Campbell's recalls beef soup cans

WASHINGTON (AP) — Almost 170,000 cans of vegetable beef soup are being recalled by the Campbell Soup Co. because they may contain shards of a soda can that got caught in a vegetable dicer.

Five pieces of aluminum, ranging from an inch to nearly 3 inches in length, have been found in three cans of the soup, company spokesman John Faulkner said Friday. None of the metal was ingested, he said.

The soup was distributed to stores in Arizona, Colorado, Iowa, Kansas, Louisiana, Missouri, Mississippi, Nebraska, New Mexico, Oklahoma and South Dakota, according to the Agriculture Department.

The recalled product is labeled "Campbell's Healthy Request Vegetable Beef Condensed Soup." The soup was processed Sept. 27.

Each can is stamped with the code "SEP 01 09279" and "EST 4K DEAL," plus four digits that indicate military time.

Consumers should return the soup to the store where they bought it, Faulkner said.

Bill requiring reporting of HIV-positive people OK'd

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — The names of people testing positive for the human immunodeficiency virus, or HIV, would have to be reported to the state under a bill approved by a Senate committee.

The Senate Appropriations and Revenue Committee unanimously passed Senate Bill 227, which had been opposed by AIDS activists and the American Civil Liberties Union.

Sen. Gerald Neal, the bill's sponsor, took out a request for more than \$2 million that would have been dedicated to the area of prevention, intervention and treatment for HIV and acquired immune deficiency syndrome, or AIDS.

Neal, D-Louisville, said Thursday that the legislation has some important proposals that would not require money and, with a tight state budget, he did not want those things to get held up.

The bill would require health departments to be consistently educated about HIV and require the state to work closely with nonprofit agencies who offer services.

Under the bill, an HIV and AIDS Advisory Council would be set up to study how and where Kentucky lags in treating people.

Neal also told the committee that by getting the names of people with HIV and getting more accurate and reliable data on HIV rates, Kentucky could qualify for more federal money for HIV surveillance.

Warm spell sets record highs in state

(AP) — A warm spell that has enveloped Kentucky for the better part of a week is continuing, luring people outdoors to play wintertime rounds of golf, take walks in parks and eat lunch alongside rivers.

The National Weather Service said Friday long-standing record highs were shattered in Louisville and Lexington, while new marks were also set in at least two other cities, Jackson and London.

The high reached 74 degrees in Lexington, breaking the date's previous record of 70 set in 1918. In Louisville, which also set a record high on Thursday, it was 77 on Friday, breaking the old mark of 74 recorded in 1930.

Forecasters said a cold front will move through the state on Sunday, but daytime highs will only dip down from the 70s to the 60s. Rain was in the forecast for the

entire weekend.

Mike York, a weather service meteorologist in Paducah, said the record-setting warm spell was the result of a shift in the upper-atmosphere winds known as the jet stream. Instead of coming in from Canada in the northwest, the winds were moving in from the Great Plains states in the southwest, he said.

York said there won't be any change in

the jet stream pattern in the foreseeable future.

"That'll just keep on bringing in mild air," he said. "Any cold fronts won't have much in the way of cold air behind them."

That southwesterly flow of warm, moist air also was expected to bring rain to the Bluegrass State on Saturday and Sunday and again by midweek.

Identity theft bill heads to Senate

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — The House voted Friday to put Kentucky on the offensive against cybercrime that takes a victim's identity, money and reputation.

A bill creating a felony crime of identity theft, punishable by 1-5 years in prison, passed the House 92-0. The bill now goes to the Senate.

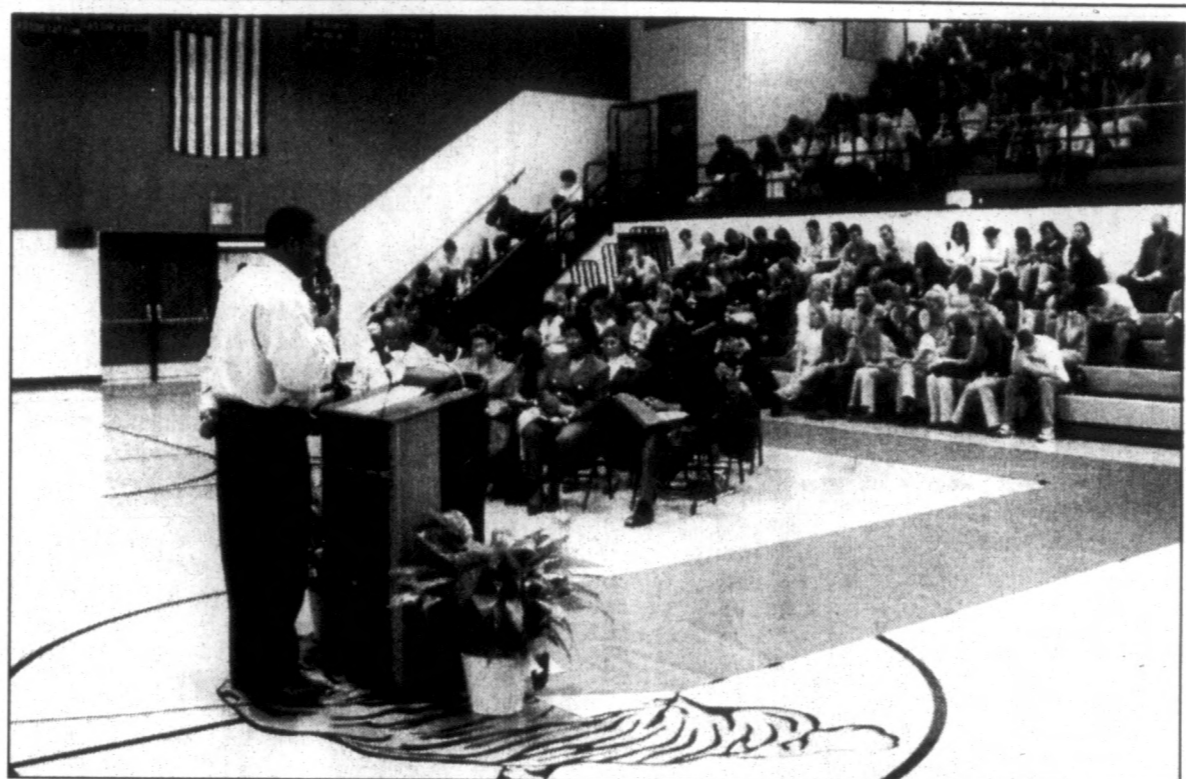
Rep. John Vincent, the bill's lead sponsor, said the proposal is meant to protect Kentuckians from having their identities seized by computer hackers.

"The bill addresses one of the fastest-growing crimes in America, and that is the use of identity to impersonate someone for the purpose of obtaining credit or committing crimes," said Vincent, R-Ashland.

Identity theft would apply when someone improperly obtains personal information and uses it to obtain benefits or property, make financial transactions or avoid detection. The information could be a person's name, Social Security number, birth date or other personal identification.

Vincent said the bill would give Kentucky one of the nation's toughest laws against such cybercrime. Attorney General Ben Chandler testified in favor of the proposal dur-

Golf course-booze bill survives

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — A bill that would allow local-option alcohol sales at golf courses in "moist" counties made the turn for home Friday.

The proposal, rejected in past years, passed the House 50-36.

The bill returns to the Senate, where it has already been approved, for what could be a final vote if senators accept a small change by the House to remove one county from the bill's effects.

Supporters say allowing beer and liquor sales at championship-caliber courses in so-called moist counties would help attract tournaments that reap economic dividends for the community. The bill's sponsor is Sen. Tom Buford, R-Nicholasville.

In Buford's home county of Jessamine, Champions Trace golf course lost out on playing host to a women's professional tournament because alcohol sales aren't allowed, said Rep. Jodie Haydon, D-Bardstown.

"That event would have brought about \$12 million into the state," Haydon said. "A professional event needs sponsors, and sponsors want to have hospitality tents. And this can't be done without a drink license."

The bill would leave the decision in the hands

Report shows few graduates

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — A state report shows that nearly half the degree programs run by state universities aren't producing enough graduates to be worthwhile.

The report by the Council on Postsecondary Education showed that 47 percent of the 1,120 degree programs at Kentucky's eight public universities don't meet minimum standards for producing graduates.

"We were concerned the number would be high, but I didn't imagine it would be this high,"

said Bill Swinford, a senior academic affairs associate for the council, which circulated the report among the universities this month. "Most institutions see themselves as isolated silos of education, and that's not what we want," Swinford said.

