Flags and Busch: Racing faithful honor fallen king

ROCKINGHAM, N.C. (AP) - In a way, the stack of Busch Light beer cases outside Doug and Glenda Hall's camper serves as a tribute to Dale Earnhardt.

You see, through most of their 16 years of marriage, Doug was a Miller Lite man. But when The Intimidator started carrying Busch endorsements on his No. 3 Chevrolet, the couple just had to switch.

That was the kind of appeal Earnhardt had.

"He was my man," Glenda Hall said over the generator growl as she stood shivering on a patch of faux-grass carpet in the campgrounds across U.S. 1

from the North Carolina Speedway. "He's the only man my husband's ever let me have in my living room, bedroom and kitchen."

The couple have stockpiled eight cases of their favorite beer for this weekend. They will need it as they prepare for Sunday's Dura Lube 400, their first NASCAR race in years without "their man."

"I think that any Earnhardt fan that doesn't come, they're going to look like a bunch of cop-outs," said Mrs. Hall, a No. 3 earring flashing from each lobe. "We should be here to show our remorse and all to

BUCKNER, Ky. (AP) - Gas station owners call them "drive-offs" - people who fill 'er up, then

zoom away without paying. Most are never caught. Those who do get collared usually lose little beyond the cost of their illgotten gasoline.

Times

Taking them to court is costly, in time and money, for business owners. But bills in the General Assembly might help.

A bill by Rep. Tim Feeley, which the House passed last week, would allow suspension of a driver's license for up to six months upon a second or subsequent conviction for misdemeanor theft at the gas pump.

What is more important, perhaps, is that gas retailers could post warnings to that effect on their pumps.

"Most people would think twice and probably not chance it," said Larry Meadows, a gas and food mart owner who inspired the legislation. "That was the whole intent."

his family and to the legend of the sport that's fallen."

And so, less than a week after his death in a crash at Daytona, legions of fans in pain are making the pilgrimage to "The Rock, a track sunken in the pines of North Carolina's Sandhills like a crippled flying saucer.

Across the road is a pup-tent bivouac festooned with Confederate flags and Earnhardt banners. Outside the main gate, a granite boulder inscribed with the names of Earnhardt and other Winston Cup champions is encircled by "3"-shaped flower arrangements, winged Teddy bears, black balloons and roses - both real and

Mary Kay Rowell wiped away tears as she walked from the makeshift memorial.

"Oh, I haven't cried in 10 years, and I cried two full days after this happened," the Dillon, S.C., woman said. "He was my boyfriend's driver — and he was also my driver, too."

How do people decide whom to make "their driver"? For a primer, stop by the corner table at downtown Rockingham's Holiday Restaurant, where fans come to wash down pork barbecue with pitchers of sweet iced tea.

Bill McAnulty raced the "outlaw" dirt tracks in the 1950s and '60s. His favorite driver was erstwhile moonshine runner Junior Johnson, until Johnson made a fateful decision - he switched to Fords.

"I couldn't pull for a Ford," McAnulty said, shaking his head in mock disgust. "I was raised in a Chevrolet family and I drove Chevrolets. I'm driving Nissans

now, but when it comes to racing, it's got to be a Chevrolet."

But why? "Why are you generally a Republican or a Democrat?" he asked. 'Because you were born into it."

McAnulty found a new hero in Earnhardt. And after a lot of soulsearching, he has decided to pull for Dale Jr.

"He's got the right car, he's got the right name and he's driving essentially his dad's equipment. And he's a pretty doggone good race driver," McAnulty said. "As they say, the apple don't fall too far from the tree."

Across the table, Jim Murray announced almost apologetically that he is a Jeff Gordon man. But he said his love of the sport goes deeper than a number on a hood or an advertiser's decal on a roof.

He thumped his chest to describe how the roar of the passing cars affects him. There is poetry in the wind that rushes over him as the machines roar past. The residue of burning tire that coats the track is a thing of beauty to him.

"I still believe race fans are race fans, OK?" he says. "And because you lost Dale, this is going to take awhile. But they'll gravitate to other drivers, and they will stay race fans, because they love racing."

Around these parts, NASCAR is more than just a sport, said Kevin Parsons: "It's a way of life."

Like Dale Jr., Parsons followed a famous daddy into racing. Parsons' father was 1973 Winston Cup champion Benny Parsons. The younger Parsons raced for about four years "until I ran out of money." He now teaches math at the local community college."

He said he thinks that cycle is what has kept the sport - and

its stars - humble.

"You know how it is in football and basketball," he said. "Guys, by the time they're 15 years old, people tell them how special they are, that the rules don't apply to them if they'll just put the ball in the hoop. Racing doesn't have that. No matter who you are, you have to start out racing for \$500 purs-

"Sweat and tears on your own stuff. And when you do get there, I think you appreciate it a little

Despite the big tracks and the myriad endorsements, Parsons said NASCAR has still not been tainted by a major scandal and has retained much of the family flavor it started out with. The only Sundays it takes off between February and November are Easter and Mother's Day.

People loved Earnhardt because he was like a neighbor, a friend, even a family member.

Barbara Sears liked him because he reminded her so much of her late husband, "Big" John Sears, who raced at Rockingham when the speedway there was still only a dirt track. His widow pulls out a dust-covered framed newspaper clipping showing off his No. 10

Mercury - the car he once won in after running the last 17 laps with only three wheels.

"Back then, they may have called him The Intimidator," she says with a laugh as she shows off a photo of him rubbing baby powder on his bumpers to cut the wind drag. "I could see a lot of my husband in Dale."

