# Minger suit against housing director reportedly settled

A settlement has apparently been reached in a federal lawsuit filed by the mother of a MSU student who died in a 1998 dormitory fire against current Murray State University Housing Director David Wilson.

A clerk with United States District Court in Paducah said Friday that the settlement had been reached this week, but could not discuss its terms. Paperwork on the settle-

ment could be available by Monday.

Gail Minger, the mother of Michael Minger, originally filed a suit in federal court against Wilson and former MSU director of public safety Joe Green. Wilson was MSU's associate director of housing when Michael

Minger was killed. That suit was dismissed in U.S. District Court in 1999, but was reinstated in February 2001 with Wilson as the lone defendant.

Gail Minger's attorney, Charles L. Cunningham of Louisville, was unavailable for comment Friday afternoon, as was Wilson. A spokesperson for MSU President Dr. F. King Alexander said that all questions concerning the suit were to be directed to university legal counsel John Rall.

Rall said that he was also unable to officially divulge the terms of the settlement. "We have not gotten all the paperwork finalized yet," he said. "I hope everyone's pleased with the way it worked out."

Gail Minger said in a telephone interview, though, that she was preparing a written statement to respond to the settlement ruling.

"I've been pretty upset about this for the past three days," she said Friday.

Michael Minger died of smoke inhalation in a dormitory fire in MSU's Hester Hall in September 1998. The fire was later ruled to be an arson.

Murder and arson charges were eventually brought against Jerry Wayne Walker, a former MSU student who lived in the dormitory at the time the fire occurred. Walker was never convicted on either charge.

## Search area to increase for missing plane

The Civil Air Patrol is increasing its search area for Earl Witte and Clem Anderson this weekend.

A week ago today, the two Paducah residents were flying from Short Creek Field in McKinnon, Tenn., to West Kentucky Air Park near Paducah, but never reached their destination.

The Civil Air Patrol has been camped at Murray-Calloway County Airport for the past week for airborne searches while ground crews and the U.S. Coast Guard have been busy searching land and water.

Capt. Kevin Fosberg with the Kentucky Civil Air Patrol said there

would be 10 aircraft searching the area this weekend. That search area has spread north and west of Paducah, east of Lake Barkley and south of McKinnon.

"When you first start a search, you concentrate on the area of flight," Fosberg said. "We've got an extensive search area."

"The area is very dense with trees which made our probability of detection very low," he added. "The weather should help us."

Today's weather forecast calls for sunny skies.

Along with the 10 aircraft, Calloway County Search and Rescue, Calloway County Fire-

## Calloway girl has ear for music, eye on national event

The reality television series "COPS" is probably not something that comes to mind when one thinks of places musical careers began, but for Murray's Kailey Stone, the reggae sound of the group Inner Circle and their infectious theme song, "Bad Boys," wound up causing a fever.

She could not get it out of her system as a 6-year-old, singing every word just about everywhere she went day or night. Now, six years later, the small rash that started with that tune — now you can't get it out of your head, can you? — has become a full-fledged musical outbreak.

With an ear for all types of music, Stone has become proficient with several instruments, including the banjo, with which she is one half of a western Kentucky teenage duo that took a grand championship in last month's American Kids Talent Search competition in Midwestern musical mecca, Branson, Mo.

"I've only been playing [the banjo] for 1 1/2 years, so I really didn't see myself doing something

like this," said Stone, who teamed with Cadiz musician Austin Hopson on their version of "Dueling Banjos." "We had been going to the same teacher [in Cadiz], and the guy taught him one part [on guitar] one week, then taught me on the banjo another week, and finally he said, 'OK, why don't you try it together.'"

That was more than a year ago and the teenagers clearly perfected the piece. Their performance reportedly whipped Branson's Majestic Theater into a frenzy as they not only won the crowd over with their talent but, most importantly, the judges.

"Here was the weird thing. We went over there cold turkey," said Hopson, noting that "Dueling Banjos" was the only thing they really knew they would be playing. "Other than that, we didn't know what to do."

Their win last month means Stone, who has eyes on joining the Calloway County Middle School band, and Hopson automatically are invited back to the Majestic in July for the American Kids National Finals and can use the same formula

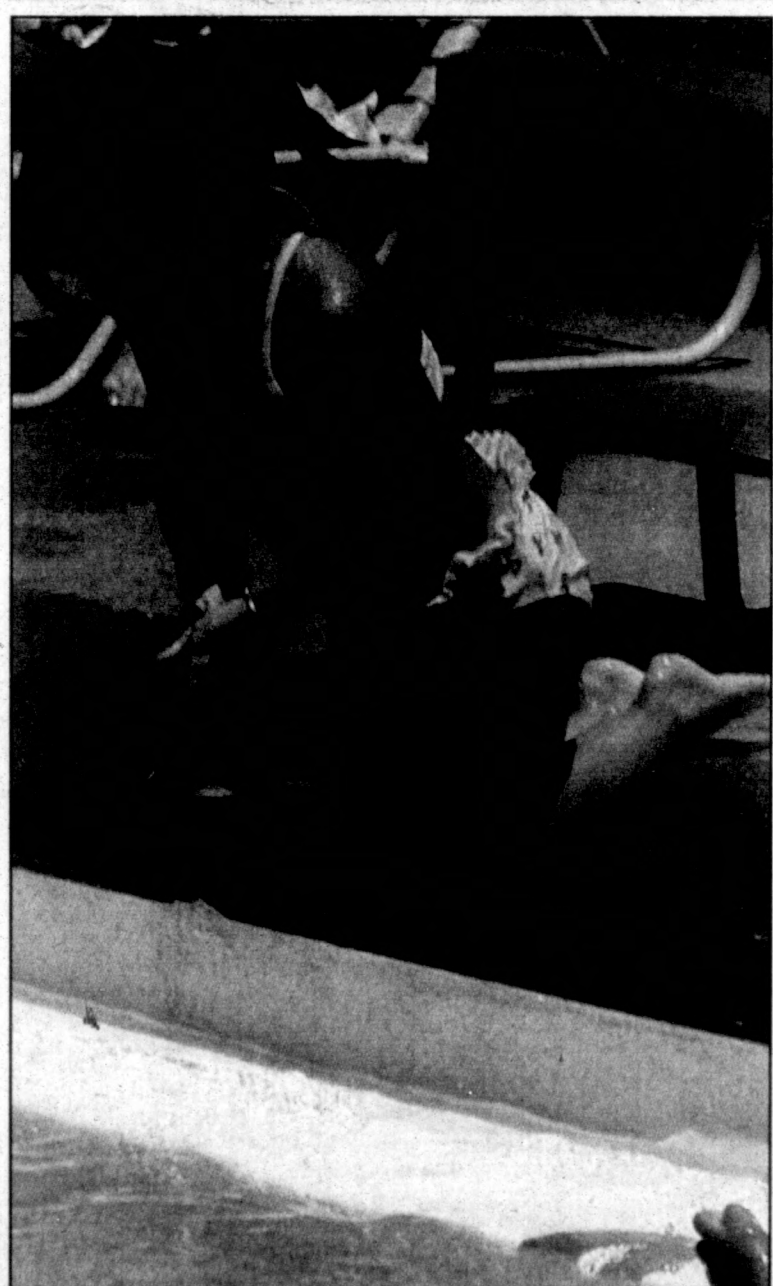
la that produced so much success the first time.

However, Stone was getting that chance anyway. She also won two silver medals in other categories; one from her banjo rendition of "Goin' Up Cripple Creek" and the Patsy Cline classic "Walking After

Midnight," which she accompanied herself with a guitar.

"She really doesn't have any favorite style of music. She'll listen to anything," said her mother, Sandra. "Country was not the only

# Court-martial recommended for Akbar

FORT KNOX, Ky. (AP) — An investigating officer Friday recommended the court-martial of a soldier charged in the grenade attack that killed two officers in Kuwait and traumatized troops days before they were to move into Iraq.

Evidence shows Sgt. Hasan Akbar had ample time to get the grenades used in the attack against the 101st Airborne, and that Akbar's rifle killed one of the two officers who died, said Col. Patrick Reinert at an Article 32 hearing. Fourteen soldiers also were wounded in the March 23 attack.

"There are reasonable grounds to believe the accused committed the offensive charges," Reinert said.

"This was a surprise attack executed by stealth."

Reinert said an injury on Akbar's leg after the attack linked him to the attack scene, as did a fingerprint on a light generator outside one of the three tents attacked.

Akbar's attorney said in closing arguments that no eyewitnesses placed the soldier at the scene, and that soldiers on the ground unduly assumed he committed the crime because he is Muslim.

"Nobody, not one witness, can say they saw Sgt. Akbar throw a grenade or fire a weapon," Lt. Col. Victor Hansen argued.

