

Mayor, MPD chief address enforcement of city stickers

Murray Mayor Jack Rose says the \$50 price of Murray's city stickers is probably the fee locals most resent having to pay.

With no replacement readily available, though, Rose said the city plans to continue requiring those who live or work in the Murray city limits to buy them, and also plans to strictly enforce the city sticker ordinance.

In April, the Murray City Council voted 7-5 to pass the second reading of an ordinance amendment that raised the late fee for not having a city sticker from \$50 to \$100. If someone is caught without a city sticker, the person must pay that fee in addition to purchasing the sticker. Rose said that when people complain to him about the enforcement of the city sticker ordinance, they sometimes ask whose idea it was to double the late fee. He tells them he proposed the change, but adds that the majority of council members voted in favor of it.

Rose said that while he was campaigning for mayor last fall, he spoke to a couple of employ-

Democrats unite in Murray

Jeff Jax speakers say Republicans have gone too far to right on issues

If there was one thing emphasized during Friday night's annual Jefferson Jackson Dinner for Kentucky Democrats it was the need for party unity when it comes to the November general election.

Most of the heavy hitters on the party's list of Kentucky constitutional office candidates were at Murray State University taking swings at the Republican Party for what they say is going too far to the right when it comes to its political platform. Only gubernatorial candidate Jack Conway and Commissioner of Agriculture hopeful Jean-Marie Lawson Spann missed the dinner, Conway due to a previous engagement in Louisville and Spann on doctor's orders to rest as she awaits the birth of a child.

Everyone else, though, was taking full cuts at the plate.

"We are at a 1776 moment here, that is going to dictate this state's agenda for the next 50 years," said Kentucky Auditor Adam Edelen, who is seeking re-election this fall and specifically targeted Conway's opponent, Republican Matt Bevin. "The choice could not be clearer between the Democrats and Republicans this time, and you look no father than their views on early childhood development.

Jack Conway is opposed by a candidate that doesn't think we should have Head Start.

"Folks, Ronald Reagan couldn't be nominated by the Republican Party of today. They're that conservative. We have a historic opportunity here to reach out to moderate Republicans in this election and gain their support."

Reagan benefited from swaying Democrats to his side in a pair of presidential election victories in the 1980s; those Democratic voters came to be known as "Reagan Democrats."

Edelen has been a perennial Jefferson Jackson speaker during his tenure. So, too, has Secretary of State Alison Lundergan Grimes, who about

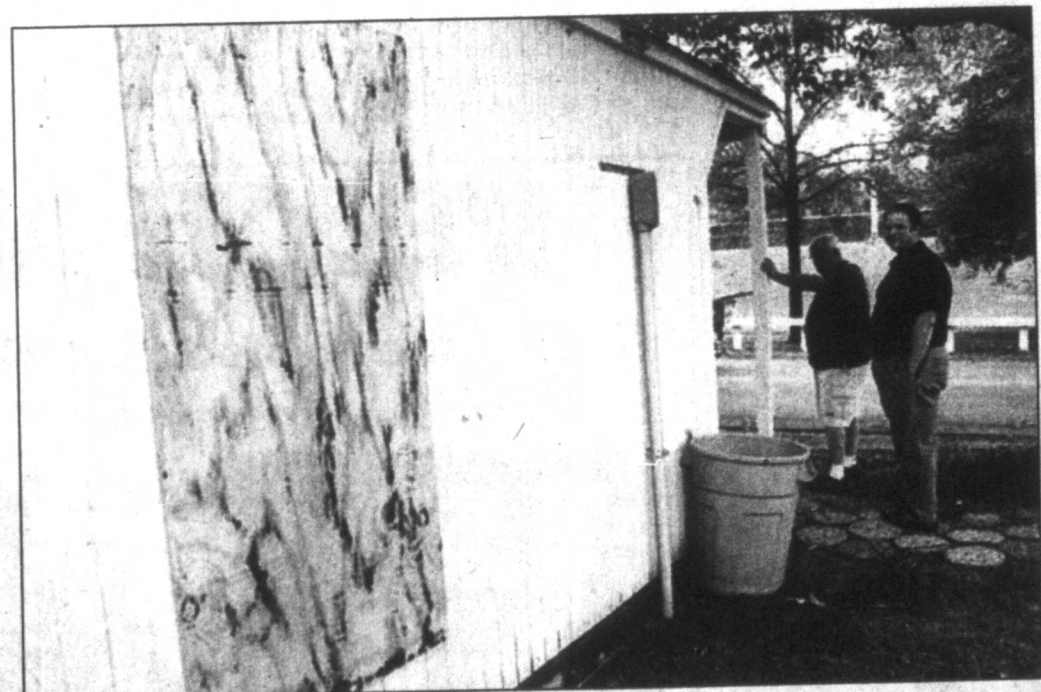
half a year removed from a sound defeat at the hands of now-U.S. Senate Majority Leader Mitch McConnell, showed that she has a renewed energy, opting for the same style she used during that campaign in 2014 ... crowd involvement.

"Are you tired of folks who say we can't afford to raise the minimum wage? Are you tired of people earning just 76 cents on every dollar? Are you tired of policies that deny women equal pay for equal work?" Grimes roared from the podium, finishing each question the same. "Then let me hear you say Democrat!"

Vandalism causes estimated \$5,000 damage to park areas; MPD arrests three juveniles

During Monday night's meeting of the Murray-Calloway County Park Board, the subject of vandalism was strongly discussed and a special-called meeting of the board's Safety Committee was set for Friday.

After that, it seems the activity exploded. No fewer than three incidents occurred between Tuesday and Wednesday, resulting in damage to park property that may exceed \$5,000.

On Thursday came word that Murray police had apprehended three juveniles in connection with the activity, which clearly had pleased Safety Committee members by the time Friday's meeting time arrived. MPD Major Jim Osborne confirmed those arrests Friday.

Still, there were concerns. Cameras are credited with identifying

"Let's get ready to rumble. This year we have to be engaged in this election."

Grimes also was speaking just a short time removed from visiting longtime Calloway County Democratic Party leader Zee Enix, who has experienced health issues the past few months and is now receiving care at Spring Creek Health Care & Rehabilitation Center. The two have formed a strong bond in Grimes' political career.

"I tried to spring him out of there tonight, but the alarms would've gone off," she said, then referring to her failed 2014 campaign, where she faced a McConnell machine she said spent \$100 million on his re-election campaign. She said Enix had a message Friday. "He told me, 'You tell them that I'm not finished and neither are you.'"

Grimes also said that her loss may have helped the Democrats keep the state House of Representatives. With McConnell's attention squarely on her, she said he could not financially support other legislative races.

"The one thing I remember as I

came down off that stage that night from making the speech I really had not wanted to make was asking (her father, Jerry Lundergan), 'Did we keep the House?' And he said we had," she said. "Folks, we may not become part of the \$100 million club I'm part of, but (the Republicans) are going to play in a similar way."

"You know, not even Billy Graham could've won against that," said Kentucky Treasurer candidate Rick Nelson. "Yeah, a man like Billy Graham probably wouldn't have been able to have shown his face in Kentucky after that. But you know what? We'd probably had lost the House if they hadn't spent that on keeping McConnell in Washington."

Attorney General candidate Andy Beshear has an interesting perspective on the governor's race, being he just happens to be the son of the current governor, Steve Beshear. He said a vote for Conway helps preserve the work the elder Beshear has done during his time in office.

