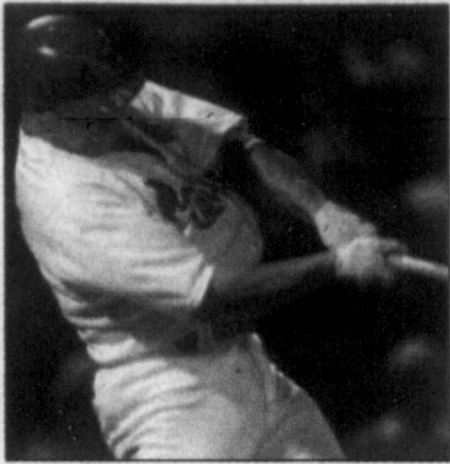

Murray, Calloway County receive label as 'Community of Promise'

With all the new businesses in the area, it may be no surprise that Murray has been named a "Community of Promise."
But the program isn't referring to commerce or industry. Community of Promise, a national program sponsored by the United Way and U.S. Secretary of State Colin Powell, mainly focuses on the community's youth.
"Basically, we're giving every child an opportunity to succeed," said Peggy Billington, director of the local United Way and co-chair of Murray's chapter of Community of Promise.
Billington said the program is based around the "Five Promises," which strive to build America's youth through caring adults, safe places, healthy start, marketable skills, and opportunities to serve.
"We're promising those Five Promises," Billington said. "We will do the things for the community."
Sherri Holbrook and Billington found that Murray

is ripe and ready to be a "Promise" community.
"We found that we were doing a majority of it," said co-chair Holbrook.
She said many organizations in the community already fulfill those promises, but the "Community of Promise" unites all of these organizations into one goal.

The main focus in Calloway County's program is to empower youth and give them some direction.

Murray man faces September hearing

PARIS, Tenn. — A Murray man will face a Sept. 18 hearing in Henry County, Tenn., on several charges including aggravated rape and assault.
Bobby Wayne Bills, 35, no address listed, was arrested Wednesday at the Henry County Jail, according to a report in Thursday's *Paris Post-Intelligencer*. In addition to aggravated rape and assault, he was also charged with aggravated burglary, criminal impersonation, vandalism, burglary and four counts of violation of the check law.
Bills allegedly broke into the home of a former girlfriend and started a fight with her and her boyfriend. Bills left the residence after the fight, but returned after the woman's boyfriend went to work.
Bills then allegedly impersonated a police officer to gain entry into the residence. Once inside, he allegedly assaulted the woman and attempted to rape her. A kitchen knife was allegedly used in the attack.
Bills was released on \$25,000 bond and appeared in General Sessions Court Thursday to schedule

Lt. Gov. airs concerns over Medicare, ambulances

Ambulance service and Medicare were two issues that drew the ire of Lt. Gov. Steve Henry this week.
Henry met with officials at Murray-Calloway County Hospital Tuesday to discuss the state of Medicare in Kentucky and how it relates to ambulance service.
"Medicare is not paying for a service that is deemed a medical necessity by a physician," said Kent Johnson, business office manager for Murray-Calloway County Hospital. "That puts a financial burden on the beneficiaries and the taxpayers."
Johnson said the problem arises when a patient who is bedridden or unable to ride in a car according to a doctor's orders, is transported to the hospital in an ambulance during an emergency situation. If the patient's injury is not directly related to their inability to be transported, Medicare does not pay the bill.

"Patients are being told that they (Medicare) cover these services and they do not," the lieutenant governor, himself a doctor, said Tuesday during a stop in Murray.
Johnson said that the hospital has around 35 percent of all their ambulance claims turned down by the AdminiStar Corporation.
Medicare will pay up to \$275 plus \$5 per mile for an emergency transport, and \$140 plus \$5 per mile for a transport such as taking a bedridden patient back to the nursing home. Johnson said this is what the hospital charges Medicare patients for these services.
However, when the bills are not paid or when requests for more information ties up the reimbursement process, it is up to the hospital to foot the bill.
And the bills can get steep.
"Currently, (there are) outstanding claims in excess of \$100,000."

Documents: Wilson paid no federal taxes since 1991

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — Former Gov. Wallace Wilkinson hasn't paid any federal income taxes since at least 1991, according to documents filed in U.S. Bankruptcy Court by his creditors.
Wilkinson reported losses ranging from \$2.5 million to \$32.5 million each year between 1992 and 1999, the documents show.
The income tax figures were compiled by creditors based on copies of Wilkinson's tax returns they received recently from Wilkinson's accountants.
Robert J. Brown, Wilkinson's attorney, said Friday the former governor paid no income taxes because he planned to sell his

companies through a public stock offering and wanted to make their profits appear as high as possible.
To do that, Brown said Wilkinson shifted the cost of interest on loans obtained by his companies to his private tax returns.
The interest shifts wiped out his personal tax liability and removed the cost of interest from the books of his companies, most notably Wallace's Bookstores.
"He did not want his companies to show interest expense losses," Brown said.
Figures compiled by his creditors show that Wilkinson listed from \$11.2 million to \$117 million a year in interest on his tax returns during the 1992-99 period.

Wilkinson's attorneys have been fighting unsuccessfully in bankruptcy court to prevent the documents from being made public. They say their release would violate the privacy of Wilkinson and his wife, Martha, who file joint returns.
Martha Wilkinson is not in bankruptcy.
Wilkinson, 59, entered Chapter 11 bankruptcy in February, declaring debts of \$418.4 million.
He has said he borrowed huge sums for Wallace's college textbook purchases, and those loans make up most of his debt.
While Wilkinson paid no personal taxes, his companies paid higher taxes because their profits were greater, Brown said.

