#### Probe won't alter scores

NEW YORK (AP) - Two states that posted large gains on a national reading test would have shown only average performance had they not excluded more special-education students, an analysis by the Education Department reveals. One state with modest gains could also have been boosted by the exclusions.

Maryland and Kentucky, which were lauded last month for the 1994 to 1998 increases in reading scores of fourthgrade students, also excluded significant numbers of special education students in that time period. Minnesota could have claimed higher average scores because it excluded fewer spe-

Neither scores nor rankings will be affected, but the federal study of the 1998 test results could lead test-givers to change some policies, Pascal D. Forgione Jr., chief of the Education Department's statistical branch, said Friday.

"We have been woken up on the issue that we must monitor this participation rate," he said. "If it keeps going like it is, the increase could be statisically significant."

# Woman plans to

# Murray schools OK safety plan

The city school system has an official districtwide safety plan with suggestions for staving off problems before they happen.

But some of the plans proposals, which range from the installation of surveillance cameras to emphasizing conflict resolution and anger management, might depend on funding, said Superintendent W.A. Franklin.

Those measures that cost only someone's time are ongoing, Franklin said.

But suggestions such as the cameras, with an estimated cost of \$30,000 to install them at all three schools and on some buses, are not guaranteed, he said.

"We don't know if was have any money for them," Franklin said. The school system scrambles to find ways to pay for current expenses, he added.

Murray school board members approved the final draft of the plan Thursday night during its monthly meeting.

It was then sent by express mail Friday to the state Center for School Safety, which was created by the General Assembly last summer under House Bill 330, in order to meet today's completion dead-

line, Franklin said. HB 330 also required that every school district form a safety plan in order to qualify for funds for alternative education and safety strate-

plan means Murray will get to share \$170,000 in its alternative education partnership with school systems in Calloway and Graves counties and Mayfield.

Franklin said Murray's share will pay the salary for school resource officer Jerry Lee, the former Murray police chief. As part of the plan, he and other officers will patrol hallways and parking lots at the middle and high schools.

The safety plan is the result of a two-month effort by a committee, co-chaired by Franklin, that sifted through answers to surveys given to teachers, staff, students' parents and the students themselves.

The committee and its three subcommittees also reviewed current board policies and added members' input that was given during five meetings.

"We had a lot of really positive things that came through," Franklin said.

Almost every parent said they felt secure about their child's safety, he said, but many students said they had been threatened at least once.

Other components of the plan

· Addressing disrespectful and aggressive behavior and correcting it by establishing an advisee-advisor program.

 Clarifying the school's conduct code and rewriting it so elementary-age students can understand it,

## O'Bryan sentenced for July burglaries

Corey O'Bryan has been ordered to pay for his crime with his time - and money

The Poplar Street man has been sentenced to serve 10 years in prison for burglary, theft and being

a persistent felony offender. And O'Bryan and Ted C. Leopard of Hazel have been ordered to pay more than \$2,900 for items they took from, and damage caused at, two county businesses

last July 12. Calloway Circuit Judge Dennis Foust sentenced O'Bryan, 24, Mon-

day as part of a plea agreement. O'Bryan pleaded guilty to thirddegree burglary and theft by unlawful taking more than \$300, as well as complicity to both of those charges, and possession of a handgun by a convicted felon.

But the 10-year sentence was ordered in lieu of five years on those charges because of an amended count of second-degree persistent felony offender.

Leopard to Bob's Corner Market in New Concord, where they broke a window and took cigarettes and money. They were ordered to pay the store \$959.54.

# Bus driver urges caution

After 13 years as a bus driver for the Calloway County School System, Linda Cullop can tell when she is in trouble. "I can look at (drivers') faces and tell whether they see me or not," she said. "A lot of times, people don't."

She also said that all her years of experience, however, could never have prepared for the recent traffic problems she has encountered at Five Points and on Chestnut Street.

"It is just so frustrating when you've got the stop sign out, and you're blowing the horn, and people still don't stop," Cullop said. "It has gotten worse recently."

