Hazard readies for Clinton visit on Monday

HAZARD, Ky. (AP) — From city workers to local musicians and thespians, residents are busy sprucing up streets or rehearsing for their own roles in President Clinton's visit to this Appalachian community.

Firefighters hosed down Main Street, and workers planned to set up a podium normally used during the city's annual Black Gold Festival.

"Have you ever tried to ride a wild horse?" asked Mayor Bill Gorman. "That's what planning for this has been like."

Gorman estimates that as many as 30,000 people will come to this town of about 5,400 to hear the president speak Monday afternoon.

White House officials said Thursday that the president will speak about 3 p.m. The town will begin a program welcoming the president at 12:30 p.m.

The afternoon will include theatrical performances and pieces from the Hazard High School marching band.

"It's a lot of hard work getting this all together," said band instructor Steve Miniard. "But it's definitely worth it. This is a great thing for this town."

That sentiment was expressed by other residents.

Local woman files nomination papers

Calloway County resident Kathy Lyons is now an official candidate for lieutenant governor.

Lyons filed her nomination papers with Calloway County Court Clerk Ray Coursey Friday afternoon, one day after filing a certificate of nomination with Secretary of State John Y. Brown.

Lyons and gubernatorial candidate Gatewood Galbraith will be running on the Reform Party ticket.

Galbraith and Lyons made the announcement that they will be running as independent candidates on the November election ballot July 1 at a press conference in the Capitol Rotunda in Frankfort.

Galbraith said during the conference that he was "honored to have Kathy as my friend, ally and 1999 running mate," then joked "that she's never been arrested, so she brings much-needed balance to the ticket."

"We present the most balanced ticket in this race," Lyons said during the conference. "It is our goal to serve the people of Kentucky, to give them honest government and to conduct ourselves in such a way that Kentuckians will be proud to call us their leaders."

Galbraith has run for public office before, but always as a

New price for tickets from KSP

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — That ticket the Kentucky State Police officer is writing for you may mean a lot of money — just not the way you might imagine.

To emphasize seat belt usage, people who are properly buckled up and are using child safety seats properly could end up with the trooper writing a ticket that might mean money to the motorist.

Commissioner Gary Rose said troopers will not stop motorists to give them a "Buckle for Bucks Thank You Ticket." But if there is contact with a motorist, the ticket could be written. Motorists can return the ticket to the KSP Highway Safety Branch, which will award cash prizes after a random drawing on Feb. 10, 2000.

First prize will be \$3,000, second prize \$2,000, and third prize \$1,000.

The flip side is that not wearing seat belts subjects motorists to a different kind of a ticket — and a fine of up to \$25.

State police will be out in their usual force over the long weekend.

Construction on major highways will be interrupted this weekend to reduce delays, but the work will still mean some lane closings and other traffic impediments.

Lane restrictions or other problems will be in the following places:

Bath County — Interstate 64, one lane westbound mile points 119 and 120.

Carter County — I-64, one lane

Tobacco plan could affect area

Even though Calloway County predominantly produces dark fired tobacco, the recent settlement could still affect the area.

According to Western Dark Fired Tobacco Growers Association President Will Clark, approximately 350,000-400,000 pounds of burley will be produced in Calloway County this year.

"The biggest quota is in Ballard County," Clark said. "There's just not that much burley produced in Calloway County."

As for the debate over whether quota owners or growers deserve

more money, Clark said popular opinion depends on which side is talking.

"It's real easy to make the argument for whichever side of the fence you're sitting on," he said. "The bottom line is there's just no way to divide the money and please everybody."

Clark did say, however, that growers should be cautious not to expect too much out of the settlement.

"Nobody's going to get rich off this," he said. "These payments are not going to be that substantial."

Tobacco quota owners, growers and landowners would share equally in the first year's proceeds of a

settlement with cigarette manufacturers under an arrangement tentatively agreed to earlier this week.

Information from the 1998 growing season would be used to identify the recipients, and all of the \$112 million Kentucky expects to receive for the first annual installment of a 12-year settlement will be distributed immediately.

The Tobacco Growers and Quota Owner Certification Corp. will meet later this month to put the final touches on the plan, which will only be in effect for one year.

Gov. Paul Patton said he would

Official: Outlook of plant tied to sales

PADUCAH, Ky. (AP) — Two gaseous diffusion plants, one in Paducah, the other near Portsmouth, Ohio, will stay open as long as sales dictate, said an executive of the company operating them.

Foreign competition "can transfer a sound business into a troubled business in the blink of an eye," said Jim Miller, executive vice president of USEC Inc.

Such aggressive competition has driven USEC decisions to cut 500 jobs at the plants, scrap a once-promising laser technology called AVLIS and take over direct control of the work force.

The Paducah plant enriches about one-third of the fuel needed for the world's nuclear power.

Questions remain about the plants, whose lifespan is generally regarded as seven to 10 years. Gaseous diffusion technology is more than 50 years old and costly.

Power makes up 55 percent of USEC's budget, and the plants use the daily equivalent of three nuclear power plants' generation of electricity.

USEC is studying whether to deploy one of two other technological advances — proven gas centrifuge or unproven SILEX — or stick with diffusion and work to make it more cost-efficient.

Those strategies are critical to the plant.

Patton: Bell 'is for peace'

NEW ORLEANS, La. (AP) — A bell hailed as the Millennium Monument World Peace Bell has been unveiled, not to replace the Liberty Bell but certainly to rival it in status.

"It is for life, for liberty, for pursuit of happiness. It is for peace," Kentucky Gov. Paul Patton said Friday afternoon on the banks of the Mississippi River in downtown New Orleans.

The Peace Bell, which is touted as the largest swinging bell at 36 tons and 12 feet high and wide, will stay in

New Orleans for the Fourth of July weekend before it heads up the Mississippi and Ohio rivers to its home in Newport, Ky. A dedication ceremony is scheduled for Sunday in New Orleans.

The bell was the idea of Kentucky construction equipment entrepreneur Wayne Carlise, who paid its \$5 million price tag to attract tourists to northern Kentucky. The bell has no historical significance, but officials hope that one day it will symbolize peace.

UK hospital to resume air service

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — The University of Kentucky Hospital will resume medical helicopter service from Jackson for the first time since a UK helicopter crashed there last month, hospital officials said.

The new helicopter, a Sikorsky S-76 identical to the aircraft that crashed June 14, killing four crew members, is to begin service at 11 a.m. Monday.

"We're pleased to again be able to offer this service to eastern and southeastern Kentucky," said Colleen Swartz, director of trauma and emergency transport for the hospital.

The late-night crash occurred minutes after the helicopter took off from Jackson's Julian Carroll Airport on its way back to Lexington for the night.

"I just want to get out there and shake his hand," said Arvin Bishop, 64. "This is the greatest thing that's ever happened here."

But not everyone is so proud. "I'm not really impressed with it," said Robert Terry, 52, who was watching the firefighters prepare the town for the visit. "If it was someone else, I might be. I'm just not impressed with Bill Clinton or his morals."

Murray Walker, 34, said she would be more impressed if regular

people could talk with him.

"I'm not going down there," she said. "I'm not wasting my time."

The visit kicks off a four-day tour by Clinton promoting his "new markets initiatives" program. But it won't be the town's first brush with fame.

About 50,000 people jammed the streets of Hazard in September 1981 to see the stars of the television show "The Dukes of Hazzard" during the Black Gold Festival.

Many also recalled a visit by Robert F. Kennedy during his bid for the presidency in 1968.

'Godfather' author Puzo dies

NEW YORK (AP) — Mario Puzo was an obscure author saddled with a \$20,000 debt and the task of supporting a wife and five children when he sat down to write his third novel. He decided that art was out and commerce was in.

"It was really time to grow up and sell out," Puzo recalled of those days in the late 1960s.

Puzo, who died Friday at the age

78, sold plenty: the 1969 book was "The Godfather," which sold 21 million copies worldwide and spawned a pair of classic American films that collected nine Academy Awards. Before long, "an offer he can't refuse" was part of the American lexicon.

Puzo, the Italian immigrant's son who turned the Corleones into the Mafia's first family of fiction,

died of heart failure at his Long Island home.

The two-time Oscar winner, who wrote seven other novels and assorted Hollywood screenplays, had just completed the third book in his Mafia trilogy, "Omerta."

Puzo was born Oct. 15, 1920, in New York's Hell's Kitchen, the son of illiterate Italian immigrants.

like the forms, rules and procedures put in place to get checks to farmers in December or soon thereafter.

The money is part of a \$5.15 billion settlement from cigarette manufacturers with the tobacco growing industry. Kentucky is scheduled to get about \$1.5 billion, but that could be dramatically different depending on what

happens to cigarette sales and tobacco stocks.

The money is supposed to make up for income that growers will lose as cigarette demand falls. Cigarette prices increased after manufacturers agreed to pay the states \$206 billion over 25 years to settle the health-related costs of smoking.

Kentucky's share of the larger settlement will be distributed by

the General Assembly.

Quota owners will get their piece based on the 1998 basic quota maintained by the U.S. Department of Agriculture. Landowners and tenants will get their portions based on an average of their 1998 effective quota — which is the basic and whatever surplus or shortage carried from the previous year — and the amount of tobacco actually marketed.

"If we get enough meaning around the bell for the next 20, 30, 40 years, then people will want to come see the bell," Carlise said. "This is just a bell until you put a meaning around it. We will put peace around it."

New Orleans Mayor Marc Morial and Patric Marechal, deputy vice mayor of Nantes, France, where the bell was cast, also were at the ceremony.

The bell was covered by canvas but unveiled in front of more than 50 people during a public ceremony. Marechal was the first to ring it with a computerized clapper.

An inscription on one side of the bell reads: "The World Peace Bell is a symbol of freedom and peace, honoring our past, celebrating our present and inspiring our future."

Three children holding hands in front of a world map are depicted on the bell. Six images of the millennium such as astronauts on the moon and a computer chip circle around the top.

The bell will be rung once every hour during New Year's ceremonies at its permanent home.

The bell was cast in Nantes, France, because no other foundry was big enough, officials said. It was then shipped into the Gulf of Mexico and will be rung again with its outside clapper in New Orleans on July 4 and at a dozen other stops along the Mississippi and Ohio Rivers while it travels accompanied by a four-decked paddle wheel boat named the Belle of Cincinnati.