"You know, I kind of love the current governor," he said. "But I've seen him work his tail off for this state, and it's worked. Right now, is a good time. We've got hope."

Getting back to Enix, his absence was felt by everyone in the hall Friday. This was especially true when it came time for the presenta-

tion of an honor in his name - the Zee Enix Democrat of the Year Award - that goes to a member of the Calloway County Democratic Party who, as Murray City Councilman Jason Pitman put it, "goes above and beyond" to enhance the party, whether it be from preparing food items for meetings to going door to door for candidates.

This year's recipient was Melisa Stark, who incorporated a little Enix into her acceptance speech.

"You know he'd introduce me to people as a 'really good Democrat,'" Stark said. "There are two things I hold dear, though. One is the love of holstein cattle and, two, is being a Yellow Dog Democrat! I love this party!" ■

ees at one large business in town who asked that he make sure everyone working there bought a city sticker. He said this was one reason why he recommended an increase in the late fee - so people would know the City of Murray expected everyone who lives or works here to follow the ordinance and that his administration was serious about making sure they did.

Murray Police Chief Jeff Liles said officers are out in force, and... the Murray Police Department has issued about 643 notices of violation (NOV) between June 8-19 alone. He said that while NOVs are occasionally written for people who have been pulled over for other offenses, the majority of tickets are written when officers check parking lots at various Murray businesses. Liles said many businesses have designated spaces for employees, so while officers make visits to check business licenses, they will often ask managers where employees park before checking those employees' city stickers.

Occasionally, an officer is already in the area of a particular business when he or she notices an employee park in the customer parking lot, possibly to avoid being noticed by police, Liles said. Employee vehicles at factories like Briggs & Stratton, Saputo and Kenlake Foods are easier to check because the employee parking is more easily defined than some smaller businesses, he said.

Liles said some people keep their stickers in the glove com-

partments of their vehicles, but this is a violation of the ordinance even if the sticker is currently valid. If the sticker is current but is not affixed to the license plate or otherwise properly displayed, the fine is \$50. If a person has a license plate from a state that does not allow stickers to be placed on them, the person may buy an alternate versions of the sticker that can still be placed on the windshield - as they were before the stickers were redesigned in 2012.

"It's got to be affixed," Rose said. "There's more than one reason for that. One of the obvious reasons is so that it's pretty easy for the officers to detect whether they have it or not, and then they don't have to (go out of their way to check) if they are going through the lots."

Rose said he had seen people in the past try to get around the ordinance by purchasing one sticker for several vehicles and using transparent tape to switch them from vehicle to vehicle, depending on what the person was driving on a particular day. Rose said the ordinance has been in existence for many years, and he remembered getting his first city sticker when he earned his driver's license in 1959.

Rose said he thought the city sticker was one of the most resented fees that Murray residents or workers have to pay, and Liles said he agreed with that assertion. Rose said he had never been a fan of the ordinance, but if the city were to ever eliminate it, it would have to find a way to replace the revenue it generates. A payroll tax

is one thing many other cities have in place that Murray does not, but the idea of a payroll tax seems to be even more unpopular than the city sticker ordinance, he said.

Rose said a payroll tax would be much more expensive for individuals than city stickers. Even a payroll tax of 1 percent would cost someone \$200 a year if they made an annual salary of \$20,000, or \$1,000 if they made \$100,000 a year, he said.

"The only thing I know that we are not taxing is payroll," Rose said. "The payroll tax would be the option (to replace the city sticker)."

If a person receives a NOV, he or she has 10 days to either pay the late fee and buy a city sticker, or to make an appeal. If someone feels they have been wrongly cited for not having a city sticker, they may appeal the NOV to the code enforcement board, which has five members. "The board will decide whether they (people who have received an NOV) are right or wrong," Liles said. "Some of them have legitimate reasons why they didn't get the city stickers, and then the board will dismiss it. We've got a real good code enforcement board. They'll listen to you, but if you're wrong, they'll make you pay it."

Rose complimented Liles on his enforcement of the ordinance. He said Liles has a helpful disposition but is not fooled easily by excuses. He said the entire police department has done an outstanding job of enforcing the ordinance since he asked the department in early March to ramp up enforcement. ■

