## Residents oppose museum

BURLINGTON, Ky. (AP) — A group of residents has asked a judge to block construction of a creationist museum in northern Kentucky that won local approval after a long zoning fight.

The group wants a circuit judge to overturn a decision by the Boone County Fiscal Court, which approved a zoning change last month for Answers in Genesis for its proposed museum, headquarters and distribution center.

In a lawsuit filed this week in Boone Circuit Court, the group contends the fiscal court acted in an "unreasonable, arbitrary and unconstitutional" manner. The fiscal court voted 3-1 to override the Boone County Planning Commission's recommendation and approve the zoning change.

The suit also says that Boone County Commissioner Robert Hay violated the due process rights of residents because he voted to approve the ministry's planned building even though he has friends within the organization and has appeared in the group's promotional materials.

## Camps increase security

(AP) — After a school year of shootings and copycat threats, summer camps are bracing for the arrival of millions of children — and tightening security to make sure tragedy doesn't follow them.

Some overnight camps are asking parents to pack their children's bags to keep out weapons, and camp directors say they will be more vigilant in searching campers and sending kids home if they don't behave.

"We feel the greatest tragedy of Columbine would be thinking it can't happen to us," said Bob Schultz, American Camping Association director of resource development, referring to the April 20 shooting rampage in Littleton, Colo., that left 15 people dead.

The Martinsville, Ind.-based ACA sent a letter to member camps urging them to review safety procedures and detailing when it is legal and appropriate to search campers.

Rodger Popkin, owner of North Carolina's Blue Star Camps and president of the ACA, sent a letter to parents asking them to pack for their children.

Also, "we've added an addendum to our contract with campers saying they can't have weapons or ammunition," Popkin said. "Previously, we would have never dreamed we needed that type of contract."

## Lamb trial delayed by publicity

Pretrial publicity and a lack of a defense attorney were cited as reasons for postponing the trial of Amos Lamb on misdemeanor traffic charges until later this summer when a new jury pool will be available.

Calloway District Judge Leslie Furches, referring to a front-page story about Lamb in Thursday's Ledger & Times, dismissed about

three dozen prospective jurors Friday morning after apologizing for any inconvenience.

"Hopefully, it won't happen again," Furches said.

Later, after confirming with Lamb that he had no attorney and did not want a public defender, the judge rescheduled the trial for 9 a.m. Aug. 20.

She also warned supporters of Lamb, whose religious beliefs dictate that he shun statutory law and

strictly follow biblical and constitutional law, against trying to contact prospective jurors. Doing so could be a criminal offense, she said.

Two such supporters bore small American flags as they sat behind Lamb, his wife Shari and the Rev. Homer Fletcher, pastor of the Victory Baptist Church in Paducah.

Lamb said following the 10-minute proceedings he was happy the trial was postponed.

"I'd have probably went to sleep

while it was going on," he said. "Hopefully, this will be well out of my system by (August)."

Lamb referred to his claim that he is still feeling the effects of medication given to him last month at Western State Hospital in Hopkinsville, where he was involuntarily committed by Furches for evaluation and treatment.

Lamb, who was quoted in Thursday's story about feeling sleepy and having involuntary

twitches in his mouth and hands, told Furches Friday he was still under the influence of the medication.

He also claimed in an affidavit filed Friday morning that he signed his bond papers under the influence of the medication and threat of further imprisonment. He also said he was not ready to stand trial and wanted a doctor of his own choosing.

## Charges dismissed against Patton aides, Teamsters

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — A judge Friday declared Kentucky's campaign-finance laws unconstitutional and dismissed criminal charges against four people: two of Gov. Paul Patton's top aides and two Teamsters leaders who supported Patton's 1995 campaign.

The four were accused of colluding to get around campaign spending limits. But the laws, which the General Assembly later amended, restricted political activity protected by the First Amendment, Special Franklin Circuit Judge William W. Trude Jr. said in a written ruling.

Defendants were Patton's chief of staff and closest adviser, Andrew "Skipper" Martin; labor liaison Danny Ross; Robert Winstead, president of Teamsters Local 89, and Lon Fields Sr., the local's former president and currently a Patton appointee to the Kentucky Racing Commission.

Patton, who was not charged, insisted that no one in his campaign did anything illegal. He had refused to suspend Martin or Ross.

"After reviewing the pleadings and documents available to the public, I am even more convinced that none of the four people indicted ... violated either the letter or the spirit of Kentucky's campaign finance laws as I understand them," Patton, a Democrat, said through a spokeswoman. Patton was traveling in Japan.

Attorney General Ben Chandler, whose office obtained the indictment, said

through a spokesman that he would decide next week whether to appeal.

In exchange for public campaign funding, Patton's campaign agreed to a \$1.8 million spending limit in the campaign against Republican Larry Forgy.

The prosecution alleged that Martin, who ran the campaign, wanted an all-volunteer staff so campaign money could be reserved for advertising.

Ross, whose role was to get unions organized for Patton, could not afford to forgo a salary, so the Teamsters created a job for him, Chandler alleged.

That allegedly gave Martin two things: one less salary to pay and a way to influence organized labor's independent spending.

The Patton campaign, Teamsters and other labor groups thereafter illegally coordinated spending for a get-out-the-vote effort in Jefferson County that proved decisive in the 25,000-vote victory over Forgy, Chandler alleged.

A brief filed by Chandler in April showed that the indictment was based in large part on grand jury testimony by Alice McDonald, a former state school superintendent who was an unpaid campaign staffer. McDonald testified as part of a plea agreement in an unrelated theft case.

Trude's ruling said the campaign-finance law was overly broad and vague about what constituted a contribution, an independent expenditure and a delib-

## Consultant suggests program

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — A consultant has suggested an experimental program that would pay Kentuckians to seek additional schooling as a way to educate the 40 percent of adults who read at middle school level or below.

The consultant also recommended establishing a network of adult-education providers for every county by July 2001.

The draft report written by Aims McGuinness of the National Center of Higher Education Management Systems in Boulder, Colo., was released Thursday and will be the subject of a June 16 public hearing in Frankfort.

McGuinness has been working with a task force appointed and chaired by Gov. Paul Patton. The report says Kentucky's current system is uneven, often provides poor services to the counties where it's needed most and is built largely to respond to federal mandates.

The main recommendations in the report are:

—Build a network of adult-education providers for every county. Services in each county, which now vary widely, would include family literacy and parent-child education programs. The new system would also raise standards for adult educators and improve their training.

—Establish a limited, experimental program that would pay adults to pass adult education courses that would increase their read-

## Troops might enforce peace

WASHINGTON (AP) — U.S. Marines trained for war will instead begin enforcing peace in Kosovo, perhaps within days, if Serb troops retreat from the ethnically divided province as promised.

Even as NATO pressed on with a 73rd day of bombing over Kosovo on Friday, the vanguard of about 7,000 American peacekeeping troops moved toward the Balkans aboard a three-ship Marine amphibious group.

About 50,000 peacekeepers from NATO nations and other countries would eventually move into Kosovo if a peace agreement struck earlier this week holds. Yugoslav President

Slobodan Milosevic acceded to the alliance's terms for an end to violence in Kosovo after more than 10 weeks of bombing that destroyed roads, bridges, airfields and hundreds of pieces of military equipment.

President Clinton said Friday he is eager to stop the air war but wary of Milosevic's record of broken promises.

Pentagon spokesman Kenneth Bacon said the bombing could stop Sunday or early next week if Yugoslavia cooperates. Meanwhile, he said, bombs will fall until the allies see clear proof the Serbs are leaving Kosovo quickly and irreversibly.

## Moore: UK didn't follow procedure

PADUCAH, Ky. (AP) — The University of Kentucky should have notified a special advisory committee it was planning to offer a new graduate degree at Paducah Community College, according to a state agency official.

The availability of a degree in health administration came as a surprise to Sue Hodges Moore, vice president for the Kentucky Council on Postsecondary Education.

Moore said she heard about it from Murray State University officials who are questioning UK's procedures.

"Surprises are not good things," Moore said Thursday. "It makes it harder for institutions to work together."

But Moore said she is encouraged that UK has indicated a willingness to cooperate with MSU on the matter.

Although Murray State doesn't offer a master's degree in health administration in Paducah, it does offer master's degrees in business administration and other courses that have health-care administration options.

