Owensboro changes calendars

OWENSBORO, Ky. (AP) — The Owensboro Board of Education has adopted a new school calendar that, beginning this fall, will divide classroom instruction into four quarters and shorten summer vacation by three weeks.

After two hours of discussion involving a parade of parents, teachers and administrators Thursday night, the four-member board voted unanimously to take the action as a three-year pilot program.

The district's 1999-2000 school year will begin Aug. 2, not in late August, as in recent years. The last day of school will be June 8, 2000.

Each school year will have four nine-week instruction sessions with three weeks off between quarters, except during summer, when students and teachers will get seven weeks off.

Between quarters, voluntary remediation classes will be offered to students in danger of failing while enrichment activities will be provided for other students.

Some parents who expressed their unhappiness with the plan promised to remove their children from the school system. Others asked the board to delay its decision for a year.

Williams seeks new trial

PADUCAH, Ky. (AP) — Lawyers for a former Murray State University football player convicted of conspiring to kill his wife have asked for a new trial.

Attorneys Roger Perry and Dennis Null filed a nine-page motion outlining the request in McCracken Circuit Court on Thursday. They listed seven reasons why they believe their client, Neil Williams, didn't receive a fair trial there earlier this month.

If Judge Jeff Hines, who presided over the trial, doesn't grant the motion, Perry and Null could appeal to the Kentucky Court of Appeals.

The nine-day trial ended March 11 when a 12-member jury found Williams, 37, guilty of conspiracy to commit murder.

The jury recommended a 12-year prison sentence and Hines set a formal sentencing date of May 7.

Bobbi Holman Williams, 35, was bludgeoned with an antique pancake syrup bottle and strangled.

Her body was discovered in a half-filled bathtub at the couple's Marshall County home on July 16, 1996.

Neither her husband, who was a defensive end at Murray State, nor anyone else has been charged with killing the woman.

City settles grievance with officer

The city of Murray has paid almost \$14,000 to settle a grievance filed by Murray police K-9 officer Steve Robinson concerning overtime pay for Robinson's care and maintenance of the dog.

Robinson received a pre-tax settlement of \$13,627.55 Friday. The

figure was less than \$7,000 after federal taxes were withheld, he said.

The settlement represents back pay figured on a basis of five hours per two-week period beginning in May 1995, when Robinson became the K-9 officer, to late December 1998, when the city began paying him for K-9-related

work he performed off duty.

The work includes feeding Max, cleaning his pen and exercising him, said City Administrator Don Elias.

Robinson said Friday he was happy the matter is settled, especially since the city initially brought up the subject of overtime pay.

"The city came to me," he said. Robinson said he was unaware

of the issue until a city council meeting early last summer.

He made a presentation at the meeting about his work with Max, which is used to detect narcotics, track suspects and lost children and search buildings.

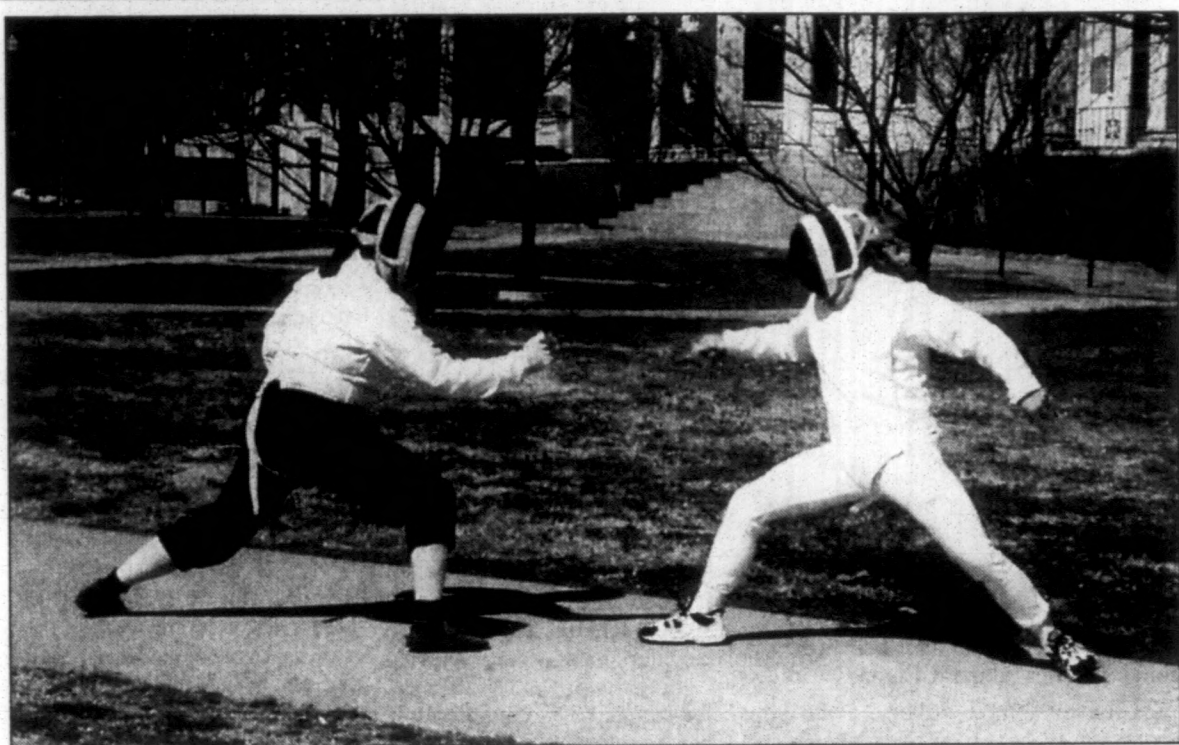
Among their accomplishments at that time were 105 arrests, including 30 on felony charges, and the

seizure of two vehicles, Robinson said.

"They (councilmen) were all really impressed," Robinson said.

At the same meeting, councilman Dennis Crawford told the council it needed to pay Robinson for the extra care needed in police

Farmers told to expect battle

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — Attorney General Ben Chandler urged agriculture leaders to prepare now for the battle they will encounter when trying to put tobacco settlement money into the hands of farmers.

Getting the money will be the most important thing, Chandler said. He suggested that once the money becomes available, it should be turned over to a foundation governed by a board of experts, farmers and agriculture groups.

"When it's appropriated this time, it needs to be appropriated for the long term. People might not want (the settlement money) to be susceptible to the General Assembly every two years," he said.

His comments were made Thursday during a meeting of the Philip Morris Agricultural Leadership Development Program alumni.

Farm groups, including the Kentucky Farm Bureau and the Burley Tobacco Growers Cooperative, have told Gov. Paul Patton that agriculture is entitled to at least half of the \$3.45 billion Kentucky will get over 25 years from the \$206 billion master settlement. But farmers are by no means guaranteed to receive any of it.

Patton is not inclined to recommend any of the money for the farm community unless it has specific benefits for the state, said John-Mark Hack, Patton's liaison for agriculture.

Hack said there will be competition for the money from many quarters, including Patton's push for education programs such as early

childhood development.

Chandler predicted the health community will be the most likely and most interested contender for a large share of the money.

During last year's session, the General Assembly ordered that the money be used for agriculture and for health care. But Chandler said those restrictions are basically meaningless.

"The legislature can and will change that around," he said.

Agriculture leaders will have to do more than argue that they deserve what has become known as the Phase One money.

Sam Moore, president of Kentucky Farm Bureau, said they will need to put together packages, complete with cost-and-benefit analyses, for the governor.

"The burden lies squarely on the shoulders of the agriculture community to demonstrate need," said Hack, the governor's liaison.

And to do that effectively, he said, farm interests will have to cooperate.

But that's exactly what Moore and Burley Co-op President Rod Kuegel said they plan to do.

"We will all be unified when we go to the governor," Kuegel said.

Moore said the Farm Bureau plans to meet April 1 in Louisville with commodity groups for ideas, then prioritize those projects at the April 20 board meeting.

"Then we'll try to mesh our ideas with other agriculture groups" at the second in a series of informal meetings of farm leaders.

Jury rules death self-inflicted

LAWRENCEBURG, Ky. (AP) — Forensic pathologists consider every case a homicide until proven otherwise, Dr. Gregory Davis said.

"We're trained to think dirty," Davis said Friday during a coroner's inquest into the death last fall of AFL-CIO bookkeeper Donna Bayless.

But Davis, associate chief medical examiner for Kentucky, and other experts testifying said their investigations showed that the single gunshot wound to Mrs. Bayless' head was self-inflicted.

A coroner's jury concurred, taking barely 40 minutes to reach a unanimous finding Friday morning.

"As far as my office, it does put a close to the case," Anderson County Coroner Brian Ritchie said.

"For the community, and everything else pertaining to this case, I'm sure there will always be a lot of unanswered questions."

