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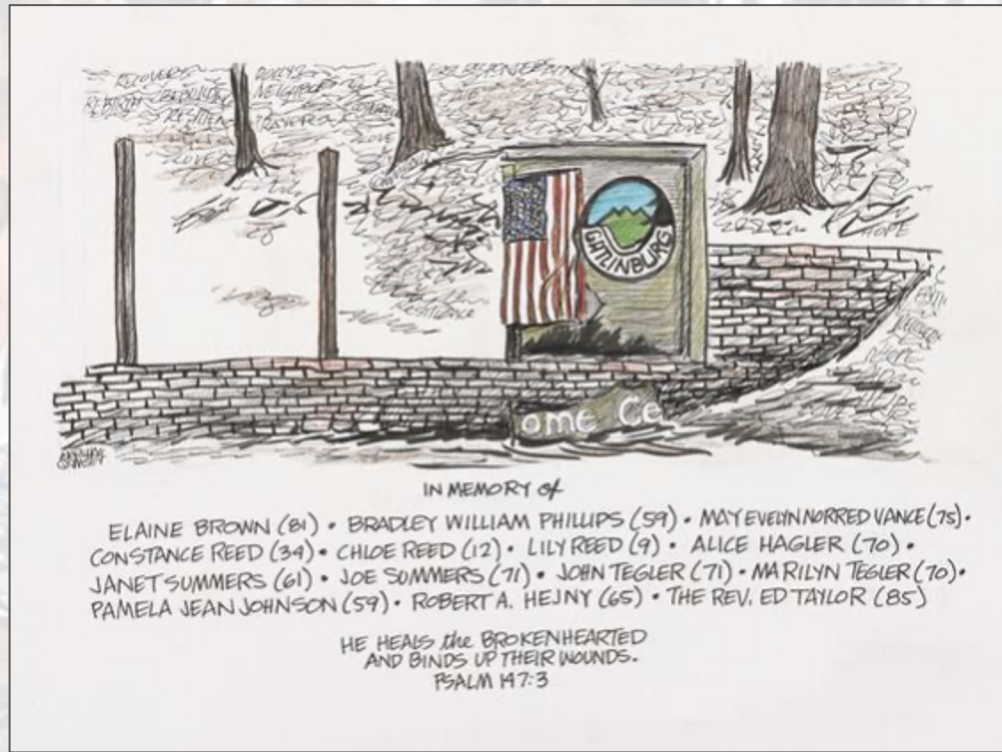

Chimney Tops 2 Wildfires

- Began on November 23, 2016 in the Great Smoky Mountains National Park
- 14 individuals lost their lives, 200 were injured, and thousands evacuated