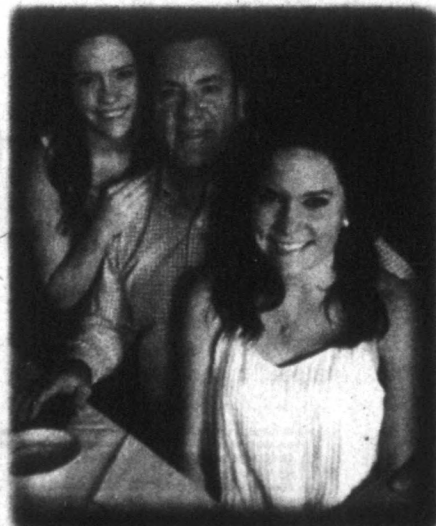

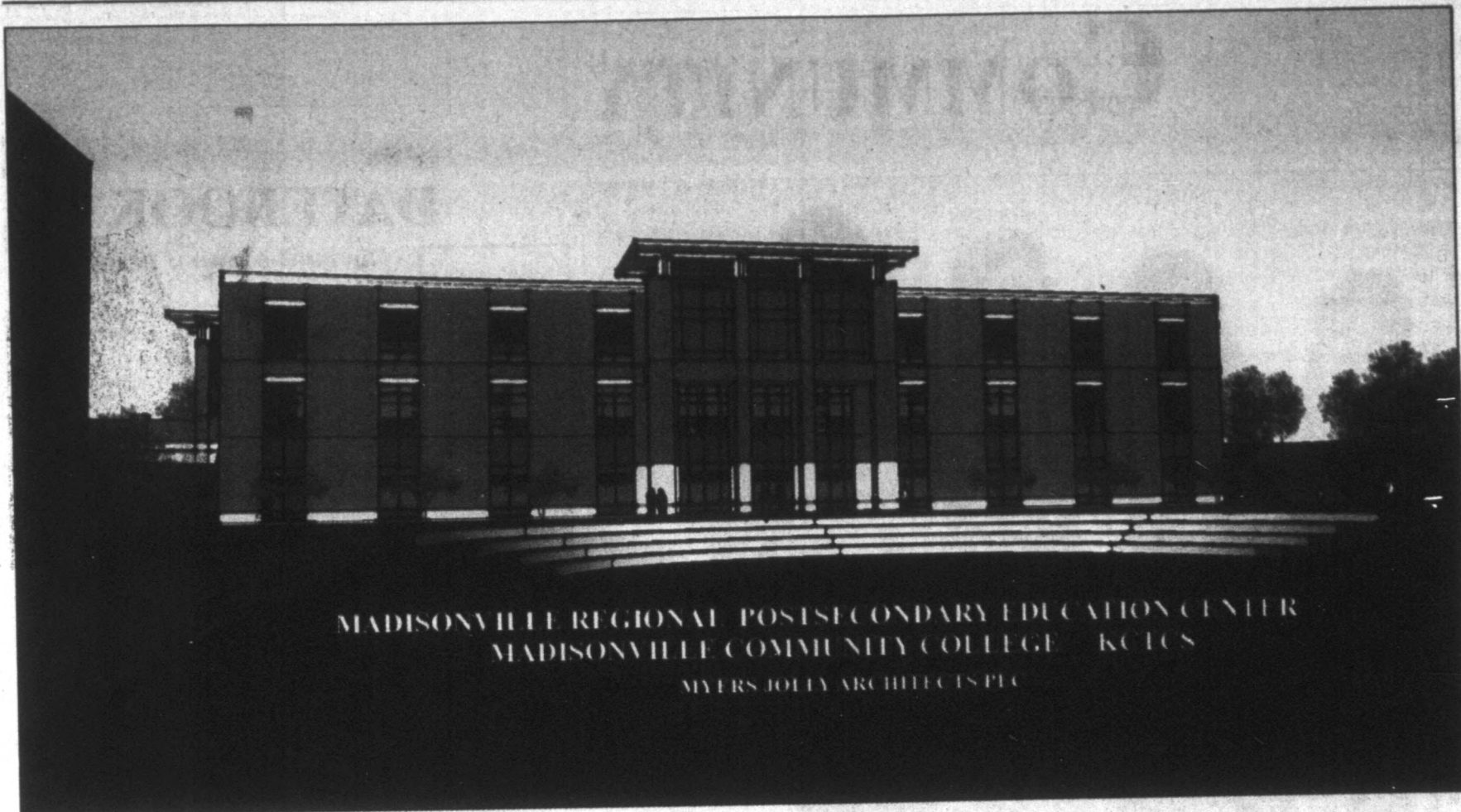

MCC raises funds for Murray State extension in Madisonville

Madisonville Community College has taken the initiative in a \$20 million project to open a Murray State University extension for a postsecondary education center.

During last year's legislative session, the state lawmakers gave the Kentucky Community & Technical College System the opportunity to propose a project for each of the 16 colleges to raise money as a part of the Build Smart Campaign.

With the Build Smart Campaign, community colleges take the initiative to raise 25 percent of the money it takes to build or open a campus extension, and after that percent is raised, the KCTCS will be allowed to issue bonds for the remaining 75 percent.

Madisonville proposed a \$20

million project that will be 55,000 square feet and house MSU extension classes for the Two Plus Two program for postsecondary education — in which students can attend community college for two years and seamlessly transfer to finish their bachelor degree at MSU.

Chris Woodall, the director of advancements at MCC, said the building will serve as a part of MCC and MSU's efforts to continue education and provide teaching labs and classes, as well as provide a community room — the Racer Room — which will provide a place for meetings and any community events.

"The community in Madisonville is so closely tied to each other, and we have an amazingly generous group of individuals and industry partners at the college," Woodall

said.

Woodall said that because of the construction of the new I-69 corridor, there will be new industry, and it is projected that there will be tremendous growth.

"We're going to need to provide people with training of four-year degrees for the industry that should come with development," Woodall said. "It's going to improve the educational opportunities for our communities, and consequently, our quality of life and the overall economic vitality of our region. If students know that four-year degrees are available and easily accessible, then that should remove a barrier to students being successful."

Tina Bernot, the interim executive director of development at MSU, said MCC has raised almost \$4.9 million of their \$5

million goal. According to Bernot, MSU has jumped in to assist in raising the last \$100,000-\$150,000 by reaching out to alumni, specifically those in the Madisonville area.

Bernot said that as a part of the Build Smart Campaign, MSU is utilizing the strong base of alumni in Hopkins County and the community to join in efforts to raise the final pieces of the funds.

"We have a committee of MSU alumni who are driving the campaign and emphasizing how partnership will create opportunities for thousands of people to reach their educational goals," Bernot said. "This campaign represents a community working together to promote student success and to improve the quality of life. We are very excited to be a part of this wonderful endeavor."

Currently, Bernot said the initiative is in a quiet phase of development, but once the final money is raised, it will move out of the quiet phase.

Woodall said the goal is to begin breaking ground in the spring of 2016, but he hopes to finish raising the money in the next few months.

Bernot said MSU alumni are asked to make gifts to the MSU Foundation that will be designated to this project and donors will be recognized in the new facility, specifically in the Racer Room on the Racer Recognition Wall.

In the Racer Room, there will be a wall that recognizes the alumni that donate to the foundation. The room will be open for community members and education functions alike.

Elm Grove Rd. search results in KSP arrests

Kentucky State Police reported Friday that it made three arrests at a residence near the Elm Grove community of Calloway County.

Also located during the search was a fugitive, Amanda Duncan, 33, who was arrested on an outstanding warrant from Marshall County.

All arrested subjects were taken to the Calloway County Jail in Murray. Once there, Jared Crouch was also charged with promoting contraband in the first degree for attempting to bring more drugs into the jail, KSP said.

The investigation continued by Trooper Jody Cash of KSP Post 1 in Mayfield.

Individuals facing charges are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law.