Kentucky State Police said from the outset that Mrs. Bayless' death was an apparent suicide. A stepson found Mrs. Bayless' body Sept. 19 on family property west of Lawrenceburg, after she had been missing for several days.

Ritchie said he asked a jury to help him determine the manner of death in part because of circumstances surrounding the case.

Mrs. Bayless had been suspended from her job at the AFL-CIO office in Frankfort just before she was reported missing Sept. 15.

Clinton 'working hard' on marriage

WASHINGTON (AP) — After a scandal-ridden year, President Clinton says he and his wife Hillary are "working hard" on their relationship and "we love each other very much."

He also said the box score of his presidency will show "one negative" when he lied about his relationship with Monica Lewinsky against "hundreds and hundreds and hundreds of times" when he did "not abuse my authority as president, that I was truthful with the American people."

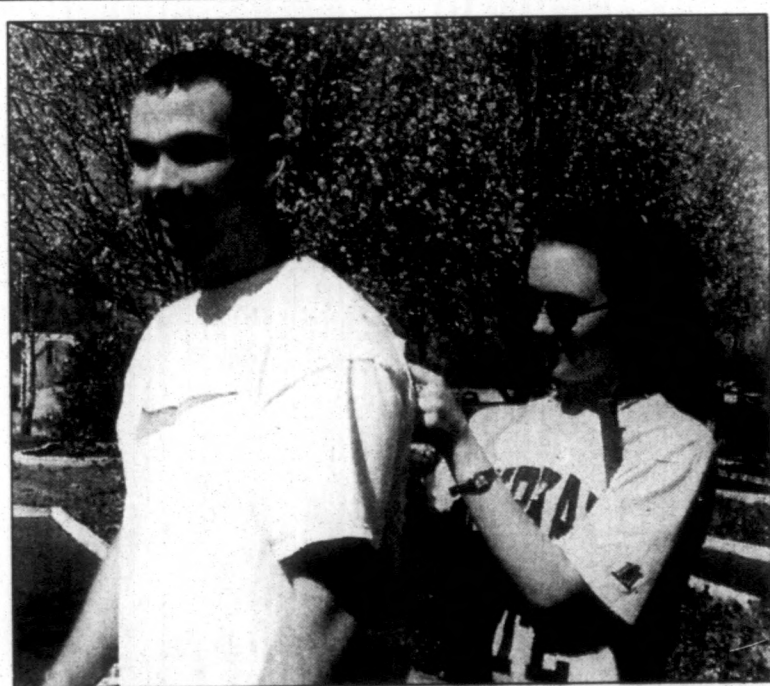
Clinton offered his accounting Friday at an hour-long news conference, his first full-scale question-and-answer session at the White House in nearly a year. The

primary topics were the prospect of military action against the Serbs and suspicions that China stole nuclear secrets from U.S. nuclear laboratories.

The president said NATO must be prepared to carry out airstrikes against Serbs because "hesitation is a license to kill." And he said the Serbs already had crossed the threshold that warrants military actions.

Clinton defended his administration's handling of China's suspected theft of secrets from U.S. nuclear labs in the 1980s. He also said, "To the best of my knowledge, no one has said anything to me about any espionage which occurred by the Chinese against

Newspaper wins appeal

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — Hardin County school officials improperly denied a reporter information on disciplinary actions against students, the Kentucky Court of Appeals ruled Friday.

A circuit judge said the information was exempt from disclosure under the Kentucky Open Records Act because it could lead to the identity of students or their parents.

An appellate panel disagreed. The reporter, J. Kyle Foster of The News-Enterprise in Elizabethtown, conceded that students' names are confidential. She requested school, year of occurrence, type of action and reason for it.

"There is simply no information which could easily lead to the identity of the students," Judge Tom Emberton said, writing the 2-1 opinion.

Hardin County Superintendent Lois Gray gave Foster a compilation of actions by the school board. The name, school, grade, age, race and offense of each student was blotted out.

Foster appealed to the attorney general's office, which said releasing the school name and category of offense would satisfy open-records requirements without violating student privacy. The school district appealed that ruling to Hardin Circuit Court.

Information requested by Foster "does not constitute an unwarranted invasion of personal privacy," Emberton, of Edmonston, wrote.

"The increase of violence, drug

Nichols: Bluegrass violated laws

PADUCAH, Ky. (AP) — State Insurance Commissioner George Nichols says Bluegrass Family Health has violated state insurance laws and will be penalized next week, a newspaper reported.

Nichols had planned to issue an order outlining the violations and penalties on Friday, but agreed to delay taking any formal action after meeting with Bluegrass officials late Thursday.

"We had a very good meeting in which we discussed our areas of concern and where we go from here," Nichols said told The Paducah Sun for a copyright story in Friday's editions. "We will give them time to review and respond to our findings and should have

something to make public early next week."

Nichols declined to say how Bluegrass will be penalized. The options include fines, orders to correct mistakes, orders not to do certain things in the future and, ultimately, a loss of the license to operate in Kentucky. The final option is not under consideration, he said.

A telephone message seeking comment on the newspaper report was left Friday at the office of Jim Fritz, the insurer's chief executive.

"I am excited that Bluegrass is in the marketplace in western Kentucky, because there aren't too many options down there," Nichols told

the Sun. "But the bottom line is that we still expect them to comply with the law."

Bluegrass has been under investigation since January, when doctors in Mayfield and Murray filed complaints about the Lexington-based health insurance company. The physicians accused the insurer of maneuvering its provider contracts in an effort to require its policyholders to use Western Baptist Hospital in Paducah.

The doctors said money was the motivator because both Bluegrass and Western Baptist are owned by Baptist Health Care Systems.

Loures Hospital in Paducah later complained that Bluegrass had violated a law requiring insur-

ance companies to sign contracts with any medical provider willing to accept the same terms as other providers.

Loures is the only hospital in western Kentucky that doesn't have an agreement with Bluegrass. Loures officials said they were willing to accept the same contract offered to hospitals outside of Paducah, but Bluegrass proposed a different contract.

Nichols said Bluegrass violated the "any willing provider" provision in Kentucky health care law. The provision prohibits health care benefit plans from discriminating

dog handling.

It was about that same time that a similar issue arose in a northern Kentucky department, Elias said.

"That's where most of the other officers started hearing about it," Elias said.

Robinson said police Chief David Smith told him to compile a memo with the number of extra hours spent related to the K-9 unit.

Robinson said he did some research dating back to 1992 and talked with dog handlers at other departments.

"Everybody was pretty much in agreement that it was one hour (a day)," Robinson said. He said he submitted his memo to Smith later that summer.

But the issue remained unresolved, so a frustrated Robinson filed a grievance Dec. 21. He said he cited the earlier memos that were requested of him and the fact that his research showed he was entitled to the overtime pay.

"I'd be crazy not to take it," he said Friday.

Robinson said his request in his grievance was based on a five-day work week and that he had built a pen for Max using donated materials and a sidewalk leading to it on his own time.

The Ledger & Times requested a copy of the grievance from the city through the state Open Records Act, but received no response as of Friday afternoon.

Crawford said he was unsure what caused the delay between the time Robinson was asked to submit a memo and December, but that he was assured the matter was being handled.

Crawford also noted the police department was dealing with other matters at the same time — a grand jury investigation into money missing from the department's evidence room, the death of Detective Mike Jump — and that the K-9 issue might have "fallen between the cracks."

Elias also was unsure what caused the delay.

"I didn't see (a memo) from

Steve," he said.

On Dec. 25, Robinson said, he started receiving overtime pay for the K-9-related work, but not for back pay.

"What we found was that it was a legitimate claim," Elias said, adding that City Attorney Don Overby researched the issue.

Last month, the city offered a settlement of about \$5,000 for back pay for the previous two years, Robinson said.

He refused it and later called the state Department of Labor, which told him he had earned the back pay, Robinson said.

Elias declined to discuss the settlement offer, saying it was "part of the negotiating process."

"There's been lots of different figures talked about," Elias said. Elias said the city initially learned the federal statute of limitations about grievances such as Robinson's was two years.

But a check with the state labor department showed its statute of limitations was five years, thus Friday's settlement, Elias said.

the labs during my presidency."

He also was asked about impeachment, the loyalty of former aides who have written tell-all books and allegations that he sexually assaulted an Arkansas woman 21 years ago when he was the state's attorney general.

His attorney has denied the assault allegation, and Clinton said, "He speaks for me. I think he spoke quite clearly."

Clinton refused to discuss his personal reflections about his bitterly partisan impeachment ordeal or comment on whether he feels resentment or relief. "It's best for me not to focus on that now. I think it's best for me to focus on my job. I have nearly two years to go."

But a questioner pinned him down about "what your legacy will be about lying" and the importance of telling the truth. After initially denying that he had an affair with Ms. Lewinsky, Clinton acknowledged last year that they had a sexual relationship and that he had lied about it.

He said the lesson for young

people will be that even presidents have to tell the truth and there are consequences when they don't.