New Orleans was a fitting site for the bell to be first revealed in the United States because this is where the French-Canadian explorer Jean Baptiste le Moyne, Sieur de Bienville first landed in 1718.

"As we begin the new millennium, the 21st Century, I think it is very important that we celebrate world peace, human understanding ... right at the site where Bienville founded this city."

Kentucky officials are still working out financing for the plans, which include an \$80 million tower complete with an observation deck, restaurant and space-shot ride inside.

Democrat. He first attracted attention in 1983, when he ran for Kentucky agricultural commissioner.

Miller provided a look at their recent past and the near future during a speech Thursday to the Paducah Area Chamber of Commerce.

Last July, USEC went from a governmental entity to a publicly owned business through the sale of more than \$1.4 billion in stock to about 40,000 shareholders. That marked the first time the plants, built in the early 1950s, were not operated by government contractors.

Despite rocky financial performance since privatization, USEC continues to pay a \$1.10 annual dividend and predicts a booming fourth quarter, which ended Wednesday.

USEC Communications Director Elizabeth Stucke said those results are unaudited and not yet public.

However, USEC's June 9 decision to scrap a \$2.5 billion project to develop a laser technology called AVLIS was one reason why Morgan Stanley, lead underwriter for the stock sale, upgraded the stock's outlook.

Judge clears way for Branch Davidian lawsuit

WACO, Texas (AP) — A federal judge has cleared the way for a lawsuit that claims the federal government is responsible for the fiery and deadly end to the 1993 Branch Davidian standoff.

U.S. District Judge Walter S. Smith Jr. pared the number of defendants and plaintiffs, but ruled Thursday that the case can go to trial, said Mike Caddell, lead attorney for the Davidians.

"I think what the judge did is a great victory for the Davidians and for the country," Caddell said. "Our folks can't be happier, and look forward to having their day in court."

The lawsuit — filed by surviving Davidians and the relatives of the dead — challenges the government's conclusion that the Davidians started the fire and that they also shot first during the federal raid on their compound.

The multimillion-dollar lawsuit has been on hold since early May while an appeals court considered whether Smith should be removed from the case. The plaintiffs wanted another judge because Smith has ruled in criminal cases involving Branch Davidians.

David Koresh and about 80 followers died in the fire that ended the 51-day standoff.

Carter surprises students

PLAINS, Ga. (AP) — To the surprise of students working on a new national historic site at Jimmy Carter's boyhood farm, the former president arrived unannounced on a bicycle.

"We had no idea we were going to meet him," said Michelle Greenleaf, 17, of Rock Stream, N.Y. "And I'm very surprised he rode his bike."

Carter answered students' questions Thursday about everything from segregation in the South during his childhood to the gnats that plague them as they work. The site is being developed by the Interior Department.

Carter recalled that his best friend growing up was a black boy whose family lived on his father's farm. He said they couldn't sit together at the movies because the theater was segregated, but "we'd meet outside afterwards and come back home."

Brown charged with misdemeanors

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Hall of Fame football player and actor Jim Brown has been charged with two misdemeanors for allegedly threatening to kill his wife and breaking her car windows with a shovel.

Brown, 63, was charged Thursday with vandalism and making a terrorist threat. He faces up to 18 months in jail and a \$2,000 fine if convicted on both counts. He is scheduled to appear in court Tuesday.

Brown was arrested June 15 at his Hollywood Hills apartment after his wife, Monique, 25, called 911.

Mrs. Brown later said she had overreacted, and Brown's lawyer William Grayson denied the charges.

"His wife did not feel threatened and continues to live peacefully with her husband," Grayson said. "They did have an argument but there was no violence, no injury."

Brown retired from football in 1966. Playing for the Cleveland Browns, he set many National Football League rushing and scoring records. He has appeared in several Hollywood films, including "The Dirty Dozen."

Princess Margaret has new grandson

LONDON (AP) — Princess Margaret has a new grandson, a baby boy who is 13th in line to the British throne.

The boy, born Thursday night to the princess's son, Viscount Linley, and his wife at London's Portland Hospital, has not yet been named.

"Mother and son are extremely well and both families are delighted," said a statement from Linley's office.

The baby is the third grandchild of Princess Margaret, Queen Elizabeth's sister.

Hamilton purchases new home

THOUSAND OAKS, Calif. (AP) — Scott Hamilton, the Olympic gold medalist and figure skating TV analyst, found his new home on the Internet.

Hamilton paid \$1.5 million for the 6,000-square-foot, four-bedroom home, which features a private boat dock and lake views from all six levels. The area is 50 miles northwest of Los Angeles.

Hamilton was browsing the Internet from his main residence in Denver when he discovered the listing for the home, the Los Angeles Times reported Thursday.

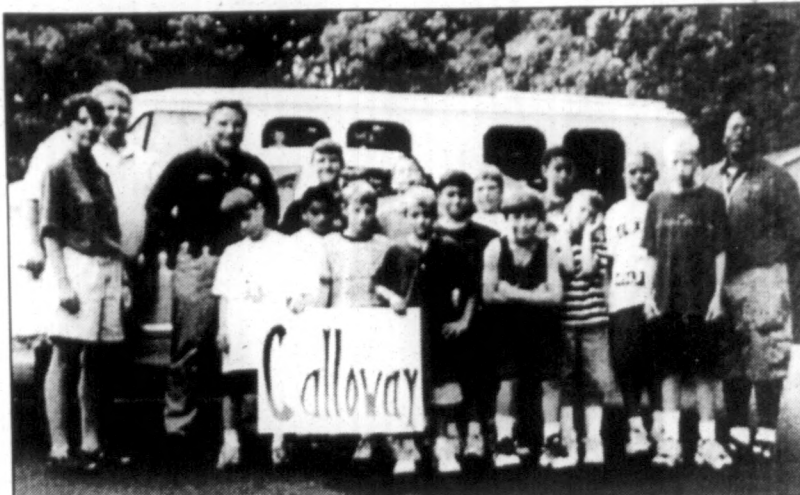
He added, "The ranch serves needy children, ages 8-11, from throughout Kentucky at no charge to the children or their families — the funds to operate the camp are

What does it mean?

There's a new word in the English language: "Nethercutt."

To Nethercutt means to go back on one's word; to say one thing in order to get elected to political office and then to do the opposite once elected; to be swept off one's feet by the perks and privileges of Washington.

It means to be dishonest, a hypocrite, an opportunist.

The word comes from Congressman George Nethercutt who in 1994 became the first person to defeat a sitting Speaker of the House since the Civil War.

Then House Speaker Tom Foley, a 30-year incumbent, sued the voters of Washington to overturn a term limits initiative they passed two years earlier.

Campaigning against Speaker Foley, Nethercutt pledged again and again to abide by the term limits voters endorsed, and serve no more than three terms in Congress.

Now, six years later as his promise comes due, Nethercutt is breaking his word to the voters and plans to keep running for office to cash in on a career in Washington.

The Seattle Times defines "nethercutting" as, "the cynical, self-serving hypocrisy of someone who exploits others for personal gain."

In stark contrast to Nethercutt, Rep. Matt Salmon and seven others

who made term limit pledges have kept them.

When asked about Nethercutt's excuses for breaking his word, Salmon said bluntly: "I don't buy those arguments and I can trump all those arguments with one card: if you give your word you ought to keep it, end of story."

The problem isn't that Nethercutt changed his mind about term limits. In fact, Nethercutt claims he still supports term limits.

The issue is now one of simple integrity. He can always change his mind about an issue, but that's different than breaking his word to step down.

Voters are wondering: if Mr. Nethercutt can break his word regarding the central tenet of his original campaign, can he be trusted on any other subject?

There have been others in history who made similar pledges, and a few may later have wished they had not given their word.

President Teddy Roosevelt pledged in his 1905 inaugural address that he would not run again in 1908.

Unlike Nethercutt, Teddy Roosevelt's pledge was not crucial to his being elected in the first place — it actually came as he was taking office long after the votes were counted.

But, like Nethercutt, Roosevelt came to wish he had not made the pledge.

When the 1908 presidential cam-

paign rolled around, Roosevelt was still very popular and, since there were not yet mandatory presidential term limits, he could have legally served again.

But here is where Roosevelt was far different than Congressman Nethercutt; he could not break his word because he refused to surrender his personal integrity.

Roosevelt was a man of tremendous character and he would not "nethercutt" the American people.

Even the sports pages recently carried a story about the kind of integrity that Mr. Nethercutt lacks. Felipe Alou is the manager of the Montreal Expos a baseball team that has been down on its luck this year.

Alou turned down an offer to go to another team, saying: "I always said I would not leave this organization ... I had to keep my word. It doesn't matter if you are winning games or losing games. We die with our word."

June 27 - Le Monde, Paris, on Israel's bombings of Lebanon:

Once again, in the early summer heat, Beirut is licking its wounds from shell damage. A few days before leaving the government, Benjamin Netanyahu gave the green light for the heaviest bombings against Lebanon since 1996.

Eight Lebanese civilians were killed, sixty others wounded.

Thursday, the rocket fire from the Lebanese Hezbollah group killed two.

In the all-too-familiar refrain, Israel claimed legitimate self-defense, the Hezbollah claimed retaliation for an Israeli attack.

Many questions remain unanswered. Was Ehoud Barak, the Israeli Prime Minister elect, even aware of the strikes?

Was Netanyahu being a bad loser and provoking problems for his successor? Or, was the Israeli army — unable to defeat the Hezbollah — having one last stab at Lebanon before they had to withdraw?

But one thing is for sure: even if the Hezbollah is in the wrong, the sheer disproportion of the Israeli retaliation highlights the failure of their fifteen year campaign against Lebanon.

June 28 - The Sydney (Australia) Morning

Herald, on Indonesia:

When former president Soeharto ruled Indonesia general elections were staged like clockwork every five years with the results known well in advance.

It is a measure of how much things have changed that there is still no final result from the poll three weeks ago.

With little over half the vote counted the broad outlines are clear. The secular nationalist Indonesian Democratic Party of Struggle (PDI-P) of Megawati Sukarnoputri is out in front with about 36 percent, followed by the ruling Golkar Party on 18.5 percent.

