Mr. Burdick introduced the following bill; which was referred to the Committee on Indian Affairs

A BILL

To amend Public Law Numbered 383, Seventy-third Congress (48 Stat. L. 984), relating to Indians, by exempting from the provisions of such Act any Indian tribe or reservation in the State of North Dakota.

- 1 Be it enacted by the Senate and House of Representa-
- 2 tives of the United States of America in Congress assembled,
- 3 That section 13 of the Act entitled "An Act to conserve and
- 4 develop Indian lands and resources; to extend to Indians the
- 5 right to form business and other organizations; to establish
- 6 a credit system for Indians; to grant certain rights of home
- 7 rule to Indians; to provide for vocational education for
- 8 Indians; and for other purposes", approved June 18, 1934
- 9 (48 Stat. L. 984), be, and is hereby, amended by inserting
- 10 after the words "United States", in the second line of said
- 11 section, the following: "or to any Indian tribe or reserva-
- 12 tion located in the State of North Dakota".