Reinert's recommendation will go to Akbar's battalion commander, Lt. Col. Peter DeLuca of the 326th Engineer Battalion, and eventually to Maj. Gen. David Petraeus, commanding general of the 101st.

Maj. Trey Cate, 101st spokesman, said he does not know when DeLuca — who is in Iraq — would make a decision.

The brutal and chaotic attack in the early days of the war in Iraq shocked soldiers and their loved ones at home, and was made even more jarring by the fact that one of their own was accused.

Capt. Harper Cook, an attorney for the prosecution, said Akbar stole seven grenades from a Humvee he was guarding, then an hour later walked to the brigade operations area to attack his comrades in the three tents.

"He selected the weapons, he pulled the pins, he threw the

grenades and he shot Maj. (Kenneth) Romaine with his rifle," Cook said. Romaine was wounded in both hands and his left thigh by a gunshot in the attack, he testified.

Cook said evidence shows Akbar's weapon was used to kill Capt. Army Capt. Christopher Scott Seifert, 27, of Easton, Pa. Air Force Maj. Gregory Stone, 40, of Boise, Idaho, also was killed.

Cook also said Akbar was injured in his leg during the attack, but chose not to seek treatment because he wanted to blend in with other soldiers.

His attack plan "was well-thought out and executed with military precision," Cook said.

Hansen pointed out that two different soldiers testified they told investigators that Akbar was not the man they saw shoot Seifert. One witness said he saw a second shot fired that he thought came from a second shooter.

Hansen said the probe was tainted when Col. Ben 'Hodges, the brigade commander, told the arriving investigator that a soldier had confessed to the crime because he said American soldiers were going to rape and kill Muslims in Iraq.

Hansen said soldiers on the ground were too quick to assume that Akbar committed the crime because he is Muslim and that Hodges was not a criminal investigator and should not have been making assumptions.

"The Muslim portion is important," Hansen said, adding, after

that, "that's the theory they ran with."

"Now we'll never know" what really happened, Hansen said.

Hodges testified by video teleconference from Mosul, Iraq, on Thursday that two Kuwaiti interpreters were detained immediately after the attack, but soon he received word that Akbar and grenades he had been guarding could not be accounted for.

"By the time the sun's coming up, I was pretty well convinced it was one of our soldiers," said Hodges, who suffered shrapnel wounds in his arm in the attack.

Akbar, 32, did not testify. He could face the death penalty if convicted at a court-martial.

It is the first time since the Vietnam War that a U.S. Army soldier has been prosecuted for the murder or attempted murder of another soldier during a period of war, the Army said.

Lt. Col. Tim Marsano, spokesman for the Idaho National Guard, said they are looking forward to justice being served in the case and they have confidence that will happen as the case moves forward. Stone was a member of the Idaho National Guard.

"For us, in the Idaho National Guard it's an open sore for us and we'd like to see the whole issue resolved," Marsano said.

Frank Lenzi, Stone's half brother, said his family declined to comment on the case.

## Runaway train cars derail, fling lumber onto homes

COMMERCE, Calif. (AP) — A line of train cars broke loose in a switching yard and rolled more than 30 miles before workers derailed them to avoid a potential disaster in Los Angeles, launching tons of lumber onto trackside homes but causing only a handful of injuries.

Railroad workers diverted the 31 cars onto a side track at noon after they had raced nearly 30 miles at speeds sometimes topping 70 mph. At least 11 derailed, unleashing a blizzard of wood, newsprint and fiberboard that destroyed two homes and damaged

two others.

"That was the last chance we felt we had to derail them before they went into downtown Los Angeles," Union Pacific Railroad spokesman John Bromley said.

Firefighters sent three children and three adults to hospitals for treatment of minor injuries. Seven other people were treated for minor injuries at the scene, authorities said.

The train cars were derailed in the largely industrial community about 30 minutes after they got loose at a switching yard in Montclair and began rolling down-

hill.

"We saw the train demolishing and splintering the house. You saw the power lines going down, the sparks. I was in shock," said Jason Mendez, 34.

"It sounded like a plane crash combined with an earthquake," he said.

Rescue workers searched the wreckage into the evening, and cranes were to be brought in to remove debris, taking care should someone still be under the rubble. About 20 homes remained evacuated, but no one was believed to be missing.

thing the kids were doing. In fact, the girl that Kaylie was buddied up with was from California and did 'Man of LaMacha.'"

The "Bad Boys" days, says Sandra, were just the first sign something musically special was happening with her daughter. When the Stone family took a vacation to Nashville, Tenn., to visit now-defunct Opryland, young Kaylie was not all that interested in things like the Tennessee Waltz or the Floom Zoom.

"Mike Snyder ... Mike Snyder," that's all she would talk about," remembered Sandra of her daughter being enamored with the renowned

"There were always musicians on my mother's side of the family," she added, "so it's easy to where all this is coming from."

Rescue, Henry County, Tenn., Rescue Squad and Coast Guard Auxiliary, as well as local residents who have rented boats and operators, will all be searching the water near Paris Landing with sonar, underwater camera equipment, and divers. though, as a jury in June 2001 deadlocked 10-2 in favor of acquittal. The charges against Walker were eventually dropped, and no one else has been charged for the incident.

Gail Minger has contended that she notified MSU housing officials of several disabilities her son had, including attention-deficit disorder, dyslexia and perception/spatial disorientation that could put him at risk in the instance of an emergency situation, such as a fire.

She claims MSU officials refused to give Michael a housing exemption that would allow him to live somewhere other than the university's dormitories during his freshman and sophomore years, which is the university's housing policy for most first- and second-year students.

A similar suit against the university is slated for trial in Calloway County Circuit Court for Nov. 12.

# The wait is over: Harry Potter hits the shelves

NEW YORK (AP) — Just after midnight, fantasy became reality for Harry Potter fans as bookstores in the East rang up the first official U.S. sales of "Harry Potter and the Order of the Phoenix."

Anticipation had been building to near unbearable levels for the fifth installment in the Potter series, as author J.K. Rowling took three years to complete it.

The book had already gone on sale hours earlier Saturday in Britain and elsewhere in the English-speaking world.

"I love it so much I get goosebumps," said 12-year-old Lisa

Brummett of Mesa, Ariz., after hours of waiting at the WH Smith bookstore at London's King's Cross rail station to buy the thick new book.

"Harry Potter is the most magic thing there is," Lisa said, clutching the book to her chest and grinning from ear to ear. "Once I get out of here, I will start reading."

"It's kind of nice to escape to a place a bit more magical," said her sister, Stephanie, 16, looking forward to the 768-page British edition, the longest yet in the tales of Harry and his pals at Hogwarts School of Witchcraft and Wizardry. (The

American edition runs 870 pages, but has the same content.)

The girls' family had rescheduled their two-week tour of Europe to be in London for the launch.

Rowling, looking relaxed and happy, paid a visit to a Waterstone's bookshop in her home town of Edinburgh, Scotland, and gave out signed copies of her book to 40 school children.

"Much of the pleasure of being published for me is meeting the children who are reading the books," she said.

Paying homage to its King's Cross location, the WH Smith store

re-created the gateway to Platform 9 3/4, where Harry, Ron and Hermione catch the magical Hogwarts Express to school.

Throughout the United States, stores held parties and children dressed in Harry Potter costumes to celebrate the book's release.

Aspiring young wizards visiting a Barnes & Noble bookstore in Henderson, Nev., received a pair of Harry Potter glasses and were placed under the famed Sorting Hat to determine which house they belong to at Hogwarts.

At a Borders in Chicago, young-

sters made owl puppets and got their faces painted as they awaited the midnight hour.

With the help of other downtown merchants, the Learned Owl Book Shop in Hudson, Ohio, converted Main Street into Diagon Alley, with each store having a Harry Potter theme and activities for children. And an employee at Curious George Goes to Wordsworth children's bookstore in Cambridge, Mass., made chocolate frogs for book-buying youngsters.

The twists and turns in the book's plot were guarded closely by the

British publisher, Bloomsbury. Rowling insisted on preserving her surprises for readers. She did reveal that one of the central figures dies in the book, but said she has not even told her husband who the doomed character is.

Yet leaks occurred. A store in Fishers, Ind., and a New York health food store were among those that mistakenly put copies out for sale. The Daily News in New York City, which bought a copy and published a preview, is now facing a \$100 million lawsuit from Rowling and her publishers.

## Pimento cheese stories

Listening to South Carolina historian Walter Edgar's public radio talk show on a recent Friday, I longed for a phone-in number.

Edgar, while interviewing someone who has done research on where the best pimento burgers are around the South, kept insisting that pimento burgers began right there in Columbia. I felt his evidence was provincial and poor, and I wanted to correct him.

