UNDERGRADUATE ADVISING

STATEMENT OF PHILOSOPHY

The University of Memphis is committed to quality academic advising that fosters student growth and development. The main elements of quality advising consist of promoting the understanding of the aims and purposes of higher education; providing information and resources about the University's programs, opportunities, and requirements; and assisting students in identifying their educational and career goals.

The academic advising process involves many segments of the University community including students, faculty members, professional advisors, counselors, administrative staff, and student peers. Advisors and advisees should seek to integrate the services and expertise of both academic and student affairs professionals.

REGISTRATION CLEARANCE

Most degree seeking students at The University of Memphis must obtain registration clearance from an advisor to register. Students should contact the appropriate advising area to set up an appointment well in advance of their assigned day for registration. Registration clearance information will be included on continuing students' Invitation to Register mailed prior to Priority Registration and with acceptance letters from Admissions for new students. While non-degree seeking students are not required to have registration clearance, those considering future degree seeking status are encouraged to seek advising.

The following students must receive registration clearance from an advisor: (1) first time freshmen and transfer students, (2) students on academic probation, (3) students receiving veterans' benefits, (4) students who have not enrolled in required Transitional Academic Studies courses, and (5) participants in varsity sports.

UNDERGRADUATE STUDENT ADVISING

ACADEMIC COUNSELING UNIT

The Academic Counseling Unit (ACU) advises all undergraduate students who are undecided about their major, pre-Nursing, non-degree, and students who are required to take coursework through Transitional Academic Studies. Exceptions: Art majors contact the Art Department-201 Jones Hall; Music majors contact the Music Department-123 Music Building; Theatre majors contact the Theatre Department-143 Theatre Communication Arts Building. ACU offers advising appointments early in the semester. Students must see their advisor to get registration clearance. Call for an appointment.

STUDENTS WITH DECLARED MAJORS

Individual colleges and departments will inform students of advising guidelines and registration clearance requirements unique to their programs. The general guidelines for each college are as follows: College of Arts and Sciences - Students should contact their advisor in the department of their major for registration clearance.

Fogelman College of Business and Economics - Students must receive registration clearance from the Business and Economics Advising Center, 114 Business Building, (901) 678-2855.

College of Communication and Fine Arts - Students must receive registration clearance from their departmental advisor.

College of Education - All students assigned to Advisory Services must contact their College of Education advisor in person or by phone (901) 678-2728 during regular working hours for registration clearance. Any student seeking teacher licensure who is not fully admitted to the TEP should not register for selected upper division courses leading to teacher licensure. Students who are inappropriately registered for TEP upper division courses will be administratively dropped during the first week of classes.

It is the student's responsibility to obtain initial advising and then to follow the prescribed degree program sheet given at that advising session. Any student who needs or desires additional or updated advice should meet with his/her faculty mentor well in advance of the registration dates. If the mentor is unavailable, the student should contact the departmental office. If program changes occur that could result in alterations in degree requirements, student registration clearance flags will be reset to disallow student registration without seeing an advisor.

Undergraduate students assigned to the following departments who are in good standing will be cleared for registration. Any student who needs or desires additional or updated advice should meet with his/her faculty mentor well in advance of the registration dates.

An Undergraduate Advising Center is available in the Instruction and Curriculum Leadership Department. Group advising sessions are scheduled each semester for students to gain additional advising.

NOTE: On July 18, 1997 changes in teacher licensure requirements were adopted by the State Board on Education. The effective date for the new standards will be no later than September 1, 2001. Teacher licensure programs must change in response to these mandates Almost all licensure programs will be affected by these changes.

Herff College of Engineering - Students must receive registration clearance from their advisor in the Herf College of Engineering.

Loewenberg School of Nursing - Students must receive registration clearance from their advisor in the Loewenberg School of Nursing.

University College – Students who do not have an approved baccalaureate contract, or have not attended a University College orientation session, or new, continuing, or transfer students who have not had an initial advising appointment, must receive registration clearance from the University College Office, G-1 Johnson Hall, (901) 678-2716.

Jackson Center Advising

Jackson Center students should contact The University of Memphis Office on the Jackson State Community College campus at (901) 427-4725 or (901) 678-5087 (local Memphis call) for registration clearance information.

GRADUATE ADVISING

Graduate degree seeking students should contact the department of their major for registration clearance and advising information.

I. Financial Aid for the Summer

A. Current aid applicants

You have previously completed the 1998-99 FAFSA.

- 1. Complete and turn in the Summer Update Form on the next page of this schedule by April 1, 1999.
- 2. Register for at least half-time credit hours 6 for undergraduate or 5 for graduate.
- 3. All summer awards are subject to a review of your academic record at the end of the spring semester.

B. New applicants for the summer

- You must be ACCEPTED or currently enrolled in a degree program. If you are in a conditional, special admission, or non-degree status, you are **not** eligible for financial aid.
- Complete the 1998-99 Free Application for Federal Student Assistance (FAFSA) and mail in the envelope provided. Be sure to list The University of Memphis (Title IV code 003509) in Section H of the FAFSA. The priority date for mailing the FAFSA to the processor is March 1, 1999.
- 3. Complete and turn in the Summer Update Form on the next page of this schedule by April 1, 1999.
- 4. If you have attended any college university, or post-secondary institution(s), you must have the Financial Aid Office at your previous school(s) complete a Financial Aid Transcript and forward it to The University of Memphis Student Financial Aid Office. This transcript is required regardless of whether you received financial aid at your previous school(s).
- 5. When your FAFSA is processed, a Student Aid Report (SAR) will be sent to you. Immediately review the SAR for accuracy. If corrections are required, make them on part 2 and submit the corrected SAR to the U of M Student Financial Aid Office. You may be required to submit additional documents before an award can be made.