But unlike Earnhardt, "Big" John didn't die on the track. He quit racing in 1973 after his brother, James, was killed in a wreck and died of a heart attack at the end of the 1999 NASCAR season.

Standing behind the register in the Ellerbe garage her husband started after leaving the circuit, Mrs. Sears fumbles through a file drawer and pulls out another faded postcard showing a stock car and "Big" John.

Looking back, she finds its hard to understand all that is happen-

"I'm not a fanatic, because I know they are just men like any other man," she says, replacing postcard in the drawer.

"I don't put them up on any pedestal. And I think a lot of people do too much worshipping. They expect too much out of them."

for residents to dispose of their household waste, though in many communities that is as basic as a centrally located dumpster. Otherwise, there is a long tradition in some areas of tossing garbage over the nearest convenient hillside.

"It breaks my heart to see litter, trash and garbage laying around," said Rep. Tanya Pullin, D-South Shore, a freshman legislator who returned to Kentucky only recently from a successful career in the Far East.

Others, though, complained that the bill would force local governments into expensive programs without a way to pay for them.

Rep. Jeff Hoover, the Republican House floor leader from Jamestown, proposed an alternative to increase the fine for littering to \$750, with \$500 of it going to the agency that issued the citation.

"This is nothing more than a smoke screen to force mandatory collection," Hoover said. "The counties cannot financially go out and clean up these dumps."

Hoover's proposal was defeated by a vote of 36-59.

The bill passed 70-28. It would

force counties to clean up their dumps by 2003 or begin curbside collection. The Natural Resources Cabinet estimates there are more than 4,000 illegal dumps. If counties failed to do either, the legislation lets the state direct 10 percent of a county's annual Road Fund money to cleanup efforts instead of blacktop.

After passage, House Democratic leader Greg Stumbo of Prestonsburg stunned his colleagues by asking for a vote on his own plan, which includes a half-cent tax on most drink containers and cups from fast food restaurants. The estimated \$30 million the tax would raise annually would be divided among counties for litter abatement, cleaning up illegal dumps, starting recycling programs and other initia-

Stumbo's proposal was defeated by a 41-56 margin, far short of the 60 votes needed.

"We have some contradictions here," said Rep. Mike Cherry, D-Princeton. "We have the opportunity here to pay our own way. We've got to have the political courage to get up here and do something.'

Meadows, owner of Sav-A-Step stations at Buckner and on busy Westport Road in Jefferson County, once lost hundreds of dollars to drive-offs each month, especially when gas prices were soaring last spring and summer.

"People just decided they weren't going to pay it," Meadows said

in an interview. "I guess they thought they were going to get back at the gas companies."

If so, they didn't understand gasoline retailing. Meadows said his distributor gets paid in full. When someone steals at the pump, "I eat every bit of it myself."

A vacation trip to Florida last June gave Meadows an idea. Gas pumps bore a warning about gas thieves losing their licenses. A state trooper was pictured, holding a driver's license.

"I got to thinking that's not a bad idea," said Meadows, who contacted Feeley, R-Crestwood. Feeley introduced a bill last month.

The bill originally would have allowed a license suspension for a first conviction of misdemeanor gas thievery. To the disappointment of dealers, the House Judi-

Ed Brewer, general manager of

a Flying J truck stop in Shelby County, said deferring suspension until a second offense probably is pointless.

"We catch quite a few of our drive-offs," Brewer said. "But I've never caught the same person twice.

A bill from the Senate may be more to his liking. It would require denial or suspension of a license for a first offense, though for no more than three months. The bill is by Sen. Ernie Harris, a Republican who also is from Crestwood. It has cleared a Senate commit-

Brewer, who said the Flying J loses about \$10,000 a year to drive-offs, makes it a practice to prosecute every case possible, which amounts to about a case a week. But taking a thief to court, even someone caught in the act,

is no simple matter. Kentucky State Police require him to get a full description of the motorist and vehicle, plus the license number, Brewer said.

But the only value of a prosecution is its deterrent effect. "It's not really worth it unless the local newspaper puts it in the paper," he said.

The process is a bit more arduous in Jefferson County. If Meadows gets a driver's tag number, he can file a report with police to get a car owner's identification. He then must go downtown to the Hall of Justice and file a

Meadows managed to stop the drive-offs at his Westport Road station by switching to prepayment in August. It's an inconvenience for customers, and his gas sales have dropped about 10 percent, he said.

If Feeley's bill is enacted, he might switch back to after-purchase payment but would have to invest in surveillance cameras, Meadows said.

He won't chase gas thieves because it's too dangerous, Meadows said. "But I'm not going to let them drive in here and steal my business away from me."

ation director. "We're trying to get the fund going to help them out in that aspect."

Steele estimated that the site was ready for further construction allowing for ground settlement by the end of January.

Shinners said he anticipated some work to begin on the project after July, when the Parks Board would be notified if the grant money would be supplied.

"We would work pretty hard to get that \$25,000 in matching funds,' Shinners said. "The ground still has to settle after it was spread out last October and it all has to stabilize. The soil would probably be settled by June, and we still have some compaction to do...the earliest work could be done would

be next summer. "Rotary will see that the amphitheater will come to completion," he said. "I don't want you to think that we're not committed to the project and that it's not going to happen. We're not at that point yet. But the amphitheater will not be done as quickly


without the grant." The main concern of the parks board, Steele said, is that a timeline has never been set for completion of the project.

"We've never had (a timeline,)" Steele said. "The board has expressed a desire to see when this project will complete its stages. We would like a commitment on when it will be finished."

