

## **Office shuffle on** county's horizon

By DAVID BLACKBURN Staff Writer

The new judicial building is nearing completion, and the county is pursuing renovation funding for the Miller Courthouse Annex.

Now, many county officials are starting to think about how they could use any additional space freed up by office shuffling.

"It's something we've needed for a long time," said Sheriff Stan Scott, noting that his office outgrew its present home before it began dispatching in 1996.

The Calloway County Fiscal Court recently gave Scott and County Attorney David Harrington permission to move into the courthouse annex once state workers move into the judicial building.

"I like it because it's still downtown. It's a central location for everybody," Harrington said. Those moves would, in turn, free up courthouse space, especially for County Clerk Ray Coursey Jr., who has to store some back automobile-related records in a musty third-floor area.

"I'll take whatever they give me," said Coursey as he sat near one of several stacks of driver's license boxes that populates Coursey's 15-member office.

ken a what-if glance at the annex. "I feel like we can do what we need to do with the right-hand side," Scott said of the area that now houses the circuit and district court clerks and the district courtroom.


Scott's 20-odd employees now handle law enforcement and taxcollection duties from cramped first-floor and basement offices in the courthouse.

Besides the time-consuming legwork of moving equipment such as desks, chairs and filing cabinets, transferring the county's E-911 dispatching system will make Scott's move the most difficult.

The system consists of six radios, three printers, a three-piece recording machine, two consoles and two computers. And all of that runs off telephone lines, which brings up a logistical problem depending on how long it takes workers to string new lines, he said.

"I think we can move everything and not be down at all," Scott said. "I've got spare equipment down in the basement in case (the current) one goes down, so we could just hook it up and

use it."

"If it was in the water it would be a lot easier to change because we could tell the water plants to take whatever it is out of the water," said Dr. James Muller, director of the University of Kentucky's Gill Heart Institute.

The average death rates from heart disease in the nine states that border the Ohio and Mississippi rivers is about 56 percent higher than in states with the lowest coronary death rates.

More than 30 cardiovascular specialists and scientists participated in a two-day Coronary Valley Symposium that concluded Friday at the University of Kentucky.

Muller read a consensus statement the group issued at a news conference Friday that practically ruled out water as the cause.

"It is probable that excesses also exist in elevated cholesterol, high dietary fate intake, diabetes, and possibly estrogen deficiency," the statement said.

The states that border the two rivers and have high death rates from heart disease are Kentucky, Missouri, Arkansas, West Virginia, Indiana, Tennessee, Louisiana, Ohio and Illinois

"The traditional risk factors appear to be the cause," Muller said. "They are harder to change.

Property Valuation Administrator Ronnie Jackson said he hasn't had time to make any plans about rearranging his office, but he likes the idea of more room.

"I know we're short of space," Jackson said. "It's about to the point now where we can't shuffle anymore."

No one, especially Scott and Harrington, will shuffle anywhere until the annex is empty and its roof, windows and leaky basement are repaired.

"I'm not going to do any serious layout design 'til they get out of there," Scott said of the current annex residents' move to the See Page 2

Scott also plans to use paneling and Sheetrock to divide the district courtroom into offices.

"That's a minor expense," said Scott, adding that he doesn't think the annex will be ready for his department until late summer. "I don't anticipate this being a big operation. I anticipate doing a lot of it ourselves."

Harrington, who said he was agreeable to using the left-hand side of the annex, and his five employees will have a simpler time, he said. "I don't have as much equipment as the sheriff's

Despite the recent financial difficulties of the West Kentucky Allied Services, the local Meals on Wheels program will not be adversely affected.

Randy Smith, director of the Murray-Calloway County Senior Citizens Center, said the local program will continue to provide meals for over 60 elderly residents even though the WKAS agency faces an approximate \$200,000 deficit in its meals program.

"Nobody is going to be cut from the Meals on Wheels program in Calloway County," said Smith. "We (the center) have the (financial) ability to keep doing

sis to Calloway and the seven other counties in the Purchase Area for the past several years. Currently, meals are produced

at WKAS and transported to Murray by the local Senior Citizens Center. In turn, the Mayfield agency reimburses the senior citizens centers for their operating expenses through federal funding.

The reimbursement figures currently stand at \$3.25 per meal. But the Purchase Area Development Center, which awards contracts to WKAS for the meals program, recently voted to increase the agency's per meal payout to \$3.98 from Jan. 1 to June to ask for public assistance in maintaining the meals program.

"They've (WKAS) been in debt for going on three years," Smith said. "They've asked the (Graves County) fiscal court to pay off their debts, but that hasn't been a popular idea.

