May 6, 1982

The Chair made the following announcements:

- 1) Attached to the agenda is the Institutional Review Board Draft Procedural Statement for information.

- 2) A copy of the N. D. State Board of Higher Education Tenure Study Committee's Recommended Regulations on Academic Freedom, Tenure and Due Process was distributed by the Office of the VPAA. This is for study now and any input accumulated will be forwarded to the State Board.
- 3) The Chair requested that Gerald Skogley present an update on the preparation of the biennial budget. There being no objection, Mr. Skogley reported to the Senate.
- 4) A copy of the draft of the State Board policy on the awarding of honorary degrees was recently circulated. Mr. Wali, Chairman of the Honorary Degrees Committee, asked for verbal comments on the draft today to submit written input for the Board agenda at the meeting on May 13 and 14.
- 5) Alice Clark reported that the University budget will be reviewed by the Board at the May meeting.

4.

Mr. Kinghorn moved approval of the minutes of the April 1, 1982, meeting of the University Senate. Mr. Schubert seconded the motion. The motion was voted upon and carried by a vote of 42 for and 1 abstaining.

5.

Mr. Wermers presented the tentative list of Candidates for Degrees in May, 1982, and moved that the list be approved for recommendation to the State Board of Higher Education for the awarding of the degrees indicated, upon satisfactory completion of the work of the present semester. Mr. O'Kelly seconded the motion. The motion was voted upon and carried by a vote of 42 for and 1 abstaining. (See attachment #1.)

6.

Mr. Langemo presented the annual Report of the Athletic Board of Control and moved that the report be filed. Mr. Schubert seconded the motion which was voted upon and carried by a vote of 42 for and 1 abstaining. (See attachment #2.)

7.

Mr. Selbyg presented the report of the Fringe Benefits Committee and moved that the report be filed. Mr. Johnson seconded the motion which was voted upon and carried unanimously. (See attachment #3.)

8.

Alice Clark presented the report from the committee on the FAR form. Mr.

Ring's motion, made at the March meeting, to discontinue use of the FAR form, was brought back to the floor. Discussion followed. The motion to discontinue use was voted upon and defeated by a vote of 13 for, 25 against and 5 abstaining. Mr. Johnson moved to file the report of the FAR Committee. Ms. Smiley seconded the motion which was voted upon and carried by a vote of 41 for, 1 against and 1 abstaining. (See attachment #4.)

9.

Mr. Bryan presented the recommended change in the Code of Student Life, Section 3, University Owned Residences, and moved approval. Mr. Hill seconded the motion and discussion followed. Mr. O'Kelly moved the previous question. Mr. Perrone seconded the motion which was voted upon and carried by a vote of 40 for, 2 against and 1 abstaining. The motion to approve the recommended change was voted upon and carried by a vote of 39 for, 3 against and 1 abstaining. (See attachment #5.)

10.

Mr. Reid presented the proposed revision of the section in the Faculty Handbook on patents and moved that the revision be adopted. Mr. Selbyg seconded the motion. Discussion followed. Mr. Reid said to scratch the words, "with any," at the end of line 11 and place a period after the word, "procedures". Mr. Hampsten moved to insert the word, "students," after the words, "faculty members," in line 16. (This was a friendly amendment and didn't require a vote.) The move to adopt the revision was voted upon and carried unanimously. (See attachment #6.)

11.

Lucy Schwartz, Chairperson of the Curriculum Committee, presented the report of the Curriculum Committee to add a new program, M.S. in Child Study and Education, and two courses along with the program. Mr. Bostrom moved approval of the program and courses. Mr. Perrone seconded the motion which was voted upon and carried unanimously. (See attachment #7.)

12.

The Chair reported that no action was taken at the last meeting on the Report of the Honorary Degrees Committee. Mr. Selbyg moved to file the report. Mr. Kinghorn seconded the motion. Discussion followed. The motion was voted upon and carried by a vote of 37 for and 1 abstaining.

Mr. Wali presented the information on a candidate for an honorary degree. Ms. Clark moved the approval of an honorary degree for the candidate. Mr. Boyd seconded the motion which was voted upon and carried by a vote of 33 for, 2 against and 1 abstaining.

13.

Mr. Miller moved to adjourn. The motion was seconded, voted upon and carried by a vote of 32 for and 1 against. The meeting adjourned at 5:17 p.m.