According the county attorney's office, passing a school bus while the stop sign is out is punishable by fines of up to \$200 for the first offense.

If the accused pleads guilty, the fine is automatically \$100. The violation can also be punishable by up to 60 days in jail. Cullop said that she often lets children out at the YMCA at 1510 Chestnut St. Since she is usually headed east, children have to cross two lanes of traffic to get to the building.

"That outside lane is not going to see them, and some-

body's going to get killed," Cullop said. Cullop has suggested to city police that a traffic officer be placed at the Five Points intersection in the afternoon until all

the buses have gone through. "It wouldn't take 15 minutes to get all the buses through there."

Deputy Police Chief Ken Claud said, however, that any traffic problems at Five Points will have to be taken up with the state.

"I don't disagree that something needs to be done about that intersection, but that's really up to the state," he said. "That would be something that highway planning would need to look into."

Cullop said she believes the rest of the problems on Chestnut Street have been caused by the addition of the new turn lane.

"We've always had people passing the stop signs, but it's become worse since they put the turn lane in," she said. "I think because of that turn lane, people are just ignorant that they have to stop."

Cullop said that the sheriff's department has reported writing numerous citations for violations on Chestnut Street. Even that, though, does not seem to be slowing people down.

"I understand that they can't (monitor the area) all the time, but somebody's going to get killed," she said

Claud said that until driver awareness increases, all the police can do is try and keep an eye out for violations.

"There's not much else we can do," he said. "About the only thing we can do is try and have officers in those areas, and they'll try to catch all the people they can who are doing that.

"I have turned (people) in before," Cullop said. "It's hard. though, to get license numbers when trying to watch the kids and the other traffic, too.'

### **Drivers** hospitalized in separate accidents

A Puryear, Tenn., woman remained in a Paducah hospital's intensive care unit Friday afternoon with injuries she received in a onecar accident in Hazel.

According to a Calloway County Sheriff's Department report, Theresa L. Ganz, 43, suffered a head injury Thursday morning.

She was taken to Murray-Calloway County Hospital before being transferred to Lourdes Hospital, an MCCH spokesman said. Ganz was listed in critical condition at Lourdes.

Ganz said she only remembers driving into Hazel from Tennessee on U.S. 641 South until her car came to a stop, the report said.

Witnesses said she appeared to be slumped over the steering wheel, the report said. Her car reportedly went up on the sidewalk near Dees Street, hit two road signs and five metal poles before coming to rest near Barnett Street

Meanwhile, a Guthrie Drive man who was injured when a tractor fell on him was listed in serious but stable condition in MCCH 's critical care unit Friday afternoon.

and are in that age range. There was an opportunity to have such a facility here."

McDonald, who previously served as director of the Bethesda Cancer Center in Cookeville. Tenn., said the local center could be considered one of the best of its kind in the country.

"I worked as a radiation oncologist in Cookeville, and the facilities there are not as nice as they are here," he explained.

"I don't know of anybody anywhere who has a center as nice as this one ... We just really want to give the message that we have what you need here. There's no need to go to Paducah or Nashville or Memphis.'

According to McDonald, the regional need for the center has exceeded expectations since its opening.

"To have a successful cancer center, you really need to be treating at least 20 people a day, as far as radiation treatments go," he

"That was a goal we were hoping to reach. And we reached that within the first three months. I'm an optimist, but I didn't think about it being this successful."

McDonald said the center is treating patients from all over the

"We're getting patients from all around this area," noted McDonald. "We have several patients from Mayfield, Calvert City and Paris (Tenn.). But the vast majority of our people are from Murray .. Over the course of the year, it's probably going to translate into about 250-300 people.

"It's really a unique thing for this area - something the whole region can be proud of," he added.

Another \$10 bill turned up Monday at the Union Planters Bank on North 12th Street in a deposit from McDonald's.

The same day, police charged a 17-year-old city boy with 11 counts of second-degree forgery for allegedly using a home computer, scanner and printer to copy the \$10 bills.