About 15 people are in Murray's health-care administration-related courses in the Paducah area. UK plans to enroll between 12 to 15 students this fall in its 51-hour master of health administration degree.

The regional advisory committee, co-chaired by PCC President Len O'Hara and MSU President

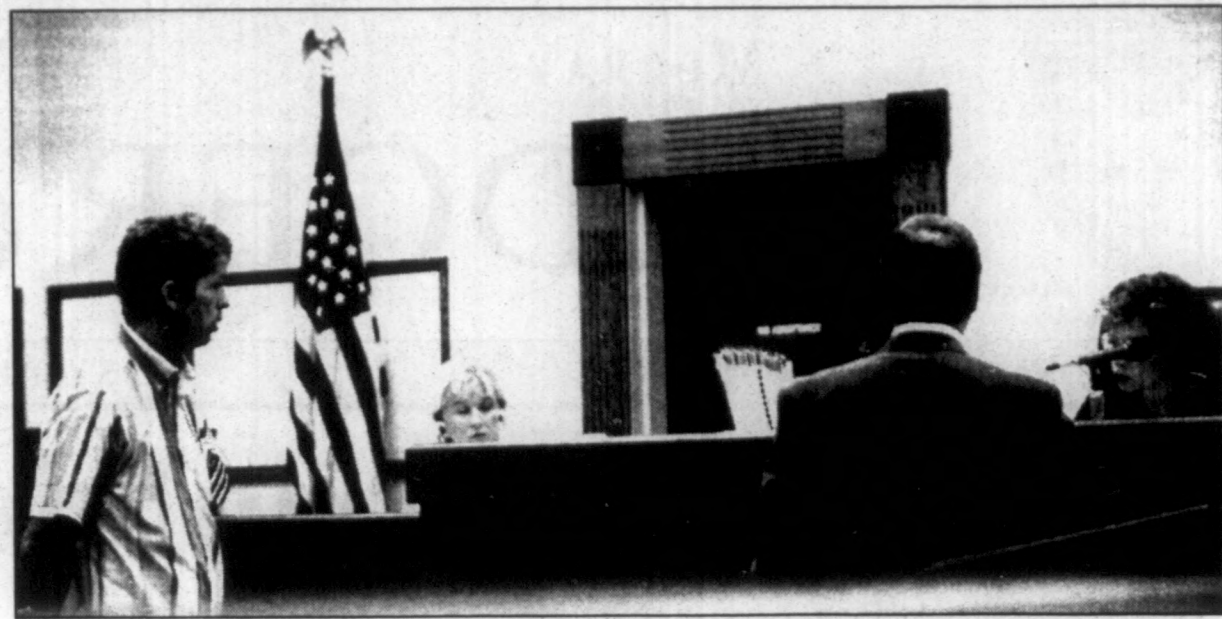

County Attorney Randy Hutchens said the story, coming on the eve of Lamb's trial, might have influenced prospective jurors' feelings about Lamb either positively or negatively.

"Either way, he's not getting a fair trial, and I felt like I had to continue it," Hutchens said.

Hutchens also noted Lamb still had no attorney — a point, he noted, that was not brought up by Lamb Tuesday during a pretrial conference.

"I felt an obligation to make sure his rights were protected," Hutchens said.

Lamb has said he wants an attorney who will sign a contract to represent him and his beliefs.

State police arrested Lamb in early March and charged him with having no insurance, no driver's license, no registration receipt and an improper registration plate.

Lamb would not cooperate during his arraignment. Among his beliefs is the contention that spelling his name in all capital letters on court documents makes him a creation of the state, not of God.

Lamb has also said getting a Social Security number — a necessity to get a state driver's license — means entering into a contract with the state, which would involve giving up his Christian heritage.

Furches ordered Lamb to undergo mental evaluations. Based on those, Lamb's actions and consultations with Hutchens and then-defense attorney Dennis Lortie, she then had Lamb committed to Western State.

Fletcher and other supporters claim Lamb, who was deemed competent to stand trial about two weeks ago, was unfairly treated because of his religious beliefs.

But Hutchens calls that claim a "red herring."

"I have no desire to mistreat him at all other than to require him to

obey the same laws the rest of us do," Hutchens said of the state traffic laws.

The religious freedom issue "doesn't have anything to do with it," Hutchens said. "He might talk about it; that's his option...I certainly won't make an issue out of it. I'm going to put on a normal traffic stop (case)."

Hutchens, when asked about the Lambs' being encouraged by supporters to sue over Amos Lamb's treatment, said that is coming from people who "don't have his best interests involved."

"The people advising him have driver's licenses. What does that tell you?" he said. "It's unfortunate that someone can be led astray by people who have their own agenda."

One of Lamb's supporters, Gary Enos Thornell of Fairdealing, said he asked a woman walking into the Calloway County judicial building if she was a prospective juror.

Thornell said the woman did not respond and that he was warned soon afterward by sheriff's deputies not to talk to prospective jurors.

Thornell said he has been told

by a state Supreme Court justice, whom he did not identify, that talking to a potential juror was not illegal.

But Hutchens cited two state laws — KRS 524.090 and 524.010 — that deal with juries and jury tampering.

KRS 524.090 defines jury tampering as directly or indirectly trying to influence a juror's vote, opinion or decision by communicating with a juror outside the boundaries of the trial. It is a Class A misdemeanor.

KRS 524.010(1) defines a juror as someone impaneled on a jury or "summoned to attend as a prospective juror."

"The statute's pretty clear that someone who's summoned to be on the panel is a prospective juror, and you can't tamper with (them)," Hutchens said.

A Marshall County judge convicted Lamb of 33 counts of jury tampering in 1997 for giving jurors, who were going to hear his case on a charge of driving without insurance, fliers advising them they could nullify laws they felt were wrong.

Specific plans for the Serb retreat, including logistical questions about which roads and bridges to use, were to be considered in a NATO-Yugoslav military meeting today.

NATO blames Serb troops loyal to Milosevic for months of ethnic violence aimed at Kosovo residents of Albanian ancestry. An international tribunal indicted Milosevic last month on charges he perpetrated war crimes by ordering massacres and systematic expulsions from Kosovo, a rebel province of Serbia.

Hundreds of thousands of refugees have fled Kosovo, and thousands more are camping out within the province.

"There is an enormous opportunity to be seized here, a chance to shift our focus from defeating

something evil to building something good," Clinton said. He seemed to welcome the coming task of rebuilding the shattered province and said the bombing campaign was worth the effort.

Americans flew about two-thirds of the missions to rescue Kosovo. The United States has long planned to turn over the bulk of any postwar peacekeeping operation to the other allies.

The Marines would patrol a section of eastern Kosovo assigned to the United States, while other countries field similar initial landing forces in their assigned sectors, Pentagon spokesman Bacon said. The Marines would soon yield to Army troops and heavy armor from U.S. bases in Germany.

The 1,900 to 2,200 Marines should arrive in the Greek port of Thessaloniki by late Sunday, Pentagon officials said.

erate violation.

The defendants' attorneys argued that the prosecution needed to prove a specific intent to break the law.

"In essence, those definitions made it impossible for anyone who was independently supporting a candidate to communicate with a campaign," one of Ross' attorneys, Phillip J. Shepherd of Frankfort, said in an interview. "That just runs squarely afoul of the First Amendment."

Trude wrote that legislatures "must be careful not to invade the First Amendment rights of individuals who wish to spend money on behalf of their own free speech in supporting political candidates."

ing or job skills. Such a program would be used to determine what would spur more people into the adult education system.

—Reassign the lead role on statewide adult-education policy from the Cabinet for Workforce Development to the Council on Postsecondary Education. Programs would still be run through the cabinet's adult-education department.

Nancy Price, coordinator of adult education for Muhlenberg County

schools, said she had not yet seen the report, but that its recommendations sounded like "a beginning point." She said that enticing people into adult-education programs is a big challenge.

"Our main issue is reaching undereducated adults. With such a low unemployment rate, most of the people who qualify for our services are working," she said. "The problem is they're not in jobs that provide an adequate living."


County firefighters are unsure what caused a fire that destroyed a Kelly Road mobile home or where it started.

Kern Alexander, was set up precisely for situations like this, Moore said.