Among the issues raised in the report:

— In some areas of teacher education programs, the number of specialized and duplicated programs statewide mean few graduates are produced each year in

graduate fields like music teacher education and vocational teacher education.

— Some new programs have yielded no graduates. For example, Murray State enrolled its first students in an international relations major in 1995 but has not produced any degrees in that area.

The study found that doctoral programs were most likely to be inefficient. While the council and Kentucky college representatives

Owens gets eight years for assaults, burglary, theft

A Wildcat Drive man has been sentenced to eight years in prison after entering a plea agreement on charges stemming from two 1998 incidents in which a woman and a teen-age girl accused him of raping them and three 1999 burglaries.

Calloway Circuit Judge Dennis Foust handed down the term to Christopher Owens, 22, who entered Alford pleas to two counts of amended second-degree assault and three counts each of second-degree burglary and theft by unlawful taking more than \$500.

An Alford plea means the defendant does not admit guilt, but acknowledges enough evidence exists to possibly lead to a conviction.

Five sentenced Owens, scheduled trial dates in eight cases, issued probation or deferred sentences in four other cases and revoked probation in two others during Feb. 14 court proceedings.

Owens was originally charged with two counts of first-degree rape.

A former Jakes Inc. co-worker told Murray police in August 1998 that she gave Owens a ride to his North Fourth Street apartment, where he lived at the time, and went inside. He then forced her

out of her clothes and raped her for about three hours, she said.

Nine days later, a 16-year-old girl, who was an acquaintance of the woman's, told police of a similar incident that happened in June 1998. She said she met Owens in downtown Murray, then went with him to a Riviera Courts home where he raped her in a back bedroom.

The burglary and theft charges stemmed from the break-ins of several county homes in March 1999 by Owens and three co-defendants. Items from three of the burglaries were found in his home.

In other cases, Foust ordered a five-year deferred sentence for Belinda Turley, 34, of Hazel, for welfare fraud. She is disqualified from receiving benefits and must also pay \$400 in fees and \$10,304 in restitution.

Turley also is required to write a letter of apology to James Morris, the former employer of Randy Wyatt, Turley's live-in boyfriend.

She signed Morris's name to employment verification cards for four years for Wyatt after he quit working for Morris in February 1994, allowing them to draw almost \$29,000 in benefits.

The judge ordered 12-month con-

recover all medical costs that it is 'authorized or required by law to furnish or pay for.'

To the industry's complaint that the government had never before brought such a case, the Justice Department replied, 'What makes this suit unique is the conduct of these corporations, which for decades have deliberately and successfully addicted millions of citizens to a product that defendants have long known causes suffering and death... Defendants cannot rely on the sheer massiveness of their wrongdoing to defeat this suit.'

Last year, the industry reached settlements with all 50 states. It agreed to pay states \$246 billion to settle lawsuits they filed to recover the cost of treating sick smokers in the Medicaid program, which serves poor and disabled Americans.

Tobacco lawyers argued that many of the federal government's non-monetary demands are already required by those state settlements, such as a ban on attempts to target children in advertising and marketing.

The Justice Department replied that the state settlements "did not speak to the far greater costs that the same unlawful conduct has imposed on Medicare, the Federal Employees Health Benefits Program, the Indian Health Service, the health care programs of the military branches and the Department of Veterans Affairs."

And, the state settlements "did not impose restraints that will definitively end the defendants' unlawful conduct, prevent them from improperly profiting from the conduct or eliminate the severe future public health consequences of that conduct," the department added.

The department also said industry lawyers erred in suggesting the government was required to show before trial how remedies under the federal racketeering law, used in one portion of the lawsuit, might restrain future wrongdoing.

The lawsuit was filed against Philip Morris Inc., R.J. Reynolds Tobacco Co., American Tobacco Co., Brown & Williamson Tobacco Corp., Lorillard Tobacco Co., British American Tobacco Ltd., Liggett and Myers Inc., the Council for Tobacco Research-USA and the Tobacco Institute.

ditional discharges for Walter Wayne Johnson Jr. and David Todd in lieu of two-year sentences in separate cases.

The sentence for Johnson, 28, of Hardin, was for amended non-support. He must pay \$400 in fees and has 23 months to pay the \$3,505 in back support he owed from September 1997 and December 1999.

Todd, 21, of Bailey Road, was sentenced for three counts of marijuana possession and misdemeanor receiving stolen property stemming from separate 1998 cases.

A charge of second-degree trafficking in methamphetamine was dismissed against Todd and co-defendant Terry Todd, 48, who lived at the same Bailey Road address and was charged with similar marijuana- and stolen-property-related offenses.

Foust remanded Terry Todd's case back to Calloway District Court.

Also, Foust ordered five years unsupervised probation for James

Boyd Tyer, 30, of Puryear, Tenn., for intimidating a witness and fourth-degree assault. He also must pay \$97.75 court costs, complete an anger-management class by Aug. 14 and get a general equivalency diploma.

Tyer and three co-defendants attacked Jeremy Kirksey of Murray and warned him about testifying in a drug-trafficking case.

In other cases, Foust: • Revoked probation for Shawn Cannon, 16, of Rayburn Road, and reinstated a five-year sentence for intimidating a witness. Cannon dropped out of a Teen Challenge program that was part of his probation after being caught stealing and forging counselors' names to get extra privileges, according to court records.

• Revoked probation for Lhonda R. Nielsen, 37, of Puryear, Tenn., and reinstated a two-year sentence for welfare fraud for possessing a dangerous weapon and going out of state without permission.

• Set June 2 trial dates for Ann Marie Stalls of Poplar Street and Johnny Blanton of Spruce Street, both 30. Stalls is charged with first-degree trafficking in cocaine and Blanton with

complicity to the same crime, both Class C felonies, stemming from a July 1999 sale of a \$40 crack rock to a Murray police informant.

• Slated a June 9 trial date for Patrick Bushrod, 32, of Hazel, who is charged with first-degree robbery, a Class B felony, in connection with the April 1999 armed robbery of the Hazel Convenience Mart.

• Set a May 11 trial date for Aaron Ennis Sr., 27, of Nash Drive, on a charge of misuse of electronic information, a Class D felony. He allegedly used Darrow Clay's access number for an automatic teller machine on Nov. 7, made a false deposit of \$4,864 into Clay's account and wrote checks on the account.

(Clay, who told police he did not give permission to make the deposit or write the checks, was indicted Feb. 14 by a Calloway County grand jury on four counts of second-degree forgery. He allegedly signed Ennis's name to open a checking account, then wrote three checks on it in late December.)

• Set a Sept. 27 trial date for William Robert Hayden, 32, of Hazel, who is charged with second-degree burglary, a Class C felony, and second-degree stalking, a Class A misdemeanor. He allegedly harassed his ex-girlfriend, Joetta McBurney, at work

and at her Hazel home repeatedly between August and November 1999

• Set a June 27 trial date for Bobby Hale Higgins, 59, of Highland Road, who is charged with possession of a handgun by a convicted felon, a Class C felony; possession of marijuana, a Class D felony; and misdemeanor possession of drug paraphernalia, illegal sale of alcohol in a dry territory, possession of an apparatus to make alcoholic beverages and possession of prescription medication not in the proper container. Sheriff's deputies found parts of a still, as well as marijuana, rolling papers, scales, six firearms, a jug with suspected moonshine residue and 13 cases of beer, in and around his home in January 1999.

• Set a May 31 trial date for Steve A. Jackson, 50, of Elm Street, on charges of first-degree cocaine trafficking, a Class C felony, and first-degree persistent felony offender, a Class A felony, for allegedly selling crack to a police informant in February 1998.

• Set a June 21 trial date for Bradley Don Johnson, 20, of Scenic Acres Drive, on a charge of first-degree criminal abuse, a Class D felony. He allegedly injured his live-in girlfriend's then-6-month-old daughter while baby-sitting in September 1999.

of voters living in the same precincts as the golf courses. It would apply to 9- or 18-hole regulation courses in counties that are dry but include a city that allows alcohol sales.

Proponents of alcohol sales at the golf courses would have to circulate petitions to get the question on the local ballot.

If approved by voters, the liquor license would be limited to the golf course. No other restaurant or package sales of alcoholic beverages would be allowed under such an election.

Supporters have said the counties affected are Warren, Harlan, Henry, Pendleton, Hopkins, Rowan, Montgomery, Jessamine, Pike, Madison, Logan, Shelby, Washington, Lewis and Union. The Alcoholic Beverage Control Commission, though, lists Union County as already wet. The House altered the bill to exclude Boyd County from being affected.