"But I also think that there will be a box score," he said, "and there will be that one negative and then there will be the hundreds and hundreds and hundreds of times when the record will show that I did not abuse my authority as president, that I was truthful with the American people."

Further, Clinton said that "scores and scores of allegations were made against me and widely publicized without any regard to whether they were true or not. Most of them have already been actually proved false. And it's very hard to disprove every false allegation against you. But we have had more success, frankly, than I was afraid we would when we started."

He said he and Mrs. Clinton are "working hard" on repairing their relationship and that, "We love each other very much." He said he had not a clue whether she would run for a U.S. Senate seat from New York — but added

pointedly that the first lady had suggested they move there when he leaves the White House.

The president chuckled when a reporter asked why people "have been so mean to you. Is it a conspiracy, is it a plan?" He said that despite all his troubles, "I have been very blessed in my life."

He declined to criticize former senior aide George Stephanopoulos, now a television commentator, and former political adviser Dick Morris for writing books that reveal insider secrets and their personal feelings about Clinton.

"I haven't read either of the books or even any articles about it," he said. But he said he valued the loyalty and service he has received "from the overwhelming majority" of people who have worked for him.

The president reserved special praise for Vice President Al Gore, tweaked by Republicans for his claims that he invented the Internet and spent his boyhood plowing hills in Tennessee. He said it's a challenge for any politician to promote himself without overdoing it.

Her husband, who also worked for AFL-CIO, also had been suspended and has since been fired. National AFL-CIO officials have reported finding financial irregularities at the Kentucky office, including that Morgan and Donna Bayless allegedly were paid about \$285,000 over their salaries.

Morgan Bayless has denied knowing of any excess payments to him or his wife.

Detective Greg Wolf of the Kentucky State Police said Mrs. Bayless was last seen Sept. 15 when she dropped her teen-age daughter off for school. She spoke to the daughter about being worried about going to prison, Wolf said, and she hugged her daughter and told her she loved her.

"She thought that was unusual for her mother to do," Wolf testified.

Wolf said that before Mrs. Bayless disappeared, police had been interested in questioning her as part of an investigation of a Sept. 4 arson fire that destroyed records at the AFL-CIO office and a burglary in August. That investigation and an FBI investigation into possible embezzlement are ongoing, Wolf said.

Meanwhile, new details of Mrs. Bayless' death emerged at Friday's inquest, which lasted a little more

than an hour before the jury began deliberations.

Wolf's testimony revealed that a hose led from the tailpipe and into a rear window of Mrs. Bayless' car, indicating that she tried to use carbon monoxide to kill herself.

Wolf also testified that a second gun was found in the car, in addition to the weapon that Mrs.

Bayless used. The weapon Mrs. Bayless used was one of two .22-caliber handguns her husband had purchased at a Mount Sterling flea market, Wolf said.

Davis, the medical examiner, said the presence of multiple means of suicide was a strong indication that Mrs. Bayless intended to kill herself. He also said levels of carbon monoxide in her blood were not enough to kill her.

against any provider within the plan's geographic coverage area and willing to meet its terms and conditions.

During Thursday's meeting, Bluegrass officials expressed concerns about the provision because of a bad previous experience. While the insurer may have a legitimate concern, his agency doesn't have the authority to waive it, the commissioner said.

He noted that the Kentucky Court of Appeals upheld the law as constitutional last summer.

The other apparent violation is related to wrong information given to state workers last fall and win-

ter when they signed up for insurance coverage with Bluegrass.

The company published a list of providers that included doctors in Mayfield and Murray. After state workers signed up for coverage, however, the company said a mistake had been made and those doctors weren't part of the network. Those customers then were assigned to doctors with more distant offices.

Nichols said if Bluegrass doesn't agree with the findings in the order he will issue next week, the company could ask for an audience with a hearing officer from outside the Kentucky Department of Insurance.

use and behavioral problems within our schools heightens the public's need to know the disciplinary problems and their resolution by our school administrators and board members," Emberton wrote.

He ordered the circuit court to enter a judgment in favor of Foster and the newspaper, Judge R.W.

Dyche III of London concurred.

In a dissenting opinion, Judge Rick Johnson of Mayfield said he believed the disciplinary records were, in fact, exempt from disclosure. The information sought by Foster could be cross-referenced with school directories to easily identify students who had been expelled, Johnson said.

Suspect faces other charges

A fourth suspect wanted in connection with marijuana-related arrests in Almo faces felony charges related to the use of juveniles, including some children, in a sexual performance.

Calloway County sheriff's deputies arrested Bobby Harris II, 50, Thursday night, according to Sheriff Stan Scott.

Deputies charged Harris with use of a minor in a sexual performance, a Class B felony; distribution of matter portraying a sexual performance by a minor, a Class D felony; and possession of matter portraying a minor in a sexual performance, a Class A misdemeanor.

The charges stem from a March 9 raid by sheriff's deputies and the Murray Police Department's narcotics division of the Ellen Elizabeth James home on Radio Road,

where Harris also lived, Scott said.

James and two others, Marion Elizabeth Schaefer, 46, of Puryear, Tenn., and William H. Vaughn, 38, of the James' residence, were charged with marijuana possession and trafficking.

In addition to the drugs, authorities also found notebooks and photographs allegedly tying Harris to the sex-related offenses, Scott said.

The notebooks allegedly were diaries kept by Harris detailing his sexual activities with boys and girls approximately 6 to 14 years old, Scott said. The photographs allegedly showed some of the youth in the nude, he said.

Harris was also charged with first-degree possession of drug paraphernalia and trafficking in marijuana less than eight ounces, both misdemeanors.

Harris remained in Calloway County Jail Friday afternoon in lieu of a \$15,500 cash bond.

Clinton prepares for possible strikes

WASHINGTON (AP) — President Clinton tried to brace the nation on Friday for airstrikes in Kosovo following the collapse of peace talks, saying he knew military action would put American lives at risk but "if we don't act the war will spread."

With Clinton suggesting NATO action against Yugoslav President Slobodan Milosevic may be close, the State Department began evacuating the U.S. Embassy in Belgrade and the Pentagon sent more warplanes to the region.

"Our allies are strongly united behind this course," Clinton told an East Room news conference. "We are prepared, and so are they, to carry it out."

"Make no mistake: If we and our allies do not have the will to act, there will be more massacres," Clinton said.

Clinton refused to discuss whether Milosevic was under any deadline for complying, before NATO strikes. One hindrance might be next week's visit of Russian

Prime Minister Yevgeny Primakov, whose government adamantly opposes military action against the Serbs. He will be in the United States until Friday.

Earlier, he gave congressional leaders a detailed briefing on the crisis. They emerged saying they were persuaded that Clinton was ready to act — and needed to warn Americans that military action could include risk to U.S. pilots.

"We're on the brink of a very grave situation," House Speaker Dennis Hastert, R-Ill., said after the two-hour meeting.

Defense Secretary William Cohen ordered three more EA-6B Prowler electronic warfare planes and four KC-135 refueling aircraft to Europe to join the approximately 200 other American warplanes standing by for possible use.

At the news conference, Clinton noted that 40,000 of Milosevic's Serbian troops and police had massed threateningly on the Kosovo border.

