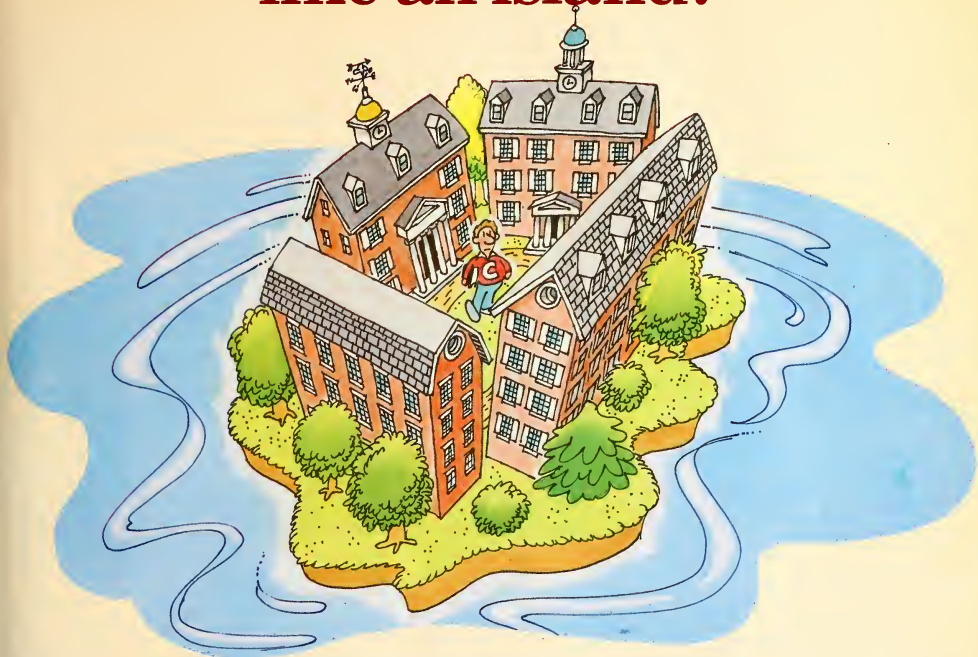

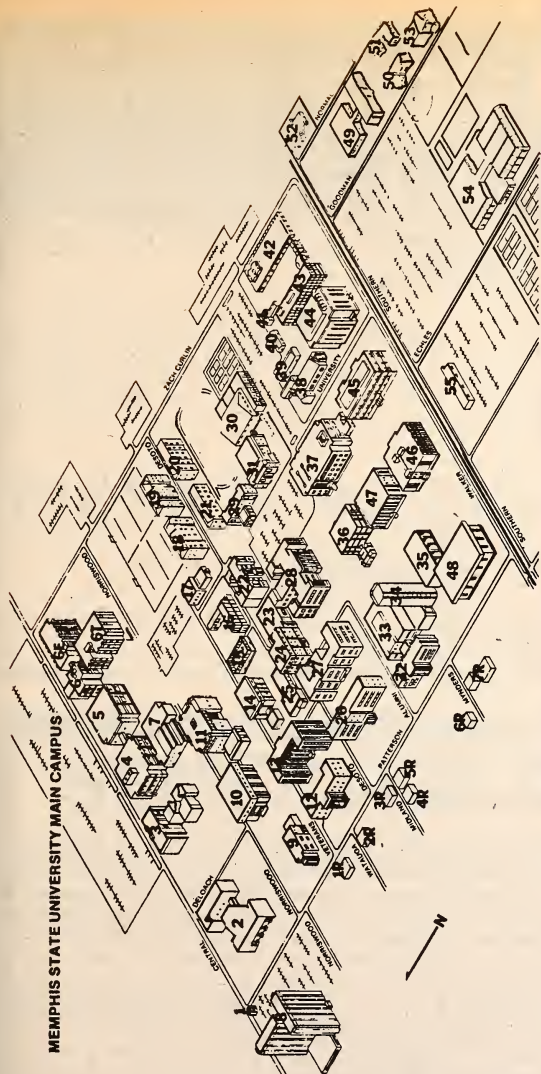

## NOTICE TO GRADUATING SENIORS

### Senior Testing Requirement

University policy requires all seniors to complete a general education and/or major area examination in the academic year of their graduation. The ACT-COMP, a general education test, is scheduled on the dates listed below for seniors planning to graduate in December, 1984. Choose the preferred test date and register by calling the University Testing Center at 454-2428. CALL EARLY to register for the test date of your choice. The test must be completed PRIOR to your graduation.

Students with a major listed above are required to take an area examination rather than the ACT-COMP. Contact your college advisor for further information.

### About The ACT-COMP

The ACT-COMP is a test designed to assess the skills that students learn in their general education program and how well the student can apply these skills for effective functioning in a variety of adult roles. It is not meant to test knowledge gained in a specific major or discipline, but rather to evaluate the student's ability to receive information in a variety of formats, analyze the information, and respond, in terms of actions and values, to situations related to adult roles in society. Questions are based on excerpts from television documentaries, recent magazine articles, ads, short stories, art prints, music, discussions, and newscasts.

Scores on the test will be returned to the student, along with information on the percentile rankings of the scores relative to a national group and the local MSU group with which the student was tested. The report includes not only an overall total score, but also subscores in the following areas:

- Functioning Within Social Institutions
- Using Science and Technology
- Using the Arts
- Communicating
- Solving Problems
- Clarifying Values

A description of each subscore area is included with the score report.

There is no required score for graduation. However, a good set of scores, which shows a ranking in the top half of the comparison group, may be a useful tool in seeking employment and references, and in verifying that you can function and communicate well in a variety of situations.

## INTENSIVE ENGLISH FOR INTERNATIONALS NON-CREDIT

The Intensive English for Internationals program provides language instruction for non-English speakers in Memphis, in the surrounding area and from abroad. Students attend classes grouped by ability level and receive a certificate of attendance upon successful completion of study. The program is offered year-round on a semester basis coinciding with the University's calendar and features an 8-week summer session. All classes are taught by professionally trained staff members. All courses are non-credit. Five options are available for the 1984 session: Intensive English with twenty-three hours a week instruction, Semi-intensive English with fifteen hours a week instruction, evening classes four hours a week, TOEFL preparation, and pronunciation classes also taught in the evening.