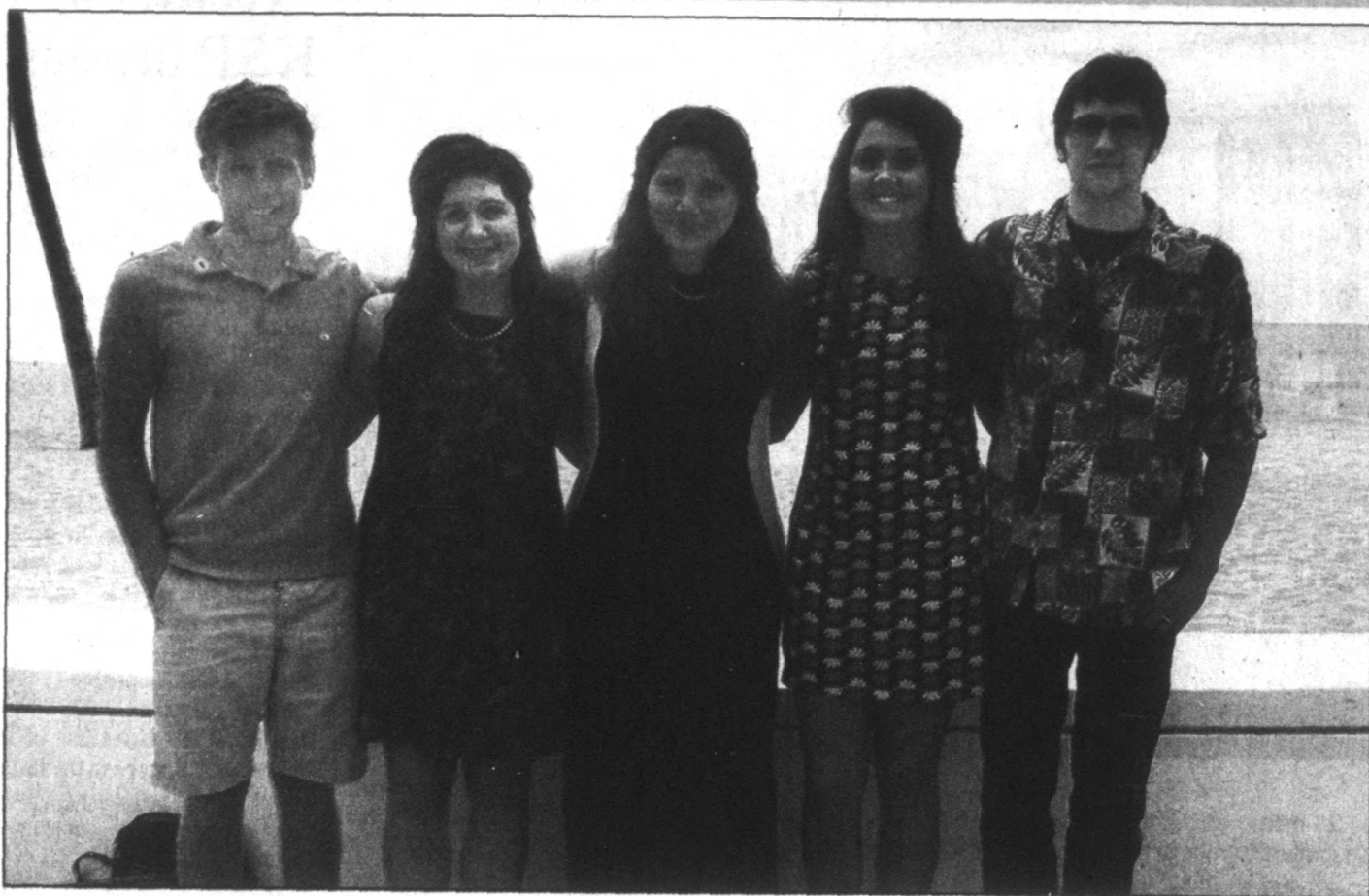

Emily Wilson Wolfson died Thursday, June 18, 2015, at Spring Creek Nursing Home in Murray. She was born Emily King Wilson, the daughter of Joseph Thomas Wilson and Mary Compton King, in her grandfather's house in Corydon (Henderson County), Kentucky on Sept. 2, 1915.

She was preceded in death by her parents; her husband, Alfred M. Wolfson; her sister, Jean Wilson Trigg; her brother, Joseph Thomas Wilson III; and her stepdaughter, Nancy Wolfson.

Mrs. Wolfson is survived by her stepdaughter, Marianne Reichlin; her stepgrandchildren, Michele Katz-Reichlin and H. Paolo Reichlin; her nieces, Emily Trigg Mabee and Jane Foster Trigg; her nephew, Joseph Wilson Trigg; and a stepgreat-granddaughter; four great-nephews; a great-niece and a great-great-niece.

Emily Wolfson grew up in Wilson Station, a little community near Corydon where her father had a farm. When he lost the farm in the Great Depression, the family moved to Henderson, where she graduated from Barrett Manual Training High School in 1933. Her artistic abilities won her a scholarship to the Newcomb School of Art (now incorporated into Tulane University) in New Orleans, Louisiana. After she received a bachelor of design degree in 1937, she won a Wooley Fellowship in painting that enabled her to spend a year in Paris, where she studied under the Cubist, Fernand Léger. She continued her art studies at Louisiana State University, where she obtained an MA in 1940.

After working with the WPA in Louisville, she taught art and art history at Murray State Teachers College, as was then, from 1941 until 1944. That year she left Murray to work at the Evansville Museum and Evansville College (now Evansville University) from 1944 to 1948. She then taught art at the University of Indiana (Bloomington) from 1948 until 1958. She worked primarily as a painter until 1955, when she spent a sabbatical leave learning a double weaving technique in Helsinki, Finland. She obtained her own loom and for many years put her first efforts into weaving. In 1957 a weaving of hers won Best in Show at the Midwest Designer and Craftsman Exhibition at the Chicago Art Institute. Since then her works have been widely exhibited and have won numerous awards.

In 1958 she married Alfred M. Wolfson, professor of biology, who had recently lost his first wife, Marcelle, and she moved back to Murray. She and Professor Wolfson were happily married until his death in 1990. She felt herself a second mother to his family. She and her husband particularly enjoyed a monthly Great Books Club and sailing on Kentucky Lake in their boat, the Si Bon. She taught art and art history at Murray until she retired in 1969. Throughout her time in Murray, she was active in civic affairs. She shared with her husband a concern for the environment that led, among other things, to support the Natural Resources Defense Council and the Nature Conservancy.

She not only produced art but also promoted the arts. In 1961 she helped found the Kentucky Guild of Artists and Craftsmen and was instrumental in organizing an Art Train that provided art instruction around the state in two railroad cars. During the sixties, she also assisted her friend Naoma Powell to establish the Quicksand Craft Center in Vest, where residents of an impoverished eastern Kentucky mountain community were trained to produce high quality textiles. In 1976 she joined the Murray Art Guild, where she did painting and which she actively supported until prevented by age. In recognition of such work, Kentucky Governor Martha Layne Collins awarded her the Community Arts Award in 1987 as part of the Governor's Awards in the Arts. In 1997 she received the Rude Osolnik Award for her service to crafts in Kentucky.

A memorial service for Emily Wolfson will be at Murray University on Saturday, June 27, 2015. Time and location will be announced at a later date.