Indeed, that desire was brought up by Hudspeth, when he mentioned the amphitheater at the February parks board meeting.

"We do have a problem with not knowing exactly what's going on," Hudspeth said. "I don't think the park board's had too much communication with them - not as much as it should have. Hopefully, they can come to the next meeting and we can sit down, look at this project, and see what needs to happen to make it complete."

Source: More Clinton action under scrutiny

NEW YORK (AP) — Federal prosecutors are investigating whether former President Clinton commuted the sentences of four convicted swindlers in exchange for Hasidic Jewish votes for his wife during her run for the Senate, The Associated Press learned Friday.

The four men were members of the Hasidic community of New Square, which voted overwhelmingly for Hillary Rodham Clinton when she was elected in November.

U.S. Attorney Mary Jo White is investigating their commutations as part of a probe that is also said to include the pardon of fugitive financier Marc Rich, according to a source who spoke on condition of

Julia Payne, a spokeswoman for the former president, referred all questions to Clinton attorney David Kendall, who did not immediately return calls for comment.

"Senator Clinton has spoken about these commutations on sev-eral occasions and we do not have anything to add at this time," said her spokeswoman, Karen Dunn.

Mrs. Clinton has said previously that she did not discuss the men's fate with Hasidic leaders before the election but sat in on a December meeting with supporters of clemency for them. However, she said

she played no part in her husband's

"I did not play any role whatsoever," she said last month. "I had no opinion about it."

It is unusual for a first lady to sit in on a clemency meeting.

The commutations are part of a growing furor over several of the 140 pardons the president made on his last day in office. Also under scrutiny are a pardon and a commutation for which Mrs. Clinton's brother Hugh Rodham received nearly \$400,000; two pardons on which her campaign treasurer performed legal work; and the possible role of the former president's halfbrother, Roger Clinton, in some other cases.

The AP also learned Friday that Rodham has not yet repaid all the money he collected.

Bush defends One Florida program

TALLAHASSEE, Fla. (AP) -Florida Gov. Jeb Bush cried before a black Baptist group Friday as he introduced minority staffers and appointees he said have been ridiculed by other African-Americans for associating with him.

Bush's decision to abolish affirmative action in university admissions and state contracting prompted protest marches and demonstrations, including a sit-in by black lawmakers in the governor's offices, last year.

Bush said the criticism was unfair because his One Florida initiative that replaced affirmative action has increased black enrollment at

universities. He also said minority contracting with agencies he controls is up about 90 percent and that his administration is the most diverse in the state's history.

Critics say it is too early to tell whether Bush's efforts will have a lasting effect. Also, white as well as black enrollment at universities increased last fall, leaving the percentage of African-Americans about the same.

Bush said he feels hurt by the criticism not for himself but for people such as Leslie Steele, one of his press aides, and Lottery Secretary David Griffin, both black. Afterward, Bush said he teared up when he looked at Steele in the audience.

"I saw her and I decided to speak from my heart about it," Bush said.

He had asked that Steele come to the podium. When she did, she handed him a tissue that he used to wipe his eyes.

"I'm not crying for me," Bush told Steele. "I'm crying for you, Leslie, and others who have to make the ultimate sacrifice."



Stirring the attic dust

Do you remember Orlando B. Willcox?

If you do, you are exception-

If we asked 5,000 college graduates who Orlando Bolivar Willcox was, maybe one person might know. Some might guess, but wrongly - maybe he was one of the brothers who made and flew the first airplane.

Born in 1823, Orlando B. Willcox was a West Point graduate (1847) from Michigan who saw military service in Mexico, New York, Boston, the western frontier, and Florida, and then played a fairly substantial role as a general in the

He was much more important than our ignorance of him justi-

He told his own life story in carefully written memoirs which languished in boxes and a trunk in attics until discovered in 1993 by historian Robert Garth Scott, now published with additional notes from Willcox journals and letters and helpful footnotes in Forgotten Valor: The Memoirs, Journals, & Civil War Letters of Orlando B. Willcox (Kent State University Press, 1999, 720 pages).

Memoirs, correspondence, diaries, and journals from 19 century Americans are a very popular form of literature these days. I must have gone through over a hundred published memoirs and journals in the last five years.

Diaries and journals tend to be written on the spot, of course, and they become boring.

Civil War records dwell on sicknesses, weather, boredom, homesickness, religious revivals, lost comrades, and poor food.

Memoirs are more reflective, and occasionally surprisingly brilliant-

Like Union General Lew Wallace, better known for being the author of Ben Hur than for having gotten lost at Shiloh, Orlando Willcox was a published author of novels, none of which were Stedman, and Willcox lamented

acclaimed and all of which have long been out of print.

But he did have writing skills, and his memoirs are a rare and entrancing first-hand record of his

the Potomac into Alexandria, where Col. E. E. Ellsworth, a friend of Lincoln's, became the first Union martyr in the War.

At First Manassas, Willcox led a brigade in an attack of rebelheld Henry Hill, and was wounded and captured.

He received a Medal of Honor in 1895 for that achievement.

As a prisoner, he was sentenced to be hanged, in retaliation for reports that rebel sailors would be hanged as pirates, but both sides relented, and he was spared.

Released in August 1862, Lincoln promoted him from colonel to general.

He led a division at South Mountain, and then crossed Burnsides Bridge at Antietam three days later, and then led a corps at Fredericksburg.

