Bush seeks campaign cash in Texas

DALLAS (AP) — President Bush on Friday attended the first of two Texas fund-raisers this weekend that will raise \$7 million — the largest take in any trip to one state this year.

The president left behind the partisan battles in Washington over his statement on Iraqi weapons programs that was based in part on faulty evidence.

There was no talk of the brewing controversy at a Dallas hotel where Bush was greeted by what Gov. Rick Perry called a "Texas-sized welcome."

His speech followed his fund-raiser script, urging the Senate to approve his judicial nominees and asking Congress to embrace his energy, education and faith-based initiatives. And he replayed the toppling of Saddam Hussein and the routing of the Taliban from Afghanistan.

"All the tests of the last 2 1/2 years have come to the right nation," Bush said.

"This is the work that history has set before us," he said. "We welcome it. And we know that for our country, and for our cause, better days lie ahead."

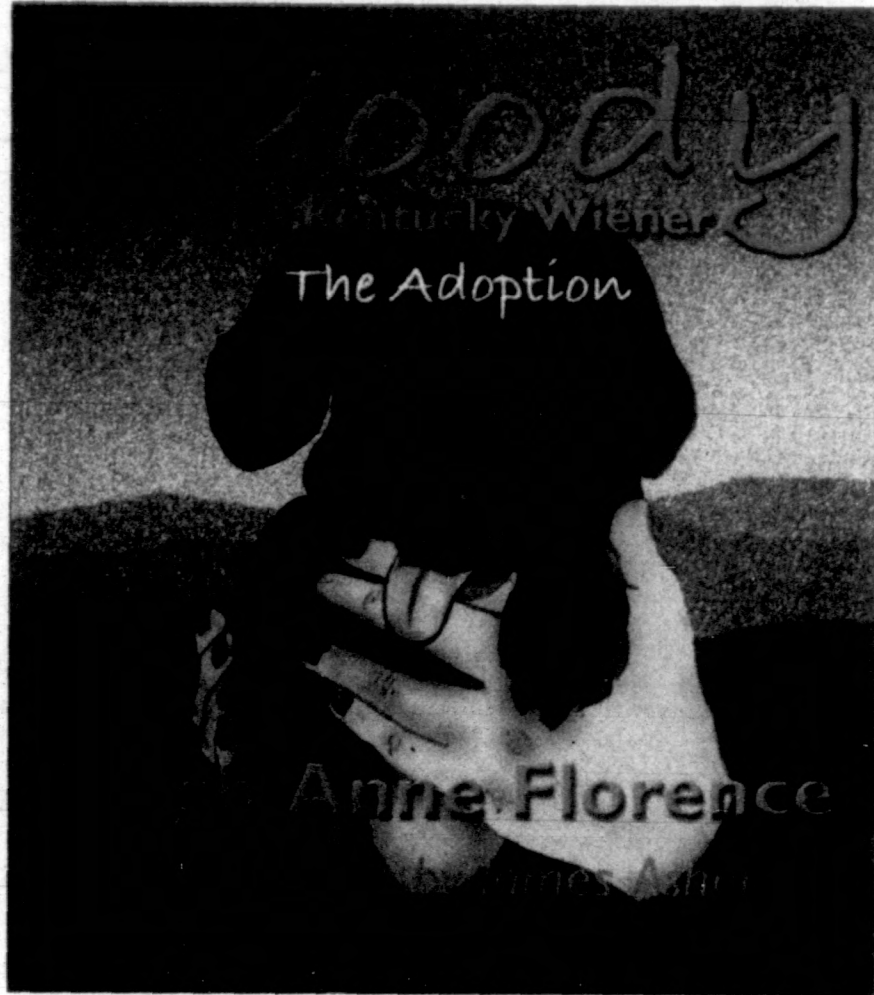
The \$2,000-a-person events in Dallas Friday night and another in Houston on Saturday are his eighth and ninth fund-raiser since announcing his re-election campaign on May 16. That will pad the \$34.4 million his campaign has raised since May, more than the total raised in the second quarter by all nine of Bush's Democratic rivals.

Dan Ronayne, a spokesman for the Bush-Cheney '04 campaign, said about 900 people attended the Dallas fund-raiser where donors sipped drinks and nibbled on appetizers; 700 would be at the event in Houston.

The Bush campaign says the fund-raising success is a sign of Bush's public support.

A CNN-Time poll released Friday showed that Bush's overall job approval had dropped 8 percentage points since May to 55 percent, according to a CNN-Time poll released Friday. A majority in this poll, 52 percent, said the president is doing a poor job of handling the economy, and just four in 10 say the U.S.-led military campaign in Iraq has been a success.

Outside the hotel where Bush spoke, about 75 protesters waved flags and carried signs that said "Peace is patriotic" and "Regime change starts at home." Inside the event, Steve Young, a Dallas businessman, said Bush's fund-raising success is linked to support for the war. "Texas is a fairly patriotic state," he said. "Since Sept. 11 and the Iraq war, it has grown even more patriotic."

Love of dogs guides former Murrayan's pen

Leigh Anne Florence took one look at her two dachshunds and saw the perfect way to teach children lessons in life.

Florence, a former Murray resident and public school music teacher, is currently promoting the first in a series of five books that teaches children morals through the eyes of two rambunctious wiener dogs, "Woody: The Kentucky Wiener."

"We promote being a good person through a cute little dachshund," said Florence of the tales, based on her own pet dachshunds, Woody and Chloe. "This little dog has gotten a lot of publicity."

Florence developed the idea for the books three years ago, although she had never written a children's book before. "I started thinking it would be great to address children's issues through

the eyes of these dogs," she said.

The series started as a trilogy, but the publishing company insisted on a five book series. Florence said she went back and wrote the first two books describing Woody's arrival to their happy home.

"You can't really capture personalities in one book," she said.

Florence, her husband and the dogs are currently on a book tour to stores and libraries, and in September will take their stories to Kentucky schools.

"I'd love to say we have been to all 120 counties in the state," said Florence.

The family, which resides in Shephardsville, Ky., has been amazed at how fast the first book has taken off with readers.

"It has been the most fun I have ever had in my career," she said.

She said traveling with the dogs is something her family has

Chinese diplomat meets with Powell to discuss North Korea

WASHINGTON (AP) — The United States in sessions Friday with a visiting Chinese diplomat pressed its case to expand talks with North Korea on its suspected nuclear weapons program to include other nations in the region.

The Americans want Japan and South Korea to get seats at the table to help bring about a peaceful non-nuclear Korean peninsula.

State Department spokesman Richard Boucher said Vice Foreign Minister Dai Bingguo, Beijing's most experienced envoy on North Korean affairs, held an unusually long 2 1/2-hour meeting with Secretary of State Colin Powell and other U.S. officials. Powell's meetings rarely last longer than an hour.

Dai had also met with Vice President Dick Cheney and national security adviser Condoleezza Rice at the White House. He described the sessions

as useful. "We both agreed to work together to push the process forward and resolve the issue," said Dai, who visited Pyongyang July 12-15. He did not elaborate.