In other action, the House passed a bill dealing with gubernatorial appointments to state boards and commissions, and their gender makeup.

The bill would not force the governor to make appointments based on gender.

But it says that when a board or commission's membership does not reflect gender equity, the governor may make an appointment to achieve as much gender balance as possible.

Rep. Robin Webb, D-Grayson, said the bill carries "an important symbolic message" for today's youth. She said it could encourage girls to aspire for leadership, and for boys to accept it.

The bill passed 93-1 and goes to the Senate.

agreed that an average of five degrees a year would be a sign of productivity at that level, 57 of the 93 doctoral programs didn't produce that many.

Also, of the 81 associate degree programs, only 26 met the standard.

No state university met the productivity measure for geology, general physics, music or drama and theater arts programs.

Only the University of Kentucky met the undergraduate cutoff of 12 degrees a year in its philosophy program.

Officials said the figures spotlight duplication in some subjects and show where colleges spend themselves too thin.

Universities have until May to recommend whether underproducing programs should be dropped, modified or allowed to continue. The full council will act on the issue in July.

Council officials said that many of the unproductive programs could be either merged into other majors, offered at fewer schools or shifted to the Kentucky Commonwealth Virtual University.

In a letter to college presidents earlier this month, council President Gordon Davies said he expects universities to close some programs.

"We recognize this will be a difficult review," he wrote. "But it is necessary to ensure that we use taxpayer funds as efficiently as we can."

For officials at private colleges, frequent program reviews are a fact of life.

"If there are programs without enough majors or people taking advantage of them, we seriously think about curtailing them or shutting them down because we're a private institution and don't have money coming through a magic pipeline," said John Ward, vice president for academic affairs at Centre College in Danville.

It has been more than six years since Kentucky colleges had such a review. A commission created by former Gov. Brereton Jones identified about 200 programs then but colleges resisted cuts.

It was mostly sunny with highs in the 70s throughout Kentucky on Friday, however, and many people made the most of it. At the Western Hills Golf Course in Hopkinsville, golfers filled every available tee time between 8 a.m. and 3 p.m., said Jim Jones, the clubhouse pro at the privately owned public course.

"It's fantastic," Jones said. "It's like the middle of summer. Everyone's out playing."

He predicted that between 150 and 160 golfers would play the course before the end of the day.

At Atkinson Park in Henderson, people ate lunch alongside the engorged Ohio River and strolled on the park's winding, two-mile-long asphalt walking path.

Susan Jordan and Janet Downey, who are sisters and Henderson residents, shared a fast-food meal beneath one of the park's shelters.

"We generally have lunch together on Fridays and we didn't want to sit inside," Jordan said. "It's too pretty."

Students transcribe Civil War letters

LONDON, Ky. (AP) — Although members of the South Laurel High School history club haven't seen the letter that James Raines received from his wife in the early days of the Civil War, they figure the Confederate colonel received quite a scolding.

"My dear wife, I have received your very unkind letter," Raines' response begins. "I was perfectly astonished by it. I did not think that you would write me such a letter at a time when I may be called away from you, perhaps forever."

The letter is just one of about 100 documents pertaining to the battle of Camp Wildcat. Because many of the letters and diary entries are now faded, students are helping to transcribe them for the U.S. Forest Service.

Although hard to understand because of changes in language and writing style since 1861, the documents still provide a revealing look into what Union and Confederate soldiers faced before, during and after the battle of Camp Wildcat — the first Civil War engagement of troops on Kentucky soil.

Jeff Humble, 16, and Tiffany Pennington, 17, said Raines' letter

was humorous at first, but has a sad ending.

"I enclose you a \$10 bill, which is every cent I have," writes Raines, a former writer for the Nashville Banner who served as colonel of the 11th Tennessee Infantry. "I will endure to live on salt pork and stale bread, and you shall have all you want."

More than a year later, Raines was killed in combat at the battle of Stones River in Murfreesboro, Tenn.

Pennington said Raines' wife must have endured feelings of guilt when she received the news.

"I'd say she felt pretty bad," Pennington said. "I'm thinking she wrote the letter on a whim."

Some diary entries describe weapons and food eaten by soldiers. Others detail the horrors of war.

"It is something frightful to battle," writes John Wilkins, a Union soldier of the 33rd Indiana Infantry, in a letter to friends dated Oct. 29,

1861. "Truly one becomes so excited that he (has) no fear remaining."

John Johnson, 16, said the letters are much more interesting than standard textbooks.

"Your history book wouldn't say your colonel got drunk before he got to Barbourville," he said, referring to a letter written by a disgruntled Union soldier, Stephen Keyes Fletcher, to his father in Indianapolis.

Fletcher's letter also provides a glimpse at the loneliness a soldier endures.

"I received your good letter last night," he writes to his father. "It was a good treat I tell you. ... I had been looking for a letter for several days, but had become discouraged. I suppose the time seemed longer than it really was."

There has been renewed interest in the battle at Camp Wildcat since Kentuckians celebrated the state's bicentennial in 1992.

prosecuting the crimes. The bill also would allow victims to seek civil damages from perpetrators. Violators also would be responsible for making restitution for any financial losses suffered by their victims. Those costs could include lost wages, attorney's fees and efforts to correct a victim's credit history.

Vincent said the identity theft crime would not apply to minors caught with fake identification to purchase tobacco or alcohol.

Another new felony crime would be created — trafficking in stolen identities — to prosecute people who possess or try to peddle stolen IDs. Violators could be sentenced to 5-10 years in prison.

The bill also would allow Kentucky to prosecute people in other states who use computers to obtain a Kentuckian's personal information. Vincent said that's a recognition that many of the crimes occur outside Kentucky.

Minimum wage could increase

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — Some legislators want the state to raise the minimum wage, but it is unclear whether it would actually mean more money in any Kentuckian's pay check.

The state and federal minimum wage are now \$5.15 per hour. And, while there used to be a number of employers who were not covered by federal standards, every business that takes credit

cards or checks is now required to pay the federal minimum.

A proposal offered by a bipartisan group of legislators wants to raise the state wage to \$5.65 on Sept. 1, 2000 and add another 50 cents to \$6.15 on Sept. 1, 2001. The bill was filed in the House this week.

Congress also is considering an increase in the federal minimum wage.

Another postings effort under way

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — Legislators will make another run at passing legislation to let schools post the Ten Commandments.

The version filed in the House on Thursday would let school councils offer an elective course in history, ethics, comparative religion or other subject areas that uses "religious or scriptural texts, including the Bible." In addition, the teacher could elect to post religious, literary or historical documents, including the Ten Commandments. The course would have to be balanced, academic and objective and "not favor religion or any particular religious belief."

A number of conservative Chris-

tian groups and legislators have mounted unprecedented efforts during the 2000 General Assembly to have schools post copies of the Ten Commandments, which according to some religious beliefs were handed down by their god to serve as a code of conduct.

The Supreme Court ruled 20 years ago that a Kentucky law that required the posting of the Ten Commandments on school walls amounted to a government endorsement of a particular religion and was therefore unconstitutional.

Several Ten Commandments-related bills already have been filed, but have not yet received votes.

Battle looms for tobacco money bill

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) — An administration bill proposing to use \$56 million of tobacco money for early childhood programs has been approved by the House Health and Welfare Committee.

Rep. Tom Burch, the committee chairman and lead sponsor, said Thursday he had enough votes to get the bill out of the House. From there, a battle looms.

Some key senators, including Senate President David Williams, say Gov. Paul Patton earmarked too much tobacco money for early childhood and too little for smoking cessation and prevention.

Williams has a bill to spend \$40 million on smoking cessation — \$35 million more than Patton proposed. Each would take money from the same pot — Kentucky's share of a legal settlement by tobacco companies — so the two are in conflict.

Burch, D-Louisville, said the House bill's emphasis on preventive health care and fostering good health habits in children would pay bigger dividends.

"In 20 years, they will not be smokers," Burch said.

(The legislation is House Bill 706).

Triple-meaning ties

On Valentine's Day, my wife rummaged way back in our closet and laid out a tie for me to wear, one I had forgotten I owned.

It's a red tie with Peanuts characters - Charlie Brown, Lucy, Schroeder, Peppermint Patty, Woodstock and the inevitable Snoopy - holding Valentine cards.