He was transferred to Kentucky in 1863, and then to Indianapolis to command the Department of Indiana and Michigan, where his main action was to pursue John Hunt Morgan in Morgan's fabled raid. Then he was at Cumberland Gap and at Knoxville, opposing

Longstreet. He returned to the eastern front in 1864, and led a division in the Wilderness, at Spotsylvania, and at Cold Harbor, in the Petersburg siege and the Crater.

His troops received Lee's last assault, March 25, 1865, at Fort for decades afterward the slaying of A. P. Hill, his close friend from West Point days.

A professional soldier, Willcox seemed to have known everyone of any significance in American mil-In one of the first military itary history: Winfield Scott, engagements, he led soldiers across Zachary Taylor, Lee, McClellan, Bragg, Burnside, Franklin, Heth, Jackson, Pemberton, Lovell, Hancock, Fremont, Meade, and most

After the war he was a strong supporter of Andrew Johnson's Reconstruction policies and toyed with politics briefly, but then returned to active service and was made military commander in Lynchburg, VA, for three years.

When a large crowd of Washington College students attacked a Yankee merchant, and the army almost closed down the college, Willcox went to see Lee, then the college's president, and eventually peace was restored.

From Virginia, he was transferred to San Francisco, then to New York, then to Arizona (during horrible Apache rampage days), then New York, and finally Kansas, where he retired as a brigadier general in 1887.

He was superintendent of the famous Soldier's Home in Washington for several years, and died

Most of Willcox's memoirs were composed from 1885 to 1905, twenty to forty years after the

But his research on battles and his documentation from his own journals and letters combined with his wonderful prose style to make this discovered memoir-trove a real

The bombings of Iraq

Massive bombardments by the US-British warplanes of the Iraqi defense establishments in Baghdad on Feb. 16 are further additions to the long index of violations of international laws and the national sovereignty of Iraq. Such kind of aggressions show a dramatic "reversal" of the international order towards the dark ages, because this aggression was neither approved nor discussed by the U.N. Security Council nor even decided by any regional security arrangement.

Bombing Baghdad, in addition to regular airstrikes by the U.S.-British warplanes in no-fly-zones, is completely a unilateral and criminal action which has no legitimacy under any aspect of international law. However, this aggression needs to be examined at different levels. For the first time since December 1998, they struck against targets outside the no-flyzones which were arbitrarily imposed on Iraq in south and north in 1991 and 1992.

At least 50 aircraft - fighter, bomber, aerial refuellers, command-and-control planes and electronic jammers, took off from the aircraft career USS Harry S. Truman in the Gulf, particularly from Kuwait and Bahrain. They were accompanied by four British tornadoes. In military terms, the two-hour airstrikes included longrange, precision-guided weapons. US Airforce F-15Es used AGM-130s against Iraqi radar sites.

The same was used in 1999 Kosovo campaign, but not at such a long distance.

U.S. Navy F/A-18s toted the similar AGM-154 "Joint Stand-Off Weapons." AGM-130 can hit target at extreme end of ranges. It also allows the user to stay outside the threat-rings.

The U.S.-British authorities have claimed to hit five targets of radar and command centres.

In fact every state has sovereign right to install command-andcontrol centres for national security. No U.N. resolutions against Iraq even express a single hint to destroy such safety measures maintained by the Iraqi government.

In response to illegal entry of U.S.-British bombers in the Iraqi space, Iraq has begun to use anti- · Britain, should also pay compenaircraft shots to prevent airspace violations.

But the U.S. wants to deprive

Iraq of even its moderate capability of defense system. Marine Lt. Gen. Gregory Newbold, Director of Operations for the Joint chiefs of Staff said that Iraq air defenses had been increasing both their frequency and the sophistication of their operations against U.S.-British warplanes patrolling no-fly-zones.

Therefore, the legitimate right of Iraqi security against the foreign warplanes became the pretext for the recent aggression on Iraq. British Defense Secretary G. Hoon called the attack a "proportionate response" to an increased threat to their warplanes violating Iraqi airspace. Only this year the US warplanes have struck the Iraqi anti-aircraft targets nine times. The Iraqi officials had estimated in June 2000 the U.S.-British penetrations into Iraqi airspace by more than 21,000. The Pentagon also confirmed that more than 280,000 sorties were flown in the near decade since the imposition of no-fly-

The recent attack is the first military action ordered by President Bush. Earlier such attacks were also made without the U.N. approval. In 1996 the U.S. launched 44 cruise missiles in southern Iraq in "Operation Desert Strike." In December 1998 (Operation Desert Fox), it launched over 400 cruise missile strikes against 100 targets including presidential sites, airdefenses, intelligence facilities and economic targets.

Four days of heavy bombings in 1998 were made in response to the politicized complaint of the UNSCOM chief Richard Butler that Iraq was not cooperating with

Like other attacks, the recent aggression has been widely condemned by the world community. Russia and China have strongly condemned it. The Arab League called it an action against international

Turkey, France, Iran and many others, significantly India, have condemned this attack. Not only the U.N. Charter but also the U.N. resolutions against Iraq clearly mention to respect territorial integrity and sovereignty of Iraq.

It is, however, unfortu.n.ate that Iraq's neighbours provide bases to as a victory for Iraq. the aggressors to violate Iraqi sov-

In other words, Kuwait, Bahrain and Saudi Arabia should also be held responsible for the crime of aggression led by the U.S.

They, including the U.S. and sation to Iraqi victims as Iraq has been paying to Kuwait victims.

However, the recent aggression shows more American involvement in diverting the real issue of liberating the Palestinians u.n.der the Israeli occupation since 1948 and

President Though described the attack as a routine matter, in the words of Rep. Henry J. Hyde, chairman of the House International Relations Committee,

"Bush is not interested in simply maintaining an appearance of containment.'