Boucher said the United States made clear in the talks with Dai "our strong belief that the time has come for other parties to join the multilateral talks in order to insure that all key issues are addressed." He said the objective of the talks is to establish a peaceful, non-nuclear Korean peninsula.

The United States wants Japan and South Korea and possibly Russia to join the sessions. At the previous round in Beijing in April, China, the United

States and North Korea took part. China is pressing for another such session.

Boucher said President Bush has consistently pursued a diplomatic approach to the nuclear stalemate "despite North Korean threats and steps in the wrong direction."

He also said Powell expressed appreciation to Dai "for the tremendous effort China has put into this matter." Boucher said the two countries will remain in close touch on these issues.

Dai's trip is the latest in a flurry of diplomacy by China aimed at calming tensions over the North's nuclear program, which the United States believes is aimed at producing nuclear weapons. North Korean leader Kim Jong Il's government claims to have completed extraction of plutonium, a crucial ingredient in nuclear weapons, from 8,000 spent nuclear fuel rods.

Station readies for more vehicles

Murray Fire Chief Pat Scott says there is one rule to keep in mind about fire trucks: They may get taller and/or longer, but they never get any wider.

With that concept in mind, firefighters from the Murray Fire Department, along with assistance from the Murray Public Works department, have been busy recently clearing out more bay space in the fire department's downtown station to make room for its expanding fleet of vehicles.

"We've got to work it out where we can everything in," said Scott. "We've still got to see how it's all going to fit in here."

The primary reason for clearing out more bay space has to do with the fire department's acquisition last year of a new brush truck. The truck, a dual-cab pickup, was purchased using money acquired from the Federal Office of Emergency Management.

The truck has been being kept at MFD's Station II on South 16th Street, but even that scenario has left the fire department cramped for vehicle storage space. "If you go out there [to Station II], you see all the trucks parked in the bays, but if you drive around back, about four feet of the pumper is sticking out the back door," he said. "That works okay in the summer, but in the winter we can't have our trucks in the open and freezing up."

The new bay area that is currently under construction has served over the years in a variety of capacities, but City Hall's recent move to its new location helped clear that area out for additional use by the fire department. It had been serving as a weight room for MFD; detectives' offices for the Murray Police Department; and a storage area for

Seabiscuit craze hitting the Bluegrass

LEXINGTON, Ky. (AP) — Dell Hancock can remember when he was a child and walked through the barn at Claiborne Farm where Seabiscuit grew up.

"Whenever a horse goes on to win a certain amount of money, he got his name put up on the stall door permanently," said Hancock, the public relations director for the Paris, Ky., farm owned by her family. "I remember thinking Seabiscuit was a funny name for a horse."

The barn burned in 1972, and the door that bore Seabiscuit's name was destroyed in the fire. But while Kentucky race fans might struggle to remember the 1938 Horse of the Year was foaled at Claiborne Farm — Hancock said many people assume Seabiscuit was bred in California, where he enjoyed much of his success — there is no doubt that Seabiscuit has become a household name in this town of 260,000 that bills itself as the "Horse Capital of the World."

Special screenings of the movie "Seabiscuit" will be held Saturday in Lexington and Louisville, almost a week before the film will be released nationally. The state and those two cities have declared Saturday to be "Seabiscuit Day," which isn't too surprising, considering filming of the movie took place at Keeneland Race Course in Lexington and three central Kentucky horse farms — Calumet, Normandy and Stony Oak.

"I think it should be shown here first," said Lamar Prewitt of Lexington, as he prepared to spend the afternoon at Keeneland, watching simulcasts of races from other tracks. "After all, this is horse country."

His friend, Barry Dicken of Frankfort, said

that he had purchased Seabiscuit shirts for younger members of his wife's family when the movie was being filmed at Keeneland.

"I don't know that it will have significance until they actually see the movie," he said. "It seems to be a bigger deal here than at a lot of the other tracks."

The movie is based on the 2001 book "Seabiscuit: An American Legend" by Laura Hillenbrand that chronicles the rags-to-riches tale of not only the horse, but also jockey Red Pollard, trainer Tom Smith and owner Charles Howard. It's a book that's difficult to put down, said Frank Atkins Jr., who works in the admissions department at Keeneland.

"It's such a good story," Atkins said. "It's going to be the premier movie about racehorses ever made. They've tried to make them in the past, but a few years ago, they didn't have the technology to do them as good as they do now."

One of the scenes filmed at Keeneland depicted the famed 1938 match race at Pimlico in Baltimore between Seabiscuit and 1937 Triple Crown winner War Admiral.

"I saw enough of what they were doing when they were filming here to know the technical side of the movie will make it worth seeing, just for that," Keeneland President Nick Nicholson said. "They were true to the story."

Many in the thoroughbred racing industry hope to ride the movie's coattails. The Blood-Horse, an industry magazine based in Lexington, compiled a 165-page book, "The Seabiscuit Story," which features articles run in the magazine about Seabiscuit since 1935, when the magazine first mentioned the horse. Also included in the book, which took about a year to produce, are rare photos and race charts from some of Seabiscuit's more prominent races.

"It was fun to look at this material and learn about his humble beginnings, and how it took a long time for him to get any kind of respect for being a racehorse," said John McEvoy of Evanston, Ill., who edited the book.

He's as astounded as anyone about the attention the Seabiscuit saga is receiving.

"I don't think anybody can explain it. I know why those of us in horse racing were interested in it. We are in the business. But for the general public to be so interested, I think it's because of the good job Laura Hillenbrand did," McEvoy said.

Keeneland, like other tracks across the nation, hopes to see a rise in attendance as a direct result of the movie, Nicholson said.

"I think what it will do is two-fold," Nicholson said. "It will sort of bring back fans that how forgotten how much fun (racing) is, and hopefully introduce the sport to a generation of fans that might otherwise not have tried it."

Evan Hammonds, the managing editor of The Blood-Horse, said that the movie, coming on the heels of Funny Cide's unsuccessful but eventful Triple Crown bid, should be a boon for the industry.

After Funny Cide won the Kentucky Derby, "a lot of parallels were immediately drawn" between Funny Cide and Seabiscuit, Hammonds said. "Here is this underdog gelding winning the Derby. His story paralleled Seabiscuit, because it transcended the racing community and the sports community."

"From what we understand, it's a very positive, uplifting story, and that can only help the awareness of thoroughbred racing today. What other sports movies have made you want to go out and participate in that sport? I think this one might."

Late Wednesday afternoon, the vehicle enforcement officer pulled into a gas station near Interstate 64 in north Lexington to assist another motorist when a station clerk told the officer that Harsh, who was waiting in traffic near the station, had not paid for his gas, police Sgt. Jack Dawson said.

The officer stopped Harsh, who pulled back into the station's lot and parked before returning to the station's store with the officer, Dawson said.

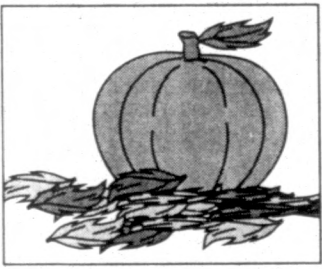

Medicare would pay for adult daycare under pilot program

WASHINGTON (AP) — Patricia Smith, of Louisville, Ky., has relied on Medicare to pay for home nursing care in the past, but she now gets additional care at an adult daycare center — an option that soon might be more widely available to seniors.