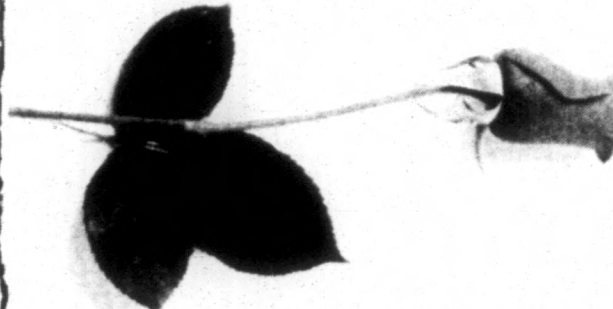

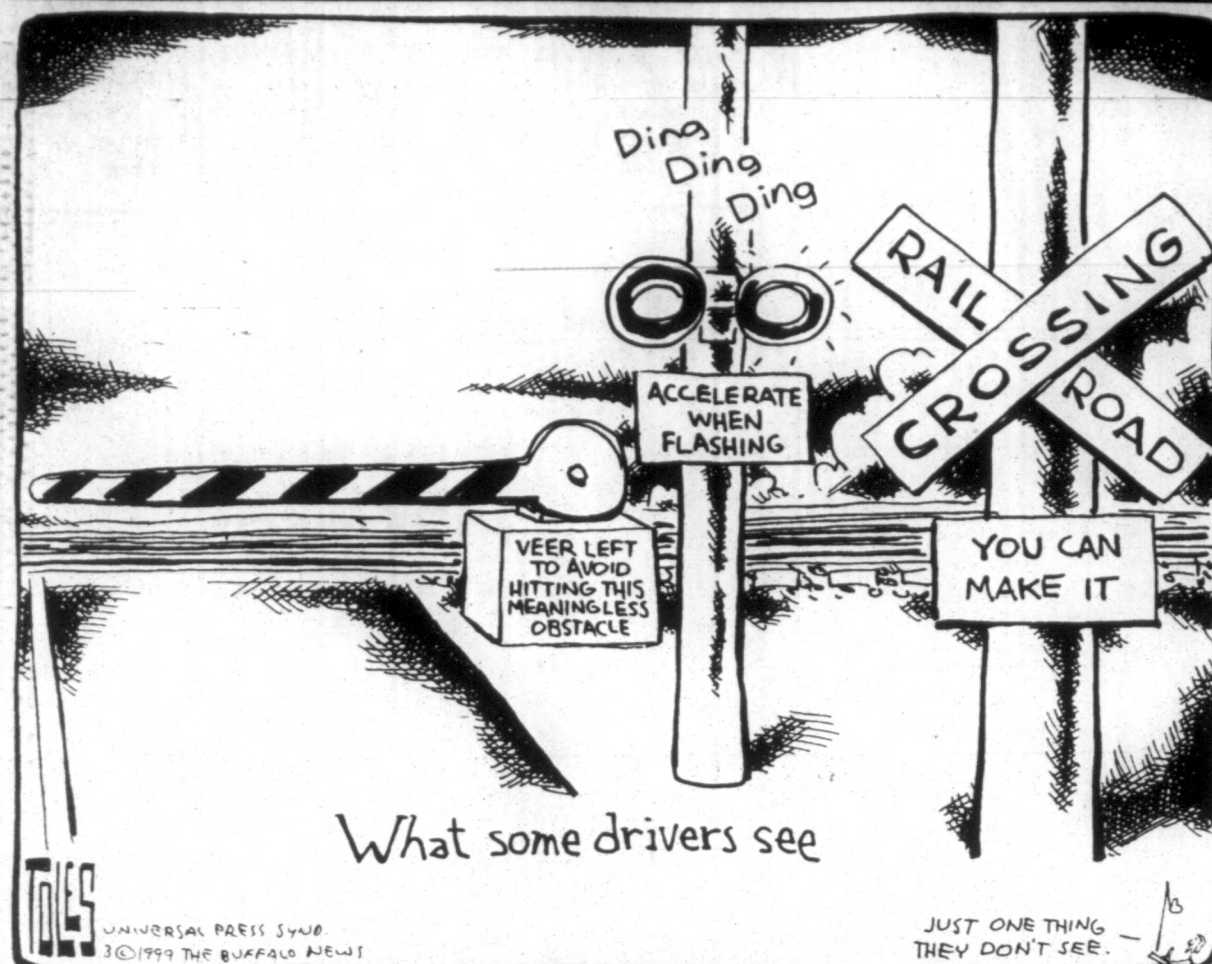

Items in houses could be salvaged

Dear Editor:

I wish to refer to the March 18 article about the hospital board meeting. In my appearance before the hospital board, I asked that they adopt a policy that would allow the public access to purchased houses prior to demolition.

I feel too often as though we have become a disposable society. To date, many salvageable items remain on the four lots on Poplar Street.

Structure and finish lumber, porcelain sinks, transoms, solid brick, hardwood flooring, leaded glass windows, moldings, and hardware remain only to be demolished and hauled to the landfill (to the tune of \$12,500).

Some see no value in "old" or "used" materials, but it should be realized that most of these things can no longer be purchased. If found, these items at restoration suppliers have exorbitant prices.

I question liability as a reason for prevention. We live in a litigious society, but the hospital properties must be some of the most heavily insured in the county. Liability waivers requiring signature could be presented at the time bids are accepted (common procedure throughout the country).

If contents were sold at bid, it would reduce hospital removal cost, but to mention less solid waste disposal. If not sold let it be given to those who can use it.

There is a high level of poverty housing in this county. Much of what is in those houses could be used instead of being buried.

Many individuals have approached the hospital administration regarding bidding on the numerous (157) houses the hospital has demolished in past years. They were refused.

To clarify a statement, the person who secured a backhoe for tree and shrub removal had prior permission from the Stubblefield family.

All were desperately trying to preserve memories and history. Unknowingly, the agreement was not honored by the hospital. Many items in the yard were gifts to Congressman Frank Stubblefield.

Mrs. Stubblefield had a tree moved from Eighth and Poplar to her yard when hospital parking took that lot. Sadly, that same tree along with others will probably meet a demise for yet another parking lot.

We are so very fortunate to have the Murray-Calloway County Hospital expanding in this community. The health care improvements are miraculous since I moved here 33 years ago.

However, sometimes I still question if more is better. I was told by hospital personnel that expanding vertically is much costlier than expanding horizontally. Perhaps we need to examine at what cost.

EDITORIAL ROUNDUP

March 17 - The Sydney (Australia) Morning Herald, on European Union:

The resignation of all 20 members of the European Union's executive commission is a dramatic way for the many to take collective responsibility for the failings of some.

But why wasn't a different kind of responsibility — steady and unspectacular — seen earlier, and instead?

The committee of experts' report on fraud, mismanagement and nepotism in the European Union shows an organization insufficiently restrained by internal sanctions against inefficiency and waste.

It is a sorry indictment of an organization that was supposed to be a shining light, overriding petty nationalism and showing the way of the future that this inquiry would find it necessary to restate such a simple, fundamental truth.

March 17 - The Irish Times, Dublin, on St. Patrick:

There have been many aspects of our traditional celebration of St. Patrick which failed to reflect the character of the man — or the men — who brought Christianity to this island.

The Christian community he founded divided into a number of larger churches and a myriad of sub-groups.

Catholics and Protestants have seen St. Patrick uniquely as their own and they have staked their rival claims accordingly down the centuries, often in the most bitter, exclusivist terms.

It is only in the most recent times that they have begun to recognize that Patrick can be a unifying figure, a symbol of common historical experience, rather than a focus of rivalry.

It is a paradox — a positive one — that the feast which once marked some of the sharpest collision points between the Irish churches and between differing Irish identities should now become the focus of political rapprochement in Washington — even as it develops into a great public celebration, spread over a number of days, at home.

Differing strands of the Irish people are coming closer together. In spite of the wickedness and cruelty of the gunmen and the bombers, there is a gradual taking down of barriers and a growing hope that we will face the future in harmony and

cooperation. St. Patrick — both of him — would surely approve and give his blessing.

March 15 - Der Bund, Zurich, Switzerland, on the Kosovo talks:

Perhaps the western mediators have acted for too long as if there is a political solution for the various Balkan conflicts. They strove for democratization, to build a civil society, to strengthen the moderates — NATO diplomats can use pacifist terminology too.

But the citizens didn't go along with it. In the Republika Srpska they elected the nationalist Nikola Poplasen as president, and he is now fighting against his dismissal by the international official Carlos Westendorp who says he is Milosevic's henchman.

In Kosovo, where Milosevic had taken away the economic and political future from the Albanian majority, the result was an uncompromising Albanian nationalism.

NATO's compromise solution — autonomy but for the moment no independence for Kosovo — is at best supported by the Kosovo Liberation Army for tactical reasons.

And the second round of Kosovo negotiations ... will end without a political solution. At the most, it will succeed in forcing a ceasefire — but then only if NATO doesn't put its credibility at risk with empty threats.

March 15 - Clarin, Buenos Aires, on land-mines treaty:

With the entry into force of an international treaty to ban landmines, a small but significant step has been taken for peace and international security.

The more than 100 million mines scattered throughout the world are one of the most ominous testaments to a century of wars of annihilation and of massive death. ... In Latin America, a great quantity of these landmines remain, still causing mourning and anguish today.

The treaty's implementation is a significant expression of the advances toward a civil world order ... but steps remain, including the adherence to the treaty of the United States, Russia and China, among others.

Muddling toward mediocrity

The local moviehouse's ticket office looks upon my appearance as an annual occasion much like the swallows returning to San Juan Capistrano each March.

I'm not much a moviegoer, but I usually get to one a year — after saving up enough for a tub of buttered corn and a large coke.

This year's annual public appearance was to attend "Shakespeare in Love," an absolutely marvelous movie — well-acted, fast-moving, witty, with fine scenery and costumes — deserving Academy Award nominations.

I haven't enjoyed a movie that much since "Field of Dreams" and, before it, "It's a Wonderful Life" (which, parenthetically, has its own web-site).

"Shakespeare in Love" set me to thinking about what a wonderful life it would be to live in a world that loves and understands Shakespeare.

Sadly, that isn't the case with our world.

Lou Harry, writing in a current issue of "Gaffly," envies Englishman J.C. Trewin's attendance since 1922 of 85 different productions of "Hamlet," and laments the lack of Shakespearean productions in the United States to attend.

Outside of Washington and New York, only Ashland, Oregon and Montgomery, Ala. offer regular Shakespearean fare.