Originating pimento burgers is a distinction that could be claimed by any fast food place that ever served pimento cheese sandwiches and hamburgers.

When I was a carhop in 1950, making \$1.50 a night plus tips and a meal, I often smeared a thick topping of pimento cheese on an otherwise pedestrian hamburger. We can speculate without much danger of contradiction that similar mergers occurred in hundreds of home kitchens and drive-in restaurants.

Pimento cheese is one of those major southern distinguishing institutions, right up there as a subject for ferocious debate with religion, politics, barbecue, biscuits, gravy, mint juleps and the proper age and curing of country hams.

Before she gave up her kitchen, my mother made pimento cheese regularly, and her former minister would drive all the way from Indianapolis to west Tennessee to eat it.

My mother makes her pimento cheese with a block of American cheese, but my wife uses Velveeta. Most purists would feel they are both wrong and that pimento cheese can only be made with sharp cheddar or "rat cheese." Some pimento preparers blend cheddar and one or more other cheeses.

Other debates focus on what brand of mayonnaise to use (or whether to make your own), whether to drain the pimientos and leave the juice, whether to mix the concoction with utensils or with your hands or feed it through a meat grinder, whether to add sugar or how much, whether to throw in olives or jalapeños, whether to use chopped pimientos or whole or sliced ones and how many to use, whether to add milk or cream cheese or lemon juice or salt or Tabasco or onions or garlic — or Worcestershire sauce (as Elvis did).

There are even debates about how to spell it or pronounce it. Most recipes and menus call it pimento cheese, but technically it is made with pimiento peppers. Pimiento is Spanish for pepper.

Upper-class consumers spread it on celery stalks or gourmet crackers and call it "puh-mintah," but most folks mumble it and call it "p'min-nah."

In America, Georgia is the biggest producer. According to the Southern Foodways Alliance (based at Ole Miss, and one of my favorite organizations), prepared pimento cheese was available in southern groceries as far back as 1915, and in 1916 George Reigel of Pomona Products Company started canning Sunshine Pimentos in Griffin, Ga., which spread to kitchens everywhere.

Perhaps they serve pimento cheese sandwiches at the Masters Tournament in Augusta because of that Georgia connection. We bet there are more pimientos grown in Georgia than peaches, and that as long as they are redesigning their state flag there, they might as well change their slogan from "The Peach State" to "The Pimento State."

There is very good news this month for southerners tired of debating the multitudinous varieties of barbecue. We can turn our attention for the summer to pimento cheese. (It sure beats being consumed by debates on the economy.)

Southern Foodways Alliance, the Southeast Dairy Association, and Web site [www.ilovecheese.com](http://www.ilovecheese.com) are teaming up to collect pimento cheese recipes and memories. Their enticing announcement includes these instructions:

"Tell us about how your mother always hand-grated her cheese. Let the world know about how your father's homemade mayonnaise made all the difference. Tell us a story of 100 or so words about what pimento cheese has meant to you and your people. Include a recipe, and please detail the recipe's provenance."

"E-mail submissions to [sfmail@olemiss.edu](mailto:sfmail@olemiss.edu) are preferred. Deadline for entries is July 31. Three finalists will be announced on Aug. 31. The winner will receive a free trip to the Southern Foodways Symposium, to be held Oct. 2-5 in Oxford, Miss. ... a monster jar of pimentos and a wheel of delicious sharp cheddar ... (and) chef Louis Osteen of Louis's at Pawley's will feature their recipe on his menu for the month of November. Questions should be directed to the Southern Foodways Alliance at (662) 915-5993."

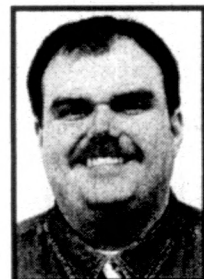

## Puzzled by Patton

Gov. Paul Patton's actions Wednesday were both a slap in the face of Kentucky Democrats as well as a nod to the GOP's super-serious run for Frankfort this November.

Not only did Patton, who has been pulling the trigger of his own political demise, grant pardons for three buddies, along with Andrew "Skipper" Martin, Patton's chief of staff, for breaking campaign laws during his 1995 run for the governor's office, but followed up by announcing that he plans to commute the sentence of a convicted killer who 22 years ago robbed, raped and shot in the face and head a single mother with a then 11-month old daughter for, according to the Associated Press, "\$143 in cash, 300 cartons of cigarettes and two gallons of gas."

Apparently since Patton has no more credibility left in the Democratic party than Fox News Channel and knows his legacy as governor certainly will not be the same as that at the beginning of his term when he was focused on education reform and economic improvement, there's no need for anyone else to either, especially those in line to face a full slate of Republicans in the 2003 General Election.

While one of those includes Patton's former right hand person Crit Luallen, who is running for the

office of state auditor, the big buck in Patton's crosshairs is Ben Chandler, the commonwealth's attorney general and Democratic gubernatorial pick for November against Republican Ernie Fletcher.

Chandler, who as we all know is the grandson of former Gov. A.B. "Happy" Chandler, has been at odds with Patton from time to time with matters pertaining to Kentucky's budget [or in some cases lack thereof] and Patton's extramarital affair with Tina Conner, who once owned a western Kentucky nursing home.

Chandler called for Patton's resignation Wednesday after the pardon announcement, saying that the governor "has again betrayed the trust and confidence of the people of Kentucky." Patton swiped back at Chandler by saying that the attorney general is on a career-boasting "political crusade" to put him behind bars.

Chandler is aiming at the highest office in the Commonwealth — a job most state Democrats feel that he has been grooming himself for — and Patton is messing things up for him.

Patton said the matter with Martin and labor liaison Danny Ross and Teamsters Lon Fields and Robert Winstead should have been handled by the next attorney general, not Chandler. But even Greg Stumbo, the House Majority Leader and Democratic AG candidate, isn't buying the moves Patton's been making. In fact, he's been wanting Patton to sign the death warrant for Kevin Stanford, the man who may have his sentence commuted.

I can't believe for a second that Patton has no idea of how his actions — all of his actions — are

affecting the state's Democratic party, but he is a man without a country. He can't run for a third term for governor [not that he'd have a chance at winning] and he ditched his effort at a run against the U.S. Senate seat held by Jim Bunning, a Republican, after he admitted to the affair with Conner.

There hasn't been much love for Patton in the state's Democratic strongholds. A huge pep rally in Frankfort Thursday kicked off the run toward November for the Democrats with the party pledging a change from previous ways. Even new party chairwoman State Rep. Susan Westrom mentioned that Patton was an embarrassment.

I suppose Patton's feeling is why help those who won't offer any support to him.

Perhaps Patton has a bit of a

Clinton complex — referring to the former President Bill; not in the town of the same name, which ironically ...

Clinton, for some strange reason, remains a solid figure in the national political picture. But that's the national scene, where Clinton can jet out to California and be at one with the liberal masses. In Kentucky, where most Democrats have strong, Conservative roots, Patton is going to be left blowing in the breeze like laundry hung out to dry.

Some have suggested that this latest controversy just highlights how Patton and Chandler and others in the Democratic party are on opposite ends. Others may just lump them all into one big barrel. It will be interesting to see the overall effect come this November.

## Another Opinion

The following is an editorial published by *The Floyd County Times* in Prestonsburg, and provided by the Associated Press. This editorial is not to be mistaken as representing a position taken by The Associated Press or the Murray Ledger & Times:

One of the silliest ideas we've come across lately was announced recently, during a ceremony to tear down toll-booths on the Daniel Boone Parkway. State transportation officials chose the occasion to change the name of the highway to the "Hal Rogers Parkway."

We certainly mean no disrespect to our state's senior representative, who during his tenure in congress has left a lasting impact on Eastern Kentucky through millions in federal appropriations.

And Rogers' PRIDE program appears well on its way to leaving a legacy Boone himself could respect as it cleans Kentucky's landscape and waterways of pollution. Certainly, Rogers deserves recognition and honor.

But not at the expense of Daniel Boone.

For all of Rogers' ability to bring the gravy home from Washington, it pales in comparison to the legendary life of Boone. The pioneer is largely credited for doing more to explore and settle Kentucky than any other person.

And while many of the tales told of the frontiersman certainly have grown tall through the years, aspects of his life that have been verified are filled with adventure that made him a hero the world over.

So maybe naming a highway, particularly an obsolete one with a reputation for inflicting carnage, isn't the best tribute for a man who charted what was then America's wilderness.

But it did serve to remind motorists who happened to travel it of our state's rich history. And maybe that sparked enough curiosity that some of them later returned to visit.

Certainly Rogers himself can appreciate the irony of stripping such an identifiable name from a highway in order to pay tribute to him, especially when so many of his efforts have been geared toward promoting tourism in Eastern Kentucky.