Seeing it brought tears to my eyes. Not only was it the right tie to wear for Feb. 14, it was even more the right tie to wear because cartoonist Charles Schulz's last Sunday cartoon panel had appeared Feb. 13, and because Charles Schulz had died just hours before that final Sunday panel appeared.

So I put on the tie and wore my best dark suit to highlight the tie's colors and characters, using the dark framing as a badge of mourning for Mr. Schulz. Millions of us were "tied" to Charles Schulz.

For weeks, the newspapers and television programs have been overflowing with tributes to Charles Schulz. All that has been said is true, proper, appropriate, befitting and poignant.

I can't say "I grew up with Charlie Brown."

By the time Schulz introduced his strip in October 1950, I was a freshman in high school, already older than his characters.

Besides that, Charlie Brown and his gang never really "grew up." They stayed the same age forever - for nearly 50 years. You never saw a grown-up in any cartoon.

But behind their young exteriors, they were adults.

They thought about and addressed adult concerns, spoke to adults and behaved like child-like adults.

What I haven't read or heard

much about in the mountain of tributes to Schulz's life and work is the depth and breadth of his theology. The more I think about what kept me reading Peanuts every day, the more it strikes me that it was the theology.

Schulz made his religious mooring most explicit in his Christmas sagas, youngsters putting on bathrobes and reciting reverently familiar passages from Luke about the birth of Jesus, but it came through on other occasions as well, with recitations from Isaiah and with Easter stories. Schulz's foundation was belief in God as Creator and as Redeemer.

With that firm foundation in place, Schulz showed us the consequences of Original Sin - our literal fallen-ness, our human foibles, our false hopes (of footballs being there to kick and of being able to win baseball games), our put-downs of one another, our reliance on cheap psychiatric cures, our self-centeredness, our suspicions, our misinterpretations, our improvised group relations.

He also shared with us the Gospel of Hope. If a motley crew of Peanuts characters, each so individually different from the rest, could live together, there was hope that the larger world, with all its varieties of languages and personalities and habits, could go and do likewise.

And along with Hope, Schulz taught us Patience and Vision-mak-

ing. If things got too rough for us, we could - like Charlie - still dream that someday the red-haired girl would love us, that someday the foot would kick the football or that someday the home team would get to bat.

Or, like the speechless Snoopy, we could find voices in fantasies, in World War I foxholes and planes, or on desert treks, or in family reunions of dogs.

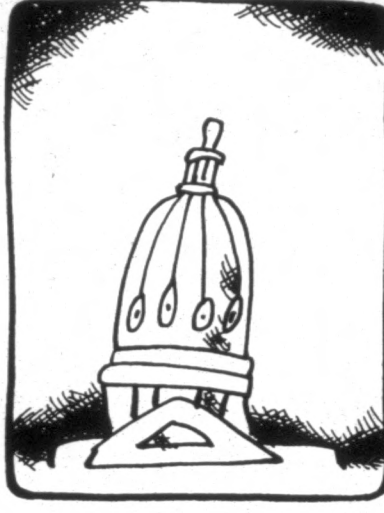
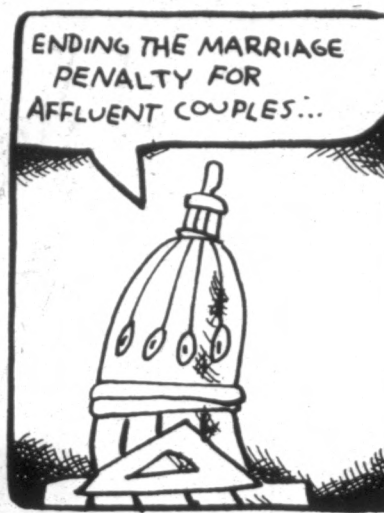
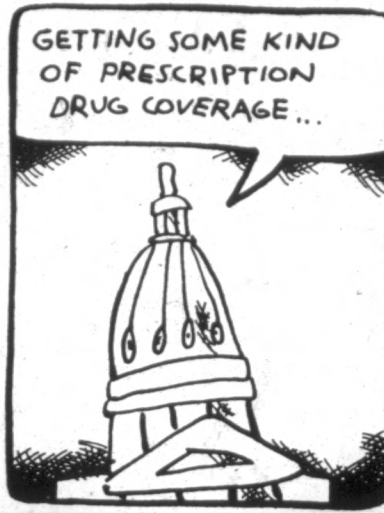
The Schulz messages, to the uninitiated, may have seemed on the surface to be saccharine, sentimental, superficial, shallow and simplistic.

In truth, however, they ran deep, touching not only heartstrings but heads, reminding us that Grace, Creation, Judgment, Fallen-ness, Redemption, Hope, Community and Love really do matter most in our lives.

In a daily paper teeming with pages and pages of stories of acquisitiveness, terror, unemployment, psychosis and pain, there always was one little place where the story line was about the coming of age and responsibility and where the bottom line was ultimately about the promise of peace and of Paradise.

Schulz's idea of heaven was no Disney World, nor even Dorothy's Nebraska. It was of our real world, but transformed.

We remember him kindly for drawing it to our attention and using it to make us better beings.



The window is closing

WASHINGTON (AP) — When the Democrats closed their window on the presidential primaries for five weeks, they opened one for John McCain.

He climbed through it to overtake Gov. George W. Bush in the contest for the Republican nomination with his out-of-party victory in Michigan. Now he's trying to persuade more Republicans to join his cause, vital in the contests to come, when party crossovers won't be so great a factor.

Starting March 7, Democrats and independents will have some place else to vote, as Vice President Al Gore and former Sen. Bill Bradley take up their interrupted competition for nominating delegates.

McCain's surge against Bush, the once-towering GOP favorite who still leads in national polls on Republican preferences, has been built on the votes of independents in New Hampshire, where there also was a Democratic primary, and of both independents and Democrats in Michigan, where there was not.

Those were open primaries, not limited to party members. So was South Carolina, where Bush won on the strength of a massive turnout of GOP and conservative Christian voters.

Washington state's open contest, coming up Tuesday, involves a unique, three-ballot system, permitting voters to choose Republican, Democratic or unaffiliated, although neither party counts the last in allocating its nominating delegates. The Republican reward there is only 12 of the 37 delegates; the rest will be chosen by caucus. The Democratic primary is no more than an official straw poll, with delegates to be settled in March 7 caucuses.

Nonetheless, Bill Bradley is spending six days campaigning in Washington, trying to revive his faltering challenge to Al Gore, on the theory that a West Coast victory would be a boost elsewhere a week later, when California and 10 other states hold primaries.

The Virginia Republican primary on Tuesday also is open - voters there are not required to register party affiliations - but people who go to the polls will be asked to sign a pledge that they

won't participate in any other party's nomination process.

These complexities are in part the product of Democratic rules that set a window for the selection of that party's delegates, leaving them open to challenge at the national convention if they are chosen before March 7, but with exceptions for the leadoff states, the Iowa caucuses and the New Hampshire primary.

Gore won both, plus a for-show primary in Delaware.

In New Hampshire, McCain's 18-point victory margin was delivered by independents, in a primary in which the Republican vote far outnumbered the party roster. Registered Republicans are about one-third the New Hampshire electorate; nearly 65 percent of the primary ballots were cast in the GOP primary.

Open primaries are nothing new. There have been disputes over them for years. The Democrats tried to ban open primaries in their delegate selection in 1978, prompting a challenge by Wisconsin, which has historically had one. The matter wound up in the Supreme Court, which decided that the party could make its own rules, leaving delegates selected without meeting them open to challenge at the national convention.

The difference in this situation is the one-sided competition from Feb. 1 to March 7, with only Republicans holding primaries that count.

But once the Democratic window opens a week from Tuesday, there will be voting in both nomination campaigns.

"When we have the Republican primary and the Democratic primary on the same day, it's going to make it awful hard for some of these Democrats who are trying to come into our primary to affect the election," Bush said, hopefully, after they did just that and beat him in Michigan on Tues-

day. The open or closed primary laws vary, from those that allow only party members in to those that let anybody vote in either party, with others in between, permitting independents to choose a ballot, or making the choice of a ballot the step that registers a voter.

California, the biggest of the primaries, has it both ways - an open preferential primary and a closed, party-only count to allocate the delegates.

In the 10 other states with primaries on March 7, three are closed, three are fully open and the others permit independents to vote either way, some with requirements that they register a party preference first.

Six Southern states hold primaries on March 14, three closed to all but Republican voters, three not - but one of the latter is Bush's Texas.

So the strategy that has served McCain so far gets more difficult. He will have to marshal the Republican voters who so far have preferred Bush. But that task becomes easier with the aura of inevitability peeled away from the long-time leader.