The advisory committee's major responsibilities include demanding cooperation among MSU, PCC, UK and possibly even the University of Louisville in suggesting program offerings and providing advice to the participating institutions.

O'Hara said he plans to bring the matter to the committee's attention the next time it meets.

But no meeting has been scheduled, and the panel has met only a "handful of times" since it was formed in the mid-1990s as part of

the resolution of the dispute with MSU over establishing the UK engineering program at PCC.

Mike Nietzel, dean of the graduate school at UK, said he believed UK had followed the proper procedures for the unique program and didn't need to go through the advisory committee.

Meanwhile, officials with the Council on Postsecondary Education are still looking into the matter and should have a resolution in the next few weeks, Moore said.

Moore said she hopes the two universities can work this matter out. But if not, the state agency ultimately could make the decision for them.

## Expert: Keep bug zapper back

CHICAGO (AP) — Researchers have some advice for folks gathering goodies for picnics this summer: Zap that electric bug zapper to a remote corner of the yard.

James Urban, a microbiologist at Kansas State University, says zappers and food should be kept apart because while they are killing insects, the devices can spread

bacteria or viruses up to six feet away.

"I think it means we should not use bug zappers in certain areas," Urban said Thursday. "It shouldn't be hanging above the condiment tray at your picnic. You might be careful having a bug zapper in areas where small children's toys might be."

## Standards track aging

WASHINGTON (AP) — Just because you're 75, you shouldn't have trouble lifting a bag of groceries or getting up from a chair. But for millions of older Americans, those simple activities are a daily struggle.

Disabling frailty doesn't have to be part of aging. In fact, studies have found that even 90-year-olds can rebuild lost muscle with some careful exercise.

It would be better to never become so frail in the first place, and researchers have come up with a way to help: Fitness performance standards to let anyone 60 and older assess quickly if they're in good physical condition for their age, or if they're at risk of a downhill slide that could lead to a nursing home.

"Our main interest is in keeping people mobile and staying physically independent as long as possible," said Roberta Rikli, a professor at California State University, Fullerton.

She led a study of 7,000 Americans ages 60 to 94 that established the standards.

If the tests signal you're at risk of becoming too frail, "we can do something to try to prevent that," she said.

The exercise tests are simple enough that many people could try them at home, and senior centers around the country are starting to use them.

Frailty is a huge risk of aging. By age 70, most people have at least 20 percent less muscle than they did at age 30.

About 70 percent of elderly women are too frail to lift just 10 pounds, and 60 percent cannot perform such household work as vacuuming. About 35 percent of men are equally frail.

Some of the muscle deterioration may be inevitable. But Rikli says at least half is due to people becoming more sedentary with age, meaning that keeping active is important if you want healthy retirement years.

Rikli and colleague C. Jessie Jones studied some 7,000 Americans over 60 who live independently. They performed such simple tests as:

—How many times in 30 seconds they could rise from a straight-backed chair without using their arms to push themselves up. That measures lower body strength.

—How many times in 30 seconds they could lift a weight — 5 pounds for women, 8 pounds for men — in a "bicep curl" that measures upper body strength.

—How many yards they could walk in six minutes, to measure aerobic fitness.

—How long it took them to rise from a chair, walk 8 feet and return to a seated position, to measure mobility.

The study, funded by a Medicare HMO provider, set standards for fitness levels that are normal, below average, or so low that people are at risk of needing a nursing home.

She advised people to track whether they're declining faster than normal, or if exercise is paying off and they're improving.

Regardless of age, people who got moderate physical activity at least three times a week were the most fit.

Some doctors already use similar but experimental tests to assess elderly patients' limitations. "They're very powerful predictors" of who will wind up disabled, said Dr. Jack Guralnik of the National Institute on Aging, a pioneer of the studies.

Rikli wants such assessments to reach more older Americans. She hopes to have easy-to-read consumer brochures available by fall to illustrate the tests and show how to measure anyone's fitness level against the national standards.

"That's an excellent idea," said Guralnik. "The more people are aware of their level of functioning, the more they can tune into the fact that they need to exercise."

Already, some of the 267 senior centers that participated in Rikli's study are using the fitness assessments.

She will advertise the consumer brochures in publications targeted to older Americans once they're complete.

But instead of waiting, senior centers or doctors could simply check April's edition of the Journal of Aging and Physical Activity for the study results.

## Homes with heart

Bill Snodgrass loves to talk about his work.

For years, the Bristol, TN, native and ETSU graduate built restaurants all around the country — numerous Hardee's for the old Spartan Foods Company, and then several places for Po' Folks company, and then many for Cracker Barrel.

Name one and he not only has visited it, but likely built it.

But the work that has him turned on and ready to talk non-stop is Habitat for Humanity housing.

Now living in South Carolina but in sight of his Smoky Mountains, he is construction supervisor for the hyper-active Habitat for Humanity of Spartanburg Inc.

Snodgrass is exuberant about the hard work of his volunteers. I met him at the current site with the Wofford volunteer service director, Mark Line, who was taking a cold watermelon to some fifteen Wofford students who had stayed around after spring semester ended for two weeks of volunteer Habitat service.

Three new houses are about ready for occupancy.

Last January, chemistry professor Randy Mahaffey and music professor Vic Bilanchone led a whole platoon of Wofford students to give a full month's work to Habitat projects as an Interim Term project.

They and other students from Wofford had raised \$4,000 after Christmas to help build the Collegiate Challenge Home at Una, across the street from a home built by the local First Presbyterian church and up from another built by a local Hot Spots chain.

A couple of years ago, when one of the first Una homes was nearing completion, Snodgrass despaired about getting it landscaped in time for a Sunday dedication.

He called a Wofford student on a Tuesday who called back on Thursday to say he had rounded up 21 students to do the landscaping on Saturday.

When Saturday came, 71 Wofford students showed up to do the work. Other Wofford teams have been to Central America and Appalachia Kentucky.

Wofford gave its prestigious Algernon Sidney Sullivan Award for selfless service this year to local Habitat director Ben DeLuca upon the occasion of his 50th anniversary of graduating from Wofford in the Class of 1949.

Local Habitat agencies are where the real work of the Habitat for Humanity International gets done.

There are 1,300 Habitat affiliates in all 50 states and the District of Columbia, and 250 international locals in 59 countries.

Habitat has built over 70,000 houses for low-income families since it was founded in 1976 by Millard and Linda Fuller as an ecumenical Christian ministry.

International headquarters for Habitat is in Americus, GA, a place many recall as being the progressive home of an interracial Koinonia Christian farm under the charismatic Clarence Jordan long before the civil rights movement.

In Una, SC, alone I counted fourteen homes completed or almost completed by Snodgrass and his corps of non-paid volunteers.

I have also visited a smaller concentration of Habitat houses on Spartanburg's south side.

The average house here costs about \$40,000.

In most cases, the land is donated, and the only site costs are for running streets and utilities to them. Owners get the houses interest-free with 20-year mortgages, paying for them by contributing 300 to 500 hours of manual labor and by making monthly payments of about \$220 a month, a manageable amount for many low-income

families. The average Habitat home houses five people.

Houses built abroad average between \$700 and 5,000 per home, with mortgages abroad ranging seven to thirty years.

Former President and Mrs. Jimmy Carter are conspicuous volunteers on constructions at home and abroad.

Despite the valiant efforts of Habitat for Humanity, low-income housing is an increasing problem nationally and internationally. In the U.S. alone, some 14 million families use over half their monthly income for rent and utilities, and the number of people in each rental house exceeds the number of rooms.

Of the 14.5 million low-income families eligible for government aid, only 4.1 million actually receive it.

Affordable low-cost subsidized housing declined 25 percent from 1974 to 1993, years during which the number of families officially "in poverty" increased 70 percent.

For the 7.6 million American households earning less than \$10,000 a year, there are only 4.4 million units available.

Some 5.3 million households make up "worst case" housing needs.

The 12.8 million people in these cases include 4.8 million children, 1.4 million elderly, and 800,000 disabled people.

What makes things a bit brighter are the shining roofs and manicured yards of the Una Habitat sub-division, and the beaming faces and blistered palms of hundreds of volunteers like those from Wofford College.

## EDITORIAL ROUNDUP

### June 2 — The Daily Mail, London, on genetically modified foods:

Rarely has a royal intervention in a national debate achieved such a telling effect.