Not only are Shakespeare productions few and far between, Harry said, they are limited in their choices of plays, usually confined to "Midsummer Night's Dream." When, really, was the last production of "Pericles" in Arkansas or of "Coriolanus" in Mississippi?

In the early 1950's a traveling troupe of Shakespearean players made the college circuit.

Our high school class was loaded on school buses to go to Murray State to see "Merchant of Venice."

We learned excitedly from it about social prejudices against the Jews and against women in professions such as law, and when later lessons came from studying the Holocaust and from women's liberation spokeswomen, we were far more sensitive than we might have been had we not seen Shakespeare live and on stage.

When we were required, as had been every English class in our high school for 50 years, to read "Julius Caesar," we lucked out when a movie of the play was released at that same time, starring Marion Brandon, Louis Calhern, James Mason, and others.

We understood the play watching it better than from reading it. The stabbing of Louis Calhern was every bit as gripping as the slaying of Janet Leigh in Hitchcock's "Psycho," and the lines when heard made us want to memorize whole speeches.

With little Shakespeare available to see on the stages of the Southland, we are reduced to reading Shakespeare's plays.

Alas, they are not easy reading, scarcely likely to awaken one's mind, and more likely — in reading them alone and silently — to put one to sleep.

Shakespeare is best when seen as it was written to be seen, not in books but upon stage.

But in a consumer-sensitive market of epic movies and rock stars, would people actually go to see Shakespeare if it were available in a local playhouse?

We have noticed that beautiful things often get cut out of the public view.

When buildings are built and

funds run short, the first thing to get cut is the ornamental horticulture that should have framed their space.

When rooms are furnished, the first thing to get cut is artwork for the walls.

The same holds true for all the arts. They seem to most people, especially people consumed with working hard in order to be able to afford the goods a consumer-society must sell in order to have jobs to produce consumers, the fine arts get short shrift in funding or public interest.

The great challenge facing democracy, Alexis de Tocqueville and James Fenimore Cooper noted rather early in the 19th century, was the tendency to reduce culture to a lowest common denominator.

"Our weakest point," Cooper said, are "provincialism, with their train of narrow prejudices, and a disposition to set up mediocrity as perfection."

Tocqueville, infatuated with democracy, nonetheless warned, "I do not believe there is a country in the world where there are so few ignorant and so few learned individuals. A middling standard is fixed in America on human knowledge."

They ask — and we join in their questioning — what does it profit the nation to have such an admirable spread of schools and to provide so many years of schooling, and yet to graduate students into being citizens who have never heard an opera nor a symphony, never visited an art exhibit, never read Homer nor Dante, and never seen Shakespeare performed?

Searching for truth

Just once it would be refreshing to hear a word of truth from the Clinton White House.

Energy Secretary Bill Richardson wants the public to believe the administration has been on top of the leaks that have allowed the Communist Chinese to get their hands on who knows how many of our secrets.

Asked by George Will on ABC's "This Week" whether the administration has found a way to monitor the e-mail from such important sites as the Los Alamos National Laboratory in New Mexico, Richardson dodged the question. Later on the same show, Rep. Chris Cox (R-Calif.), whose House committee has concluded an investigation on security breaches with China, said the e-mailing of secrets continues to be a problem not only at Los Alamos, but also at other research sites.

Only the morally obtuse and those with something to lose if the truth were known continue to believe that the administration remains pure in its China dealings.

Can anyone now say with a straight face that Clinton's people did not exchange secrets with the Beijing regime for campaign cash?

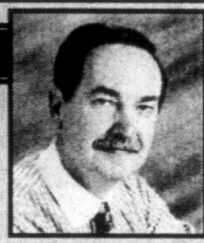
If all the Friends of Bill who fled to China were brought to Washington and told what they know, does anybody still exist who thinks their testimony would not provide evidence implicating people at the highest levels of our government in an espionage scandal?

Why have Chinese arms and drug dealers and members of the People's Liberation Army enjoyed regular access to the White House, the Pentagon and top research

facilities (which they continue to have) unless a deal was struck between desperate politicians eager to hold on to power and desperate Chinese Communists eager to know how to build more efficient weapons of mass destruction and acquire the missile technology and guidance systems to deliver them?

China's prime minister, Zhu Rongji, is scheduled to visit Washington next month.

In any deals arranged at this meeting, President Clinton will be bargaining from a position of weakness because the Chinese know the depth of his compromises with them.

They have the records and the people to prove how much he may have jeopardized America's national security just to keep himself in office.

He cannot afford to get tough with Beijing because of what the Chinese know about him.

They are to him what J. Edgar Hoover and his files were to John Kennedy.

In considering China, the left exhibits the same foolishness it did with the Soviet Union: a belief in "moral equivalency."

Many believe our approach to China ought to be one of "understanding."

If we treat them right, they'll treat us right, the thinking goes.

But the Chinese are smarter than the Soviets ever were.

They know better than the Soviets how to use such flawed notions against us. China is unlikely to change its view of the West, of capitalism, of democracy and of free speech simply because we play nice with them.

Cox hints that his bipartisan report will show how many of our top secrets are now in the hands of a major adversary.

The administration should not be allowed to escape full accountability and a thorough investigation of what happened on its watch. Excuses concerning when the security breach started are irrelevant.

This administration has known about it for at least six years and apparently did little or nothing until Richardson fired the Los Alamos scientist suspected of being a major conduit for U.S. secrets.

His explanation for waiting so long lacks credibility and ranks up there with Al Gore's claim to Internet paternity.

Let the investigation resume, this time without timetables and stonewalling by the Democrats who risk their own political future if they allow politics to trump national security while the world becomes increasingly dangerous, thanks in large part to what China is doing with American defense secrets they steal and American computers they buy.

Anglers experience tough week

This was absolutely the toughest week to fish we've had this year. Every combination of foul weather we didn't need came our way and totally shut the crappie down for three days.

Many of our local residents found out just how tough it was by trying their hand. Most of them were able to leave early or quit after a couple of hours of no bites.

I had all week scheduled to fish with Bob and Faye Lewis and Tommy, Robin and Eric Conley, who are from West Liberty.

They came down to catch some crappie that were bragging size, and we really had to work hard to do that.

Cold, frosty mornings are not the best of times to be using a rod and reel, or trying to hold a slippery shiner minnow and slab it with a hook.

The wind was blowing at daylight each day, and it continued throughout -- seeking out each nook and cranny one tried to hide behind and catch a fish.

I think our biggest problem was the fact that the wind was always blowing cold air.

It never did warm up over the water, and the short ripples continued to move to the surface.

Now, the water was rising almost two feet every day. And plenty of color was coming into the lake from the main channel.

This is usually a perfect scenario for rising water to help bring

schools of fish up from their winter depths.

Once they move with the fresh warmer water rising, they encounter the abundant food sources in the shallows and begin to feed.

I think the only factor that helped us on the nature side is the water temperature continuing to rise each day.

When we started out Monday, it was 43 degrees. And by noon on Thursday, we were fishing in 50 degree water.

This was the same place we started, and the water never did get stained as the lake rose.

On Thursday, the elevation was going the other way. It dropped eight inches by 1 p.m.

Throughout the last rain period, live minnows a size larger than what you normally find around here seemed to work the best.

However, I've found that the big crappie were more receptive to a roadrunner jig as the temperature rose each day.

It could have been the only thing

moving in the area, and drew the strike as a reaction to the movement.

We were forced to try many different areas, and gradually the crappie began to respond to our baits.

Bob and Faye really like to use minnows for crappie. So I had to choose banks to allow that. The action was slow, and it was cold.

These are super nice folks, and I was happy that the fish started to feed and respond to our efforts. They both caught some big crappie, but not what we wanted in numbers.

We even tried some of the fast current points on the main lake in hopes of finding a run of white-striped bass.

During this time, I have discovered a problem Robin Conley was having with his rod and reel.

She is left-handed, and a push button spin cast outfit is awkward for her to use.

I switched her over to my ultra light open face skiman. And bingo -- the magic began!

This lady emerged from the coon as one smooth fishing machine, able to do away with all bad casting habits. And best of all, she caught crappie and smallmouth bass.

Her husband, Tommy, and son, Eric, tried their best to outfish her. But it just couldn't be done. Robin believed in the magic and made her casts accordingly.

It has been a long time since I have seen such a great attitude shared by an entire family as the Conley and Lewis families did. It was a great time for me.

Eric, who is 18 going on 30, has an answer or saying for every situation. But when his mother constantly outfished him, he was weakened to mere muttering.

Finally, his lure was struck. He reeled in a big crappie, and suddenly he was giving lessons and autographs.

Our catch went from two fish a day to 15. And on our last day out, we caught 39 crappie, two bluegill, one shellcracker, one yellow stripe and one beautiful four-pound smallmouth.

One can't help but think what it could have been if the weather had been more favorable.