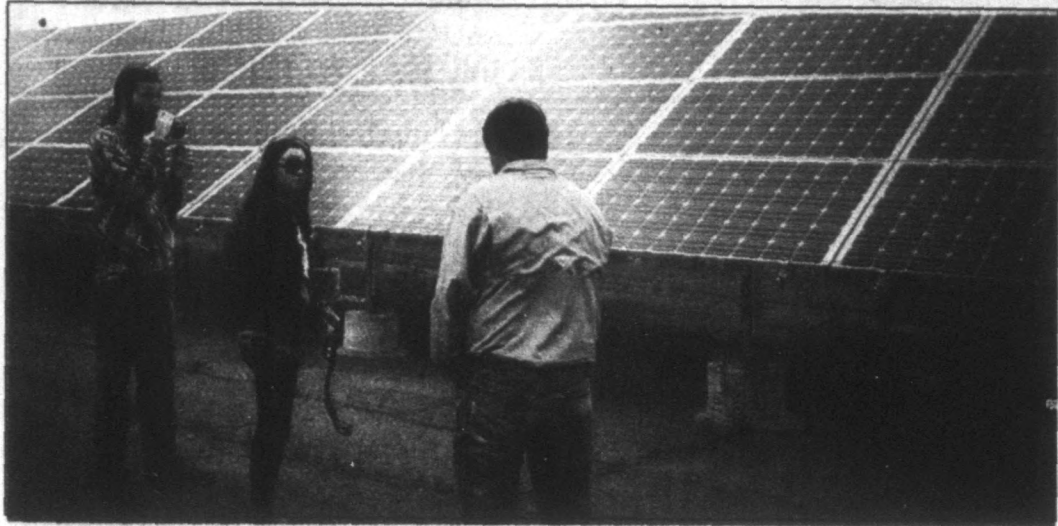

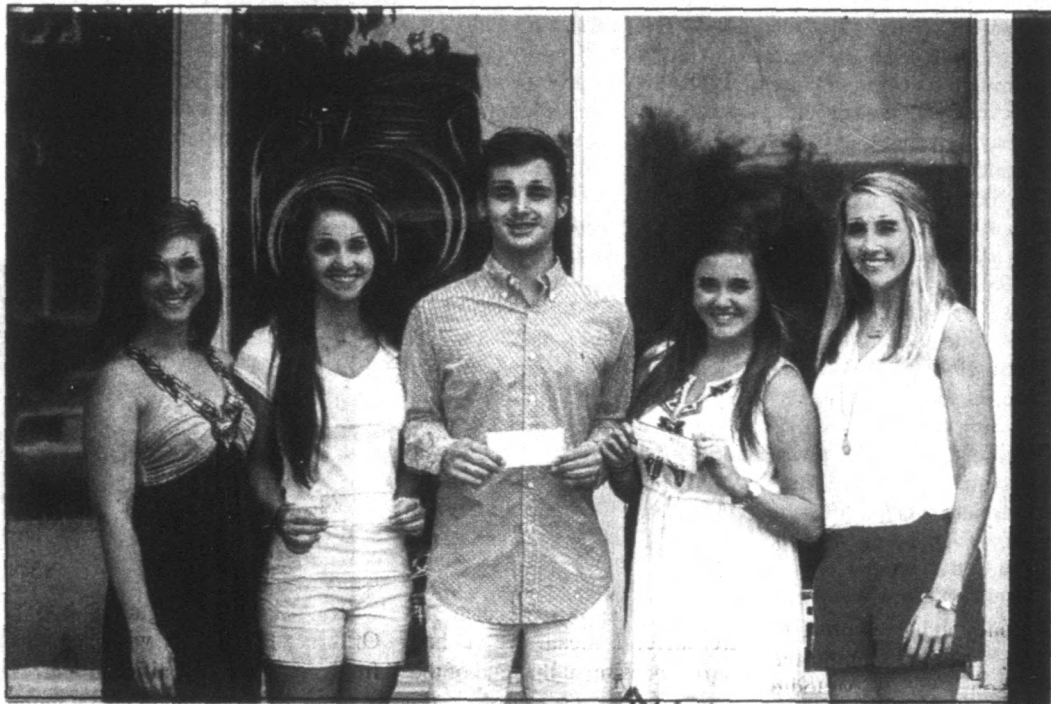

the suspects and finding a way to further cover the park with proverbial eyes in the sky was heavily on the minds of the committee Friday.

"Here's the question. How much money are we willing to spend?" said Committee Chairperson Melodie Cunningham, whose group does not have a lot of options in this area, being that Parks & Recreation is severely strapped financially.

Still, with the result of this week's case, committee members are hopeful that they can make a case for assistance from the community as they try to find ways to prevent this type of damage from occurring again.

"What we have is indispensable," Cunningham said. "Odds are, without our cameras at work, these things are still happening."

"We haven't had a lick of vandalism problems until now

(since cameras began being installed)," said Parks Maintenance Director Steve Wilhelm, specifically mentioning both Bee Creek and the area near the one-room school house in Central. "I think it's because everybody knows the cameras are there. I mean, we've had zero vandalism at that end of the park. Now, the main places where we're having problems is near Bailey Pavilion and the dog park."

The immediate problem is how to repair the damage done, committee members said.

An MPD release said the three suspects damaged several items, including light fixtures and several bridges on the parks trail system. They also broke a window out of the ranger station near the entrance of Central Park and stole bats from the batting cages at Central, which later were used to cause the damage to the light fixtures and the ranger station window. The suspects also forced entry into

one of the concession stands at the Bee Creek soccer complex and then stole items from inside.

The Bee Creek activity was captured on one of Parks' cameras, Parks Director Tab Brockman said.

MPD said investigation by Officer Sam Biers, with help from the video, identified three juveniles suspected of the activity. Charges are pending on one male juvenile, 14, of Murray, for theft by unlawful taking under \$500, two counts of burglary in the third degree and criminal mischief in the first degree. Charges are also pending on one male juvenile, 15, of Murray for theft by unlawful taking under \$500, two counts of burglary in the third degree, as well as one count of criminal mischief in the first degree. Charges are also pending on one male juvenile, 17, of LaGrange for theft by unlawful taking under \$500, one count of burglary in the third degree and one count of criminal mischief in the first degree.

It is not known if the juveniles charged Thursday are involved with damage to another wooden bridge in Chestnut Park that was reported a few weeks earlier. Also of concern to committee members is that all of the crimes the juveniles are accused of committing, and were shown on video while they committed them, happened during daylight hours.

"The good news is (suspects were apprehended)," Brockman said. "Our video worked really well, and that shows these cameras can help us and our enforcement groups did a nice job and we're waiting to see what happens as the case moves forward."

"The problem is it costs money to buy these cameras, and it's money we don't have."

Marshall Sheriff's Office hosts stolen items viewing next week

Anyone who suspects having had something stolen from a storage unit the past several months in western Kentucky may want to attend an open house next week in Benton.

The Marshall County Sheriff's Office will host the open house Thursday and next Friday for people to view items recovered items. MCSO reported this week that a search warrant was executed at a local storage unit and resulted in the discovery and subsequent recovery of items confirmed stolen from several storage units in the area.

People can view the items from 2-7 p.m. both days at the Marshall County Judicial Building, 80 Judicial Drive, in Benton; that is along Fifth

Street between the Purchase Parkway and Main Street (U.S. 641).

MCSO said the search warrant was obtained and executed on June 8, the same day a fatal shooting happened in McCracken County in which a man allegedly shot another man he suspected of attempting to burglarize a storage unit he was renting.

Jeff Conrad, 49, of Benton is facing capital murder charges for allegedly shooting Garlon Casey Cox, 30, also of Benton, on the morning of June 8 at the AAA Mini-Storage facility in Reidland. Cox later died at a Paducah hospital.

The McCracken County Sheriff's Department has said that Conrad allegedly found Cox and another man, Brandon York, allegedly steal-

ing items from the unit. The sheriff's department said York, 36, also of Benton, ran away from the scene when the shooting started. York was later found and arrested by law officers.

MCSO says York is a possible suspect in the rash of storage unit burglaries. He faces charges in McCracken County, as well as Simpson County.

As far as next week's viewing, MCSO said people believing they have items that could be present needs to have filed a police report in their local jurisdictions and have the report in their possession or have proof of the ownership of items.

Individuals facing charges are presumed innocent until proven guilty in a court of law. ■

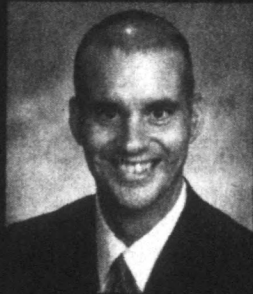

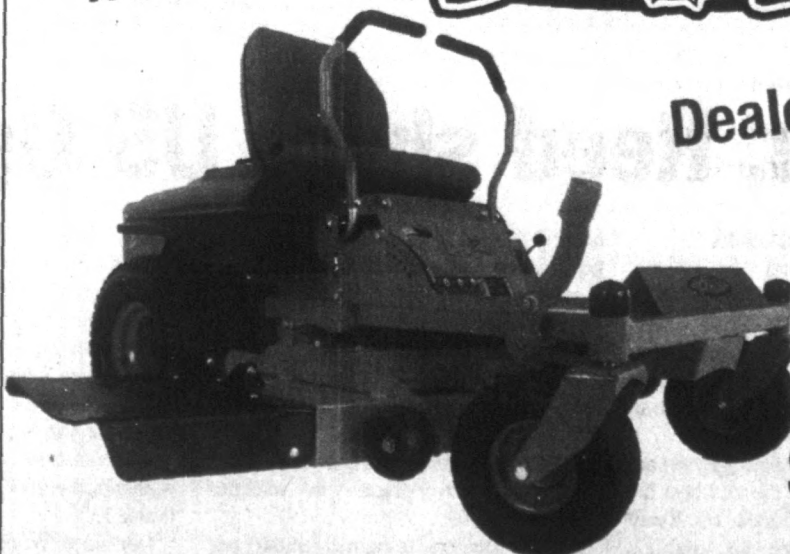

PHILADELPHIA (AP) — Randal Grichuk homered and had three hits, and Kolten Wong and Yadier Molina also went deep as the St. Louis Cardinals set season highs for runs and hits in a 12-4 rout of the Philadelphia Phillies on Friday night.