Yesterday's article by Prince Charles in the Mail, raising his concerns over GM (genetically modified) foods and crops, has not only aroused intense public interest but seems to have exposed tensions within the government itself.

While Environment Minister Michael Meacher appears almost to welcome Charles' comments, the response elsewhere is less than enthusiastic.

Indeed the official attitude was summed up by the Prime Minister last week, when he accused the media of whipping up "hysteria" over the issue.

That is as may be, though this paper would strongly dispute the claim.

But what is beyond doubt is that Charles' restrained and sober questions are anything but hysterical.

Rather than attacking the media, the government would be better advised to answer the pertinent questions he posed.

### June 2 — Asahi Shimbun, Tokyo, on international relations on the Korean Peninsula:

There appear to be some signs of incipient change in international relations on the Korean Peninsula.

The Democratic People's Republic of Korea (North Korea), which was isolated in the international scene, has shown a flexible attitude toward the United States.

Pyongyang has also started to mend its relations with China, at the highest level, which have been frozen for many years.

Kim Yong Nam, North Korea's Chairman of the Standing Committee of the Supreme People's Assembly and second in command after Kim Jong Il, will make an official visit to China on Thursday.

On the whole, steps being taken on the Korean Peninsula can be seen as moving toward an easing tensions there.

Greater dialogue and exchanges between North Korea and other countries are something to be welcomed.

The series of moves in recent weeks will be quite meaningful if they prompt North Korea to free itself from international isolation and start dialogue with other countries in Northeast Asia. Japan must be sensitive to changes in the situation on the Korean Peninsula.

### May 31 — Neue Zürcher Zeitung, Zurich, Switzerland, on inauguration of Nigeria's first civilian president for 15 years:

Nigeria's military ruler, Abdulsalami Abubakar, kept his word.

As he announced a year ago, he turned over the leadership of the country May 29 to a successor elected by the people.

It is only the second time that a Nigerian military government has actually fulfilled a promise to return to barracks.

Abubakar was following the example of his successor — former general (Olusegun) Obasanjo, who in 1979 handed over power to the civilian Shehu Shagari.

Obasanjo finds himself in a situation which in many ways resembles that of Shagari.

Obasanjo's arrival at the presidential palace in Abuja has raised great hopes of an economic and moral new beginning.

Like Shagari, the new president promises to stamp out corruption and reestablish trust in government and administration.

In his choice of ministers and close advisers, it will soon be seen how serious Obasanjo is in his promise of transparent government.

It is one thing to present oneself as a servant of the state and the general good, but another to fend off the demands of party friends and discredited old politicians.

### May 31 — St. Petersburg (Fla.) Times, on military base closings:

Secretary of Defense William Cohen, the Joint Chiefs of Staff and the secretaries of the Air Force, Navy and Army pleaded with Congress last week to allow two more rounds of base closings in 2001 and 2005.

Military officials have called the closings "absolutely necessary."

Unfortunately, the Senate rejected, on a 60-40 vote, a measure that would have authorized a new round of base closings in 2001 as part of a \$288.8 billion defense spending bill for the next fiscal year.

Closings favored by the Pentagon would save an estimated \$20 billion and generate \$3.6 billion annually by eliminating the overhead costs of running the bases.

Members of Congress know the devastating effect a base closing can have on a community.

Still, evidence exists that many communities have recovered and even flourished when nearby bases were converted to non-military use.

The military leaders charged with the responsibility of defending the country are united in their support for an objective process of base closings. It makes you wonder what exactly most senators are trying to defend.

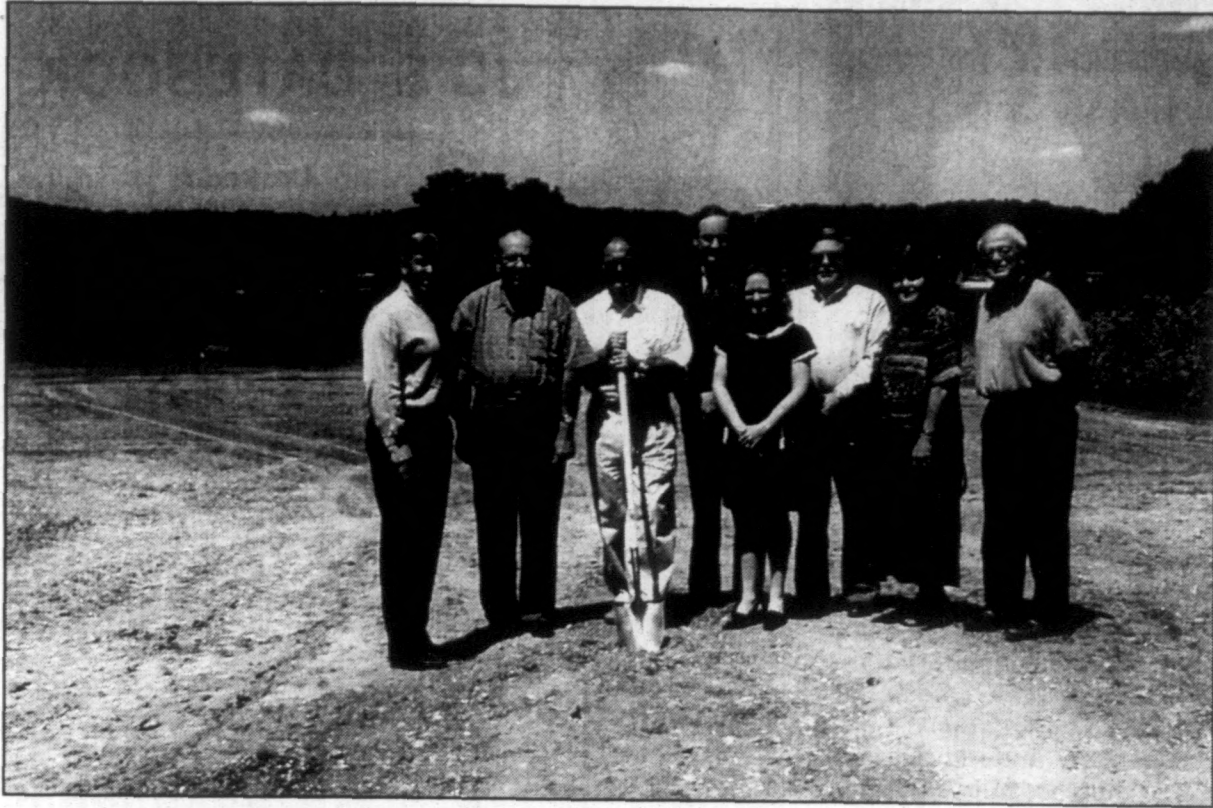

## Amazon.com goes to court

SEATTLE (AP) — Internet bookseller Amazon.com has asked a federal court to declare that it can continue to cite The New York Times' best-seller list in advertising discount prices.

Amazon, the No. 1 Internet bookseller, announced May 17 that it would offer 50 percent discounts on books on the Times' best-seller list. On May 28, the Times demanded in a letter that Amazon stop using the list for promotions, saying Amazon was infringing on the newspaper's copyright and trademark. Amazon said in a news release today.

The Times did not immediately return calls for comment.

Amazon filed a request late Thursday in U.S. District Court here asking for a ruling that would allow it to continue to refer to the Times best-seller lists in promoting its discounts.

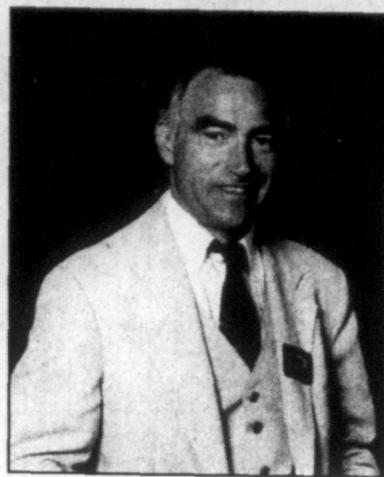
## Stock exchange delays extending trading hours

NEW YORK (AP) — The New York Stock Exchange will delay extending its trading hours until next year at the earliest, its chairman announced this week.

Richard Grasso said the board of the world's biggest stock exchange would wait first to make sure stock traders smoothly handled two challenges — the Year 2000 computer bug and the planned shift to reporting stock prices in decimals rather than fractions.

