Patton orders racial profiling information

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) -State law enforcement agencies will begin collecting information about arrests, stops and searches to determine if the race of an individual is a factor under an order issued Friday by Gov. Paul Patton.

Patton said the information will be compiled to determine if "racial profiling" takes place, a practice among some law enforcement authorities to base their actions in part on the race of an individual. A bill that would have required the compilation of such information was defeated in the 2000 General Assembly session.

"Stopping or searching individuals on the basis of race is not an effective law enforcement tool nor is it a defensible strategy for public protection," Patton said in a release explaining his executive order.

The information will be used by the Justice Cabinet and the state law enforcement council to craft a policy that prohibits racial profiling, Patton said. Once a state policy is adopted, local police and sheriff's offices will be encouraged to adopt the state plan or devise one of their own.

The information will also include the gender and ethnicity of those who are stopped and searched.

Seminary head hails document elimination

LOUISVILLE, Ky. (AP) - The president of the Southern Baptist Theological Seminary says a vote by trustees to eliminate a document that acknowledged the school's shift to the conservative right was a "powerfully symbolic act." Trustees unanimously voted last week to kill the "Covenant Renewal," a seven-page document approved in 1991 that stipulated that the school would hire only "conservative evangelical scholars."

Whitfield touts legislation By EDWARD SHERIDAN Staff Writer

First District U.S. Rep. Ed Whitfield, R-Ky., is taking his latest legislative proposals to the people they will affect the most the Kentucky tobacco farmer.

Whitfield was in Calloway County "Friday morning at the Smotherman Farm near Lynn Grove to discuss two pieces of legislation he is proposing to help area tobacco farmers.

"I know that neither one of these initiatives is going to answer all of the problems that our farmers face, but I believe that if we're successful in implementing them at least it will be a small help," Whitfield said to the group of farmers at the meeting.

The first piece of legislation, H.R. 4344, has to do with filing of lawsuits by H-2A migrant farm workers. The new legislation would prohibit H-2A workers from filing lawsuits against farmers in courts outside the state where they were employed.

Since the Legal Services Corporation, which aided in the filings of many of the migrant workers' lawsuits, is a federally subsidized organization, Whitfield introduced a bill last year that would cut its budget by approximately \$50 million to try and discourage the number of lawsuits.

Patton signs controversial pension bill

FRANKFORT, Ky. (AP) - Gov. Paul Patton on Friday signed into law a bill he said earlier could potentially double legislative pensions and that he had promised to veto.

Patton said the underlying bill was too important to overturn. It creates a medical savings plan for judicial and legislative retirees who live outside Kentucky and cannot take advantage of ordinary health care plans. Patton was encouraged to sign the legislation by Chief Justice Joseph Lambert.

Patton said he tries not to meddle in the affairs of the other branches of government and legislators will have to answer to voters about the pension increase and how it came about.

Also Friday, Patton vetoed four measures, including one that would have let more schools hire the spouses of education officials and another that tried to expand legislative control over regulations.

House Bill 389 was changed late in the session to include a vague provision about legislative pensions. It appeared to add an annual cost-of-living raise to the pensions retroactive to 1998. Patton said initially the provision could double legislative pensions. It was sponsored by Republican Sen. Albert Robinson of London.

"The leadership of the Senate should have been more sensitive to this kind of backdoor attempt to increase legislative compensation without the knowledge of the people," Patton said in a statement released

"It is a powerfully symbolic act," said seminary President R. Albert Mohler.

The adoption of the document reflected the shift in the seminary - and in the Southern Baptist Convention as a whole - toward a fundamentalist view that the Bible should be taken literally and that Christianity is the only path to salvation.

All but 14 of the 73 professors currently at the seminary have been hired since the Covenant Renewal was approved. Most of the moderate faculty resigned, some under pressure, during an emotionally wrenching period that lasted through most of the 1990s.

"I'm not saying it was a mistake" to approve the covenant at the time, Mohler said. But it is now unnecessary when "this faculty is fully committed to the full authority and inerrancy of the Scriptures."