The National Awakening Party of Abdurrahman Wahid is on 18 percent.

It is difficult to imagine the presidency could be awarded to anyone other than Megawati. The fact that Megawati and Wahid are in loose alliance gives her an added advantage.

Such an alliance would give Indonesia a government with three important characteristics. First it would have a strong grounding in Java.

Second it would be a government which, while committed to reform, would be in no hurry to overturn the existing social and economic order.

Finally it would be a government distinctly wary of modernist Islam.

Lonesome in a mob

He has a postage stamp bearing his image.

His home, Graceland, is second most visited historical site in America, second only to the White House.

There are over 500 active fan clubs operating in his memory, more than the 65 when he died, and 50 million fans still active.

There are as many as 20,000 impersonators of him performing in Vegas and hick towns across the country.

He has been dead 22 years, but his recordings remain among the best-sellers. Thousands of people have videotape collections of his movies.

"He" is Elvis.

Amazon.com, the Internet book site, lists 261 books currently available about him: books on Elvis sightings, books on Elvis shrines, books on his favorite recipes, books on Elvis Graceland graffiti, books on cover-ups of his death and on his not being dead at all, books doing psychological analyses of him, books of fan letters, books of quotes from him, tour books of places he visited or performed, books on Elvis memorabilia, books on his entourage, books of photos and art works about him, a book of Elvis paper dolls, books about psychic experiences involving him, books by people claiming to know him personally.

In death, he has achieved a fame and immortality few scholars would have foreseen after watching his career stagnate, briefly revive, and then end in isolation, drugs, and scandal.

In death, Elvis is more imitated and revered than even NASCAR racing or WWF wrestling — or Jesus Christ.

As a center of worship, Elvis has to be taken seriously, even if most books and cults surrounding him and boosting his memory are shallow, irrational, exploitive nonsense.

Three recent decent Elvis books are Greil Marcus's *Dead Elvis: A Chronicle of a Cultural Obsession* (Harvard, \$17.95); Erika Doss's

Elvis Culture: Fans, Faith & Image (Kansas, \$24.95); and Peter Guralnick's *Careless Love: The Unmaking of Elvis Presley* (Little, Brown, \$27.95).

Marcus's book is a series of essays from Rolling Stone, Village Voice, and elsewhere, published eight years ago and now reprinted by Harvard in paperback. Marcus believes the secret of Elvis's abiding public appeal is in his music, which in its sensuality and "newness" captured and symbolized the Zeitgeist ("spirit of the times") of a seismic shift in public life. The layers of meaning various groups of the public attach to Elvis are not unlike the multilayered meanings scholars attach to Melville's *Moby Dick* or to Lincoln's Second Inaugural, says Marcus.

Like many other authors, Marcus latches on to the Elvis-As-Jesus theme, and documents the public's equation of the two.

For Doss, it is not so much the Elvis sound (the music) as it is the visual image of him which explains his cult-like status.

She finds parallels between Jesus and Elvis in the displacement with pictures of Elvis, from Vietnam days onward, of Sallman's Head of Christ painting, once a major religious icon in millions of homes.

She explores rituals, shrines, and the ambiguous and often contradictory fans who adore Elvis "religiously."

It is, to Doss, not Elvis who lives on, but an image of Elvis his fans have created in his absence and in their need to fill vacuums within their own psyches and inner feelings.

Guralnick is the Elvis scholar to be taken most seriously. Most other books concentrate on his

fans and followings, but Guralnick is in search of Elvis himself.

The first volume of his Elvis biography, *Last Train to Memphis*, appeared in 1994, and garnered plaudits for objectivity and for focusing on Elvis himself in the pre-military service meteoric career.

The second volume, *Careless Love*, traces Elvis's retreat from early fame into "institutionalization," in which he declined after military service, from 1960 on, into a long string of poor movies and bad music, orchestrated by Col. Tom Parker, who claimed half of Elvis's earnings and kept the Elvis image under dictatorial controls.

For a brief moment, in the 1968 Elvis television special, Elvis seemed to break free of Parker and to regain his simplicity and grace, but it was not to be.

Obsessions with drugs, food, women, guns, and isolation take him into a final, fatal, unfortunate ending.

The legacy, Guralnick says, is not the fanaticism of his fans, although it is how Elvis is seen today, but the music.

Much of it was good and endures.

Elvis is a case study of the modern tendency to elevate secular symbols to sacred status, to make worldly religions out of celebrities in an unending search for something of substance to fill modern spiritual vacuums.

In giving us insight into the historical Elvis, Guralnick performs a valuable and necessary service of demythologizing a manmade god — but fairly, not cynically.

What Elvis actually was and what we have made of him are too radically different things.

June 30 - The Financial Times, London, on Northern Ireland:

It is hard to imagine how Northern Ireland could have a better chance of peace, if it is not grasped today. The possibilities may often have seemed slender during the war of words which preceded today's final deadline for agreement. But if things do not now move forward, they seem certain to deteriorate.

June 25 - Cape Cod Times, Hyannis, Mass., on Einstein's brain:

It's official. Albert Einstein's brain was different. It has been reported in the medical journal *Lancet*. Most of the world came to that conclusion long ago, so the puzzler is what the study means. Scientists, generally, have no trouble describing things, but have more difficulty drawing conclusions. ...

What the scientists did not claim is that the study is new ammunition in the age-old nature-nurture debate, that Einstein's genius was the result of cerebral hard-wiring.

Of course, it can only be interpreted that way and, perhaps because there are no alternative theories, critics have assailed the study as a 20th-century reincarnation of phrenology, the discarded theory of the 1800s that understanding the shape of the skull was a key to understanding character. ...

June 30 - The Times, London, on Ocalan death sentence:

Hanging (Abdullah) Ocalan will not improve Turkey's relationship with its Kurdish minority. ... Making a martyr of him could ignite new Turkish

violence.

Hanging Ocalan would also put more strains on Turkey's already tense relationship with European neighbors who reject the death penalty. ... The most imaginative route for Turkey now might be to wait until today's passion and polemics fade away.

Formally commuting the death sentence might, for now, strike Turkish voters as weak. But if Ocalan was alive, in prison, with a death sentence over his head, the PKK (Kurdish Workers' Party) might exercise more restraint; meanwhile, the Turkish Government would win time for a broader approach to the Kurdish question. This would let Turkey move towards taking its pragmatic interest, close ties with Europe, as seriously as its principles.

June 30 - Il Giorno, Milan, Italy, on Ocalan sentence:

The indignation expressed by European leaders in the wake of Abdullah Ocalan's death sentence by the Turkish military court is hypocritical.

Hypocritical, since Europe banned Ocalan and practically handed him over to the Turkish secret services.

But it is hypocritical mainly because the matter cannot be reduced to Ocalan's sentencing and Turkey's use of the death penalty.

Ocalan was sentenced because of his leadership of the Kurdistan Workers' Party, an organization not unlike the Kosovo Liberation Army (KLA), whose leaders were celebrated as martyrs of freedom and then supported militarily.

What were the Albanian fighters doing in Kosovo other than engaging in terrorist actions? Yet its leaders were accepted and encouraged in Western diplomatic circles, whilst Ocalan was consciously and cynically pushed towards the gallows. ...

Lastly, the ultimate and grotesque paradox, Turkey, for decades responsible of crimes against humanity against the Kurds, has, as member of NATO, presented itself as a defender of human rights in Kosovo.

Dr. J: 'Tennis phenom is my daughter'

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Alexandra Stevenson plays tennis with a vengeance and plenty of flair. More than overpowering serves and mammoth ground strokes, her game exudes a natural-born talent for playing to the crowd.

Much like her father, Dr. J. Julius Erving, the Basketball Hall of Famer who redefined the game with high-flying dunks and charisma, said Friday he is the father of the 18-year-old tennis phenom. His statement by telephone to The Associated Press came shortly after Stevenson made history on another continent, becoming the first female qualifier to advance to the Wimbledon semi-

nals.

It was a momentous day for the young, captivating player from California and for Erving, the former Philadelphia 76ers star who is now a vice president with the NBA's Orlando Magic.

"I acknowledge a relationship with her mother in 1980," Erving said from his office in Florida. "My wife, who has known from the beginning, and children are aware of this situation."

"All matters concerning Alexandra since her birth have been handled privately through counsel. I am pleased to see Alexandra, at 18, doing so well and I applaud her mother's efforts and courage."

The possibility that Erving was Stevenson's father was raised this week when

The Fort Lauderdale Sun-Sentinel published a copy of her birth certificate. Though it listed her father as Julius Winfield Erving II, Erving's legal name, the basketball great initially denied being her father.

Stevenson has taken Wimbledon by storm with her game and presence and also by the controversy that has shadowed her run to the semis.

Her mother, Samantha Stevenson, is a free-lance journalist who covered the 76ers while Erving starred on the team. She stirred Wimbledon with accusations of racism and lesbianism on the WTA Tour and with a dispute over prize money.

Mother and daughter declined comment Friday when asked several times about Erving's statement.

Stevenson advanced to the semifinals against Lindsay Davenport by beating another qualifier, 16-year-old Jelena Dokic, 6-3, 1-6, 6-3. She hopped and skipped to the net after the final point, clapping with one hand on her racquet strings and curt-sying four times to the crowd on Court 1.

An ocean away, Dr. J said: "I haven't talked to her. I only met her once, and she was 3 years old. She was brought to me at a basketball clinic at a public school."

Erving soared higher, hung in the air longer and slam-dunked with more style than any player before him. He was Michael Jordan before Jordan came along, revolutionizing the game during a 16-year

career in the ABA and with the Sixers. He was also the epitome of class off the court — patient, considerate and always gracious to his fans.

If he was watching his daughter on television, there's no way he could have missed her crushing serves at speeds up to 113 mph and the way she peppered the court with mighty, one-handed backhands that are rare in women's tennis.

But while millions of other kids who grew up in the '80s idolized Dr. J, his own daughter had different ideas. Her idol is Pete Sampras, and she learned that devastating backhand from his old coach, Pete Fischer.

Erving said he would make no further comments about Stevenson.

Braves demolish Mets 16-0 Worst shutout ever for N.Y.