C. Awarding and Disbursing

- When all required documents have been received, you will receive a Financial Aid Notification (Award Letter) which you should complete, sign, and return as soon as possible. Your awards will then be finalized.
- 2. If your award includes a Direct Loan, you will be contacted about signing a promissory note. Federal regulations require that the loan be divided into two disbursements. Once you sign the note, the first half of the loan will be disbursed at the beginning of the term and the second half at the middle of the term.

- Federal regulations also require that the first loan disbursement to first-time freshmen be held for 30 days.
- When financial aid is disbursed, university charges are deducted before any remaining balance is given to you. Refer to the Fee Payment section of this schedule.

D. Satisfactory Academic Progress

Students applying for or receiving financial aid must meet the following academic standards:

- 1. Meet the cumulative GPA requirements for undergraduates of a 1.65 once you have earned 24 credits and receive grants or work, or a 2.0 once you have earned 55 credits or receive loans. The graduate GPA requirement is a 3.0 cumulative.
- 2. Do not completely withdraw from two terms.
- 3. Complete your undergraduate degree once you have attempted 198 credit hours.
- 4. Do not receive all "F" grades for a term.

DISCOUNT PROGRAMS

Certain dependents of Licensed Tennessee Public School Teachers, State of Tennessee employees, or Tennessee Board of Regents/University of Tennessee employees may be eligible for a discount of their enrollment fees at The University of Memphis. Students eligible for the discount must submit their certified discount form (obtainable from the employee's Human Resources department) to the Bursar's Office at the time of enrollment fee satisfaction EACH SEMESTER.

Forms received in the Bursar's Office by April 23, 1999, will be reflected on the enrollment fee invoice mailed to students who registered during Priority Registration.

FEE WAIVER PROGRAMS (PC 191 and PC 1047)

Employees of any Tennessee Board of Regents institution, the University of Tennessee system, or the State of Tennessee may be eligible to enroll for one (1) class per semester without payment of fees.

Enrollment under these programs is on a space-available basis only. Therefore, participants MAY NOT register for the fee waiver course prior to May 10, 1999, and cannot enroll in any Thesis, Dissertation, Independent Study or Applied Music courses under these programs. Participants who do not register until the Late Registration period (June 7-8, 1999) WILL BE ASSESSED a Late Registration Fee of \$25.

AFTER COURSE SELECTION, participants must complete the enrollment fee satisfaction process by submitting their approved fee waiver forms. REGISTRATION LOANS

Students who are unable to satisfy enrollment fees in full by the fee payment deadline may apply for a short-term University registration loan. Students must be registered for a minimum of three (3) credit hours and be in good financial standing with the University in order to qualify for a registration loan.

Students who register during Priority/Extended Registration may apply for a registration loan in the Bursar's Office (177 Administration Building) beginning MAY 17, 1999. Students who register after Priority/Extended Registration may apply for a registration loan in the University Center Ballroom during Last Call and Late Registration.

A non-refundable loan processing fee of \$10 (per semester) will be assessed to each student who is approved for a registration loan. Registration loans normally will not be made for the student's loan processing fee, student activity fee, out-of-state tuition, late registration fee assessments, or any other amount due the University.

Registration loans must be repaid in full no later than August 1, 1999. A \$25 Late Payment Fee will be assessed if any portion of the loan balance remains unpaid after the due date. The registration loan balance (including accrued interest) will remain payable even if the student withdraws from the University, except for any normal University refund which may reduce the loan balance due. Registration loan amounts due must be paid by the due date in order to participate in the course selection process and/or use the Registration Loan Program for future terms.

Students whose fees are to be paid in full by any type of financial assistance (financial aid, direct student loans, scholarships, third party sponsors, or other fee credits) must complete the enrollment process by confirming they will attend classes at The University of Memphis during the Summer 1999 semester. HOW MUCH TO PAY (Continued)

DESCRIPTION OF FEES

MAINTENANCE FEE - Maintenance fees are assessed based on the course level and are determined solely on a semester hour basis for the Summer term sessions. Maintenance fee amounts quoted in the Fee Schedule include the Debt Service and General Access Fee components.

OUT OF STATE TUITION – Students classified as out-of-state residents by the Office of Admissions, using regulations provided by the Tennessee Board of Regents (TBR), pay the additional out-of-state tuition as indicated in the Fee Schedule. Residency regulations of TBR and information on appeals procedures are available in the Office of Admissions. ONLY THE OFFICE OF ADMISSIONS MAY CHANGE RESIDENCY CLASSIFICATIONS.

STUDENT ACTIVITY FEE - All students enrolled at the University will be assessed a student activity fee of \$4.00 per credit hour for the Summer term sessions.

APPLIED MUSIC FEE - Certain music courses require an additional applied music fee of \$45 per semester for each weekly one-half hour lesson. This fee is not included in the Fee Schedule.

LABORATORY MATERIAL FEE - Certain laboratory courses, such as Chemistry, may require an additional materials fee of \$10-\$25 per semester. This fee is not included in the Fee Schedule.

NURSING CLINICAL PRACTICUM FEE – Certain nursing courses require an additional clinical practicum fee of \$44-\$55 per semester. This fee is not included in the Fee Schedule.

LATE REGISTRATION FEE - A Late Registration Fee of \$25, which is not included in the Fee Schedule, will be assessed to each student who does not complete registration, including the payment of fees, prior to the first day of classes for the Pre Session May 17, First/Full session June 7, and Second session July 13.

LOCKER RENTAL FEE - Students who wish to rent a locker will be assessed a \$5 locker rental fee each semester. This fee is not included in the Fee Schedule.