Those bills bore the serial number F22139088C.

In other reports, city police are still investigating the theft of a \$2,750 air compressor from Cunningham Auto Repair on South Fourth Street Thursday morning.



# Your Kentucky area code may be changing April 19th.

Western Kentucky needs phone numbers. Numbers for the kids, numbers for the office, numbers for pagers, faxes, and cell phones. And don't forget about computer modems. Each one needs a number, and there are only so many to go around. It's just a mathematical fact. So to open up a few million more, western Kentucky is getting a new area code: 270. If your area code is currently 502 and your phone number begins with any of the prefixes at left, 270 will be your new area code.

Starting April 19th, 1999, you'll be able to use new area code 270 for long distance calls made to and within western Kentucky. A transitional period will be in place until November 1, when you will then be required to dial 270 for all of these calls.

Please make a note of 270 and begin preparing for the change. You may need to reprogram telecommunications equipment like speed dialers, fax machines, PBXs – virtually anything that dials numbers automatically (consult your vendor if you're not sure). And if you live in western Kentucky, be sure to let friends and loved ones know your area code is changing.



'AUSTIN, Texas (AP) — A month from his debut as a presidential campaigner, Gov. George W. Bush professes amazement at his ranking atop the Republican field in a race he plans to run on his terms and on his timetable

He knows what's coming when he takes the road from Texas. He stayed put to deal with the business of the state Legislature, which adjourns at the end of the month. So Republican leaders came to him, 150 or more, to see, hear and endorse the man at the top of the preseason polls for the GOP nomination, and for the 2000 presidential election.

In an interview with The Assoctated Press, he talks in minute detail of state legislation, but he is purposefully vague on national issues. "I know what I believe, and I know what I will fight for," he said. "I will have a tax plan. III have plans on various issues which we will lay out on my timetable

"It's a very long and arduous road, as you know, and the temptation's going to be for people to want to know it immediately.

"What are you going to do on this, what are you going to do on

""I'll be specific in some areas and in some areas, I'll hold my fire, so I'll have something to say over the course of the fall and the winter.'

That will intensify the pressure, the questions, the criticism from other candidates and from commentators for a detailed platform from Bush.

But that kind of one-on-one campaign is difficult if not impossible in the era of nonstop television, boom microphones, crowds of reporters, Secret Service secu-

"I've got to go shake those hands," Bush said. "It's going to be interesting to see how we can accomplish that."

That's been his strength in Texas campaigns, not the stump speech to the crowd.

There will have to be more of the latter now, and more television campaigning.

All to put him to the special tests of the leader. "I know the expectations are high," Bush says. "As my daughter said, 'Dad, you're not nearly as cool as people think." He's about to begin finding out.

## Big fourth leads **Heat over Knicks**

Deciding game Sunday in Miami

NEW YORK (AP) - Patrick Ewing sat all alone at his locker, a look of dejection on his face so strikingly similar to his glassy gaze of playoffs past.

"We messed up. We messed up," Ewing said.

Just six words, but no others could have said it better.

The Knicks were thoroughly outclassed in the fourth quarter Friday night of what could have been their clinching game, dropping an 87-72 decision to the Miami Heat that forces a Game 5 in the firstround series Sunday.

It'll be the third do-or-die game between Miami and New York in as many years, but this time, for the first time, everyone will be at full strength.

"Without a doubt, the Knicks have been somewhat of a nemesis to us, other than the Bulls, and in adverse situations we've learned to come together, believe in ourselves and find a way to win," center Alonzo Mourning said.

"We showed that this evening, but all it guaranteed us was a trip back to Miami.'

With Tim Hardaway finding his scoring touch, Mourning shutting down Ewing and Miami's bench providing a sorely needed boost, the Heat staved off elimination. The fourth quarter was shockingly one-sided with Miami outscoring New York 29-10.