Rogers, who was as surprised by the announcement as anyone else, was obviously flattered by the honor.

But his public image would grow considerably more if, in this instance, he were to simply say, "Thanks, but no thanks."

## Red Cross blood drive Monday

The Red Cross Nurses and Technicians will be at Fred's Super Dollar Store, 928 South 12th Street, Murray, from 12 noon to 6 p.m. on Monday, June 23. Free baseball type caps will be given to all donors. All blood types are needed.

Larry Doyle, chairman of blood drives for the Calloway County Chapter of the American Red Cross, said "all blood donor types are welcome at this blood drive. Every day lives are saved by blood donors who voluntarily provide the precious gift of live to patients in need. Only voluntarily given blood may be used for transfusions and blood cannot be manufactured."

When an illness or accident occurs, everyone expects blood to be in the hospital with all other supplies, but if the blood supply runs out -- no 24-hour convenience store can produce it for you. Maintaining the blood supply is a community responsibility that is crucial, and yet depends entirely upon voluntary donors.

One whole blood donation can be divided into three different products:

Red blood cells carry oxygen and help patients who are anemic from large blood losses.

Plasma is the liquid portion of the blood. It carries nutrients, removes waste, and regulates body functions, i.e., keeps the body warm or cool.

Platelets are cell fragments that prevent bleeding. Cancer patients and others frequently need platelet donors to help them to promote blood clotting. A cancer patient may use as many as 600 bags of platelets per year.

To be eligible to give blood, donors must be healthy, at least 17 years old, weigh at least 110 pounds and not have given blood in the last 56 days. A health review will be conducted to further determine eligibility to give blood. Refreshments will be served.

There is no upper age limit and donors with diabetes and high blood pressure will be accepted if it is under control.

The next scheduled blood drive is at Kroger in Murray on Friday, June 27.

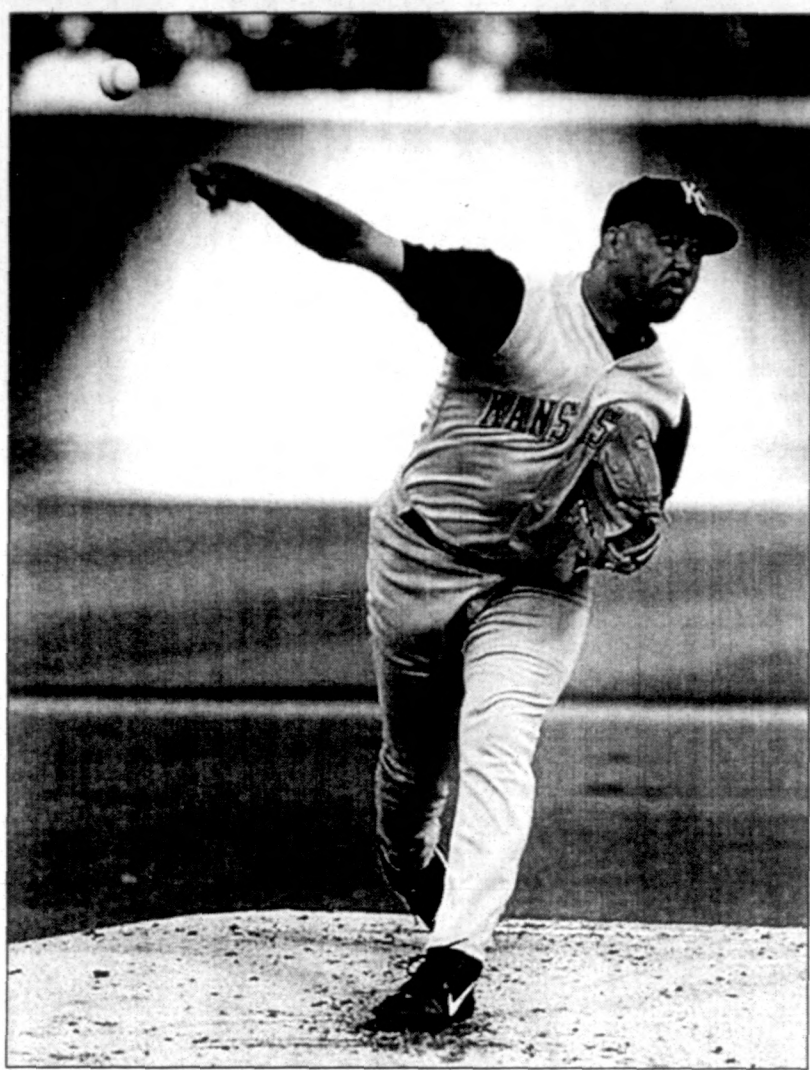

## Lima, Royals stomp Cards

ST. LOUIS (AP) — Jose Lima is confident the wait for his next victory won't be nearly as long as this one.

"I'm back, I'm back," Lima said after earning his first major league win since last August in the Kansas City Royals' 10-4 victory over the St. Louis Cardinals on Friday night.

"I knew sooner or later I was going to get a phone call and I got it, and I'm not going to let it go," he said.

The Royals got four RBIs from Ken Harvey in the first of six games in a 10-day span between the cross-state rivals that met in the 1985 World Series.

The Royals are 2-6 the last two seasons against the Cardinals, but punished St. Louis ace Matt Morris to even the series at 11-11 overall.

Raul Ibanez went 3-for-4 with three RBIs for the Royals, who rebounded from a 16-2 loss to the Twins and have won five of six overall. Desi Relaford homered on the second pitch of the game, and Harvey and Angel Berroa also connected for Kansas City.

"I think we have shown a lot of people and we are not going to go away," manager Tony Pena said. "We go out and we fight and we're going to fight until we reach our goal."

Lima (1-0) gave up two runs and four hits in 5 1-3 innings in his second start since his contract was purchased from Triple-A Omaha on June 15. He struck out two and walked three to beat the Cardinals for the first time in five career decisions, lowering his ERA to 7.11 against St. Louis.

Lima's last big league victory came with the Detroit Tigers on Aug. 19, 2002, against Seattle. He was released last Sept. 11 by Detroit and spent two months with the Newark Bears of the independent Atlantic League this season, going 6-1 with a 2.33 ERA before signing a minor league deal with the Royals on June 11.

Morris (7-5) beat the Royals twice last year, allowing two runs in 16 innings. But he's struggled since throwing consecutive shutouts in May, giving up 23 earned runs in 25 innings over five outings to hike his ERA from 2.26 to 3.64.

## Williams, Kentucky roll 28-14

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — Versatile Michael Bush gave Louisville fans a glimpse of the future on Friday night, leading Kentucky to a 28-14 win in the Kentucky-Tennessee All-Star Football Classic at Commonwealth Stadium.

Kentucky won the annual game for the third time in four years. Tennessee holds a 14-6 lead in the series, which features graduated high school seniors.

Defensive back Nathan Williams, a Murray High product and Murray State signee, collected four tackles and broke up a Tennessee pass play.

Mayfield linebacker Jay Burgett, who will team up with Williams and the Racers this fall, led Kentucky's defense with eight tackles, including three stops behind the line of scrimmage.

Bush, the versatile quarterback who led Louisville Male to a runner-up finish in Class 4A last season, earned All-America honors from Student Sports as a multi-purpose threat.

He showed why on Friday, completing 8 of 15 passes for 97 yards and a touchdown, rushing five times for 35 yards and catching three passes for 21 yards.

Bush said that while he enjoyed playing different positions in the all-star game, he is headed to Louisville to be a quarterback only.

"I told (the coaches) I didn't want to do that," Bush said. "If quarterback doesn't work out, then I can play other positions, but right now, I'm just strictly a quarterback."

Team most valuable player honors for Kentucky went to Louisville Manual wide receiver Keenan Burton. Burton, who has signed with Kentucky, had four catches for 66 yards and one touchdown, a 3-yard laser from Bush in the first quarter.

Ohio-bound quarterback Austen Everson of Brentwood was Tennessee's MVP. Everson

rushed for 40 yards and completed 8 of 15 passes for 91 yards and two touchdowns, both to Chattanooga Notre Dame wide receiver Adarius Bowman.

A 33-yard pass from quarterback Justin Haddix of Breathitt County to Jacob Tamme of Boyle County highlighted Kentucky's first scoring drive, a six-play, 50-yard march that ended with Bush's TD pass to Burton.

A 48-yard interception return by Dustin Lopez of Hopkinsville gave Kentucky possession at the Tennessee 26. Five plays later, Lopez's high school teammate, Kentucky-bound Ricky Abren, bulled into the end zone from the 3, giving Kentucky a 14-0 lead with 4:02 left before halftime.