The deadline for the move to decimals is the middle of next year.

"We were unanimous this morning in our view that nothing should happen, at the Big Board at least, until the millennium change and decimalization have been accomplished," Grasso said.

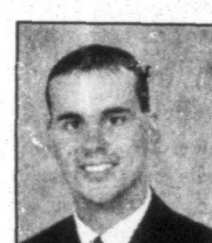

The 100-meter hurdles finals will begin at 11:30 a.m. today while the 300 will be run at 1:15 p.m. (CST).

## Martinez strikes out 16 Braves in Sox win

BOSTON (AP) — Pedro Martinez threw one pitch after another past frustrated Atlanta batters. When he was done, he had finished his best game in a brilliant season.

A career-high 16 strikeouts. A three-hitter. His second complete game. And a bunch of major league-leading marks — 11 wins, 133 strikeouts and a 1.91 ERA.

"I felt great," Martinez (11-1) said after pitching the Boston Red Sox to a 5-1 victory over the Braves on Friday night. "I felt I could throw it by anybody, and I did."

He reached double digits in strikeouts for the eighth time this season, the 16th time since he joined the Red Sox before last season and the 43rd time in his career. He won his ninth straight

## Charismatic tries for elusive Triple Crown

NEW YORK (AP) — The filly was the talk of horse racing. The colt wasn't even a murmur in February.

But now it's Charismatic, the colt who twice ran in claiming races, who can become the first Triple Crown champion in 21 years.

Silverbulletday, however, remains a very interesting conversation piece. She takes on the role of spoiler when she makes

her debut against colts in the 1 1/2-mile classic on Saturday in the Belmont Stakes.

It might not end up as a two-horse race, but going in it's a two-horse story.

"This is unique," said Bob Baffert, Silverbulletday's trainer. "It's like a heavyweight title match. You've got the 3-year-old filly against the 3-year-old colt who won the two big races this spring. It's for serious bragging rights. ... This should be on pay-per-view,

and I want a piece of the action."

Silverbulletday was the third early favorite at 4-1. Charismatic, 31-1 in the Derby and 8-1 in the Preakness, was 2-1. Menifee, runner-up in the Derby and Preakness was 7-2. Menifee is trained by Elliott Walden, trainer of Victory Gallop, who foiled Real Quiet's Triple Crown bid by a nose in the 1998 Belmont.

Silverbulletday was the champion 2-year-old filly last year when she won six of seven starts, including the Breeders' Cup Juvenile Fillies. This year she is unbeaten in five starts. Eleven of the 12 starts have been in stakes.

Charismatic, on the other hand, twice ran in claiming races — the first time as a 2-year-old. Much has been made of his second claiming start, for a \$62,500 price, because it was only four months ago.

Nick Zito, trainer of Belmont starters Adonis and Stephen Got Even, put that Feb. 11 race at

Santa Anita in perspective.

"You always get a great line from the \$2 bettors, who are the heart and sole of racing," Zito said. "I was leaving the track one day and I heard a better say, 'Charismatic was never a claimer, Wayne just ran him in a claiming race.' I think that's the case."

Charismatic, bought for \$200,000 as a weanling by Bob and Beverly Lewis, was put in the claiming race by Lukas in an effort to boost the strapping chest-

nut colt's confidence. Luckily, no one claimed him, but Bob Lewis said he would not have minded if someone had because the colt didn't appear to be worth the investment.

The Lewises own Silver Charm, who failed to become the first Triple Crown champion since Affirmed in 1978 by finishing second in the 1997 Belmont. Silverbulletday is owned by Mike Pegram, owner of Real Quiet. Both colts are trained by Baffert.

## Rain rescues Agassi in match at French Open

PARIS (AP) — Andre Agassi gazed skyward and the heavens obeyed his command in a moment of peril at the French Open.

Agassi lost six of the last seven games before rain rescued him Friday, preserving a two sets-to-one lead over young Dominik Hrbaty, while Andrei Medvedev waited to see who would face him in the final.

In a tournament where the 29-year-old Agassi was blessed with the kindest of draws, and where bounces and net cords have gone his way with uncanny regularity, he couldn't have asked for a better time for that downpour.

Agassi made his own fortune in the first two sets, playing his best and, most intense tennis so far, to take them both, 6-4, 7-6 (8-6). He led the third set 3-2 when Hrbaty began cracking a steady stream of winners. Suddenly, Agassi appeared vulnerable, and Hrbaty, a fearless 21-year-old Slovakian, swept the rest of the set to win it 6-3.

As they prepared to duel for the fourth set, Agassi looked up at the milky sky, squinting through

the light, persistent rain. That was his best hope, perhaps the only thing that could break Hrbaty's momentum.

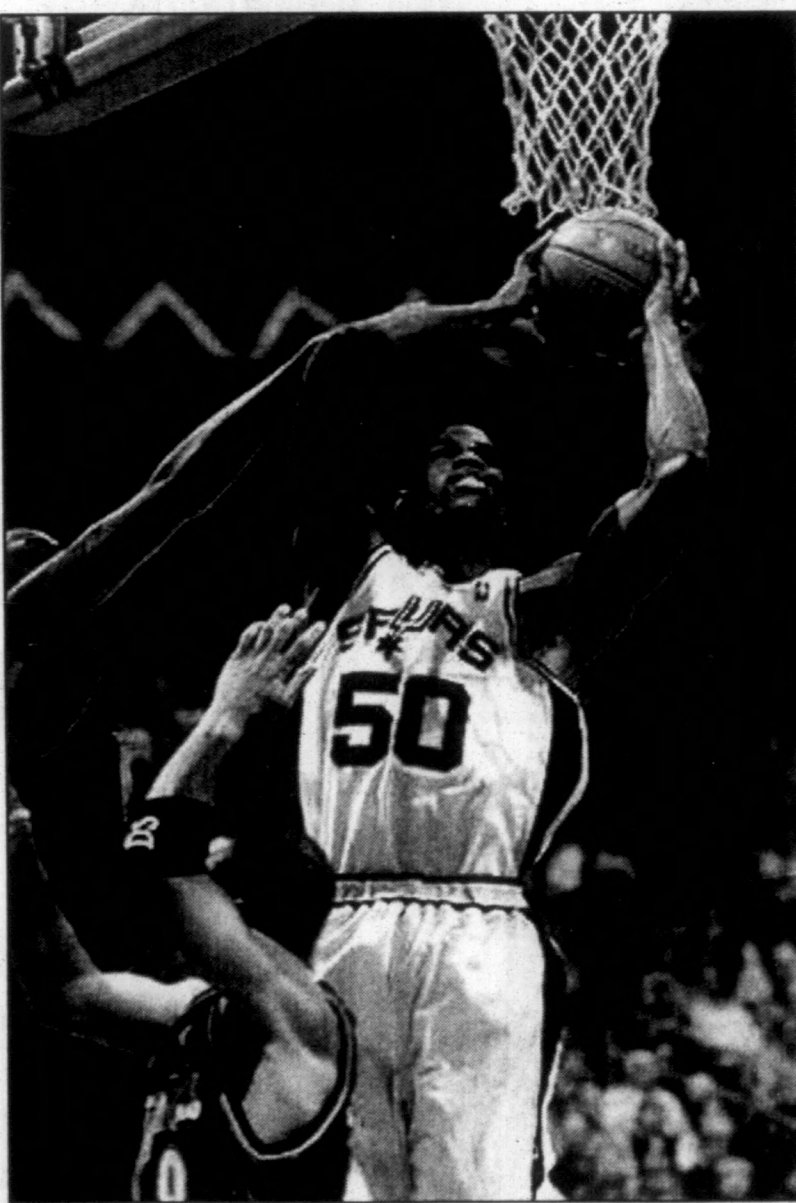
Like a prayer answered, the rain came down harder and harder as Hrbaty took a 2-1 lead on serve in the fourth set. Agassi signaled to the umpire that he'd had enough, and began packing up. Hrbaty looked as if he wanted to go on all evening, play in a mud puddle if he could, but Agassi got his way.

It was the first rain-postponed match of the tournament, and it will resume Saturday before the women's final between No. 1 Martina Hingis and five-time champion Steffi Graf.