Registration and testing for the Intensive and Semi-intensive courses will be held on September 4 or by appointment before that date. In addition to classes listed above, others designed to meet special needs may be arranged. ## VA EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS

### IT IS THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO BE AWARE OF AND FULFILL ALL REQUIREMENTS FOR RECEIPT OF G.I. BILL BENEFITS.

Any student using VA Educational Assistance (G.I. Bill Benefits) at Memphis State University should contact the Office of Veteran's Services, Room 212, Scates Hall, 454-2996. New students should be prepared to furnish the following items as needed: an original or VA certified copy of their DD 214, or other armed forces separation papers, a copy of their Delayed Enlistment Contract, copies of their children's birth certificates, a copy of a divorce decree if either vet or spouse was previously married, their VA file number if benefits have been used previously, and a transcript from any college or university previously attended.

The VA places restrictions on those receiving veterans educational benefits. Some of these restrictions include: regular class attendance, satisfactory academic progress, and adherence to a specific degree program. The VA will not pay for repeated courses if the grade already earned is acceptable for graduation requirements and major objectives at this University (This includes transfer credit), or for elective courses in excess of those included to meet graduation requirements.

#### Certification Reminders:

- (1) Register with the Office of Veterans Services every semester by completing a Veteran Data Sheet and Certification Request.
- (2) Report credit allowed for prior training in cooperation with your adviser by completing a "Request for Reevaluation of Prior Credit" form. These forms are available from the Office of Veterans Services.
- (3) Inform the Office of Veterans Services of any changes in major or degree pursued, address, marital status, or number of dependents claimed.
- (4) After registering report to the Office of Veterans Services immediately all changes in class schedules including adds, drops, section changes, cancelled courses, and withdrawals.
- (5) Obtain a degree posting sheet/formal degree plan from your adviser, and furnish a copy to the Office of Veterans Services, as well as keeping a copy for your personal files.

For more information on eligibility requirements, monthly pay rates, and other services available, contact the Office of Veterans Services.

## ADMISSIONS PROCEDURES

New students planning to enroll for any credit course or on an audit basis must be formally admitted to the University. Admission to the University must be fully cleared before any registration is authorized. Any student who meets admission or readmission requirements after August 1, cannot be assured of registration before the first day of classes. Any non-Tennessean who resides more than 150 miles from the University must file an application for admission or readmission prior to that date. Anyone failing to do so cannot be assured of being considered for admission.

#### New Applicants

Applications for admission, detailed instructions concerning admission procedures, and regulations for all student levels may be obtained in the Admissions Office, Room 215, Administration Building. After 4:30 p.m. and on Saturday mornings, these may be obtained in Evening Academic Services Office, Room 167, Administration Building, 454-2398.

#### Former Students

A former student is defined as a student who (1) has previously been enrolled at Memphis State but (2) was not enrolled during the previous semester. Undergraduate or graduate former students desiring to be readmitted may obtain an application for readmission from Room 167, Administration Building. Former undergraduate students entering Graduate School are not "former students" for readmission purposes. They are new graduate students who must be properly admitted to graduate school as new students.

Graduate students who have not attended Memphis State in the past 5 years or longer must apply for readmission at least 3 days prior to Graduate Registration in order to complete registration on time.

#### Transferring Credit to MSU

In order for completed additional course work to be transferred from another university and recorded on the student's permanent record, the student must request that an evaluation of the additional course work be completed by the Transfer Affairs section of the Admissions Office. After the student has been admitted as a regular undergraduate, whether he is a beginning freshman or a transfer student, it is recommended that he consult with his adviser or the Transfer Affairs section of the Admissions Office if he anticipates enrolling at another college or university for the purpose of transferring credit to Memphis State University.

#### Residency Classification

All determinations concerning classification of in-state and out-of-state students for fee-paying and other purposes are made in the Admissions Office. The determinations are based on the regulations and guidelines of the State Board of Regents. Copies of the guidelines and regulations used in the classification of students for fee-paying purposes are available in the Admissions Office, Room 205, Administration Building, 454-2344.

#### Persons 60 Years of Age and Totally Disabled Persons

Persons suffering from a permanent disability which totally incapacitates such person from working at an occupation which brings him an income, and persons who will become sixty (60) years of age or older during the academic semester in which such persons begin classes, and who are domiciled in Tennessee, may AUDIT courses at Memphis State without paying tuition charges, maintenance fees, student activity fees, or registration fees. Admission to AUDIT will be limited on an individual classroom basis according to space availability.

Any person who is totally disabled, and persons who will become sixty-five (65) years of age or older during the academic semester in which such persons begin classes, and who are domiciled in Tennessee, may enroll for courses for credit at the cost of \$19.50 per undergraduate semester hour, or \$27 per graduate semester hour, not to exceed \$75 per semester. The University Health Services shall examine certification of permanent disability (not the applicant) and determine the eligibility of the applicant under this legislation.

## REGISTRATION PROCEDURES

### (1) CONSULTING WITH ACADEMIC ADVISER

#### Current Students

Current Memphis State University students are encouraged to see their academic advisers well in advance of registration, preferably during the preceding term when ample time can be given for general academic advising including assistance in selection of courses for the ensuing term. This is not always possible for new and returning students and for some current students. However, all students are required to have a class schedule with an adviser's signature prior to entering the registration center.

To find where an adviser will be located for assistance in class scheduling, go to the Packet Center located in Mitchell Hall, when it is open, and in the Late Registration Center, during the late registration period. Please consult the registration calendar for dates and times these Centers will be open.

*During late registration academic advising occurs in the academic department, where faculty advisers are generally available except when they are teaching. Assistance in locating an adviser can be obtained in the Department Offices or in the Late Registration Center.*

#### Handicapped Students

Preferential Scheduling is offered to students whose academic planning must take into account mobility, medical or educational factors directly related to a disability. Generally, this includes students with handicaps of mobility, vision, hearing and those with specific learning disabilities such as dyslexia. In addition to simplifying the registration process, preferential scheduling allows students to get a particular class schedule so that disability-related needs can be planned in advance. Personal attendants and academic aids who are employed by handicapped students are also eligible for preferential scheduling so that their work and class schedule can be coordinated to accommodate the disabled students for whom they work. Students requesting this service must be approved by the Handicapped Student Service Office.