"They claim that they will have to stop producing meals if the fiscal court doesn't pay off their debt. But what they (WKAS) have been saying is highly misleading. They are not working toward the future, but paying off past costs of the prog-

## New hog rules appeal to some

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) -New rules on the size of hog feeding operations and treatment of waste from those producers were imposed Friday with some provisions stronger than earlier versions but some more agreeable to farmers.

The rules, which take effect immediately, come just two days after the administration's first efforts at regulating hog farms expired. The expiration was the culmination of a protracted political fight that pitted the powerful Kentucky Farm Bureau against Gov. Paul Patton and the Natural Resources Cabinet.

The administration rushed an emergency regulation onto the books last summer, when a factory-scale swine operation was being developed near Mayfield and another was planned - and since canceled - in the Madisonville area.

It exempted existing farms, regardless of size, and applied to

## **Mental problems** plague gunman

EDDYVILLE, Ky. (AP) -The man accused of killing state Alcoholic Beverage Control officer Brandon H. Thacker was a manic depressive who was on disability because of his mental condition, according to family and friends.

Timothy R. Doyle, 41, of Paducah, was charged with murder Thursday following the shooting on the Western Kentucky Parkway in Lyon County.

Doyle appeared in Lyon District Court Friday where Judge William McCaslin ordered him held without bond and scheduled a preliminary hearing for next Friday. Public defender Rob Embry was appointed to represent Doyle.

The suspect, who appeared calm in court, smirked when a television crew asked for comment as he was being led away, but said nothing.

Thacker, 27, had observed a car speeding and being driven eratically as a four-car convoy of ABC agents was en route to Henderson.

The agents were in separate, unmarked cars. Thacker may have been the last in line, according to ABC spokesman Mark McDaniel.

After Thacker radioed to the other officers about the erratic driver, the agent driving in front of Thacker, Jennifer Shearer,

## Gambling increases in college

KANSAS CITY, Mo. (AP) -Michael Hudspeth started gambling when he was in junior high, shooting craps for lunch money on the cafeteria floor. When he went off to college, he played dice aboard Missouri's riverboat casinos.

His losses grew from the \$2 a day his mother gave him for lunch to \$2,000 he once borrowed as a student loan — and he lost that in one night.

"I would go to the boat every day," said Hudspeth, 24, who often skipped his classes at Missouri Western College in St. Joseph to gamble five minutes away at the St. Jo Frontier Casino. "I don't know, it's just something about all the people and excitement that keeps me going back.'

The spread of casinos around the country may be contributing to problem gambling among college students.

Students who live close to casinos are more prone to gambling addiction, said Michael Frank, a professor of psychology at Richard Stockton College in New Jersey, which has a dozen casinos in Atlantic City. "It seems to be increasing in recent years."

According to a 1997 study by Harvard Medical School's Division on Addictions, about half of the college students surveyed in the United States and Canada said they had gambled at a casino

looked in the mirror and saw Thacker's car swerve.

Thacker was shot in the chest from the driver's side, Kentucky State Police said.

The shooting occurred in Lyon County just east of Eddyville. Thacker was pronounced dead at Caldwell County Hospital an hour later.

"Probably blue lights were turned on," in an effort to get the erratic driver to stop, McDaniel said. "They thought he was drunk.''

"Our officers have full police powers and while they might not blow their cover by stopping a car with an outdated license plate sticker, they cannot ignore someone endangering public safety," McDaniel added.

After Thacker was shot, the .44 magnum was tossed into the grass along the parkway, McDaniel said. ABC agents, state police and other law officers walked shoulder to shoulder through the grass until they found the

#### Shark bites after tail pulled

MARATHON, Fla. (AP) - A 3-foot nurse shark chomped down on a boy's chest and hung on all the way to the emergency room after the teen-ager tugged on its tail.

Doctors split the shark's spine to unlock its jaw, and the boy, Kevin Morrison, 16, of Rockford, Ill., was released from the hospital the same day.

The boy was on a diving trip off the Florida Keys with his family Thursday when he became fascinated with a shark swimming nearby. He pulled its tail, and the shark whipped around and bit him, the Coast Guard said.

#### Napalm causes stir

FALLBROOK, Calif. (AP) - The people who live the closest to the nation's supply of napalm are leaving the bickering to the politicians, the searching to the Navy and the fretting to the communities that might inherit the jellied gasoline.

After all, some of the 37,000 people of this lush avocado-growing community 55 miles north of San Diego have lived near the aluminum canisters filled with Vietnam War-era napalm for 25 years, and nothing really serious has happened yet.

