Downtown master plan focus of workshop

The City of Murray, in partnership with Murray Main Street, is creating a Downtown Master Plan. The Plan will serve as a user-friendly tool and provide a foundation for redevelopment in downtown and historic residential areas and to create a corridor to the University. The study area is centered upon Main Street with the approximate project boundaries being 4th Street to 16th Street (east to west), and Olive Street to Elm Street (north to south).

A Visioning Workshop will be held from 6-8 p.m. on Monday, Nov. 22, at the Convention and Visitors Bureau. The structure of the workshop will allow for residents, business owners, elected and appointed officials, members of the consultant team and others to work together in creating a vision for the Downtown.

The Workshop will include both small and large group working sessions to review and discuss conditions and potentials within the Downtown area. Small breakout groups will work together to develop visions for the future of the Downtown. The meeting will conclude with general agreement regarding the long-term role and character of Murray Downtown and the projects and improvements that will be desirable in the future.

For those unable to attend the workshop but still wanting to participate in the planning process, visit the project website to complete an online community questionnaire and view future meeting dates and to review draft plans and reports. Two types of online question-

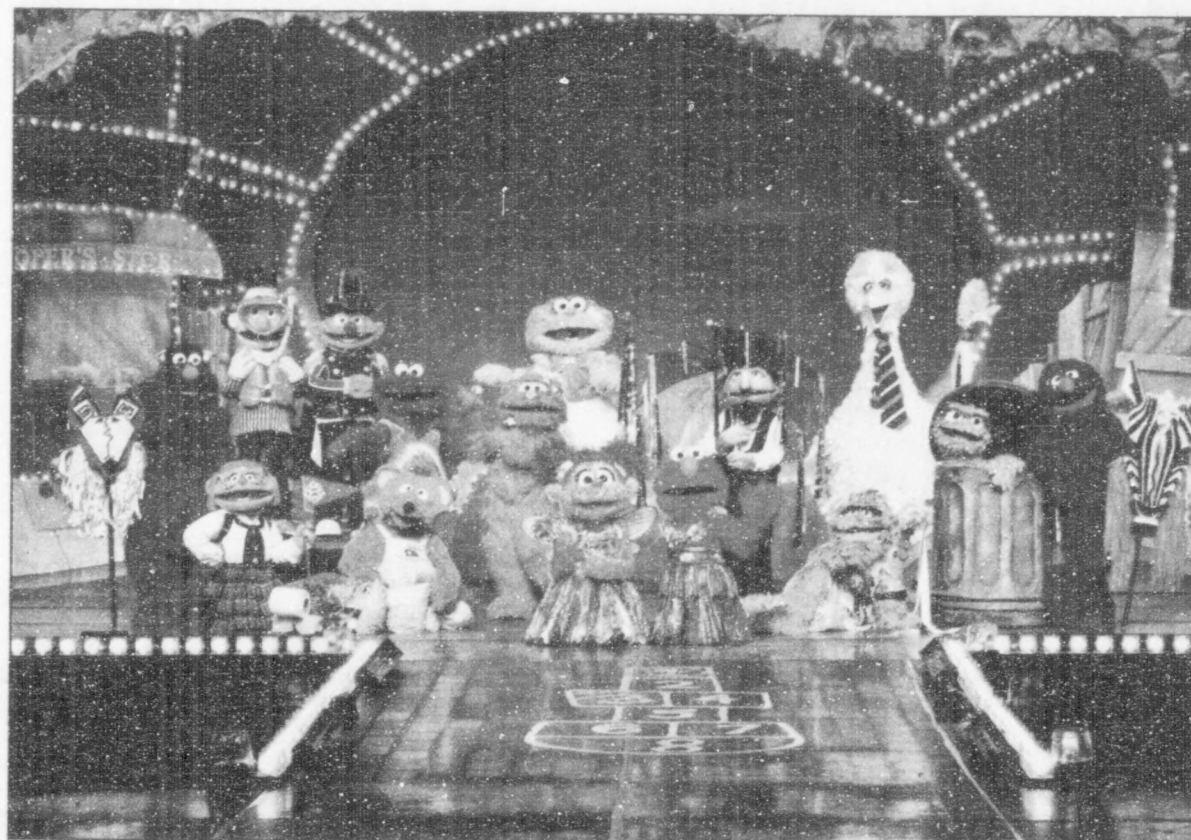

Plans underway for annual Rotary Christmas Parade

As December approaches, plans and registration for this year's 9th annual Rotary Christmas Parade are underway.

Donna Poston is this year's parade chair and said the parade will be held on Saturday, Dec. 4, at 10 a.m. The parade will be themed "Sharing the Joy of Christmas," and will begin at the intersection of Main and Tenth streets, proceeding down Main Street to the court square.

Parade float entries are currently being accepted and there is no entry fee. Poston said. Entry forms are available printed in the Murray Ledger & Times or online at www.MurrayRotary.org. They also may be picked up at the Murray-Calloway Chamber of Commerce and the Murray Convention and Visitors Bureau. Entry forms are due Friday, Nov. 26, at 5 p.m.

On Dec. 2 and 3, parade participants will receive a phone call with their lineup number and street information. The details will also be on the Murray Rotary Club's website, Poston said. Lineup for

the parade will begin at 9 a.m. the day of the parade and will be assisted by the local amateur radio club.

Floats will be entered into a competition and judged in three categories. The categories are commercial, church/religious and club/civic organization. First place in each division will receive \$150, second place \$100 and third place \$75.

Poston said the parade committee has discussed the throwing of candy during the parade and recognized it can be a

MEMPHIS, Tenn. (AP) — Bill and Melinda Gates are checking on one of their latest investments — the Memphis city schools.

The foundation begun by Bill Gates, a co-founder of

Microsoft, and his wife gave the local schools \$90 million nearly a year ago.

During a visit to Hamilton High School on Wednesday, a student reporter asked why the couple came there.

The Commercial Appeal reported Bill Gates responded, saying that the best place to invest in a strong economy in Memphis is in the high schools.

The city school system in Memphis has a graduation rate of 65 percent.

The schools spent \$5.2 million in grant money last year to recruit new principals, improve school culture and get an outside nonprofit organization to hire new teachers.