The Fee Information in this section is intended to cover the situations most students will encounter. Detailed information concerning other miscellaneous student fees may be found in the Undergraduate and/or Graduate Bulletins of the University.

A full (100%) refund will also be provided for courses cancelled by the University at any time and in the case of the death of the student during the semester.

Please note the final refund period ends earlier than the final deadline for dropping courses or withdrawing from the University.

The University refund policy is based entirely upon the official date of withdrawal or change of course which would result in a refund. The refund percentage is NOT calculated on the amount of payment, but rather to the student's total enrollment fees assessment.

Refunds beyond the specified dates/percentages indicated above will not be made for reasons such as employment conflicts, moving out of town, or other reasons which are beyond the University's control or responsibility.

Refunds will be processed and mailed to students beginning approximately ten (10) days after classes begin. The University will offset against proposed refunds any amount owed by the student to the University.

OTHER INFORMATION

UNIVERSITY ID CARDS

The University of Memphis issues each student an identification card, which bears the student's image and social security number. There is *no charge* to the student for their initial University ID card. All students should obtain this permanent identification card which is used as the primary campus-wide method of determining privileges and accesses permitted to each student.

The University identification card remains the property of The University of Memphis and should be surrendered upon the request of a University official. A student may possess only **ONE** University identification card at any time.

Students may obtain a replacement for a lost, stolen, or damaged University identification card from the *ID Card Office in 171 Administration Building*, between the hours of 7:30am-6:00pm Monday-Thursday, or 7:30am-4:30pm Friday. Students will be charged a \$10 fee to replace a card that has been lost or stolen. A charge of \$2 will be made to change any data on a card.

TIGER FUNDS

A personal TIGER FUND\$ account, which is accessed through the student's University ID card, is also available to all students at The University of Memphis. TIGER FUND\$ is a declining balance money management program that allows students a convenient way to obtain supplies and services on campus without the need to carry cash or the inconvenience of paying by check or credit card.

TIGER FUND\$ are accepted at numerous campus locations, including the University Store, Health Center, and campus food service locations. TIGER FUND\$ are even accepted at various vending machines on campus for added convenience.

Your personal *TIGER FUND*\$ account can be activated by making a deposit at the Bursar's Office cashier's windows, *177 Administration Building*. Additional information on University ID cards and the advantages and convenience of having your own personal *TIGER FUND*\$ account may be obtained from the *ID Card Office in 171 Administration Building* or by calling the ID Card Office at (901) 678-3028.

RETURNED CHECKS/CREDIT CARD DRAFTS

It is expected that a check or credit card draft given to the University for any reason will be honored by the bank on which it is drawn. Any check or draft dishonored by the bank on which it is drawn may be presented a second time at the discretion of the University. A \$20.00 returned item fee will be assessed for any check/draft returned.

The privilege of making payments to the University by personal check and check cashing privileges will be revoked for any student who has had more than one returned check/draft within a twelve month period. The suspension of this privilege will be for a period of one year from the date the last item is redeemed.

A student will not be permitted to satisfy registration fees by check if any previous check in payment of registration fees has been returned. Students on a "NO CHECK" status must be prepared to satisfy registration fees with cash, cashier's check, or by authorized credit card draft.

APPEALS OF UNIVERSITY FEES/CHARGES AND REFUNDS

Any individual may appeal the assessment, application, calculation, collection, or interpretation of any University fee, charge, deposit, or refund. The University has developed the following processes for an appeal:

Traffic Fines/Citations – Traffic fines and citations may be appealed through a separate process on forms available from the Parking Office, Office of Judicial Affairs, or the Student Government Association Office.

Residence Life – Appeals related to Residence Life financial matters should be filed first with the Office of Residence Life for review within their process. Decisions of the Office of Residence Life may be appealed in writing to the Office of the Assistant Vice President of Student Affairs and Dean of Students. This decision may be appealed to the University Fee/Refund Appeals Committee.

All other University Fees/Charges, Refunds, Etc. – A written appeal of all other financial matters should be filed first on forms available in the Bursar's Office, 176 Administration Building. Decisions of the Bursar's Office may be appealed in writing to the Office of the Associate Vice President for Finance. The Bursar's Office will forward any appeals which they cannot address to the Office of the Associate Vice President for Finance.

The Office of the Associate Vice President for Finance will provide a decision in writing of those matters appealed to that office. This decision may be appealed to the University Fee/Refund Appeals Committee. The recommendation of the Committee will be forwarded to the Vice President for Business and Finance for a final decision, which will conclude the University's appeal process.

The listing of any fee or incidental charge in this publication does not constitute a contract between the University and the student. As a condition of registration, each student will pay the fees in effect for the semester for which he or she registers. All questions in regard to fees, fee payment, refunds, and appeals should be directed to the Bursar's Office, 176 Administration Building or by calling the Bursar's Office at (901) 678-5579.

Fees are subject to change without notice. The University will usually collect the amount of fees due at the time of enrollment in accordance with the residency classification and fee rates in effect. After all enrollments are complete, any over-collections will be refunded and students will be billed for any under-collections.

Fees for AUDITING courses are assessed on the same basis as fees for credit courses. Courses offered between terms, for a concentrated period during a term, or at specific locations may be subject to fees on a per-hour basis only.

SCHEDULE OF SPECIAL EXAMINATIONS

ACADEMIC ASSESSMENT AND PLACEMENT (AAPP)

Appropriate components of the AAPP course placement test are required of all first-time freshmen with an ACT composite score less than 19 (SAT total score less than 890), an ACT mathematics sub-score less than 19 (SAT quantitative score less than 450), and/or an ACT English sub-score less than 19 (SAT verbal score less than 460), or with no ACT (SAT) score. The AAPP test must be completed prior to a student's first enrollment.