On Kentucky's first second-half drive, Bush eluded a heavy rush and found Burton open for a 47-yard gain to the Tennessee 1. Lexington Bryan Station's Markeith Gillis — an Eastern Kentucky University signee — scored on the next play, making it 20-7.

## Yankees topple Mets 5-0

NEW YORK (AP) — The New York Yankees used some familiar faces to overcome an unfamiliar Mets team.

Andy Pettitte shut down the Mets for seven innings and the Yankees got consecutive home runs from Alfonso Soriano and Derek Jeter to win the opener of the Subway Series 5-0 Friday night.

Jason Giambi also homered as the Yankees once again got the better of the heated intracity rivalry, beating the Mets for the 19th time in 31 regular-season meetings. The Yankees also won the 2000 World Series against the Mets in five games.

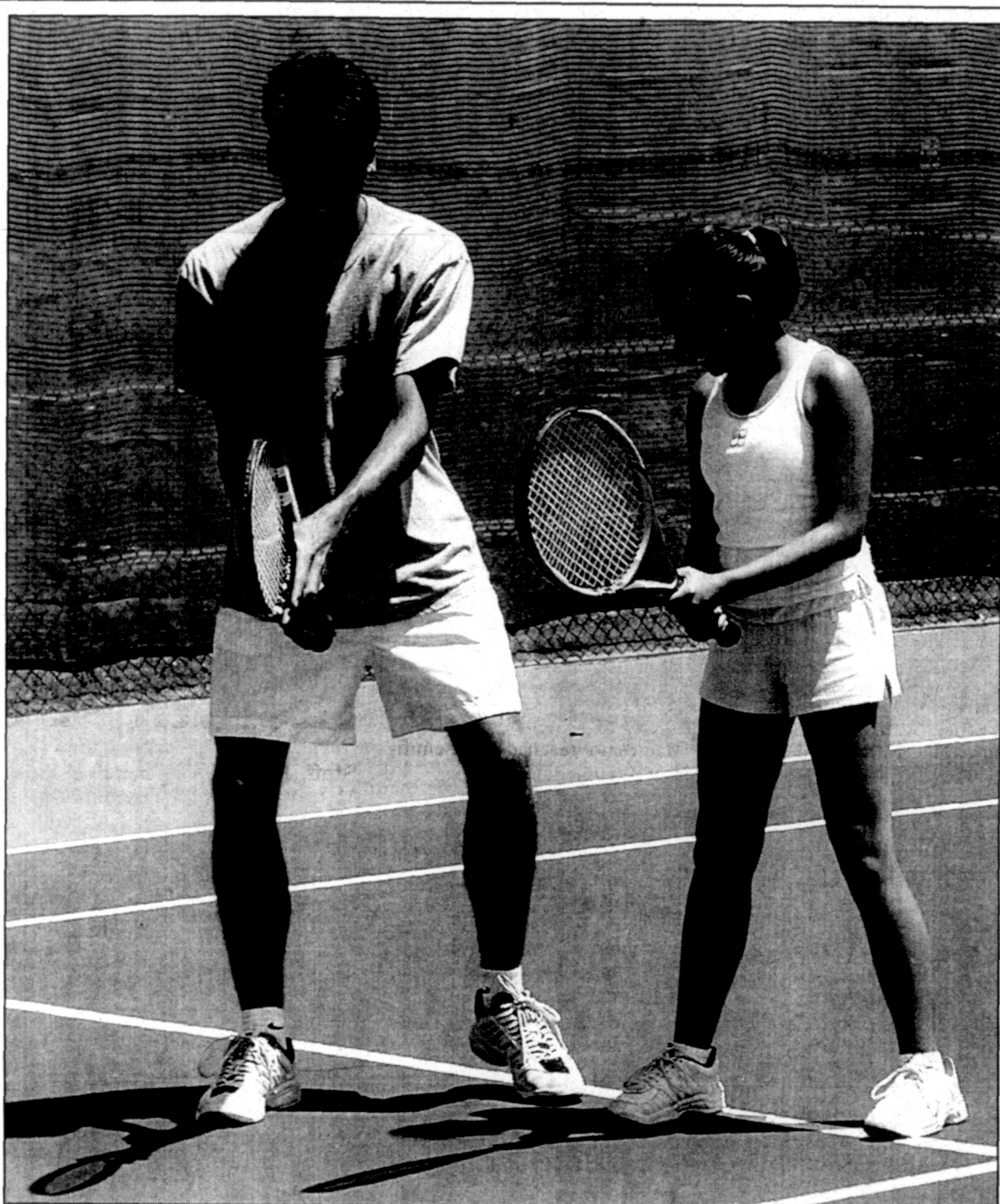
With Mike Piazza sidelined, no one in the Mets' starting lineup played in that Series and three players had never faced the Yankees before.

"It felt different this time because there were so many new guys," Pettitte said. "I hadn't faced a lot of their guys before. I had to talk to the scouts to find out about them."

The Yankees had many Subway Series veterans: Jeter was the MVP of the 2000 Series, Pettitte started the clincher at Shea Stadium and Mariano Rivera, who finished Friday night, saved two games.

Jeter went 3-for-5 in front of a sellout crowd of 55,386, improving his career average against the Mets to .360, including the World Series.

"I enjoy it," he said. "It doesn't mean you're going to be successful, but I enjoy being in big games. Obviously, playing the Mets is a big game."

Silva's suspension had been scheduled to start Friday and Casey's next Tuesday.

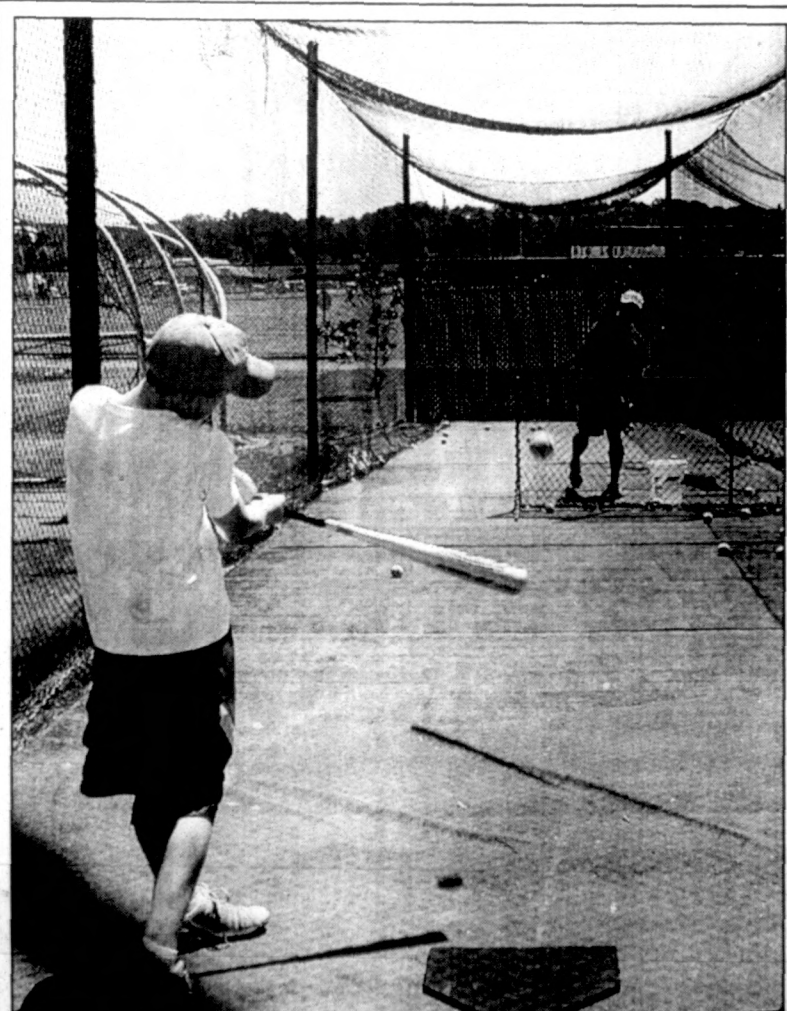
Phillies manager Larry Bowe also was suspended for one game for Silva's actions after a warning had been issued by the umpires.

## Lewis, Klitschko ready

LOS ANGELES (AP) — A lot has changed in the heavyweight world since Lennox Lewis put a whipping on Mike Tyson a year ago in Memphis.

There are two intriguing new belt holders, one big deflated contender and no sign of Tyson.

One thing that hasn't changed: Despite his lay-off and his tendency to give his titles away, Lewis is the true heavyweight champion until somebody beats him in the ring.

"I am the last great heavyweight," Lewis said.

That boast gets put to the test tonight when a giant from Ukraine tests both the rusting skills of Lewis and his suspect chin in the first heavyweight title fight in Los Angeles in 45 years.