The decision is a defeat for the Economic Development Cabinet and Secretary Gene Strong, who argued they were the only ones allowed to see the records and sole determiners if companies are meeting their obligations to receive the incentives.

The state for many years has had a variety of programs to provide direct loans or, more recently, credits and other tax benefits to companies that bring or create new jobs in Kentucky. The incentives are usually tied to employment and investment promises made by the company.

"The secretary maintained that he and only he can determine the accessibility of the records," the appeals court said Friday.

The cabinet also hired private attorneys to defend its policy. Spokeswoman Pamela Trautner said Friday the records of how much money has been paid to lawyers in the case will not be available until next week.

Trautner also said officials in the cabinet have not seen the ruling and were unable to comment on whether there would be an appeal.

Sex offender's return concerns neighbors

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) - After serving 13 years for sodomizing two young boys, Johnny May returned to his mother 's house and shocked some of the neighbors.

They didn't know he had been released from prison and were upset. Things would have been different last week.

On April 11 a revised version of Megan's Law went into effect, and sheriff's deputies are no longer required to alert people that highrisk sex offenders have been released and are living nearby.

Now, the names and some photos of sex offenders are posted on an Internet site maintained by the Kentucky State Police.


Lawmakers say more people will receive notification of the release of sex offenders via the Internet.

But that doesn't sit well with neighbors of May, 52, who was released from the Kentucky State Reformatory in La Grange on Sunday.

Not everyone has a computer, said one resident, Bill Faulkner. "We should have been notified of his release," he said.

"Three little boys live in that house. And there are two others living there," Faulkner said, pointing out houses on the dead-end street. Many older residents also have grandchildren who visit them often,

Federal agents seize Elian in pre-dawn raid

MIAMI (AP) — Armed federal agents seized Elian Gonzalez from the home of his Miami relatives before dawn today, firing tear gas into an angry crowd as they left the scene with the weeping 6-year-old boy

More than 20 agents arrived at

the home shortly after 5 a.m. and used rams on the chain-link fence and on the front door. A short time later, a woman and man brought Elian out of the home and put him in a white van that drove away.

"Assassins," yelled some of the approximately 100 protesters, some of whom climbed over the barricades in an attempt to stop the agents. The agents, wearing Immigration and Naturalization Service shirts, were armed with automatic weapons.

"The world is watching!" yelled Delfin Gonzalez, the brother of the little boy's caretaker and great-uncle, Lazaro Gonzalez.

"They were animals," said Jess Garcia, a bystander. "They gassed women and children to take a defenseless child out of here. We were assaulted with no provocation'

Within an hour of the raid, the crowd in Little Havana quickly swelled to about 300.

The raid came amid reports of progress early today to immediately transfer custody of the boy from his

Miami relatives to his Cuban father. Attorney General Janet Reno was at her office early this morning engaged in an extraordinary, longdistance negotiation that began Friday afternoon.

The settlement was first proposed by civic leaders in Miami serving as intermediaries. Proposals and counterproposals flew through the night by telephone and facsimile machine between the Miami house, the Justice Department and the Washington office of the father's lawyer.

All of that ended early today. Carlos Gonzalez said he and several others tried to form a human chain in front of the door but were forced back at gunpoint.

The government and the boy's father, Juan Miguel Gonzalez, insisted that any deal contain an immediate transfer of custody of Elian to him, but the Miami relatives had defied Reno's order switching custody.

The relatives have cared for him since November, when he was

found clinging to an inner tube in the Atlantic after a boat carrying his mother and other Cubans capsized, killing her and 10 others. They and the Cuban exiles in the street do not want the boy returned to a Cuba ruled by Fidel Castro, whom they fled.

The deal under discussion called for Juan Miguel Gonzalez and Elian, Lazaro and his daughter, Marisleysis, to move to one of two foundation-owned conference centers near Washington - either Wye Plantation, a center on Maryland's Eastern shore that has been used for Mideast peace conferences, or Airlie House near Warrenton, Va., according to a government official, who spoke on condition of anonymity.