The net effect was that Wilkinson and his companies paid the same or more in taxes than if Wilkinson had not made the interest shift, Brown said.
Outside accountants concluded Wilkinson's strategy was completely legal, Brown said.
But Wilkinson's financial collapse occurred before he could sell his companies.
Two companies, Wallace's and ecampus.com, also sought bankruptcy protection this year. Wallace's has largely been liquidated, and ecampus was sold to one of its leading shareholders and continues to operate.
Friday's tax filing was part of a proposed

plan to be heard by the court on Sept. 14.
In general, the plan calls for most of Wilkinson's assets to be placed in a trust run by the creditors until the assets can be sold to pay at least part of his debts.
As of July 31, the creditors said Wilkinson's debts totaled \$431.3 million. They estimated that his assets — largely real estate, and office and apartment buildings — were worth only \$26.5 million.
The total includes \$4.9 million in assets that are co-owned by Martha Wilkinson, including Wilkinson Farms in Mercer County, the couple's homes in Lexington and Florida, and several cars and trucks.

Governor criticizes Leeper

PADUCAH, Ky. (AP) — State Sen. Bob Leeper of Paducah betrayed his constituents and the state two years ago when he switched from the Democratic Party to become a Republican, Gov. Paul Patton said Friday.

The party switch, which gave Republicans control of the Senate, has caused havoc in state government because of Republicans' unwillingness to cooperate and compromise, Patton said during a labor luncheon leading up to the Fancy Farm picnic this weekend.

"The focus of the Senate today is to stop the governor from doing anything," Patton said. "We need to sit down and work out solutions we can live with."

"People need to realize you don't always get your way. The voters expect that body (the Senate) to work with the governor and the House to get things done."

Republicans hold a 20-18 advantage in the Senate.

Patton urged labor and Democratic leaders to find a credible candidate to run against Leeper next year.

Patton apparently has done some recruiting on his own by urging former state Rep. Rex Smith of Paducah to enter the race. The Paducah Sun reported in a story to be published Saturday.

Smith told The Sun he has "more than just a passing interest" in the

race but is in no hurry to make a decision.

Leeper, who was not at the luncheon, declined comment Friday. In the past, he said he switched parties for philosophical reasons and because of the way he was treated by then-Senate President Larry Saunders, D-Louisville.

Bush picks U.S. attorneys for state

WASHINGTON (AP) — Steve Pence, who prosecuted a former Kentucky House speaker and others caught in a legislative corruption scandal in 1992, was nominated Friday by President Bush to be U.S. attorney for western Kentucky.

Bush also nominated Greg Van Tatenhove, a congressional staffer and former Justice Department trial attorney, as U.S. attorney for eastern Kentucky.

Bush followed the recommendation of Kentucky's two U.S. senators — Republican's Mitch McConnell and Jim Bunning. The nominations must be approved by the Senate.

Pence, who has been a criminal defense lawyer in Louisville, would replace interim U.S. attorney Monica Wheatley, who succeeded Clinton appointee Steven Reed.

Before entering private practice, Pence was an assistant U.S. attorney who became a familiar figure during the long-running Operation Boprot, an undercover corruption probe that centered on the Kentucky General Assembly.

Pence was involved in prosecuting more than a dozen public officials, including former Speaker Don Blandford, a Democrat, and one-time Senate minority leader John Rogers, a Republican. Both went to prison.

Pence also worked as a judge advocate in the Army.

Pence called his nomination a privilege. He declined to discuss the job in detail until after the confirmation process but said it was "one of the most honorable things you can do."

U.S. Rep. Anne Northup, R-Ky., praised Pence's abilities.

"I think he will be a strong candidate and will be just so good in that role," said Northup, of Louisville. "He is so trustworthy. He is so committed to doing the right thing, to serving his community."

Both Pence and Van Tatenhove are law graduates of the University of Kentucky.

UK law professor William Fortune said Pence's background in the courtroom was more typical of a U.S. attorney than that of Van Tatenhove, who is chief of staff to U.S. Rep. Ron Lewis, R-2nd District.

"I think it just makes sense ordinarily to appoint someone who is a career prosecutor and has dealt with law enforcement folks, but that's not always going to be the determining factor obviously," Fortune said. He added that Van Tatenhove's political and managerial skills also would be useful.

"I think his experience, his varied experience, is good for the judiciary," Northup said.

Van Tatenhove once was an aide to McConnell. In addition, he served as a law clerk for Eugene Siler Jr. when Siler was a U.S. District Court judge. Siler is now a judge of the 6th U.S. Circuit Court of Appeals.

"I'm very excited to return home," said Van Tatenhove, who grew up in Wilmore, Ky.

Johnson said, Johnson said the \$100,000 worth of claims are over 30 days old, and will eventually trickle back down to the community if not paid.

Because the hospital owns its ambulance service, the effects of the denied claims are not as easily seen as those in rural areas, or areas where ambulance services are privately owned. Johnson said these areas could be in danger of losing their ambulance service if bills are not paid, especially if the bulk of their transports are Medicare patients.

"Other ambulance service departments are feeling a bigger pinch than we are," Johnson said.

Henry said this problem is not just in Calloway County, but all over western Kentucky. "It's not just this county, but every county in this area," he said.

Henry called for a plan of action at Tuesday's meeting, asking the hospital to document the denied claims. He said he would seek help from U.S. Rep. Ed Whitfield (R-Ky.).

"You all need to be a squeaking wheel," the lieutenant governor said.

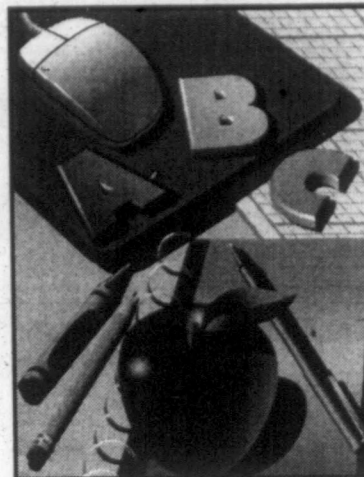

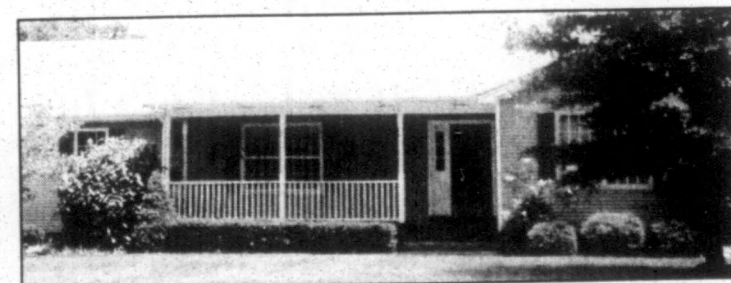

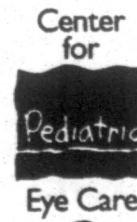

Seniors benefits



Some of the most popular government programs are ones that provide benefits aimed at helping senior citizens remain healthy, secure and independent. Yet each year, billions of dollars worth of government benefits aren't claimed by eligible seniors.