State Medicaid programs pick up the daycare tab for low-income seniors such as Smith, 69, in some parts of the country, while others generally pay for the service themselves.

But legislation pending in Congress would add Medicare to the mix, allowing seniors who get so sick that they become eligible for Medicare's homebound coverage to use that benefit in a daycare setting.

Smith, who has suffered from a stroke and breast cancer in recent years, said she prefers daycare over in-home assistance because of the social benefits.

"You intermingle with people. You're not by yourself," said Smith, who added that she became depressed while stuck at home after her stroke.

Seniors who are eligible for Medicare's in-home benefit would qualify for daycare coverage under a pilot program included in the Medicare reform bills recently passed by the House and Senate.

"It gives seniors another choice," said Sen. Jim Bunning, R-Ky., and a lead supporter of the change.

Rep. Ron Lewis, R-Ky., inserted the provision in the House bill. "It allows them for some social contact, but it still allows them to be at home with their family," Lewis said.

A recent study funded by the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation determined there were about 2,100 adult daycare centers nationwide that provided seniors and disabled individuals with medical assistance.

About 80 percent of centers that participated in the survey reported being licensed or certified by states. More than 70 percent are run by nonprofits, and the average age of users is 72. Meals are usually provided, and activities range from art classes to field trips and even wheelchair exercises.

The daycare component of the

Medicare legislation has no opposition and even has the support of an industry group representing in-home nurses.

The legislation could ease problems associated with a nursing shortage and doesn't threaten the in-home nursing industry, said William Dombi, a lobbyist for the National Association for Home Care and Hospice.

"I don't think everybody that is a Medicare homebound patient is a candidate for adult day services," he said, noting that some patients can't leave their beds and others simply prefer to stay home.

The legislation's main supporters say their proposal will save the government money, since group care is more efficient than in-home services.

It generally costs about \$90 for a nurse to visit a patient at home, compared to about \$60 per day to treat, entertain and feed a senior in a daycare setting, said Bill Yarmuth, CEO of Almost Family, a Louisville, Ky.-based company that runs both an in-home nursing business and adult daycare centers.

Yarmuth said daycare facilities may see costs rise when they start routinely caring for patients so sick they're eligible for Medicare's homebound benefit, but he said daycare will still be cheaper than home care because nurses can see more people in a day if they don't have to travel.

Among the biggest supporters of the proposed benefit are relatives of seniors. "We've had great experiences with home health, but they were in and out," said Julie Smith, Patricia's daughter. "Leaving her alone was the scary part."

The House and Senate bills are slightly different. The House bill would establish the pilot program in five states. The Senate version, authored by Pennsylvania Republican Rick Santorum, would allow the demonstration to take place at three centers. A conference committee is expected to sort out the differences.



Parting is Such Sweet Sorrow

A previous owner of our home, in which we have now lived 21 years, raised the roof. With four sons, more space was needed, and he built, out of the back half of the attic, two bedrooms and a bath connected by a hallway.

The bigger room, now our study, contains a computer and four walls of bookcases. The hallway, until recently, held three bookcases, and the corner bedroom has four bookcases. Below, on the main floor, we have floor-to-ceiling bookcases of both sides of the living

room fireplace, another on the den wall, two half-wall bookcases embracing a corner fireplace on the sun porch, a large bookcase in a daughter's vacant bedroom, and a short case under the phone in the hall.

We ran out of bookshelves ten years back. Since then, we've been stacking books on the study floor, by the lounge chair, and beside the bed.

We have little of material value to show for 42 years of marriage, but we do have books — dozens of books, hundreds of books, probably two- or even three-thousand books.

Periodically, my ever-patient spouse, Betsy, would urge me to cull and give books away or to buy more bookcases. The local public library sometimes got boxes of novels and, once, even a complete 1971 set of encyclopedias. Still, the stacks grew faster than the cleanings, like algae. Books covered the entire carpeted floor, ten or more to a stack, with only a narrow pathway to the computer. When the ceiling in the den below the study creaked and appeared to be sagging, we knew time was running out for us.

One Saturday in June, we took down pictures and I installed bookcases down the upstairs hallway wall. Despite some false starts (miscounting the number of pine boards needed for shelving, running the electric screwdriver in reverse by error, buying 12-inch metal triangles for 10-inch planks), I still succeeded in having the shelves in place in a day's time.

This will be a piece of cake, I foolishly thought to myself.

The hard part lay ahead, concealed by my false optimism. It took three weeks to finish what I had started.

First, I had to cull out give-away books from existing bookcases, which only added to the piles and piles on the study floor.

Then I had to decide on a system for grouping books into compatible categories: biography, Civil War, southern history, southern culture, race studies, southern literature, southern literary criticism, Appalachian studies, southern states' histories, etc. That meant moving books from other bookcases to new areas on bookcases and culling those hundreds on the floor by categories.

It also meant stretching muscles seldom used, and spending a lot of time on my knees on the floor.

Worst of all, it meant revisiting old friends I treasure and neglect. I found myself taking longer and longer breaks, leafing through forgotten unforgettable prose, relishing the variety and savoring the words as if I were salivating at a Sunday dinner on the grounds. Saying farewell to old friends became harder as I pored over books and sweat poured from me night after night.

In the end, the mayhem was over. Thirteen boxes of books went to the Wofford library, thanks to the sturdy backs of two student workers and the spacious rear of the librarian's station wagon (the axle of which survived the journey). Four boxes of Alabama books went to Alabamian exiles in Dayton and one box of Kentucky books to friends in Lexington. Five boxes of African-American history, civil rights history and women's studies works went to our graduate student daughter and four boxes of fiction to her Maryland sister.

We bade each box good-bye with the mixed emotions we had when we sent those daughters to college, joyful that the books would have far, far better lives in the hands of people actually reading them instead of our hoarding them, but sorrowfully acknowledging that we were losing members of our family.

The day after the last box left (like Browning's "Last Duchess"), our new Oxford American magazine arrived. Rick Bragg — whose books we kept — writes in it about the pain (mental and physical) of divesting oneself of books: "While books are more than just possessions, while they are much more than paper and ink and cardboard and cloth, they are also damned heavy."

In his last move, "I found myself unwilling to part with almost anything... Before I know it the only ones I'm willing to give away are the ones — like 'To Kill a Mockingbird' — that I have two of."

We know that feeling.

Patients at risk Why medical malpractice reform is desperately needed in Kentucky

When I became a physician, I took an oath to always place the interests of my patients first. I promised to consider their needs above all else to ensure that they

receive the care they need and to provide care to all who seek it. Making sure that patients have access to quality health care is my duty as a physician. It's the duty of all physicians who practice medicine.

Sadly, the skyrocketing costs of medical malpractice insurance premiums are inhibiting access to quality care in Kentucky. According to a report from the Legislative Research Commission, "from 2001 to 2002 per capita premiums increased by 22 percent nationally while increasing 34% in Kentucky."

The above-average increases in premiums are forcing some doctors to close offices, others to provide essential services, and others to move to other states that have policies to keep premium rates low.