COLLEGE OF EDUCATION COMPREHENSIVE EXAMINATIONS

Students wishing to take the M.S. or M.A.T. Comprehensive Examinations must consult with their major department to obtain the date, time and location of the examination, place their names on the examination list, and receive directions for preparing for the examination. Students wishing to take the Ed.S, Ed.D, or Ph.D Comprehensive Examinations must make arrangements with their major professor.

PRAXIS TESTS SERIES

Education majors may sign up for the National Teachers Exam (NTE) or the Pre-Professional Skills Test (PPST) using the PRAXIS bulletin. The completed application and fee must be received by the testing company on or before the deadline. SENIOR TESTING REQUIREMENTS

The Tennessee Board of Regents and University policy require all seniors to complete prior to graduation a general education test, and when scheduled, a major area achievement test. Seniors may register for the general education test when they have completed 100 hours toward their degree. Register by calling the Testing Center, (901) 678-2428. Registration for each test date is first come, first served, so CALL EARLY! The test should be completed PRIOR to filing the Intent to Graduate Card. Students with disabilities who are eligible for special test accommodations will be exempted

from the senior test upon request to the Director of Student Disability Services, 215 Scates Hall. The request must be made prior to the last test date for the semester in which one is graduating.

ACADEMIC POLICIES & PROCEDURES

AUDIT

Students wishing to audit a course must obtain approval from the department offering the course. The audit permit is electronically issued from the department and should be requested well in advance of the student's registration window of time. After the audit permit has been issued, the student must register on STRIPES or TIGERWEB. Fees for audit are the same as for credit. Students may not change from a grade point basis to audit or from audit to a grade point basis after the last day to add classes. PLEASE NOTE: Audit classes are not included in full-time enrollment status consideration.

COURSE NUMBERING SYSTEM

Courses are numbered according to the following system:

Below 1000 primarily for remedial and developmental students or non-native speakers of English

1000-1999	primarily for freshmen
2000-2999	primarily for sophomores
3000-3999	primarily for juniors
4000-4999	primarily for seniors

6000-6999 Courses equivalent to 4000 level courses for which limited graduate credit may be earned. Students will be expected to do more work and/or to perform at a higher level to receive

graduate credit
7000-7999 primarily for master's students

8000-8999 primarily for post-master's students only for doctoral candidates

CLASS ATTENDANCE

Students who do not attend courses are responsible for processing an official withdrawal on STRIPES or TIGERWEB.

- Students who do not attend any class meetings during the first week will be <u>administratively</u> withdrawn from each class never attended as reported by their instructor.
- Students who stop attending during the semester will be assigned a grade of "F" for that course, and the last known date of attendance will be reported.
- Students who are absent from the final examination without the permission of the teacher incur a grade of "F" on the examination and may, depending on the weight of the examination in determining the final grade, incur a grade of "F" for the course.
- Students who receive VA benefits or Title IV funds for enrollment fees are subject to cancellation of future awards and immediate repayment of these benefits if they stop attending whether or not they officially withdraw or drop a course.
- Class attendance may be used in computing grades at the discretion of the instructor. If attendance is to be used, a complete written statement of the

instructor's policy detailing the weight of attendance in determining the final grade must be presented to all students present at the first and second meetings of the class.

CLASS CANCELLATION & INCLEMENT WEATHER POLICY

In the event that inclement weather requires the cancellation of classes and/or campus activities, local radio and television news media will be immediately notified for dissemination, as they deem appropriate. Such closing decisions will also be given to University vice presidents for dissemination through the notification system in place for each division. Cancellations will not apply to administrative offices. Each faculty and staff member and each student is expected to recognize that inclement weather creates conditions more dangerous than normal. Therefore, each person is expected to exercise a high degree of care to avoid accidents. All non-teaching employees who do not report to work during inclement weather will be considered in an annual leave or leave without pay status for the period of their absence. (University Procedure 2A:16:01A)

Students must have approval from the appropriate official in their degree granting college for hours in excess of the maximum (concurrent enrollment at other colleges is included). Overload requests for approval should be made well in advance of registration.

CREDIT/NO CREDIT

Undergraduate students who have a 3.0 average and 60 semester hours, with permission of the dean of their college, may elect to take some courses on a credit/no credit basis. Students should pick up the Permission of Department Permit from the department, obtain appropriate signatures (including their academic advisor and dean) and bring the permit to Student Information Services, 119 Administration Building to be processed.

DISABLED AUDIT or CREDIT REGISTRATION

Tennessee residents who have a permanent and total disability which totally incapacitates them from working at an income producing occupation, may AUDIT courses without paying tuition charges, maintenance fees, student activity fees, or registration fees. They may enroll for CREDIT at the cost of one-half the normal per credit hour fee, not to exceed \$75.00 per semester. Enrollment for audit or credit will be limited according to space availability.

PLEASE NOTE: Students must contact Registration Services (901) 678-2676 after they register to obtain tuition reduction.

Applicants for this program must present medical information to University Health Services documenting a permanent and total disability. The University physician examines the documentation and determines eligibility. If the applicant is eligible for State Vocational Rehabilitation Services, which by their nature and definition are designed for individuals who have potential for employment, the applicant would not be eligible for the free audit or reduced fee benefit. Eligibility for this program applies only from the time of approval by the University physician and is not retroactive. Direct all inquiries regarding this program to Registration Services, 115 Administration Building, (901) 678-2676.

GRADE REPORTS

A grade report is mailed to the **permanent address** of each student at the end of the semester.