And McCain began tending his Republican flank before he was done celebrating the victory he won with outside votes, which produced an unlikely victory speech with "a special plea" to the GOP not to fear his campaign but to join it. The Arizona senator said he is a proud conservative Republican, in the Ronald Reagan tradition.

No less a political tactician than Richard M. Nixon said the way to win as a Republican is to move far enough right to get nominated, then far enough back to the middle to win the election.

McCain is trying to rewrite that script.

EDITORIAL ROUNDUP

Feb. 8 - The Columbus (Ohio) Dispatch, on new Austrian government:

Though democracy is the best form of government, it certainly isn't a perfect one, as Austria has just demonstrated.

The new coalition government there includes as a major partner the Freedom Party of Joerg Haider, whose pro-Nazi statements and anti-immigrant xenophobia have put Europe and Israel on edge.

To protest the formal inclusion of Haider's party in the governing coalition, the 14 other nations in the European Union have taken steps to isolate Austria politically.

Some observers are warning that if the European Union acts too resolutely to isolate and punish Austria, it may only inflame Austrian nationalism and push more voters into Haider's corner.

Maybe. But inaction by the member nations might be far more dangerous, because it could encourage similar movements throughout Europe.

The organization cannot undo the outcome of democratic elections in Austria. But it is not obligated to like that outcome, nor to cuddle up with the government that results.

Feb. 14 - The Post and Courier, Charleston, S.C., on Elian Gonzales custody battle:

The massive propaganda campaign launched by the Castro dictatorship to exploit the plight of 6-year-old Elian Gonzalez is reminiscent of Soviet Communism at its worst.

According to the Castro regime, the little boy has been "kidnapped." Posters in Havana show a sad little face looking through a chain-link fence - not the yard of the modest Miami home of relatives who took him in after his rescue from drowning.

Elian's father, Juan Miguel Gonzalez, recently wrote to U.S. Attorney General Janet Reno and Immigration and Naturalization Service Commissioner Doris Meissner to complain that "serious harm has been inflicted on my son's health and emotional balance by his intolerably prolonged captivity." ... If he were so concerned, Mr. Gonzalez would want to come to Miami himself to rescue his son.

Elian's freedom is potentially such a strong symbol that it threatens a 41-year-long dictatorship. Let us pray for a second miracle to save Elian from being returned to the prison island that his mother lost her life trying to leave.

Feb. 15 - The Evansville (Ind.) Courier & Press, on Forbes' finish:

Money counts for a lot in politics but not everything, as evidenced by multimillionaire publisher Steve Forbes' decision to bow out of the Republican presidential race after spending around \$32 million.

That bought him a second-place finish in Iowa caucuses - at an outlay of about \$160 a vote; a distant third in the New Hampshire primary; and another third in Delaware, a state - the only state - he won in his \$37.4 million run for the nomination in 1996.

Being the absolute monarch of an inherited family business is probably not the best preparation for politics: The employees have to listen and obey; the voters do not.

Even though he could have easily run for Congress or governor in his home state, he disdained this traditional route to the White House and apparently still does.

Forbes insists his two campaigns were worthwhile because "we have changed the political landscape" - on taxes, Social Security and health care. It's hard to see how.

He did, however, have an impact. His relentlessly negative ads against Bob Dole in 1996 cost the eventual GOP nominee both money and momentum.

George W. Bush's campaign is another one with deep pockets, \$70 million-plus. As this struggling candidate is also learning, money will get the voters to look at you, but it's no guarantee they'll like what they see.

Feb. 13 - San Antonio Express-News, on high cost of prescription drugs:

In New York, Senate candidate Hillary Clinton burst out of the blocks with a proposal to change U.S. law so consumers could have unrestricted access to low-cost prescription drugs sold in Canada. Like her or not, she hits an issue worthy of debate.

Because of government price controls, Canadians typically pay one-third less than Americans do for prescription drugs.

President Clinton recently proposed and Republicans essentially agree with him adding \$35 billion to Medicare to pay for prescription drugs, which are vital to the health and survival of senior citizens but are not covered by Medicare.

If the president's proposal succeeds, it will create a huge new market for drug makers because Medicare will enable more seniors to buy prescription drugs.

Prescription drugs are hugely profitable, and consolidation within the industry ... will reduce market competition.

Drugs would not be sold for less in Canada unless it was still profitable for companies to do so. The argument can be made that U.S. consumers pay more so Canadians can pay less.

That does not fly in the free market, and the drug companies do not use that pitch. Instead, they hide behind a 1988 U.S. law that restricts reimporting drugs. The measure, the New York Times reports, was intended to ensure that only Food and Drug Administration-approved drugs could be sold in this country.

Mrs. Clinton says most drugs sold in Canada use the same ingredients and are manufactured in the same factories under the same controls as those sold domestically.

If that is true, then the 1988 law should go and the so-called free market should be allowed to work. Or drug manufacturers should lower prices in return for the privilege of providing drugs, at a smaller profit, to millions of older folks. ...

Tigers roar to comeback

Stephen Compton had to wait a while before he could make his Senior Night truly memorable. But after his Murray High boys' basketball teammates turned Friday's 11-point second-quarter deficit into a 10-point lead with 5:48 to play, Compton gave the Tigers a jubilant Homecoming with back-to-back 3-pointers that put nails in Crittenden County's coffin.

The 65-53 triumph over the Rockets (19-8) gave Murray (12-13) its fourth straight win to close the regular season, improving the Tigers' record in 2000 to 11-4 heading into Thursday's Fourth District semifinal showdown with crosstown rival Calloway County at 7 p.m. at MHS.

But with a regional tournament berth on the line, head coach Dan Hudson just hopes his Tigers don't get too carried away after their impressive come-from-behind win. "This is a springboard for us, but the Calloway game will still be a dogfight," said Hudson, whose

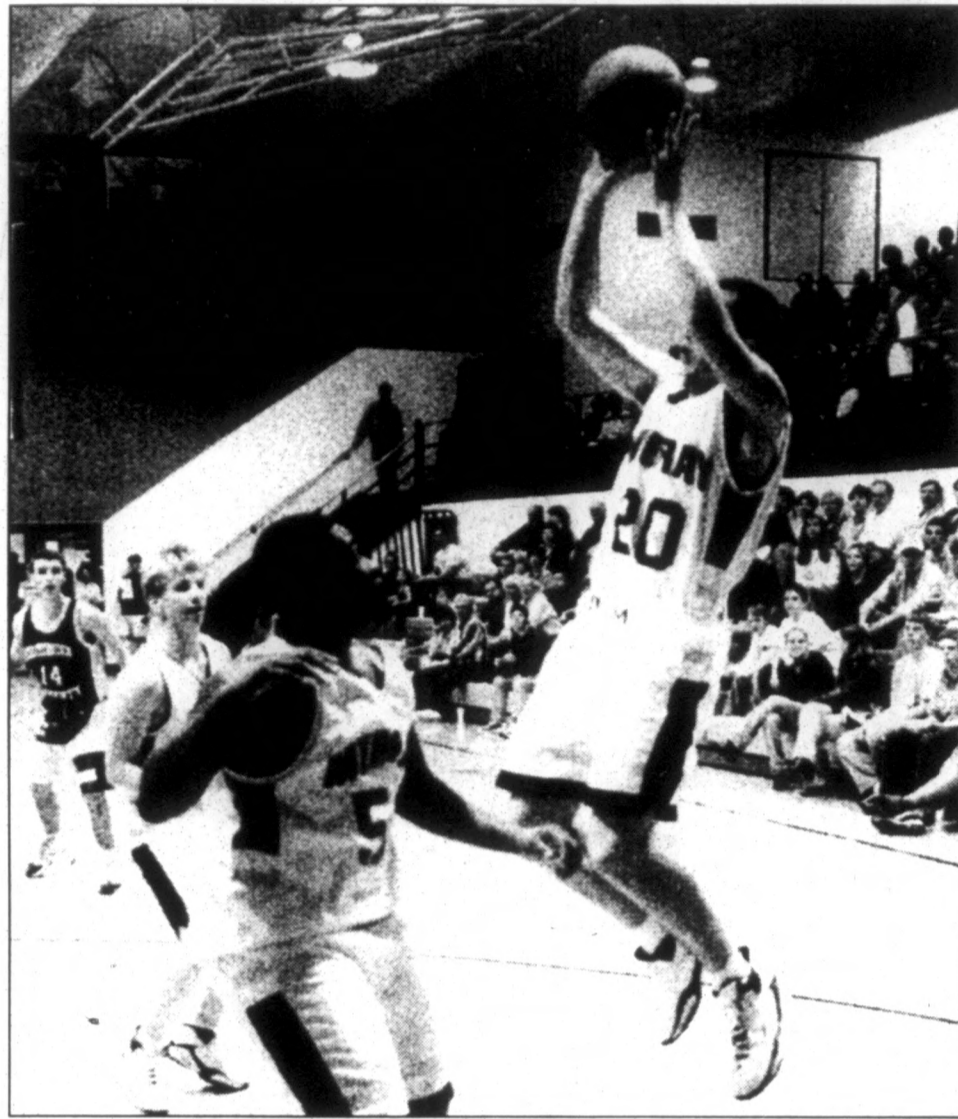
squad swept the two regular-season meetings. "Both games have been decided in the final seconds, so it should be a lot of fun." Murray had a lot of fun Friday, once the Tigers got over the imposing figures of Crittenden's 6-4, 240-pound center Josh Cozart and 6-4, 225-pound forward Justin Hill.