Preferential scheduling is begun prior to regular registration. Students using this procedure should see their adviser, fully complete the "Student Schedule" form and take it to the Handicapped Student Service Office well in advance of the beginning of registration. (Please check with the Handicapped Student Service Office regarding deadlines for turning in class schedules.) The desired class cards will be pulled before registration and will be held in the Handicapped Student Service Office where students are to pick them up just prior to going through registration. No cards will be released earlier than one half hour before the student's registration appointment time assigned in the registration packet. Handicapped students may go through registration at any convenient time after the assigned appointment time, however, they should not pick up their cards until a half hour before they plan to register.

Some disabled students find Late Registration easier to manage because of smaller crowds and the close proximity of all registration functions. Students who can manage regular registration are encouraged to do so, however, those who need to go through Late Registration because of physical considerations may request a waiver of the late fee on the basis of handicap if their cards were pulled in advance. Any student who requires assistance with the process of registration should direct their request to the Handicapped Student Service Office two days in advance of their registration appointment.

If a student for whom cards are pulled in advance should for some reason decide not to complete registration, notification must be given to the Handicapped Student Service Office so the reserved cards may be returned to the departments for use by others.

For further information, please contact the Director of Handicapped Student Services, Room 215, Scates Hall or call 454-2880 (Voice and TDD).

#### New and Readmitted Students (Undergraduate)

All new freshmen students and transfer students without an academic major will be assigned to the Academic Counseling Unit, located in Scates Hall, and should go to the unit immediately after admission to the University to request the assignment of an adviser. Students who have not seen an adviser will be assigned one.

Students who have been readmitted and have selected a major should contact the department of their major for the assignment of an adviser. Readmitted students without a declared major should go to the Academic Counseling Unit. This should be done in advance of the first day of registration.

#### Evening (Undergraduate)

New and readmitted undergraduate students enrolling in evening and/or Saturday courses only may obtain the required registration and advising information in the Evening Academic Services Office, Room 167, Administration Building.

#### Unclassified, Special Undergraduate, and Audit Students

Undergraduate students who are unclassified, special undergraduate, or audit go to the Academic Counseling Unit, Scates Hall. Evening students in these categories go to the Evening Academic Services Office, Room 167, Administration Building for advising assistance.

#### New and Readmitted Students (Graduate) — Day & Evening

New graduate students are directed to an adviser following their admission. Students classified as Graduate Special or Graduate Provisional should go to the Graduate School Office, Room 315, Administration Building for an adviser.

Readmitted graduate students having a major should contact the department of their major for the assignment of an adviser. Readmitted graduate students not having a major should contact the Graduate School Office for an adviser.

### (2) OBTAINING REGISTRATION MATERIALS

The registration packet consists of four basic materials: (1) "Student Information Form," (2) "Registration Appointment Card," (3) "Registration Receipt," and (4) a permanent ID card.

#### Current Students

Registration materials are mailed to the permanent address of all regular students currently enrolled, with the exception of those students suspended for academic reasons, those who are on academic probation, and those who have holds placed on their packets by a University office. When a hold is released, the student is given a release card which tells where and when to secure his packet.

#### New and Readmitted Students

New and readmitted students who have cleared all admission requirements at the time registration materials are prepared, receive their materials by mail. Students not clearing in time to receive their materials by mail are given a chance to obtain materials before the actual day of registration and receive instructions on how to accomplish this.

### (3) SECURING CLASS CARDS

Students having their "Student Schedule," permanent ID card, and registration materials, are prepared to enter the Registration Center to obtain class cards and to pay fees.

**Registration appointment times** — Enter the Registration Center on the date and time printed in the upper right hand corner of the "Registration Appointment Card." Registration priority is based on cumulative hours earned. The student may enter at any later day time after his day appointment time or at any later night time after his night appointment time.

#### REGISTRATION PRIORITY

Since all students cannot register at the same time, it is necessary to establish priorities in the assignment of registration times. Registration priority and the registration appointment times appearing on registration materials are based on the number of cumulative hours earned.

Registration materials must be prepared before the end of the term that immediately precedes registration. **Appointment times do not reflect hours earned during the current term.** For example, registration times for the spring semester are not affected by hours earned during the fall semester.

Registration priority and associated registration appointment times cannot be based on the need to work because such a large number of students do work. No practical or equitable way exists to administer a priority system on the criterion of a student having to work.

Unclassified students will be awarded registration appointment times on the basis of hours earned at Memphis State University only.

Seniors not holding an undergraduate degree who are taking degree credit courses have priority over special undergraduate students (those who hold degrees) when enrolling for undergraduate credit courses.

#### Special Courses

**Credit/No-Credit Courses** — Certain students, with permission from the dean of their college, may elect to take some courses on a credit-no-credit basis. Details are found in the undergraduate *Bulletin*.

Procedures for registering are as follows: (1) Obtain permit form from academic adviser, complete information on the form, and secure adviser's signature; (2) Get permission of the dean of their college; (3) Go to the office of the chairman of the department in which the course is taught and secure his approval; (4) Obtain "Class Card Request" form; (5) Take completed permit form and "Class Card Request" to the Registration Center at the appointed registration time.

**Audit Courses** — The student must: (1) Obtain academic adviser's approval; (2) Go to the department in which course is taught and pick up "Class Card Request" form; (3) Take the "Class Card Request" to the Registration Center at the appointed registration time. Fees for audit courses are the same as for credit courses. Further details on audit courses are found in the undergraduate *Bulletin*.

### ID CARD

**ALL STUDENTS MUST OBTAIN A PERMANENT MEMPHIS STATE UNIVERSITY ID CARD BEFORE THEY WILL BE ALLOWED TO REGISTER. THIS INCLUDES PART-TIME STUDENTS, EVENING STUDENTS, UNCLASSIFIED STUDENTS, ETC.**

The University issues to each student an identification card which bears his photograph, social security number, and certification that he is enrolled as a student in the University. The card is required for registration, the borrowing of library books, and other purposes. The card remains the property of the University and will be surrendered upon the request of a University official.