Part of the reason these benefits aren't claimed is because getting information on them is too often a tedious — even frustrating — process. Many seniors must contact numerous government agencies and navigate a maze of bureaucracy just to learn about the benefits available and whether they qualify.

Fortunately, that's about to get much easier now that the National Council on the Aging has unveiled a new service called Benefits Check-Up. The groundbreaking service gives seniors a simple, one-stop source for information on the state and federal assistance programs that could improve the quality of their lives.

The new service is absolutely free for anyone who has Internet access. Family and friends can also use the service to get information on the benefits their loved ones may qualify for.

Here's how it works: Visitors to the Benefits Check-Up site spend 10 to 15 minutes filling out an online form. The form asks questions about a seniors' age, expenses, and income. All the information remains confidential. The form doesn't ask for names, social security numbers, or any other information that could be used to identify a person.

Once the information is entered, Benefits Check-Up searches more than 1,000 programs in a national database to match up seniors with the benefits they may qualify for.

Though people can't apply for programs through Benefits Check-Up, the service provides a list of the phone numbers and contact information for any programs people are eligible for.

No matter what their income, many seniors who use this service will be surprised to learn about the benefits they qualify for. Possible benefits identified by Benefits Check-Up may include veterans' benefits, free telecommunications equipment for the deaf and blind, nutrition programs, employment opportunities, job training, opportunities for volunteer work, weatherization assistance, housing assistance, and help with utility bills.

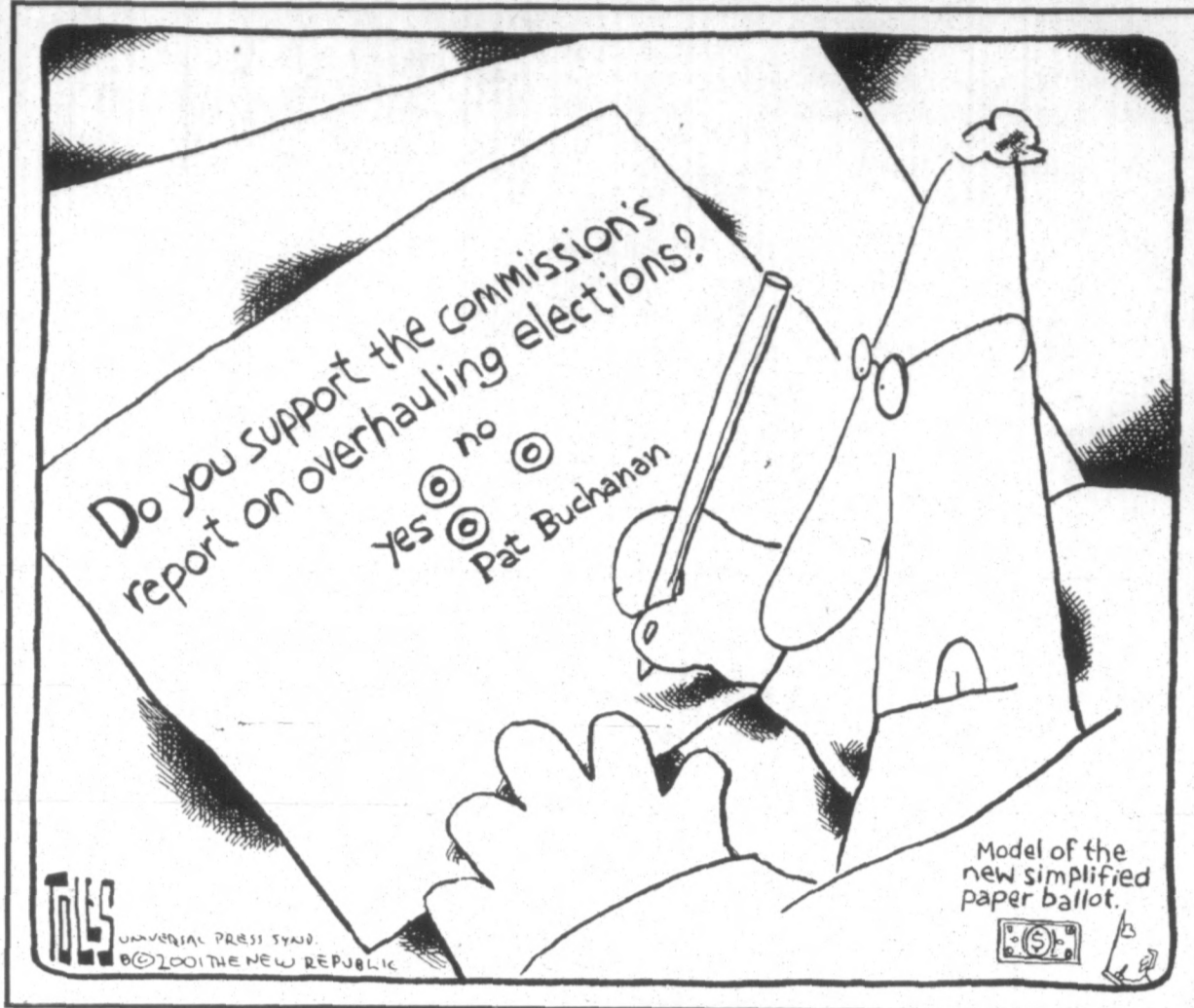

Could tobacco be vessel for growing stem cells?