Try telling that to the Illinois and Indiana congressmen who vehemently opposed sending the napalm by train to an East Chicago, Ind., company for recycling.

The Navy had planned to ship the napalm batch-by-batch over two years. But Pollution Control Industries, citing political and public pressure, abruptly backed out of its contract Monday, two days after the first 12,000-gallon shipment left Fallbrook for the Midwest.

#### Company recalls shipments

NEW YORK (AP) — Baxter International is recalling some shipments of a blood product to the United States and Hong Kong because it could be tainted with a fatal ailment linked to mad cow disease.

Baxter said Friday it voluntarily recalled the plasma product after it discovered that a donor later died of Creutzfeldt-Jakob Disease, the company said.

CJD, a fatal neurological disorder, has been linked with bovine spongiform encephalopathy, or mad cow disease, which has killed 20 people in Britain.

#### Bombs explode in Virginia

LOUISA, Va. (AP) — Two homemade bombs left outside a home and restaurant exploded on Friday, wounding three people four months after a pregnant woman was killed by a bomb blast in the same rural county.

Police declined to say whether there were similarities in the bombings. They asked residents to report any suspicious objects and to remain calm, which was proving to be difficult for some.

In December, 24-year-old Tammy Baker was killed instantly when an explosive device detonated outside her apartment in Louisa, about six blocks from the Pizza Hut explosion. No arrests have been made in that case.

### Mayor surprised at damage

NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) -Mayor Phil Bredesen had been briefed about tornado damage to his city, but he still was stunned by what he saw during an aerial tour Friday.

Hundreds of homes and businesses — including President Andrew Jackson's estate - were damaged or destroyed. Mangled utility poles lay on city streets. Thousands of windows in downtown buildings were blown out. And trees too numerous to count were ripped from the ground.

"I was not prepared for what I saw in East Nashville," he said. "There was one street where just basically all the power lines are snapped halfway up the poles, the lines are in the street, trees are in the street."

He was "astounded" no one was killed. Of the 100 or so people injured, only one - Vanderbilt University student Kevin Longinotti of Memphis - was critically hurt. He was struck by a falling tree in Centennial Park.

Two twisters hit Nashville on Thursday and at least eight others touched down elsewhere in the state. Six people were killed and dozens injured. Outside Nashville, hundreds of homes and businesses were damaged or destroyed.

Vice President Al Gore, Gov. Don Sundquist, U.S. Rep. Bob Clement and Bredesen toured parts of Nashville and spoke to residents. Gore told a 16-year-old girl she did the right thing by diving in a bathtub when the tornado hit.



#### McConnell writes letter

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) - Sen Mitch McConnell doesn't think teachers should be investing their retirement savings in extra-violent computer games.

In a letter to the Kentucky Teachers' Retirement System, and several other teacher pension funds, McConnell urged them to divest from companies that make the games.

McConnell, a Republican, said Kentucky should divest its stock in Cendant Corp., the parent company of Sierra OnLine. Sierra makes a video game called Phantasmagoria, which contains a rape scene. He thinks there is a direct link between violent video games and recent killings at schools in Kentucky and Arkansas.

#### Trial to follow schedule

MADISONVILLE, Ky. (AP) — The triple murder trial of two Hopkins County men accused of setting fire to an apartment building is scheduled to begin Tuesday after a judge rejected a defense motion to delay the proceeding.

William Clarke and Christopher Hogan, both 18, are accused of setting the April 1, 1997, fire in an Earlington apartment building, killing Stephanie and Jimmy Ford and Charles Wayne Blanchard. Clarke and Hogan allegedly started the fire to cover up a burglary. They are charged with second-degree burglary and first-degree arson as well as three counts of murder.

#### Candidate gets boost

LEIPZIG, Germany (AP) — Germany's left-leaning Social Democrats united Friday behind their most market-friendly platform ever to bolster candidate Gerhard Schroeder in his bid to unseat Chancellor Helmut Kohl and end 16 years of conservative rule.

Surrounded by American-style convention hoopla, Schroeder, 54, criticized Kohl for record unemployment and promised to make jobs his top priority if the Social Democrats win the Sept. 27 elections.

#### Canada gains fame

TORONTO (AP) — In the past, Canada's high-profile exports to the United States featured hockey players and comedians. Now there's a cash crop on the list - homegrown marijuana that ranks among the priciest and most potent in the world.

The pot is so coveted on the West Coast that it sometimes trades pound-for-pound for cocaine, officials say. Stepped-up searches for it have led to vexing backups at some border crossings.

