STATE Officials ask TVA to delay spraying GUNTERSVILLE, Ala. (AP)

- Lt. Gov. Don Siegelman and a group of bass fishermen are urging the Tennessee Valley Authority not to resume spraying herbicides on Guntersville Lake to control acquatic weeds. TVA says the herbicides have been approved by federal envi-

ronmental officials and spraying won't be as widespread as it was in the past. Instead, it will be done in small amounts and in specific areas. That's not good enough for

Siegelman, who wants TVA to delay spraying until another public hearing can be held on the issue.

In a letter sent earlier this week to TVA Chairman Craven Crowell, Siegelman said he was "personally opposed to the use of poisonous chemicals to control vegetation in the waters of the State of Alabama."

Bass fishermen who are also opposed to the spraying, plan to drive while pulling their boats behind them from Scottsboro Plaza to Guntersville on Aug. 29 in protest.

"The vast majority feel that pesticides are not the way to go," said Gary Douglas, director of the Alabama BASS Federation's northeast Alabama district.

Reformatory stops program

LA GRANGE, Ky. (AP) -The Kentucky State Reformatory has stopped sending inmate work release crews into the community following the alleged rape of a 12-year-old girl by a prisoner last month.

Police said the incident occurred July 3 in woods near the Oldham County Convention-Community and Aquatic Center at Buckner. It was reported July 18.

The suspect is one of three inmates from the La Grange reformatory who were on work release at the center on Kentucky 393. Police aren't releasing his name because he has not been charged.

Procedures for managing the work-release program, including supervision requirements, are under review, said Jim Stephens, deputy warden for security and operations. It's not known when or if the prison will resume the program, he said. Oldham County Parks direc-

tor Tom Boyd said inmates have worked in the parks for years. The inmates, who wear street clothes, have worked around patrons from picnickers to people fishing, Boyd said, and "we've never had a problem."

Federal regulators, in a report today to Congress, find that large school buses are one of the safest forms of transportation.

Fieger had said earlier that he moved in June, which means he was within the 60-day grace period unless he moved the first week of June. An attempt to clarify was not immediately successful, as his campaign said he was out of town today.

HUD gives \$30 million to South Dakota

PINE RIDGE, S.D. (AP) — The federal government will give \$30 million to Indian tribes in South Dakota to improve housing on reservations.

Housing and Urban Development Secretary Andrew Cuomo announced the grants Thursday after touring the Pine Ridge and Lower Brule Indian reservations.

Some of South Dakota's reservations make up among the nation's poorest counties. Cuomo said the conditions on the reservations were about as bad as he's seen.

Many tribal members live in substandard housing. Some threeroom houses have dozens of family members living inside, and some have no indoor plumbing.

Nebraska mayor offers to walk naked

NORTH PLATTE, Neb. (AP) - Some mayors crack down on public nudity. North Platte Mayor Jim Whitaker plans to wear his birthday suit downtown.

Hoping to draw attention to the problem of an uncontrolled pet population, Whitaker offered to take a naked stroll during the Fall Fun Fest celebration Sept. 12 if the Paws-itive Partners Humane Society receives \$5,000 in donations by that date.

"I hope there is a Nebraska football game that day so everyone will stay inside and watch that," the mayor said.

Sorry, mayor. The Huskers are playing at night in California, so folks in this central Nebraska city of 22,000 are more likely to be downtown.

The Supreme Court in 1977 ruled that the portions of the 3,700 hours of tapes which contain personal and private conversations, such as talks with his wife and daughters or conversations of a purely political nature, would have to be returned.

So far, the public has heard only about 350 hours of the tapes, to six years.



In the nine days from July 20-July 29, the New York Times website book forum had 622 opinions about the Modern Library list of 100 novels published in English and the 20th century.


Hardly anyone agrees with the list selected by novelists A.S. Byatt, William Styron, and Gore Vidal; historians Daniel Boorstin, Arthur Schlesinger, Jr., Edmund Morris, and John Richardson; novelist/historian Shelby Foote; Carnegie Corporation head Vartan Gregorian; and Modern Library board chairman Christopher Certf.

The dominance of white male elderly historians is conspicuous.

Some dissenters question what is meant by "best" - historical importance, number of copies sold, familiarity of title, frequency of use in classrooms, years in print? U.S. News & World Report annually triggers similar controversies by publishing lists of the "best colleges and universities" without clear agreements on what is the definition of "best."



eter of American literacy, the fact that so many literate people in the forum sampling have not read most of these novels tells us something about how fiction-in-print has declined as serious entertainment while movies, motoring, television, NASCAR and Disneyworld have prospered.

If the reader audience for fiction has dwindled, it is likely that the number of publishing writers has declined as well.

The relegation of fiction to a tiny corner of American life by the public and publishers of books is a frightening development. What kind of society are we creating that has such little time for or interest in good books?

If the average American reads less than one novel a year - likely by Danielle Steele or John Grisham - what dire fate awaits the world of letters (and the world Quite a few dissenters feel the One group of opinions distresses itself) in the 21st century? Does our listing show us sinking?