So now it's back to Miami Arena, site of so many memorable playoff moments from this fierce rival-

"I don't think we'll have any advantage," Miami's Dan Majerle said. "Homecourt hasn't meant anything in this series. Sunday is

going to be an all-out war." In 1997, several Knicks were suspended for a fight that took place late in Game 5 of a sevengame series, and in 1998 Mourning and Larry Johnson were banned from the building after another fight. Both teams will have all their weapons when they go at each other one more time.

"It's only befitting that we have to go through the series this way,"





DEAR DR. GOTT: The wood tick season is here again. How do you get a tick out once it is imbedded? What is the best way to keep ticks away?

DEAR READER: We have all heard of the clear nail polish method and the "hold-a-burning-cigarette-to-hisbehind" technique, but there are obvious disadvantages to these maneuvers, particularly for those of us who don't use nail polish and don't smoke cigarettes. Most experts recommend grasping the tick with tweezers as close to the head as possible, applying gentle but steady traction, and slowly rotating the tick during removal.

Your second question is more difficult. There are tick repellants for both animals and humans. In my experience, the animal variety is far more effective. Sometimes, exterminators can spray pesticide in areas where the tick population is particularly troublesome. Authorities recommend that people dress appropriately (long sleeves and trousers tucked into socks) when walking or working in tick-infested locales. And, of course, at the end of the day, a thorough tick-

tial. Ticks are remarkably versatile critters; they are difficult to repel and almost impossible to eradicate.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Awhile back, you published a column about the foul odor of fecal material, which you said was normal. Not always. I noticed that my bowel movements suddenly became very smelly and dark. During a colonoscopy, a bleeding tumor was discovered. Once it was removed, my stools returned to their usual unpleas-

DEAR READER: Good point, well taken. Bleeding into the bowel can, indeed, cause a change in the fecal odor that may be a tip-off to something wrong. In my original column, I said that fecal odor is largely a function of diet. I was remiss in not mentioning the very situation that you experienced. Thanks for writing.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I am violently allergic to aspirin. Yet I constantly hear that it is recommended both during a heart attack and for patients with stroke or coronary artery disease. If I can't take aspirin, what can I do?

DEAR READER: You're stuck. The risk of aspirin allergy (with a possible fatal reaction) far outweighs the potential benefits (protection from heart attack or a second stroke). Don't take aspirin in any form if you are allergic to it. Ask your doctor if, because of your health problems, you should be given a prescription anticoagulant that is aspirin-free.





# Kenlake fishing trip provides fun for all

I was lucky enough to fish with Joe, Dorothy and Sheryl Phillips for a couple of days out at Kenlake

We were a little worried about the water elevation rising so fast that it might have the fish displaced, and we wouldn't be able to

I stopped on a bank between Kenlake and Blood River early in the morning so we could cast some crankbaits down into the current.

It took a few minutes to find the right speed to retrieve our baits, but we did start hitting the area where some smallmouth bass were chas-

Everyone caught some of the "super bass" of Kentucky Lake before the sun was up and shining bright on the surface.

They were tough hitters and put up tremendous jumps so we could see them display their speed and strength. All of the bass were re-

Once the sun reached a certain height, the fish left the area entirely, we were forced to change our tactics and look for something

We decided to look for the big bluegill and shellcrackers.

It is almost time for them to be on their beds. And if we could locate a big school, some great fishing would be just ahead.

We found several willing bluegill and catfish, but only one shellcracker moving around the old betting areas where we had found them before the water kept rising.

This put most good areas under several more feet of water than normal, so we really expected the gills to be scattered.

Sheryl has become the queen catfish angler for the past two years because she consistently catches three to six-pound catfish on ultralight tackle and four-pound test

I held the net while she wrestled two around 100 yards of shoreline and across a bay before I could dip them. She did the work and I was worn out from watching and maneuvering the boat.

We kept a good bunch of fish, finally. But the water stopped rising and the air temperature was warmer the next day. That's when the Phillips family really loaded their FISHING LINE Jerry Maupin

Joe showed the catch, so I knew the change in the barometer really did help the bluegill to move.

They kept 130 of the big, hefty females that had moved up to the shallower banks.