Cozart, who weighed 270 during his senior football season, signed to play football at the University of Louisville last month. The Crittenden combination joined forces for 10 points as the Rockets built a 20-9 lead early in the second period.

But behind Kwen Trice's game-high 25 points — on four 3-pointers and 11-of-12 shooting at the free-throw line — and eight assists,

Much will be at stake for the Murray State Racers when they take on Tennessee Tech in the regular-season finale for both squads tonight at 7 in Cookeville. The contest is scheduled to be televised live by Fox Sports Net South.

'Cats provide test for Hogs

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — Arkansas coach Nolan Richardson knows his squad will have to play one of its best games of the season tonight to beat No. 18 Kentucky on the Wildcats' home floor.

Still, despite an uncharacteristic 14-12 record overall and 6-7 mark in Southeastern Conference play, Richardson savors the challenge that comes with facing one of college basketball's most storied programs.

"I think the competitiveness in me is that you always go after and try to play the best teams in the country and they have been that way for years and years and years. Regardless of what their record is, Kentucky is always a big-time program."

"Plus we are going to bring a bunch of young guys over that have never been to Kentucky. That will be quite an experience for them to see 25 or 26 thousand people in the arena."

Kentucky (19-8, 9-4) has beaten Arkansas in each of its last two meetings at Rupp Arena. The two teams split a pair of games last year as Arkansas won 74-70 in Fayetteville during the regular season and lost 76-63 in the SEC Tournament championship game at the Georgia Dome in Atlanta.

The Razorbacks are in the midst of a brutal stretch of schedule that will see them play their final six games against Top 25 opponents.

Arkansas lost the first two games to No. 9 Florida and No. 15 LSU before topping No. 24 Vanderbilt 78-63 on Wednesday. Following tonight's contest with 18th-ranked Kentucky, the Razorbacks travel to No. 7 Tennessee before returning home to face No. 11 Auburn.

"The mental aspect of the game is so important, especially at this stage of the season," Richardson said. "You have to have some things. You have to see that the things you are working on are starting to pay off."

No one knows that better than Kentucky coach Tubby Smith. The Wildcats fell to seventh-ranked Tennessee 74-67 Wednesday, dropping them a game behind the Vols and Florida with three games remaining in the race for the SEC East Division crown.

Although the chances of a conference championship appear

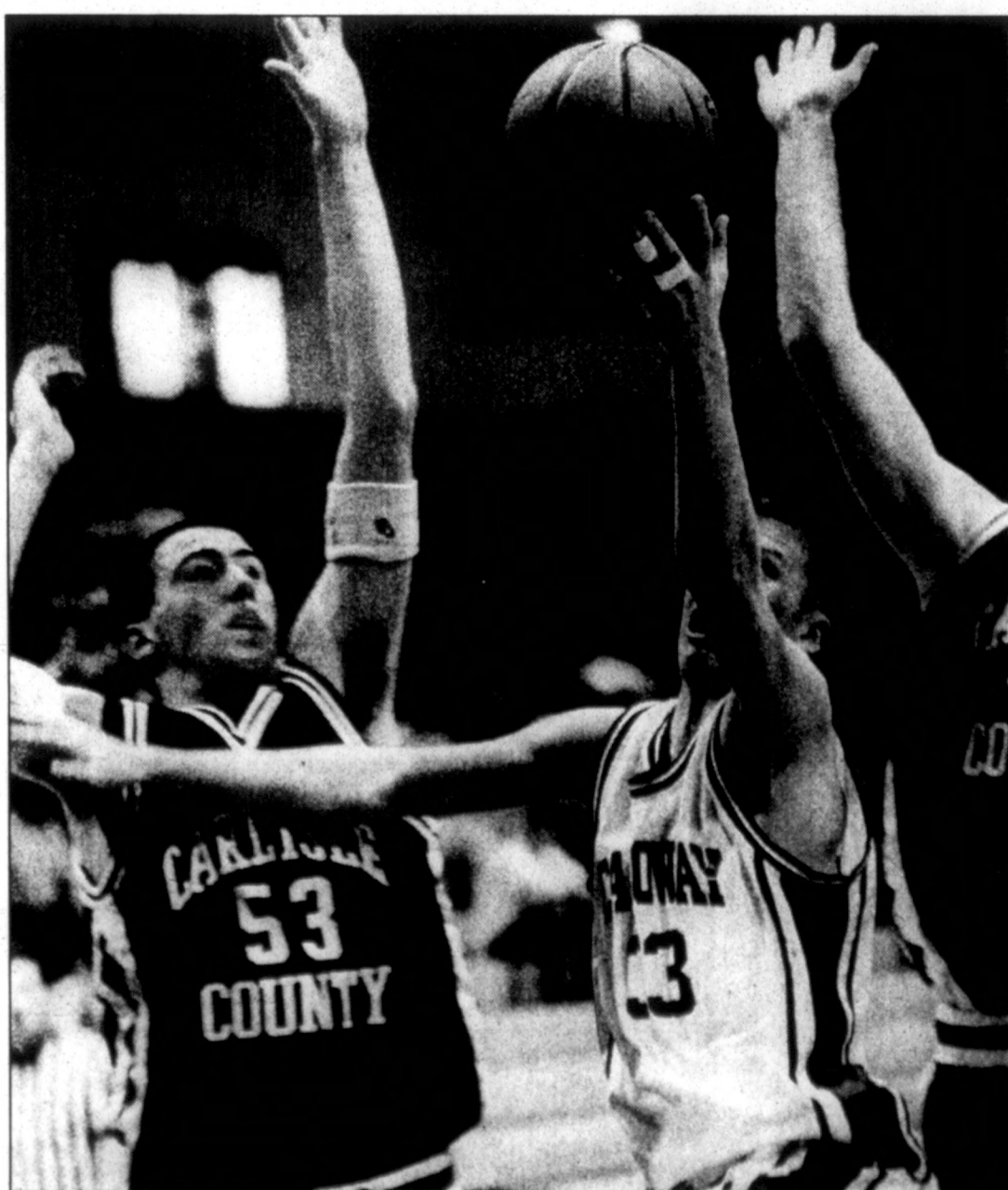

The MSU men's team has been competitive all winter, receiving school-record performances from senior Kenny Shields and sophomore Jon Cargill. Anglers should expect major storm

Our current lake elevation measured 355.8 feet on Wednesday morning. The Tennessee River level below the dam was 318.2 feet below sea level.

A major storm front is headed our way with super strong winds and probably heavy rainfall.

We had planned to be on the lake this day. But when I saw the winds were in excess of 30 miles per hour, the yellow flag came out!

The storm is also coming up from the southwest on an angle, which prohibits you from fishing most of the good banks.

Some of you good folks are out on the watershed and pond banks casting away - and a few are doing pretty good.

Always keep in mind that a small reservoir will warm more rapidly - thus encouraging fish movement and prespawn activity sooner than the larger lakes.

I haven't checked any of the watersheds lately, but I would expect their waters to be in the high 50s and bank full.

Anglers who do get out there on a bank should try a floating minnow surface lure, if for no other reason than to enjoy the heart-throbbing excitement of watching the lure disappear in a swirl and splash as you twitch it on the surface!

The sudden jar and heavy pull of the bass awakens the fisherman for another year of having great fun.

Often in late February or early March, we have these warming trends spend a few days with us. As they do, our fish respond aggressively.