A current student who has lost his or her card may obtain a replacement from the Dean of Students Office, Room 204, Scates Hall. A student will be charged \$10.00 to replace a card that has been damaged, stolen, or lost. A charge of \$2.00 will be made to make any change in data on a card. Students unable to obtain an ID card at an off-campus or special registration must go to the Records Office to have one made.

Part-time students who are enrolled for at least six semester hours of credit courses will be given full-time ID card validation. ID card validation of full-time is for student activity purposes and does not necessarily constitute a full-time academic load.

For information concerning the number of hours required for a full-time academic load, consult the Memphis State University Bulletin.

A credit hour load equal to one-half of that for the minimum full-time credit hour load qualifies as half-time academic load.

### Late Registration

Students registering during the day at the Late Registration Center must go to departments to obtain class cards. Cards are at the Center during evening late registration hours.

### (4) PAYING FEES

Students should not enter the Registration Center unless they are prepared to pay fees. Registration is not completed until fees are paid. Students receiving VA assistance are expected to pay fees in full. Students holding scholarships, student aid, or billing authorizations for this term should stop at the "Scholarship" or "Authorized Billing" stations in the Fee Payment Center. Students will not have their names placed on the class rolls until after all fees are paid.

*Students may not register until all outstanding financial obligations have been cleared.*

### Returned Checks

It is expected that a check given the University, for any reason, will clear the bank on which it is drawn. A \$10.00 service charge will be assessed for each returned check whether given in payment of any fee or cashed by the University for the convenience of the student. Returned checks, used as payment of registration fees, will result in deletion of the student from class rolls. Check cashing privileges will be revoked for any student who has had checks returned by his bank more than once within a twelve-month period.

## FEES AND DEPOSITS

The listing of these fees in this publication does not constitute a contract between the University and the student. As a condition of registration, each student will pay the fees in effect at the time he or she registers. Fees are subject to change without notice. Persons 60 years of age and totally disabled persons should refer to the sections of this publication covering their registrations.

### Application Fee

Each student submitting an application for admission to the University must pay, at the time he submits his first application, a one-time non-refundable fee of \$5.00.

### Maintenance Fee

All students, whether resident or non-resident, pay a maintenance fee. Maintenance fees are based upon course level. Students paying the fee for six or more hours are entitled to admission to home athletic events and certain health services, concerts, plays, social and other student-sponsored activities, and a subscription to the student newspaper, *The Helmsman*.

\*Out-of-state student fees include a maintenance fee which is charged each student plus an additional \$85.00 per hour or \$984.00 maximum.

Fees for auditing courses are assessed on the same basis as fees for credit courses. Courses offered between terms, for concentrated periods during a term, or at specific locations, may be subject to fees on a per-hour basis only.

### Activity Fee

All students enrolled for one to five credit hours will pay a student activity fee of \$1.00 per hour. All students enrolled for six or more credit hours will pay a student activity fee of \$15.00.

There is no activity fee during the summer terms.

### Tuition

Students classified as out-of-state are charged an additional \$85.00 per semester hour.

The Office of Admissions and Records is charged with the responsibility of assigning a residency classification to each student using regulations provided by the Board of Regents. The student may appeal the decision to the Committee on Residency. Residency regulations of the Board of Regents and information on appeals procedures are available in the Office of Admissions and Records.

RESIDENCY CLASSIFICATION MAY BE CHANGED ONLY BY THE RESIDENCY ADVISER, OFFICE OF ADMISSIONS AND RECORDS.

### University College Fees

In addition to their \$5.00 application fee, students who apply to the University College must pay a screening fee of \$15.00, which is non-refundable. If accepted into the University College, the student must pay a non-refundable contract-advising fee of \$25.00.

Students who apply for credit for experiential learning will pay a non-refundable portfolio assessment fee of \$45.00. After the portfolio has been evaluated and credit assigned, the student will pay \$15.00 per credit hour for each hour in excess of three for which credit is awarded. For students enrolled under a group contract, a maximum fee of \$90.00 will be assessed for credits assigned under the terms of the contract.

### Courses in Applied Music

The fee of applied music is \$30.00 per semester for each one-half hour lesson.

### Music Locker Deposit

Music students are required to have a locker for storage of University-owned musical instruments or equipment. Personal instruments may also



be stored in lockers. A deposit of \$3.00 for one semester or \$4.00 for two semesters is required on each locker issued. This deposit, less a service charge of \$1.50 per semester, will be refunded upon return of the locker. Students will be expected to pay for any damages.

#### Automobile Registration

Each person who expects to operate and park any motor vehicle on the campus must pay \$5.00 for an official permit, valid from September through August, and register the vehicle in the Security Office, Room 151, Administration Building. A reduced fee of \$4.00 is charged for vehicle registrations after January 1, and \$2.00 after May 1. Proof of ownership must be presented when registering the vehicle. You must show registration receipt form to receive parking decal. Residence hall occupants should ask for a special resident decal when registering their automobiles.

#### ROTC Deposit

A uniform deposit of \$10.00 is required of each student who enrolls in the Army and Air Force ROTC program. The uniform deposit, less charges for uniform loss or damage, will be refunded at the end of the academic year or at the beginning of a semester in which the student is not enrolled in the ROTC program.

#### Laboratory Deposits

Certain courses in chemistry require breakage deposits from \$10.00 to \$20.00 per semester, depending upon the course. Any unused portion of these deposits will be refunded.

#### Physical Education Locker and Towel Fee

Students enrolled in physical education courses must pay a fee of \$4.00 for the locker and towel issued them. Students must provide their own lock.

#### Late Registration

Students who do not complete registration (including the payment of fees) during the official registration period will be charged \$10.00 for any late registration following the official registration period.

#### Adding and Dropping Courses

A fee of \$5.00 will be charged for each change-of-course form processed, regardless of the number of course or section changes included on the form.