OWENSBORO, Ky. (AP) — Could the much maligned tobacco plant be used to help cancer patients?

A California biotech company says it can, and it has set up shop in tobacco country to prove it.

Large Scale Biology of Vacaville, Calif., has built a commercial "biopharmaceutical production facility" in this Ohio River community of 54,000. It is one of a handful of companies harnessing plants to produce useful human proteins.

Genetic engineers already use many different plays to manufacture human proteins, such as insulin and growth hormones. Often, they isolate a human gene that carries the code for making a protein and splice it into yeast or bacteria, which multiply in fermentation vats. Other methods include putting genes into cancer cells, which grow endlessly in lab cultures, or into farm animals, which make the proteins in their milk.

Now, companies are doing the same thing by the acre. They hope molecular farming, as some call it, will be cheaper and more efficient.

"We borrow the plant's cellular machinery," said Barry Bratcher, Large Scale Biology's bio-manufacturing director. "The plant is just a host for us."

Tobacco is a big bulky plant that produces lots of greenery, and it is one scientists have already had plenty of practice genetically manipulating in the lab.

Large Scale Biology has contracts with four local farmers to grow a combined 27 acres of tobacco for research. Tobacco is also grown in the company's five greenhouses in Owensboro.

"It is ironic that tobacco might actually be used to create health instead of reducing health," said chief executive officer Bob Erwin.

Already, the company has begun early stage testing of a tobacco-produced vaccine intended to trigger the body's immune system to fight non-Hodgkin's lymphoma. Each dose would be a customized protein, made by mutant genes taken from the patient's own cancer cells. In theory, the proteins should stimulate the body to turn against the cancer.

If the vaccine works, the company says it will produce a plant that can make 15,000 individual doses a year.

The company also is considering human testing of a treatment for Fabry's disease. The therapy is a tobacco-made copy of a normal human enzyme, needed to break down fats, that is missing in victims of the disease.

In earlier stages is a collaboration with the U.S. Navy and the National Institutes of Health to use tobacco to make stem cells grow. The goal is to find a natural human protein that will multiply blood-forming stem cells that have been isolated

from the bone marrow.

Stem cells are the source of all human tissue. Those taken from early stage embryos can grow into any cell in the body, and they will divide forever in test tubes. However, because they are derived from embryos discarded during in vitro fertilization, many people believe their use is unethical.

Adults also have stem cells. Even though they can be isolated from the brain and other organs, they are difficult to grow on demand.

A team of Navy and NIH researchers, led by Dr. John Chute, is attempting to produce a protein that will make blood stem cells divide repeatedly in a test tube. They already have evidence that the body makes such a protein. The collaboration with Large Scale Biology is intended to find the gene responsible so it can be manufactured in quantity.

Chute said the protein could be extremely useful for conducting gene therapy to correct inherited blood diseases, such as sickle cell anemia.

The idea: Isolate a few of the exceedingly rare stem cells from the victim's marrow, then use the protein to produce many more copies of them. This will leave doctors with enough stem cells to attempt gene therapy, replacing the disease-causing genes with healthy copies. The repaired stem cells would be returned to repopulate the patient's marrow.

The work could also have wartime applications. Radiation and chemical weapons can destroy the bone marrow, leaving only a few stem cells. On their own, these cells may reproduce too slowly to prevent death. But victims might be rescued by removing some of the remaining cells, building them up in a lab dish, and then returning them to restore the marrow.

Dr. Larry Goldstein, professor of cellular and molecular education at the University of California, San Diego, cautioned that such research is difficult.

"I hope they'll be successful, but I think it's unrealistic to expect rapid success," Goldstein said. "Lots of companies and labs have been working on this for years and it's a painstaking slow process to do this sort of thing."

However, Erwin said his company hopes to manufacture the stem cell factor soon using tobacco plants in Owensboro. "We would like to get the gene identified in the next year and start clinical trials with the product in two years," he said.

Earlier this year, several members of Congress wrote a letter to President Bush praising Large Scale Biology's research because it does not use embryonic stem cells.

"I'm pleased to present an ethical alternative that is less morally problematic and is producing fantastic results," U.S. Rep. Ron Lewis, R-Ky., said during a recent subcommittee hearing.

Southern Seen

Women of the word



If asked a month ago for the living women public figures I most admire, I would have replied, "Eudora Welty and Katherine Graham". I would have been hard-put to think so immediately of others.

If asked a month ago to name two living women Pulitzer Prize winners, I would have replied, "Eudora Welty and Katherine Graham".

I would have been hard-put to think so immediately of others.

And now, in one of those delicious ironies that make American history so delectable, the two have died within a few July days of one another.

At 84, Mrs. Graham was the younger of the two. Daughter of publisher Eugene Meyers, she took over the reins of the Washington Post Company upon the death by suicide of its publisher, Phillip Graham. She overcame her natural shyness to become a world figure of importance, bringing to the *Washington Post* and *Newsweek* fearless news editors (such as Ben Bradlee) and writers (such as Carl Bernstein and Robert Woodward) and astute business personnel, forging an empire under her leadership that took the company into the Forbes 500 rankings. Her most memorable exploits included the Watergate stories and the Pentagon Papers stories.

Fiercely independent (although many GOP people persist in thinking the *Post* and *Newsweek* are liberal Democrat organs), Mrs. Graham was capable of throwing dinner parties for both incoming presidents Bill Clinton and George W. Bush, and despite her stands on Watergate and Viet Nam, took Henry Kissinger to the movies and stayed in touch with Lyndon Johnson.

Her autobiography, *Personal History*, to her surprise, won a Pulitzer Prize for Nonfiction in 1998. The famous black-and-white attire ball thrown by the late Truman Capote years ago was in Mrs. Graham's honor.

Eudora Welty, who died at 92, is best remembered for her short stories, although rightfully she ought to be remembered for her novels and photography as well. Her collected works probably would take only a quarter of the shelf space of fellow Mississippian William Faulkner's works, but in quality they matched his as literature. Where Faulkner tended to the convoluted and symbolic and gothic side of things, Welty emphasized translation of keen-eyed observations into language.