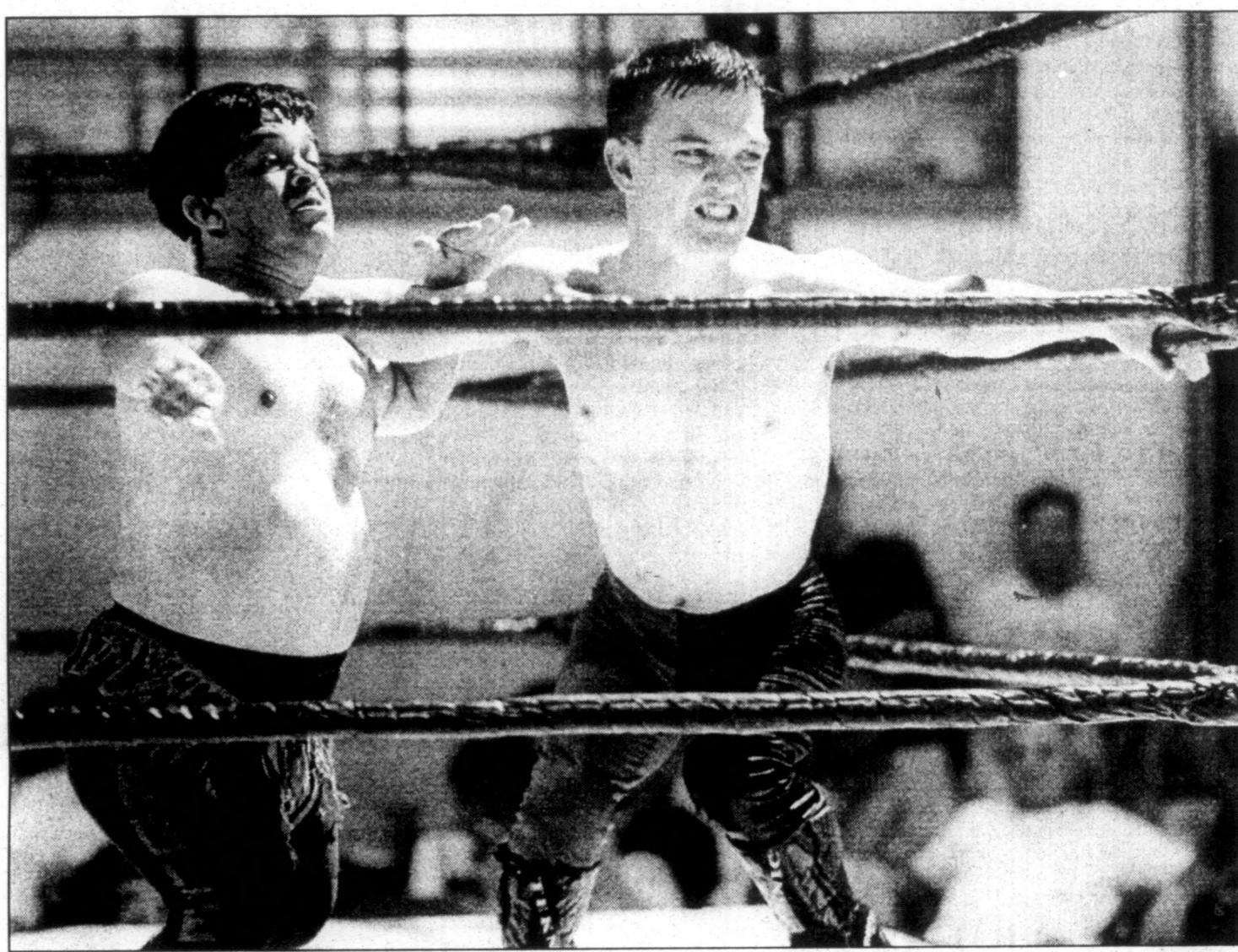
NEW YORK (AP) — While Greg Maddux was nearly unhit-table, Atlanta batters couldn't miss what the New York Mets were throwing.

Again looking like the dominant pitcher who won four straight Cy Young Awards, Maddux allowed just two hits in six shutout innings as the Atlanta Braves made it look like batting practice in a historic 16-0 rout Friday night.

Chipper Jones hit a pair of two-run homers, Eddie Perez and Gerald Williams hit three-run drives and Ryan Klesko added a solo shot for the Braves, who sent the Mets to their worst shutout loss ever.

The Braves matched their biggest shutout win this century, having beaten Brooklyn 16-0 on May 7, 1918, and tying that against Pittsburgh on Sept. 12, 1952.

Maddux (8-5), backed by eight runs in the first three innings, didn't give up a hit until Luis Lopez's one-out single in the fifth.

Woods shares Western Open leaderboard with Appleby

LEMONT, Ill. (AP) — Tiger Woods walked off the 18th green thinking he'd had a pretty good round. It looked even better after Stuart Appleby ran into trouble on the last two holes.

After notching an eagle and seven birdies, Appleby bogeyed Nos. 17 and 18 Friday, leaving him tied with Woods at 10-under 134 after the second round of the Western Open. Both shot 6-under 66s on Friday.

Mike Brisky, the first-round leader, shot a 69 and is one shot back at 9-under 135. Vijay Singh, the 1998 runner-up, is among four at 7-under 137 in the \$2.5 million tournament on the 7,073-yard Dubsread course at the Cog Hill Golf and Country Club.

"I feel bad for Stuart, but I feel pretty good for myself," said Woods, who won the Western Open in 1997. "To finish like that is always tough, especially with how well he was playing."

After bogeying the par-4 No. 4, Appleby seemed to get in a groove. He had birdies on Nos. 5, 7 and 9, including a tough, 15-foot uphill putt on the seventh. He made a 12-foot putt on the 10th to go 8-under and catch Woods, who was playing a hole in front of him.

"Pretty good golf," Appleby said.

Cone, bullpen help Yankees slip past Orioles 2-1

NEW YORK (AP) — The Baltimore Orioles finally pitched well, but the hitters let them down. The New York Yankees hitters failed to do the job, so David Cone and the bullpen stepped it up.

That's the way it has been going

for these two teams, streaking in opposite directions in the AL East.

Cone gutted his way through six innings and the New York Yankees scored just enough to hand the Baltimore Orioles their ninth straight loss, 2-1 Friday night.

The Yankees have won nine of 10 games and eight straight at

home against the Orioles. Baltimore's longest losing streak of the season comes immediately after winning 11 of 12 games.

"It's a confidence factor," Yankees manager Joe Torre said. "When you keep beating a club, their confidence is not as high as it was. It is something that is always in

the back of your mind."

Jason Johnson (1-3) allowed two runs in seven innings to give Baltimore its second straight strong start, but it still wasn't enough. On Thursday, the bullpen blew a 6-3 lead for Scott Erickson at Toronto, the third straight day the "pen took the loss. This time, the hit-

ters were the problem.

"We are just going through this as a team," Johnson said. "We hit line drives all over the place but they all seem to be at somebody. They don't hit the ball nearly as hard, but they fall in and runs score."

Cone (9-3) allowed a batter to

reach in every inning, but held the Orioles to one hit — an RBI single by Cal Ripken in the sixth — in 12 at-bats with runners in scoring position.

"He does best when he puts himself in tough situations," said New York's Derek Jeter, who went 2-for-4.

Rudd's ride back in sync after sponsor surprise

DAYTONA BEACH, Fla. (AP) — Critics say the business side of stock car racing is sapping all the fun out of the sport. Anyone who agrees probably can't help but pull for Ricky Rudd in the Pepsi 400 on Saturday night.

Considered a dinosaur in NASCAR circles because he owns a one-car team in an era of multibillion-dollar conglomerates, Rudd suffered a difficult blow to his business this week. His sponsor for most of the decade, Procter & Gamble, decided to pull its Tide label off the 24-year Winston Cup veteran's car at year's end.

He responded with one of his best qualifying laps of the year, making the front row outside of Joe Nemechek. And for that effort, every racing fan who has ever started his own company — or simply bought a box of Tide, for that matter — has a reason to cheer for Rudd this weekend.

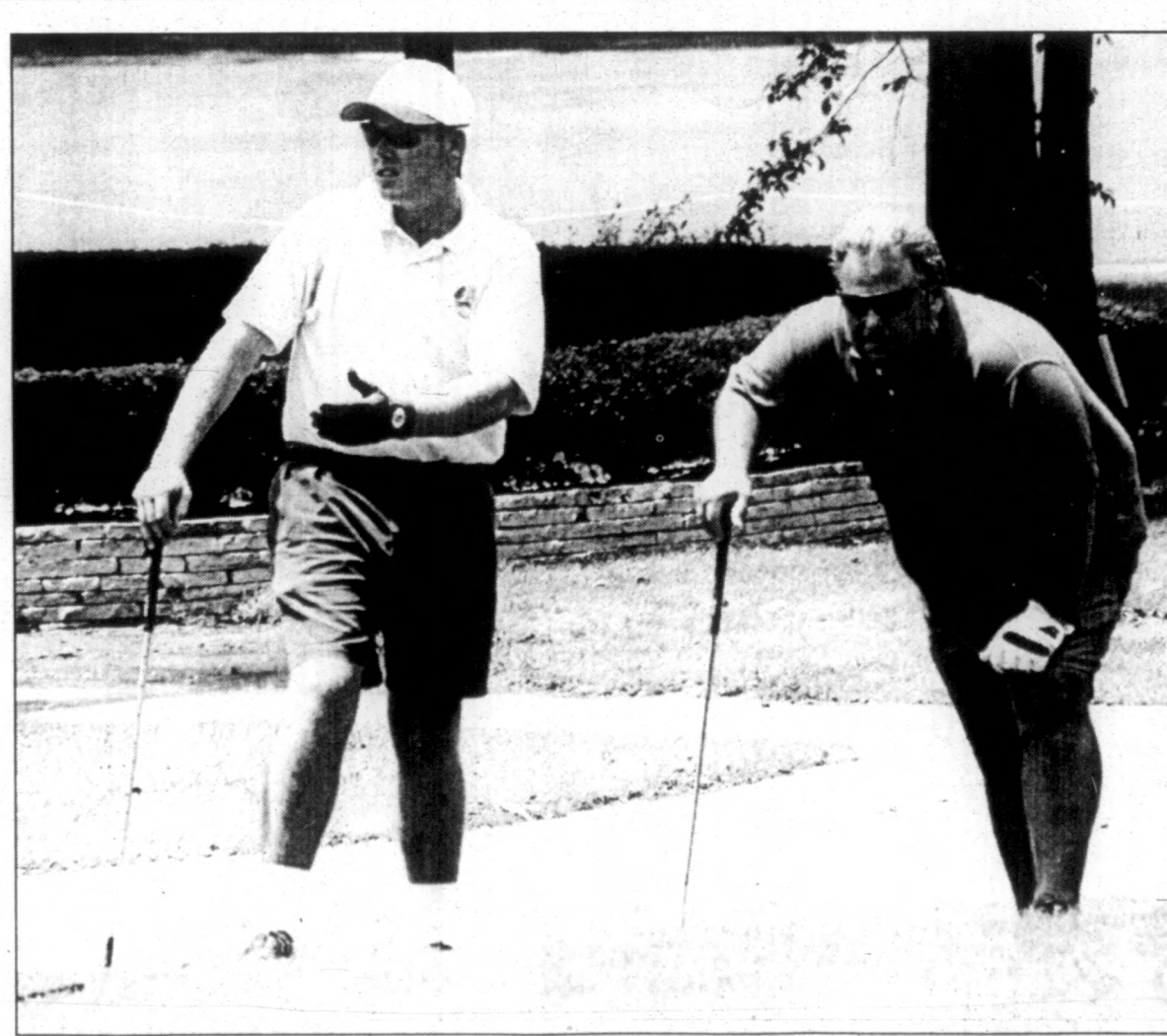
"This is really the first time I've ever experienced anything like this," Rudd said. "I guess racing