#### Transcripts

There is no fee for transcripts. However, the student will be charged \$1.00 for each official transcript over the maximum of five (5) per request. Transcripts are issued only at the request of the student in person or by letter. No transcript will be provided for a student who has any unfulfilled obligation to the University.

#### Graduation Fee

Each candidate for a degree from Memphis State University pays a \$25.00 fee to cover cost of the diploma, rental of cap and gown, and incidentals connected with the commencement exercises. This fee must be paid thirty days before graduation.

## STUDENT FEE REFUND PROCEDURES

#### Maintenance Fees, Out-of-State Tuition, Music Fees

The following refund percentages apply to students who withdraw from the University or who drop to an hourly load below full-time.

- 100% Refund: A full (100%) refund of fees will be made for courses cancelled by the University.
- 75% Refund: The University provides a 75% refund of enrollment fees beginning at the moment of registration and extending for a period of time as noted in the term calendar for the semester.
- 25% Refund: A 25% refund of enrollment fees is provided after the expiration of the 75% refund and concludes as noted in the calendar for each semester.
- 100% refund in case of death.

If a student withdraws during the 75% period, all of the student activity fee is refundable. There is no refund of the student activity fee after this period.

The University refund policy is based entirely upon the official date of the withdrawal or change of course which would result in a refund. Refunds beyond the specified date or percentage cannot be made for reasons such as employment conflicts, health or medical problems, moving out of town, or other reasons which are beyond the University's control or responsibility.

Note on the semester calendar in the *Schedule of Classes* that the refund period ends earlier than the final deadline for dropping a course or withdrawal.

Refunds will be processed beginning approximately two weeks after classes begin and usually should be completed six weeks after classes begin.

#### Appeal Procedures for Fees and Refunds

A student may appeal the assessment, application, calculation or interpretation of any University fee, charge, deposit, or refund, or any University action connected with fees and charges. Questions should generally be discussed with personnel in the Bursar's Office. If a student is not satisfied with the resolution made by the Bursar's Office, a written appeal, on forms available in the Bursar's Office, can be made to the Director of Finance; his determination may be appealed to the Vice President of Business and Finance; and his determination may be appealed to the President of the University. Traffic fines are subject to a separate appeal procedure.

#### Credit by Examination or Placement Examination

The fee for taking credit by examination is a non-refundable fee of \$45.00, which must be paid prior to the examination. An additional \$15.00 will be charged for each hour in excess of three for which credit is awarded. A fee of \$15.00 per credit hour will be charged when an application for credit is made under the credit by Placement Examination policy.

### (5) CHANGING ENROLLMENT STATUS

CHANGE-OF-COURSE APPLICATIONS "ADD-DROPS" WILL BE PROCESSED ONLY AFTER THE REGULAR DATES OF REGISTRATION, COMMENCING ON THE FIRST DAY OF LATE REGISTRATION.

#### Change of Course

After a student's registration is complete, he may change his class schedule by adding and/or dropping courses. APPLICATION FOR PERMISSION TO ADD OR DROP COURSES BEGINS WITH THE ACADEMIC ADVISER. Time limits for add/drop are outlined in the semester calendar. A fee will be charged for each change-of-course transaction before it is processed. *There is no charge for a change made as a result of the University cancelling a course.*

Permission to add or drop a course after the deadlines shown in the calendar must be approved by the appropriate college dean.

*Students enrolled in one course who wish to drop must withdraw from the University.*

**Schedule conflicts** — Each student is responsible for preventing conflicts in the scheduling of his classes. *Students should check each class card which they are issued to insure that the course and section numbers, time and credit agree with what they requested.* Students will be assessed a "change-of-course" fee if it is necessary to make changes because of a scheduling conflict or because of having the wrong class card. Students should be careful to check the schedule for course offerings that might have been changed. Up-to-date information may be obtained during registration.

The University does not guarantee that the instructor listed in the Schedule of Classes will be the one to teach the course, and no fees will be waived accordingly.

University policy prohibits the waiving of the change fee when a course section has been closed and later reopened. *The University reserves the right to cancel courses or sections or to combine sections.*

#### Withdrawal Procedures

Students may withdraw from the University by contacting the appropriate University official. ID's must be turned in to be invalidated.

- (1) Undergraduate Students—the Center for Student Development, Room 120, Scates Hall

- (2) Evening/Saturday Students—the Dean, Evening Academic Services, Room 167, Administration Building
- (3) Graduate Students—the Dean of Graduate Studies, Room 315, Administration Building

Time limits for withdrawals are stated in the Semester Calendar.

#### Change of College or Major

Undergraduate students in the Colleges of Arts and Sciences, Business Administration, Communication and Fine Arts, Education, Engineering, and the University College may change their college or major by completing an application at the designated office of the college for the new major. These offices are as follows:

Graduate students may change their major by making application in the Office of the Dean of Graduate Studies, Room 315, Administration Building.

Students may change adviser by making application to the college in which they are currently enrolled.

#### Change of Name, Address, or Social Security Number

It is imperative that the student keep his/her name and address current on University records. Opportunity for changing addresses is provided on the "Student Information Form" in the registration packet. In order to change social security number or name, the student must come to the Records Office, Room 119, Administration Building. Students who move should leave a forwarding address with the post office so that all University mail will reach them at their new address.

*IMPORTANT: All changes should be made early in the term to insure their processing before the next semester.*

## GRADE REPORTS

A grade report showing the grade received, credit hours earned, and quality points earned, is mailed to the permanent address of each student at the end of the semester. The grade report will show cumulative hours attempted, hours earned, and grade point average.

#### Withholding of Grade Reports

The University is required by State law to withhold grade reports, transcripts, and diplomas from students who have outstanding financial obligations to the University. Previous semester grades which were withheld may be obtained (with the proper release card and identification) in the Records Office, Room 119, Administration Building.

**THE RECORDS OFFICE WILL NOT RELEASE ANY GRADE EXCEPT BY THE OFFICIAL COPY SENT BY MAIL. TO PROTECT THE CONFIDENTIAL NATURE OF THE STUDENT'S RECORD, NO GRADES WILL BE RELEASED BY TELEPHONE.**

## ACADEMIC STATUS AND RETENTION

Official notification of academic status is by means of the grade report processed to each student at the end of the regular semester. A complete statement of the policy regarding academic status and retention may be found in the *University Bulletin*.