Unmarried, Welty left us enduring offspring: *A Curtain of Green and Other Stories*, *The Robber Bridegroom*, *The Wide Net and Other Stories*, *Delta Wedding*, *The Golden Apples*, *The Ponder Heart*, *The Bride of the Innisfallen*, *Losing Battles*, and *The Optimist's Daughter*, as well as *One Writer's Beginnings* and three photograph collections.

I saw Welty only once, about 1980, paddling down an airport corridor in Knoxville, pulling her wheeled luggage behind her. She was even more strikingly southern in person than in her photos, but I respected her privacy and resisted the urge to ask for autographs and conversation. It was my loss. Dozens of others made pilgrimages to Jackson, Miss., and she bore their visits graciously, and she was a revered and desired participant at countless southern writer symposia and book festivals and in almost every American literature anthology.

Only a few months ago, as if sensing her inevitable death as imminent, I read Vanderbilt professor Michael Kreyling's helpful synopses and analyses of her work: *Understanding Eudora Welty* (University of South Carolina Press, 1999, 262 pp., \$29.95), and also Miss Welty's final work, a collection of WPA-era photographs she made in the 1930's and 1940's of Mississippi cemeteries and churches, *Country Churchyards* (University Press of Mississippi, 2000, 111 pp., \$35.00). Welty once said that tombstones were the only (visual) art available in Mississippi, and she learned much from them. It seems fitting for her final book to be photos of graveyards, which began her career and which figure into her fiction.

Graham and Welty, in their separate venues and ways, elevated courage and appreciation of language and of reporting what was to be seen.

Asked this month to name living public women I most admire, or living women Pulitzer Prize winners, I am hard-put to name any one at all. They are our loss.

Katherine Graham and Eudora Welty have left public space vacuums difficult to fill, but have left also filled hearts that will be slow in forgetting and steadfast in saluting them among great women of the 20th century.

College students should learn credit card responsibility

By the time teens or adults enter college, they've generally learned how to successfully tackle a term paper, solve an equation and discuss such topics as capitalism. Nonetheless, statistics suggest that most college students would deserve low marks if they were being graded on how well they manage debt.

Consider the following:

- While students often must borrow money to complete a college education, credit cards are a far more costly form of debt than traditional student loans.

- According to figures recently released by Nellie Mae, a student loan agency, 78 percent of undergraduates

have credit cards. Within this group, the average balance was \$2,748, an amount that was over and above whatever loan debt these students carried. For the average undergraduate, the loan debt carried to finance a college education is estimated at \$14,000 to \$16,000.

- Half of all college students with credit cards pay late fees, and seven percent have had at least one credit card revoked.

"Many young people going off to college find credit card applications very tempting," says Victoria Jacobson, vice president and director of education, Consumer Credit Counseling Service-St. Louis.

"Anyone 18 or older can legally sign up for a credit card without parental permission. This means that he or she also assumes the responsibility of repayment as well as the risks associated with misuse of credit."

Jacobson offers the following credit-wise tips to college students and their parents:

- Discuss how credit cards work, how finance charges are computed and the consequences of credit card misuse. Analyze credit card advertising and applications, carefully reviewing the credit terms, including grace periods, annual fees and annual percentage rates. Teach your college student how to read the fine print.

After his rocky first inning, Andy Benes worked five hitless innings. He gave up four runs on five hits in 6 1-3 innings.

Morris (13-7) contributed to the comeback in the first game with a two-run single in a three-run third. Kerry Robinson also drove in a run in the second, and his squeeze bunt off Brad Penny (7-6) in the fourth made it a one-run game.

In the fifth, an RBI single by J.D. Drew tied it and Edgar Renteria's run-scoring groundout gave St. Louis the lead.

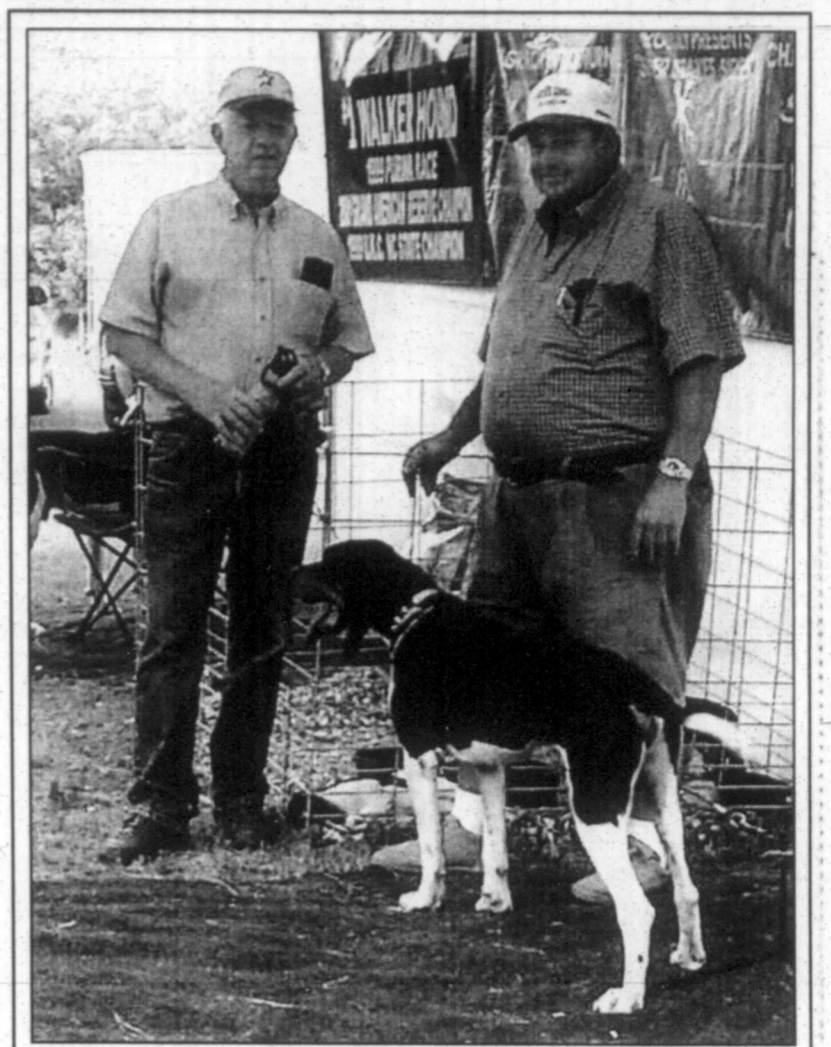

OVC Media Day

Racers picked to finish fourth

NASHVILLE, Tenn. — Like most head coaches, Joe Pannunzio takes a philosophical approach to preseason polls.