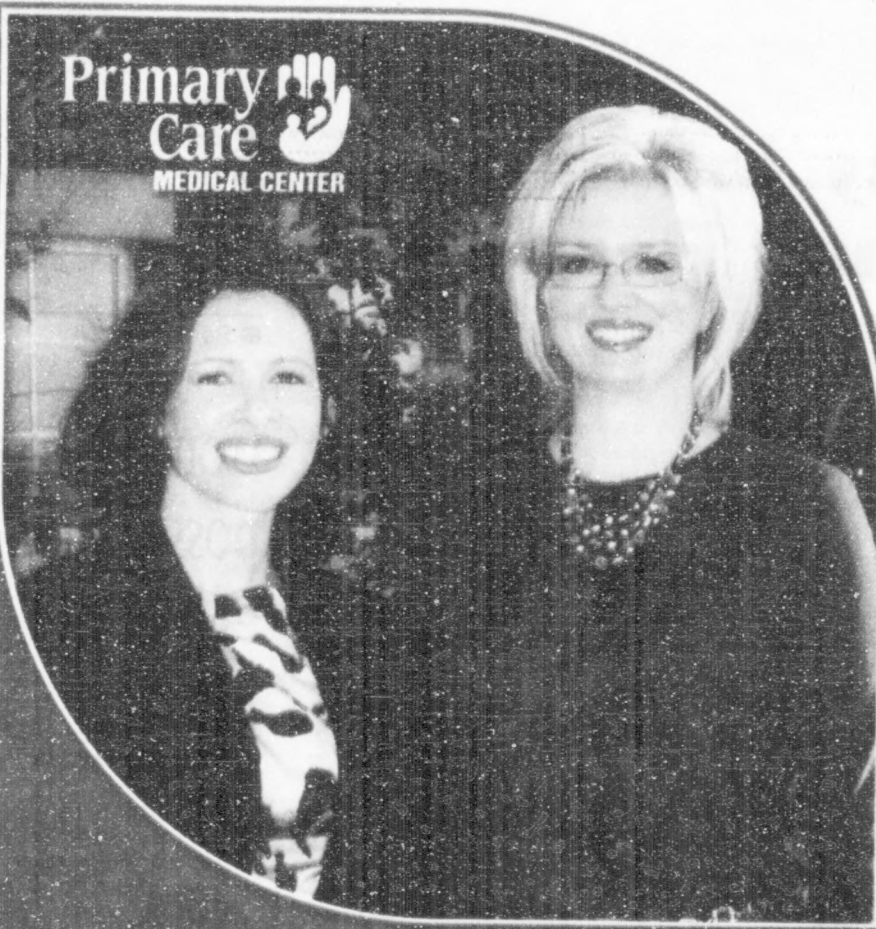

CCSO investigating possible fatality

One person reportedly died Friday afternoon in a one-vehicle accident on Douglas Road, according to local officials.

Calloway County Fire-Rescue, Calloway County EMS and Calloway County Sheriff's Department officials responded to an accident with injuries around 2:45 p.m. to the location approximately six miles southeast of Murray on Ky. 1536.

The vehicle was reported to be off the road and fully engulfed

in flames. Sheriff's Capt. Richard Steen reported at the scene that no one apparently made it out of the vehicle.

The roadway was blocked at Douglas and Scott Fitts as well as Douglas and Wright roads by Calloway County DES Rescue teams while officials investigated the accident to determine the cause and to determine who may have been inside the vehicle. Calloway County Coroner Rick Harris was called to the scene.

No further details were available as of press time.

MPD's Det. Clere one of 12 recent KCA grads

The Murray Police Department's Det. Angel Clere was one of 12 crime scene investigators from across the commonwealth to recently graduate from the Department of Criminal Justice Training's fourth Kentucky Criminalistics Academy (KCA).

KCA is a 10-week, 400-hour course. Through the KCA, Detective Clere received training in bloodstain-pattern recognition, explosives investigation, shooting reconstruction and bullet trajectory, computer-crime investigation and digital evidence, alternate light sources and luminol, crime scene management, death investigation (autopsy, postmortem fingerprinting and wound analysis), digital photography, trace evidence, DNA and more.

Clere and other KCA graduates now possess the knowledge to respond to and assist with any criminal investigation, including those involving terrorism, as well as other incidents that result in mass casualties, such as natural disasters.

Among the highlights of the CSI training is a week of study at the renowned "Body Farm" — or Anthropological Research Facility — at the University of Tennessee in Knoxville, where CSIs and scientists study human decomposition after death. At the Body Farm, the Kentucky CSIs collected scattered human bones and excavated a buried body. They also attended lectures on forensic anthropology, time since death, forensic odontology and participated in field exercises in osteology and entomology.

"The Kentucky Criminalistics Academy has given me the knowledge and training in 10 weeks that would normally have taken 10 years," Clere said.

Foust slated to rule Monday on request to dismiss plea

Circuit Judge Dennis Foust is scheduled to decide Monday whether a Murray man accused of murder in the death of Calloway resident Carl Douglas McGowan will face sentencing under a previous plea agreement or be scheduled for a jury trial.

Michael A. Lynch, 29, had previously entered an Alford plea in a plea deal with Commonwealth's Attorney Mark Blankenship. He was scheduled to be sentenced to 25 years in prison last month. However Lynch has asked the court to throw out his plea and requested a jury trial. Lynch is represented by Cheri Decker of the Kentucky Department of Public Advocacy's Murray office.

The accused was charged with murder in McGowan's death by physical assault about a year ago.

Assistant Commonwealth's Attorney Cirris Hatfield had asked Foust to deny the motion based on the previously-agreed plea. Foust said he would rule on whether to grant or deny Lynch's action Monday.

Additional hearings concerning the matter are a possibility. When entering an Alford plea, the accused does not admit guilt, but does admit the state may have evidence to prove the stated charge.