Specific questions concerning academic retention/suspension should be directed to the Evening Academic Services Office, Room 167, Administration Building, between the hours of 12:00 Noon-8:00 p.m. Monday through Thursday, and 8:30 a.m.-12:00 Noon on Saturdays.

Note: A student suspended for the first time at the completion of the spring semester will be required to remain out of the University the subsequent fall semester as well as the summer session.

## PRIVACY RIGHTS OF PARENTS & STUDENTS

### NOTICE TO STUDENTS

The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act of 1974, with which the University intends to comply fully, is designed to protect the privacy of education records, to establish the right of students to inspect and review their education records, and to provide guidelines for the correction of inaccurate or misleading data through informal and formal hearings. Students also have the right to file complaints with The Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act Office (FERPA) concerning alleged failures by the institution to comply with the Act.

Provisions for the release of information about students and the rights of students and others to have access to Memphis State University education records are as follows:

- A. Release of Personally Identifiable Student Education Records. Memphis State University shall not permit access to or release of any information in the Education Records which is specifically identifiable as referring to any student, other than Directory Information, without the written consent of the student to any party other than the following:
  1. MSU officials and staff who have legitimate educational interests, including academic excellence, honor societies, and fraternities and sororities. Written requests from such officials or organizations shall be sent to the Records Office, and proper identification will be required.
  2. Officials of other schools in which the student seeks admission, if the student has executed a release form to that institution. (At a later date a request for academic information from another institution of learning indicating the reason will be honored as a matter of inter-institutional courtesy.)
  3. Appropriate persons in connection with a student's application for or receipt of financial aid.
  4. Federal or State officials as defined in the regulations concerning this law.
  5. State and local officials authorized by State statute adopted prior to November 19, 1974.
  6. Organizations conducting studies for, or on behalf of, Memphis State University for the purpose of assisting in accomplishing the University's stated goals, and when such information will be used only by such organizations and subsequently destroyed when no longer needed for the intended purpose. The Dean of Admissions and Records or his designate must approve requests of this nature.
  7. Accrediting organizations to carry out their functions.
  8. Parents of a dependent student as defined in section 152 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954. (Note: Husband or wife cannot get records of his/her spouse regardless of dependency.)
  9. In compliance with judicial order or subpoena after the University has made a reasonable effort to notify the student.
  10. Appropriate persons in connection with an emergency if such knowledge is necessary to protect the health or safety of a student or other persons. Verification of the conditions involved will be fully documented.

Note: All individuals and agencies who have requested or obtained access to a student's record (except as stated in A 1-7) will be noted in a record which is kept with each student's closed file. A request must be in writing stating the purpose of the request. This record will also indicate specifically the legitimate interest that the person or agency had in obtaining the information, and the information made available will be limited to that necessary to satisfy such demonstrable needs.



## B. Definitions:

- **Educational Records.** "Educational Records" is defined as those records, files, documents, and other material which (1) contain information directly related to a student; and (2) are maintained by Memphis State University or by a person acting for the University. They do not include: (1) personal notes; (2) records available only to law enforcement personnel; (3) employment records; (4) medical, psychological, and psychiatric records (these are accessible to the student's physician); (5) and records containing only information relating to a person after that person is no longer a student at the University. An example would be a record of accomplishments of an alumnus of the University.
- **Student.** A student is any person who is or has been enrolled at Memphis State University. Wherever "student" is used in reference to personal rights, an eligible parent of a dependent student has similar rights. This "eligible" parent is one who has satisfied Section 152 of the Internal Revenue Code of 1954, and who presents proof of such to the custodian. Normally, this will be notarized affirmation by the parent declaring that the student is a dependent for Federal Income Tax purposes.
- **Directory Information.** "Directory Information" is defined as: The student's name, address, telephone listing, date and place of birth, major field of study, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, the most recent previous education agency or institution attended by the student, the student's full- or part-time status, and the student level. At the time a student registers for courses, the student may personally deliver to the Records Office a written request that directory information for that student may not be released. This notification is effective only for the one semester for which the student is then registering. Such information will then be withheld if the request is received within 14 days after the beginning of classes.
- **Access.** To have access to an "Educational Record" is to be allowed to see the original record. It implies the right to obtain copies of that record.
- **School Officials.** School officials are those University employees with general or specific responsibility for promoting the educational objectives of the University.  
Employees whose responsibilities place them within this category include: teachers; faculty advisers; admissions counselors; academic advisers; therapeutic counselors and vocational counselors; degree analysts; employment placement personnel; deans, department chairmen, directors, and other administrative officials responsible for some part of the academic enterprise or one of the supporting activities; administrative and faculty sponsors of officially recognized clubs, organizations, etc.; members, including student members, of committees appointed by the President; and clerical personnel employed to assist University officials in discharging professional responsibilities. Access by these officials is restricted where practical only to students for whom they have professional responsibility and only to that portion of the student record necessary for the discharge of assigned duties.
- **Legitimate Educational Interests.** Legitimate educational interests are defined as those interests which are essential to the general process of higher education prescribed by various legislative acts and the body of policy adopted by the governing board. Legitimate educational interests would include teaching, research, public service, and such directly supportive activities as academic advising, general counseling, therapeutic counseling, discipline, vocational counseling and job placement, financial assistance and advisement, medical services, and academic assistance activities. In addition, the University officially recognizes appropriate co-curricular activities which are generally supportive of overall goals of

the institution and contribute generally to the well-being of the entire student body and specifically to many individuals who participate in these activities. These activities include varsity and intramural sports, social fraternities and sororities, honorary and academic fraternities and sororities, departmental clubs, professional fraternities, special interest clubs, and student government.