Vitali Klitschko wasn't even supposed to be the best of two fighting brothers. But the awkward 6-foot-7 contender got two weeks notice and the biggest chance of his boxing life, and couldn't pass it up.

"I am not a god and nobody is perfect," Klitschko said. "But I am really confident to go in the ring. I've been waiting a long time to fight Lewis."

Lewis, who will be punching up to reach his opponent for one of the few times in his career, is a 4-1 favorite to defend his WBC heavyweight title against the No. 1 contender in a scheduled 12-round fight at Staples Center. The fight will be televised by HBO, beginning about 9:30 p.m. CDT.

It's a lot different than last June, when a bigger, faster Lewis battered Tyson around the ring before finally stopping him in the eighth round of the richest heavyweight fight of all time.

Since then, Lewis (40-2-1, 31 knockouts) has been relaxing and enjoying himself as the heavyweight division changed about him. Roy Jones Jr. won a title and so did Chris Byrd, while Klitschko's brother, Wladimir, was exposed in a shocking knockout loss to Corrie Sanders.

## Williams leaves hole at 'Bama

TUSCALOOSA, Ala. (AP) — Take away Mo Williams from Alabama's starting lineup, and what do you have? That's what basketball coach Mark Gottfried is wondering.

The 6-foot-1 point guard called Gottfried on Thursday to tell him he was sticking by his decision to leave the Crimson Tide and enter the NBA draft.

Gottfried said it was "too early" to speculate on how the Tide roster would look next season, although seniors Antoine Pettway and Demetrius Smith could be the top candidates at point guard.

Alabama will have 10 days of practice in July and early August to get an early look at potential candidates, thanks to a trip to the Bahamas for five exhibition games beginning on Aug. 9.

Williams' decision to leave after his sophomore season marked the fourth straight year Alabama has lost a player with remaining eligibility.

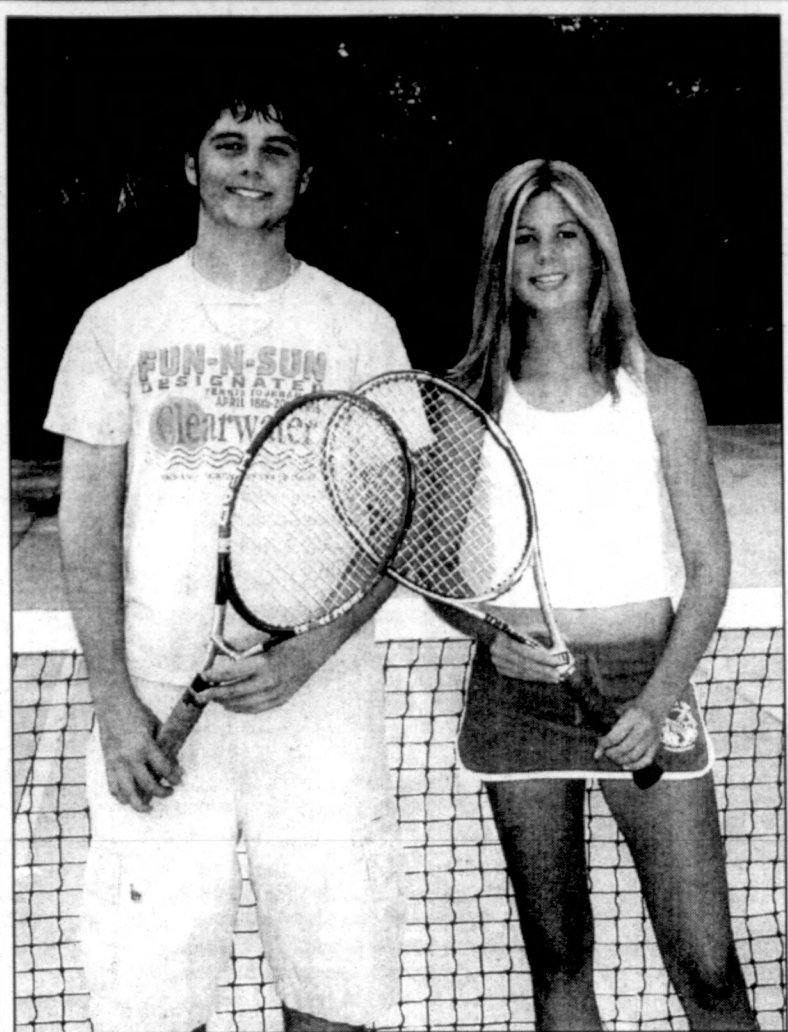
Schea Cotton left early in 2000, Gerald Wallace in 2001 and Rod Grizzard in 2002; only Wallace was a first-round pick. Williams is projected as a second-round pick by most NBA draft analysts.

"I just hope things work out," said Ike Williams, the player's father. "In regard to what all the experts are saying, we just don't know what the future will hold."

He may not be a first-round pick, but no one has said he won't be an NBA player. He's a competitor. He understands that he is going to have to go and make a team.

Williams led Alabama in scoring this past season with 16.4 points per game. He averaged 3.9 assists per game.

WIMBLEDON, England (AP) — Wimbledon was hit with more withdrawals Friday, with Amelie Mauresmo, Marat Safin, Alex Corretja and Magnus Norman pulling out three days before the tournament begins.

Corretja withdrew for the fifth straight year, this time because of the birth of his first child.

Mauresmo, seeded sixth, has a rib injury. The 18th-seeded Safin cited a hand problem. Norman pulled out with an unspecified injury. The two-week tournament begins Monday.

Spain's Albert Costa, seeded

24th, withdrew Thursday. Other withdrawals include former champions Goran Ivanisevic and Richard Krajicek, Marcelo Rios, Monica Seles, Anna Kournikova, former Australian Open champion Thomas Johansson, 1998 French Open winner Carlos Moya and Tommy Haas.

Ivanisevic, Moya, Costa, Corretja, Rios and Haas all withdrew last year, too.

Mauresmo reached the semifinals at Wimbledon last year.

Corretja, a two-time French Open runner-up who prefers clay courts, hasn't played at Wimbledon since 1998.

# UGA's buck stops with Felton

ATHENS, Ga. (AP) — Dennis Felton says his regime at Georgia will be different from the last one: If anything goes wrong, he's the man to see.

"I want to control everything I can control," the Bulldogs' new basketball coach said. "I don't want to leave anything to chance."

That's certainly a change from his predecessor, Jim Harrick, whose lack of control cleared the way for an embarrassing scandal that caused Georgia to pull out of the Southeastern Conference and NCAA tournaments last season.

Harrick was forced to retire amid allegations that his son, assistant coach Jim Harrick Jr., paid some bills for a player and was teach-

ing a sham class on coaching. The elder Harrick denied knowing about any of the malfeasance, a sort of don't-ask, don't-tell philosophy that led to his downfall.

Enter Felton, who vows to take a much different approach. If nothing else, there will be accountability at the top of the program.

"I certainly will be involved in how we are carrying ourselves and making an effort at cultivating the kind of image we want to enjoy," he said during a recent interview at his Stegeman Coliseum office.

Felton is quick to point out his academic record at Western Kentucky, where all but two players — both seniors he inherited in his first season — graduated on time.

"That doesn't happen by coincidence," he said. "That takes an incredible amount of attention. But that's an example of the kind of discipline and standard that I believe in."

Felton also had plenty of success on the court, guiding the Hilltoppers to three straight NCAA appearances and a 100-54 record in five seasons.

Before the scandal, Georgia was in line to make its third straight NCAA appearance for the first time in school history.

The Bulldogs lost their top two players from last season, Jarvis Hayes and Ezra Williams, and freshman Wayne Arnold was kicked off the team by Felton after being caught with pot in a dorm room.

## LBL to close area for dust

GOLDEN POND, Ky. — Turkey Bay Off-Highway Vehicle Area at Land Between The Lakes National Recreation Area will be closed all day Tuesday for dust abatement or reduction treatment to the main roads and parking areas.

The treatment is designed to provide additional protection to the resources at LBL and to protect the OHV users. Excessive dust creates a visibility hazard to riders, and can lead to more rapid erosion and sedimentation in nearby lakes and streams.

The entire area will be closed for 24 hours to provide uninterrupted safe access and mobility for the treatment vehicle.

The treatment process uses a soybean-oil mixture to reduce the amount of dust that is created by riders in the area. The mixture is sprayed onto the surface and must be allowed to settle into the ground for a full day in order to have the desired effect.

We are having one of the best seasons possible under the conditions we dealt with last month. Hopefully the high waters are gone for another 10 years and we won't have to

deal with that problem.

Our bass population has rebounded tremendously and any angler with the tiniest bit of knowledge can catch lots of bass. As long as you anglers handle these bass very carefully and release them quickly, everyone will have bass to catch and enjoy!