Also, Brandon S. McManomy, 23, of Evansville, Ind., is expected to appear for a status hearing on charges of rape and sodomy in an alleged attack on a female Murray State University student in August. McManomy is scheduled for a jury trial June 8, 2011. The accused has pleaded innocent to charges of first-degree rape, first-degree sodomy, kidnapping, first-degree assault and violation of an emergency protective/domestic violence order from another state during arraignment. McManomy is accused of attacking the victim on university grounds. He was arrested in Indiana following an investigation by the Murray Police Department. McManomy remains in Calloway County Jail under a \$100,000 bond.

The press kit says that the 2010-2011 season marks the 31st touring season for "Sesame Street Live." It premiered in September 1980 at the Met Center in Bloomington, Minn.

and is now the longest-running children's touring show in history. The shows have toured five continents in more than 30 countries beyond the United States.

Denise Pajak, 27, lives in Buffalo, N.Y. and currently plays Bert in the touring show. In a telephone interview, she said this was her fourth year touring with "Sesame Street Live" and the second year in this particular show. She said she has been dancing since she was 3 years old, a physical performing background that has served her well in creating the beloved character inside the confines of her Bert costume.

She decided when she was 17 that she wanted to continue performing as a adult and has also worked at Disneyland's Magic Kingdom theme park in Anaheim, Calif., she said.

Like most Americans 40 or younger, Pajak grew up watching "Sesame Street," so the importance of the characters in children's lives is not lost on her. She said she remembers in particular being obsessed with Cookie Monster as a child. Since the show is more or less universally beloved, she always gets strong reactions from anyone she meets when she mentions what she does for a living.

"Everybody who ever finds out thinks it's the coolest thing in the world," Pajak said. "I mean, how many people do you know who can say they play Bert from 'Sesame Street'?"

Pajak said performing in the show is one of the best jobs she has ever had. When she was still in college, she found out the company needed a replacement. She was tall enough to perform in the costume, so she went for it. One of the biggest reasons she loves her job is seeing the smiles on the faces in the audience. Since most parents at the shows also grew up with "Sesame Street," they love it too, and grandparents often come along to see their grandchildren enjoy themselves, she said.

Pajak said she also loves her job because of all the places she has been able to visit. With only 13 people in the cast, the performers are very much like a family and they get to travel all over the world. Since she began working with "Sesame Street Live," Pajak has been all over the U.S., as well as Puerto Rico, Mexico, Peru, Panama, Spain Portugal and Canada, she said. Since shows are usually only Thursdays through Sundays, she and the cast actually have time to rest and enjoy the cities they visit, a rarity for most touring performers.

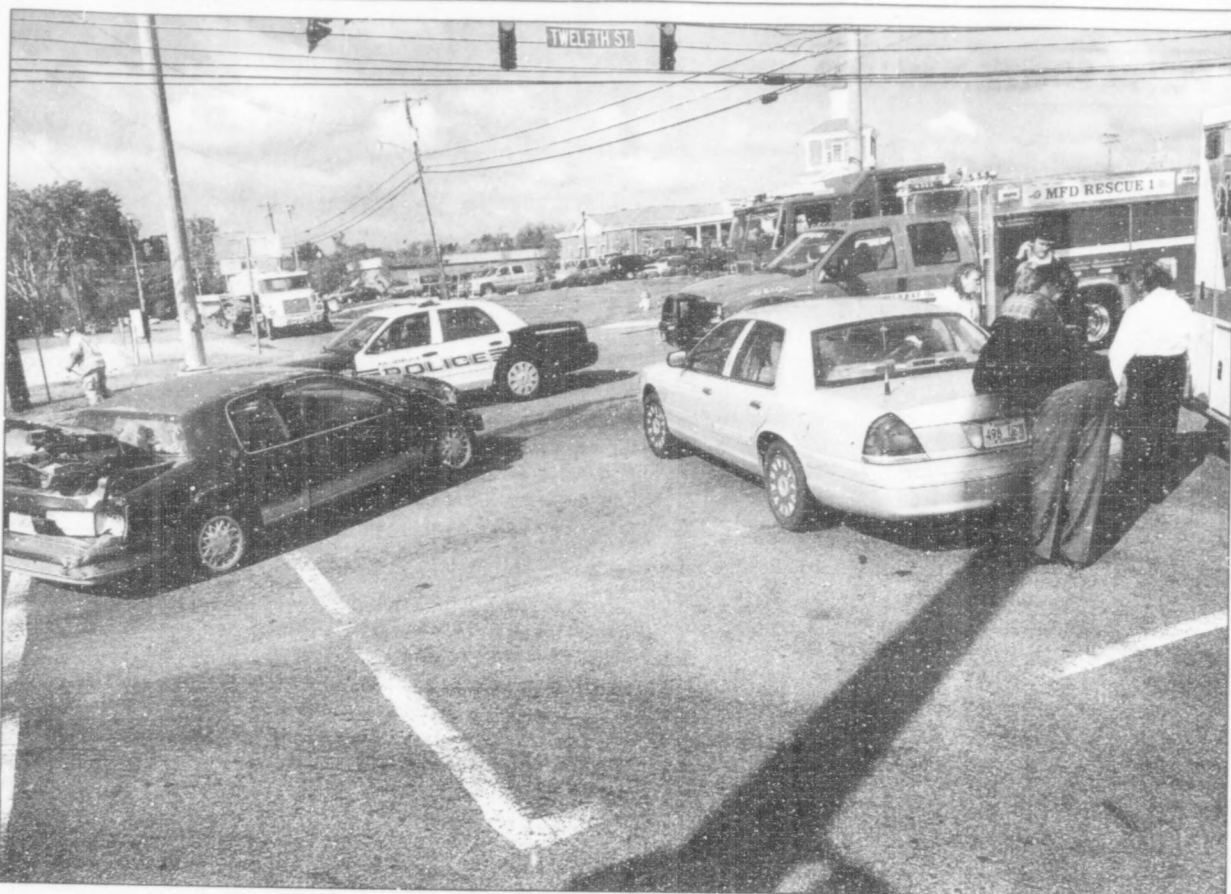

Fuel leak halts Friday launch of space shuttle

CAPE CANAVERAL, Fla. (AP)—A potentially dangerous hydrogen gas leak cropped up as NASA fueled Discovery for liftoff Friday, resulting in yet another delay for the space shuttle's final voyage — possibly until the end of the month.