The company I was with couldn't have been improved upon. They were the best.

See you folks when the white stripes start jumping.

Commission sets deer seasons, zones

The Kentucky Fish and Wildlife Commission set deer hunting seasons and zones for 1999 at their meeting Feb. 26 in Frankfort.

With the exception of the calendar shift, deer hunting seasons will be the same as last year.

Archery deer season opens Sept. 18 and runs through Jan. 17, 2000. Youth deer hunt weekend is Oct. 16-17. Muzzle-loader season is open the following weekend, Oct. 23-24.

Modern gun season opens Nov. 13 and runs through Nov. 22. Crossbow season opens Nov. 23 and runs through Dec. 2. Muzzle-loader season reopens Dec. 11 and runs through Dec. 17.

In addition to other deer hunting seasons, a two-day firearm season for antlerless deer will open in zone one counties Dec. 18-19, with a bag limit of one antlerless deer.

Statewide or zone one bonus permits must be used. A hunter who has filled statewide and bonus zone one permits in an earlier season not be able to participate.

The Fish and Wildlife Commission approved zones for the upcoming deer seasons. Sixty-four counties were liberalized while three were restricted.

Zone one counties are: Allen, Anderson, Ballard, Boone, Butler, Caldwell, Calloway, Campbell, Carlisle, Carroll, Christian, Crittenden, Franklin, Fulton, Gallatin, Graves, Grayson, Hancock, Hardin, Henry, Hickman, Hopkins, Jefferson, Kenton, Livingston, Logan, Lyon, Marshall, McCracken, McLean, Muhlenberg, Ohio, Oldham, Owen, Shelby, Spencer, Todd, Trigg, Trimble, Washington, Webster and Woodford.

Zone one means a 10-day either sex modern gun season and either sex muzzle-loader and archery seasons. An additional two-day antlerless only weekend is held in zone one only.

Beginning this year, all deer must be checked in using the tele-check phone system.

A presentation given by Wildlife Division Director Roy Grimes on the accuracy and convenience of the tele-check system convinced the commission to approve it as the only check-in method for 1999.

The phone number for using the electronic deer check system is 1-877-CHK GAME. Hunters may check in deer from any phone, but walk-in check stations offering phone service will be listed in the hunting guide.

Also this year, hunters are required to notch or cut out the information on their deer tags, instead of making it with a pen or pencil, before moving their deer.

The new procedure will keep dishonest hunters from attempting to reuse a tag by erasing the information.

Other changes that affect deer hunters concern quota hunts, or managed draw hunts.

The commission voted to repeat all 1998 hunts, but make changes to individual hunts on some wildlife management areas and state parks.

This year, quota hunt applications can apply in parties of up to five individuals. Last year, the limit was four.

Where check-out is required, any hunter who fails to check out will be disqualified from applying for the next year's quota hunt.

Tips for other first-time turkey hunters

What seemed a simple task a couple of months ago is growing more complicated every day.

Sitting in a deer stand and watching a flock of turkeys tear up the hillside beneath you lends itself to a false sense of simplicity.

Immersing myself in the study of turkeyology, I have found the opposite to be true.

For starters, big tom turkeys, the object of the ordeal, undergo a "Jekyll/Hyde" transformation in early spring and set about to impress the female turkey world by puffing up their feathers, fanning their tail and strutting their stuff in front of the ladies.

The game plan at this point is for the hunter to mimic the language of an amorous hen and entice the old boy to come for dinner.

Unfortunately, any old longbeard worth his spurs has been fooled more times than a fifty year old bachelor and is almost as wary. He'll cackle out an order, then wait for the hens to come running to him.

A good strategy, I have found, is to use a hen decoy in conjunction with a good bit of hen turkey language to convince the old boy that what he sees and hears is worth investigating.

The hard part is knowing what to say in turkey language, since they appear to have a vocabulary exceeding that of some small nations. The wrong thing said, however, is disastrous -- be it in the turkey woods or at your wife's dinner party.

The real trick is to fool Mr. Longbeard into thinking that the plastic hen he sees sticking up

across the clearing is not only real, but is a new intern with a crush on him.

Of course if they were as easy as Bubba, turkeys would have long since gone the way of the Dodo bird.

If all the experienced turkey hunters will bear with me, here are a few things I have found important to the beginning hunter like myself.

First and foremost is safety.

Always sit with you back to a tree large enough to shield your body from behind, and be still -- both turkeys and hunters may key in on any movement.

Wear visible hunter orange while walking to or from your hunting area, and avoid blue, red, or white colors that another hunter could mistake for turkey colors.

Do not use a gobbler call that could attract other hunters. Never, EVER shoot at sound or movement -- be 100% sure of your target BEFORE you shoot.

As for turkey guns, most hunters prefer a 12-gauge with 3-inch shells. Although trend is toward 3 1/2-inch magnums, the shorter shell will do fine with less punishment on your end.

Use number 4, 5, or 6 shot. Buffered, copper-plated shot seems to be the preferred choice.

The most important thing to know about your turkey gun is

where will it shoot.

Buy or draw a turkey target, and make sure your gun will place at least six pellets in the head and neck area of the turkey at 40 yards.

If it won't, try a different load/shot combination, or change the choke. As for calling, the beginning hunter can get by with only two calls -- the yelp and the cluck.

Since it's fairly difficult to explain the proper turkey yelp in the newspaper, I suggest you purchase a tape of Messrs. Knight and Hale or some other master yelper.

For your own safety and well being, do not practice calling turkeys in the house, unless you are a 50-year-old bachelor.

The proper attire is head-to-toe camo.

Any good pattern will do as long

as the fabric is quiet. Gloves and face mask are also required. If you wear white socks, make sure they're covered.

The most important factor in hiding is to be perfectly still. So don't forget a good cushion for your nether regions.

In other news, the KDFWR has released the dates for the 1999-2000 deer season. Archery season starts Sept. 18 and will run through Jan. 17.

The youth hunt is Oct. 16-17, muzzle-loader Oct. 23-24, and the modern gun season Nov. 13-22. Muzzle-loader season will reopen Dec. 11-17, and will be followed by a new antlerless only season, Dec. 18-19 in Zone 1 counties only.

It looks like all of the Western Kentucky counties are Zone 1 for the upcoming season, allowing antlerless deer to be taken throughout the season.

This looks like a dud to me, and I'll have more to say later. Meanwhile, let's hit the woods and listen for gobblers!

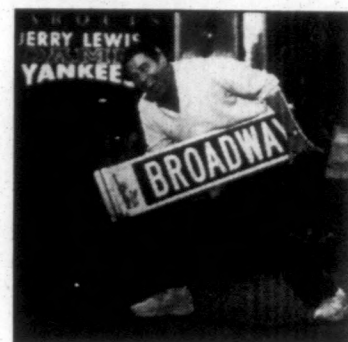

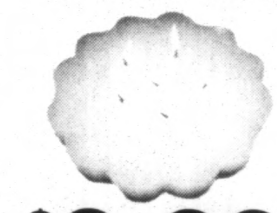

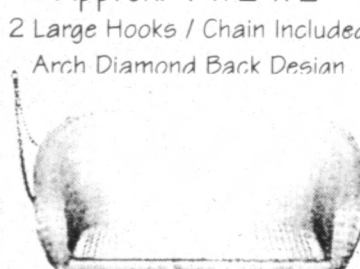

'Cats stop Wally, Miami

Padgett's 17 key for UK

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Kentucky didn't need to stop Wally Szczerbiak to close down Wally World. Szczerbiak scored 23 points in his final college game, but got almost zero help from his teammates as the defending national champion eliminated Miami of Ohio 58-43 before a record crowd of 42,440 in the Midwest Regional semifinals Friday night.

"You're not going to stop Wally Szczerbiak from scoring, he's too good a player," Kentucky coach Tubby Smith said. "What you want to do is make sure the other guys don't beat you. It's just an unbelievable performance by our team."

Scott Padgett got all but three of his 17 points in the second half for Kentucky (28-8), the No. 3 seed. The Wildcats also had a dominating 37-18 rebounding advantage to move a game away from their fourth straight trip to the Final Four. The Wildcats will

take on No. 1 seed Michigan State, which held Oklahoma to 33.3 percent shooting in a 54-46 victory in the first semifinal.

This will be the first meeting between the teams since 1978, when Kentucky beat Miami and Michigan State in the NCAA tournament en route to a championship in St. Louis.

Kentucky has won 20 of its last 21 NCAA games, has played for the title the last three years and is in a regional final for the fifth straight year.

"Our veteran players are very poised and very focused," Smith said.

Szczerbiak was 8-for-16 and broke Ron Harper's school record for points in a season with 774. He concluded his wondrous three-game tourney run with 90 points before leaving with 1:32 left — his only bench time.

"It's been a fun ride," Szczerbiak said. "I'm going to leave with my head held high, because we accomplished something few Miami teams have."