The plan called for formal custody to transfer immediately from the Miami relatives to the boy's Cuban father, but it was not clear that the relatives had accepted that, the official said.

Another sticking point was the length of the joint occupation of the compound. The intermediaries proposed that all family members stay until a court appeal is completed, in late May at the earliest. But Juan

Miguel Gonzalez faxed a counterproposal back in late evening that called for a much shorter joint stay, the official said.

Reno, Immigration Commissioner Doris Meissner and other officials waited in Reno's Justice Department office past midnight for the relatives' reply to the counterproposal.

The Miami relatives lost a U.S. District Court battle to get a political asylum hearing for Elian. An appeals court has ordered Elian to stay in this country until it hears that case, but did not bar Reno from switching custody.

Reno met for 15 minutes Friday at the Justice Department with Juan

Miguel Gonzalez. During the emotional session, the father said he had a very good 25-minute telephone conversation with his son on Thursday, the government official said. He also asked Reno to give him a date certain when he would get his son back.

But afterward, Reno said she told him "that I could not commit to a particular course of action or timetable.

ticular industry," he said. "I think all industries need to be aware of the precedent this is setting." In addition to the new legisla-

tion, Whitfield said he is looking into the salaries of migrant workers established by the U.S. Department of Labor. "We know they're including

some wage scales that are not in the tobacco industry," he said.

Migrant workers are paid \$6.39 for field work and stripping and \$7 for cutting, but farmers are also responsible for paying for their lodging, transportation and workman's compensation claims.

"Most of these guys will tell you, when you add up the bus trip, the housing and workman's comp, it adds up to closer to \$11 an hour," said Will Ed Clark, director of the Western Kentucky Dark-Fired Tobacco Growers Association.

The Kirksey Post Office is hosting a special event May 9 to promote the sale of this stamp.


The Murray-Calloway County Health Express will be in the Post Office parking lot offering routine screenings as well as information on women's health issues including early detection of breast cancer.

Report: Agents held fire

ST. LOUIS (AP) - Federal agents did not fire at Branch Davidians in the 1993 siege that ended in a deadly blaze at the group's compound in Waco, Texas, according to a preliminary report from last month's simulation of the confrontation

Vector Data Systems, the British firm that conducted the simulation, provided the written report to U.S. District Judge Walter S. Smith Jr. earlier this month

The test was performed March 19 in Fort Hood, Texas.

Vector found that flashes produced by sunlight reflecting off debris were considerably longer in duration than flashes produced by gunfire, the St. Louis Post-Dispatch reported today, citing informed sources.

That finding would support the government's claim that similar flashes seen on a 1993 infrared tape were the result of sunlight reflecting off debris from the crumbling complex, not gunfire.

Each early April, once dogwood and red bud trees are blooming and bare tree limbs are lime-green with new leaves appearing, Shiloh Battlefield, down a-top the Tennessee state line above Mississippi, comes to mind.

Stephen Benet described it succinctly and well in "John Brown's Body'

By Pittsburgh Landing, the turbid Tennessee

Sucks black, soaked piles with soil-colored water.

That country is huge and disorderly, even now.

In sixty-two it was shaggy with wilderness still.

Stretches and stretches where roughly-chinked log cabins,

Stood in a wisp of open. Shiloh National Military Park

is, by preserved battlefield standards, impressively large, some 4,000 acres in all.

Much of the terrain remains as it was 138 years ago, rippled uneven land laced with country lanes and creeks (Dill, Owl, Snake, Chester, and others draining into the river near the landing)- although there were many more trees back then.

With all the forests and creeks, fighting was disorganized and savage, hardly like the open-field charges at Gettysburg or Fredericksburg.

Here on a Sunday, April 6,1862, Albert Sidney Johnston and 44,000 Confederates launched a surprise attack on Ulysses S. Grant and 40,000 Yankees.

Grant had driven Johnston and the Confederacy out of Kentucky and Tennessee by capturing Forts Henry and Donelson.

Johnston had rallied his scattered troops at Corinth, Mississippi, and Grant planned to attack there once General Buell joined him from Nashville.