Withholding of Grade Reports

The University is required by State law to withhold grade reports, transcripts, and diplomas from students who have outstanding financial obligations to the University. When financial obligations have been resolved, students may obtain their grade reports in Student Information Services, 119 Administration Building or by calling 678-2671 to have grades mailed. In person release of grade reports requires photo identification.

PRIVACY RIGHTS OF PARENTS & STUDENTS - NOTICE TO STUDENTS

The University of Memphis intends to comply fully with the Family Education Right and Privacy Act of 1974 and its subsequent amendments. A complete copy of the procedure may be obtained in the Office of the Registrar.

Directory Information

"Directory Information" is defined as: the student's name, address, telephone listing, e-mail address, major field of study, date and place of birth, participation in officially recognized activities and sports, weight and height of members of athletic teams, dates of attendance, degrees and awards received, the most recent previous education agency or institution attended by the student, the student's enrollment status (number of enrolled hours, full-time or part-time status), and the student's classification (level).

Restricted Release of Directory Information

After a student registers for courses, the student may personally complete a written request in Student Information Services (119 Administration Building) that directory information not be released. Such information will be withheld from the campus telephone directory if the form is completed by the 14th day of classes.

Access to Records

To gain access, the student must request the custodian of the records to allow perusal of the education record according to the University Procedure for Student Records Access, which contains a list of the custodians of the records. A student must present proper identification in support of his/her request. Parents of dependent students as defined in the Internal Revenue Code Section 152 may obtain access to a dependent student's record after presenting appropriate documentation.

Review, Amend, Consent To Release Records

Parents and eligible students have the right to review education records, request amendments to the record, file a complaint related to the University's compliance with the requirements of the Family Educational Rights and Privacy Act (FERPA), and provide consent for release of personally identifiable information according to University Procedure 2E:30:01A. Release of personally identifiable student education records (other than directory information) is not permitted without written consent of the student to any party other than those specified by FERPA (e.g., the University does release education records to officials of other schools in which the student seeks or intends to enroll or has previously been enrolled).

PROBATION/SUSPENSION - UNDERGRADUATE ACADEMIC STATUS AND RETENTION

Students will be notified of their academic status at the end of each semester through their official grade report. Students who do not receive their grade reports in the mail may pick up a copy of their grades in 119 Administration Building. A complete statement of the University's academic status and retention policy may be found in the Bulletin. Specific questions concerning academic probation/suspension should be directed to the Academic Status Office, 117 Administration Building, (901) 678-2393.

Regardless of academic status, students will be allowed to register for classes for the following term. However, students whose grades result in an academic suspension will be automatically withdrawn from the University before classes begin. If the grade report indicates suspension, a student is required to remain out of the University the following semester. If the suspension occurs at the end of spring semester, the student must remain out of the University the summer session and following fall semester.

TRANSITIONAL ACADEMIC STUDIES

Students will be notified of their academic status at the end of each semester through their grade report. Students whose grades result in an academic suspension will be automatically withdrawn from the University before classes begin for the next semester. If the grade report indicates TRAC suspension, the required time out of the University prior to readmission is one semester. Students may appeal the suspension. TRAC suspension questions should be directed to Transitional Academic Studies Office, 203 Administration Building, (901) 678-2028.

REPETITION OF COURSES

A student may not attempt the same course more than three times for the purpose of obtaining a passing or higher grade. The dean of the college from which the student intends to graduate may make exceptions to this limitation. Exceptions must be approved prior to the student's registration for the fourth and any subsequent attempts of the same course. The student's grade point average will be computed as follows:

The record will continue to reflect all grades earned in the same course.

SENIOR CITIZEN AUDIT / CREDIT REGISTRATION

Persons who will become sixty (60) years of age during the academic semester in which they begin classes, and who are domiciled in Tennessee, may AUDIT courses without paying tuition charges, maintenance fees, student activity fees, or registration fees. Permission to AUDIT will be limited according to space availability.

Persons who will become sixty-five (65) years of age prior to or during the academic semester in which they begin classes and who are domiciled in Tennessee, may enroll in courses for CREDIT at the cost of one-half the normal per credit hour fee, not to exceed \$75.00 per semester. PLEASE NOTE: Students must contact Registration Services (901) 678-2676 after they enroll to obtain tuition reduction.

Direct all inquiries regarding this program to Registration Services, 115 Administration Building, (901) 678-2676.

STUDENTS WITH DISABILITIES

Eligible students with disabilities may register prior to their assigned time so adequate plans can be made for disability related needs and academic accommodations. The Office of Student Disability Services (SDS) mails detailed early registration instructions to students registered with their office. Other students with disabilities are encouraged to contact the SDS office for eligibility information.

Registration is available from any touch-tone telephone as well as the web. Students who are unable to register either by telephone or web, may go to Student Information Services, 119 Administration Building, for personal

registration assistance. Students must comply with the advising procedures established by their college and/or department before registering.

TRANSCRIPT REQUESTS

The University of Memphis requires written authorization from the student to release transcripts. Transcripts may be requested in person (143 Administration Building), by mail, or by FAX (901) 678-3249. Include the following information with your request: complete name, former names, Social Security Number, birth date, current address, first and last years of attendance, address (es) where transcript is to be mailed, number of copies to each address. Sign and date your request. There is no fee for transcripts; however, a transcript will not be released if student has not satisfied all obligations to the University. If you have additional questions, please contact Transcripts Office at (901) 678-3927.

