December by the largest amount in six years, reflecting anouher big monthly decline in gas prices
and providing further evidence of and providing further evidence of falling inflation pressures. The Labor Department said Friday that its consumer price
index dropped 0.4 percent last index
month, the biggest one-month month, the biggest one-month
drop since December 2008. It was also the second straight
monthly decline in prices with monthly decline in prices with both months reflecting big
decreases in gas prices, which decreases in gas prices, which have been tumbling in recent
months because of the global plunge in oil prices.