Whoever wins the Agassi-Hrbaty match will find an opponent on Sunday who can't believe his own good luck. At No. 100, the lowest-ranked French finalist in the open era, Medvedev beat Brazil's Fernando Meligeni 7-5, 3-6, 6-4, 7-6 (8-6) to reach the first Grand Slam final of his roller-coaster career.

"It's a minor miracle," Medvedev said, referring to his

## Spurs slam Blazers to take 3-0 series lead

PORTLAND, Ore. (AP) — No Tim Duncan, no problem.

With Duncan on the bench in foul trouble, San Antonio steamrolled the Portland Trail Blazers with a 16-0 third-quarter run Friday night on the way to an 85-63 rout that puts the Spurs one win from a sweep in the Western Conference finals.

"Well, 3-0 is better than 2-0, and I wouldn't trade it for anything in the world, but it still doesn't put us anywhere," San Antonio coach Gregg Popovich said.

Portland's 63 points was its fewest ever in the playoffs, and the second-lowest total in NBA playoff history. Utah scored 54 against Chicago in the finals last year. It was the fewest points ever allowed by the Spurs in the postseason.

"We did some things (defensively), but I doubt if we surprised them," Popovich said. "We've faced them nine or 10 times this year."

Duncan managed just five points, but it could not have mattered less, not the way the rest of the

Spurs played and the way Portland's offense vanished in a nightmare second half.

"They did a better job of making shots, especially 3s, while we were struggling offensively. They made some tough shots," Portland coach Mike Dunleavy said.

"It was our offense, or inability to make shots and to force them to have to come double-team us or to have to switch on some double coverages," Dunleavy said. "I think at times we have some pretty good looks."

"We hit a slump. We didn't make shots."

David Robinson had 15 points, nine rebounds, five assists and seven blocked shots as San Antonio won its ninth consecutive playoff game and improved to 5-0 on the road in the postseason.

Jaren Jackson came off the bench to tie a San Antonio record with six 3-pointers, scoring 19 points, and Avery Johnson had 14 points and eight assists.

The Blazers shot 25 percent (19-for-77) from the field and were 8-for-40 in the second half while being outscored 43-25. The 19

## Pacers, Knicks set to resume East series today tied 1-1

NEW YORK (AP) — Chris Dudley will start at center for the New York Knicks in place of Patrick Ewing when the Eastern Conference finals against the Indiana Pacers resumes Saturday.

Coach Jeff Van Gundy announced his choice Friday, the third straight day without a game in the best-of-7 series.

"To me, this is the simplest," Van Gundy said of his decision to start the slow-footed, offensively challenged Dudley. "You

can get guys in as early as you want, you can change early if that's what you need to happen."

Dudley started 16 games during the regular season, four alongside Ewing and 12 when Ewing was out with Achilles tendinitis. In the 12 games without Ewing, the Knicks went 7-5.

"When Patrick's been out in the past, that's how we've been," Van Gundy said. "We've had some good wins, some tough losses. We'll start the same, and everyone will stay in their same pattern."

That means Latrell Sprewell, the team's leading scorer, will continue to come off the bench in the first and third quarters.

The Knicks used the third day of rest to go over what they need to do better now that they don't have Ewing. Doctors discovered a slight tear in Ewing's Achilles' tendon on Wednesday and declared him out for the season.

Allan Houston, Sprewell, Larry Johnson and the two point guards, Charlie Ward and Chris Childs, will need to contribute more offensively.

"It's not like Patrick was averaging 20 shots a game," Houston said. "We had a lot of balance before Patrick went out, so it's going to change, but it's not going to change to the point where certain people are going to take 10 or 20 more shots per game and overextend themselves."

Saturday's game will only be the third for Indiana in two weeks since it completed a sweep of Philadelphia in the semifinals May 23. For the Knicks, it will be their third in 12 days.

"I think it's been great for us,"

coach Larry Bird said of the extensive practice time his team has had. "We got a lot of things accomplished. We put in some new stuff on the offensive end. We've had time to prepare and that should help us."

The Knicks are expecting to see improved offensive production from Rik Smits, now that his chances of getting into foul trouble while guarding Ewing have been reduced. Van Gundy would not say whether Dudley would start with the defensive assignment on Smits, or whether he will continue hand-

ing that task to Kurt Thomas.

Van Gundy also warned that the Knicks cannot overlook the contributions of Dale and Antonio Davis, both of whom have hurt the Knicks offensively during this series.

"If you go into the game trying to avoid foul trouble, you can't be effective. We've got to be aggressive, tenacious and passionate, but we also have to be smart," Van Gundy said.

"We know they've been a much better road team in the playoffs than they have at home," he added.

baskets was an NBA playoff low. Rasheed Wallace scored 22 points but got no help as the Blazers lost at home for only the fourth time this season. Two of those losses were to the Spurs. San Antonio has beaten Portland six in a row, all close until this one.

San Antonio outscored Portland 24-8 in the third quarter. It was the second horror quarter for the Blazers of the playoffs. They set an NBA record with five points in the fourth quarter of the first game of the conference semifinal series against Utah.

This one, though, hurt much worse.

Arvydas Sabonis had cut the Spurs' lead 48-46 with a sweeping hook shot with 6:42 to go in the third quarter when an ugly night turned unbearable for Portland. The Blazers didn't score again in the period.

Johnson's 16-footer started the decisive outburst, Jackson's fourth 3-pointer highlighted it, and Johnson's 20-footer finished it.

Portland scored the first four points of the fourth quarter to cut the lead to 64-50, but Wallace was called for a technical, Jackson made the free throw, Johnson scored on a driving bank shot and Jackson made his fifth 3-pointer to give San Antonio a 70-50 lead with 10:09 to play.

No team has come back from 3-0 to win an NBA playoff series. San Antonio can complete a sweep with a victory at the Rose Garden on Sunday.

After a miserable first half that featured 28 personal fouls, 19 turnovers and enough bricks to pave the Willamette River, San Antonio led 40-38. The Blazers shot just under 30 percent in the first two quarters (11-for-37) and no one was thinking it could get worse. But it did.

Robinson, Duncan and Sean Elliott — San Antonio's starting front line — all were on the bench with two fouls apiece with 3:37 left in the first quarter. Still, Portland managed only a 26-22 lead, thanks to Greg Anthony's 3-pointer at the first-quarter buzzer, a basket that the Spurs argued shouldn't have counted because the clock started late on the inbound pass.

San Antonio caught the Blazers at 30-30 on Jackson's second consecutive 3-pointer and third of the game with 9:33 left in the half. Steve Kerr's first 3-pointer of the playoffs capped a 10-0 run to put the Spurs up 34-30 with 6:46 to go in the half.

The Blazers were 3-for-17 in the third quarter. They tied the game twice early in the third quarter, 40-40 on Wallace's two free throws after Duncan drew his fourth foul 40 seconds into the period and 42-42 on Sabonis' inside basket with 10:30 left in the period.

game, walked two and threw just 118 pitches.

He struck out every Atlanta batter and fanned Brian Jordan four times and Gerald Williams three. He nearly struck out the side in the ninth, but Javy Lopez ended the game with a groundout on a 1-2 pitch.

"A special game," a usually reserved manager Jimmy Williams raved. "That game is hard to top."

The Braves, who had struck out the third fewest times in the National League, agreed.

"He's always been that dominant," said Chipper Jones, who struck out twice. "When you have a guy with that stuff and that command of the strike zone, he's going to put up big numbers."

Atlanta starter Tom Glavine (3-7) also put up a big number with his seventh loss, the most in the

National League, in the matchup of that league's last two Cy Young Award winners.

"I feel good about the way I'm pitching," Glavine said. "If I catch a break I give up one or two runs. I'm making strides."

This is the second time Glavine has been victimized by a dominating strikeout performance by a member of the Martinez family.

Exactly nine years earlier, Pedro's brother Ramon struck out

18 Braves as the Los Angeles Dodgers beat Glavine 6-0. Ramon, signed in spring training by the Red Sox, is expected to be ready to join them around the All-Star break.

Atlanta's run came on Ryan Klesko's seventh homer, a 310-foot shot that landed just inside the right-field foul pole in the seventh inning.

"He couldn't have hit that any other place. He got jammed," Mar-

tinez said.