MAKING HEALTH CARE MORE AFFORDABLE AND **HELPING PATIENTS TO BETTER UNDERSTAND THEIR** MEDICAL COVERAGE

When it comes to health care, every Kentuckian deserves atfordable, quality care and access to the best doctors and specialists available. In the coming weeks, the Senate will consider S.2330, The Patients' Bill of Rights and Health Care Quality Act, legislation designed to improve managed care health plans. The result of a comprehensive, seven-month examination of our nation's health care system, this bill will provide patients fewer hassles, greater security, more choices and overall better service from their health plans.

The bill's primary benefit is that it will expand health care coverage to more Kentuckians by making care more accessible and enhancing its affordability. One group that has traditiona'ly had difficulty getting the coverage they need is the self-employed. This bill should increase access for the self-employed by allowing them to deduct the full cost of their health care premiums, rather than the 45% they can deduct now. The bill will also expand Medical Savings Accounts - currently available only to employees in companies of 50 or less - to every single person.

They are concerned that if they develop a serious medical condition, they may not be covered for all necessary treatment. Our bill will also make it easier for patients to understand their coverage and medical options. Health plans will be required to provide patients accurate, easy-to-understand information about their providers and their doctors, as well as what their health care plan covers, including information about out-of-pocket expenses.

There are several other provisions which will make you better informed about your coverage and health care options. First, our legislation will eliminate so-called "gag rules," which prevent doctors from discussing with their patients certain treatment options that may not be covered by their plan. In addition, providers will be required to cover - without prior approval - any emergency care that a "prudent lay person" would consider necessary.

Another important component of our plan sets a quick, fair procedure for settlement of any disputes about your coverage. Rather than leaving patients' health vulnerable to costly and time consuming lawsuits, our bill allows patients to appeal coverage determinations to medical experts with no affiliation to their health plan. The expert's ruling will then be binding on the health plans. and it will not cost the patient exorbitant lawyers fees. The appeal comes at no cost to the patient, as the plan is responsible for covering the entire cost of the process.

Our bill also contains several provisions to expand and improve women's health care and services. Health plans will be required to allow women to visit an ob-gyn. without a referral from a "gatekeeper." The bill also prohibits health plans from setting caps on how long women may stay in the hospital following breast cancer treatment. Finally, the bill continues funding for several important research programs on early detection of breast and ovarian cancer, as well as a study on osteoporosis and continued research into the causes and prevention of cardiovascular diseases, which are the leading cause of death among women.

Unlike the bill offered by Senator Kennedy and the Democrats - which would make health insurance more costly and drive some small businesses to altogether drop coverage of their employees our legislation will reduce many burdensome federal requirements that would otherwise make almost every health plan resemble a Health Maintenance Organization (HMO). Rather than expanding regulation and forcing a "one-size-fits-all" approach to health care, similar to the Clinton plan of 1993, The Patients' Bill of Rights and Health Care Quality Act will give more people better access to quality health care and will allow every Kentuckian to better understand the health care that they are paying for.

The LDP has already begun the process of selecting a successor to Hashimoto. If his exit has opened up the possibility for change, it is only because voters have demonstrated that mismanagement of the economy will not go unpunished.

Stoking the fire of the national tobacco debate has been teen smoking. Not just how America curbs youth's habits, but how do we snuff it out altogether?

The answer is simple.

Enforcement.

We've done it with underage drinking. Why can't we do it with underage smoking?

Take a look around. There are teens smoking everywhere. The law prohibits the sale of tobacco products to those under age 18. It's supposed to prohibit kids from using.

Still, somehow, cigarettes and snuff make their way into the hands of teens in staggering numbers. Maybe they get it from someone old enough to purchase it for them, maybe from their parents, maybe from an unknowledgeable store clerk.

What matters is they get it.

Oddly, it's not too uncommon to see cigarettes dangle from the mouths of teens in plain view. ... But generally, the scene gets ignored.

We just walk on by.

Some members of Congress and others lobbying to abolish the tobacco industry, or at least severely cripple it, instead see the key to eliminating teen smoking as wiping out popular advertising campaigns and hiking prices. After months of discussion, the debate has flared into little more than a publicized stalemate.

Forget the bickering, and take a stand. Like the stand we've taken against underage drinkers.

Admittedly, it goes on. But underage drinking arguably is not as widespread — or as visible — as teen smoking.

We need to be more vigilant against kids who smoke.







Racers strong on defense, QB



Johnson must fill holes on O-line; defense remains solid with eight returnees from No. 2 unit last year

By MARK YOUNG Sports Editor

NASHVILLE, Tenn. -- A year later, and Denver Johnson's dilemma is just the opposite of last year.

Johnson headed into 1997, his first as head coach at Murray State, with a veteran offensive line, quality receivers and a good running attack, but no proven quarterback.

This year, he seems to have the quarterback situation solved, but now Johnson must replace almost an entire offense, including all but one starter on the offensive line.