A former Pentagon official and foreign adviser to Bush, Richard N. Perle says: "There is nothing routine about this at all." Pentagon spokesman Adm. Craig Quigley said: "This was a very deliberate, planned procedure," "to keep the pressure on the Iraqi president." The U.S. national security adviser, Condoleezza Rice, called it the "fourth enforcement" of the no-fly-zone since Bush took administration.

In fact the Bush administration wants to militarize the posture of Clinton administration towards Iraq. The U.S. Secretary of State Colin Powell has already called for tough adherence to sanctions against Iraq. Their renewed interest in Iraq seems to indicate that the U.S. has personalized rules of international relations in the Middle East.

The issue in the Middle East is not to attack Iraq but to force Israel to follow U.N. resolutions to end the colonization of Palestinians.

The U.S. neither envisaged an international coalition force (as was prepared against Iraq in 1991) nor condemned, or imposed sanctions against Israel which has been occupying the sovereign territories of Palestine, Jordan and Syria. The US has never pressured or pu.n.ished Israel for violating over 150 U.N. resolutions nor has it asked it to destroy its weapons of mass destruction.

Since September 2000, 400 Palestinians have been killed and 30,000 injured.

The U.S. is disturbed over the growing acceptance of Iraq by many states. Frequent flights to Baghdad, Iraq's agreement with Syria and Egypt on free-trade zones and the Russian initiative to establish dialogue between Iraq and Kuwait and Saudi Arabia were perceived

The forthcoming U.N.-Iraq dialogue and Arab summit are supposed to be constructive for Iraq.

Therefore, the purpose of the aggressor is to tame Iraq and to provoke it to undertake retaliatory measures. Iraq's provocation would only strengthen its enemies.

It is, at this jun.cture, very important for Iraq not to allow itself to be provoked but to concentrate on exposing the fraud of the U.S.-British governments in its case.

reluctantly to the eight-year Clinton era, which the Washington Post, in retrospect, has termed 'ragged,' wild and disorganized.

And that was even before the heavy impact of the Clintons' tasteless — or perhaps typical departure from Washington. America is now in a tizzy about the pardoning of wealthy party donors by the Man from Hope — as if this president, who even stooped to "renting out" the Lincoln bedroom, had ever exercised restraint in these matters during his eight years in office.

There is little to be made of this. Clinton always was the man he showed himself to be at his departure. In now pretending surprise and disappointment,

Democrats in particular are being politically more At the moment, though, the new administration

and its president appear to be the beneficiaries of all this.

By way of contrast, they have had quite a smooth start. Whenever the party controlling the White House changes, the new president faces the task of filling several thousand posts in numerous government departments, and that process is now farther along than it was at the same point eight years ago ..

Just what strategy will be followed by the new American team is quite another matter.

About that there is little more than smoke sig-

nals on the horizon. The Clinton administration was an expression of its time, the first that could be called a true postwar presidency.

Those years marked a turning away from the realities, strategies and attitudes of the cold war, even more than was appreciated at the time.

What is coming now will surely push that process further. Just how far is still a matter for considerable

speculation.

The Daily Telegraph (London) on Feb. 19: What more does Robert Mugabe have to do to jolt the international community into action?

His expulsion of foreign journalists, combined with his repression of the Zimbabwean press, is intended to clear away the last remaining obstacle in the path of totalitarianism.

The Zanu-PF regime has already trampled over the judiciary, traduced property rights, flouted international law and brutalised the democratic oppo-

Now, by silencing the media, Mr Mugabe is making clear that he will not tolerate criticism, let alone opposition.

Journalists must guard against a certain deformation professionelle when writing about other

The travails of newspapermen are plainly less monstrous than the wanton murders which accompanied last year's land seizures. But Mr Mugabe's latest move is most worry-

ing because of what it presages.

It is not an accident that the expulsions should be ordered now.

The president is plainly ready to resort to new levels of thuggery in order to remain in office at the next election and he does not want any witnesses around.

Slow beginning haunted MSU

You could almost see this one coming

The Murray State Racers have had a penchant for falling behind in recent games, and it finally caught up with them on Thursday night.

Two weeks ago, the Racers spotted Eastern Illinois a 15-point first-half lead before rallying to defeat the Panthers 92-77 in a nationally-televised contest.

MSU repeated that pattern last weekend during its two-game road swing through 'Death Valley' allowing Morehead State to build an eight-point first-half advantage before winning 87-76 and then letting Eastern Kentucky enjoy a 40-39 halftime lead before edging the Colonels 86-81.

But on Thursday, the opponent wasn't Morehead or EKU. And the ending wasn't nearly as happy.

Tennessee Tech proved its worth as an Ohio Valley Conference champion, overcoming a hostile environment - a season-high crowd of 7,076 at the Regional Special Events Center — to post leads of 20, 21 and 23 in coasting to an easy 94-71 victory.

It was another night of growing pains for a young and inexperienced Murray State program, which was looking for its 13th OVC crown in the last 14 seasons.

However, it was not to be as a veteran Golden Eagle team taught the Racers a valuable lesson good defense and solid shooting wins championships.

Murray certainly didn't play much defense Thursday night, allowing Tech to shoot 55 percent (32-of-58) from the floor. That total included a 14-of-24 performance from 3-point range, courtesy of a weak Racer zone.

The Racers allowed Tech guard Leigh Gayden to score a career-

high 33 points. The 5-10 sophomore hit 11-of-18 shots and 7-of-12 3-pointers, and he also dished out eight assists.