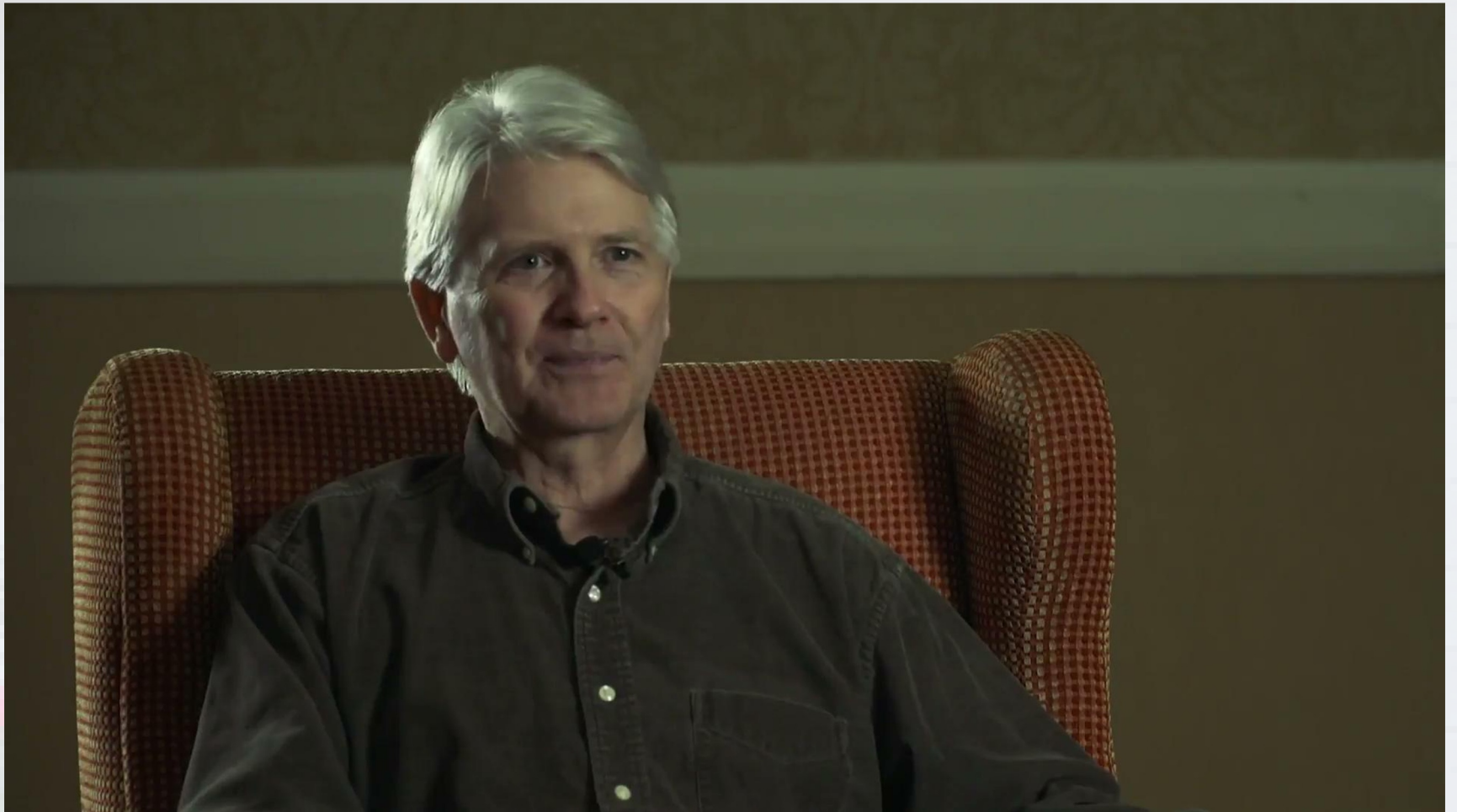

Arrowmont School of Arts & Crafts

Web Content Accessibility Guidelines (WCAG)

Automatic Captions are Not Sufficient

Automatically-generated captions do not meet user needs or accessibility requirements, unless they are confirmed to be fully accurate. Usually they need significant editing.

There are tools that use speech recognition technology to turn a soundtrack into a timed caption file. For example, some common video websites provide automatic captions. However, often the automatic caption text is wrong and does not match the spoken audio — sometimes in ways that change the meaning (or are embarrassing). For example, missing just one word such as “not” can make the captions contradict the actual audio content.

Example of bad automatic captions (that cause a fire)

Spoken audio:

"Broil on high for **4 to 5 minutes**. You should **not** preheat the oven."

Automatic caption:

"Broil on high for **45 minutes**. You should **know to** preheat the oven."



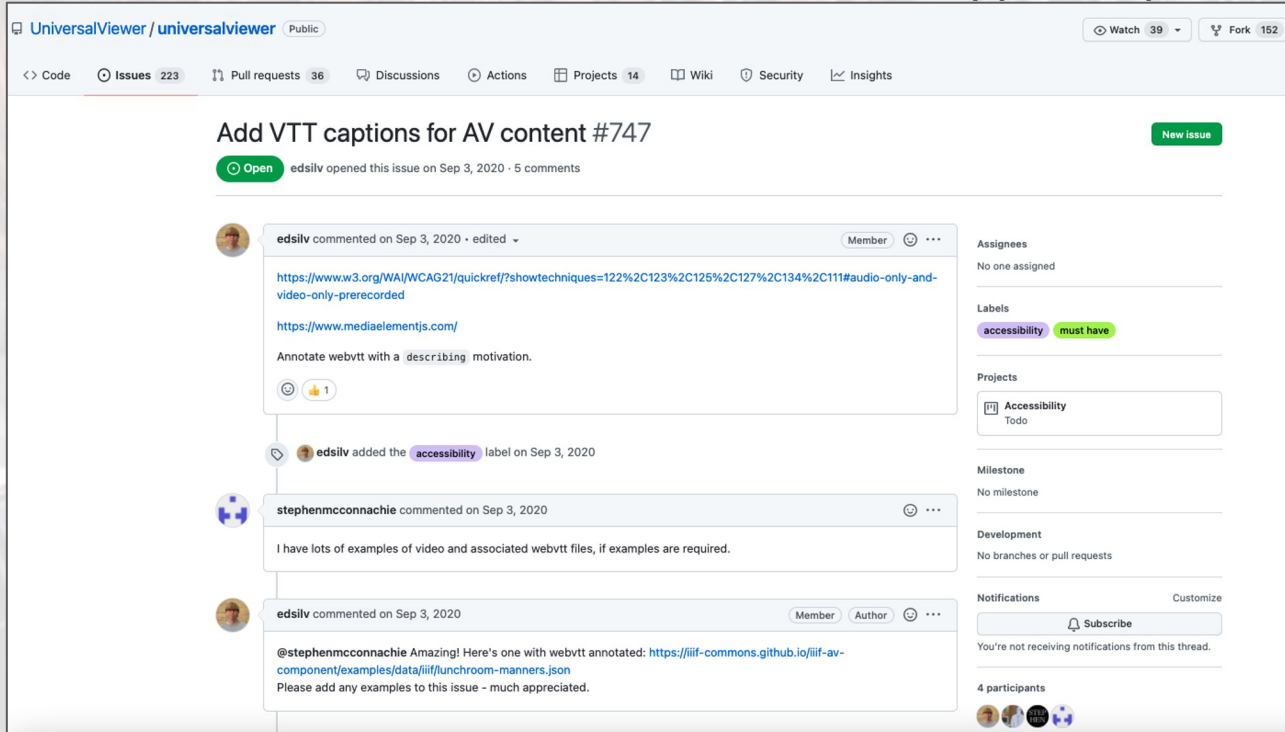
Automatic captions can be used as a starting point for developing accurate captions and transcripts.