Our waters finally reached 75 degrees, and this really helps all anglers because there is such a wide variety of lures bass will strike after these temperatures are reached.

It doesn't take long for most novice anglers to want to try the top water noisemakers so they can experience the thrill of the strike where they can see it happen!

Some brands are better than others, but most of the time, the angler makes the difference.

The majority of the threadpin shad are still in the bays close to the thick cover for protection. Practically all other species of fish we have made a meal out of these shad when they can find them.

Soon they will become large enough to move out onto the main lake and join with millions of others to attempt to reach adulthood.

This is the beginning of prime striped bass fishing! We all look for this to happen because these strippers are so much fun and exciting to catch. Besides the chase, strippers fight harder for their size than any other fish we have, including the great smallmouth!

Be prepared to hook up with some real demons this year in the form of the genuine Kentucky Lake rockfish striper!

This species is a true champion fighter in any lake and will outclass any species of fighters we know of! You'll see when you

hook one!

We caught three different age groups from the same flat last week, and this week, there were four sizes there! All were nearly impossible to remove a hook from safely!

The present weather conditions may get nasty again and bring us more water than we need to fish in. We are now out of the full moon phase, so you can expect to catch more fish during the daylight hours.

I had the pleasure of having Steve and Jason Spillman as my guests on Monday, and we found some bass which were willing to spar a little. We used cranks, tubes and spinnerbaits to wrangle a few decent bass from the rocky ledges and shorelines.

Steve and son Jason are good anglers and we didn't let many bass get by us. The action was slow most of the morning, but not boring, at least.

Later in the day, we hooked up with some big bluegill, but even then, the action was slow as the pressure was high. A front was approaching.

We definitely will hook up again before long and chase them some more when we can get the large bluegill and strippers. Steve is an officer for Murray State's public safety department, so we will be talking soon!

We didn't have room to clean our fish at the fish house because we chose the wrong time to come in. I did see some super bluegill, crappie and catfish other anglers had caught that morning. We were still glad we spent the time bass fishing!

Good times are near, so keep casting — mayflies are hatching!

## Early seasons set; deadlines approaching

The Kentucky Fish and Wildlife Commission, made up of commissioners from each of the nine wildlife districts across the State, met June 13 to finalize the Commonwealth's portion of the early migratory bird seasons.

Approval from the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service is required to finalize the actions, but that should be forthcoming.

Dove season has been set for the traditional Sept. 1 opener. The first phase will close Oct. 24. The second phase will open Nov. 27 and close on Dec. 2.

A new twist to dove regulations this year will involve harvest of a prolific invader to our native population, the Eurasian collared dove. Collared doves have been targeted by the KDFWR and the USFWS this year to be also targeted by hunters.

There will be no limit on collared

doves and they will not count against the total dove bag limit. Hunters will need to do a little research and perhaps carry a mugshot of the exotic bird into the field for positive identification.

The early wood duck and teal season, a season that was experimental until last year, will be open Sept. 17-21. This season has become rather popular in recent years, not only to give waterfowlers a jump on the traditional seasons, but because it has provided the best opportunity for a shot at migrating waterfowl.

The rationale is that wood ducks and teal move through our area early in the year before the main waterfowl season opens and the early opportunity allows waterfowl hunters to take a few of these small, colorful ducks.

To deal with the increasing population of Canada geese that like our area golf courses, marinas and agricultural fields so well that they hang around all year, another early goose season will be offered Sept. 6-10.

Considering the decline of the traditional goose season, the early season affords goose hunters the best opportunity to bag a goose or two without trav-

and moorhens Sept. 1 through Nov. 9. The season has to be that long because it takes a while to figure out exactly what kind of strange bird these fellows are, then another length of time just to locate a patch of them.

I suspect that anyone intent on hunting any or all of these odd fellows would do well to, as in the immortal words of Adolph Rupp, "lift thine eyes unto the hills ..."

OK, so Rupp did have some extra inspiration for that quote — but the message is the same.

Want more bobwhites and other game on your farm or lease? The local NRCS (formerly ASCS) office is accepting applications for the EQUIP program through July 11.

EQUIP is a cost sharing program whereby a landowner can implement certain improvements that are beneficial to the land and to wildlife of all types. Especially useful are native grass plantings and stream-bank improvement.

If you are serious about wildlife, use this program to help rid your farm of fescue and replace it with native grasses. Contact the folks down at the NRCS

office for information — they'd love to help!

The wet spring has been both a blessing and a curse, but may wind up being a boon for wildlife such as turkeys and deer. Because of the weather, few fields have been mowed, which has spared the life of many fawns and turkey poults.

The jury is still out on the effect to the bobwhite as many believe the heavy rains are detrimental to young birds. Typically, hay fields have been cleanly mowed by this time — a practice that destroys turkey nests and results in the death of scores of whitetail fawns.

By the time weather allows harvest this year, most of the critters should be old enough to avoid the farm equipment and survive outside the field.

So at least we can breathe a sigh of relief that another commissioners meeting has come and gone without major changes or gouges to our pocketbook. The fall seasons are drawing ever near and the LBL Quota Applications — the first sign of fall — will be available July 1.

In the meantime, get yourself a good bird book and become acquainted with the Eurasian collared dove.

Miller and Taylor also had the big bass of the tournament. Miller caught a 5.11-pound largemouth and Taylor netted it for him.

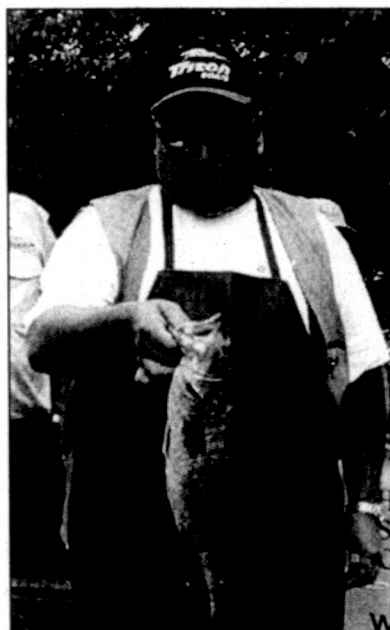

When they finally got it near the boat, it jumped one last time. Connie Booher said she stuck the net out and the fish threw the jig in one direction and then came down in the net.

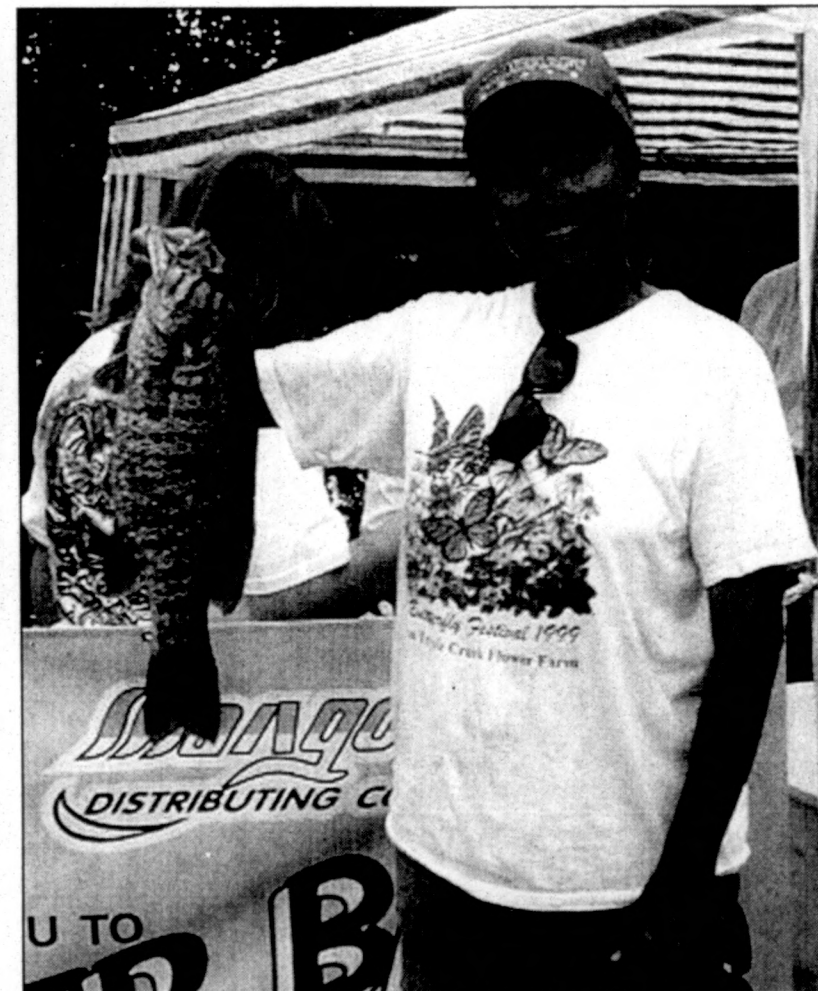

## DR. GOTT

DEAR DR. GOTT: My 10-year-old son is active in Little League baseball. Because my husband and I lift weights, we have encouraged our child to lift weights in order to increase his athletic ability. However, I've been told that lifting weights before adolescence can harm a child, even stunt his growth. Obviously, we would retract our encouragement if this were the case.