One area of medicine that has been hit particularly hard by the

using costs of medical malpractice insurance premiums is obstetrics and gynecology. In Kentucky, the average annual premium rate for OB-GYNs is \$63,012. In Jefferson County, the average premium jumped 23 percent to \$72,464 from 2001 to 2002.

If premiums continue to increase at the rate of 23 percent per annum, what doctor will be able to afford insurance? The alternatives are obvious: to avoid high premiums, a doctor must limit his or her services, move to another state, or quit the business altogether.

With each doctor that leaves the state, patient care suffers. For every obstetrician physician that moves away or shuts down their practice, 140 women are suddenly left without the quality care they need. Kentucky's ratio of doctors to the population is already well below the national average, especially in the rural parts of the state.

Kentucky patients simply cannot afford to lose any more of their doctors. With medical malpractice premiums driving doctors out of the state and away from providing essential services, the American Medical Association placed Kentucky on its list of "states in crisis."

With this crisis looming, it's time our leaders take initiative to correct the problem that has been ignored for far too long. To accom-

plish a lasting solution, an amendment to the Kentucky Constitution must be passed that will grant the Governor and state legislature the authority to tackle the medical malpractice issue.

Kentucky has a history of making sincere attempts to fix the ailing system, but each initiative has been largely undone by our judicial system. A constitutional amendment must be passed because the Kentucky Constitution does not provide the authority to develop policies to deal with the problems we're facing.

Once that constitutional authority is in place, the Governor and state legislature can and must cut to the root of the problem and seek a comprehensive solution to combat the skyrocketing premium costs. Other states that have enacted legislation to address these costs now have lower premiums and a greater number of physicians.

As Governor, I would support the establishment of a medical review panel to weed out frivolous lawsuits as well as malpractice insurance reform to prevent price gouging. I also support the Department of Insurance's recommendation that requires insurance companies to "designate the line" and submit their rates for review.

Furthermore, we must also enact reasonable limits on non-economic damages those damages paid out for "pain and suffering" as opposed to lost wages and medical bills. These caps have proven to be effective when included in comprehensive reform legislation. According to a report from the Health and Human Services, over the last two years, "states with limits...on non-economic damages have seen...preuums increase [only] 18 percent, but states without reasonable limits have seen increases of 45 percent."

We must commit ourselves to a collaborative effort that depolarizes the issue and works to build a coalition of the willing that intends to put patients' need for quality care above politics. By working together, we can foster an environment that affords patients the access to quality health care they deserve.

Republican gubernatorial candidate Ernie Fletcher was elected to his third term in 2002 to represent the 6th Congressional District of Kentucky. Prior to his election to the House, Fletcher was a family practice physician for 12 years and served for two years as CEO of the Saint Joseph Medical Foundation.

Bryant denies assault charge

EAGLE, Colo. (AP) — Kobe Bryant was charged Friday with sexually assaulting a 19-year-old woman in a case bound to tarnish the career of one of the NBA's brightest young superstars.

Bryant denied the charge, fighting back tears at a news conference in Los Angeles and saying he was guilty only of adultery.

"I didn't force her to do anything against her will. I'm innocent," he said, with his wife, Vanessa, at his side. "I sit here in front of you guys furious at myself, disgusted at myself for making a mistake of adultery."

The 24-year-old Los Angeles Lakers' guard faces four years to life in prison or 20 years to life on probation if convicted of the single felony count, Eagle County District Attorney Mark Hurlbert said.

Hurlbert said Bryant forced the woman into "submission" through physical force but refused to disclose other details.

The woman worked the front desk at the exclusive spa where Bryant was staying while in the state for knee surgery. Hurlbert said she would not be made available for comment.

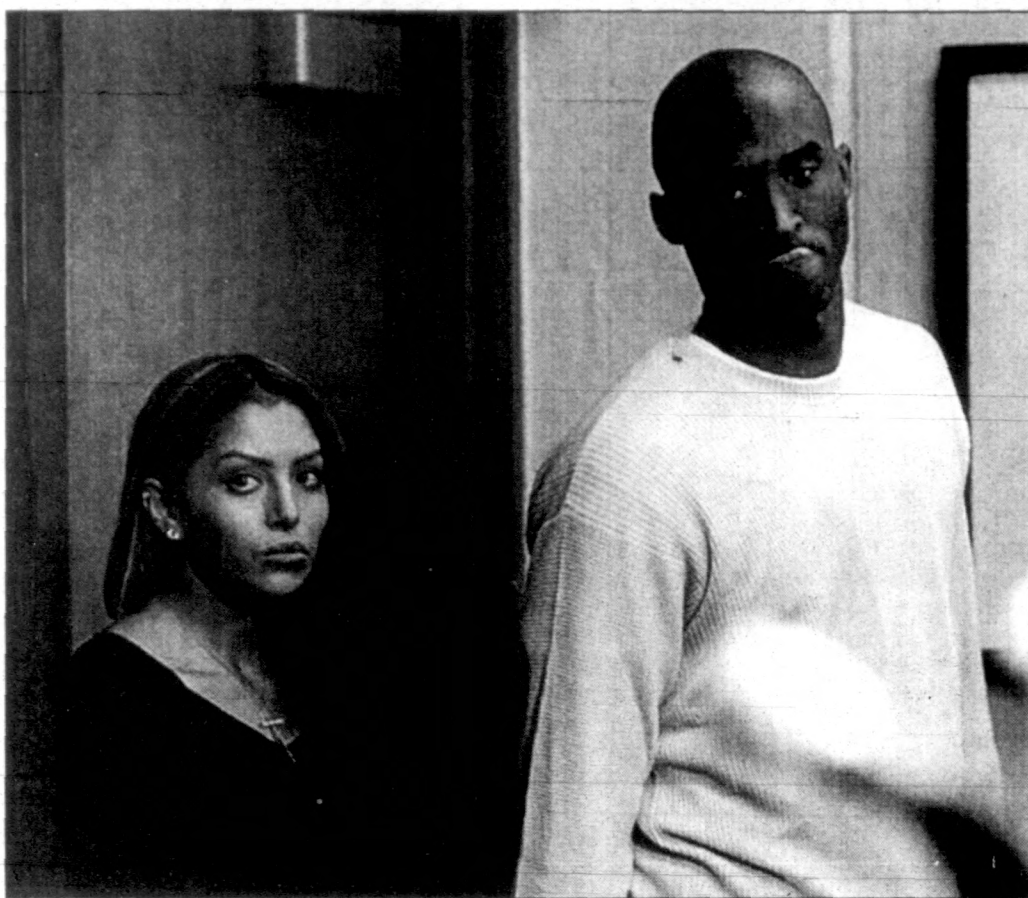
Bryant, free on \$25,000 bail, must return to court in Eagle on Aug. 6 for a hearing.

Bryant's attorney, Pamela Mackey, said he will plead innocent.

Speaking at Bryant's news conference at the Lakers' arena, Mackey said the defense will be that the sexual encounter was "between two consenting adults."

Bryant needed several seconds to compose himself before speaking, and his voice quivered once he started. His wife, who had their first child in January, held his right hand.