Although the United States' border with Mexico remains its No. 1 smuggling zone, U.S. customs agents are devoting increasing attention to the northern border, particularly in Washington state. In the past year, the Customs Service has nearly doubled its enforcement effort there because of a surge of marijuana smuggled in from British Columbia.

#### Earthquake rattles visit

VALPARAISO, Chile (AP) - A small earthquake rattled the central Chilean coastline Friday during President Clinton's visit. No injuries or damage were reported.

Chilean authorities said the quake was felt for 330 miles along the central coast.

"There was no damage, no victims," said Carmen Fernandez, a spokeswoman for Chile's National Emergency Office.

The U.S. Geological Survey in Reston, Va., said the quake struck at 3:49 p.m. EDT and had a magnitude of 4.7. Spokeswoman Diane Noserale said it was centered 35 miles northeast of Valparaiso.

## FROM OUR READERS Laws chafe gun owner

#### Dear Editor:

Many gunowners recoil at the proposal of mandatory safe gun storage laws because their impression is strong, and largely justified, that such proposals are put forward in bad faith. At best, such law's proponents seem motivated by a condescending, paternalistic urge to lead all of us poor evolutionary throwbacks out of our primitive, benighted state.

I'm a childless old bachelor with few visitors, but I've kept all guns except the one I'm actually wearing (or have within arm's reach) locked up for years. I take this elementary precaution because I don't want my guns stolen - not because some law threatens me with years of inevitable gang rape and torture in the vilest prisons ever known on Earth if I don't

It should be obvious that the gun most secure against unauthorized tampering is the one actually worn or borne by its alert owner - who can usually be counted upon to resist its attempted theft more vigorously than any passive safe or trigger-lock! But our overlords don't get it. Consequently, current law mandates that even concealed weapon permit holders must leave their weapons behind and unattended whenever entering any of the long and growing verboten zones. If - if -I'm driving I secure my sidearm in the locked glove compartment (no Fort Knox, that!) of my locked car. I deeply resent being threatened with prison if these inadequate security measures - which the law forces me to rely upon - should fail.

As for the new breed of high-tech, "personalized" or "signature" guns, I can tell you their bugs are a long way from being worked out. Those relying on fingerprint scanners can refuse to work if the troughs between the ridges of fingerprints are full of any liquid (say, sweat). Those that key on a radio signal from a transmitter worn (or implanted!) elsewhere on the body are subject to every kind of interference (not to mention.

## Actions call for MSU union

EDITOR'S NOTE: The Murray State Faculty Senate has invited representatives from the American Federation of Teachers to campus for a forum Monday at 3:30 p.m. in the Freed Curd Auditorium in the Collins Center concerning collective bargaining.

Dr. Bill Schell of the MSU history department initiated the invitation. He explains his reasonings for unionization in the following commentary:

Why do many of the faculty want a union at Murray State University?

Is it merely that President Alexander wishes to dramatically increase the cost of health care for faculty and staff? Is it that funds are shifted from one part of the budget to another to pursue pet projects without regard for the academic mission of the university? Is it that all principles of shared university governance are routinely ignored.

Is it that President Alexander runs the unversity like an absolutist's monarch qua Louis XIV: "L' e'tat c'est moi" (I am the state)?

#### consider the issues in more detail. I have previously written that all Korean students would receive tuition waivers regardless of their financial need. President Alexander actually implemented a policy design to "provide financial aid to international students who have encountered severe, anticipated financial difficulties of political or economic crises in their home countries... in the form of waivers of the non-resident porition of MSU tuition... on a semester-by-semester basis beginning with the fall of 1998."

COMMENTARY

The policy statement clarifies "economic emergency" as a significant shift in current exchange rates although it is not limited to that. Students must also complete an application which includes a financial disclosure form and be willing to seek on-campus employment." The decision was made outside of channels of

shared governance by which the university is supposed to operate. For decades, the MSU faculty has traded low salaries for en-

#### hanced and affordable health care. President Alexander has persistently underfunded health care at 1994 levels. The current health care "crisis" is entirely contrived to create a flow of new funds that can be diverted to cover other budget shortfalls.

For years, the athletic program exceeded its budget by millions of dollars, yet this required no instant fax. Rather, we were constantly told that it would take time (years) to bring this under control so that the change would not be overly disruptive.

Yet health care must be fixed immediately at the expense of faculty and staff with no consideration or input by the appropriate governing bodies.

Meanwhile, more and more is required of the faculty while empty faculty positions are left unfilled so that funds may be diverted to other uses. This increases the student to faculty ratio, makes classes larger and makes it harder for students to

get needed classes.