It was the latest problem — and most serious — to hit NASA's oldest and most traveled shuttle over the past week.

Another attempt would not be made before Monday, NASA spokesman Allard Beutel said.

Midway through the fueling process Friday, hydrogen gas began leaking from the attachment point for a vent line on the external tank. It's the same type of problem that forced delays for two shuttle missions last year, and had not reoccurred since then.

Managers halted the countdown two hours after fueling began. The six astronauts had

yet to board the shuttle.

Discovery's final mission already had been running four days late because of technical and weather problems.

Monday represents the last opportunity this month for NASA to send the shuttle to the International Space Station with a load of supplies and the first humanoid robot bound for orbit. Otherwise, the flight will be off until Nov. 30 because of unacceptable solar angles.

Beutel said it will be a challenge to fix the problem by Monday.

The leak, described as substantial, was considered serious because of the flammability of hydrogen gas.

Friday was the closest NASA had come to launching Discovery on this mission and the veteran crew of astronauts led by commander Steven Lindsey. News of the leak came as a disappointment.

Compromise possible for ending tax cuts...

Obama's long-standing position has been that individuals with incomes less than \$200,000 a year and couples making less than \$250,000 should continue to enjoy the tax cuts enacted during George W. Bush's presidency, but that those making more should return to the higher rates before Bush took office.

The tax cuts, enacted in 2001 and 2003, are due to expire Dec. 31. They include lower income tax rates, a \$1,000 per-child tax credit, relief for married couples and lower taxes on investments and large estates.

Gibbs said the White House wants the issue dealt with before Jan. 1 so that taxpayers will avoid seeing more money with-

held from their paychecks or being hit by the higher alternative minimum tax. This would produce an average \$3,700 higher tax bill come April for some 30 million middle-income families.

"I think what the president believes is that we have both houses coming back and that this is an issue that must and has to be dealt with in that session," Gibbs said.

Republicans welcomed the developments but expressed caution since the White House hasn't been more explicit.

"I take any signal that the president may be backing off his pledge to raise taxes on small businesses as a good sign, but we have to see where this discussion goes," said Rep. Dave

Camp, R-Mich., who will become chairman of the tax-writing House Ways and Means Committee in January.

Even before the election, Democrats were splintered over Obama's plan to raise taxes on people with high incomes. The GOP might win a showdown if it came to that in the current Congress.

The obvious — and perhaps only — way to get an agreement this year is for a one- or two-year extension of all the tax cuts. The incoming Congress and Obama would then have plenty of time to sort it out later.

"There's bipartisan opposition to raising taxes on anybody," said Senate Minority Leader Mitch McConnell, R-Ky. "What I hope we'll do is come together

and agree to extend the current tax policy for everyone."

McConnell spokesman Don Stewart said the Republican Senate leader is amenable to a two-year extension.

Gibbs reiterated that Obama won't go along with a permanent extension of the upper bracket tax cuts, which would cost about \$700 billion over the upcoming decade.

"Making those tax cuts for the upper end permanent is something that the president does not believe is a good idea," Gibbs said.

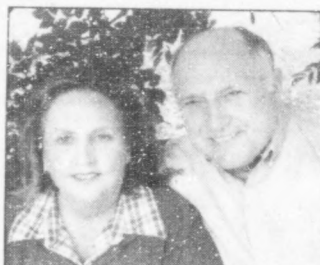
Failing to extend the Bush-era tax cuts wouldn't affect next year's filing season but employers would have to withhold more money from workers' paychecks.

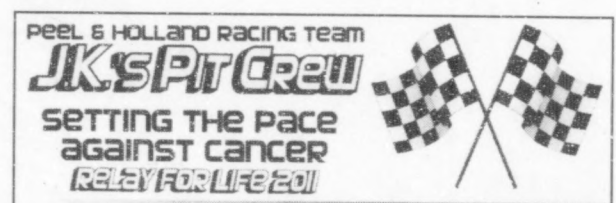
Haslam to step down as Knoxville mayor

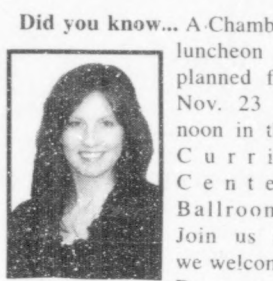

Stock futures turn higher on strong jobs report

NEW YORK (AP) — Stock futures are turning higher after the government reported a big jump in job creation last month.

Employers added 151,000 jobs in October, the biggest gain in five months and more than double what analysts were expecting.

The strong report from the Labor Department early Friday sent U.S. stock index futures higher in pre-market trading.

Dow Jones industrial average futures bounced back from earlier losses and were up 16, or 0.1 percent, at 11,403 shortly after the employment report came out.

S&P 500 futures are up 2, or 0.2 percent, at 1,220 and Nasdaq 100 futures are up 2, or less than 0.1 percent, at 2,186.

The yield on the 10-year Treasury note edged up to 2.55 percent from 2.50 percent.

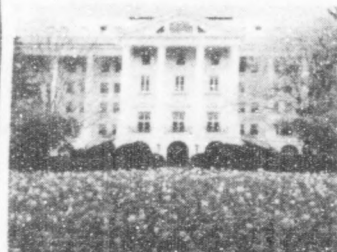

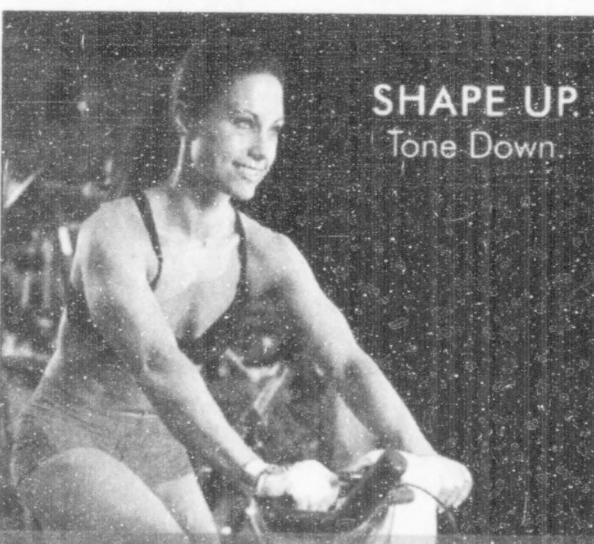

TVA CEO gets 10 percent compensation increase

ATHENS, Ala. (AP) — The Tennessee Valley Authority board voted Thursday to give TVA President and CEO Tom Kilgore a 10 percent increase in his largely incentive-based compensation package to \$3.6 million.