## C. Procedure for Gaining Access to Educational Records.

- To gain access, the student must request the custodian to allow him to peruse the "Educational Record," which request will be granted within a reasonable period of time. The student may ask for an explanation and/or copy of his "Educational Record." Examination will be permitted under conditions which will prevent alteration or mutilation of the record. A student must present proper identification upon request. Documents submitted by or for the student in support of his application for admission or for transfer credit will not be returned to the student nor sent elsewhere.
- If the student believes the "Record" content to be inaccurate, he may submit a request for amendment of his record. Normally such matters will be satisfactorily settled in the course of informal discussion with the student. When this is not the case, the request and the challenge must be presented in writing to the record custodian who will inform the student of his decision within 45 days and of his right to a hearing. The student may then submit a written request for a hearing to the Dean of Admissions and Records who will (1) appoint an Appeals Committee consisting of four "Record" custodians (none of whom is custodian of the "Record" in question), with one of the four designated as chairman, and (2) designate a time and place for the first meeting and inform the student of the same.
- The Appeals Committee will convene with the student within 45 days from the date of the request, allowing the student, or his parents if the student is a dependent, to present relevant evidence. The student may be assisted or represented by counsel of his choice and at his own expense. A written decision based solely upon evidence presented at the hearing will be given the student within 45 days after the conclusion of the hearing, including a summary of the evidence and reasons for the decision and notification of his right to place a statement in the "Educational Record." Thereupon, the student may submit to the Committee a written explanation to be inserted into the "Record."  
Note: This procedure does not provide for a hearing to contest an academic grade.

## D. Right of Access Does Not Include:

1. Financial records of parents or any information therein.
  2. Confidential letters and statements of recommendation which were placed in the "Educational Records" prior to January 1, 1975.
  3. "Records" to which access has been waived by a student.
- E. No University office receiving student information shall, and all agencies receiving student information will be advised not to, release the information to another party without the written consent of the student.
  - F. The University retains all rights to the student's academic record and may withhold transcripts of the record because of unfulfilled obligations to the University.
  - G. Eligible students and parents have the right to file a complaint with the Department of Education concerning an alleged failure by the University to comply with the "Privacy Rights of Parents and Students" Act. Students may also file a complaint against the University in the office of the Dean of Admissions and Records. A copy of the Act may be read in the offices of the Associate Dean of Admissions and Records (Records), the Dean of Admissions and Records, or the University Council.

**TELEVISION-ASSISTED DIRECTED STUDY COURSES**

Memphis State University, in conjunction with WKNO-TV, offers television-assisted courses for adults working toward bachelor's degrees and learning for personal enrichment. These courses, designed by specialists in a variety of fields, are rigorous and challenging. They have been developed to serve the special needs of adults who, because of work and family obligations, distance, or handicap choose not to attend on-campus classes. Persons in Memphis and the surrounding areas of Arkansas, Mississippi, and west Tennessee within the broadcast area of WKNO-TV may enroll.

Independent study is a major component of each course. Students are guided in their studies by a detailed week-by-week syllabus written by their MSU instructor, a study guide, textbooks, and written assignments. Television programs supplement the reading and are broadcast on WKNO-TV and repeated on cable television. Video tapes of the television programs are available for viewing in the learning media center of the MSU library. Written assignments are evaluated by the course instructor with whom the student may confer by phone or in person. Students may also attend optional discussion sessions led by the instructor. These courses are applicable to degree programs at MSU as courses in the major, courses required by a college, or as electives. Students should check requirements for their degree programs before choosing courses.

Registration for these courses may be completed by mail or in person prior to on-campus registration and during on-campus registration. Persons who have never attended MSU or need to seek readmission should apply in advance of registration. Books may be ordered by mail. The fee for both in-state and out-of-state students is \$39.00 per credit hour. Contact the University College at 454-2716 for further information.

**COURSES FOR FALL 1984**

**CHEM 1111. PRINCIPLES OF CHEMISTRY, sec. 521, 4 semester hours. Dr. Graden Kirksey**

For students who are majoring in one of the physical sciences, biology, mathematics or engineering, or who are following a pre-professional program requiring additional chemistry. The required laboratory for this class will meet on Tuesday nights from 7:00 to 9:45.

**PSYC 3306. BRAIN, MIND, AND BEHAVIOR/PSYCHOLOGICAL PSYCHOLOGY, sec. 521, 3 semester hours. Dr. Michael Williams**

This course is designed to give students a comprehensive understanding of the human brain, its functions, its common pathologies and its many mysteries. The course will focus upon the brain and its influence on our thoughts and behavior and will address such topics as vision, movement, sleep, stress and anxiety, addiction, language, aging and memory, sex differences in the brain, mental disease, and the action of drugs on the brain's chemistry.

**UNIV 3700. HERITAGE: CIVILIZATION AND THE JEWS, sec. 521, 3 semester hours. Dr. Abraham Kriegel**

A survey of Jewish history, thought and culture, set against the backdrop of the civilizations in which Jews have lived, and focusing upon the interaction of Jewish culture and the civilizations of the western world.

**POLS 4217. CONGRESS: WE THE PEOPLE/THE LEGISLATIVE PROCESS, sec. 521, 3 semester hours. Dr. Richard Mahood**

This course presents an inside view of the U.S. Congress and the complex range of individuals, organizations and processes it embodies. Among the themes addressed are congressional elections, committees, parties, leadership, lobbying, constituency relations, law making, budgeting and separation of powers.

**UNIV 3700. SYSTEMS PERFORMANCE, sec. 521, 6 semester hours. Dr. David Stevenson**

This course introduces the use of systems concepts, techniques, and methods to analyze the performance of complex systems. After the student learns the philosophy and theory of basic systems, the course examines various methods and techniques used in the analysis of systems that have failed. The course concludes with a series of case studies focusing on systems failures. These include nuclear power generation, regional government, health delivery, and a possible California earthquake.

**UNIV 1010. THE WRITE COURSE/COMMUNICATION I, sec. 521, 6 semester hours. Ms. Linda Hearn**

An introduction to college composition which emphasizes the writing process. The course covers basic writing skills, such as pre-writing and shaping a thesis, planning a composition, and composing effective sentences, paragraphs, and essays.

**UNIV 1020. EXPLORING LANGUAGE/COMMUNICATION II, sec. 521, 6 semester hours. Mr. Ed Weathers**

An innovative approach to the study of language and writing. The course has a dual purpose: to teach the fundamentals of clear, concise writing by providing week-by-week instruction in organizing and writing essays, and to explore the social, psychological, and political implications of language.