"It really doesn't matter to me where we're picked in the preseason," said the second-year Murray State head coach, whose Racers were picked to finish fourth in the Ohio Valley Conference in 2001 by league coaches and sports information directors at Friday's Media Day activities. "I'll be comfortable at the end of the year when we finish No. 1."

Judging by offensive talent alone, Pannunzio's lofty goals don't seem that far-fetched.

Leading a stable of seven returning starters is sophomore quarterback Stewart Childress, who exceeded all of the Racers' expectations a year ago by throwing for 2,928 yards and tossing 20 touchdown passes on his way to second team All-OVC honors as a freshman.

Re-joining Childress in the backfield will be junior tailback Garner Byars, whose switch from defense (linebacker) to offense paid dividends with 788 yards and 6 TD on the ground while racking up 244 yards on 22 catches and 2 TD through the air. That production also earned him second team league recognition.

Also returning are first team All-OVC wide receiver Michael Slater (43 catches, 819 yards, 7 TD), tight end Josh McKeel and three of five offensive linemen — junior center Josh Foster, junior guard Cameron Martin and junior tackle Clint Parker.

That's not to mention in-coming junior college transfers Kory Chapman and Desmond Collins, who are expected to make immediate impacts at the tailback and receiver positions, respectively.

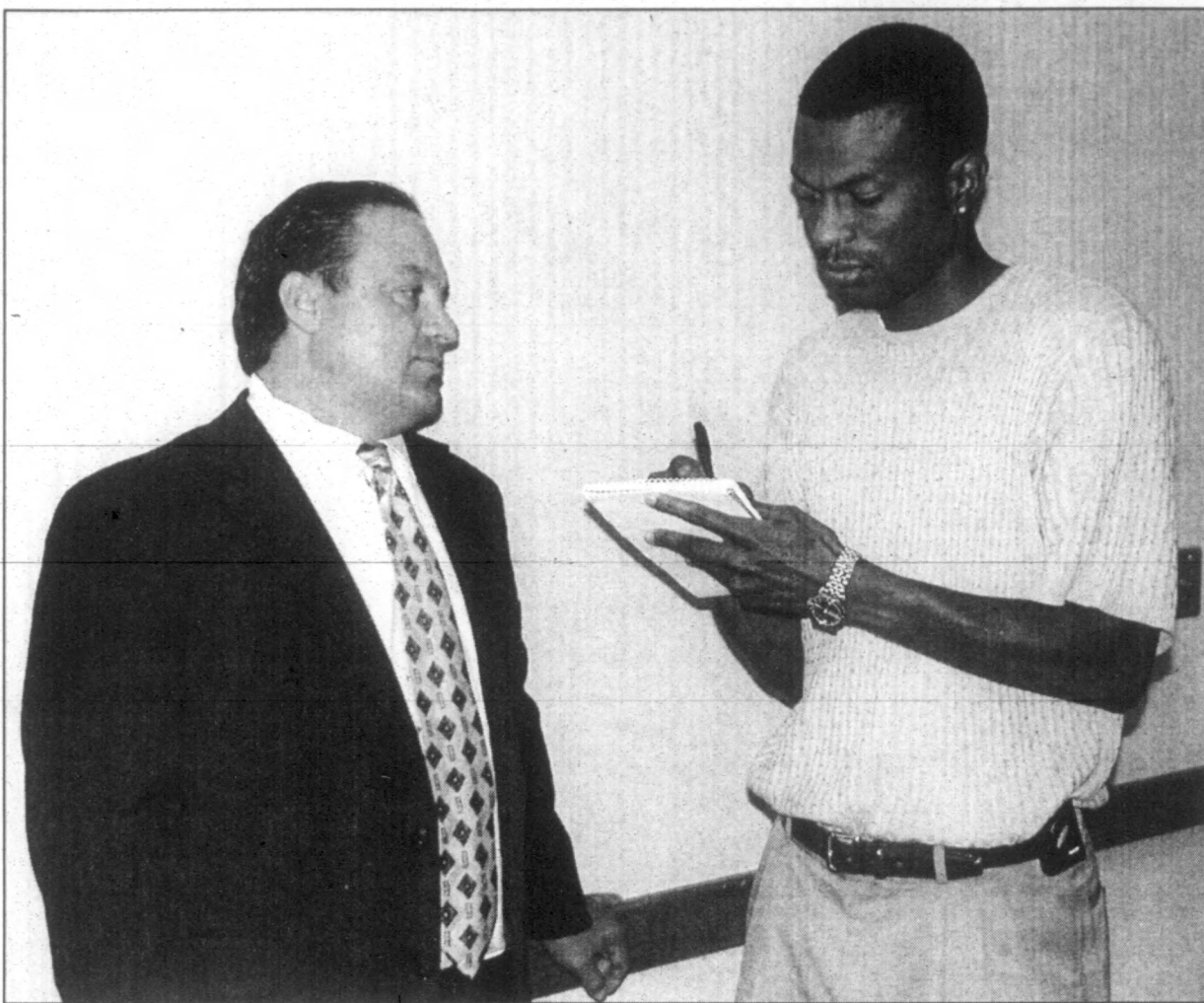
"I feel very good about what we have on offense," Pannunzio noted. "Where we have to get better is on the defensive side of the ball. We have to have some guys to step up over there."

If the Racers expect to make up ground on preseason favorite Eastern Illinois, they will have to overcome the loss of seven defensive starters.