That package includes Kilgore's annual salary of \$850,000, which remains the same for 2011. Kilgore said he has not received any increase in two years.

It was the board's first meeting with three new appointed members and one reappointed by President Barack Obama.

Kilgore said a decision about 2010 bonuses for other TVA executives will be made later this month. There was no bonus last year due to the economy and the utility's December 2008 coal ash spill that is costing \$1.2 billion to clean up at its Kingston Plant.

The cleanup of the 54-million-cubic-yards spill at the plant in East Tennessee is ongoing and was not mentioned at the meeting. Kilgore said afterward that deciding the ash from the Emory River is finished.

"We've got everything out of the river and it's probably left better than it was before the spill," he said.

Kilgore said the remaining spilled ash on the riverside landscape will be cleaned up within two years and kept at the site.

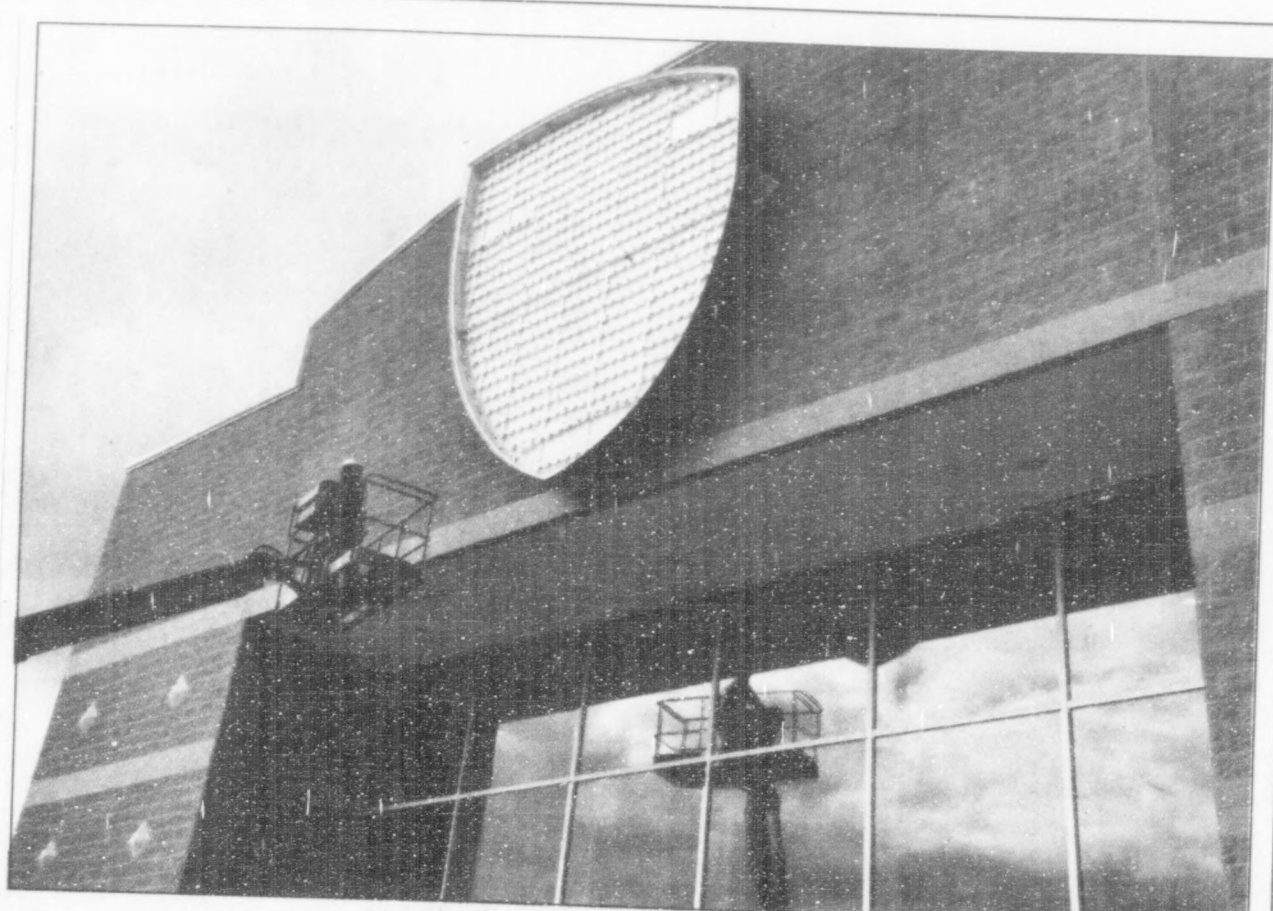
He said TVA had a good year financially in fiscal 2010, which ended Sept. 30, and expects no increases in base rates this year. The utility expects that payments it makes to state and local governments in lieu of taxes, which increased by 9 percent in 2010 to a total of \$550 million, will decrease this year to about \$520 million due to a drop in rates.

Kilgore also said after the meeting that although the board has not made a decision, TVA is likely moving ahead with plans to resume building one of its unfinished reactors at the Bellefonte Plant in northeast Alabama.

"I think that's pretty obvious," he said.

The board in August included \$248 million in the fiscal year 2011 budget for initial engineering design and site preparation for Unit 1 at the site plant. Kilgore said final approval for the project is not expected until next spring.

The board also approved spending up to \$160 million to build new cooling towers at the Browns Ferry Plant. When finished by 2013, they are expected to prevent the river from heating to the level that forced TVA to interrupt operations during the summer and avoid switch-off costs.