**UNIV 1210. INTRODUCTION TO HUMANITIES, sec. 521, 6 semester hours. Dr. Robert Frankle**

This course is a general introduction to the major fields of the humanities: history, literature, music, philosophy, and art history. Case studies are used to illustrate some important concepts of each discipline and explore the methods used by scholars in each area. Included are Shakespeare's "A Midsummer Night's Dream", Bach's "Second Brandenburg Concerto", and Renaissance Art.



**OPEN LEARNING  
FIRE SERVICE PROGRAM**

University College at Memphis State University is the regional center for the Open Learning Fire Service Program, serving fire service personnel in the states of Tennessee, Kentucky, Arkansas, Mississippi, Alabama and Texas. OLFSP is a degree-completion program, offering upper division courses in Fire Administration and Fire Prevention Technology. These courses are designed for independent study.

**COURSES FOR FALL 1984**

**TECH 4944. Applications of Fire Research (3)**

The understanding of fire research and its application. The transfer and implications of available research results for fire prevention and protec-

tion programs. National and international studies. Maintaining awareness of research developments.

**POLS 3615. The Community and The Fire Threat (3)**

The sociological, economic and political characteristics of communities and their influence on the fire problem. How to study community profiles and structures with consideration of the economic, geographic, and sociological variables of the fire threat. Examination of functional basis of the community, diverse social roles of community agencies, and study of fire services as a complex organization in community.

**TECH 4944. Fire Dynamics (3)**

Study of fire propagation phenomenon in both fuel and air regulated phases. Variables in pre and post-flash-over fire development. Study of geometric, material, gaseous, fluid flow, and thermodynamic parameters. Compartment and building fire models.

# ADDENDA TO THE CATALOGS

## GRADUATE AND UNDERGRADUATE ISSUES 1984-1985 MEMPHIS, TENNESSEE JULY, 1984

The following courses were approved for inclusion in the offerings of the University after 1984-85 Catalog issue of the University *Bulletin* had been sent to the printer. Their publication here constitutes the official announcement of their addition to the University curriculum.

### UNIVERSITY COLLEGE

#### UNIV 3511. THEMATIC STUDIES. (6 credit hours) URBAN STUDIES.

A course on urban problems and their causes, an overview of the perspective and contributions of each of six participating disciplines which include: urban anthropology, urban geography, urban history, urban economics, urban politics, and urban sociology. In addition, community leaders in the fields of city planning, housing, regional economic development, manpower and banking will present summary reviews of problems and proposed solutions in their respective fields.

#### UNIV 3514. THEMATIC STUDIES. (6 credit hours) COMPUTER LITERACY WITH APPLICATIONS.

This course is designed for the liberal arts major with a minimum prerequisite of a single college level course in mathematics. The course has two goals:

1. Enable the student to become comfortable with the hands-on use of modern, office type computing equipment. The student will become accustomed to utilizing the equipment both as a stand-alone computer and as a terminal, communicating with some of the major data banks and the University computer center.
2. Expand the student's mind and level of awareness in the best sense of the liberal arts tradition. This course is a broad survey of the full spectrum of computing in our modern society and is definitely not a science or mathematics course. The viewpoint of the course values the cultural, artistic, societal, organizational, and psychological aspects equally with the engineering, mathematical, theoretical, and scientific aspects.

Students will do an independent study project with the equivalent of two semester hours. Out-of-Class learning contracts will be approved.

#### UNIV 3521. THEMATIC STUDIES, CHINESE CIVILIZATION: GREAT BOOKS AND GREAT TRADITIONS.

After a general introduction to the formative stages of Chinese civilization and an overview of China's political history; the course will proceed with the thematic exploration of China's most notable contributions to world civilization. Major themes to be covered include the distinctive elements of Chinese society and family life, China's major philosophical and religious traditions (including Confucianism, Taoism, Legalism, Buddhism, and Neo-Confucianism), China's politi-

cal traditions (including thought and institutions), Chinese science (theoretical and applied), Chinese literature (poetry, drama, short stories and novels), and Chinese art (including bronzes, ceramics, architecture, sculpture and painting).

#### UNIV 3700. FORENSIC EVIDENCE AND THE HUMAN SKELETON.

Forensic Evidence and the Human Skeleton is designed to illustrate the application of Anthropological and Archaeological techniques used in forensic investigations. Classroom instruction will focus on techniques commonly used in forensic anthropology (e.g., skeletal identification, hair analysis, facial reconstruction, handedness, parturition, etc.). The application of an archaeological approach in crime scene investigation will be demonstrated in a class project.

#### UNIV 3700. HERITAGE: CIVILIZATION AND THE JEWS.

This course deals with Jewish history and the development of Judaism: the impact of Judaism on the surrounding cultures; the political, economic and social structures of the societies in which the Jewish experience developed; the continuities and breaks within the Jewish tradition and the differences and tensions between Jews living in Israel and those in other parts of the world.

#### UNIV 3700. SYSTEMS PERFORMANCE.

This course introduces the use of systems concepts, techniques, and methods to analyze the performance of complex systems and examines various methods and techniques used in the analysis of systems that have failed. The course concludes with a series of case studies focusing on systems failures. These include nuclear power generation, regional government, health delivery, and a possible California earthquake.

#### UNHP 3106. ORWELL AND 1984

Sources, influences, prophecies, and themes of 1984; reading and discussion of *Animal Farm* and selections from *The Orwell Reader*.

#### UNHP 4107. THE FAUST THEME

Goethe's *Faust (Parts I & II)*, and the *Urfaust*; 16th century *Volksbuch*, Marlowe's *Dr. Faustus*, and other versions. Critical examination of Spengler's concept of "Faustian Man."

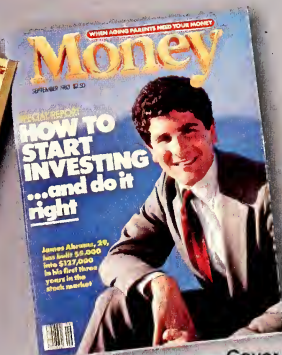