is growing and it's changing and, hopefully, it's all for the better. But I think, unfortunately, a lot of the guys who paid their dues and helped create the sport are tending to get run over."

Rudd's detractors will be quick to point out that he has created many of his own problems. When he split with Rick Hendrick and created his own team in 1994, Rudd kept the sponsorship deal with Tide going. And even five years ago, he must have been able to see that one-car owners were quickly becoming outnumbered in the garage, on the test track and, most importantly, on the earnings ledger.

Still, there's no denying Rudd has reason for hard feelings. Procter & Gamble is likely to move its sponsorship to Precision Preparation Inc., a company best known for its CART team, one that won't put a car on a NASCAR track until next year.

Whoever drives that car will take the logo that belonged to Rudd, who has one of the most

World Series runner-up Padres turn season around

SAN DIEGO (AP) — Maybe it won't be a bumper summer in San Diego, after all.

With the afterglow of their World Series appearance gone, the Padres fell to the bottom of the NL West and weren't expected to be contenders again until closer to 2002, when their new downtown ballpark opens.

They obliged, looking downright awful at times. Injuries made things worse, with Tony Gwynn, Wally Joyner and Reggie Sanders being knocked out of the lineup. And they had lost many of their other stars from last season because the team couldn't afford to keep them.

At one point in June, the Padres looked more like a glorified version of the Triple-A Las Vegas Stars than the team that won the NL pennant.

Then the veterans slowly returned, the youngsters who remained got better and the Padres became a summertime sensation.

Tour de France opening under scandal

PARIS (AP) — Organizers of the biggest cycling race in the world are desperately hoping that attention on this year's Tour de France will be focused not on drugs, but on the sport itself.

That seemed unlikely, if not impossible.

Even as the 180 riders on 20 teams were gathering for today's prologue at Puy-du-Fou, recriminations from last year's catastrophic doping scandal were still flying.

The former director of Festina, the team at the heart of the scandal, spoke of drug use among riders, including former team member and

French star Richard Virenque, who denies having used illegal substances.

Bruno Roussel, one of two Festina officials banned from the sport, said the drug demands of the riders became "incredible."

"Given their state of dependence, it was no longer possible to talk to them, to do anything," Roussel in Friday's L'Equipe newspaper.

Richard Virenque remains under investigation on drug charges, but he planned to be riding today.

On Wednesday, the tour reluctantly bowed to pressure from cycling's governing body and readmitted the controversial rider,

barred because "his presence would be incompatible with the image of the tour."

The International Cycling Union, citing a technical error, ordered organizers to rescind the ban. Race director Jean-Marie Leblanc called the order a "takeover by force."

In addition to Virenque, now with the Italian team Polti, the cycling union ordered Tour officials to rescind a ban on Manolo Saiz, sporting director of Spain's ONCE team.

On Friday, Leblanc tried to strike a positive tone, telling a news conference he hoped that from now on, people "won't talk anymore about doping, but about the race."

Virenque, for his part, kept silent when pursued by journalists seeking his views on this year's race.

As this year's tour begins, nobody is happy. Riders are furious about what they continue to see as a witch hunt; sponsors are wary of supporting a discredited sport; and many fans are fed up.

Making things worse, many top stars are not competing.

Defending champion Marco Pantani is one of them. The Italian said the course didn't suit him, but his place would have been in jeopardy anyway after he was kicked out of the Tour of Italy last month.

They had won 13 straight games going into the July 4th weekend — a club record and the longest streak in the majors since 1994 — to jump right back in contention.

The rest of baseball has to be

shaking its head, especially the underachieving division rival Los Angeles Dodgers.

Six times in 10 days, the Padres left the Dodgers blue. San Diego jumped from last to third place in the NL West to get back to .500. The Dodgers, whose payroll is \$31.2 million higher than San

Diego's, dropped into last place.

"A realistic goal for us was to get back to .500 by the end of the season," said scrappy outfielder Eric Owens, who along with fellow newcomers Damian Jackson and Reggie Sanders leads an offense that has caught up with solid starting pitching and an airtight bullpen.

"No one thought we'd go on a streak like this. This is a good way to get started off in July. We need to run with this, and if we can get into August, we can make a pennant race of it."

Manager Bruce Bochy said the Padres played just as hard when things were going bad. Still, the players met a few weeks back to discuss attitude.

"We made a conscientious effort as a group that we're going to play hard and let things fall where they may; in a sense, not have any regrets," said reliever Trevor Hoffman, who blew three saves early — two more than he did all of last year — then nailed down 11 straight.

There are no prima donnas in the Padres clubhouse, just guys who play the game the way it's supposed to be played.

The catalysts, Owens and Jackson, don't even make as much as \$300,000 each. The Padres have been without Gwynn since the third game of the streak. The batting star is sidelined again by a calf injury and remains 18 hits short of 3,000 for his career.

While the 1998 Padres were a

station-to-station team that waited for Greg Vaughn or Ken Caminiti to go deep, these Padres aren't afraid to stick their faces in the dirt to take an extra bag.

The Padres hit and run, steal and double-steal. Jackson, a rookie, thrilled even his teammates when he raced from first to third when pitcher Andy Ashby fooled the Dodgers in a bunt situation by chopping a ball though the infield and into left.

They use their speed on defense, too, banging into the fences and tracking down balls others might not get.

"They go about it relentlessly," Joyner said of his speed-blessed teammates.

General manager Kevin Towers, who sacrificed power for speed when he sent 50-homer man Vaughn to Cincinnati for Sanders and Jackson, called it "a more exciting brand of baseball."

"Guys are getting dirty," he said. "We have seven or eight guys in the lineup who come into the clubhouse after games and you can't see the 'Padres' on their uniform."

On Monday night, San Diego's speed was enough to withstand Colorado's power in an 8-7 win. The Padres raced to a club-record nine stolen bases, with Jackson tying the team mark with five. They've already blown past last year's total of 79 stolen bases.

impressive records in the sport. He has won at least one race for 16 seasons straight, from 1983-98.

This year, Rudd is mired in 38th place in the points standings without a top-10 finish. He says sales and promotion had been the last thing on his mind.

"I'm probably guilty of working way too many hours and worrying way too much about this race team, instead of going up with a fancy briefcase and a nice powerpoint presentation," Rudd said.

PPI owner Cal Wells said he didn't mean to stir up bad feelings with Rudd, who has been very critical of Wells, or with other NASCAR drivers who might feel like he is barging in on their turf.

"I'm sorry Ricky feels the way he does," Wells said. "We're not here to kick him or anyone else off. We're here to build a strong foundation in this sport and in this industry."

Aside Rudd in Saturday's race will be Nemecek, another under-

dog who nonetheless has the manpower of Felix Sabates' Sabco racing team at his disposal.

A few rows back are Dale Earnhardt, Jeff Gordon and Dale Jarrett, who, in different ways, symbolize where the sport has gone over the last decade.

"You have to do a lot outside the Winston Cup points chase, Jarrett, Gordon and Earnhardt are in the thick of it."

Jarrett, who will start 12th, holds the lead by 157 points over Bobby Labonte heading into the second half of the season. Gordon has four victories, more than anyone in the field, but stands 314 points behind Jarrett in the quest for a third straight title. Gordon will start 11th.

Earnhardt is in seventh place. He ran second at Daytona in February and earned his lone victory this year at Talladega, proving his restrictor-plate program has as much potential as anybody's.

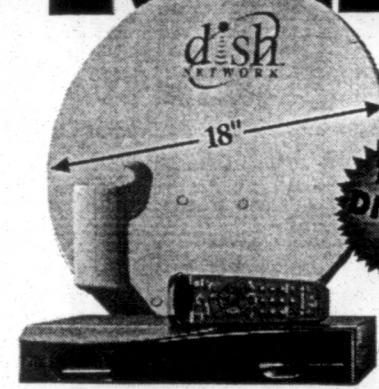

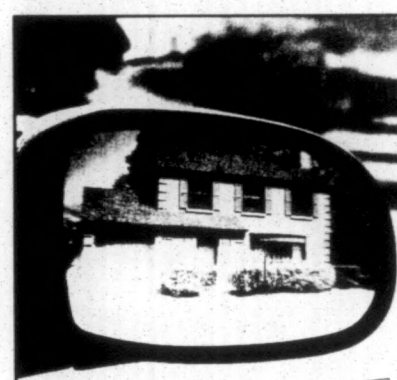

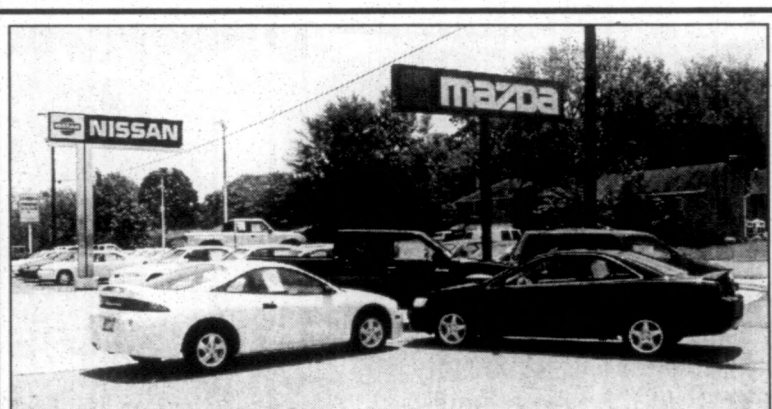

Fish conditions good news for local anglers

There's good news for most of our fishing population, and it's just in time.