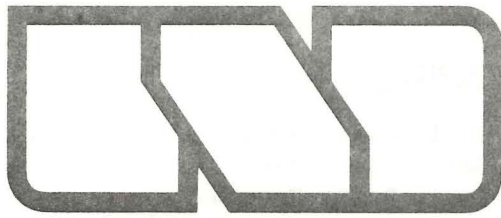

In addition to the usual responsibilities associated with the approval of athletic schedules, awards, monthly financial statements, and the annual budgets, the board paid special attention to the following:

COMMITTEE ACTIONS:

1. A subcommittee was established to develop policies for post-season, championship, or invitational competition by UND athletic teams. The subcommittee, chaired by Randy Lee, developed guidelines for use by the Athletic Director to govern individual and team participation in those events.

2. A subcommittee (consisting of student members Alison Myhra, Don Speare, and John Gray) was established to consider the question of a potential surcharge or surcharges for students attending hockey, basketball, and football games as a potential source of revenue for funding intramural and intercollegiate athletics.
3. Board of Control support was expressed to the Athletic Director and Assistant Athletic Director for maintaining womens' teams at a level required for their participation in the North Central Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (NCIAC) and the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA).

HIGHLIGHTS OF THE YEAR:

1. The mens' ice hockey team won the Division I national title! Specifically, the hockey team won the Western Collegiate Hockey Association (WCHA) championship and the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) national championship.
2. The mens' basketball team won the North Central Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (NCIAC) championship, the North-Central NCAA Regional championship, and participated in the NCAA's "final eight" Western Division II title game.
3. The mens' golf team won the North Central Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (NCIAC) championship for the third year in a row.
4. The womens' swimming team won the North Central Intercollegiate Athletic Conference (NCIAC) championship.
5. Milson Jones was named to First Team All America as a runningback.
6. Heavyweight wrestler Jerome Larson was named an All American for the second straight season.
7. Jeff Skinner was named as the first University of North Dakota All American in the sport of golf.
8. Kim Edwards placed high in the national swimming meet in the short races.
9. Coach John Gasparini was named national "College Hockey Coach of the Year" and "Coach of the Year in the WCHA".
10. Coach Dave Gunther was named District Five Division II "Coach of the Year" by his peers in the National Association of Basketball Coaches.
11. Construction began in March on the addition to the Winter Sports Center, to better serve the National NCAA Division I Hockey Tournament in 1983.

RE: 1982 Report

Arne Selbyg is secretary and other elected members are Richard Kauffman, Robert Kemper, Michael Polovitz, and Marie Zimmerman. Fred MacGregor, Personnel Director, also meets with the committee. The committee met five times as a group. Two subcommittees, one working on phasing and early retirement, and another on benefits for part-time personnel, met an additional two times each. As a result of the work done by the subcommittee on benefits for part-time personnel, the Fringe Benefits Committee felt a clarification of policies was accomplished. Most of the actions of the subcommittee for phasing and early retirement became part of a report to the Council of Presidents, and from there to the Board of Higher Education. A committee composed of Dick Forseth, Professor of Math at Mayville, Ray Hoops, VPAA at NDSU, and Tom Robinson submitted that report. It seems likely there will be future action by the Board permitting incentive early retirements and more widespread use of phased retirement. For example, a bill has been drafted by the Legislative Council staff for the Higher Education Commission which would permit the Board of Higher Education to essentially buy up the contract of a tenured faculty member.

This year there has been an updating of the fringe benefits brochures and an increase in the life insurance coverage offered through Western States Life. The third annual series of pre-retirement seminars was held, under the direction of Fred MacGregor and Tom Robinson.

This is the final report to come to the University Senate from the Fringe Benefits Committee, since the Senate at its April, 1982, meeting approved the formation of a new committee, called the Compensation Committee, among whose duties will be to oversee fringe benefits. Although there have been no spectacular improvements in benefits there have been accomplishments in the areas of disability and life insurance, retirement benefits, pre-retirement preparation, and overall awareness of benefits during the period of existence of the Fringe Benefits Committee.