Returning to a unit that allowed an average of 426 yards per game are junior tackle James Bridges, senior cornerback Cornelius Denman, senior linebacker Zelbert Johnson and senior end Chad Lamb.

Seniors Aaron Manningham, Ed Johnson and Jeremy Davis — who missed significant time last season to a "broken arm" — will also have to play key roles if the Racers are expected to conquer the high-flying Panthers, led by junior quarterback Tony Romo, who threw for 2,583 yards and 27 TD in earning OVC Offensive Player of the Year honors during the 2000 campaign.

nial league powerhouse Eastern Kentucky are all ranked ahead of the Racers in the preseason poll. Tennessee State, Southeast Missouri and Tennessee-Martin round out the seven-team field.

Colonel head coach Roy Kidd — just one win shy of his 300th career victory entering his 38th year at EKV — was surprised that his squad, which finished an uncharacteristic 6-5 last fall, was selected ahead of rival Murray.

"Based on our reputation, I can

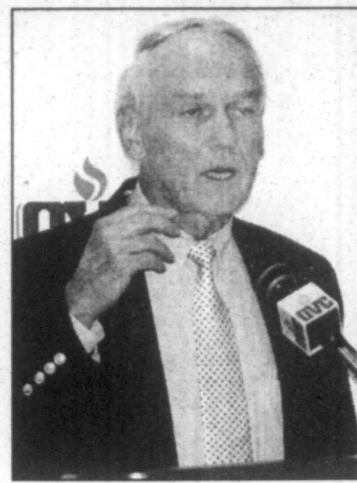
see why we're ranked high," Kidd said. "But we didn't have a very good year last year, and there are some very good football teams in this conference."

"It's just like I tell my players all the time — you'd better be ready to play every week because everybody's pointing at Eastern Kentucky as the team they want to beat," he added.

Tennessee Tech, who was picked to finish in second place, will bring its always-tough defense to

the table in 2001. In addition, the Golden Eagles return 10 offensive starters, but must find a replacement for departed quarterback Grant Swallows.

"You feel good about the type of team you have until you get here (to media day) and see how good all of the other teams are going to be," Pannunzio explained. "I think there are a lot of good teams in this league, and they're all about evenly matched. It's going to come down to who stays healthy."

League Notes

KIDD STUFF: Eastern Kentucky head coach Roy Kidd begins his 38th season at the helm of the Colonels just one win shy of becoming the seventh coach in NCAA Division I-AA and I-AA history to collect 300 coaching victories. Kidd, whose record stands at 299-117-8, would join Eddie Robinson, Bear Bryant, Pop Warner, Amos Alonzo Stagg, Joe Paterno and Bobby Bowden as coaches with 300 career victories.

SWEET SUCCESS: OVC teams were 18-14 in non-league games last season, with six of the losses coming to Division I-AA foes. Against I-AA teams, the OVC posted an 11-8 mark, with four of the setbacks coming by three points or less.

AIRING IT OUT: The OVC welcomes back two of the top young quarterbacks in Division I-AA in Eastern Illinois junior Tony Romo and Murray State sophomore Stewart Childress. Romo was selected as the OVC Offensive Player of the Year after passing for 2,583 yards and tying a league record with 27 TD passes. He ranked second in I-AA pass efficiency and threw at least one TD pass in every game. Childress threw for the third-most yards (2,928) and had the third-most completions (230) in OVC history last season. He passed for 200 or more yards in nine of the Racers' 11 games and earned second team All-OVC honors.

EKV STREAKING: Eastern Kentucky kicks off the 2001 campaign looking to continue one of the most impressive streaks in college football. Under the leadership of head coach Roy Kidd, the Colonels have registered 23 consecutive winning seasons, and haven't had a losing record since 1972 (28 seasons). Along with their regular-season success, EKV has made the I-AA playoffs a record 17 times.

RECORD PURSUIT: Tennessee Tech senior kicker David Collett enters the 2001 season with 41 career field goals, which is just 11 shy of the OVC record of 52 held by Middle Tennessee's Kelly Porter (1981-84). Collett has booted at least 11 field goals in each of his first three seasons. He also has 194 career points and needs just five more to become the Golden Eagles' all-time leading scorer.

WELCOME MAT: The OVC welcomed its two newest members Friday, officially introducing Jacksonville State and Samford, boosting its football membership to nine. The two schools begin league play in 2003.

Fishing Line

Anglers should be aware of heat



The heat wave is upon us now, so use caution when you go out boating or fishing. Take plenty of water and some soft drinks to replace the fluids you lose through perspiration. I don't care how tough you think you are, fluids are essential to your well-being. It's easier to have extra rather than not enough.

The water temperature is now holding a steady 84-85 degrees overnight and it rises to 87-88 during the day.

Naturally, most anglers try to get that first light advantage when it is cooler for a short time. The next shift will be in the late afternoons until dark, and it can be as good as the mornings.

Since we are coming into a full moon, there will be several night anglers after the bass, strippers and catfish until dawn.

There may be even some more willow fly hatches to help tease the fish into feeding. There are a million good places to fish during the night, but an awful lot of folks prefer to be around the bridges. I guess some look for safety in numbers.

Live bait is used by most, but fish will also bite the hair jigs and beetles.

For most anglers, the depth is decided by dropping your baits to the bottom and then slowly reeling them up until a strike occurs. Be sure to take plenty of ice in your coolers because your fish will die and spoil in a live well very quickly.

Shiner minnows seem to be the best live bait for strippers, but the catfish will also take the worms or nightcrawlers. Sauger and crappie will feed at night, so you can possibly do quite well if there isn't a problem with the wind.

I had a very good day last week when I fished with Jan Roberson and her brothers, Thomas and William Clapp. We were looking for the white strippers to break the surface and give us some hot action to stretch our string.

Much of the early hour was spent looking for a decent congregation of strippers to tempt. Instead, we had to settle for the decent-sized to small yellow stripes that were willing to strike our lures.