I was with Joyce and Tommy Noel and Don Lane that day. We could tell the conditions were finally becoming favorable.

We were sticking to the artificial

lures and the possibility of hanging a super large striper while the water We caught several bass, stripes

We caught over 100 fish on crickets, so we could possibly do that again also.

Please pay attention when running the lake. It's full of trash and is dangerous to your health.

I have some more news about the changing water elevation. Now the level is falling rapidly. And probably before you read this - we

will be back to summer pool stage. What this means is all of the fish have to re-locate. In doing so, they may or may not bite.

With the water temperature still climbing into the low 70s, I expect them to feed.

The time is right, and so should the water be where you can find some hungry mouths.

I took Joyce, Tommy and Don out again, and we smoked the bluegill and shell crackers again on

We caught over 60 and were through fishing by 10:30 a.m. because of a rain coming and the cool

# Sportsmen have chance to improve results with planting

The key to sustaining populations of wild critters is improving their local habitat

Whether your target species is deer, turkeys, waterfowl, quail or rabbits, any improvement in the habitat will greatly benefit all species, both game and non-game.

Unfortunately, many hunters fail to consider the habitat needs of game animals until a couple of weeks prior to opening day.

Then they run out to the woods and dump a bag of corn or a bucket of apples on the grounding, expecting to stampede to the new honeyhole like a herd of starving cattle.

Even worse, they spread a little too much fresh grain around to attract doves. Instead, they end up attracting a flock of conservation ofon, folks - sowing corn on a field in the middle of August is NOT standard agricultural practice in

First and foremost, to improve habitat for wild animals, get rid of fescue. Fescue may have been a savior to soil in the 50s and 60s, but it has very little value to wildlife, and may even be toxic to some

In areas you want to improve for wildlife, it is imperative that fescue be banished.

Probably the quickest method to remove fescue is to spray it with Roundup, a Monsanto product that should be familiar to anyone who has a lawn.

through the county extension agent. In our area, the main focus of wildlife planting is to attract deer, turkeys and doves.

For deer, corn is the favorite. But it requires a higher level of small plots of one-fourth to onehalf acre.

This will require less than five pounds of seed. Check with local seed companies for broken or partial bags of seed. This year, I plan to seed white

clover into the standing corn. The clover will provide nitrogen for the growing corn, then will be a source of food into the winter. Leave the corn standing when it dries. Deer and other animal will

harvest the grain as needed throughout the winter and early spring.

One of the best all-around foods

for both animals and birds is milo or grain sorghum. This can be broadcast on prepared soil along with millet or other small-seeded plants

Maturing in early fall, milo will provide a bounty of seeds throughout the winter. Plant as much as management. I prefer two or three possible - birds have a voracious

> For doves, several options are available. Many farm stores sell a commercial blend of seed especially attractive to doves under brand names such as Doves-A-Plenty

> This is usually a mixture of millet, milo and sunflowers. Or, if your prefer, each of the aforementioned crops planted alone will be attractive to doves.

> Sow a large field around the first of June and wait until mid-August to mow. This practice is legal in Kentucky, as long as the field is not enhanced with extra grain prior to

Don't forget to feed your food plots. Drill fertilizer into corn rows as you plant or broadcast it over fields that will be sown. We're not shooting for record yields, so 100 to 200 pounds per acre should be sufficient.

Again, seek advice at your local farm supply store, seed or fertilizer dealer. Many will even rent or loan special applicators or spreaders. There are other items that need

to be deployed before summer. Put out livestock mineral blocks or salt blocks for deer. Deer need lots of nourishment while nursing fawns or growing

antlers. Consider applying fertilizer

to thickets and edge areas to improve the quality and protein content of browse.

Mass producing trees such as white oak also respond well to annual application of nutrients. Taking action now on your farm

or lease will help concentrate deer and other animals around the food source, improve the quality of the animals through nutrition and will lessen the pressure of high game populations on agricultural crops.

All species of wildlife benefit from our help throughout the year not just during hunting season.