Johnston sprang his own sur- Strong resistance by General Pren-

A defense line at Dill Creek was established and held as night fell and as Buell and Wallace came to support the panicked Union army.

By the time Beauregard retreated to Corinth on Monday, April 7, some 11,000 Confederates were dead or wounded, while Grant had lost 13,000, but had replaced his losses with the 25,000 reinforcements.

It was the bloodiest battle of the War up until then, and an omen of the violence to come.

Each year, re-enactors gather on the weekend nearest the battle dates - this year on April 8 and 9, and I am here watching them this year, back at Shiloh for the first time in a quarter century.

The fields are ringed with monuments, and in the cemetery, where only northerners are buried, the tombstones form regimental lines down toward the river.

The trees are gone, and so too are the piles of arms and legs thrown out of Shiloh Church when it served as a hospital that Easter Sunday and the day afterward long ago

But awe and wonder, deep thoughts and prayers - and ghosts - linger on at Shiloh.

It is taking a long, long time to rise above it, and there are no guidebooks that adequately explain it.

EDITORIAL ROUNDUP

April 18 - Le Matin, Lausanne, Switzerland, on Italy:

For the casual observer looking at Italy, what happened on Sunday - defeat of the center left in the regional elections - is not at all illogical. The peninsula is passing from red to blue, and thus returns to a political coloring which matches the unforgettable sky of its enchanted springtime. Silvio Berlusconi's invigorating Forza Italia is sweeping away the diverse and dried-up Olive Tree of Massimo D'Alema.

D'Alema, formerly a hard-headed and conservative Communist apparatchik, was the reddest of the social-democrat leaders of the European Union. Italian electors, having expelled - with the help of the Clean Hands judges - Christian Democracy, the socialists and their historical leaders, are saying a final farewell to old-style politics. It was riddled with ambiguous alliances. The concrete facts and the desire for modernity were bogged down in the semantics of another age.

"The left is lying. We are freedom," That was the cry of Berlusconi's troops. The simplicity has paid off. The right's foray into the north has been huge and significant. In the age of e-business, where everything becomes volatile, the Italians are showing an astonishing ease in adapting to the "new politic" advocated by Silvio Berlusconi, a media- and computer-friendly leader.

No more can we think of Italy as like the Vespa in "Roman Holiday." Nowadays the peninsula is on-line. And how!

April 18 - Liberation, Paris, on the French government's acknowledgment that the confiscation of Jewish assets during World War II totaled \$1.3 billion:

The 11-member Matteoli commission has exposed all the daily crimes, all the cowardice, all the murderous "good conscience," all these legal pogroms. All a part of our history.

It belongs to that same history of silence, of procrastination and lies ... which hindered, delayed and forbade the restitution of the confiscated items to their owners or their descendants after the liberation.

That this business of indifference and dissimulation had been postponed until the 1990's, that the Mateolli mission had, just a few months ago, been up against the unwillingness of banks and concerned insurance companies, only added to the scandal.

April 15 - Asahi Shimbun, Tokyo, on South Korean politics:

South Korean politics was jostled ... by the citizens' active participation in the election process and disclosure of information about individual candidates

The Citizens' Alliance for 2000 General Elections, comprising about 500 civic groups engaged in activities for the environment, human rights and education, called on parties to weed out politicians unfit for parliament and not to endorse their candidacy.

It should also be noted that the election law had been revised as part of political reform that President Kim Dae Jung advocates, and the National Election Commission had disclosed information about individual candidates regarding the payment of taxes, military service and criminal records. Based on such information, the citizens' alliance publicized its list of undesirable candidates.


... Thirteen years after the declaration for democratization that ended military dictatorship, politics in South Korea took another step forward. We are surprised by the new move and a little envious of such a development in the neighboring country. Given the new allocation of parliamentary seats, President Kim will have a hard time vis-a-vis parliament.



That's worth noting. The closest a Jewish American ever got to living in the White House may have been when Kitty Dukakis had a chance at becoming first lady in 1988

Lieberman won't speculate on his chances.