There are many species of "the favorite fish" turned on and feeding right now. Everyone should be able to catch a limit on some, and all you can carry on others!

Let's start with the white-striped bass. They seem to cause you to pump more epinephrine than any other fish. Maybe it's because of the way they travel and then strike the lure so hard.

The striper is also very forgiving when it's after your lure.

If you don't set the hook in time or hard enough, just let it fall back toward the bottom and hop it a couple of times. The fish will strike it again!

Stripers traveling in large schools and feeding on the surface also perform some of the best medical magic a human can every go through.

These fish can surface near your boat and change everyone's fingers into thumbs instantly.

Still, we humans are able to catch large numbers of these great fighters and take them to the Ziploc bags to be enjoyed again at another time and place.

We are blessed with four different species of stripers. You need to know how to tell the difference in them, because two species are to be kept only if they are 15 inches or longer.

These two are the original rock-fish stripers, full-blood and the hybrid cross.

They are very easily identified from our native stripers by the thick bond of stripers being wider and darker - in addition to the stark, brilliant white underbelly.

The hybrid has some lines or bands that are broken or crooked. These are easily seen as well.

Our local white striper has an off-white, sometimes golden cast to its color. And all of its stripes or bands are narrow and straight.

The little yellow stripe is most often truly yellow. The side bands are off-set and don't come together

in a straight line. This offset usually occurs back past the middle of the fish.

This little striper is probably the most aggressive of all the species, but it doesn't get very large - except in taste and flavor.

This is a very good eating fish, even if it is small. They will attack any type of lure you offer!

The shad minnows have started moving out onto the main lake. Now, they are a roaming shad buffet from daylight until nightfall.

We also have experienced the all-important current in the main

lake moving these tons of shad around.

As they move, the predator stripers are also moving to ledges, drop-offs and creek and river beds. There, they can set up an ambush point and attack when the shad pass over them.

Everything works together - most of the time, or it doesn't at all. It's just as simple as that.

The blue and white channel catfish are now moving on top of the flats, looking for a little change in diet. They've been eating snails all spring.

I fished two days with Bill Craig, a long-time friend, and his partner, Donald Coleman. We chased the stripers pretty hard.

On the first day, everything clicked at the same time. We caught 160 stripers, four bass and three blue catfish before 1 p.m.

We culled hard and kept only a select size striper, which amounted to 66 and the catfish. Everything else was released alive.

This was the best of days so far. There was a current, a light breeze and the fish were hungry.

This was the first time these men had been into the stripers, but it won't be the last.

It was very different on the second day - with 15 to 25 mph wind from the southwest. The fish just didn't feel like fighting the waves.

However, we concentrated on the little yellow striper's habitat and caught nearly 100 of them. Once in awhile, a larger white striper would come paddling through and Donald would catch it

for the skillet.

We hooked a few fish that couldn't be handled by normal rods and reels. This helps to perk everyone's attention a bit - even if they did get away.

It was a great trip for some great guys. We look forward to the next trip with them.

The mayflies continue to hatch and bring the bluegill to the surface. So get a fly rod or an ultralight and catch some.

Take the children over the holiday weekend and teach them how to fish.

You should be able to find the sauger right there with all the others. We caught some that were super fat critters. But they were just a little shy of the legal limit on length.

Crankbaits, minnows, jigs or spoons will get you a sauger bite. So give them a try. The lake elevation is up to 360 feet.

Century's final hunting season not far away

It's hard to believe, but there are only 49 more days until the beginning of the fall squirrel season, Aug. 21. My, how time flies when you're having fun.

And if squirrel season is here, can deer season be far behind. Seventy-six days and counting.

The first of July has become a benchmark of sorts over the years - kind of a dividing line as spring hunting and fishing seasons give way in anticipation of fall.

The LBL has reinforced this notion by making their quota hunt applications available annually on the first day of July. With this single act, the dog days of summer are forgotten in favor of the deer days of fall.

If you are a regular quota hunt customer, you should already have LBL's impassioned plea for \$5 in hand. If not, the applications are available on site or by calling (270) 924-2065. Computer users can contact LBL at www.lbl.org for information.

hunt applications is July 31.

There are some slight changes this year. For one, the application process is easier for hunters who automatically received an application in the mail.

Also, Buck Only permits have been reduced by 17 percent on each hunt. Hunt days are Nov. 19-20 and 27-28 for Kentucky, and Nov. 12-13 and 27-28 in the Tennessee portion. The youth hunt is Oct. 30-31 for both sides of LBL.

Archery season for deer opens statewide Sept. 18 while the LBL season opens Sept. 25. This year,

hunters may harvest up to four deer statewide, of which only one can be a buck, if the hunter takes advantage of the available bonus permits.

Additional deer may be taken on WMA, or on other special quota hunts.

Hunters can apply for Kentucky Fish and Wildlife quota hunts during the month of August. This year, all applications must be made by telephone by calling 1-877-868-4868.

Last year, after the department initially gave out an incorrect phone number, then struggled to work the bugs out of the system, I hurt their feelings by suggesting they employ technology more on line with their abilities - such as No. 2 pencils and rotary-dial phones. Let's hope this year is better.

Archery hunters planning to hunt in Illinois can still purchase permits over the counter, beginning in August. The non-resident permits are \$121.

Tennessee deer hunters are facing several changes this season. After a bitter fight, the TWRA has limited antlered deer harvest to three per hunter per year statewide.

I guess that would sound restrictive to a state whose legislature just made it legal to harvest roadkill. The application deadline for Tennessee WMA quota hunts is July 21.

Hunters born after Jan. 1, 1975 must have a valid hunter education course completion card.

Hunter education classes are available throughout the year and schedules may be obtained by calling the KDFWR at 1-800-858-1549 or from your local conservation officer.

It is a good idea to take this class as soon as possible, now that fall hunting seasons are right around the corner.

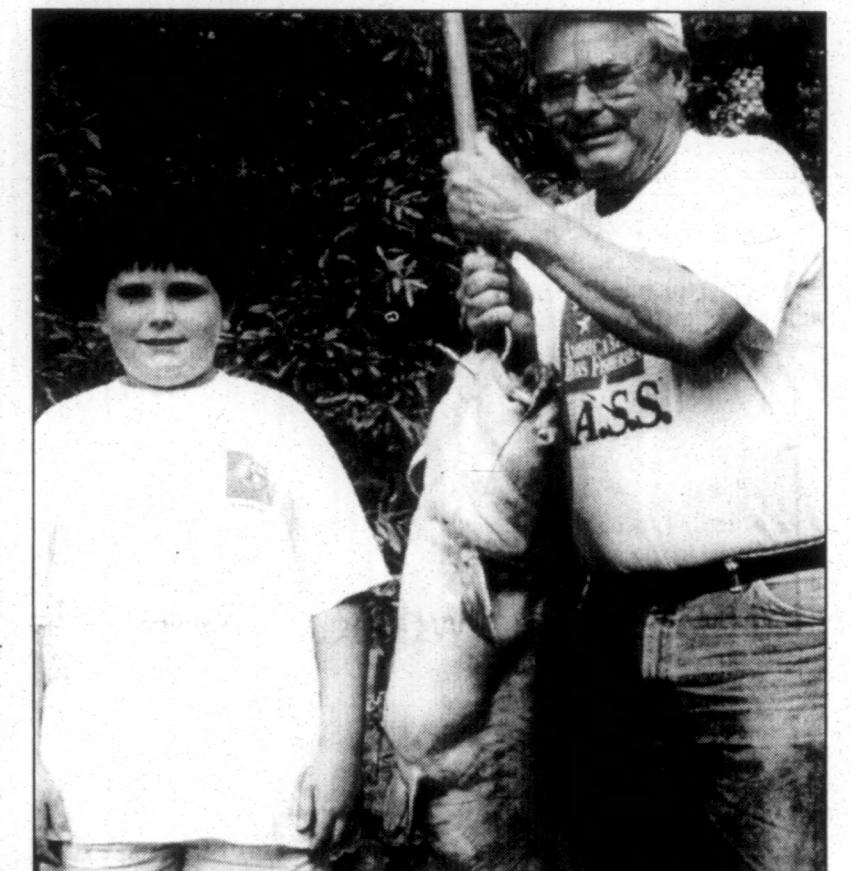
As you celebrate the Fourth of July and the signing of the Declaration of Independence, remember the value placed on the concept of liberty by those brave enough to affix their signature.