"I love my wife with all my heart. She's

my backbone," he said, turning to her.

Earlier, Vanessa Bryant released a statement, saying she stood by her husband.

"He is not a criminal," she said.

The case has riveted the sports world for nearly two weeks because it involves

one of the NBA's most magnetic stars. Bryant has also used his clean image to land lucrative endorsement contracts.

Just last month, he signed a multimillion-dollar sneaker deal with Nike to go with contracts he already had with Sprite, McDonald's and Spalding.

The case also raises questions about Bryant's summer plans and whether he will be able to play with the U.S. Olympic qualifying team, which begins practice Aug. 10 in New York.

The Lakers start practice in October for the 2003-04 season.

"Naturally, we're disappointed with today's announcement," Lakers general manager Mitch Kupchak said. "While there are many questions concerning this issue, we will wait for time and the judicial process to answer them."

NBA commissioner David Stern said the league would have no comment until the case is settled.

Hurlbert, who took office in December, said he consulted prosecutors around the state and pored over physical evidence and testimony before making his decision.

Bryant is accused of assaulting the woman June 30 at the gated Lodge & Spa at Cordillera in nearby Edwards. Bryant, who was having surgery in Vail, arrived at the lodge that day.

Eagle County sheriff's deputies took Bryant to Valley View Hospital in Glenwood Springs for tests early July 2, later letting him leave in a taxi with his bodyguards.

Bryant surrendered to authorities July 4 and was released an hour later after posting bond.

The arrest was announced July 6.

Dodgers topple Cards

LOS ANGELES (AP) — Rickey Henderson hit his first home run since returning to the major leagues, and the Los Angeles Dodgers rallied to beat the St. Louis Cardinals 8-5 Friday.

Henderson's 296th career homer and first since Aug. 17, 2002, trimmed the Cardinals' lead to 4-3 in the third inning. The former AL MVP spent last year with Boston but wasn't re-signed and played 56 games for Newark of the independent Atlantic League before the Dodgers signed him Monday.

Henderson, who played for Cardinals manager Tony La Russa in Oakland, is leading off and playing left field in the absence of injured outfielders Dave Roberts and Brian Jordan. He went 2-for-4.

Trailing 5-3 in the sixth, Shawn Green doubled against St. Louis starter Brett Tomko and scored on Adrian Beltre's sacrifice fly against Cal Eldred (3-3). After a two-out walk to David Ross, Cesar Izturis' RBI single tied it, and Daryle Ward made it 6-5 with a run-scoring single while batting for Kazuhisa Ishii (9-3).

Benitez shines in Yankee debut

NEW YORK (AP) — Armando Benitez made a successful debut in pinstripes.

The former Mets closer pitched two innings and held a four-run lead to help preserve Roger Clemens' 302nd win as the New York Yankees beat the Cleveland Indians 10-4 Friday night.

Jason Giambi homered twice, Ruben Sierra also connected and Alfonso Soriano hit a two-run double for New York, which rallied against Cleveland for the second

straight night and opened a four-game lead over second-place Boston in the AL East.

Benitez, maligned by Mets fans for blowing seven of 28 save chances this year, was obtained by the Yankees on Wednesday in a trade for three prospects.

Clemens (9-6) failed to hold a 3-0 lead, allowing three runs in the fourth and one in the fifth. But the Yankees rallied for five runs off Brian Anderson (7-7) and Jason Boyd in the sixth, an inning

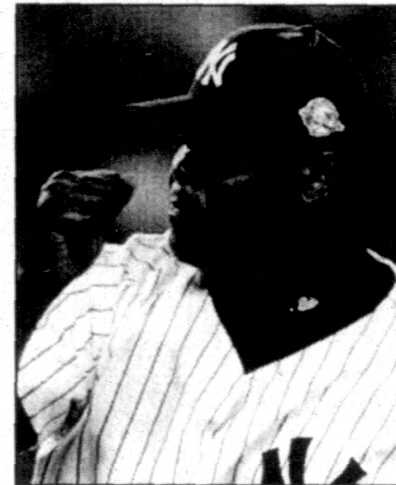
interrupted by a 61-minute rain delay.

Benitez entered with an 8-4 lead to a mixture of cheers and boos, and he struggled slightly with his control, throwing balls on 10 of 26 pitches over two innings and falling behind in the count at some point on six of seven batters. He also nearly hit plate umpire Laz Diaz trying to exchange baseballs after his second batter.

But Benitez escaped without

allowing any runs, giving up one hit and striking out two. When he blew a 3-2 pitch by Milton Bradley to end the seventh, Yankees captain Derek Jeter gave the reliever a glove slap on the behind as he ran past.

Clemens also had a hectic week as he starts the final half-season of his 20-year career in the major leagues. He was a late All-Star selection, flying around a hurricane to get to Tuesday's game in Chicago.

Rain ends Series stay at 2-3 for Mud Dogs

ST. LOUIS — The Murray Mud Dogs' shot at an AAYBA World Series consolation bracket championship was washed away Friday morning by heavy thunderstorms in and around the St. Louis area, where the tournament for 13-under teams was being held.

The showers wiped out Murray's 10 a.m. game against the Cincinnati Sharks and all other tournament games as well. The Mud Dogs finished the tournament with a 2-3 record.

"We would have liked to get to .500 for the tournament," said Mud Dogs coach Kevin Lamb. "It was a realistic goal that we thought we'd get after our slow start."

The Dogs began pool play 0-2 while their bats were in cold storage. Murray lost the first game against Mac-N-Seitz from Kansas City 9-1. In their second game, Murray fell 1-0 to the St. Louis Blast on an unearned run in the sixth inning.

Mac-N-Seitz is rated as the country's top team in USSSA sanctioned play, while the Blast is 10th in the nation.

The losses dropped the Dogs into consolation play, where they fell to the Carlyle (Ill.) Indians 6-1 in the opening round on Wednesday. The night air seemed to do the locals some good, as their offense came alive for a 7-3 win over the Hampton (Va.) Bombers later Wednesday evening.

Murray capped the week with a 5-1 win over the Houston Slam Thursday night.

"It's tough to say 'what if,' but one or two plays here or there could have been the difference in us playing for the overall championship," Lamb said. "Our intensity just wasn't there early and it showed up in our lack of offense. But we got much better by mid-week and played the kind of baseball we're known for."

The Mud Dogs' overall record for 2003 is 30-22. Murray won four tournament titles during the summer, including its third consecutive USSSA Kentucky State Championship.

Armstrong feels heat in time trial

CAP'DECOUCVERTE, France (AP) — Lance Armstrong wilted in the heat.

Parched and weak after a ride on a scorching day, the four-time Tour de France champion ran out of energy — and water — on a key stage leading to the Pyrenees.

The Texan finished second in an individual time trial Friday and lost precious time to one of his main rivals — stage winner Jan Ullrich of Germany, who moved into second place overall.

Not since Armstrong overcame cancer to return to the Tour in 1999 has his grip

on cycling's most prestigious race looked so tenuous.

He barely kept the overall lead after a crucial time trial in which riders unleash every bit of force to beat the clock.