Everybody else was a collective 6-for-28 for an overall 31.8

Duke advances with 78-61 win over Southwest

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. (AP) — Even Duke couldn't have kept playing as well as Duke had been lately.

The top-ranked Blue Devils had won their first two NCAA tournament games by an average of 41 points. Those were the last two wins in an 11-game stretch that saw them win by an average of 31 points.

So Friday's night's victory over 12th-seeded Southwest Missouri State in the East Regional semifinals by a more mortal 78-61 had some saying Duke looked almost normal.

"Anything would have been a letdown," Duke coach Mike Krzyzewski said of his team's recent play. "We've been playing great basketball, actually unusually great basketball."

Their 30th straight victory may not have been as dominant as the recent streak, but it did get the Blue Devils within a win of the Final Four for the second straight season.

Duke (35-1) will play sixth-seeded Temple, which beat 10th-seeded Purdue 77-55, on Sunday at Continental Airlines Arena, a building where it is now 14-1 and from which it has moved to the Final Four half of the eight times the Blue Devils have gone there under Krzyzewski.

"When you bring really great teams into an arena you're going to win a hell of a lot of games," Krzyzewski said. "I should have good records in a lot of buildings."

The latest win came as a result of some good defense by Duke and a solid offensive outing led by Trajan Langdon's 24 points on 9-for-14 shooting.

Langdon, who had a career-high eight rebounds, had missed the last two games of the Atlantic Coast Conference tournament and the NCAA opener with a sprained foot.

"I was able to practice all week and it feels real good and is responding well," Langdon said.

Chaney, Temple edge closer to first Final Four

EAST RUTHERFORD, N.J. (AP) — Temple coach John Chaney got within one victory of his first Final Four with a "technical knockout" over Purdue.

The Owls broke the game open after Purdue picked up two early technical fouls and went on to beat the Boilermakers 77-55 Friday night in an East Regional semifinal.

"It kind of gave us our momen-

tum," said Mark Karcher, who led the Owls with 21 points, including eight in the game-breaking 30-7 run fueled by the technicals. "Every time we got the ball back then, we executed our offense. It got us in the flow of the game and everybody just ran the script."

To get to the national semifinals in St. Petersburg, Fla. Chaney and his sixth-seeded Owls (24-10) must find a way to beat top-ranked Duke, which beat Southwest Missouri State 78-61 earlier in the night.

"Duke is the best team in the NAAs," said Temple point guard Pepe Sanchez, who led the Owls with 17 points, nine assists and six steals. "We've prepared the whole year because we want to win the championship and Duke was going to be in our way. One day we were going to play them and it's going to be Sunday. What can we do, we just can't let them win."

Temple took control after 10th-seeded Purdue picked up two tech-

nicals during a 19-second span early in the first half. The Owls then scored eight straight points to start the big run.

On the first technical, referee Donald McAllister whistled Purdue guard Jaraan Cornell for a retaliatory shove. The second was called on Boilermakers coach Gene Keady for arguing with the officials.

"Jaraan is such a mild-mannered guy, that was a reaction that was caught, not an action," Keady

said. "I thought it was unfair. I wanted to stick up for my player. I felt we came out very unemotional and I guess I just overreacted to it."

Kevin Lyde started the run with a rebound follow with 13:21 to play. As the freshman center walked to the line for a foul shot, teammate Quincy Wadley pushed him playfully in the back, also grazing Cornell. Wadley then shoved Cornell again and Cornell shoved back and got a technical.

"The outside official made a mistake and called the technical," Cornell said. "There was nothing I could do about it. I thought a warning to both of us would have been a better way."

Lyde, who scored all 14 of his points in the first half, made his free throw and Sanchez made the two shots from the technical for a 12-11 lead.

Rasheed Brokenborough was fouled on the ensuing play as Temple kept possession.

Lakers hope changes, new attitude help

Matt Freeman hopes a change of attitude and a fresh start will help put his Calloway County Lakers back on track in 1999.

The first-year coach — replacing Eddie Morris, who resigned after last season — is looking to inject new life into a Laker baseball program that suffered through growing pains and internal struggles during a dismal 3-25 finish in 1998.

"There were a lot of problems within the program last year," said Freeman. "Some attitudes on this team were not good, and that carried over to the other players."

"Baseball is a long season anyway. But when you start out losing five or six games in a row, then people start talking and you start having players quit ... It just wasn't a good situation," he added.

To help turn things around, Freeman and assistant coaches Zack Hobbs, Richard Collins and Nick Houghton started with a fundamental tradition in athletics.

"We set them down and asked each one of them to set an (individual) goal, and then to set some team goals," Freeman explained.

"Our first goal is to win 15 games. Another goal is to win the first game of the district tournament, and then to make it into the region tournament — which we would do by winning in the district."

The CCHS coaching staff has also changed a few team rules and added a few new twists, looking for a

Spartans slip past Oklahoma

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Michigan State isn't the smoothest team in the NCAA tournament, although the Spartans may be the toughest. Oklahoma found that out Friday night.

Michigan State shut down the Sooners' perimeter shooting, flattened their best player and muscled its way to a 54-46 victory in the Midwest Regional semifinals.

All-American point guard Mateen Cleaves, whose collision with Oklahoma star Eduardo Najera knocked both players out, was only 3-of-14 from the field and his top-seeded Spartans shot just 40 percent. But 13th-seeded Oklahoma was held to 33 percent and was just 4-of-15 from 3-point range, where the Sooners had been so effective in the first two rounds.

"It was an ugly game," Cleaves said. "It's been an ugly tournament for MSU, to tell you the truth. But the guys are coming through, we've come together as a team and we're in the Great Eight."

With their 21st straight victory, the Spartans (32-4) advanced to the regional finals for the first

time since their national championship season of 1979.

Oklahoma (22-11) held its own on the backboards and gave up only one fastbreak basket. But the Sooners got just seven points from Najera, none in the final 16 minutes, and couldn't shake Michigan State's perimeter defense.

"If you had told me before the game that we would have more offensive rebounds than Michigan State, that they would have just seven and Mateen would go 3-for-14, I would like our chances," coach Kelvin Sampson said.

"One of the things that's jumped up and bit us in the butt this year is the inability to make shots, but Michigan State deserves some of the credit."

Oklahoma had a 14-6 rebounding margin after the first 12 1/2 minutes against a team that came in averaging 10 more rebounds per game than its opponents. The Sooners also did a good job penetrating against the Spartans' man-to-man defense, and as a result only trailed by a point at half-time.

During the break, coach Tom Izzo reminded his team of how it

Montgomery gets scare from Wayne Co. in Sweet 16

BOWLING GREEN, Ky. (AP) — Undersized and underpublicized, Wayne County nearly spoiled Montgomery County's perfect-in-Kentucky season.

The Lady Indians had to rally from a nine-point fourth-quarter deficit and play an overtime session before eliminating the Lady Cardinals, 68-58, to reach the state semifinals Saturday against Assumption.

Montgomery County, with two first-team all-stars, has been top-ranked all season and had not lost to a Kentucky high school. But the Lady Indians (33-2) nearly saw their 20-game winning streak end against the underdog Lady Cardinals, who played flawlessly for three-and-a-half quarters.

"We didn't have any all-stars, we haven't had a lot of press, and rightfully so, but this is what makes sports such a great thing," Wayne County coach Wayne Ryan said.

"It's amazing when individuals rise to the level this group has."

Danika Cox led Montgomery County with 20 points, and point guard Harmonie King came alive in the crunch. The first-team all-star sank a free throw to send the game to overtime, then scored 10 of her 15 points in the extra session.

Montgomery County's semifinal will be preceded by a Shelby County-Lexington Catholic matchup on Saturday morning. The

winners play at 7 p.m. CST Saturday for the state title.

Jane Conner scored 17 points for the Lady Cardinals (22-10) and point guard Whitney Shearer had 13 while running the Wayne County offense with near-perfect efficiency.

With Wayne County working for open perimeter shots and Shearer penetrating off the dribble against King and Amber Roby, the Lady Cardinals grabbed an early lead and built on it, refusing to fold

against Montgomery County's pressing, trapping defense.

With 5:30 left, the Wayne County lead was nine, 47-38. That was when Montgomery County started to chip away, sparked by consecutive 3-pointers from Cox.

Forward Marcia Patton made two baskets off the bench for Wayne County as her team tried to hold off the Montgomery County charge. But it was the basket Patton missed that will be remembered — an open layup off a perfect pass from

Shearer that would have put Wayne County up 54-50 with 1:35 left.

Instead, Montgomery County took the lead seconds later on a Roby 3.

After Conner's two free throws gave Wayne County the lead back, King made the second of two free throws with 7.6 seconds left to tie the game and force overtime, where the Lady Indians dominated.

Spring training injuries mounting

These spring training injuries keep adding up.