Correct, add or delete information to accurately reflect your effort devoted to both scheduled and nonscheduled courses. Scheduled courses are those which meet on a regular basis, typically in an assigned classroom, laboratory, studio, etc. Non-scheduled courses are the "middle digit 8 and 9" courses which meet on a flexible basis, e.g. independent study, thesis and dissertation advisement, student teaching supervision, etc. Courses you will teach outside of your home department should also be included. NONSCHEDULED COURSES: Courses which meet on a flexible basis (independent study, theses, etc.) should be asterisked in this column. Courses which have a "middle digit 8 or 9" have been asterisked by the computer. Please correct those entries which are in fact scheduled courses.

CONTACT HOURS: Enter the number of hours per week that each class will be met, based on the class meeting an entire semester. For example, an eight-week course that meets two hours per week averages one hour per week for the semester. For non-scheduled courses, enter the average number of hours per week. Do not answer in more detail than tenths of an hour.

PERCENT OF TIME: Indicate what percent of your total effort will be spent on each class. Include projected time spent meeting with the class, all preparations, testing, grading and evaluating, meeting with and assisting students, and traveling to off-campus sites. Answer only in full percentages. Percent of effort devoted to any courses in this section which are counted as part of a separately budgeted instructional account should be shown in I.B. (See below).

B. SPONSORED INSTRUCTION

Include all planned effort devoted to instructional activities which are separately budgeted. Examples are efforts to externally supported instructional projects and training grants. 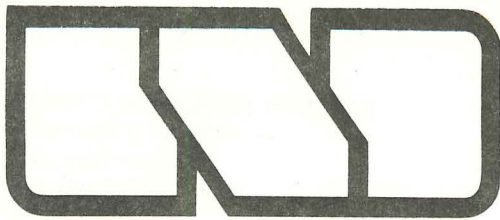

Attached please find a proposed revision of the section in the Faculty Handbook on Patents (p. 78). This revision is necessary because the existing one is in conflict with the North Dakota Century Code 47-28. The proposed revision corrects the illegal statements and changes the relative roles of the Faculty Research Committee vis-a-vis the Office of Research and Program Development.

We recommend that this be brought to the University Senate for its endorsement.

7. PATENTS AND COPYRIGHTS

University Patent Policy, as approved by the University Senate and the State Board of Higher Education and as consistent with the laws of the State of North Dakota, provides that inventions developed by faculty, students, employees and associates through the use of University facilities, time or materials must be reported to the *Faculty Research Committee Office of Research and Program Development*. The University will either utilize Research Corporation or proceed independently to evaluate the worth and patentability of the invention and, if patentable, to obtain patents, arrange licenses, etc. Any royalties received from such patents will be used first to cover the expenses incurred in the patenting and licensing procedures with any returns beyond these costs being distributed among the inventor(s) and the University according to existing royalty distribution agreements. All such University income will be devoted to the support of the Faculty Research Program. Remaining royalties will be divided so that at least 15% of the net proceeds shall be paid to the faculty members, officials or employees of the University responsible for the invention. The remainder shall be used in the faculty research program, and administered jointly by the Faculty Research Committee and the Office of Research and Program Development.

Persons with inventions should submit the appropriate materials and descriptions to the Director of the Office of Research and Program Development for processing. The Faculty Research Committee Office of Research and Program Development shall decide upon final disposition of the rights on the invention. The Committee invention; that office may decide that the inventor should retain ownership, in which case the inventor may proceed to file a patent application in his own behalf with the University waiving all rights.

The Director of the Office of Research and Program Development must give advance approval to any contract or grant in which (a) the disposition of patent ownership is specified as being other than the University of North Dakota and/or (b) licensing agreements are specified in the grant or contract document.

The Copyright Policy, reproduced below, has been approved by the University Senate and the State Board of Higher Education.

1. *Members of the faculty who, in the course of scholarly pursuits of their discipline, write articles and books are encouraged to seek and retain copyright ownership of these works.*
2. *If the University directly supports the production of a copyrightable work, the ownership of which is vested in the individual faculty member, the University shall be reimbursed out of the royalties, in accord with an agreement between the faculty member and the University, up to the amount of the University's direct support.*
3. *If faculty are employed or commissioned by the University or agencies of the University for the production of materials, or if by prior agreement they are assigned to produce or develop materials as educational or instructional aids in the course of their regular duties and if such materials are deemed appropriate for copyright, they must be reported to the Faculty Research Committee (Educational materials may*