"I'm definitely not thinking about it," he said. "Believe it or not, my dream in life was to be a United States senator."

Feinstein did not return calls to her office seeking comment.

Jewish officeholders have sought the presidency in modern times, but generally haven't gotten far. In 1976, Pennsylvania Gov. Milton Shapp, a Democrat, dropped out after finishing fourth among five candidates in his state's primary In 1996, Sen. Arlen Specter, a Pennsylvania Republican, gave up his run before any primary votes were cast.

To date there have been 26 Jewish senators and 147 Jewish members of the House, according to Sandy Maisel, a professor of government at Colby College in Waterville, Maine, and author of "Jews in American Politics," which is to be released next year.

One of them, former Connecticut senator and Secretary of Health, Education and Welfare Abraham Ribicoff, was said to have been offered the chance to share the ticket with Democrat George McGovern, who lost to Richard Nixon.

"I don't want to be president, and if a man says he wants to be vice president, that means he wants to be president," Ribicoff said in turning the offer down, according to another book on Jews and American politics by Stephen Isaacs.

included Judah Benjamin, a Whig, who became the first Jew in the Senate in 1852. He resigned in 1861, eventually becoming secretary of state for the Confederacy during the Civil War.

Elected to his first full Senate term in 1950, Herbert Lehman also served four terms as New York governor and was one of the earliest opponents of Sen. Joseph R. McCarthy's hunt for Communist sympathizers.

Jewish Republican Jacob Javits, who hoped to be tapped for a vice presidential run, served in the Senate from New York from 1957-1980.

Feinstein, who is 66, could have a better chance this year if George W. Bush chooses former Cabinet secretary Elizabeth Dole as his running mate, matching female candidates on the Democratic and Republican tickets. The only previous major-party vice-presidential candidate was Geraldine Ferraro for the Democrats in 1984.

But Feinstein could be hurt by concerns about her husband's business dealings with Communist China, said Stuart Rothenberg, editor of the Rothenberg Political Report.

Lieberman, 58, who won his seat in 1988, was one of the first in his party to publicly criticize President Clinton's behavior with Monica Lewinsky.

"In a sense, he immunizes Gore on that particularly sensitive topic for those voters who might resist Gore because of his association with Clinton," said Ross Baker, a Rutgers University political science professor.

Whether having a Jew on the ticket would matter is subject to debate.

"The Jewish community is already voting close to 80 percent unquote, religious party."

Forman, executive director of the National Jewish Democrat Council, and Maisel's co-author.

Then again, "this could solidify the Gore ticket with a very loyal group of voters," Baker said.

Anti-Semitism is not likely to sink a ticket, said Abraham Foxman, national director of the Anti-Defamation League.

A 1998 poll found that about 12 percent of the population holds strongly anti-Jewish views, including the opinion that "Jews have too much power."

This is down from the 20 percent of Americans who held such views in 1992, and 29 percent in 1964.

"Yes, on the fringes there would be some opposition to a Jewish candidate," Foxman said. "But some people blame the Jews if it rains on July Fourth. I think in general this country has come of age."


Still, Maisel questions how far that tolerance goes.

"Lieberman is sort of one step beyond just a Jewish candidate," he said. "He's an observant Jew. For non-Jews, there might be questions about what that means."

One thing it means is that Lieberman observes the Jewish Sabbath, from sundown Friday to sundown Saturday, during which he is ostensibly prohibited from working.

Lieberman has interpreted this to mean he may still work during that time, but only to promote "the respect and protection of human life and well-being." This means he will vote on legislation and participate in important meetings on the Sabbath ---but he won't campaign.

That might carry some weight with voters, Rothenberg said. "He could change the perspective that the Republicans are the, quote



> If you were born before 1938, you will still be eligible for your full Social Security retirement benefit at the age of 65 and reduced benefits as early as age 62.

> However, those born in 1938 who retire "early" this year will find their benefit reduced from 20 percent to 20.8 percent.

> Beginning in 2003, full retirement age for those born in 1938 or later will increase.