That cut Boston's lead to 4-1, and the Red Sox went on to win for the 21st time in 27 games and maintain their 1 1/2-game AL East lead over the New York Yankees. Damon Buford, who went 3-for-4, made it 5-1 with a homer in the eighth.

Then Martinez retired the side in order in the ninth.

"I've never seen anyone locked in like he is," Boston pitching coach Joe Kerrigan said. "He can knock you out with finesse."

Glavine fell behind 3-0 after three innings in the meeting of the team with the NL's best record and the AL's second best.

Boston took a 2-0 lead in the first and could have had more, loading the bases with one out before Jeff Frye struck out and Jason Varitek flied out to center.

Boston loaded the bases on a

walk to John Valentin, a double by Nomar Garciaparra and an intentional walk to Mike Stanley. Troy O'Leary and Buford followed with RBI singles.

The Red Sox made it 3-0 in the third on a two-out double by Buford and an RBI single by Frye. In the sixth, Frye scored again when he doubled and took third on a groundout. He then broke for home with Darren Lewis at bat and was credited with a steal of home as Glavine's pitch sailed over the head of catcher Lopez.

Both Atlanta hits in the first six innings led to serious threats. Lopez started the first with a single, took second on a walk and third on a force play at second. But Martinez struck out Williams to end the inning.

Andrew Jones led off the fifth with a double and advanced on a wild pitch. But Martinez struck out Randall Simon and Williams, then retired Walt Weiss on a popout.

"That's a doggone good hitting Atlanta club," Varitek, Martinez's catcher, said. "If they were guessing they guessed wrong most of the time."

serendipitous trip the past two weeks. "On the other hand, it doesn't fall from the sky. You have to work for it. You have to wait for it. When you get an opportunity, you've got to take it."

Medvedev, a 25-year-old Ukrainian who was ranked No. 4 in 1994 before a fast lifestyle and injuries took their toll, struggled through cramps and dizziness in the last two sets.

"All I thought was to fight like a dog, and that's what I did," Medvedev said. "If I died on the court, I wouldn't care today, really. If my heart would stop on the court, then I would be proud that I'm dead this way."

Medvedev's penchant for the melodramatic and the romantic — he waxed poetic once more about his love for the German player Anke Huber — was matched by the drama of his performance.

He didn't have quite the strength or accuracy he exhibited in beating Pete Sampras in the second round and 1997 champion Gustavo Kuerten in the quarterfinals. But Medvedev showed resilience when he was in trouble and a willingness to push his body to the limit.

A trainer visited Medvedev several times on changeovers, feeding him pills that seemed to work. "Thank God, I'm not doing doping control today," Medvedev joked. "The first three were just because I felt dizzy, weak. I think they were just minerals. Then I started cramping. He gave me one pill, but it didn't work."

Medvedev called the trainer back and asked for another pill.

"That's a double dose," said the trainer, Doug Spreen.

"Yeah, but I'm a double guy," Medvedev responded. "I'm bigger than Fernando. Give me one more."

That, and some smelling salts for the dizziness, did the trick. Medvedev blamed his problems, in part, on a restless night.

"I started to get nervous right after the match against Guga," he said. "I couldn't sleep because I was so excited. There were so many thoughts going through my mind."

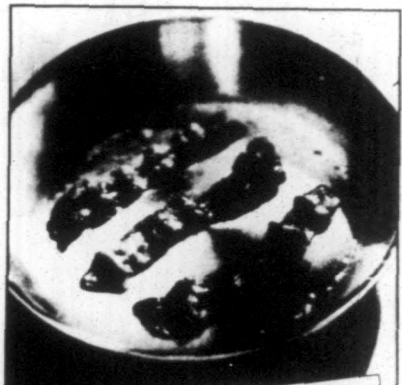

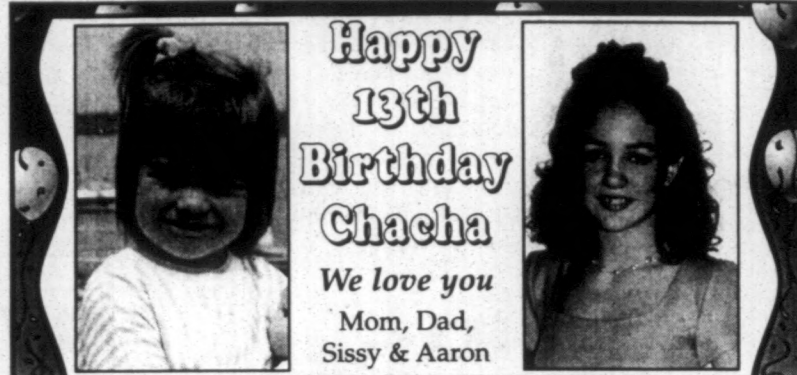

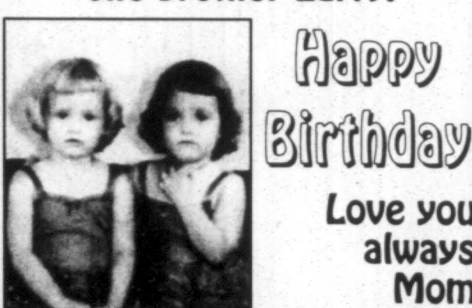

## DR. GOTT

DEAR DR. GOTT: I am 36 and have been about 30 pounds overweight for the past 10 years. Six weeks ago, I began a diet and exercise program. In one month, I had lost 20 pounds. Then my weight wouldn't budge. Therefore, I decreased my intake to 600 calories a day. Now I am troubled by fatigue and headaches during my strenuous workouts. What can I do further to lose the remaining fat around my abdomen?

DEAR READER: First of all, I congratulate you on the efforts you are making to slim down. Obviously, you are highly motivated and have made a stupendous commitment to get into shape. That's the good news.

The bad news is that you are overdoing it. I am not publishing your activity routine, because it is complicated and extensive; I got tired just reading what you are doing! In my opinion, you have reduced your caloric intake to a dangerously low level, given your level of strenuous work-out. Muscles need calories if they are to function normally, especially when stressed — as yours are. I advise you to increase your calories to about 1200 a day. At this level, you should be able to lose further weight, at the same time providing the necessary nutrition for muscle metabolism. Your fatigue and headaches may be an early warning that you are flirting with malnutrition.

As a general rule, the average dieter should easily be able to lose about a pound a week without risking a nutritional deficiency. If you are willing to modify your diet, the extra belly-weight should eventually disappear.

Now the really important point: Almost anybody can lose weight on a low-calorie diet. The problem is, how to keep it off? Study after study has shown that the major difficulty in weight reduction is maintenance. Most dieters cannot (or will not) stick to a low-calorie diet after they have slimmed down. Therefore, the real challenge is to develop dietary and activity changes that will be permanent. The situation is analogous to the alcoholic who abstains for several months — and then, for whatever reason, begins drinking worse than ever. In weight reduction, this has been termed the "yo-yo effect." It is frustrating, depressing and dangerous to health.

I urge you to adopt a weight-reduction diet that will serve you for many years. A 600-calorie intake will not do. Once you have decided on a plan that you can live with, be patient: Your weight should eventually equilibrate. DEAR ABBY: Will you take one more comment about children at weddings?

Traditions defining many public ceremonies arose in times when the only public record was the public recollection. Centuries ago, before publicly recorded deeds secured property owners' rights, buyers and sellers would gather witnesses, including 10 small boys, and define the boundaries before exchanging a bag of gold for a symbolic clump of dirt. The men would then beat the boys to fix the transaction in their memories. This provided witnesses able to attest to the land sale covenant in the event a dispute arose, even decades later, in spite of limited life expectancies. I discovered this fact while researching land sales during law school.

It is my understanding that wedding included children for similar reasons. Celebrations, parades through the streets and processions into the church provided a positive reinforcement to the memories of the young children included to preserve a good public "record" of the marriage covenant. Modern ring bearers and flower girls apparently represent a remnant of this tradition. If correct, the tradition explains why such participants should be old enough to be cognizant, but otherwise very young.

Regardless of the reasons, sniffing, giggling, chattering children, missing their cues in the procession or fidgeting among the witnesses, remind me that some element of the family and community can attest to the vows long after the other witnesses and I are gone. In my opinion, a ceremony that excludes children misses the point of a public ceremony.

## Painting Yourself into a Corner

East dealer. Neither side vulnerable.