The Cardinals avoided their second three-game losing streak of the season while breaking out of the offensive funk that followed Tuesday's news of a federal investigation into whether club officials illegally hacked into the Houston Astros' player database.

The Cardinals batted .211 with five runs in the first three games after the story broke. If the investigation had any bearing on the lackluster offense, they certainly put it out of their minds against the Phillies.

St. Louis pounded out 16 hits, including six for extra bases. Jhonny Peralta doubled and had three RBIs. Mark Reynolds had a two-run double and 10 Cardinals got hits.

Ryan Howard homered for Philadelphia, which snapped a nine-game losing streak on Thursday. The last-place Phillies sank 23 games under .500.

Tyler Lyons (2-0) won his second straight game after going 13 consecutive starts without a win dating back to 2013. He earned a victory Saturday over the Royals and cruised to his latest

NEW YORK (AP) — Alex Rodriguez homered for his 3,000th career hit and smiled all the way around the bases Friday night, the highlight so far in what's become a resurgent season for the formerly disgraced slugger.

The New York Yankees star wasted no time, connecting in the first inning on a first-pitch, 95 mph fastball from Detroit ace Justin Verlander.

Rodriguez became the 29th player in major league history to reach 3,000 hits, and the first since Yankees great Derek Jeter homered from the very same batter's box in 2011.

With the crowd at Yankee Stadium standing in anticipation, Rodriguez sent a high drive to right field. He held onto the bat as he took a few steps toward first base, and right fielder J.D. Martinez bumped into the wall as he backed up.

The crowd roared as the ball sailed into the seats. Rodriguez was greeted by Mark Teixeira and other teammates between the plate and the dugout, and got a big hug from manager Joe Girardi.

Rodriguez turns 40 next month. The three-time AL MVP launched his 13th homer and has enjoyed a productive year as a designated hitter after sitting out all of last season while serving a drug suspension. ■

For the second-consecutive season, The Murray Ledger & Times is revealing a 4th District softball team — chosen by coaches within the area following the 2015 school year.

Despite rain, abnormally cold temperatures and a furious finish all the way to the 1st Region championship, Calloway, Murray and Marshall County battled for district supremacy.

And for the first time in at least 17 years, the Lady Tigers (22-12) came out on top.

Marshall County returns a host of talent from last season's inaugural team, as Lexee Miller, Chaney Stearns, Abby Fiessinger and Kenslie Cross again made an impact throughout the season.

Fiessinger was named Region 1 Player of the Year — finishing with four home runs, 35 RBI and a .977 fielding percentage behind the plate.

Cross (.415 BA, 26 RBI), Stearns (.329 BA, 26 R) and Miller (.378 BA) all make the list not only for their offensive prowess, but also for their defense — making Marshall County one of the top four teams in the region.

The Lady Tigers exploded this season — particularly offensively — as head coach Scott Tucker and the gang posted a .380 team batting average and were shut out only once this season.

That came against state champions in McCracken County, who defeated Murray 6-0 in the regional championship at Graves County.

Todd returns to the list as a DH, where she held down the 4-hole for the Lady Tigers this season

and led her team in RBI.

Joining her are some new faces — cousins Savannah Grogan and Elizabeth Grogan, as well as sophomore outfielder Caitlin Mollette and junior pitcher Bayleigh Blane.

S. Grogan could have been the top pitcher in the 4th District this season, but was sidelined with right shoulder pain and instead calmly patrolled centerfield and batted over .400 in the 9-spot for the Lady Tigers.

Shouldering the pitching load for the Lady Tigers then became Blane's job — much like her older sister, Prestley, did in 2014. She succeeded admirably, posting a sub-4.00 ERA while picking up 15-plus wins along the way.

Spieth, Reed share US Open lead at Chambers Bay

UNIVERSITY PLACE, Wash. (AP) — Unbeaten as Ryder Cup teammates, Patrick Reed and Jordan Spieth now chase a U.S. Open title this weekend at Chambers Bay.

Spieth overcame a double bogey on an 18th hole that he called "the dumbest he has ever played" for a 3-under 67. Reed made only two pars over his final 12 holes, a wild ride that resembled putts on these heavily sloped greens, and had to settle for a 69.

They were tied for the lead on a day that included Jason Day collapsing to the ground because of vertigo, Tiger Woods

posting the highest 36-hole score of his pro career and Rory McIlroy making everything from eagle to double bogey on a course that gave him nothing more than two more days to figure it out.

Dustin Johnson was in the mix for the longest time until making three bogeys over his last five holes for a 71. Johnson was one shot behind, along with Branden Grace of South Africa, who matched Spieth with a 67.

Sixteen players remained under par. Spieth is the only one with experience winning a major.

And it's clear he's not just satisfied with one.

The 21-year-old Texan surged into the lead with birdies, calmed himself after a

double bogey at the turn, and then tended to Day on the par-3 ninth hole when the Australian crashed to the ground in a frightening moment. Day later was diagnosed with vertigo. Helped to his feet, he managed to finish the hole and shot 70 to wind up three shots behind. He was hopeful of playing Saturday.

Spieth also gathered himself and closed with a birdie to be the first one to reach 5-under 135.

Not since Woods in 2002 has anyone won the Masters and U.S. Open in the same year. Spieth still has a long way to go, and he realizes it will only get harder on a course that already is perplexing.

Reed has heard about the adage that par is always a good score at the U.S. Open.

He opted for three birdies, an eagle and five bogeys over the final three hours, at times going from the lead to trailing but always in the mix.

Reed and Spieth were rookie teammates at Gleneagles last September, going 2-0-1 in their partnership, a rare bright spot in another American loss. That's history. Now they're chasing it individually, with loads of company.

Tony Finau, the powerful PGA Tour rookie making his major championship debut, let it rip on his way to a 68. He was in the group at 3-under 137 that included Joost Luiten of The Netherlands (69), Daniel Summerhays (67) and Ben Martin (70).

Woods, again, was never in the picture

— not the tournament, not on television. Fox rarely showed him, except for a few shots, including the opening hole when Woods was so far left up a dune that he slipped and fell while trying to size up the shot. He had a 76 and missed the cut for the second time in the last three majors.

His 36-hole total was 156, one worse than the 155 he had at the Phoenix Open. He has one more tournament, The Greenbrier Classic in two weeks, before going to St. Andrews for the British Open.


"Obviously, I need to get a little better for the British Open, and I'll keep working at it," Woods said.

