The residue of our Holland friends from St. Clair are in this city, and will leave tomorrow for Kalamazoo. They go on the Rail Road for two dollars, each grown person, and half price for children - no charge for goods.

The accompanying letters to you were given to me <u>to-day</u> by Mr. Witherspoon - and I enclose them to you.

I hope that our friends from Albany reach you in safety. They left here on Wednesday last.