Johnson's early assessment of his offense?

"I don't know what we can do," he said at Friday's Ohio Valley Conference media day, held at the Crowne Plaza Hotel. "We'll just have to find our best 11 offensively, but I don't know how we'll look on offense until we play.

Oklahoma transfer Justin Fuente emerged from spring practice as the starting quarterback. Fuente passed for 1,018 yards at Oklahoma last year and 1,271 as a redshirt freshman in 1996.

"Justin broke some of Troy Aikman's high school passing records in Oklahoma, and with him, (Texas Tech transfer) Shayne Stevens and last year's quarterback, Dan Loyd, we have three quality quarterbacks,' Johnson said.

The Racer defense, which ranked second in the nation in total defense last season and returns eight starters, appears solid.

MSU's only two preseason All-Ohio Valley selections are both on the defensive side of the ball in end Marcus Stepp and linebacker Chris Vaughn. Stepp led the OVC in sacks last year, averaging 8.5 per contest, along with eight tackles for loss. Vaughn contributed 4.5 sacks per game with 10 tackles for loss. "I'll be very surprised if we're not good defensively," Johnson said. "I thought we would have a few more (preseason all-conference) picks on defense, though; I'm sur-

We are blessed with good clean water, and this is just one reason the fish in Kentucky are Barkley lakes have such a good flavor. We don't want to step on any-


one's toes as far as their homemade batter recipes, but the really true key to good taste starts where they grow!

DEAR DR. GOTT: I have osteoporosis and have been prescribed Miacalcin Nasal Spray. Is this an effective antidote

DEAR READER: In treating osteoporosis, doctors must judge whether patients need prescription drugs that reverse the calcium loss from bones or those that merely stabilize the situation by preventing further bone loss. Fosamax, for example, actually increases bone calcium; other products, such as hormones and Miacalcin, simply prevent further calcium losses. Therefore, your nasal spray will probably be effective - but not as effective as pills. Whether this is the best option for you is a decision you and your doctor should make. 

Baby denied by parents dies

HARRISBURG, Pa. (AP) — The short, sad life of Alek Smith a baby rejected by his adoptive parents when he was born with severe medical problems - came to an end with his mother by his parent and he would be better off side

Early Tuesday morning, after six months of life, Alek was removed from the respirator keeping him alive. His mother, Nicole Smith, who had put him up for adoption before he was born, was on hand to say goodbye.

"The decision, at least from the medical side, is that he had terminal lung disease, that his lungs were not able to support him, said Dr. Kevin Lorah, a neonatologist who cared for Alek.

Miss Smith, 25, rejected the rejecting the boy for not being baby's father's advice to get an abortion. She arranged Alek's adoption before he was born, saying she did not want to be a single with a loving couple.

North Carolina to adopt Alek. Miss skin. Smith said she talked to them about the baby's life and her hopes for him. But her pregnancy ran into difficulties. Alek was born three months premature in February, weighing less than two pounds and with lung problems and brain damage

Faced with the complications, the adoptive parents backed out. Miss Smith accused the couple of

"perfect," and she vowed to find a family for him.

But as she publicized her search and fielded more than 200 inquiries, she grew closer to the little boy, remaining by his hospital bedside,

In April, she decided to keep him. "I fell in love with him." she said. But Alek was unable to overcome his medical difficulties, and the end came this week.

Smith, said she called him Wednesday to tell him of Alek's death. "She called me from Godknows-where," he said. "She said, 'I can't handle this. I've got to get out of here."



Removing Wrinkles Ask the Doctor

Dear Dr. Torabi,

I would like to have some facial wrinkles removed, but I do not want to "go under the knife (have surgery). What other options are available for removing wrinkles? J.E., Murray

Dear J.E.,

There are several methods one can use to smooth, minimize, and/or remove wrinkles. Since you have ruled out surgery, the facelift is not an option. This leaves peels and laser resurfacing as methods you might want to consider for removing your wrinkles

A peel is simply the application of an exfoliating agent to the skin that causes the outer layers of the skin to sluff or peel away more rapidly. The new skin growth will be smoother and fresher in appearance. Peels using Kojic acid, alpha hydroxy acid, or glycolic acid are very effective in removing superficial skin features such as hyperpigmentation (discoloration), or shallow wrinkles and acne scars. Please understand that this is not a one-time, overnight process. Depending upon your situation, I recommend 2-6 weeks of daily or nightly applications of the peel. Your skin will gain a smoother and more youthful appearance in about 14 days, but to achieve your desired results, you may need to continue your peels for up to 6 weeks.

Laser skin resurfacing is another option for removing wrinkles and other undesirable skin features such as scars, discolorations/spots, and moles. Currently, the erbium laser is, by far, the best skin resurfacing tool available. The erbium laser is much more precise and controllable than C02 lasers, and was designed specifically for skin resurfacing. This is an outpatient procedure performed in the doctor's office, using a local anesthetic. Recovery time is 6-10 days, and some patients who have this procedure done on Monday, can go out on the following Saturday night.






