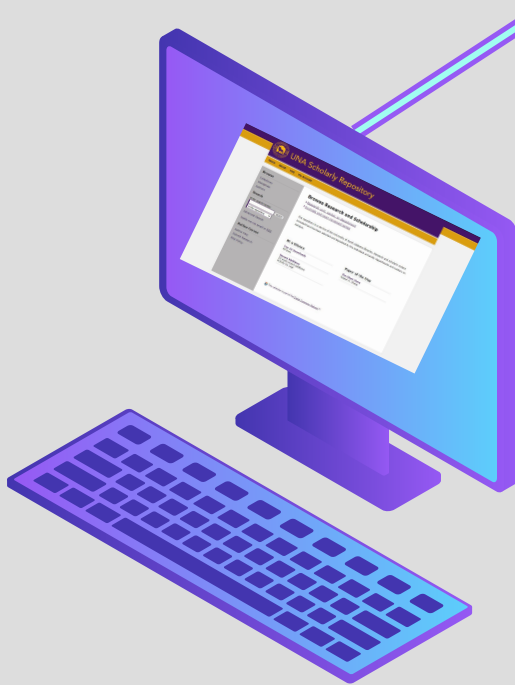

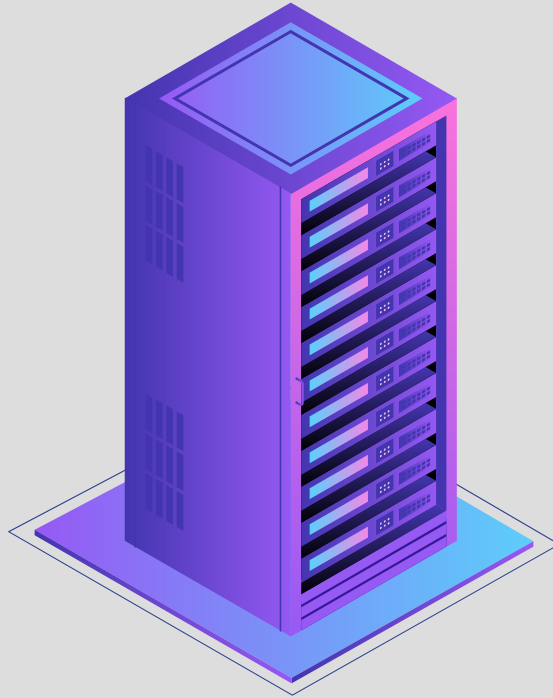

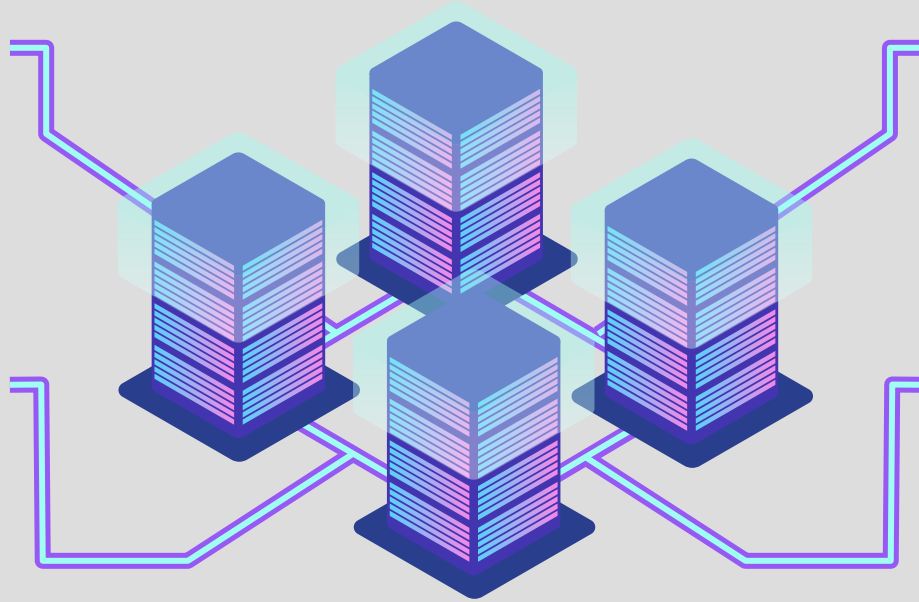

Migration Process

- Began migration August 2021
- bepress/Ubiquity overlap of only 1 month
- bepress backed up repository data to AWS
- Clear timeline
 - Google Drive for timeline, meeting docs, migration metadata
 - Weekly meeting each Monday to discuss issues and upcoming events
 - Slack channel for all other communication