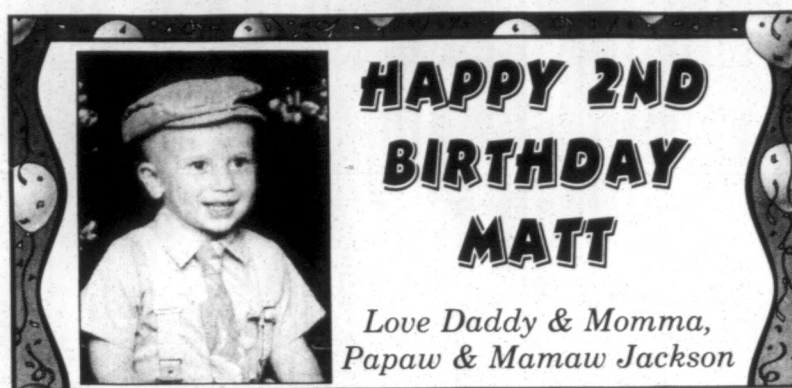

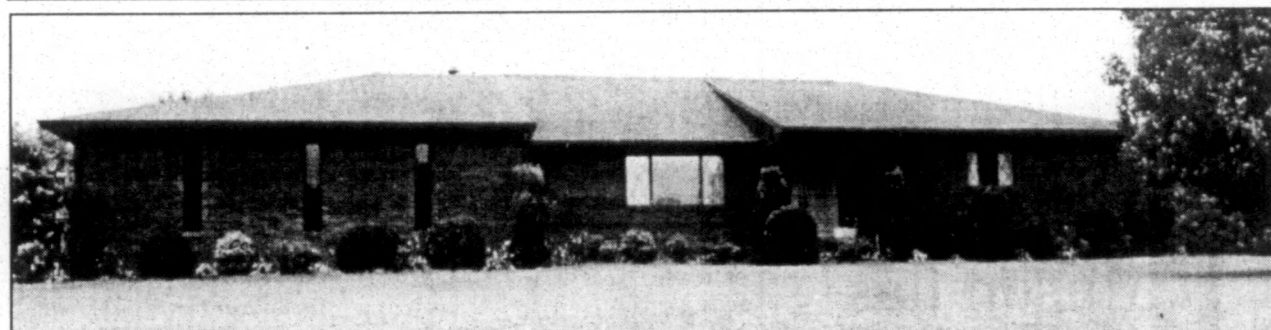

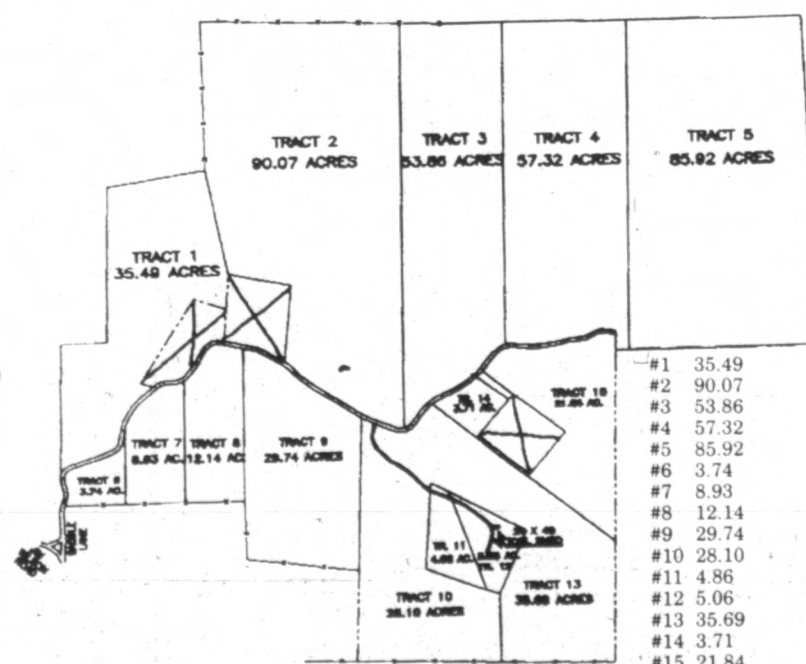

Lawsuit filed for farmers

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — A federal lawsuit filed on behalf of Kentucky livestock farmers is the latest to seek damages for an alleged price-fixing conspiracy among international vitamin manufacturers.

The suit, filed Wednesday in U.S. District Court, accuses 14 pharmaceutical companies of conspiring to keep the prices of several vitamins used as supplements in animal feed artificially high.

In May, two of the firms named in the lawsuit pleaded guilty to price-fixing charges and agreed to pay massive criminal fines. F. Hoffman-LaRoche Ltd., a Swiss company, is to pay \$500 million, while the German firm BASF AG agreed to pay \$225 million.

The Kentucky suit, which will seek class-action status, alleges that livestock farmers who add the vitamins A, B2, B5, C, E and beta carotene as supplements to their animal feed were hurt financially by the price fixing.

"Clearly, the admitted collusion between BASF and Hoffman-La Roche resulted in higher prices for vitamins — prices passed down the line to livestock producers," lawyer Rob MacIn said in a state-

ment. MacIn, of the firm Gess, Mattingly and Atchinson, is among the lawyers participating in the suit.

Among the named plaintiffs are Joe Wright, a Breckinridge County hog farmer and the former majority floor leader of the state Senate, the Springfield-based Central Kentucky Hog Marketing Association Inc.; Lexington cattle producers James and Robert Barton and Beeler Farms Inc. and Optimum Swine Genetics Inc., both of Caneyville.

Since the May 20 guilty pleas by BASF and Hoffman-LaRoche, poultry producers have sued in federal court in Arkansas, and suits have been filed in New Mexico and North Dakota on behalf of residents who purchased vitamins over the last decade.

Lawyer Brent Caldwell of the firm Brayer, McGinnis, Leslie & Kirkland said livestock farmers should be redressed.

"This had a negative financial impact on livestock producers," Caldwell said. "If left unchecked, Kentucky farmers will continue to bear the financial burden brought about by price fixing."

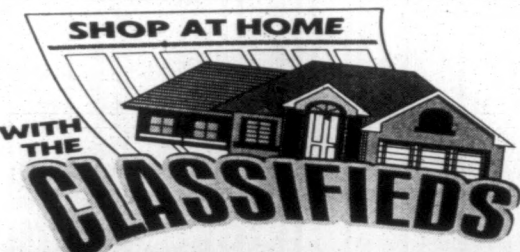

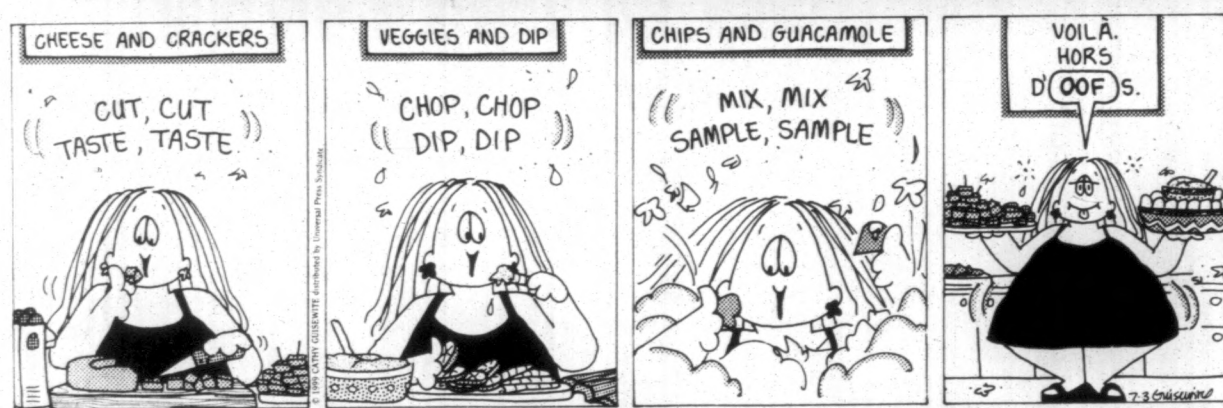

DR. GOTT

DEAR DR. GOTT: Why does a doctor thump my chest when he examines me? When I asked him about this, he gave me a smart-aleck answer. What is this test and why can't doctors answer a simple question without putting the patient down?

DEAR READER: Sound alters its characteristics depending on the medium through which it passes. Normal lungs are filled with air. When a doctor thumps your chest, he is listening for (or feeling) the sound vibrations. They are perceived as a resonant and somewhat hollow tone. If, on the other hand, there is fluid in the chest or some other condition that replaces the air, the tone will be flatter and duller. This medical technique is called percussion, and despite the extensive use of chest X-rays for diagnosis, it remains a useful and accurate method to detect abnormalities.

You can try it yourself and see what I mean. Rest your third finger firmly on your thigh and strike it smartly with the tip of the curved finger of your other hand. You will experience

a sensation (from your fingers and your ears) of a dull, flat sound. Now repeat the process on the wall of your abdomen. The sound will be more hollow and resonant because, unlike solid thigh muscle, the intestine contains air. The difference in tone results from sound travelling through tissues of unequal density.

Try percussing other parts of your body. The lungs, for example, give off a slightly different tone than does the abdomen. With a little practice, you should be able to detect the dullness of your liver (in the upper right abdomen) and, possibly, even a full bladder (just above the pubic bone).

You can experiment on your friends or on your date at a party. Pretty soon everyone will be percussing each other like crazy and having a thumping good time.

Oh, I almost forgot: Your doctor put you down because he spent thousands of dollars in medical school learning to percuss, and he is reluctant to let you in on the secret for the paltry price of an office call.

DEAR DR. GOTT: Please discuss chronic gastritis and helicobacter pylori. DEAR READER: More and more studies implicate the bacteria called H. pylori as the cause of peptic ulcers, as well as gastritis (stomach irritation). The diagnosis can easily be made with a blood test or a specific analysis of the irritated area. Treatment with antibiotics usually clears up the disorder. Ask your doctor about this.

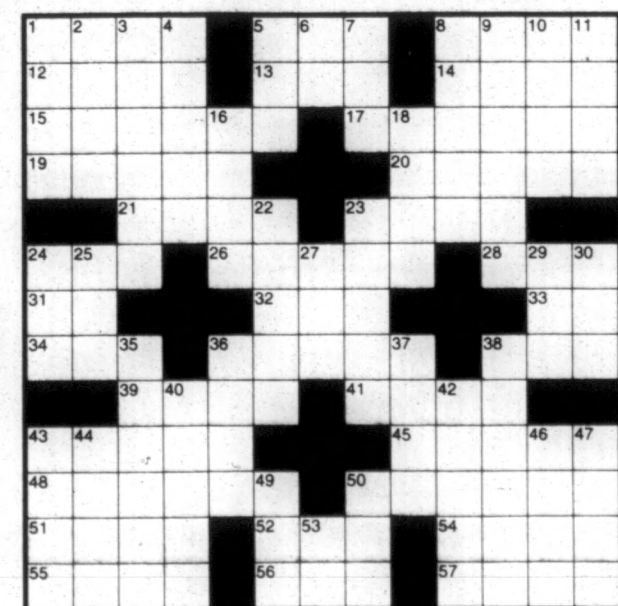

Nichols appeals conviction

OKLAHOMA CITY (AP) — Oklahoma City bombing co-conspirator Terry Nichols has appealed to the U.S. Supreme Court to overturn his life sentence, arguing that a federal judge wrongly applied guidelines for first-degree murder.