Armstrong did extend his overall lead from 21 seconds to 34, but he had been counting heavily on using this stage to distance himself from the field.

Instead, Ullrich is lurking.

Ullrich, the 1997 winner and twice runner-up to Armstrong, powered across the 29 miles of rolling vineyards in 58 min-

utes, 32 seconds to take the 12th stage. He was the only rider of 167 to finish in less than an hour.

Ullrich, of Team Bianchi, shaved more than 1 1/2 minutes from Armstrong's lead as the race enters the lung-wrenching Pyrenees.

"Now he's the big favorite," Armstrong said.

Armstrong looked stunned when he ascended the podium to accept the leader's yellow jersey. Afterward, he seemed spent — physically and emotionally.

"I had an incredible crisis. ... I felt like I was pedaling backward," a flush-faced Armstrong said. Temperatures in the shade reached 97 and were far worse in the sun.

"Perhaps it was too hot for me. I don't know. I suffered."

Armstrong lamented running out of water before the final climb to the finish line. Ullrich, however, was absolutely buoyant.

"From the start, I never thought I could win this time trial," he said, sweat dripping from his face. "I got my old rhythm back ... I didn't expect this myself."

Pittman leads nation's four-wheelers

Sure, he looks like a champion. It's easy to picture the 9-year-old, 53-pound fourth-grader on a winning Little League baseball team or even as the community soccer prodigy.

But Tyler Pittman is a star on an extra-local level, and his sport, though fairly popular in Calhoun County, receives considerably less attention than baseball and soccer.

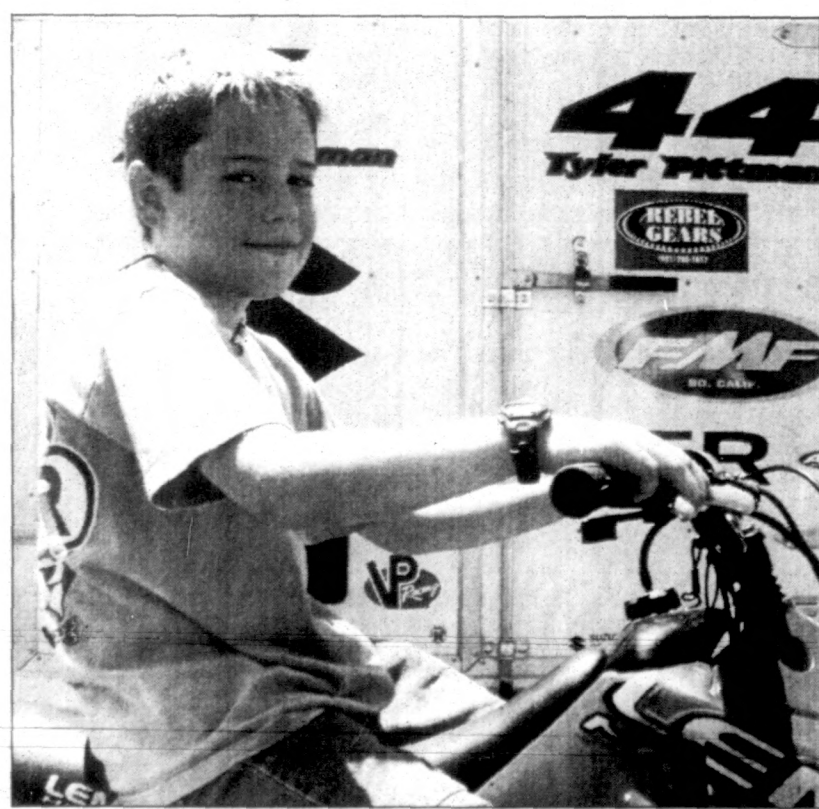
His family and friends are some of the only people who know he's No. 1 in the nation right now in four-wheeler racing in his age group. With a total of 212 points accumulated from the first eight rounds of the national championship series, Pittman is beating the runner-up by nine points.

One more first, second or third-place win will clinch Pittman as the No. 1 rider in the nation's 50cc Stock All Terrain Vehicle Association ITP Motocross Championship Series racing category.

With two more races left in the 10-race competition, Pittman has enough points to skip the last race and still be on top if he places in the top three at the Hurricane Mills, Tenn., race in August.

"Practice and riding a bunch" are what Pittman said he credits for his skills. He began racing when he was 7, during the summer before he began second grade.

"My friend at school ... said,

"Do you want to race at the fair race?" So I came home and asked if I could start racing," Pittman said.

His parents, Cliff and Ginger Pittman, agreed when they saw he

really wanted to do it. Before that day, he had not had much interest in riding, his mom said.

"He just decided one day (he) and his buddy wanted to race four-wheelers," she added. His friend

never started racing, but Pittman was driving his Suzuki over the dusty, bumpy tracks of local races and loving it too much to let the absence of his friend hamper him.

When Pittman began racing four-wheelers, he added yet another dimension to the family's racing interests. He has uncles who race motorcycles, go-carts, lawn mowers and cars, Ginger Pittman said.

A year after he started racing, one of his little followers was ready to begin her own racing career. Tyler Pittman's sister Abby, age 3 at the time, has raced locally since then.

She's 5 now, and likes the adventure racing offers: "There's jumps and I can jump them. I like baby dolls, but I like racing the best."

Her brother said he likes racing because "It feels cool." Though he isn't afraid when he's racing and jumping the hills on the tracks, crashing is scary, Pittman said.

How many times has he crashed? "Not very much," he said.

To avoid crashing, Pittman said when one set of wheels comes off the ground during a turn, he leans sideways so his weight is over the wheels that are off the ground.

"Well, if you're going into a curve, you flip up like this, turn the wheels this way and then lean the way that your wheels go," he said, demonstrating.

Traveling as fast as 35 miles

per hour during races mandates heavy racing uniforms. "You have long pants, a long T-shirt, you have gloves, a helmet, goggles, a chest-protector," Pittman said.

"And boots. I can't run in my boots," his sister added, explaining how heavy they are.

The elaborate uniforms are indicative of the expense of racing. At first, the family started small. They toted Pittman's four-wheeler to races in the back of their truck. Then they had to purchase a trailer to carry all the necessary equipment.

The four-wheelers — which eventually wear out and must be replaced — are big expenses, as well. Pittman's first and most basic four-wheeler cost about \$5,000, Ginger Pittman estimated.

Trips are another pricey part of the hobby — traveling to Mt. Morris, Penn., for the most recent race cost about \$800. "It's a never-ending thing, but as long as he enjoys it, we're going to go," Ginger Pittman said.

Fortunately, he gets considerable support from his sponsors, all of whom he can proudly rattle off: "Suzuki of Paris, Chris Grissom Racing Engines, Pittman Racing, Ezra's Cycle Shop, FMF, 909, AC Racing, Rebel Gears, Mobile Home Movers, my dad, my mom, my sister and the rest

of my family."

Pittman added that he thanks his uncle and aunt, Devin and Aleshia Banks, as well as his grandfather for their support.

"If it weren't for them, we wouldn't be able to do it," Ginger Pittman said.