Jan, Tommy and Bill all caught some big gaspergous on the stripe spoons, and we had some good fun trying to land them on light tackle.

These people could fish before, but there's a few tricks to learn about how to work a spoon when the bite is slow. It didn't take many casts until everyone had a rhythm going. The fish helped by beginning a major move.

We caught these four gaspergous between 10 and 16 pounds, crappie a shade over 2 1/2 pounds, sauger just under the size limit, largemouth bass undersize and some white stripes that were nearly two pounds.

We had a cooler stocked with yellow strippers, and there were three or four times when someone would set a hook on a big fish that was leaving town and did.

There just wasn't any way that we could hang on to the big speedsters. They took so much line so fast that the hooks simply pulled out.

We were using a good brand that has hooks. Those hooks are supposed to give instead of the line breaking. They worked well and it left us in awe each time.

Tommy had the back, Bill the center

and Jan worked the front to perfection. We could have taken a limit of larger fish, but they were late turning on to feed.

One of the main keys to getting these white demons to strike is a flashy lure, or have a lot of white on it and retrieve it very swiftly.

Don't use large swivels or snaps because

these can be seen and will stop a strike before it happens. Try to stay with the silver, good brand, snaps and swivels. You will take more fish that way.

The waters on both lakes are very clear at this time as we enter the "dog days" of summer. But we will overcome this.

Try to work your favorite areas from a distance rather than sitting on top of the fish. If you have a school move under you, drop straight down and work the baits up to draw a strike.

Usually you can take a few fish out of a school before they move away. Don't panic when they leave. They, or some just like them, will be back. You are in the right place, so take some time to fish the area properly.

If you see fish breaking the surface close by, go to them with the trolling motor and not the big engine. They will spook easy.

The shad baitfish are already swimming for their lives, so don't run up with a big 20-foot shadow and a loud roaring engine. You will eventually learn that you can catch more this way!

Our best topwater time is yet to come, so hang in there.

Many thanks to Jan, Tommy and Bill. We must do it again under better conditions so you can demonstrate our fishing expertise a little more.

These folks are good anglers and they take it seriously, so we must get another trip together soon!

Local sportsman Edwards wins elk lottery



Last Saturday at the Elk Festival in Hazard, a local sportsman made history by being one of 12 hunters selected to participate in Kentucky's first elk season in over 150 years.

Robert Allen Edwards of Hardin was drawn for the final tag, which will allow him to take a cow elk during the December portion of the hunt.

Out of 9,235 applications, 10 tags — four bull and six cow — were drawn under the watchful eye of the State Auditor's office by children recruited from the crowds.

Two additional tags were donated to organizations involved in elk restoration, such as the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation for use in fund-raising activities. The RMEF tag reportedly brought more than \$30,000 at their annual banquet.

Edwards, an active hunter who owns Hardin Sporting Goods, didn't realize he had been drawn until he saw his name in the local newspaper.

"I saw that somebody from Hardin had drawn a tag and thought 'that lucky devil,'" Edwards said. "Then when I read the article, I saw it was my name that was drawn."

Allen still wasn't sure, however, that he was "the" Robert Edwards listed in the paper until he called the Department of Fish and Wildlife in Frankfort. After confirming his application number, the woman at KDFWR transferred his call to Jon Gasset, head of the restoration project.

"This guy was just as excited as I was," Allen said. "He kept talking about this begin the first elk hunt in Kentucky in over 150 years.

It's a really big deal to them."

That Allen or anyone else would be allowed to hunt elk in Kentucky is nothing short of phenomenal. The elk restoration project is only in its third year, and the relocation of elk from their native range in the western states is still underway, leading many to question the timing of this first hunt.

Both the KDFWR and the RMEF, however, believe it is crucial to establish hunting seasons for elk as soon as possible, based on the experience of states such as Pennsylvania.

Elk were relocated to Pennsylvania several years ago for the purpose of establishing a huntable herd. Because hunting opportunities were postponed to give the herd a chance to grow, residents began to consider the elk a novelty much like captive zoo animals.

As a result, an arduous battle ensued that pitted sportsmen and the wildlife department against a segment of the population that were opposed to hunting the elk.

After several years of wrangling and mounting damage claims from the unchecked elk herd, the Pennsylvania legislature finally adopted a measure that would allow controlled hunting of the state's elk. By establishing the elk hunts early in the restoration process, the KDFWR hopes to avoid a similar fiasco.

Of the 10 tags drawn at the festival, all went to state residents. Participants will be required to attend an orientation meeting with the KDFWR before the hunt, and will be accompanied on the hunt by department personnel. In addition, the hunter may also designate a couple of people to join the hunting party.

At present, Edwards plans to take one of his sons, Josh or Jason

(depending on school schedules), along to video the hunt. He is also considering auctioning the second slot at the local RMEF banquet to raise money for the foundation.

Edwards is no stranger to elk hunting. In 10 years of hunting out west, he has taken two bulls. "Right now, this cow tag means more to me than any of those bulls," he said.

After taking elk with both rifle and muzzleloader, Edwards plans to use a bow and arrow on the upcoming hunt.

"Thirteen years ago when we started the local RMEF chapter, I said, 'If we stay with this, someday our children will be able to hunt elk right here in Kentucky.' Little did I know that thirteen years later, I would be one of the first people to hunt Kentucky elk in over 150 years!"

It's a dream come true, not only for Allen Edwards, but for all of Kentucky's sportsmen — thanks to the efforts of the KDFWR, RMEF and other groups, businesses and individuals who have worked hard in support of the elk restoration program. These initial hunts will be truly historic, not only for Kentucky but for sportsmen everywhere.

NOTE: The 2001 banquet of the local chapter of the Rocky Mountain Elk Foundation will be August 11 at the Executive Inn, Paducah.

Doors open at 5:30 p.m. and dinner will be at 7. There will be great prizes including guns and elk memorabilia, and an auction for loads of donated and hunting-related merchandise.

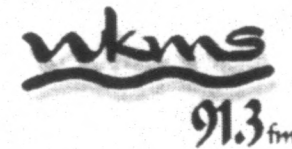