Earthquakes dog Clinton on overseas trips

CHRISTCHURCH, New Zealand (AP) — What is it about Hillary Rodham Clinton and earthquakes? Seems the secretary of state rarely takes an overseas trip that is not in some way affected by a tem-

blor. She may not have felt the earth move under her feet, but as her plane landed Friday in Christchurch, the city was hit by an aftershock from a 7-magnitude quake that struck in September. Two days earlier, as she wrapped up a visit to Papua New Guinea, a 6.0-magnitude quake rattled villages there.

Those seismic events were at least the third and fourth to have hit countries while Clinton was visiting. On her first trip abroad as America's top diplomat in February 2009, Clinton was shaken awake by a minor quake in Japan. Four months later, she felt a 5.0 quake in Honduras. Then, in October 2009, tremors struck Pakistan while Clinton was there.

And those are just the ones she's been present for.

Days before Clinton was to visit Chile in March of this year, an 8.8-magnitude earthquake caused severe damage in the South American country, forcing her to cancel plans to spend a night in Santiago. But she still made a brief stop in Chile to get a look at relief efforts, much as she did in January after Haiti was devastated by a powerful quake.

Employers add 151K jobs, most since May

WASHINGTON (AP) — Employers added the most jobs in five months in October, with the education and health care sectors leading the way.

But the unemployment rate, measured by a separate survey of households, remained stuck at 9.6 percent for the third straight month.

The Labor Department said Friday its survey of employers showed a net gain of 151,000 jobs last month, the most since May. Wall Street analysts expected a smaller gain.

Private employers hired 159,000 workers, while governments at all levels shed only 8,000 jobs, a much better showing than September's sharp drop.

The department also revised August and September's payroll figures higher. The private sector added 103,000 more jobs in those two months than previously estimated.

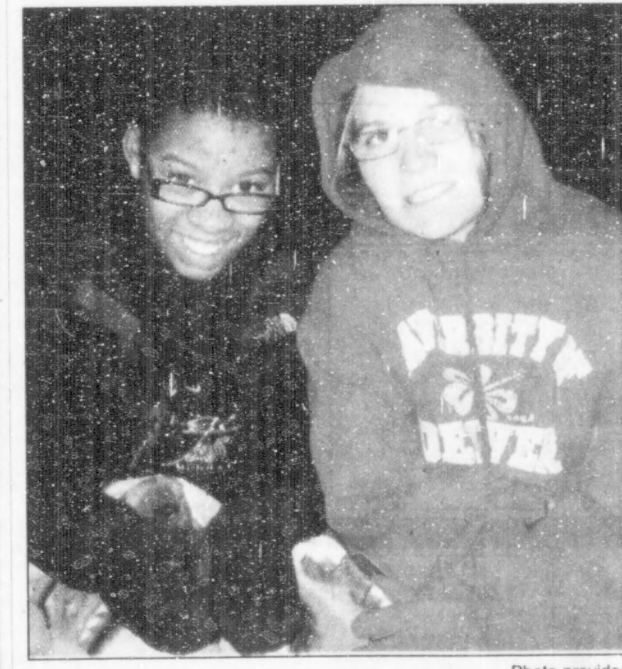

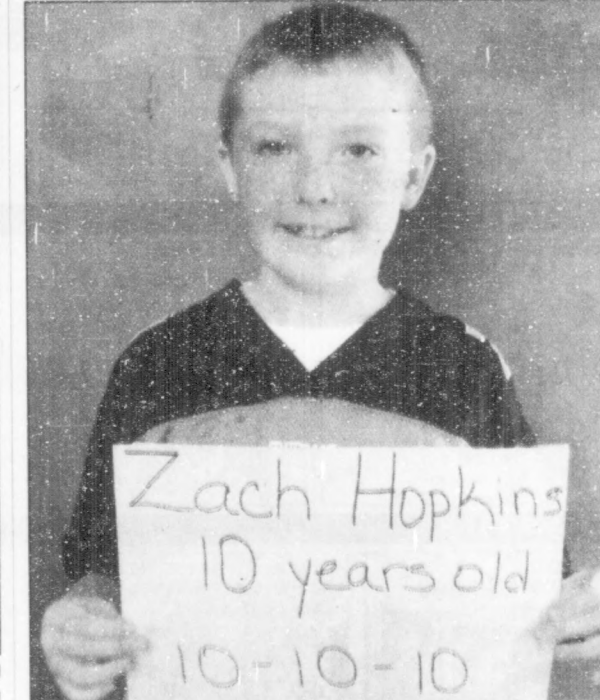

Racer Sports in Brief **Racers fall in five-set thriller at Tennessee Tech**

Like the first meeting between the Murray State and Tennessee Tech volleyball teams, the match was forced into a fifth-and-deciding set, but this time it was the Golden Eagles (5-18, 6-9 OVC) that earned the victory, 2-3 (25-20, 14-25, 25-21, 27-29, 13-15).
The Racers (13-14, 8-7 OVC) were led by sophomore Cassy Woolverton, who tallied a career-best 21 kills and a .333 (21k-6e-8ta) hitting percentage. Seniors Ashley Nemmiger and Sara Hayden also earned double-digit kill totals for MSU. Nemmiger added 17, while Hayden netted 13 and a .360 attack percentage (13k-4e-25ta). Freshman Kaitlyn Hudson was the leader of five players in double-digits in the digs column, with a career-high 20.

The teams traded short runs at the beginning of the opening set, with the Golden Eagles earning a 6-1 advantage before MSU tied the set at seven. TTU tallied the next two points, but it was a 5-0 Racers' run that gave them the lead for good in the set (12-9). MSU continued to add to its advantage with a couple of small runs and earned the 25-20 win.

After trading the first eight serves the Golden Eagles went on one of seven small runs throughout the set to took the lead for good. The Racers struggled to get their momentum going and were held to just one-point at a time in the set and fell 14-25.

The third set saw TTU again jump out to an early lead and hold it for most of the set. MSU was down 7-13 before a 5-0 run brought them within one point. The Golden Eagles countered with a 3-0 run to increase their lead back to four, but the Racers were not done fighting. Trailing 15-18, MSU went on a 6-0 run that gave them the first lead of the set (21-18). TTU followed with a 2-0 run to cut the lead to one, but the Racers had control and went on another 4-1 run to earn the 25-21 win.