TRANSFER CREDIT/U of M STUDENTS

After admission to The University of Memphis as a regular undergraduate, students must consult with their advisor and the Undergraduate Admissions Office if they anticipate enrolling at another college or university for the purpose of transferring credit to The University of Memphis. A Transfer Credit Request form must be completed. For completed additional undergraduate course work to be transferred from another university, the student must request that an evaluation be completed by Undergraduate Admissions, (901)678-2111. For information about the transfer of graduate credit contact The Graduate School, 317 Administration Building, (901) 678-2531.

WITHDRAWAL PROCEDURES

Students who register and are unable to attend the semester must formally process a withdrawal prior to the first day of classes to avoid having an academic record (official term grades recorded). Failure to officially withdraw will result in grades of "F" for the courses in which the student is enrolled. Courses dropped after the last day to add will be graded "W" (for withdrawn).

ADDENDA TO THE 1997-99 CATALOGS

The following items are corrections, revisions, or additions to the 1997-99 issues of the University Bulletin. Their publication here constitutes the official announcement of the change to the University Bulletin.

THE UNIVERSITY COLLEGE

<u>UNIV 3526. THEMATIC STUDIES – War & American Society: While Soldiers Fought (6)</u> Interdisciplinary examination of the concept and effects of war from historical, literary, artistic and philosophical perspectives. Focus on the various ways in which America has dealt with war, from the Revolutionary War to the recent Gulf Conflict, and on the changes in American Society that have resulted.

<u>UNIV 3536.</u> THEMATIC STUDIES – The Americas (3) An interdisciplinary approach to viewing the landscapes and peoples of Hispanic America. The course relates to social, historical, political, economic, and cultural aspects of Latin America. Vestiges of the indigenous population, colonialism, and the notion of a Third World will be discussed.

<u>UNIV 3537. THEMATIC STUDIES – Great Decisions: International Issues (3)</u> A review of selected contemporary U.S. foreign policy issues. Course readings, assignments, and video programs are designed to place international events into perspective and help students see the impact of foreign policy choices on their lives

<u>UNIV 3540. THEMATIC STUDIES – Ethics and Professionalism: Doing the Job Right (3)</u> Analysis of ethical decisions involved in professional practice. Application of moral principles to ethical dilemmas faced by professionals. Students will study ethical and professional issues in their intended professions

<u>UNIV 4502. THEMATIC STUDIES - THE ADULT YEARS (6)</u> Examines the simultaneous processes of growth, development and continuity that characterize the adult personal, interpersonal, social, and career experiences.


ON-LINE COURSES




Maps for Major Off-Campus Sites










MISCELLANEOUS INFORMATION

EXPOSURE TO HAZARDOUS CHEMICALS AND RADIOACTIVE MATERIALS

During the course of the semester, some classes and laboratories may use hazardous chemicals, radioactive materials or radiation producing equipment.

Prior to enrolling for classes each semester The University of Memphis recommends that students with health concerns or conditions seek private medical advice about the appropriateness for them to enroll in classes and laboratories using hazardous chemicals, radioactive materials or radiation producing equipment. The state of the art at this time is not sufficient to provide complete information about all possible side effects and health hazards, known and unknown, which could develop from the exposure to and use of such hazardous chemicals, radioactive materials and radiation producing equipment.

During regular University business hours Material Safety Data Sheets (MSDS) for hazardous chemicals are available for review through the office of the chair of the department in which such chemicals are used. MSDS are also available for review in the Environmental Health and Safety Office, 110 Brister Tower. Information about exposure from radioactive materials and radiation producing equipment may be obtained from the Radiation Safety Officer.

VA EDUCATIONAL BENEFITS

IT IS THE STUDENT'S RESPONSIBILITY TO BE AWARE OF AND FULFILL ALL REQUIREMENTS FOR RECEIPT OF GI BILL BENEFITS. Any student using VA Educational Benefits Assistance (GI Bill Benefits) at The University of Memphis should contact the Office of Veteran's Services (119 Administration Building 678-2996). New students should be prepared to furnish the following items as needed: a VA copy of their DD 214 (Certificate Of Release Or Discharge From Active Duty), DD 2384 (Notice Of Basic Eligibility), or other armed forces separation papers, a copy of their Delayed Enlistment Contract, copies of their children's birth certificates, a copy of a divorce decree if either vet or spouse was previously married, their VA file number if benefits have been used previously, and a transcript from any college or university previously attended.

The VA places restrictions on those receiving veteran's educational benefits. Some of these restrictions include regular class attendance, satisfactory academic progress, and adherence to a specific degree program. The VA will not pay for repeated courses if the grade already earned is acceptable for graduation requirements and major objectives at this University (this includes transfer credit), or for elective courses in excess of those needed to meet graduation requirements. Certification Reminders

(1) Register with the Office of Veterans Services every semester by

completing a Veterans Request for Certification Form.

(2) Report credit allowed for prior training in cooperation with your advisor by completing a "Request for Evaluation of Prior Credit" form. These forms are available from the Office of Veterans Services.

- (3) Inform the Office of Veterans Services of any changes in major or degree pursued, address, marital status, or number of dependents claimed.
- (4) After registering, report to the Office of Veterans Services immediately all changes in class schedules including adds, drops, section changes, canceled courses, and withdrawals.
- (5) Obtain a degree posting sheet/formal degree plan from your advisor, and furnish a copy to the Office of Veterans Services, as well as keeping a copy for your personal files.

For more information on eligibility requirements, monthly pay rates, and other services available, contact the Office of Veterans Services.

HARASSMENT POLICY

Policy

It is against University policy to harass or to discriminate against any member of the University Community on the basis of sex or race. Such actions are prohibited not only by University Policy, but also by Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 as amended, and Title IX of the Educational Amendments of 1972. Violation of these Acts may subject the University and/or individuals to disciplinary action and may have legal consequences.