No Captions, No Content

- When www.rfta.lib.utk.edu was initially launched on November 30, 2021, a total of 23 oral histories had to be excluded from the site because captions were not ready
- The launch date was significant because it was the 5th anniversary of the fires
- Oral history contributors contacted the Libraries questioning why their story was not present on the site at launch

International Image Interoperability Framework (IIIF) and Captions

- Used Mirador since the Universal Viewer does not support captions for AV content

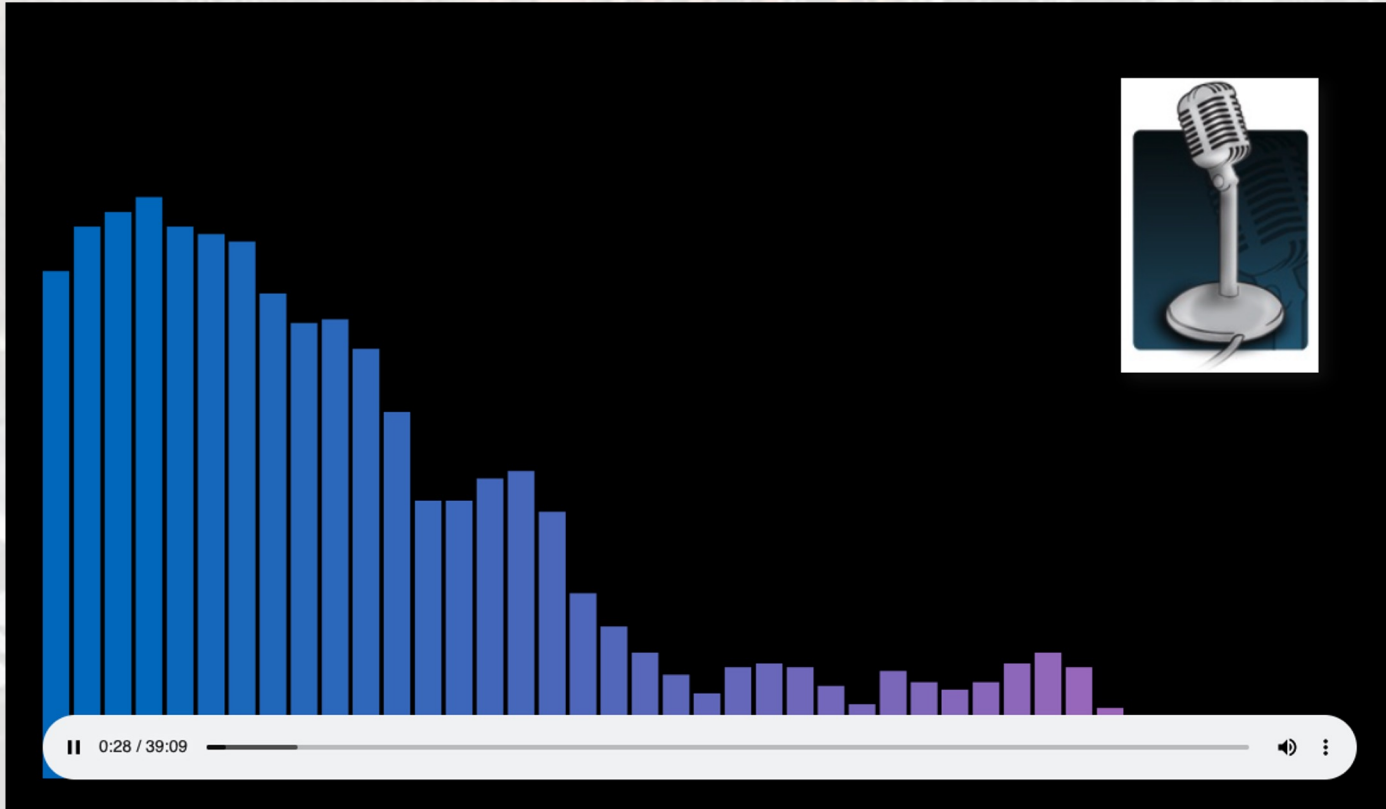

<p>Description:</p>				<p>In this interview Julia Rodríguez, a Honduran native and Gatlinburg resident since 2000, tells us of the hours leading up to her evacuation and the fear filled drive her family experienced while leaving Gatlinburg as hills and homes burned down around them. Julia talks about how her sister lost her home in the fires and explains the aftermath of Gatlinburg residents dealing with a housing and employment crisis exacerbated by the fires. Julia also talks about the toll the fires had on this Hispanic community and the possible good that came of it. This is a representative quote from the interview: "...that traumatizes you for the rest of your life. It's horrible, to see that you're at, the mouth of death. You don't know if you're living your final moments, and to see my son crying saying 'mommy, we're not going to make it.' I had no choice but to try and get out.</p>