> For example, the full retirement age for those born in 1938 will increase to 65 years and two

Middle ends 'Breds' home winning streak

The Murray State baseball team suffered its first Ohio Valley Conference loss at home this season and saw a field-record 10-game home win streak snap as Middle Tennessee State swept the Thoroughbreds 7-6 and 7-2 in a doubleheader Friday at Reagan Field.

The teams, who were tied for third place in the OVC standings coming into Friday's action, conclude the threecontest today.

In a game highlighted by four balks - three by Murray State pitching the Blue Raiders (24-16, 10-3 OVC) held on to a 7-6 victory in the first game of the twinbill by nailing Chris Johnson at the plate for the final out of the game.

With the bases loaded with two outs in the bottom of the seventh and the 'Breds (16-20, 8-5 OVC) trailing 7-4, Justin Varitek stroked a single to right field, scoring Josh Ridgway and Brad Langdon, who was playing in his first game since breaking a finger last week.

Johnson motored around third base

and appeared to be heading for home, but stumbled. MTSU second baseman Josh Renick hesitated on the throw, but it beat Johnson to the plate to win it for the visitors.

Aaron Russelberg (4-6) took the loss, allowing six earned runs on nine hits while striking out four and walking five in six-plus innings. Gordon Dugan came on in the seventh, allowing no runs on two hits in one inning.

Big bats for the 'Breds included game weekend series with a 1 p.m. Langdon, who went 2-for-2 with a double and two runs; Johnson, who went 2-for-4 with a run and two RBIs; Varitek, who went 2-for-4 with three RBIs; and Garner Byars, who went 2-for-3 with a run.

MTSU starter Dewon Brazelton (5-2) got the win, allowing six runs on nine hits while striking out 10 and walking one in seven innings.

Big hitters for the Blue Raiders included third baseman Brandon Johnson, who went 3-for-4 with a double, two runs and an RBI; left fielder Justin Links, who went 2-for-4 with a home run, two runs and an RBI; and catcher Josh Pride, who went 2-for-3 with two runs. Right fielder Bryan Peck had two RBIs for MTSU.

In the nightcap, strikeouts dominated early as each starter had five through two innings. 'Breds starter Preston Hesley had four in the second inning as Johnson struck out swinging and took first base on a wild pitch.

Hesley (4-5) took the loss, allowing seven runs on 10 hits while striking out seven and walking none in four innings. He was hit in the left shin on a sharp come-backer hit by Peck in the third inning, but was able to stay in the game for the rest of the third and all of the fourth.

John David Poynor - Murray State's sole right-hander of the day - came on in the fifth, allowing no runs on one hit while striking out two and walking one in three innings.

Leading hitters for the 'Breds were Chris Johnson, who went 2-for-4 with a run; Nathan Taylor, who went 2for-3; and Langdon, who went 2-for-3 with a run.

MTSU starter Jeff Parsons (3-4) got the win, allowing two runs on six hits while striking out seven and walking six in four innings.



nglers need rise in water elevation

Our current water elevation on Kentucky Lake is 358.28 feet and . the downstream side of the dam is at 311 feet.

This is going to help some, but we need at least two more feet for those crappie to complete a good spawning.

The reasoning behind wanting two more feet is so the crappie can reach the shallow flats in the back of most bays. This will insure us of a good spawn and a high survival rate of the fry.

Also, if the much-needed depth is there and there is a need for a reduction in the depth, then the crappie won't panic and will stay close to the flats.

The temperature is now. 60 degrees again. And if the forecast holds true, the lake could possibly warm up to 63-64 degrees this weekend.

The eggs in the females are maturing rapidly, and will peak soon if the weather remains warm. The crappie are not spawning yet, but are so close.

I have had some tough days like everyone else, and I would like to see some improvements.

We have worked out of the beautiful Paradise Resort several days this week. One of those days, I helped John Morgan with a group.

We stayed in Blood River all day and were able to put together a good bunch of crappie. They were acting funny at first, so we had to move out away from the banks to get a bite.

Most of the spider rigs were already out, because that's the way they fish. Many of the crappie were over two pounds and - as always - some big ones were lost.