Harassment is reprehensible and will not be tolerated by the University. It subverts the mission of the University and threatens the careers, educational experience, and well being of students, faculty and staff. Incidents involving sexual harassment or racial harassment have no place within the University. In both obvious and subtle ways, even a suggestion of sexual or racial harassment is destructive to individual students, faculty, staff, and the academic community as a whole. When, through fear or reprisal, a student, staff member, or faculty member submits or is pressured to submit to unwanted sexual attention, the University's ability to carry out its mission is undermined.

Sexual harassment is especially serious when it threatens relationships between teacher and student or supervisor and subordinate. In such situations, sexual harassment exploits unfairly the power inherent in a faculty member or supervisor's position. Through grades, wage increases, recommendations for graduate study, promotion, and the like, a teacher or supervisor can have a decisive influence on a student's, staff member's or faculty member's career at the University and beyond.

While sexual harassment most often takes place in situations of a power differential between the persons involved, the University also recognizes that sexual harassment may occur between persons of the same University status. The University will not tolerate behavior between or among members of the University community that creates an unacceptable work or educational environment.

- A. Sexual harassment is defined as unwelcome sexual advances, request for sexual favors and other verbal or physical conduct of a sexual nature when one of the following criteria is met:
 - submission to such conduct is made either explicitly or implicitly a term or condition of the individual's employment or of the individual's status in a program, course or activity; or
 - submission to or rejection of such conduct by an individual is used as a basis for employment decisions, a criterion for evaluation, or a basis for academic or other decisions affecting such individual; or
 - such conduct has the purpose or effect of unreasonably interfering with an individual's work performance or educational experience or creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive work or educational environment.
- B. Sexual harassment encompasses any sexual attention that is unwanted and can take many forms, but most sexual harassment falls into three categories: verbal, visual, and physical. The examples listed above are not exclusive, but simply represent types of conduct that may constitute sexual harassment. Some examples of behavior or conduct that may constitute sexual harassment include, but are not limited to:
 - refusing to hire, promote, or granting or denying certain privileges because of acceptance or rejection of sexual advances
 - promising a work-related benefit or a grade in return for sexual favors
 - suggestive or inappropriate communications, e-mail, notes, letters, or other written materials displaying objects or pictures which are sexual in nature that would create hostile or offensive work or living environments
 - sexual innuendoes, comments, and remarks about a person's clothing, body or activities
 - suggestive or insulting sounds
 - 6. whistling in a suggestive manner
 - 7. humor and jokes about sex that denigrate men or women
 - 8. sexual propositions, invitations, or pressure for sexual activity
 - 9. implied or overt sexual threats
 - suggestive or obscene gestures
 - 11. patting, pinching, and other inappropriate touching
 - 12. unnecessary touching or brushing against the body
 - 13. attempted or actual kissing or fondling
 - 14. coerced sexual intercourse
 - 15. sexual assault

Whether the alleged conduct constitutes sexual harassment depends upon the record as a whole and the totality of the circumstances, such as the nature of sexual advances in the context within which the alleged incident occurred. Please note that sexual assaults may be criminal acts and as such, investigation and processing by the criminal justice system, local police, campus security, and crisis intervention centers may supersede the process developed under this Guideline.

- C Consensual Relationships Intimate relationships between supervisors and their subordinates, and between faculty members and students are discouraged since such relationships could lead to undue favoritism or the perception of undue favoritism. Such relationships are improper when they influence or could reasonably be expected to influence decisions or actions in University-related matters.
- D. Generally, racial harassment is defined as any person's conduct which unreasonably interferes with an employee's or student's status or performance by creating an intimidating, hostile, or offensive working or educational environment. Harassment on the basis of race, color, or national origin, includes offensive or demeaning treatment of an individual, where such treatment is based typically on prejudiced stereotypes of a group to which that individual may belong. It includes, but is not limited to, objectionable epithets, threatened or actual physical harm or abuse, or other intimidating or insulting conduct directed against the individual because of his/her race, color, or national origin. Title VII requires employers to take prompt action to prevent individuals from expressing their opinions in a way that abuses or offends their coworkers.

The University seeks to encourage the prompt reporting of such harassment and its prompt resolution through University procedures. Where the charge of harassment is by one student against another student, the Assistant Dean of Students for Judicial Affairs, 105 University Center, will investigate and resolve the complaint in accordance with appropriate student procedures. Other charges, not university Affirmative Action Officer, 156 Administration Building, for investigation and recommendations to the President and will follow guidelines set forth in University Procedure 2A:12:04A.

In addition, the University will take steps towards and encourage the development of programs aimed at informing students and employees of their rights to be free from sexual harassment and the procedures available for reporting. Programs will also be developed and aimed at preventing harassment.

Procedure

The purpose of this procedure is to provide a clearly defined means of reporting and investigating the complaints of students, faculty, and staff where they believe they have encountered harassment as defined by the University policy. The final resolution of such complaints and the imposition of any appropriate sanctioning will be governed by existing University procedures as stated herein.

The President has assigned the University Equal Employment/
Affirmative Action Compliance Officer the responsibility of investigating
any complaint related to this procedure. The responsibility of
investigating complaints against students has been assigned to the
Assistant Dean for Judicial Affairs in accordance with appropriate student
disciplinary procedures.

Since harassment based on race, sex, or any other factor has been defined as discriminatory in nature, the following will be implemented for the reporting of harassment:

- Complaint by faculty member or staff against student Procedure:
 Complaint to Assistant Dean of Students for Judicial Affairs for investigation and disposition.
- B. Complaint by student against faculty member or staff; faculty member against staff; faculty member against faculty member or supervisor; or staff against faculty member, staff, supervisor or outside University contracting agency Procedure: Complaint to University Affirmative Action Officer for investigation and possible disciplinary action by the President.