The fourth set was a back-and-forth battle for control. Each team held a lead and then saw it dwindle away with runs from the other team. The Racers took a late 21-17 advantage before the Golden Eagles used three small runs to tie the set at 24 and force extra points. The teams battled for the next six points before TTU earned a 27-29 win and forced a fifth set.

The fifth set was a glimpse of the entire match, with 10 tie scores and two lead changes. The Racers took their first lead of the set, 13-12, with a 2-0 run, but TTU regained the advantage and earned the victory with a 3-0 run to win the set and match 13-15.

MSU earned a 89-72 lead in the dig column, but trailed the Golden Eagles in blocking (5-13) and hitting percentage (.237-.241). Another key advantage for TTU was in the service ace column, with a 1-8 lead.

The Racers will continue their last regular-season road trip Saturday, Nov. 6 at Jacksonville State with a 2 p.m. start time.

MSU is now 6-12 in five-set matches.

TIGERS ADVANCE TO SECOND ROUND SHOWDOWN WITH FT. CAMPBELL

Steve Duncan has a luxury few coaches have this late in the season.

Heading into the first round of the state playoffs off their most injury-plagued week of practice to date, many coaches would go into panic mode.

Not Duncan. Without the services of two starting running backs — Matt Deese and Shickell Davis — as

well as down a lineman in senior Rodney Skinner, the third-year head man for the Tigers simply re-plugged and re-adjusted, as his Tigers didn't miss a beat, claiming a 49-0 victory over Todd County Central Friday night in the first round of Class 2A's state playoffs.

"It can be a little nerve racking there," Duncan said of his team's injury report. "It can really be a key time in the year, that when you have injuries you can

be knocked off. But fortunately we played really well with a bunch of young guys coming in."

The Tigers certainly looked different in terms of personnel Friday night, but looked like their old selves offensively, coasting by the Rebels with help from key players in different roles.

With Deese and Davis cut of the lineup for the Tiger offense, Bob Fields and Christian

Duncan towed the load for a night where the Tigers didn't need a ton of offensive fire power to get the win.

The major adjustment offensively for the Tigers, was the shift of senior lineman Robbie Jones to fullback, while sophomore Seth Carter stepped into the starting role of offensive guard for the night.

The adjustments, Duncan said, are something that make

his team very dangerous. "It's helpful obviously," he said. "All of our guys know more than one position on offense and defense, and some of them know three or four or even five. That's a big key to how good we are, especially for a small school where you don't have a lot of depth and you don't have a lot of guys that can play in more than

emerged from the pile, seemingly recovering the ball. Or did he? After discussion, the officials gave the ball to the Wildcats, and Starks had to return the ball from the sidelines.

McKeel didn't have much to say about the play.

"To be as very politically correct as possible, the final explanation I got is that they blew the play dead on the ground," McKeel said with a puzzled grin creeping across his face. "That's all I can say about that. I don't really understand any more. They couldn't find the ball because our guy took it. If he's got the ball, it's our football. I can not say anything about that because my mom always told me 'If you can't say anything good bite your lip and move on.'"

McKeel did note though that only one other play from his coaching career has baffled him more.

"(The strangest play) would be against Bullitt East a couple of years ago but this was the second one," McKeel said. "Again (it happened) on an onside kick. We get the ball, we throw it

back, then their coach punts it back to us and they give them the football. I don't understand it."

Despite the loss, Greer was the star of the night for Calloway, lighting up the scoreboard for 408 yards on 26 of 46 passes with 4 touchdowns.

McKeel said his young star played well despite the odds being stacked against him.

"He had a good night," McKeel said. "We were in a situation where in the first half we were able to move the football, both running and throwing. We were able to do what we wanted to do. For the first and second quarter we were able to run it and throw it and do those things. We just got behind so much that we didn't have much of a choice, we had to start throwing the football and that makes it difficult to throw. Everybody in the stadium knew the ball was going to be thrown and that makes it tough but (I'm) proud to see those numbers and proud to get him back."

Despite the loss, work on Calloway County's 2011 season will begin soon.

"We've got a lot of work to do and unfortunately, we're one

of the 48 teams that are gonna put their pads away come Monday," McKeel said.

"We'll take a little bit of time off but then we're going to check our commitment level. Obviously, the seniors don't have that option to come back, but the underclassman do, and they're going to have to make a commitment to myself and to the program before they decide whether or not they want to come back and be a part of the 2011 team."

Calloway County finished the season with an overall record of 2-9, but will look to improve next season, with a strong core of returning starters. Sophomore quarterback Greer will return for his junior campaign with a full season's worth of his starts under his belt.

Aiding in the young quarterback's development will be an arsenal of weapons that include Greer's favorite target all season, Freidrich.

Greer and Freidrich hooked up 51 times this season, to the tune of 1,114 yards and 11 touchdowns.

The issue for next year's squad will begin with where this one ended — the defense.

one place, and we do."

After being forced to punt on their opening offensive possession, the Tigers took over on their second and wasted little time finding the endzone, on a one-play, 18-yard touchdown run from Duncan.

A little more than two minutes later, senior Cedric Cherry returned a Todd County punt 58 yards to the house, giving the Tigers a 14-0 lead eight minutes into the contest.

The Tigers weren't done adding to their first quarter lead.

With time winding down, on fourth down and 12 yards to go, Murray quarterback Kendall Deese found senior Alex Stephens all alone in the back of the endzone from 35 yards out, giving Murray High a 21-0 lead and all the momentum.

Todd County was quickly forced to punt to open the second quarter, and the always dangerous Cherry made the Rebels pay once again, taking his second punt return of the night for

paydirt and putting the Tiger lead at 28-0.

Fields would tack on a second touchdown run with :22 seconds remaining in the first half to give Murray a 35-0 lead going into the locker room.

In the third, Jones, the converted fullback, took full advantage of his first start in the Murray backfield, finding the endzone from a yard out for his first career touchdown.

Duncan joked after the game that the touchdown from his senior offensive lineman may be his first "and his last," hoping for a full arsenal next Friday.