The elevation changed rapidly after the cold front came through. It rose very high, knocking the action down to a trickle again.

Dan Dolack, John Morgan and myself have been doing fairly well because we know of so many areas to fish. I don't mind moving around to find some active crappie.

I haven't talked to Brad Weakley this week about his success. But

I'm sure he is catching some fish as well.

Most of the folks who are using the spider rig technique for crappie are catching more fish than they have in years! Many are taking a limit almost every trip.

The elements that control all of our feeding and sleeping habits are off-center. We are now just beginning to come out from under the full moon.

Hopefully, the rest of April will be favorable for all anglers and allow everyone to enjoy the beautiful outdoors we have to offer.

The light, clear line I suggested that you switch to has really paid off for a lot of local anglers. The water is still pretty clear and will be a problem to the heavy line users.

We are still throwing the Blakemore roadrunners that we just purchased - and just in time.

The body size of the 1/16-ounce bait seems to be perfect for all age groups of fish. We can catch so many different species of fish on it.

Almost daily, we catch a fair sampling of white and black crappie, bluegill, long-eared sunfish, green sunfish, warmouth perch, yellow northern perch, drum, largemouth bass, smallmouth bass, Ken-

tucky bass, white-striped bass, yellow-striped bass, skipjack shad, yellow willow catfish, fiddler catfish, blue channel catfish, moon-eyed shad, smallmouth buffalo and sauger.

We have pictures of all these species of fish. The smiles come with all of them. I know crappie can be caught on a lot of different lures. But none of them will beat a roadrunner day in and day out.

My good friend, Ray Leathers, came down for a day, and we boated a lot of these different fish on light and ultra-light tackle.

This enhances the whole deal of fighting a fish to the boat on a hook and line. The reason for being out there and doing it is for the inner self.

Brad, Brandy and Craig Sandlin met me at Paradise Resort for an outing. We had a good time. They didn't arrive until after 9:30 in the morning. So we had to work harder for that mid-day bite.

We did catch some very decent crappie, smallmouth bass and bluegill by casting the shorelines and several drop ledges.

These folks are very nice, and I hope they enjoy their stay and come back again.

I later fished with the father-son team of Harlan Leusink and Harlan Leusink II.

We had a tough, cool morning with winds 10 to 15 miles per hour. The crappie just didn't respond well at all.

We caught everything else several times over, including largemouth bass of three pounds in stature and missed as many strikes as we caught fish on.

The coming front looks bad for this area. So we may stay in the shed a day. The weekend is one to fish because time is scarce now before the actual spawn.

Take time for the kids and take them with you. You don't have to wonder where they are if you do.

Finding a suitable tree, I sat down and put every effort into sounding like a very lonesome hen.


Effort had been the key word that morning. Starting as the first grey light of dawn touched the river, 1 hiked up Money Hill - first to the meadow where owl-hoots failed to illicit a response, then steeply up a rocky grade on the face of the hill.

Twice I stopped to catch breath and convince my rubbery legs to press onward.

As the sunlight began to wash down over the tops of the trees, illuminating the gold of the new leaves, turkeys sounded off both below and on the ridge opposite.

Electing to stay high on the side of the mountain. I made my way along a narrow bench that soon became little more than a deer trail.

Rounding the back of the hollow, all sound was masked by the thunderous roar of not one, but three creeks that poured down from the top of the mountain - swirling and hopping over rocks and ledges



hoops from wooden kegs.

I'm sure that, at some point in time, the moon had shown brightly on this stream-side jut of rock.

The second stream along the trail carried the greatest volume of water down the mountainside. Above the crossing, I could see the bright, flashing white of several short falls folded into the rocks and trees.

enormous arch of solid rock that bridged a crease in the mountainside.

The allure was such that I had to walk over and stand beneath it's edge and breathe-in the mist of the falling water.

Beyond the streams was a devil's garden. narrowly terraced on a severely steep slope and planted with gargantuan outcrops of rock one in particular balanced like a huge, grey ball on a golf tee.