MSU is certainly capable of playing good defense - as evident by its efforts in the comeback win over Eastern Illinois and in a pair of victories over rival Southeast Missouri State

In their Feb. 10 triumph over EIU, the Racers allowed the Panthers to shoot 50 percent in the first half but limited their visitors to just 38 percent in a second-

Against the Indians on Jan. 11, Murray held their rivals to 42 percent shooting in a 60-58 win. The highlight of the contest was a game-saving block from freshman swingman Cuthbert Victor.

On Feb. 8 at RSEC, the Racers held SEMO to only 34 percent shooting (18-of-53) in posting a 10-point halftime lead and breaking open a close second half to earn a 65-54 victory.

And we all know what this team can do offensively with the scoring of senior forward Isaac Spencer and guards Justin Burdine and Chris Shumate.

Spencer carried the offensive load against the Golden Eagles, posting a double-double with 26 points and 10 rebounds. But the Racers must get better production from both Burdine and Shumate, who have both struggled with their

The MSU program, despite its youthfulness this year, is no stranger to the OVC Tournament, having played in the conference championship game for 11 straight

The trio of Spencer, Burdine and Shumate have all experienced the intensity of tournament basketball, and can provide a calming influence for their younger teammates.

While the Racers have shown spurts of inconsistency on a few occasions, they are more than

capable of reeling off three straight wins. Before Thursday's loss, MSU was on a five-game winning streak.

Even though a regular-season OVC championship was on coach Tevester Anderson's wish list, the loss to Tech may be a blessing in disguise.

First, a humbling loss shows that the Racers are not invincible. Secondly, a three-game winning streak is much easier to maintain than nine in a row, which is what Murray would have had with a win over the Golden Eagles and a tournament title.

Racers want larger crowds

The Murray State athletic department hopes a much-needed scheduling change and increased marketing efforts will translate into better attendance figures for men's basketball in 2001-02.

· Beginning next season, the Racers will return to a more traditional Thursday-Saturday schedule, eliminating Tuesday night home games.

With Tuesday's Ohio Valley Conference Tournament opener, the Racers will have played six of their 12 2000-01 home dates on Tuesday nights - something MSU athletic director E.W. Dennison at least partially blames for the school's sagging attendance figures this year.

"One of the things we had to do was get rid of the Tuesday night games and get back to more Saturday games," Dennison explained "Tuesday nights real-Dennison ly kill us because of high school games ... That's one thing we've been talking to the OVC about, and they've been very cooperative in helping us out.'

According to Dennison, MSU also requested the addition of rivalry games to its Saturday sched-

The Racers played only three Saturday home games this season — Tennessee-Martin, Eastern Kentucky and Eastern Illinois while games with traditional rivals Austin Peay and Southeast Missouri State were played on Tuesday and Thursday, respectively.

"Eastern Illinois and Eastern Kentucky are not rival games for us," Dennison noted. "We've got to get the SEMOs and Austin Peays back on Saturday because that's when we draw our biggest crowds.

Discounting the season-high 7,076 that showed up for Thursday's clash with first-place Tennessee Tech, the Racers' three biggest attendance marks at the Regional Special Events Center this year have come on the three Saturday dates. A Jan. 6 battle with rival Ten-

nessee-Martin drew the second biggest crowd of the season at 6,432. MSU's other Saturday games produced numbers of 5,923 (EKU) and 4,657 (EIU).

"We also asked that there be no OVC games played prior to the first of the year and no (league) games within the first week to 10 days of the year," Dennison said. "That will prevent us from having home games before our students return from the Christmas holidays. And the conference office worked all of that out with us."

Dennison cited three factors Tuesday night games, no rivalry games on Saturdays and bad weather — that have contributed to a decrease in attendance this season

"Our attendance is down, but not drastically," he said. "There are three reasons for that, and we can control two of those."

To aid in its efforts, the athletic department will add the position of attendance manager to its staff later this year.

"We think it's important to have someone who can tie our marketing and promotion efforts together," Dennison said. "We want to make sure that we have a full house for county nights, church nights, cheerleader nights, The goal, Dennison said, is to

increase both basketball and football attendance by 1,000 persons

Earnhardt's belt broken in ROCKINGHAM, N.C. (AP) - Dale Earn-

hardt's lap belt was found to be broken after the crash that killed him near the finish line of the Daytona 500, NASCAR officials said

The 49-year-old Earnhardt might have survived Sunday's crash if the cloth belt had held, a doctor said.


"A broken left lap seat belt came apart," NASCAR president Mike Helton said at a news conference. "We don't know how, when or where, yet. We will continue our investi-

Dr. Steve Bohannon, head of emergency medical services at Daytona International Speedway, speculated that with the broken belt, Earnhardt's body could have been thrown forward and to the right, thrusting him into the steering wheel.

Bohannon, who tried to save Earnhardt's life as the driver sat slumped in the wreckage, said Earnhardt's chin might have hit the steering wheel, causing the major head injury that killed him on impact. A skull fracture ran from the front to the

ribs and left ankle also were broken. "Mr. Earnhardt more than likely contacted the steering wheel with his face," Bohannon

back of Earnhardt's brain. His sternum, eight



"If his restraint system — his belts — had held, he would have had a much better chance

of survival." Earnhardt's seat belt was made by Simpson Safety Products in Mooresville, N.C., said his former crew chief, Larry McReynolds.