The libraries are underfunded. Money for book purchases is completely inadequate. Pogue Special Collections has no security system, although a used one is available from Waterfield.

MSU suffers from an epidemic of deferred maintenance. Yet large sums are spent to turn dorms (and make no mistake, that is what they are) into residential colleges, a program currently on life-support, artificially maintained and largely ineffective (as most students readily admit).

It is frustrating then that the renovated Woods Hall (perfectly located and architecturally suited for a residential college) was turned into offices (for which it is not suited).

These examples are merely the tip of the iceberg; a great many more could be cited.

What it boils down to is abuse of power and lack of shared governance. There would be no call for a union on this campus if there was another way to counteract the current maladministration. Unfortunately, there seems to be no other solution

## **KAHCF** lauds Whitfield

#### Dear Editor:

On behalf of the Kentucky Association of Health Care Facilities (KAHCF), we want to commend Rep. Ed Whitfield (R-1st) for his recent leadership in Congress calling attention to the rapidly aging baby boom generation and the need for long term health care financing reform to provide affordable, quality health care for our nation's elderly.

Congressman Whitfield's legislation, House Resolution 210, adeptly outlines the real and far-reaching health care crisis this country faces as nearly 77 million baby boomers enter their golden years in the next two decades.

We would also like to compliment our 1998 Kentucky General Assembly for their foresight in passing legislation that provides state tax deductions for the purchase of long term care insurance.

Every day, we hear of the emotional stress of families as they watch their parents or grandparents spend down their retirement savings on long term health care until they qualify for public assistance from Medicaid

The primary payer of nursing home care, Medicaid, was never intended as a long term health program for the elderly, and it certainly cannot support the deluge of seniors preparing to enter the system. Complications in the Medicaid system will affect the young as well as the old.

As Congressman Whitfield's legislation correctly points out, we must take steps now to educate consumers. The lesson?

As senior citizens live longer, more productive lives, long term care will be very real and likely possibility. Only when consumers are informed will they then make rational decisions to insure and protect their assets — just as they insure their homes, cars and other possessions should disaster strike.

Private long term care insurance does exist today, yet when less than two percent of Americans use it for their nursing care needs - and two out of five Americans will need such service — it is still not seen as on option to finance their health care.

Establishing a sound long term care insurance program through tax and other economic incentives is an important step toward deflecting the onslaught of costs and financial ruin of Medicaid continues to be the dominant payer of nursing home care.

We applaud Congressman Whitfield's bold leadership in this muchneeded examination of private long term care insurance. I am encouraged that the first steps of a difficult journey have been taken; the result of which can only mean a more affordable and effective long term health care system.

The last time there was a debate about taxes, Democrats wanted to make sure "the rich" paid their "fair share." As usual, Republicans lost the debate because they were unable to counter the presupposition that government, no matter how big, is good, and people who want to keep more of what they earn are greedy and lacking compassion.

The next time there is a debate about taxes (which should begin now and continue through the 2000 presidential election), it should focus on what is fair about big government and its demands for our money

Is it fair that tenacious and gifted workers, who play by life's rules, must hand over more than half their income to grasping government? Is it fair that middle-income people pay more than one-third of their earnings to government? Is it fair that government sees itself as our keeper and protector instead of the defender of economic and personal freedom?

We need someone to stand up for the taxpayer and not be afraid of big government's claim of executive privilege over our earnings.

The place to begin is with legislation that requires full disclosure of how much of our money government takes. If we can have truth in labeling and truth in lending, why not truth in taxing?

The fact is that while the economy booms, real wages have been stagnant for 20 years because hidden taxes have absorbed pay. According to the Cato Institute, more than one-fourth of every dollar employers pay for average manufacturing-wage workers goes to

government. The government tax bite amounts to \$4.10 per hour for such a worker, but only about half of the real deductions are listed on the worker's pay stub.

Cato analyst Dean Stansel offers this example: "Assume that you're an average manufacturing-wage worker who receives a paycheck twice a month. Your gross earnings cost your employer \$1,133.33 per pay period, but when the employer's share of the payroll taxes is included, your employer spends \$1,289.76. But your take-home pay is only \$934.73.

Stansel notes that if the current withholding system didn't exist, you would get the entire \$1,289.76 and

#### have to go to seven different windows to pay your tax obligation. You would pay \$86.70 for the employer share of Social Security and Medicare; another \$86.70 for the employee share of Social Security and Medicare; \$56.12 for workers' compensation; \$9.28 for state unemployment insurance; \$2.33 for federal unemployment insurance; \$85.31 in federal income tax; and \$26.59 in state income tax." That totals \$353.03 to the government, only half of which appears on your pay stub. Your pay has shrunk 28 percent.