The bidding:

There are many simple-looking hands where it is very easy for declarer to go astray. Such hands appear with no advance notice at all, and the first thing declarer knows, he finds he has painted himself into a corner.

For example, consider this seemingly innocent deal where West leads a spade against three notrump. Let's say South wins with the queen and plays a low club to the jack, West showing out. East takes the jack with the ace and returns a spade. Eventu-

ally, South goes down one, losing two spades, two diamonds and a club — even though he shifts his attack to diamonds at trick four.

Declarer also goes down if he leads a diamond at trick two, assuming best defense by East-West. In that case, South loses two hearts, two diamonds and a club.

The winning line of play — guaranteed to succeed regardless of how the missing cards are divided — is to lead the queen of clubs, not the five, at trick two! In the actual case, if East takes the ace, declarer allows East to win the next round of clubs with the eight and so winds up scoring four club tricks, three spades and two hearts.

If East ducks the queen of clubs at trick two, South is still on solid ground. He turns his attention to diamonds, forcing out the A-K, and scores nine tricks consisting of three spades, two hearts, three diamonds and a club.

Choosing whether to lead the queen or five of clubs at trick two may seem unimportant, but the fact is that the queen play assures the contract, while the five play does not. When one play is sure to win and cannot lose, and another play is likely to win but may lose, there can be no question as to which is the better play.

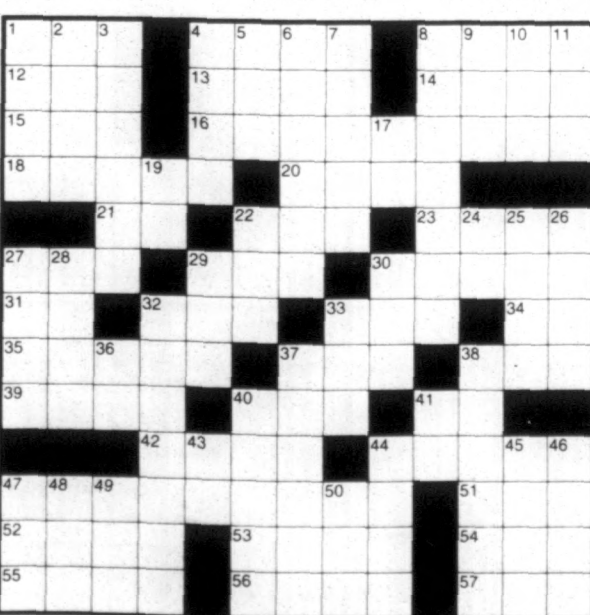

# Outdoors

SATURDAY, JUNE 5, 1999

Kentucky Lake elevation stands at 359 feet above sea level, and the Tennessee River below the dam is 303 feet.

As always, this is subject to change at a moments notice.

The recent bout of high temperature and humidity has helped to warm the waters of the lakes and rivers throughout the region.

The lake temperature is ranging from 77 to 79 degrees, depending on the depth and whether you're checking a bay or the main lake.

Most of the area is clear water. This is beginning the time of the season when the clear may be a problem for a lot of anglers.

Our local watersheds and farm ponds usually have a tannic acid color because of the vegetation in the non-moving waters.

In the smaller impoundments, fish usually bite each day on a regular schedule and they seem to be catchable, more so than the big lakes during hot weather.

Now, the answer to fishing hot weather water is to be there early and late when the sun is on an angle and the fish can come more shallow to feed. Even then, they can be fussy about artificial lures.

Felicia Elkins mentioned fishing a section of the river for bass, and she had some problems.

One of the was the bass wouldn't strike her lures. There could be a number of reasons for that.

Another was that she could see the bass and didn't realize they could also see her.

I think the most important reason may have been the bass trying to spawn. This type of behavior is typical of bedding bass. They just don't bite "something", unless it threatens the bed or her physically.

If you prowl the shorelines of any waters, you can find some shallow fish staging there. Many times, they can be caught if you are willing to put in the time and finesse.

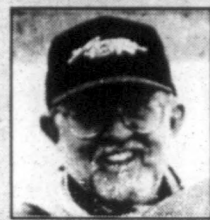
When times (conditions) get tough, I like to resort to live bait. Be it grasshoppers from a weed field or crickets and roaches from a wood pile, something will bite it.

Around the shorelines of our lakes, we count on the mayflies or willow flies, which come in uncountable numbers and attract practically all species of fish to feed on or near the surface.

We will be seeing these great baits after the water temperature has reached the 80 degree level for

a week or so.

Then we will see some surface feeding activity to make all our hearts thump loudly.

The main reason the mayfly exists is to provide a food source for the fish when the waters are clear and warm.

Other species of wildlife, such as the birds, also benefit from the mayfly. But the big one is the fish.

It helps the anglers to fish surface lures because the gamefish gather under and around a concentration of mayflies, where they can feed at their leisure.

We used to take large plastic bags and gather the mayflies by the thousands to use as bait for bluegill, bass, striper, crappie and catfish.

They are a very fragile-bodied fly, but there is an aroma or scent they have that attracts fish for long distances.

If you are after bluegill, one - or maybe two - flies will be enough. But larger fish will take more flies slipped over the hook.

In order to keep the flies fresh and use them later, we would package hundreds in plastic and freeze them.

They would thaw quickly when you were ready to fish. And if you fished after all the other flies were gone, you could really catch some good ones.

The mayflies live in the water as insects for a period of two years. And when they are ready to hatch and reproduce, it happens in a matter of 24 hours.

Usually at night, they surface and the shell splits open along the back like a dryfly does.

The now called mayfly has wings and flies to the nearest bank or source of light to mature during the daylight hours.

They gather in such great numbers, their combined weight will actually break limbs from trees.

Near the last hour of daylight, the now mature mayflies are ready to drop their eggs back into the water where life begins and the cycle

is complete.

Swarms of mayflies hover over the water, just out from the trees. You can actually see and hear their eggs dropping into the water.

Two years later, the resulting insects will take wing and fly out of the water to feed the fish.

Crappie anglers are still finding some big bodies out along the drops. It's a toss up over minnows or jigs.

The white bass are moving and looking for that all-important shad foodfish. They like the open flats - where shad gather and drift, feeding on the surface.

The striper action should increase as the shad grow to maturity. So keep a sharp eye for surface activity.

The catfish are trying to spawn, so you need to look for the fiddlers and smaller cats to be fairly shallow in the bays. Three to six feet should get you a bite.

The flatheads and blue/white channels are more out in the channel and adjoining flats to spawn.

These much larger fish take large minnows and sunfish as bait. So you can plan on using them to be selective.

The sunfish-bluegill are still hot on crickets and worms. So get a freezer stocked now.

Take the children so they can learn how to enjoy the outdoors.

Once one joins that great capitalist institution, the workforce, summer vacation ceases to be a relevant factor in life, with the exception of those (like the Chairman) who practice in the field of education.

Evidently, squirrels have taken to working overtime to produce more offspring, especially in years when there is ample fodder.

The spring season coincides with a peak in squirrel population

that cannot be sustained into the fall season. The challenge for spring hunters is to locate food sources, such as early seeds and fruits that the critters are utilizing.

So for what it's worth, the spring squirrel season is open from today until June 18. Like the fall season, the daily limit is six with no more than 12 in possession after two or more days of hunting.

The LBL season opened last Monday and runs through June 14.

While deer season is still more than 100 days away, it will soon be time to apply for quota hunts.

The Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife has posted quota hunt dates and instructions for management area hunts on its website, [www.state.ky.us/agencies/fw](http://www.state.ky.us/agencies/fw).

Applicants must apply by phone again this year, but no earlier than Aug. 1. LBL quota hunt applications will be available July 1.

This is an excellent time to take a youngster hunting. The weather is good and the woods should be full of young, spring bushytails.

And don't forget the historical significance either.

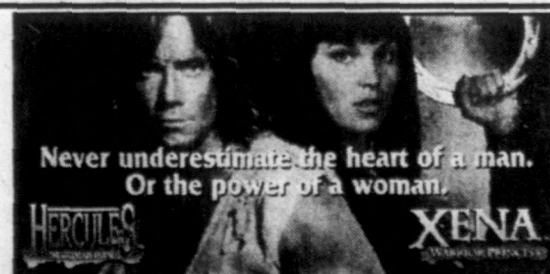