The company is a leading manufacturer of safety products for NASCAR. Owner Bill Simpson, a former Indy car driver, did not immediately return a phone call for comment. The Simpson belts have always been fine, never a problem," said McReynolds, who worked with Earnhardt in 1998 when the driver won

the Daytona 500 in his 20th try. Like most drivers at the race Sunday, Earnhardt had shunned the use of the U-shaped HANS device - for Head And Neck Support which many drivers find bulky and uncomfortable. The device fits around the neck and

is attached to the helmet and car frame. "I do support further neck and head restraints. but I'm not convinced the HANS device would have made a difference in this case," Bohan-

Following the NASCAR news conference, Dale Earnhardt Jr. made his first extended public comments since the race, in which he finished second moments after his father crashed.

He will drive in Sunday's race at North Carolina Speedway in a car owned by Dale Earnhardt Inc.

"I miss my father and I cried for him out of my own selfish pity," he said. "We just have to remember he's in a better place that we all want to be."

Prince leads Wildcat surge

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) - Kentucky point guard Saul Smith hasn't grabbed many rebounds during the Wildcats' eight-game winning streak. And he knows why.

"It's Tayshaun's fault," Smith begins with a smirk. "He hasn't missed a shot in about a month.

"When he puts it up, I just throw my arms in the air and head back downcourt. I haven't gone to the boards in weeks.'


Smith winks as he finishes his statement, knowing he's exaggerating a bit — but only a bit.

Over his last eight games, Tayshaun Prince almost singlehandedly has transformed the Wildcats (18-11, 11-2 Southeastern Conference) into one of the hottest teams in the nation.

The 6-foot-9, 215-pound junior swingman from Compton, Calif., is averaging better than 23 points and six rebounds during the streak, hitting 58 percent from the field and nearly 50 percent from behind the 3-point line.

"The way I've been playing lately has been great," said Prince, who had 16 points, five rebounds and five assists in Kentucky's 84-61 victory over LSU on Wednesday. "I can't really explain it other than I'm getting good shots and they're falling."

His teammates have taken to calling him "Mr. Clutch." He beat No. 8 Florida with a crafty little jump hook from the foul line with 3.3 seconds remaining and nailed six of seven 3-pointers en route

The Racers, who competed solely in air rifle at last year's NÇAA Championships, earned the trip to Columbus with team scores of 4,618 in smallbore and 1,535 at the NCAA Sectionals Feb. 9-11 at MSU's Pat Spurgin Rifle Range.

Shooting for Murray State in smallbore will be seniors Crystal Kern and Ann Proctor, junior Jill Livesay and freshman Morgan

Hicks also qualified as one of 15 shooters to compete for the individual smallbore national championship. Her score of 1,165 was 12th-best in the country this year.

Junior J.T. Hearn will join Kern, Proctor and Hicks on the air rifle squad that won the Ohio Valley Conference air rifle crown in January at Cookeville, Tenn.

Predictions of rainfall, waters correct

FISHING LINE

So far, our predictions about the increased rainfall and the rising waters of Kentucky Lake, Lake Barkley and the Ohio, Cumberland and the mighty Mississippi rivers have been correct.

This past week, the twin lakes have etc. risen six feet to a full summer pool stage, and the rivers below the dams are up 25.

The temperatures have also climbed to near 50 degrees, but a massive cold front is coming this way and could change our local weather dramatically and keep the temperatures down.

Of course, there is lots of stained and, in some areas, even muddy water coming through, which will affect the fishes feeding!

The crappie were coming on strong in the areas of Big Sandy, Cypress Creek, Blood River, Jonathan Creek, Little River, Devil's Elbow, Craven's bay, Eddy Creek, Donelson's Creek,

Minnows and jigs fished along the deeper sides of the ledges and old creek channels were taking some very good black and white crappie.

As you might suspect, the deeper waters of Kentucky Lake held the fish suspended most of the time in schools between 14 and 17 feet. Of course, there were plenty of them deeper, but they didn't always bite as well as the shallow ones.

The news of the big Pendleton County buck that could rank as the largest whitetail taken in the world for the 2000-01 season will certainly have Kentucky's sportsmen hitting the woods early and staying late come fall.

And if there isn't enough home-grown orange to go around, expect an influx of out-of-state hunters combing the thickets for one of those big Ken-

But before any sportsmen hit the Commonwealth's woods or waters this year, they will have to embark on a buck-hunt of a different sort - not the antlered type but the green type.

Yeseiree, when you belly-up to the license counter this year, be prepared to dig way back into your wallet for that little stash of cash you've been keeping for emergencies.

The good news is that license fees have been stable for the past few years. The bad news is that they broke out of the trend this year with modest increases across the board.

Most fees have increased by \$2.50, with the exception of the Husband/Wife Joint Fishing License that swelled by \$4 (there's that marriage penalty again).

To help alleviate the shock of the higher fees, KDFWR rolled out a new "Sportsman" license this year that in one fell-swoop covers hunting, fishing, deer hunting, spring turkey hunting, waterfowl hunting and trout fishing. (trout fishing?)

The package license is available for \$80, a savings of \$7.50 over the same permits purchased separately. Unless you plan to do a lot of trout fishing in Clark's River, however, it's cheaper by \$2.50 to buy the permits separately.

Hunting and fishing licenses are \$15 each, up from \$12.50 last year. The combination license also jumped \$2.50 to \$22.50. Junior hunting permits will be \$8.75 this year (they ought to give those away). Then you'll need a turkey tag - spring only - for \$20, a deer tag for \$25 and a waterfowl permit for \$10 (or a migratory bird permit if you hunt doves but not waterfowl, \$5).