Out of the remaining take-home pay comes property taxes, sales taxes, gasoline taxes, cigarette taxes, alcohol taxes and more, de-

Today, the total federal, state and local tax burden in America is at an all-time high. The budget surplus is projected to hit \$50 billion or more this fiscal year, but don't look for the

Clinton administration or this timid Congress to give much of it back. According to the Tax Foundation, a median-income, two-earner family pays nearly \$23,000, or roughly 38 percent of its income, each year in federal, state and local taxes.

That is more than most families pay for food, clothing, housing and transportation combined. The question is not how much government "needs," but how much workers deserve to keep.

The bigger government gets, the more it suppresses freedom, real growth and opportunity. Big government isn't fair, and it isn't fair when we are required to turn over so much of our money to a system that claims to be better and more "compassionate" at spending it than those who earn it.

The next presidential campaign should feature at least one candidate who will fight class warfare and envy head-on. That candidate should put government in its proper place and pledge to put more of our money back in its proper place: our pockets. Charity and compassion should begin at home, not with government.

## Hodges feels 'at home' with MSU

Bill Hodges has coached Larry Bird and been to the championship game of the NCAA Tournament.

But he feels right at home in Murray.

Hodges, one of the new assistant coaches under Tevester Anderson for the Murray State men's basketball team, was Bird's head coach at Indiana State when the Sycamores advanced to the NCAA finals in 1979, falling to Magic Johnson and Michigan State.

He's been many places, but says people in Murray love basketball just as much as anywhere

else. "It's just like moving back to Terre Haute (Indiana, where In-

diana State University is located)," Hodges said in a telephone interview from his home Friday. "Everybody I meet talks about basketball, where I've been and who I've recruited. There's nothing like coaching were people love basketball.'

Hodges came out of retirement to coach with Anderson, who he has known for many years.

"Tee dragged me out of mothballs," he said with a laugh. "We met at some clinics when he was an assistant at Auburn. We sat next to each other one year at the Final Four and he went to Geor-

gia a year before I went to Georgia College. They were only 70 miles away and we visited, and then when I was at Mercer, we played against each other."

Hodges, 55, is no stranger to the Ohio Valley Conference as he coached at Tennessee Tech from 1970-74. From there he went to Armstrong State in Savannah, Ga., before spending seven seasons at Indiana State.

He then had one-year stints at Palm Beach Junior College and Long Beach State before going into the insurance business for

two years. Following that, he spent five seasons at Georgia College and six years at Mercer. "Tee said he wanted an assistant with experience and one he could have faith in to do what

was needed," Hodges said. "I enjoy being an assistant because you don't have to make decisions or deal with the media or the administration. You get to do the fun thing, and that's coach." Bob Eskew, an assistant at

Tennessee Tech the last nine seasons, will also join Anderson's staff, but his hiring is not yet While Hodges did not see the

Racers play in person last season, he has been impressed with what he has seen on film.

"I've been around them in the weight room and this is the hardest working team I've seen since the Bird group," he said. "You take Bird out and this team's frontline is better than any team I've ever coached. Besides Larry Bird, the Indiana State team in 1979 didn't have as much talent as this team has, from what I've seen.

"We've really got an athletic group here," Hodges added. "I'm looking forward to coaching a bunch like this. My most enjoy-

able time is practice, and I look forward to practicing with this team."

Hodges said he last spoke with Bird, now the head coach of the NBA's Indiana Pacers, only three weeks ago.

"Larry was in Florida playing in a fundraiser golf tournament. and we had lunch together," Hodges said. "He told me that in the last three nights he had had four hours' sleep, and he looked tired.

"Larry is the type that he will work around the clock to be successful," Hodges added. "He doesn't tell anybody too much


DETROIT (AP) — Wherever they have to play, the Yankees keep winning.

With New York forced out of its own ballpark due to a fallen expansion joint, Tino Martinez hit a grand slam and Derek Jeter hit a three-run homer Friday night in an 11-2 victory over the Detroit Tigers. "You just have to play," Martinez said. "When we went to Shea, we didn't let it bother us. Same here. We've got the type of guys who don't let things like that bother them. The Yankees won their seventh straight, their longest winning streak since 1995, and sent the Tigers to their sixth consecutive loss, their longest skid since 1996, the season they lost 109.

