Murray city limits to buy them, Murray city limits to buy them,
and also plans to strictly enforce the city sticker ordinance. In April, the Murray City Council voted $7-5$ to pass the second reading of an ordinance amendment that raised the late fee for not having a city sticker
from $\$ 50$ to $\$ 100$. If someone is caught witheut a city sticker, the person must pay that fee in addition to purchasing the sticker. Rose said that when people complain to him about the enforcement of the city sticker ordinance, they sometimes ask
whose idea it was to double the whose ice. He tells them he pro-