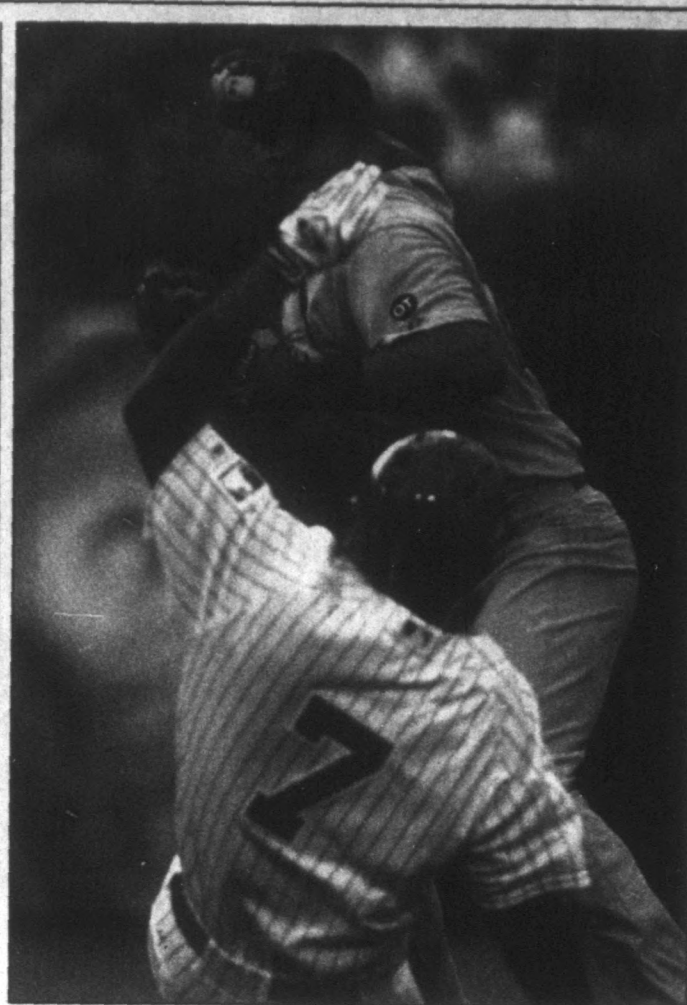
E. Grogan – sidelined with a knee injury all of the 2014 season – easily parlayed a strong senior year on the field into 4th District discussion, especially after batting .500 with a .570 OBP and a .900-plus fielding percentage at shortstop and third.

Mollette, Murray's right fielder, played beyond her years with a .450-plus BA and stellar defensive play. She should be in consideration throughout her high school career.

Calloway County and head coach Troy Webb may not have had the season they hoped (11-18), but they closed strong before falling to Murray in the 4th District Tournament.

Kristen "Kritter" Kelly certainly gets the nod at third base – while leading the Lady Lakers in home runs (2), BA (.365-plus) and RBI. She also proved to be the best defensive player in Webb's senior-laden infield.

Several notable names were not included this year, but still had excellent seasons.

Spith can lean on his experience as a Masters champion, but this major is nothing like Augusta National. For starters, he had a five-shot lead going into the weekend at the Masters. And he is on a golf course where the greens are getting plenty of attention for being bumpy and difficult to make putts.

"It's playing different," Spith said. "And I'm in a very different position. I'm not going to have a five-shot lead. So given it's a U.S. Open, I imagine they're going to try to bring us back to par. ... So I'll draw some on Augusta, but at the same time, my patience level has to be even that much higher."

His patience was tested, especially on the 18th. The tees were moved forward, making it play 514 yards. Some players who had been at Chambers Bay for the U.S. Amateur were concerned about the USGA using a forward tee and changing it to a par 4 in the middle of the U.S. Open because of an awkward landing area.

one behind double-digit run support.

Lyons allowed three runs and seven hits in five innings with five strikeouts and one walk. He also helped himself with the bat, singling twice with an RBI and scoring three runs.

Phillippe Aumont (0-1) struggled in a spot start for injured Philadelphia ace Cole Hamels, allowing six runs and five hits in four innings.

It was the first career start for Aumont, who entered 1-5 with a 6.13 ERA in 45 big league relief appearances. He switched to a starting role this spring in an attempt to improve his command and had some success in the minors, going 3-4 with a 2.35 ERA in 14 outings (10 starts). But against the Cardinals, Aumont walked seven and threw a wild pitch. Forty-eight of his 104 pitches were balls.

Two-run homers by Wong and Molina highlighted a four-run second inning that gave the Cardinals a 4-0 lead. In the fourth, Peralta drove in Matt Carpenter and Lyons – both of whom walked – to put St. Louis up by six. And the Cardinals scored five runs on six hits against Justin De Fratus in the fifth.

Aumont and De Fratus combined to throw 162 pitches in six innings, 67 of which were balls.

Howard homered for the second straight game, putting the Phillies on the board with a three-run shot in the fifth. A Missouri native whose favorite team growing up was the Cardinals, Howard homered for the 21st time in 62 career games against St. Louis.

Phillies starters have gone 24 straight games without a victory, dating to May 23. They are 0-15 with a 5.97 ERA during that stretch.

Titans sign 3rd-round draft pick Poutasi; Mariota still unsigned



NASHVILLE, Tenn. (AP) — The Tennessee Titans have signed rookie offensive tackle Jeremiah Poutasi of Utah, leaving quarterback Marcus Mariota as their only draft pick still unsigned.

The Titans announced Poutasi's signing Friday.

The 6-foot-5, 335-pound Poutasi was the 66th selection overall when the Titans drafted him in the third round. Poutasi started 35 of his 36 games at Utah, spending his first season at right tackle as a true freshman before playing left tackle his final two seasons.

The Titans have signed eight of their nine draft picks, with Mariota, the No. 2 pick overall and Heisman Trophy winner from Oregon, the only one not yet under contract. ■

The Hunter's Guide

Fishing slows for summertime weather

The fishing on Kentucky and Barkley has been good this year – really good. Just look at the results of the recent Bassmaster's Elite Series tournament fished out of Paris Landing. The top three anglers all had four-day catches of over 90 pounds even with a five fish per day limit. The largest bass caught in the tournament weighed eight pounds.

Everyone else has been enjoying the awesome fishing for largemouth bass and for the ol' whiskered catfish – until things heated up this week and especially since the current in both lakes slowed to a trickle.

But that's not to say the fishing isn't good these days – it's great! It just isn't as awesome as it was when cooler weather prevailed but help is on the horizon. Just as the cicadas faded away the mayflies have begun to hatch around the lakes and everyone knows that when mayflies hatch, fish go on a feeding frenzy.

The bass are still being taken out on the ledges in 20- to 30-foot of water. To reach these fish takes a large Carolina rigged worm, a heavy jig, or a monster sized crank bait. The story I'm getting is that not every ledge is holding bass and not every school of bass is in the mood to tussle with your lure. This is where the modern electronic depth finders come into play. The fancy models that costs an arm and a leg will allow the fisherman to not only see how many fish are holding near a ledge, but whether or not the fish are actively feeding. But if you don't have battleship sonar on your rig, just find a ledge and start fishing. Sooner or later you're bound to find happy fish.

The catfish are still cooperating out on the edges of the old river channel or on the creeks of the secondary channels. Best catches are being reported in 20- to 25-foot of water right on the edge of the deep channels. Just about anything you want to drop down to the catfish will work including minnows, shad, night-crawlers, and cut-bait such as chicken. Troll slowly at these depths and keep your hook a foot or so above the bottom.

The annual spring squirrel season has come to a close in Kentucky and with that, the spring hunting seasons have come to a close. Now sportsmen and women around the state will have to concentrate on fishing or preparing for the fall seasons which begin

with the fall squirrel season on the third Saturday in August. Right now, food plots should be planted and growing and fertilizer and herbicide should be applied where needed.


