Special Fees

Current Students

Students enrolled at Memphis State University during the Fall Semester do not have to notify the Records Office of their intention to return for the Spring Semester. Current students will receive registration materials via mail. Former students see next page.

New Students

Registration materials will not be made available to new students until they have been admitted to Graduate School and had a conference with the Graduate Dean. Folowing the conference with the Dean, the student will receive authorization to have naterials prepared. The material will be available on the campus Wednesday and Thursday, January 24-25, during office hours (8:00 A.M.-4:00 P.M.) and during the evening (6:00 P.M.-8:00 P.M.) and on Friday, January 26, (8:00 A.M.-3:30 P.M.) Former Students

A former student is defined as a student who (1) has previously been enrolled in Memphis State but (2) was not enrolled during the Fall Semester. In order to gain readmission for the Spring Semester, former students must take the following steps:

- Obtain from the Office of Admissions and Records an application for readmission. Complete this application and return it to the Office of Admissions and Records.
- (2) Request the registrar of each college attended, if any, to mail an official transcript of credits to the Graduate Dean.

After the former student has completed the above procedure, he will be sent a notice of his readmission status by the Records Office.

NOTE: To receive registration materials by mail, former students must complete admission requirements by Friday, December 1. Mailout of registration materials, Monday, January 15, through Friday, January 19.

Registration Procedure

Only the general steps in the registration procedure are listed here. More specific instructions will be presented in an instruction sheet which will be issued with registration materials. Basically, the registration procedure consists of the following steps:

- (1) Secure registration materials.
- (2) Confer with faculty adviser to secure his guidance and approval in planning your schedule.
- (3) All students must present ID cards for admission to the registration center. Current students will use the cards they now have. New students, former students, and current students who have lost their ID cards will follow instructions accompanying the registration materials.
- (4) Enter the Registration Center at the time indicated on the Appointment Card in the registration material to secure class cards and pay fees.

An application blank must be completed and filed with the Dean of the Graduate School, not later than two weeks prior to registration.

	Two transcripts of undergraduate work must be on file with the Graduate De: prior to registration. At least one of the transcripts must come directly from tl undergraduate institution. (Memphis State University graduates will have tra scripts provided.)
	A satisfactory score on the Miller Analogies Test must be on file with the Gradua Dean. Applicants from out of the City are encouraged to take the test at an instit tion near them and to have the scores sent to Memphis State University. Scores of the Aptitude Phase of the Graduate Record Examination will be accepted in lieu the Miller Analogies Test.

- 4. Prospective students should write or call the Testing Office, Administration Buil ing, the telephone number is 321-1428. Not more than 25 can be tested at one tim Arrange the test as far in advance of registration as possible.
- 5. A fee of \$5.00 will be charged for the test. It must be paid at the Business Offic Room 228, Administration Building, prior to examination. The receipt is require for admission to the testing room. The Business Office is open from 8:00 a.m. 4:00 p.m. daily except Saturday when it is open 9:00 a.m. to Noon.
- 6. The student should arrange an interview with the Dean of the Graduate Schor Administration Building, as soon as possible after he has met all admission requir ments. His registration may be delayed if the interview has not been arranged priv to Registration Day. Write, or call 321-1531 for an appointment.
- 7. An application fee of five dollars (\$5.00) is required with the application for e applying to Memphis State University for the first time. This charge is a servic charge and is not refundable.
- Applicants cannot be notified concerning acceptance before application, transcript test score, and \$5.00 fee are on file.

Admission to Work Toward Post Master's Credit

Applicants who have at one time been admitted to the Graduate School of Men phis State University and completed one or more courses, and hold a Master's degre (this does not apply to students who were admitted to a course at the request of U' MSU Center) will proceed as follows:

- (a) Submit a re-admission form to the Records Office.
- (b) Submit two transcripts of credits earned at each institution attended since the la enrollment at Memphis State.
- (c) Arrange a conference with the Graduate Dean after the transcripts are on file. A conference should be arranged two weeks prior to registration in order to allo time for conferences with advisers.

Applicants who have not been admitted to the Graduate School of Memphis Stat University will proceed as follows:

- (a) Fill out an application form (green) for admission.
- (b) Pay the five dollar (\$5.00) application fee.
- (c) Have two copies of undergraduate transcripts showing the degree earned and tw copies of graduate transcripts showing degree earned plus two transcripts of an post-Master's credit earned, sent to the Dean of the Graduate School.
- (d) Arrange a conference with the Graduate Dean at least two weeks prior to registration if possible. There is no need to arrange a conference prior to receipt of a transcripts.
- (e) Graduate advisers or a graduate committee will be assigned to advise studen pending admission to candidacy.

Graduate School Regulations

 Sixteen semester hours will be maximum load for students devoting full time i graduate study. Only full-time students may register for twelve semester hours of more of course work in any one semester, including courses on campus, extension courses, and courses to be transferred from other institutions. Students who have full-time positions may not enroll for more than two courses.

After a graduate student has completed his registration, it cannot be changed without approval of the Dean of the Graduate School. The adjustment will originate in the office of the Dean, and the change-of-course must have the approval of the student's adviser and the Dean.

ADDING:	No course may be added after February 7.	
DROPPING:	-No course may be dropped after February 21.	
WITHDRAWAL:	—No student may withdraw after April 30.	

Failure to give official notice of complete withdrawal from Graduate School in writing will result in a grade "F" in each course for which the student was registered. Address your notice of withdrawal to the Dean of the Graduate School.

To become a candidate for a degree, the student must file an application on blanks available at the Office of the Dean. The application must contain plans for a complete program of graduate study and be approved by a faculty adviser in both the major and minor areas. Unless "Intent to Graduate" cards are on file by March 4, one cannot be assured of graduation on May 25, 1968.

A student must have an overall B average in graduate courses at the beginning of the semester in order to be placed on the list for graduation in that semester.

If a student withdraws from the University within seven days after the beginning of classes for the semester, a refund will be made of 80% of fees; each week thereafter, the amount will be reduced 20%.