In the second round, a chance at redemption waits for the Tigers, as they get three-time defending state champion Fort Campbell at Ty Holland for the second straight year.

In each of their last two seasons, the Tigers have fallen to Fort Campbell in the state playoffs, and the Falcons are the only team to take down Murray in their last 23 games.

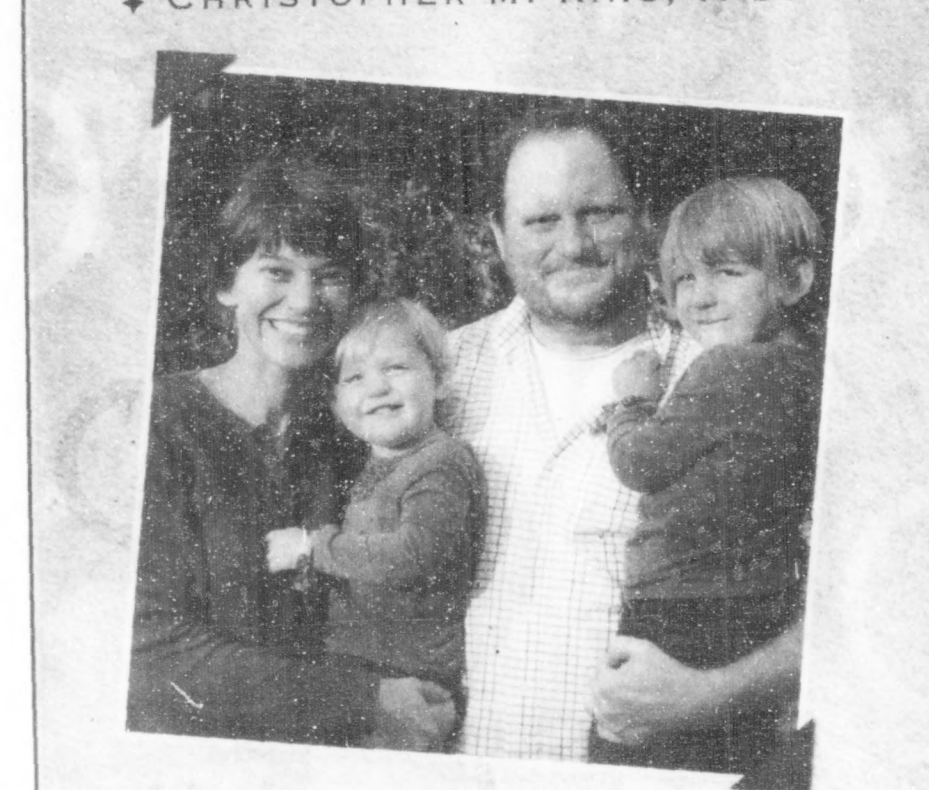
The Falcons have had a down year by their standards, however, and enter next weekend's showdown with a record of 5-6.

Deer Season in the Commonwealth. The season will last sixteen days here in the Zone 1 and 2 counties of the west. Deer hunters have waited an entire year for this day and last minute preparations are underway.

Opening day has an aura all its own. Opening day is not just a date but is a state of mind. Everyone has rituals of some sort they will follow during the coming week, whether they realize it or not. Some of it will make sense to the casual observer, some of it won't – but it's opening day and it has to be done.

Sometime this week I will dig out the winter deer hunt-

ing clothes and take inventory of the myriad of gadgets, toys, and gizmos that will be essential at least for the first few days. My scent-free clothes will be anything but scent-free after 10 months in the garage and will reek of the left-over deer urine (used ostensibly to attract deer) that has leaked out in the pockets. There will be enough stale crackers and granola bars in the pockets to feed a third-world country along with about two times that amount of empty wrappers.

Huge splash, but no body of fish was ever seen until a six-year-old caught one beside me.

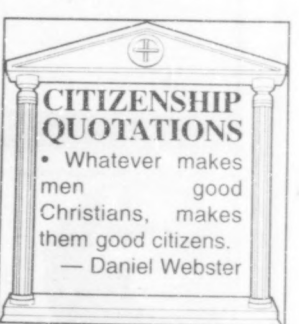
It was a four-pound skipjack and this young lad was bringing it in now. Light action rod and reel but this young lad knew how to reel and back up and then dad was there with a net.

Kentucky Blue Water Trails: Big South Fork

(This article is the sixth in the periodic Blue Water Trails series highlighting the floating, fishing and tourism opportunities on Kentucky's streams and rivers).

It looks like the gods stomped their feet in anger to make the Big South Fork of Cumberland River. They stomped so hard a large crack appeared in the southernmost part of the Cumberland Plateau in Kentucky and into Tennessee. The rumble sent building-sized boulders down the sides of the cavern, nearly choking the river's flow and giving rise to rapids later named Broken Rib, the Washing Machine, Snaggle Tooth and Devil's Jump as a tribute to their rough character.

The Big South Fork labors through those humongous rocks and continues to cut down into the Cumberland Plateau as it flows north from Tennessee to the backwaters of Lake Cumberland in McCreary County. Paddlers on this river will all but swoon with the incredible beauty of floating on the waters that cut the Big South Fork gorge. Towering cliffs surround your boat as it floats over water the color of the shallows of the Caribbean. No other

float in Kentucky holds such scenic wonderment to a paddler.

The confluence of the Clear Fork and New Rivers in Tennessee form the Big South Fork of Cumberland River. The 10.2 mile section of the river from the Tennessee state line to Blue Heron is a designated Kentucky Wild River.

The Big South Fork of Cumberland River flows through the Big South Fork National River and Recreation Area. Paddlers do not have to worry about trespass or access issues when floating the Big South Fork. It is publicly owned.

Paddlers have two options in floating the Big South Fork: an overnight wilderness float that begins in Tennessee or much milder and shorter floats starting at the restored mining community of Blue Heron. Paddlers planning a trip to the Big South Fork should watch the weather forecasts closely. A storm in the headwaters of the New or Clear Fork rivers sends a cascade of hog-pen water downriver. The tightness and sheer sides of this valley give rainfall little room to spread out, resulting in a river that quickly changes from gently flowing and green-clear to a raging coffee-colored froth.