Bass will back themselves into grass, weeds or brush right on the shoreline, looking to ambush any smaller fish or amphibian that happens along.

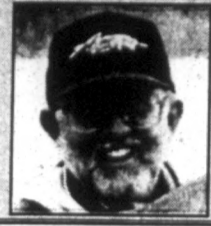
Watch the shorelines closely for movement other than the wind. When you see something, cast past it down the shoreline and twitch the floating minnow back towards the spot.

You will be amazed at how well a big bass can hide in six inches of water when it is hunting!

On bright, sunny days you may need to fish the shady banks if possible. But if the fish do not respond, then switch to a spinnerbait. In these smaller waters, a 1/4 to a 3/8-ounce spinnerbait should be sufficient.

Choose your blades and colors according to the water clarity and

what you like to throw.

If the fish have moved off the banks or shallows, tie on a short shallow running crankbait that wobbles a lot on the retrieve.

Move out to any point or bank that allows you to make long casts to the deeper areas where maybe there is a creek channel.

Your last resort technique is to tie on a black or brown soft plastic worm, grub or tube and a slip sinker for distance.

Cast to, over, beside, around any and all visible cover article - such as rocks, brush etc. to find some active fish.

We are just out of a full moon, so things should be getting in your favor. We are not too early. Maybe not fishing, on a major time but not too early in the year!

March always has the potential to be mixed weather patterns. So don't be discouraged if it rains. There is nothing better than a warm spring shower to turn on the big bass.

Most ponds and watersheds have a layer of decaying vegetation or algae covering the bottoms. When working heavy lures, you're constantly having to clean the lure.

One answer you might like is to use a 1/8-ounce jig with a small pork frog or a plastic equal, and just bounce or hop it slowly across the cover and bottom.

Many times, this is a great way to score big! Keep in mind that the bass could be sluggish and slow to respond. But stay with them.

Check the water temperature in the mornings and again in the afternoons. A day of bright sunshine will make the waters warmer later in the day.

Back to the big lakes. You can use some of the same techniques

in the larger shallow bays and be successful there.

Crappie anglers abound in this region, and its hard to stay away from some of the best eating fish in the world!

The big waters are warming rapidly also. But the volume is so great that the change overall won't be as quick!

We should be finding water in the high 40s and over 50 by this weekend. This is sure bound to help start the fish movements.

The change in elevation as it was rising didn't make much difference to the crappie because they are enjoying the free floating threadfin shad buffet.

Now we all know the water will go back down to winter pool stage before long. And, when it does, a change in feeding will slow the bite for us.

Cast in stone, the rules are such that our lakes will not have any significant amount of water coming in and remaining until the first of April.

This, of course, is subject to change - only if there is a possible flood situation from excessive rainfall in the region.

Live shiner minnows are still the anglers choice, but the response to jigs is getting better.

A 2-1/2 or 3-inch curtail has a lot of wiggle and can be worked weedless through a stakebed or brushpile to draw a strike.

Pay close attention to your casts and watch for a strike to occur before you touch any cover at first.

The crappie may be aggressive and will rise to attack the bait as soon as they see it coming!

We caught some huge slabs last spring using minnows at first, and later switching to curtails for a something different look.

On one occasion the Medleys and I had 28 crappie, which measured from the smallest at 16 inches in length to the largest at 17-1/2 inches. Several of these crappie were three pounders and the largest was a black female at 3-1/2 pounds.

Naturally, we hope to find them that grouped and aggressive again this spring!

Writer looks back on lifetime of hunting

My father had quadruple bypass surgery last Monday. I still don't think of him as old, although he will soon be 71.

We were a product of two different ages - he was born into the Great Depression and came of age during the war, which made him cautious and conservative to a fault. I was a baby-boomer and my brash, leap-then-look attitude often clashed with his.

He lost his father when he was 16 and doesn't mention it to this day. I've heard a fishing story or two about him - and maybe a hunting tale - but that's about it.

Most of the hunting stories I heard as a child invoked Dad's trips afield with his uncles, friends, and my mother's family. And hunt they did - every Saturday during season, every holiday.

Life was different then. These excursions were social events where families got together - the men to hunt, the wives to cook and visit and the children to play and be rambunctious as children are wont to be. It was a great time to be a child.

There are a few simple pleasures in life. I cannot imagine growing up without hot tamales made from stewed wild rabbit. They were finely ground, wrapped and cooked in real, honest-to-goodness corn shucks. It was a culinary delight in spite of the occasional stray piece of lead shot.

I suppose Dad and his buddies hunted for the same reason that I hunt today - because everyone around them hunted, family and friends alike, when they were young.

Perhaps it was a demonstration of freedom or self-reliance. In a time when wealth could be measured in pennies, all they needed was

a gun and a mule.

Although I still had to sit out the big holiday hunts, dad would take me hunting as soon as I could follow. We would sit under a big hickory near the corn crib and wait for squirrels in early fall, or follow a scatter-brained pointer over hill and hollow busting quail by the covey.

It didn't matter that I only carried a BB or pellet gun on those forays with Dad. I stood right there with him, shouldered that thing, taking a shot at every flushed bird or rabbit. Although, my chances would have been better with a handful of rocks.

Finally, dad handed me an old 20-gauge single shot he had used as a kid, and my world changed forever.

In those days, we always kept a pack of beagles and one or two

bird dogs. We hunted every Saturday, Sunday afternoon, and even late evenings after work.

Finally, after much begging and pleading, I was allowed to join the special holiday extravaganza.

By the time I finished high school though, rabbits were scarce and quail were getting harder to find. Dad and I started farming together, and that unfortunately replaced our hunting.

It's been nearly 30 years since we last hunted together. Dad hasn't hunted at all since that time. Although he never hunted deer, I think he gets a kick out of my exploits - even though one of his freezers is full of deer hides.

I don't think he really planned to quit hunting - and I always thought we would hunt together again.

There's still no one I'd rather hunt beside than my father. Few people have the kind of quiet reverence he had for hunting that I have now grown to cherish.

Now, wherever I hunt, I am reminded of places with names out of the past where we spent so many weekends together the Beaver Dam slough, Monkey Den, the Becky Woods, the Pine Thicket and the old Paul Darnall farm.

Hunting was truly the common denominator in our lives. Regardless of how wide the father-son gulf became or how intense the struggle, we could grab our guns and stand shoulder to shoulder in the field - two men connected by a lifetime!

So go out and take a young person hunting!

Late winter brings antler hunting season

PADUCAH, Ky. (AP) — Late winter brings a hunting season of sorts, one that can produce trophies but won't put meat in the freezer.

The annual white-tailed deer antler drop is now taking place in Kentucky, and the headgear that is shed by bucks is coveted by wildlife enthusiasts, collectors and hunters even though it doesn't come with a supply of venison attached.

Antler hunting reasonably can begin any time from the chill of late January on into warm spring weather, but most whitetail bucks

will tend to lose their racks during a period of late February through mid-March. The antlers, implements that serve as fighting weaponry as well as social status symbols, detach at bases called pedicels on the heads of bucks. They begin to loosen when the level of their hormones associated with the annual fall and winter breeding cycle decline in late winter.

Development of new antlers for the next cycle begins in just a short few weeks, but meanwhile all the bucks' bony growth falls to the ground — where it usually won't

remain long. Since the antlers are high in calcium, squirrels and other gnawing rodents tend to eat away at shed antlers, chewing them to nothing in perhaps a few days.

Unless a collector finds them first.

"We'll have 150 to 200 people out here hunting antlers on the first day we reopen to the public," said Charlie Wilkins, biologist and manager of the Ballard County Wildlife Management Area.

The Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources area, a waterfowl refuge closed to most

traffic and use during fall and winter, reopens March 15 annually. Renowned for harboring one of the state's top concentrations of trophy-class deer, the site is a choice one for seekers of shed antlers.

"There will be people out here with flashlights before it gets daylight on the day we open," Wilkins said. "They'll want to be the first ones in there to find a big antler."

Wilkins said antler hunters prosper best by poring over places where deer spend more time. In that respect, antler hunting is similar to deer hunting.

"Those places around edges — fields that border woodlots — are better than a lot of places because deer stay near edge cover more," Wilkins said. "You can find trails and search around them, but you probably won't find as many antlers there as you will around where two kinds of habitat meet."

"Another good spot is on the ridges where the deer bed down because that's obviously a place they're going to spend a lot of time," he said. "On our area, a ridge is just a little bit higher than the ground around it because we're

in the bottoms, but wherever deer go to bed during the day is a likely spot for antlers to be shed."