See, that's not so bad. Of course, if you plan to hunt turkeys in the fall, you'll need a fall turkey permit, \$15. That's just for firearms - to hunt with stick-and-string will take another \$15. Then if you want to do any trapping, that's \$17.50. Bonus deer permits are \$12.50, unless it's a quota hunt. Then it will be \$15.

And that's just the beginning. Want to hunt the LBL? That'll be \$20. Peabody WMA? Another \$12.50. How about entering the elk lottery - \$10. Can you see a pattern emerging here?

The Lord giveth but the state taketh away. If you even think about doing something commercial - like selling minnows, guiding folks on hunting and fishing trips or stuffing dead animals - be prepared for the state to turn your

pockets wrongside-out and to look under the cushions of your couch. Of course, this is not all bad. The KDFWR is funded solely by license fees and matching funds from the federal government, plus a fine or two here

The reason sportsmen bear the entire burden of funding is a matter of control. As long as the funding comes from the user-fee revenue, the users (Kentucky sportsmen) will have control of the program.

Opening the funding to general tax revenue could give control of wildlife

programs to groups hostile to hunting and fishing.

You know, we could be a little tougher on the non-residents. Out-of-state hunters will have to fork over \$115 for a Kentucky license, plus a deer/turkey tag. In Tennessee, non-residents are charged \$156 for a big-game license.

Alabama will clip me for a cool \$250 this year, but will reduce it to \$125 if I promise to leave after 10 days. It looks like we might be a little cheap compared to some of our neighbors.

Kentucky's always been a revenue-hungry state. But at least the KDFWR has something to show for our tithe. We now have elk bulgling in the mountains, turkeys roosting in every woodlot, deer in every backyard, coyotes around every corner and a raccoon in my chimney - I guess you have to take a little bad with the good.

Anyway, your cheap licenses and permits expire next Wednesday, Feb. 28. Although there won't be much to hunt, if you want to fish next Thursday you had better be scraping up those extra bucks.

Otherwise, Mr. Conservation Officer will further enrich the State's coffers at the expense of your forgetfulness. Like my old first grade teacher always said, "You can lead a horse to water, but if you can get people to pay to watch him drink, then you've got something!" Let's hunt those bucks!



DR. GOTT

DEAR DR. GOTT: Because of chronic pain, I'm trying to find out about self-administered nerve blocks. How many hours of relief do the shots give? Where can I obtain the necessary equipment? What do you think of

DEAR READER: Forget it. Nerve blocks are tricky and, unless per-formed by an M.D. who is familiar with the technique, can result in nerve damage, infection or other serious consequences.

Nerve blocks for chronic pain are useful in determining whether the pain can be relieved by deadening a particular nerve. That is, the doctor injects an anesthetic around the nerve and, if the pain disappears, surgeons then consider severing the nerve to relieve the pain permanently. This practice differs from injecting a substance near a nerve for temporary local anesthesia. Thus, nerve blocks help doctors to learn whether more permanent therapy would be appropriate. Ask your doctor to refer you to a specialist, such as an anesthesiologist, who can advise you. But don't attempt nerve blocks on your own.

DEAR DR. GOTT: How safe is dung from horses and cows when it is used as fertilizer? Can disease be transmitted to humans via air, handling or consumption of plant products grown in the substance?

DEAR READER: Animal waste makes excellent fertilizer; it is organic, biodegradable, widely available and inexpensive. In some parts of the world, dung is burned as fuel, used to build dwellings and made into poultices to treat skin diseases.

By and large, the handling of animal waste is harmless to humans. Problems may arise, however, when the animals have internal parasites or infections; these conditions can, in unusual circumstances, be passed to humans. Psittacosis, for example, is a form of avian pneumonia that can be

spread to people who inhale dust from dry, infected bird droppings. Also, tapeworm and roundworm eggs can be transmitted from animal feces by contamination of hands, food and other objects.

Food products fertilized with dung are not affected by parasites or infec-tions in the waste. Growing plants use phosphorus, nitrogen and nutrients; the other components are returned to

DEAR DR. GOTT: My friend was recently diagnosed with liver cancer.


What is the prognosis? DEAR READER: This is a bad one.

Liver cancer is difficult to treat because it is usually an aggressive malignancy that affects a vital organ and is ordinarily not discovered early. Chemotherapy, with or without radiation, may help control pain and slow the growth of the tumor. But I'm afraid the outlook is far from encouraging.

On the positive side, my answer thus far is based on the supposition that your friend has primary liver cancer. The liver is often the site of metastases (spread of malignant cells) from cancers elsewhere in the body. This is called secondary liver cancer; the prognosis varies, depending on the type of cancer and the extent of the spread.

Liver metastases from a colon cancer, for example, often shrink and even disappear during chemotherapy for the primary tumor. Therefore, although the chance for cure may be slim, the eventual outlook depends on the type of cancer, its extent and how well your friend tolerates therapy.





Greenspan blamed for economy by Bunning

HENDERSON, Ky. (AP) -U.S. Sen. Jim Bunning blames Federal Reserve Chairman Alan Greenspan for the current economic stagnation of the country.

Bunning said Thursday in a speech at the Henderson Chamber of Commerce that Greenspan is "really great when interest rates are going up. He raises interest rates better than anyone I've met. But he's terrible when the statistical data tells him to lower interest

Much of Bunning's speech was aimed at building support for President Bush's recent initiatives, specifically the \$1.6 trillion tax cut over the next decade.

Bunning, a Republican, said the tax cut, which includes abolition of the estate tax and the marriage penalty, is not geared primarily for the rich. Although they would receive larger savings than the less welloff, he said.

Bunning also praised Bush's education and military plans.