Detroit, not enthusiastic about the switch, sold just 12,348 tickets for the game — including those originally sold for April 24. But on a 54-degree night, it appeared only about 6,000 were in

"This is so frustrating," Detroit slugger Tony Clark said. "It's not for lack of effort, I'll tell you that.'

This series was supposed to be in the Bronx as part of a Saturday celebration of Yankee Stadium's 75th birthday — when Babe Ruth homered - but it was moved Wednesday due to the ongoing inspection of the ballpark.

Next weekend's series, originally set for Tiger Stadium, was fourth.

"It doesn't matter," Jeter said. "Baseball is baseball, no matter where you play.

Andy Pettitte (2-2) had a shutout through six innings and wound up allowing two runs and six hits in 6 2-3 innings with six walks and six strikeouts.

"It was a tough night, because of the weather," Pettitte said. "You couldn't get loose. I think I was in trouble every inning. I couldn't get a grip on the ball. I don't know if I've ever walked that many.

"I was scuffling, but Tino got that big hit and that helped a lot.

Jeter hit his first homer in the

All of McGwire's home runs this year have come at home. Since the Cardinals acquired him from Oakland last July 31, he has 21 homers in 33 games and 112 at-bats in St. Louis, an average of one per 5.3 at-bats.

His eight homers this year have come in only 28 at-bats at home. He's also outhomered the Phillies, who have seven.

"I love playing here," McGwire said. "It's a great baseball park, great batter's box. When you get in the box, there's a lot of confidence.'

Although he's putting up some otherworldly numbers at home, McGwire said every player he talks to - not just Cardinals - says the same things.

## After franchise QBs, NFL draft has questions

Colts will use first pick on Leaf or Manning; San Diego has second choice

NEW YORK (AP) - The Indianapolis Colts earned the first pick in the NFL draft by losing 13 games. The San Diego Chargers lost 12, but needed to trade to get the second pick.

No matter how they got there, the Colts and Chargers will take the same path when they open the NFL draft on Saturday - each will grab a potential franchise quarterback.

The choice: Peyton Manning, with the great bloodlines and instinct, or Ryan Leaf, with the body of a tight end and the Roger Clemens arm. The book says Manning will be better right away and Leaf may be the better long-term prospect.

Here are some hints.

While Bill Polian, the Colts' new president, won't disclose his choice, Jim Mora, the team's new coach, was in New Orleans for 10% seasons. Manning's father Archie, a great quarterback who


spent his career on awful Saints teams, was the color broadcaster for the team and Peyton actually ran the Saints' scout team occasionally.

"I know Archie well and I know Peyton," Mora says. "He has everything you'd want in a quarterback and he's way ahead of most coming out of college." Polian probably will heed his coach and take PEYTON MAN-NING, qb, Tennessee. The rest of the picks:

2, SAN DIEGO — "I've never picked this high," says Bobby Beathard, the quirky San Diego GM who built three Super Bowl teams in Washington and another with the Chargers by trading away first-round picks for second rounders. He's lucky no one took him up on that when he tried it last year — the Chargers started in third position and Beathard was able to get them here by trading with Arizona.

The only way he doesn't take RYAN LEAF, qb, Washington State, is if the Colts do. Then he takes Manning.

## **Nets' chances for** playoffs remain in air after loss

New Jersey closes out season Sunday By FRED GOODALL

ORLANDO, Fla. (AP) - The New Jersey Nets are down to their last chance.

'We're going to find out if this organization and all of us want to get to that next level," coach John Calipari said after the team's third straight loss, 121-109 Friday night to the Orlando Magic, left the Nets still needing one more win - or some wacky strange circumstances to clinch a postseason berth.

"This is the first step. How do we respond in these situations? We're going to find out. How do the players respond? Where are we? Who are we? Are we good enough to get to that next point. When it tightens up a little bit, when the race is tight, can we make plays?" Calipari asked.

Nick Anderson scored 29 points and Bo Outlaw had a triple-double with 25 points, 13 rebounds and 10 assists as the Magic played spoilers for the second straight game.

Despite being eliminated from playoff contention last weekend, the Magic beat Miami on Wednesday night to ruin the Heat's bid for homecourt advantage in the second round.

The Nets remained in the eighth playoff position, one game ahead of Washington, which beat Miami 97-89. New Jersey can still clinch a playoff spot by winning at home Sunday against Detroit, or by having the Wizards lose their season-finale Saturday.

If Washington wins Saturday and New Jersey loses Sunday, the Nets can still get into the playoffs if Orlando comes up with one more win - at Charlotte on Sunday.

The Nets remain confident they'll get the job done.

"There is no pressure on us. We have overachieved this year. We know that," guard Kerry Kittles said.