This past week, news broke that firearms manufacturer Colt was filing for bankruptcy. Colt has struggled in the past and, according to some, had abandoned the individual gun owner to concentrate on the military market. When Colt lost the military contracts, it was all over but the crying. It is very likely that some group will buy Colt, or at least buy the name, and will continue to manufacture Colt's line of firearms. Don't expect Colt to return to the glory days when they made the "snake guns" such as the Python, Diamondback, Cobra, and Anaconda. Those guns were meticulously made by hand and don't fit well with today's automated environment. If you have a Colt firearm of any kind, I'd put it in the safe and hang on to it for awhile.

I watched the videos this past week from the public meeting at Kentucky Dam Village with the U.S. Forest Service regarding management practices in the LBL. What I saw was disheartening. There were two major groups railing at the Forest Service – the environmentalist whackos and the former residents of LBL. The whackos, of course, want nothing done in the LBL. They want the place to grow up in sawbriers and hackberries. Somehow they think people will flock to the area see an overgrown, inaccessible hunk of land. The former residents are still bitter about being thrown off their land and they seem to oppose anything that anyone proposes to do in the LBL. They want their cemeteries taken care of, to which I agree, but they want the place preserved just like they left it years ago so they can go visit old homeplaces.

Lost in all the bickering and pontificating were the sportsmen who hunt, fish, and camp in the LBL. These are the people who will utilize and sustain the area, not that bunch of old hippies with ponytails. Managing the wildlife is the key to the LBL. Of course people who want to hunt the area will benefit from a healthy wildlife population, but even the campers and the day-use folks expect to see critters when they visit the LBL. Hunting, camping, and hiking are the major uses for the area. Very few people are going to trek across the rivers to watch trees grow.

At any rate, the debate goes on and I have little confidence in an acceptable resolution. That's a shame because the LBL is a jewel for our area. The LBL needs well-maintained campgrounds, launching ramps, and educational opportunities, not a so-called old-growth forest that benefits no one.

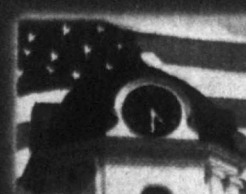

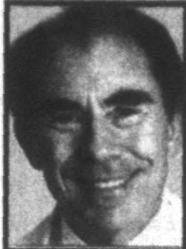

Colorblindness is most often an inherited condition

DEAR DOCTOR K: Why are some people colorblind?

DEAR READER: People who are colorblind are unable to see colors the way most people do. True colorblindness, in which everything appears black, gray or white, is very rare. More often, "colorblind" people have trouble distinguishing colors from one another.

Light that enters our eyes is focused by the lens to fall on the back of the eye -- the retina. Within the retina are 7 million cone cells. These specialized cells contain chemicals, called photopigments, that react to different wavelengths in light. The color of light is determined by its wavelength. Photopigments respond to blue, green or red light. Colorblindness occurs when the eye either lacks certain photopigments, or when these pigments do not work as they should.

Most people who are colorblind inherit the condition. Rarely, a condition that develops later in life causes colorblindness. Most people who inherit the condition are not even aware of it until another person questions their ability to identify color. Sometimes colorblindness is revealed only during color vision testing.

Symptoms of colorblindness depend on the type of cone cells affected:

RED-GREEN COLORBLINDNESS. In the most common type of colorblindness, people cannot distinguish green from red. That is, some people see red objects as being green, and other people see green objects as being red. It occurs when either the red or green cone cells are missing or

are not working properly.
BLUE-YELLOW COLORBLINDNESS. This occurs when blue cone cells are missing or not working properly. People with this type of colorblindness see blue as green and may find it difficult to distinguish yellow or red from pink.

COMPLETE COLORBLINDNESS. True colorblindness is when everything appears in shades of black, gray and white. It occurs when none or only one type of cone cell works properly.

In the United States, about 7 percent of men and 0.4 percent of women have red-green colorblindness. In other words, more than 10 times as many men as women are colorblind. Why is this? It's because the genes that are defective in colorblindness are located on the X chromosome.

Women have two X chromosomes. So even if they inherit one X chromosome for colorblindness, they won't have colorblindness. The normal color genes on the other X chromosome compensate for the defective genes on their first X chromosome.

Unlike women, men have only one X chromosome. So if their X chromosome contains defective color genes, they will be colorblind.

Inherited colorblindness cannot be "fixed." But special corrective lenses can help people with red-green colorblindness to see color more accurately.

And smartphone apps (for Apple or Android) can help to identify color and shades of color. Here's how they work: Suppose a sign has red letters on a green background. The phone recognizes this, and changes the red letters to a color that a colorblind person can see on a green background. Pretty cool!

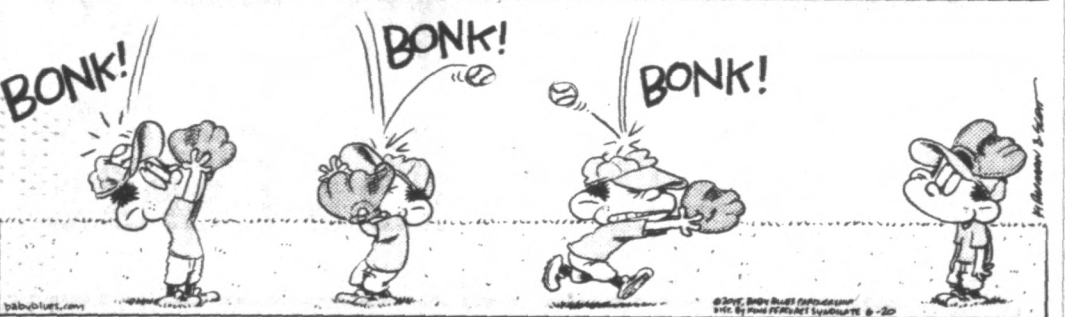

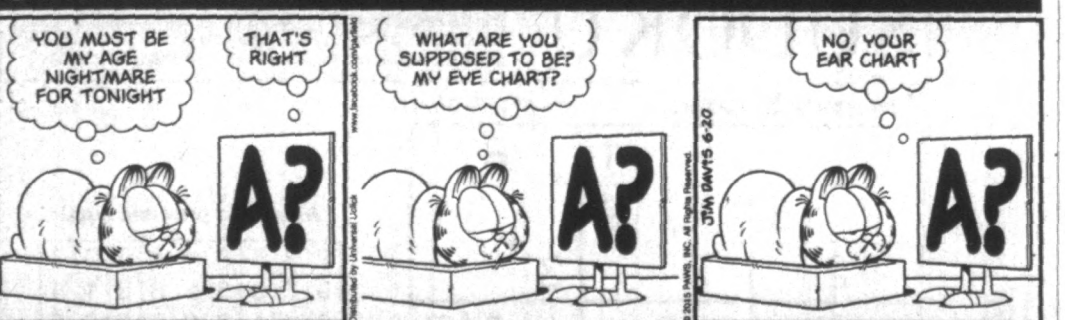

Molly will eat only an upscale, expensive brand. I try to preserve so as to reduce waste and expense. -- Cat Servant Michelle in California

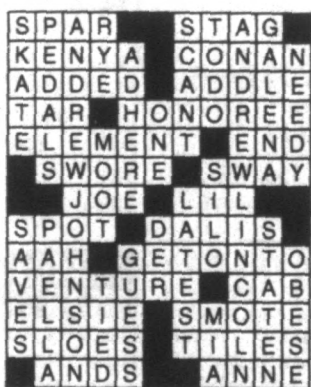