Far below, the spring green of the fields managed to peek through the rock and trees in small patches. Even farther above, a more civilized world of roads and houses existed on the flat plateau of the mountaintop.

It was here, among the broken remnants of ancient geology and the miracles of nature unequaled by human endeavor, that I encountered a tom turkey - the object of this excursion.

For an hour, we conversed as he strutted back and forth with little invention of crossing to my side of me stream - then he simply faded back into the rocks and trees.

I quietly followed one trail, then another around and down the side of the mountain until I stepped into the flat fields along the river,

before streaming in a mighty fall to splash on the flat stone below. In the mountains, even a small stream can produce a mighty sound.




DEAR DR. GOTT: My 8-year-old granddaughter constantly picks or twitches her nose. I try to tease her out of it by telling her she is going to end up looking like Pinocchio, but this hasn't worked. Any suggestions?

DEAR READER: Does the child live with you? If not, leave the behavior modification to her parents who, with the help of a qualified pediatrician, will make the necessary adjustments.

Your granddaughter is smart enough to know that her unseemly habit is not going to make her nose grow longer - lying does that, I think! (Has your nose grown lately?) Therefore, she may have kept at her nose because a. it gains a lot of attention from Grandmother, b. she doesn't believe you, or c. you're the only one making a fuss about it. Of course, you - as a grandmother - have every right to express your opinion about the child's habit, but, for heaven's sake, don't harp.

DEAR DR. GOTT: What causes enlarged blood cells?

DEAR READER: Blood cells enlarge when, during their formation, their structure is altered. This can occur in red blood cells if the hemoglobin (pigment molecule) is disrupt-

ed by a congenital abnormality (such as thalassemia) or by a nutritional deficiency (such as a lack of vitamin B12 or folic acid)

Ordinarily, blood cells are not released into the circulation until they are fully developed; immature forms are larger than adult blood cells. Therefore, large cells may indicate that young forms are being pressed into service. Leukemic white blood cells are exceedingly young and very large. In addition, in the presence of hemorrhage, young (and large) red blood cells may appear in the circulation. Enlarged blood cells almost always mean that something is wrong and should be investigated.

DEAR DR. GOTT: I have had a dull ache in my upper neck for several weeks. I have difficulty holding my head up because of the discomfort. I also have pain along my jawline and ears, dizziness and blurred vision. But what's really bothering me is that I feel constantly angry. What's happening to me?

DEAR READER: You seem to be describing muscle-contraction pain, a common complaint that can cause headache and other symptoms (including muscle spasms in the neck

and shoulders). Anger often causes this syndrome. Therefore, your physical discomfort could well be eased by addressing the root of your rage.

I suggest that you have a medical examination. Ask the doctor if counseling would be appropriate and whether pain-relief techniques such as massage, acupuncture or biofeedback - might be used to treat your pain and dizziness.

Of course, muscle-contraction pain may be associated with many illnesses, such as hypertension and muscular disorders. Consequently, your visit to the doctor would serve at least two purposes: Evaluation of potentially treatable physical ailments, plus the opportunity to obtain psychological support, if indicated. © 2000 NEWSPAPER ENTERPRISE ASSN.

After drawing trumps, South led a club to the king, hoping to find the suit divided 3-3 so that he could later discard a diamond on dummy's fourth club. But when West showed out of clubs, there was no way for declarer to avoid losing a club and two diamonds for down one.

It might seem that South is sure to fail whatever he does, but actually he can make the contract with proper play. He should play low from dummy on the club lead and take the eight with the ace.

Declarer should assume from the bidding, as well as the opening lead, that the eight of clubs is a singleton. No harm can come from making this assumption because if West has the queen of clubs, it can be trapped later on.

After ruffing two hearts in dummy and drawing trumps, South then plays the ace and another diamond. The defenders can now do no better than collect their two diamond tricks, after which they find themselves stymied. If West winds up on lead, he must return a heart or a diamond, allowing dummy to ruff as South discards his club loser. If East wins the third diamond, he must either yield a ruff and discard or lead a club into dummy's K-J. The so-called "free finesse" at trick one thus turns out to be an illusion.