Some antler hunting is done by hunters as a part of off-season scouting — seeking to discover where surviving bucks still are found and identifying the trophy animals by the larger antlers shed. Others seek the bony relics as rustic, decor or mere curiosities.

Wilkins noted that the Boone and Crockett Club's record book of big game trophies maintains a separate category for antlers that are found.

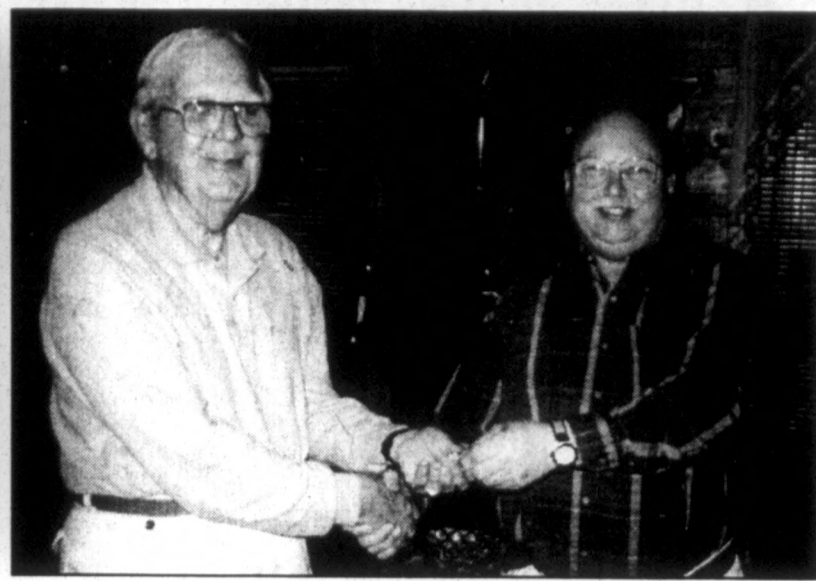

Poll outlines hiring activity

Hiring activity will hold a decided edge in The Purchase Area this spring, according to the latest poll of businesses' workforce plans, released by Manpower Inc.

"Of companies responding to the Second Quarter Employment Outlook Survey, 47 percent will recruit more workers during April, May and June," said Manpower spokesperson Helena Schultz, "while 17 percent expect to cut back and 33 percent report no changes are anticipated. Another 3 percent remain unsure at this time."

For the same period last year, 63 percent forecast adding staff and none predicted personnel reductions. Three months ago prospects were variable when 27 percent projected more hires, while 20 percent indicated employment levels would decrease.

"In many markets, the spring quarter signals a pick-up in hiring following the slower-paced winter season," noted Schultz.

Manpower Inc. conducts the Employment Outlook Survey on a quarterly basis. It is a measurement of employers' intentions to increase or decrease the permanent workforce, and during its 24-year history has been a significant indicator of employment trends.

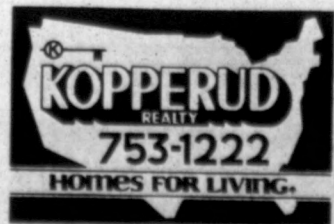

DR. GOTT

DEAR DR. GOTT: I've decided to get a facelift. What do you think of the chemical peel process?

DEAR READER: When a woman or a man chooses a facelift, the usual motivation is a desire to get rid of wrinkles and sagging skin. These facial changes are the result of aging, during which both the skin and the subcutaneous tissues undergo a marked transformation, as collagen, the skin's supporting material, fragments. However, deeper alterations also take place. With less elasticity, the inner skin layers sag, and fat deposits appear under the skin.

Therefore, a facelift usually involves removing excess skin, as well as "tightening up" the tissue that has become inelastic. Chemicals that cause shedding of the skin's outer layer are often used to smooth out tiny wrinkles, but they have no effect on subcutaneous tissue or fat.

Before giving a specific answer to your question, I'd have to know the reasons you decided on a facelift. If you are troubled merely by excessive wrinkling, a chemical peel would be appropriate. On the other hand, if you are like the rest of us oldies, wrinkles are only a part of the problem — and a small one at that. Hence, plastic surgery may be necessary to achieve the results you desire.

Not being a plastic surgeon, I'm not qualified to offer specific advice. In most cases, chemicals alone will not do the trick without some surgery to re-sculpt the face and neck. I suggest that you seek a consultation with a qualified plastic surgeon, who can provide the particular, technical information you require, describe the procedure, explain the possible drawbacks, and give you an idea of the cost.

This last point may not seem important, but it is. Plastic surgery is expensive, and most insurance plans do not cover purely cosmetic operations. Therefore, you may be stuck with thousands of dollars in out-of-pocket expenses. Carefully examine your options before committing to a procedure, and get a second opinion if you have any doubts. DEAR DR. GOTT: I eat a lot of eggs but don't eat the yolks. Will this help my cholesterol level?

DEAR READER: Egg whites are composed primarily of protein, mostly albumen; they contain no cholesterol.

On the other hand, yolks contain a significant amount of cholesterol (about 250 milligrams per yolk), so they can cause trouble for patients on low-cholesterol diets.

Egg whites are nutritious and can be consumed without restriction.

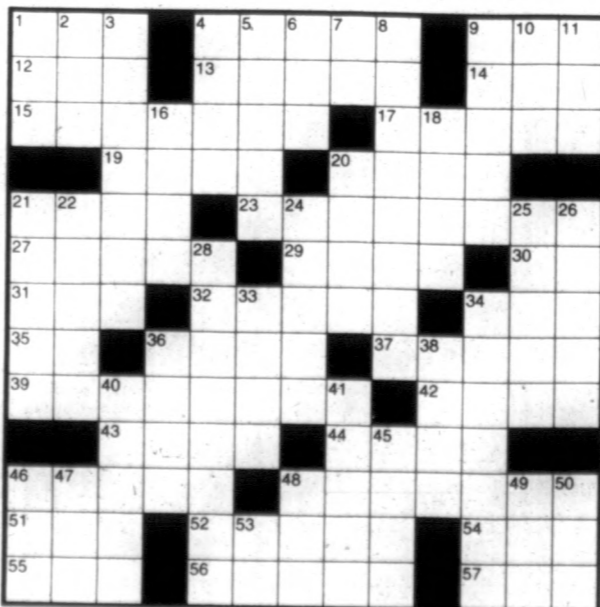

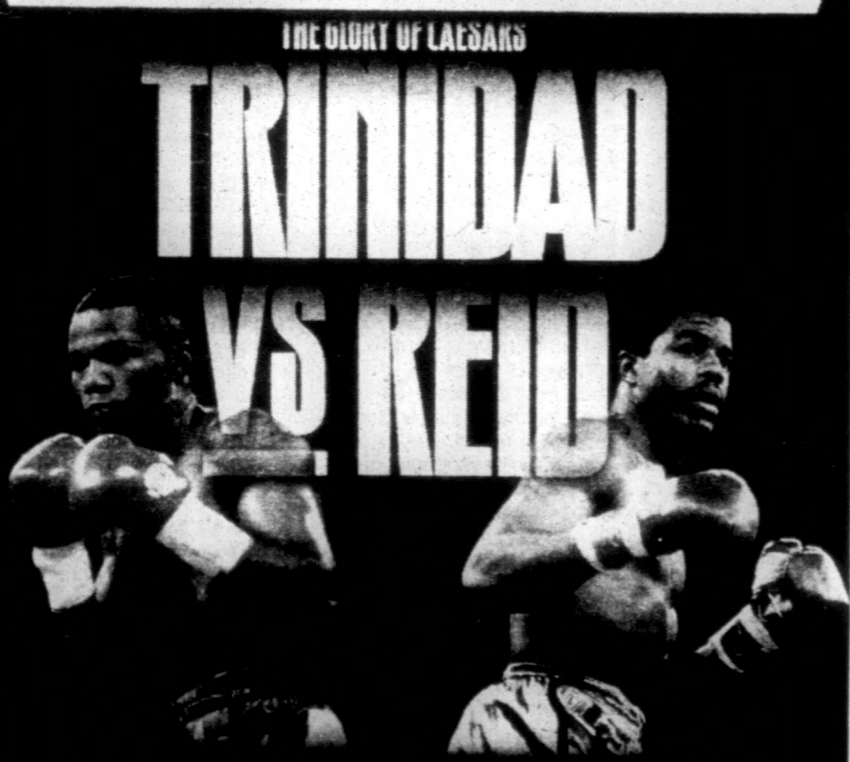