The third sponsor Tyler Pittman listed, Pittman Racing, refers to the two siblings. "They started calling themselves Pittman Racing," Ginger Pittman said. During races, Abby watches and cheers for her brother, and he does the same for her when she's on the track.

Ginger Pittman said she never would have imagined "in a million years" that her children would be racing. Watching them have fun is the part she enjoys most about their sport. She said the looks on their faces as they're racing are priceless, though race days make her uncomfortably nervous and almost unable to eat.

Since the tracks, usually between a mile and mile-and-a-half long, are so hilly, Ginger Pittman and her husband stand on opposite sides so one of them can see their son almost all the time.

"Some of the places, they disappear and you can't see them," she said.

During a recent race, when Pittman topped the hill just feet ahead of his opponent, the feeling his mom got made everything worth it. "Words just can't describe it," she said.

Tyler Pittman was able to describe how he felt, though.

"Excited and very, very tired," he said, adding that since he competes in two categories, the 8- to 15-year-old and the 4- to 8-year-old slots, he often has back-to-back races. Pittman has raced in the 4- to 8-year-old category since he was 8 when the competition began.

Accompanying him in the 8- to 15-year-old category are several other locals. Jordan Roach of Hazel holds the first-place spot, while Zachary White of Hazel holds fourth place and Cody Gibson of Mayfield holds fifth.

Though the 8- to 15-year-old category offers steeper competition, Pittman, in sixth place, has pulled the hole shot — reached the first turn before anyone else — in several of those races. He's pulled the hole shot in every 50cc race.

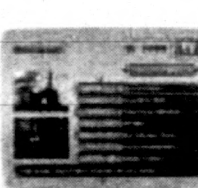

Anglers hope mayflies hatch in July

We are still looking for the massive mayfly hatches to begin so we can get our flyrods out and have some fun with the popping bugs.



Fishing Line

We could do it now, except that the flies are scarce and the waters are so clear that the fish are very shy. You get a lot of short strikes, and the majority of the action comes from the long-ear sunfish instead of the big bluegill.

We are seeing a decent crop of young bass of all three species out on Kentucky Lake. Hopefully, they can survive to become adults.

Be super-careful when you catch these young fish, and be sure to wet your hands before you attempt to handle them!

They are super-fragile. You can contract a fungus from handling them if you remove any protective mucus. This is the viscous liquid and protective coating that helps the fish prevent diseases of the skin.

Now that our waters are 84 degrees and climbing, we must be careful to prevent any injuries. Our water clarity is also a factor now

since it has become so clear.

Many species do not move well in clear waters until it's absolutely necessary to eat. At that point, it may be at night when they do!

We lost about 14 inches of our waters in a couple of days, and then the fish went numb. They haven't responded well this week at all. That has been due to the lack of water movement during primetime feedings.

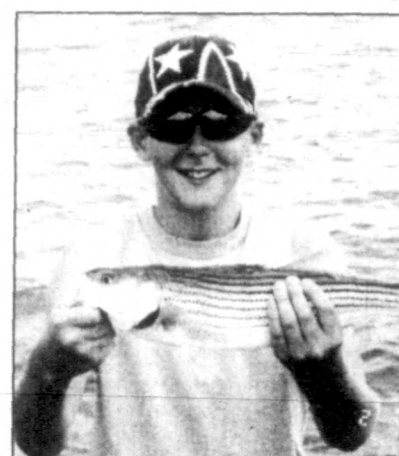
Sporadic feeding is what we have been dealing with for a few days. If you are there with the right baits, you can catch some fish. Otherwise, you should hunt and search for a pattern. Then you can put a plan together.

I enjoyed being with Steve, Pat, Amanda and Jenny Tribble last week. I compare it to a lost family returning to fishing again. Amanda and Jenny are grown now. They are looking to advance their education and be prepared to enter the working world.

We always enjoy them so much. Fishing is as much a part of life as working. This time, we didn't have the good currents helping us. We struggled with several different techniques before we could begin to put some fish in our cooler.

Everyone has their own style of casting. It always works, and slowly the numbers begin to add up to a decent catch for the freezer.

Naturally, the girls compete with

each other. It's good, clean action. But it's intense!

Steve and Pat are good anglers in their own right. You have to be tough to beat them! Right now, it's a tossup on who the champion would be. Both of them are happy for the chance to compete!

Amanda hooked and landed a big catfish on her artificial lure, which made her the champion! Jenny produced numbers to claim the title for the most fish. Everyone was happy, and they had a bag of fillets to show as a trophy!

Those fish are tremendous fighters. They will surely test your tackle. I managed to boat 28 of them, and I lost twice that many because of their fighting ability.

I don't care to keep any of them — unless they are 10 pounds or more because I prefer to cook them on the grill the same as I do swordfish!

I couldn't help but notice how many there are in Kentucky Lake now. I'm wondering what these great fish are going to be eating this year? All shad, I hope!

We don't have the answers yet, but the fact that they are coming at a time when our shad count is low could possibly pose a problem later on for our other species of gamefish.

Not only could our bass and crappie be deprived of shad, the young fry they produced could end up as food for these voracious feeders. They will outgrow all other species in a single season. They are fun to catch and good meat producers, but I couldn't help wondering how much — if any — damage they will cause.

I fished out of the Kentucky Beach Resort on Monday with a couple of great guys — Gilbert Lassus and Armando Aviazola. They wanted to fish, so we tried everything we could to produce enough for a big meal.

We threw spinners, tubes, peanut butter catfish bait and spoons. They finally began to click and catch a few fish for us.

Armando and Gilbert are pretty knowledgeable anglers. They had good equipment to use on the fish. Both men had some real exciting battles with big blue channel catfish. Fortunately, their line was new and strong. We were able to land the fish!

You may think the catfish were caught on the stink bait, but they were not!

We used the stink bait, but all we could get was hard taps without any takers. I quit the stuff and looked for the stripers again by bouncing spoons along the bottom. That's how we produced most of our catfish this past week!

They will slam into a spoon and hurt your wrist if you're not careful.

Both Gilbert and Armando hooked and landed largemouth and smallmouth bass, rockfish stripers and blue channel catfish. I almost forgot about the stripers!

We had a slow day at times, but good things happened and we took advantage by taking a big cooler of fish! Gilbert and Armando are very nice guys. I hope we can go out again sometime and pursue those stripers!

It's hot out there, so take plenty of sunscreen and a hat to protect you from the sun. The body will need fluids, so liquid refreshments are in order. Remember, use common sense!