Nomar Garciaparra, Bobby Bonilla and Matt Morris are just the latest names to join a list headed by Kerry Wood, Moises Alou, Andres Galarraga and Kerry Ligtenberg.

Those latest three injuries are minor compared to the potentially season-ending ones earlier this spring. But with opening day just more than two weeks away, they are still troublesome.

Garciaparra, the Boston shortstop, said Friday that he has had "sharp pain" in his arm and has been unable to play in the field for

nine days.

Garciaparra, runner-up in the AL MVP race last year, was encouraged by a soft catch he had at a workout Friday, according to team spokesman Kevin Shea.

Garciaparra injured a tendon in his right biceps last Thursday against Toronto. He has been limited to DH duty since then with what the Red Sox called tendinitis in his arm.

"When it comes to a player of his caliber we tend to be cautious on how we handle these things," manager Jimmy Williams said from Fort Myers, Fla.

The news comes to a Boston camp that is still dealing with in-

juries to second baseman Jeff Frye, first baseman Reggie Jefferson and outfielder Midre Cummings.

Bonilla, the Mets outfielder, will miss at least 10-14 days with a partial tear in the posterior cruciate ligament.

"It's worse now than what I thought when I came to the park," Mets manager Bobby Valentine said from Port St. Lucie, Fla. "But it's better than I thought after I heard he (Bonilla) was going to get the MRI."

Bonilla injured his right knee in a collision while running the bases against the Montreal Expos on March 8. He reaggravated the injury Thursday. It's uncertain

whether he will be healthy by opening day April 5 against Florida.

"Ten days isn't bad, more than 10 is probably too much, seven days is good," Valentine said.

Morris, a St. Louis right-hander, has a sprained elbow on his throwing arm, and team officials aren't sure if he'll be ready for the start of the season.

Though more tests are needed to confirm the diagnosis, team physician George Paletta said Friday the exam revealed the sprain, along with strain on the muscle around the elbow.

Morris, 24, is being counted on as the Cardinals' top pitcher this season.

Southwest Missouri State (22-11), which had used solid defense to beat fifth-seeded Wisconsin and fourth-seeded Tennessee, was down just 39-30 at halftime against Duke. The Blue Devils were up 59-20 at halftime against Florida A&M and 53-23 against Tulsa.

There was no crushing run against the Bears; instead, the Blue Devils just kept steadily pulling away.

Langdon scored the first seven points in a 10-5 run that gave the Blue Devils a 57-42 lead with 12:35 to play.

The lead reached 20 for the first time with 6 1/2 minutes left when Elton Brand made the first of two free throws and Corey Magette tipped in the second for a 68-47 lead.

"I thought their offense was better than our defense in the first half and then we picked it up," Krzyzewski said. "Our defense was good in the second half and we were efficient offensively. Trajan was outstanding and SMS is a very good basketball team."

The Blue Devils failed to reach 80 points for the just the fourth time this season and the first since Dec. 22, a 71-60 victory over Kentucky at the Meadowlands.

"We knew in the back of our minds as coaches that we had to shoot a good percentage and they couldn't," Bears coach Steve Alford said. "The stats were fairly even except for the shooting percentage. That's why they're the number one team in the country, an outstanding team and the best team we've faced all year."

Brand had 14 points, eight rebounds and five blocked shots for Duke, which finished with a

41-35 rebound advantage, while William Avery had 12 points.

"When Trajan gets like that it really takes the pressure off me," Brand said. "When we have that many options it really helps my game a lot."

Allen Phillips had 16 points for the Bears, who were making their first appearance past the first round of the NCAA tournament, while Danny Moore added 15 and William Fontleroy had 10.

"We knew that if we could stay within double figures at halftime we'd have a chance," Bears guard Kevin Ault said. "Their defensive pressure was excellent the whole game."

The victory gave Krzyzewski a 46-12 record in the NCAA tournament, the best among active coaches, and leaves him one win behind John Wooden of UCLA for second place on the career list. Dean Smith of North Carolina is first with 65.

"Once we went up by 22, 23 points I was able to get Elton and Trajan out of there for the last five, six minutes to rest them for Sunday," Krzyzewski said. "We had to do some things in the second half that we haven't had to because we've been up 30 at that time. We have to get back to clipping coupons."

percent shooting percentage to make the RedHawks' first appearance in round of 16 since 1978 a big letdown. Miami (24-8), the No. 10 seed and tournament darling after upsets of No. 7 Washington and No. 2 Utah, tied its season low for points and set new lows for shooting percentage (31.8) and baskets (14).

Miami also scored 43 points in a loss to Kent March 3 in the Mid-American tournament final, and shot 32.7 percent in that game with 16 baskets.

Kentucky's zone defense made Szczerbiak work a lot harder than usual for his shots. It turned his teammates into a non-factor since Szczerbiak is basically Miami's lone 3-point threat.

"They did a great job of knowing what our weakness was," Miami coach Charlie Coles said. "When I saw that zone, I said, 'Uh-oh,

we'll never solve that.'"

Padgett hit both of his 3-pointers and had eight points in a 10-0 second-half run that put Kentucky in control at 45-28 with 8:03 to go. He had only three points at the break.

"I was talking to myself sitting on the bench," Padgett said. "I was happy to finally do something to contribute to the team because I hadn't helped it much to that point."

Szczerbiak knew the significance of that run: "That was all she wrote."

Heshimu Evans added 11 points and seven rebounds for Kentucky, which has beaten Miami 18 straight times since its last loss in 1927.

Miami, or more accurately Szczerbiak, went scoreless for nearly 8 1/2 minutes in the first half yet somehow kept it close. Szczerbiak had 15 of Miami's 19 points and the RedHawks shot only 28.6 percent (6-for-21).

DR. GOTT

DEAR DR. GOTT: Although I have always favored high-necked clothes and turtlenecks, I find that the pressure on my throat is uncomfortable. Do you have any suggestions?

DEAR READER: Good grief! Give me a break. To give you down in the country: You buy the bridge, you buy the bit. If the high-necked garments bother you, for heaven's sake, change to a different style. Or stretch the neckbands.

I wonder why you would choose to write me this question when common sense dictates that you solve the problem on your own!

DEAR DR. GOTT: My 70-year-old husband has had double vision for six months. All the tests are normal. His speech is slightly slurred. I think that he had a stroke, but the doctors say it's a nerve palsy. I'm very puzzled.

DEAR READER: So am I. A nerve palsy or weakness will usually affect just the eyes. When speech is impaired, the prudent physician should consider other causes, such as a stroke or brain disorder. I think that your husband should see a neurologist before permanent damage results.

To give you related information, I am sending you a copy of my Health Report "Stroke." Other readers who

DEAR DR. GOTT: I suffer from gout, for which my doctor prescribed colchicine to use for pain. I know it's caused by uric acid, but would like to know how I can control my uric acid so this intense pain won't return. Will a special diet help?

DEAR READER: Long ago, before the availability of anti-gout medication, diet was the mainstay of therapy. Although uric acid, the cause of gout, is normally manufactured in the body as a byproduct of protein metabolism, dietary sources of uric acid could certainly trigger attacks of painful gouty arthritis when combined with the body's own production. Consequently, gout sufferers were advised to eliminate alcohol and uric acid-containing foods — notably organ meats, such as sweetbreads, liver and kidneys.

Today, fortunately, such dietary prohibitions are largely unnecessary — although some restrictions are reasonable. (For example, liver not only contains uric acid but large quantities of cholesterol as well. Do I get free brownie points from all you adults who, as children, were told to eat your liver?) Modern drugs can effectively treat, as well as prevent, gout.

One of the more interesting types of squeeze plays available to declarer is the one known as the Vienna Coup, so named because it supposedly was first executed in Vienna.

The principle feature that distinguishes this squeeze from others is that declarer at one point in the play deliberately establishes a high card for one of the defenders. The purpose of this maneuver is to prevent the dummy or his own hand from becoming squeezed instead of one of the defenders.

East won the first two club

tricks and continued with another club, ruffed in dummy. South now had to win the rest of the tricks to make the contract.

Relying on a heart finesse appeared doomed to failure since East almost certainly had the heart king for his opening bid. The only hope, therefore, was to play for a squeeze. For the squeeze to succeed, declarer had to hope that East had to guard spades as well as the king of hearts.

The first move was to cash the ace of hearts. This play — the establishment of East's king as the high heart — was a necessary preliminary to the eventual squeeze.

The rest of the play followed standard lines. South simply cashed all five of his trumps, discarding the Q-5 of hearts from dummy.

Declarer's hand now consisted of the 10-3 of spades and J-7 of hearts, while dummy's last four cards were the A-K-Q-6 of spades.

But on the last trump lead, East also had to come down to four cards. At this point he had the J-9-5-2 of spades and king of hearts. No matter what East discarded, South was bound to make the last four tricks.

Observe that the squeeze would have failed if the ace of hearts had not been cashed earlier. Dummy would have been squeezed instead, and the contract would have gone down.