The same reasoning was used by Michael Fortier to get his sentence thrown out earlier this week.

Nichols, convicted of conspiracy and involuntary manslaughter in the 1995 bombing, filed the

appeal Wednesday. He also is challenging whether an FBI special agent should have been allowed to testify about the scientific evidence against him in his federal trial.

Fortier, who pleaded guilty to having advance knowledge of the bombing, was sentenced to 12 years in prison. An appeals court tossed out the sentence on Wednesday after ruling that guidelines for involuntary manslaughter, rather than first-degree murder, should have been the basis for his prison term.

But that court's opinion noted that the case was different from Nichols' because Fortier had not shown the same malice and premeditation.

Nichols, 44, is set to appear before a federal judge next week to argue separate issues with an appeals court.

Nichols' appeal to the Supreme Court says his acquittal on charges of first- and second-degree murder show that the jury didn't believe he knew of Timothy McVeigh's intention to kill people.

Lipscomb students honored

Two local students have been honored at Lipscomb University for academic achievement during the spring semester, said Dr. Craig Bledsoe, provost.

Students named to the honor roll for posting grade point averages of 3.5 to 3.99, are Laurie and Melody Parker, daughters of Mr. and Mrs. Sam Parker, Murray.

Both are graduates of Calloway County High School.

DUI suspect improperly forced for test

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — A man charged with drunken driving in Madison County was improperly forced by police to give a blood sample, the Kentucky Court of Appeals ruled Friday.

A three-judge panel vacated the defendant's guilty pleas in Madison Circuit Court. The panel said he still could be prosecuted, but not with the use of blood-alcohol test results.

Mitchell Kyle Dinsmore entered conditional guilty pleas in 1996 to charges of drunken driving and driving on a suspended license. He was sentenced to two years in prison.

Dinsmore was arrested in Richmond on Oct. 19, 1995. He refused to submit to breath or blood tests, so Richmond Police Officer Stephen Saba obtained a search warrant for a blood sample.

The appeals court said "compelled body searches" are permissible in drunken-driving cases only if death or injury have occurred.

Study: Americans not affected by violent movies

WASHINGTON (AP) — For all the talk, Americans don't seem to be as upset by violent movies as they used to be.

An Associated Press poll, taken in the midst of a debate over the impact of violent movies and television programs on young people, found that 40 percent of adults said they would be less likely to see a movie if they knew it contained violence. That's 20 points lower than the percentage who answered the same question the same way a decade ago.

In the poll, conducted by ICR of Media, Pa., only one-third of respondents said violence is the biggest problem with current movies, about the same percentage who said tickets cost too much. An additional 17 percent said movies aren't as good as they used to be, and 13 percent said there is too much sex on the big screen.

"People these days don't see too much wrong with the violence

in movies," said Joan Hogue, a recent retiree from Denver. "They are getting desensitized to all that stuff."

Stacy Cortez, a 22-year-old student from Las Vegas, said movie violence doesn't bother her "because it's all fake." But she said young people should be kept away from movies with sex "because they see how to do it."

Movie violence became a hot issue after the school shootings in Littleton, Colo., in April. Several measures designed to curb movie violence were introduced in Congress, but they have not been adopted.

Theater owners pledged this month to check IDs to prevent youngsters from seeing R-rated movies. In the poll, 52 percent said the checks would be fairly effective or very effective, while 45 percent said they would be not very effective or not effective at all.

Those who doubt that the restrictions will help shield young people

from violent movies point to the easy access to videos, the use of fake IDs and the ability to switch movies after they enter a complex showing several films at a time.

Kathleen Hansen, a teacher in Champaign, Ill., for emotionally disturbed children, said she hears children as young as 5 years old talk about seeing violent films.

"They haven't seen Bambi, but they've seen 'Scream,' 'Scream II' and 'Chuckie' (about a violent doll)," she said. "These kids don't go to the movies. They watch the movies on video at home."

According to the poll, women and older Americans were less likely to see a movie if they knew it contained violence. Almost half of the women surveyed fell into the category, compared to 30 percent of the men. Two-thirds of those over 65 said violence would probably keep them from seeing a movie.

The poll also found:

—Whites, 42 percent, were more likely than blacks, 28 percent, to say violent content might keep them away from a movie.

—Women were twice as likely as men to say hearing about nude scenes might keep them from seeing a particular movie. People over 65 were three times as likely as those under 35 to stay away because of nudity.

—People who have gone to only a couple of movies this year were three times as likely to be troubled by movie violence as those who have seen more than 20.

—Thirty-seven percent of adults have not seen a movie in a theater in the last 12 months, and 22 percent have seen only one or two. Five percent of the population attended more than 20 movies in the last year.

The telephone poll of 1,005 adults was taken Friday through Tuesday. The margin of error is plus or minus 3 percentage points.

American bald eagle may get removed from endangered list

WASHINGTON (AP) — The American bald eagle, the living symbol of the nation since 1782, is back from the brink of extinction and can now be removed from the endangered species list, President Clinton said Friday.

Celebrating a three-decade struggle to protect the bald eagle against pesticides and encroachments on its habitat, Clinton announced a process that is expected to remove the majestic bird from the list by July 2000.

"It's hard to think of a better way to celebrate the birth of a nation than to celebrate the rebirth of our national symbol," the president said on the eve of the Independence Day weekend. "The return of the bald eagle is a fitting cap to a century of environmental stewardship."

The president was joined on a flag-backed platform on the South Lawn of the White House by a 10-year-old bald eagle named Challenger, who flapped his long brown wings and cocked his snowcapped head.

Challenger was blown from a nest in the wild as an eaglet and experienced too much human contact at a young age to be able to survive in the wild. The bird screeched during the president's remarks.

"Believe it or not," Clinton said, "Ben Franklin wanted our national symbol to be a turkey. The

press would be having a field day with that to the present day, wouldn't they?"

With the banning of the pesticide DDT in 1972 and the passage of the Endangered Species

Act a year later, the bald eagle began making a dramatic recovery. Today, there are 5,800 breeding pairs.

Four years ago, with recovery well under way, the eagle was

upgraded from endangered to threatened.

Removing the bald eagle from the government's endangered list will not expose it to new dangers and its status will be closely monitored.

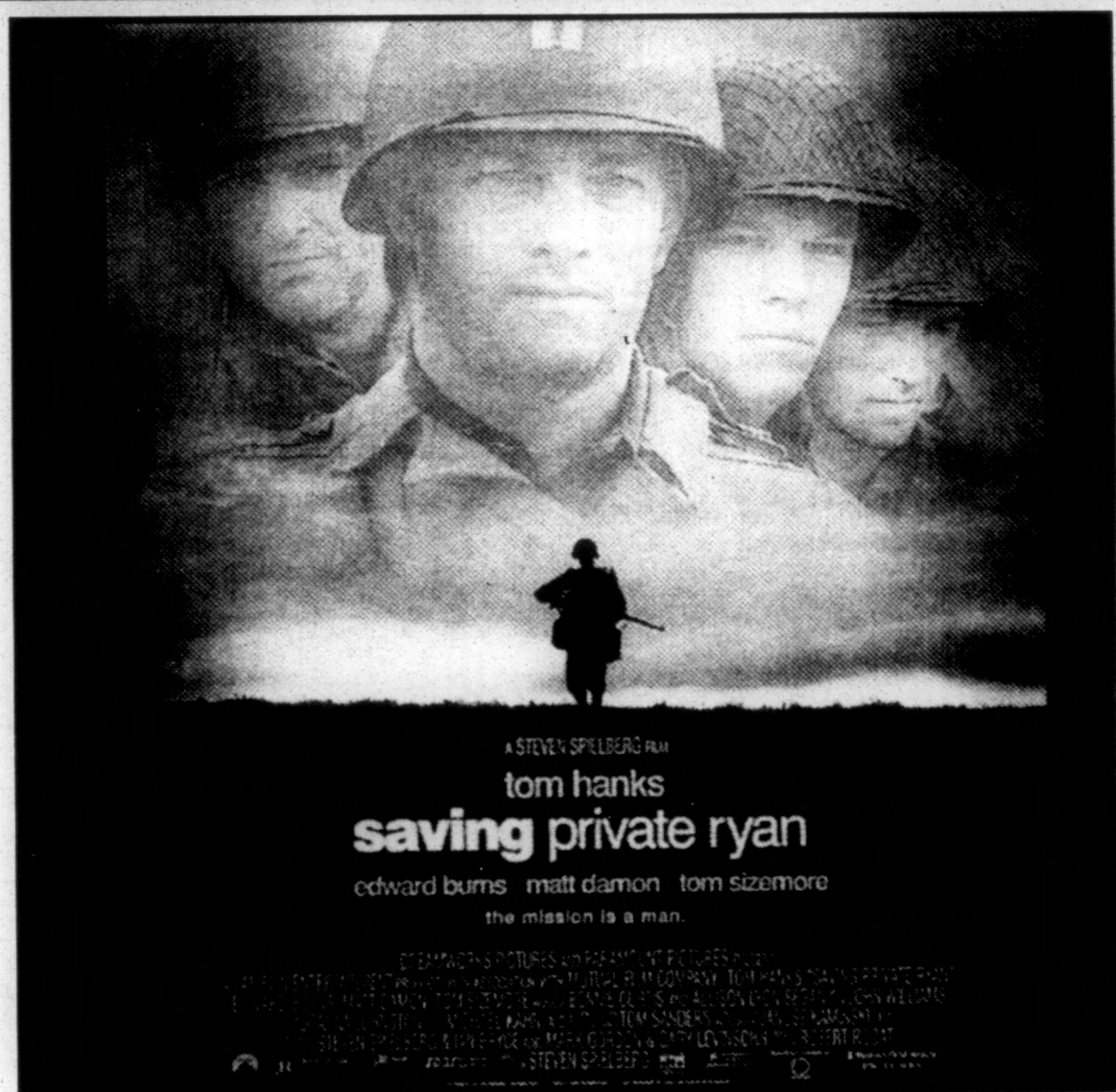