DEAR READER: My answer depends on the amount of weight and the extent of the activity. Children are not harmed by modest activity and light weights. On the other hand, focused weight training at this age can stress metabolism and lead to health consequences, such as interference with normal growth spurts. In other words, body building in a pre-adolescent is not appropriate. In your situation, light weights in repetition are OK, but I'd avoid pushing your son to the limit of his strength until he is older.

DEAR DR. GOTT: During a recent shopping session in the local grocery store, I was purchasing milk and examining the expiration dates on the containers. A fellow shopper, male, attractive, 60-ish, saw what I doing and told me that he never discards milk, even if it is spoiled. What do you think about rancid dairy products?

afraid. When my milk spoils and separates, I pour it down the drain.

With respect to your fellow shopper, I suspect that he was tweeking you perhaps because he found you to be attractive. Nonetheless, he is correct. Curds and whey (spoiled milk) are, in many cultures, perfectly acceptable as cheeses and yogurt. Rancidity implies advanced spoilage — but, in most instances, the product can be safely consumed.

If I were you, I'd spend some time hanging around the dairy department (to see if this guy might be worth getting to know) and using products that are fresh.

DEAR DR. GOTT: In 1998, my husband had extensive open-heart surgery. Immediately following this, his right testicle swelled to the size of a baseball, and his penis retracted so severely that it's barely visible. When he addressed these issues with his doctor, he was simply told that "this just goes with your problem." Now, five years later, my husband has lost faith in doctors. Perhaps you can revive that faith.

DEAR READER: That's a big order. At the time of your husband's surgery, I assume that he had bypass grafting, during which a vein from his leg was removed and transplanted to his heart. Following such a procedure, venous problems can appear in the form of leg (or genital) swelling, discomfort and pressure. Also, because heart surgery is so traumatic, sexual difficulties are common following it.

I think it's unfortunate that your husband has had to endure discomfort and frustration following his heart surgery. In my view, he should have been referred to a urologist when the genital symptoms first appeared five years ago. But it's not too late. Your husband should request such a referral. After appropriate examination and testing, the specialist should be able to recommend therapy that may well return your husband to normal. Let me know the outcome.

Opening lead — king of clubs.

Assume you're in six hearts and West leads the king of clubs. How would you play the hand? At the table, you wouldn't see the East-West cards, but even if you could, you might still have trouble making the slam. In fact, if you'd like to test your play, stop right here and see if you can make 12 tricks.

The key to the slam lies in your

very first play. If you ruff the king of clubs, you go down, but if you discard a diamond — as you should — you make the contract.

It does not matter what West leads at trick two. Let's say he shifts to the queen of spades. You win with the king, ruff a club, cash the A-K of trumps and ace of spades, then ruff a spade. After you ruff a third club and play two more trumps, this is the position:

North	West	East	South
♠ A 7	♠ K 9	♠ J 10 6	♠ 10
♥ —	♥ A	♥ —	♥ 10
♦ —	♦ —	♦ —	♦ Q 5
♣ —	♣ —	♣ —	♣ —

You lead your last trump, and West is caught between Scylla and Charybdis. Whatever he discards, you score the rest of the tricks.

Note that when the play started you had 11 sure tricks — that is, all the remaining tricks but two. By conceding the first trick, you created the position needed for most successful squeezes — having all the remaining tricks but one. Ten tricks later this early concession of a trick paid a handsome dividend.

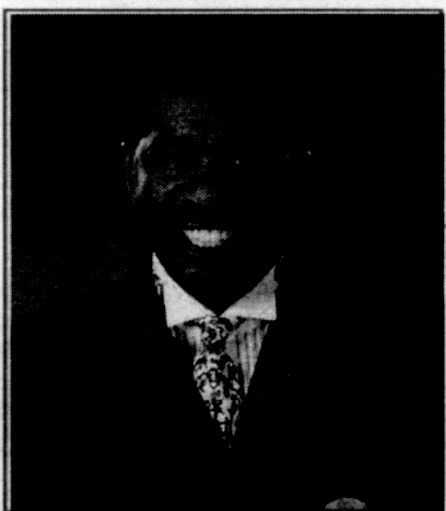

## TV PIPELINE

**Q:** What's happening with "The Practice"? Did ABC move it to Monday nights in an attempt to set it up for cancellation? —LaRonda Savage, Philadelphia.

**A:** No, ABC seriously hoped "The Practice" would thrive on Monday as part of a new dramatic lineup that also included "Veritas" and "Miracles," but both those newbies bombed, leaving "The Practice" to take a severe hit in the ratings.

ABC will restore the David E. Kelley series to its Sunday night berth when it returns next fall, but without half its familiar cast: Dylan McDermott (Bobby), whose departure was set up in the season finale; Kelli Williams (Bobby's TV wife, Lindsay); Lara Flynn Boyle (Helen); Marla Sokoloff (Lucy); Lisa Gay Hamilton (Rebecca); and Chyler Leigh (Claire), who joined the series just last season after her own Kelley drama, "girls club," bombed.

Kelley says economic and creative realities forced the shakeup, and ABC was rumored to have insisted on a sharp reduction in the per-episode fee they pay as a condition for renewal. Familiar faces Camryn Manheim (Ellenor), Michael Badalucco (Jimmy), Steve Harris (Eugene) and Jessica Capshaw (Jamie) return; McDermott is expected to make occasional guest appearances, and Kelley said the door is open for occasional appearances by the other veteran cast members as well.

**Q:** I still don't know why "The Huntress" with Annette O'Toole was canceled, because it was an excellent show. What other movies has Jordana Spiro, who played

O'Toole's daughter, appeared in? —Erin Peterka, Grafton, N.D.

**A:** Erin, don't forget, the quality of a show means nothing as far as whether it stays on the air. "The Huntress"

(USA Network, 2000-01) had a loyal cult following, but it wasn't large enough to win the show renewal.

As for the appealing Spiro, I don't find any post-"Huntress" TV or movie credits, but the actress previously appeared on the series "One World" and MTV's "Undressed," as well as in guest roles on "Any Day Now," "Beverly Hills, 90210," "Buffy the Vampire Slayer," "Silk Stalkings" and "Maybe This Time." She also appeared in the video feature "From Dusk Till Dawn 3: The Hangman's Daughter."

**Q:** Why don't we see Rod Roddy on "The Price Is Right" anymore? —Nancy Wingate, York, S.C.

**A:** According to an explanation on the show's CBS Web site: "FreMantleMedia produces around one hundred game shows throughout the world. The company's objective is to keep show formats standard in all territories of the world. Therefore, all announcers' on-camera exposure has been eliminated."

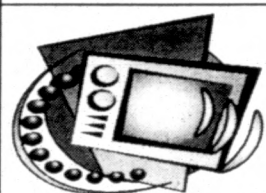

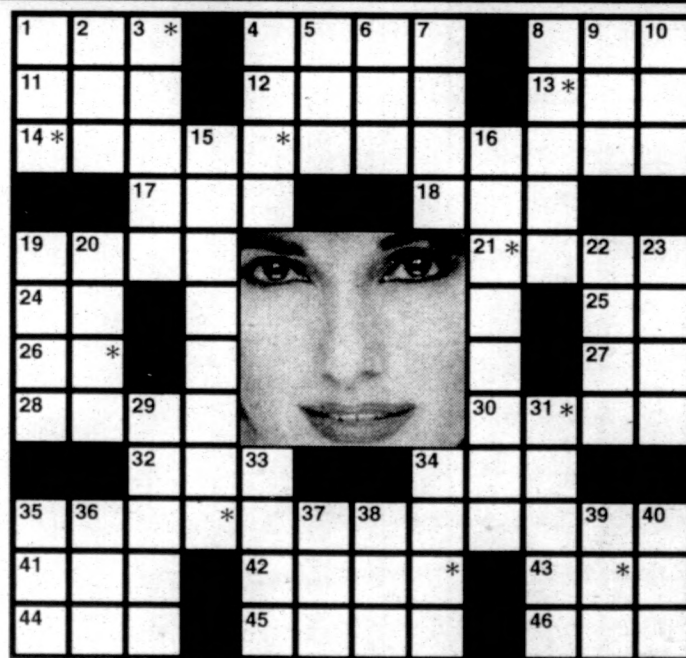