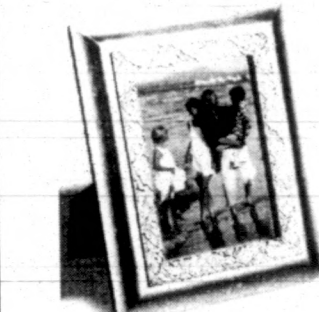

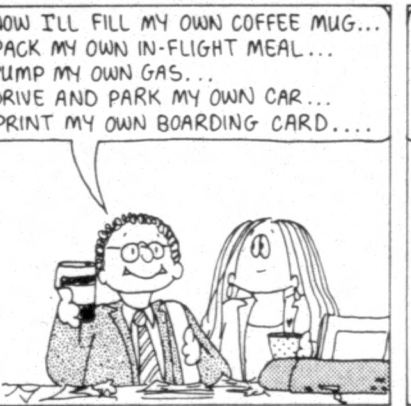

CONTRACT BRIDGE The Step-By-Step Approach

South dealer. Both sides vulnerable. NORTH: ♠ Q 7 6 5, ♥ Q J 8 2, ♦ Q 5 2, ♣ 10 4. WEST: ♠ 4 2, ♥ 6 5, ♦ J 9 7 3, ♣ J 8 6 5 2. EAST: ♠ A K J 10 9, ♥ 7 3, ♦ K 10 6, ♣ Q 9 3. SOUTH: ♠ 8 3, ♥ A K 10 9 4, ♦ A 8 4, ♣ A K 7.

The bidding: South 1♥, West Pass, North 2♥, East 2♣. Opening lead — four of spades.

Assume you're declarer in four hearts and West leads the spade four. Obviously, you must lose two spade tricks, so making the contract depends on whether you lose one diamond trick or two.

If West has the king of diamonds, it's easy enough to hold yourself to one diamond loser by leading low toward the queen at some point. But if East has the king and you lead low to the queen, you lose two diamond tricks and go down one.

You should start by making a tentative assessment of which opponent

is more likely to have the king. Since East entered the bidding on the two-level, you should conclude that he probably has the king.

Your next step is to visualize opposing distributions that would allow the contract to be made even though East has the king of diamonds. For example, you could mentally assign the singleton or doubleton king of diamonds to East and then easily manage the play so as to make the contract.

But by far your best chance is to try to force East to lead away from his assumed king of diamonds, since that would solve your problem even if he had three or more diamonds including the king.

Accordingly, after East wins the opening spade lead with the nine and continues with the king and then the ten of spades, you ruff high. After drawing trumps, you next cash the A-K of clubs, ruff a club and lead dummy's last spade, the queen.

But instead of ruffing it, you discard a diamond! This puts East on lead and forces him to return a diamond from the king or yield a ruff-and-discard. Either way, you make the contract.

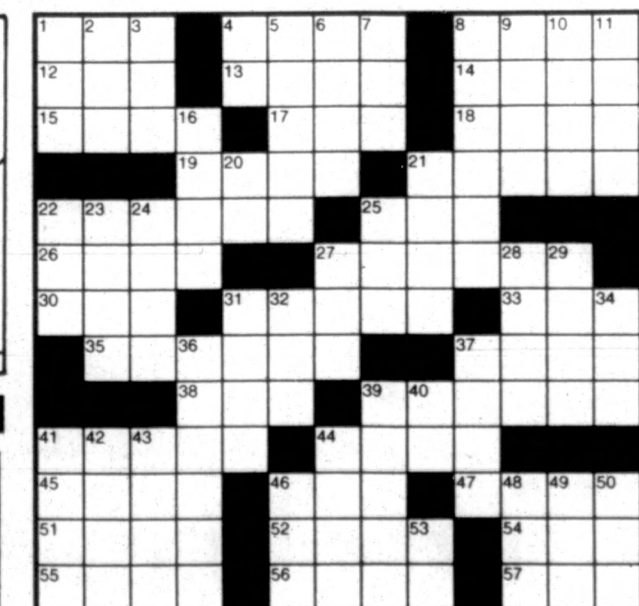
As happens so often when you're declarer, you could not be 100 percent certain of the ultimate outcome. All you could do was to follow your convictions and hope everything would eventually work out right.

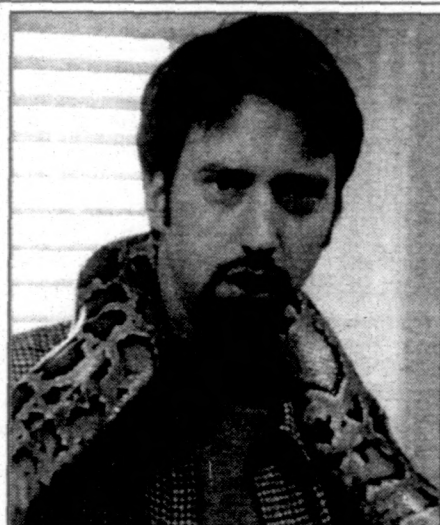

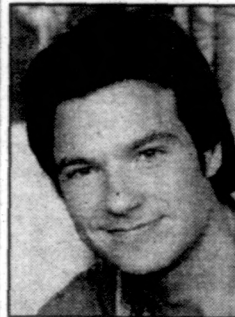

Q: I recently saw Jason Bateman on a "Twilight Zone" episode. Wasn't he on a sitcom with Valerie Harper and Josh Taylor? —Donna in Baltimore.

A: Yes, and I'm not surprised that you can't remember the name of it. At 17, Bateman played David Hogan, the son of Valerie and Michael Hogan (Harper, Taylor) when the NBC sitcom "Valerie" premiered in 1986.

Harper left the show in the fall of 1987 following a highly publicized dispute with the producers, at which point the show's title was changed to "Valerie's Family," then later to "The Hogan Family," a title that stuck until the series ended in 1991.

Now 34, Bateman returns to series television this fall in "Arrested Development," a decidedly edgy and very funny Fox sitcom in which he heads a cast that also includes Portia de Rossi, David Cross and Jessica Walter. And in case you haven't heard, Bateman married singer-songwriter Paul Anka's daughter, Amanda, in 2001.

Q: I recently heard that Jesse Nilsson of "Adventure Inc." died. What happened to him? —Daniel J. Benkert, Saginaw, Mich.

A: A lifelong asthmatic, the 25-year-old actor died of heart failure on

April 25 at his parents' home in North York, Ont. Nilsson had been battling pneumonia for two weeks prior to his death but was thought to be on his way to recovery when he died.

Funeral services were held May 1 in Toronto. Nilsson is survived by his parents and two siblings.

Q: I watched an early episode of "Friends" in which Ross's ex-wife, Carol, was played by a different actress. Who was she? —Bill Taylor via e-mail.

A: Actress Anita Barone, who had auditioned unsuccessfully for one of the three female leads, played Carol in "The One With the Sonogram at the End," the second episode of the series, which first aired Sept. 29, 1994. Although the producers offered this recurring role to Barone, the actress decided she preferred to look for something more full-time, so she left after this single appearance. Jane Sibbett has played Carol each time the character has appeared since then.

Q: Did Nicole Kidman and Ewan McGregor really do their own singing in "Moulin Rouge"? —V.L.G., Lakewood, Calif.

A: Yes, and if you stay through the end credits of McGregor's current movie comedy "Down With Love," you'll hear him sing with co-star Renee Zellweger — who, coincidentally, was rumored to have been next in line for Kidman's "Rouge" role.

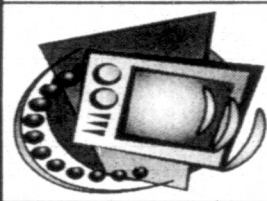

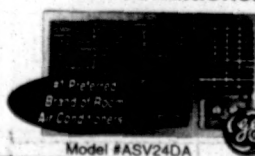