Sam Cassell led New Jersey with 27 points before leaving late in the fourth quarter with a lower back contusion. X-rays were negative, but the Nets' secondleading scorer is uncertain of his status for Sunday.



## Mr., Miss Basketball named

### Van Hoose, Vice receive top honors

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) -Paintsville's J.R. VanHoose and Montgomery County's Beth Vice were named Kentucky's Mr. and Miss Basketball on Friday, an honor that designates them as the state's best high school players. They will wear No. 1 on their jerseys in the annual doubleheader between all-star teams from Kentucky and Indiana. The games will be played June 20 in Frankfort and June 27 in Indianapolis.

The awards are presented by the Kentucky Lions Eye Foundation as voted by the state's high school coaches.

VanHoose led Paintsville to four consecutive state tournaments, including a championship in 1996 when he was named the tourney's most valuable player as a sophomore. He also guided the Tigers to a runner-up finish this season.

"It's a dream come true," said VanHoose, a 6-foot-9 center who will play at Marshall next season. VanHoose averaged 25.8 points and 14.6 rebounds, finishing his career with more than

3,000 points and 2,000 rebounds. The two-time all-stater was named a Parade Magazine All-

#### American this season "I just tried to play with my

team," VanHoose said. "I tried to make my teammates look good and they tried to make me look good.

It marked the second time that the school has produced a Mr. Basketball. John Pelphrey, who later played at Kentucky, won the honor in 1987.

"For a school our size to have two Mr. Basketballs is really phenomenal," Paintsville coach Bill Runyon said. "I really thought he was the frontrunner for it after he was MVP" in the 1996 state tourney.

Vice, a 6-foot guard, averaged 23.8 points, 5 rebounds and 5 assists. She has signed with

"This is something l've worked for all my career," said Vice, a two-time all-state selection.

Vice injured her left knee in late February, requiring reconstructive surgery to repair a torn ligament. She was on the sidelines as Montgomery County reached the state finals.

Vice said she will play in the all-star games if knee continues to improve.

"It feels really strong right now," she said. "I'm not going to go out and risk my future to play in one game but I hope I'll be ready to play.



This week sure has been hectic from so many different things happening with the local weather and lake conditions.


The strong winds have been the biggest problem, keeping most anglers from fishing their favorite banks or ledges where the crappie are trying to move in.

Our water temperature has held in the low 60s for over a week now and the crappie are making a pre-spawn move to establish an area on or near a good rocky bank in order to drop their eggs.

Surprisingly, the majority of the bays and main lake remain clear water in spite of the wind and rain. Some hail fell on us Thursday morning while we were out on the main lake and it shut the crappie off from feeding for nearly an hour. The hail stones were shaped like a

chopped pencil would look, but they made the same hard impact as the round ones.

It's really something to see when the ice falls into the lake with a huge splash! I have seen enough to last





me for this year though!

Our crappie are trying hard to get set for a spawning run as the lake elevation keeps on coming up. We need more water for a good season that will benefit all the twin lakes region.

Tourists are going to spend money somewhere for a fishing vacation and if we can advertise the crappie are biting in shallow water, they will come here.

All we need now is a few days of sunshine and mild breezes to get the fish to really commit to shallow water.

Minnows and jigs are the baits of the week, and most of the time color doesn't really matter. White, chartreuse, peacock, yellow, lime green, red/black/chartreuse are just a few colors which will catch you some crappie.

cover that her original breast cancer had spread to her lungs and brain. This was not a single metastasis; there were literally hundreds of lesions. The cancer had attacked like wildfire, unpredictably, after seven years. In hopes of a miracle, we transferred her to a teaching hospital for radiation treatments. On the other hand, I have several

female patients who are free of cancer 10, 12, even 20 years following treatment for breast malignancies.

Consequently, I have a deep respect for breast cancer, because the disease can fool the most astute physician.

You have much to be thankful for. The cancer was removed before it had spread to the lymph nodes. Nonetheless, most experts would recommend continued therapy, either with a course of radiation or hormone treatment with drugs such as tamox-

Therefore, I agree with your daughter that you need a second opinion from an oncologist. If no further therapy is appropriate, fine; you're out a couple of hundred dollars but no harm has been done. However, if additional therapy is warranted, the consultation could well save your life.

Perhaps your primary care physician feels entirely comfortable monitoring your course himself with frequent examinations and periodic mammograms. But in my opinion, this isn't enough. If you were my patient or my sister - I'd darn well want to be certain that there were no unpleasant surprises months or years down

the road. Get that consultation.