Procedures

The following procedures are intended to protect the rights of the aggrieved party as well as the party against whom an allegation of harassment is lodged, as required by state and federal laws. Each allegation will be properly investigated and, when warranted, appropriate disciplinary action taken against the individual charged.

In situations that require immediate action, because of safety or other concerns, the institution can take any disciplinary action that is

appropriate, e.g., suspension with pay, pending the outcome of the investigation by the EEO/AA Officer or Assistant Dean of Judicial Affairs. The University Affirmative Action Officer and the President should be contacted in situations requiring immediate action. The TBR Office of General Counsel will be contacted before any immediate action is taken and prior to any investigation

A. Investigation

- Any student, applicant for employment or employee who believes he
 or she has been subjected to harassment at The University of
 Memphis shall present the allegation to the designated EEO/AA
 Officer or Assistant Dean for Judicial Affairs responsible for
 compliance with Title VII of the Civil Rights Act of 1964 or Title IX of
 the Education Amendments of 1972.
- 2. Every attempt will be made to get the aggrieved party to provide the charge in writing. The allegation shall include the circumstances giving rise to the allegations, the date of the allegad occurrences, and names of witnesses, if any. The allegation shall be signed by the aggrieved individual. However, where the aggrieved individual refuses to provide or sign a written charge, the allegation will still be investigated, and recommend to the President appropriate action. Allegations made anonymously or by a third party must also be investigated to the extent possible. Based on the findings of this investigation, the EEO/AA Officer may recommend to the President appropriate action that may or may not be the steps outlined in the remaining paragraphs of this guideline.

If there is insufficient evidence to corroborate the allegation(s) or, in any situation in which the alleged victim refuses to cooperate in the investigation, it may be appropriate to discuss the allegation with the alleged harasser, informing him or her that s/he is not being accused of a P-080 violation, but that the conduct alleged could be found to violate this guideline. Any investigation and subsequent discussion should be documented and a report submitted as set forth in this procedure.

3. The Office of General Counsel shall be notified of the allegation, whether written or verbal, as soon as possible after it is brought to the attention of the EEO/AA Officer or Assistant Dean for Judicial Affairs and the investigation will be under the direction of the General Counsel. On campus legal assistance shall be forwarded a notice of the allegation.

Where a student is the party against whom a complaint is made, all documentation shall be subject to the provisions and protections of the Family Educational Records and Privacy Act (FERPA).

4. The EEO/AA Officer or Assistant Dean for Judicial Affairs shall notify in writing the alleged harasser within five (5) working days of receipt of the allegation. The alleged harasser shall respond in writing to the allegation within five (5) working days of notification.

The alleged harasser should be notified that any retaliation against the accuser is strictly prohibited regardless of the outcome of the P-080 investigation and may, in itself, be grounds for disciplinary action.

- 5. The EEO/AA Officer or Assistant Dean for Judicial Affairs may meet with both parties for the purpose of resolving the charge informally. If informal resolution is successful in resolving the complaint, a report of such, having first been reviewed and approved by the Office of General Counsel, shall be submitted to the President.
- 6. A report shall be submitted to the President and the parties within twenty (20) working days following receipt of the allegation. Each report shall outline the basis of the allegation, including the dates of the alleged occurrences, the response of the alleged harasser, the findings of the EEO/AA Officer or Assistant Dean for Judicial Affairs and all attempts to resolve the allegation informally and recommendations regarding disposition of the allegation. If following an investigation the EEO/AA Officer or Assistant Dean for Judicial Affairs finds there is no substantial evidence to support the charge, the parties shall be so advised in writing.
- The President shall review the report and make a final determination as to whether a violation has occurred and, if so, what the appropriate resolution should be.

If the investigation reveals evidence to support the allegation, the President may meet with the charged party and/or the aggrieved party and attempt to resolve the problem by agreement. Appropriate steps must be taken to ensure that the harassment will not reoccur. The charged party shall be advised of his/her right to a hearing pursuant to the procedures set forth below. An alleged

harasser may request a hearing within ten (10) days following receipt of the report.

B. Hearing

- 1 If the charged party requests a hearing, he or she shall be advised of hearing procedures available under Board of Regents Policy No. 1:06:00:05, Uniform Procedures for Cases Subject to Tennessee Uniform Administrative Procedures Act, and of the established The University of Memphis procedures available for resolution of the matter in question. The party requesting a hearing shall be given the opportunity to elect the procedures pursuant to which the matter shall be heard
- 2. When an individual elects to proceed under the established The University of Memphis procedures for resolution of the matter, the election should be in writing and signed by the individual making the election and should expressly waive the procedures available under the TUAPA as to the matter in question. When a party elects to proceed pursuant to established institutional procedures, these procedures shall include the following minimal requirements:
 - Notice of the charge to the party or parties.
 - b The right of the party or parties to present his or her case.
 - c. The right to be accompanied by an advisor.
 - d. The right to call witnesses in his or her behalf.
 - e. The right to confront witnesses against him or her.
 - In addition, in any case where the President makes a decision which is adverse to the charge or claim of either party, the President shall advise the person of any right of appeal provided by TBR policy.
- 3 Individuals electing to proceed under the TUAPA shall be referred to the appropriate University of Memphis official responsible for commencement of actions under the TUAPA as provided in Board Policy No 1:06:00:05
- 4. When an allegation involves a tenured faculty member, the same informal and formal procedures set out above shall be utilized. Tenured faculty members shall have the same right to elect hearing procedures as set out herein. However, where the investigation results in a finding that the harassment policy was violated and the President concurs with that finding and determines that the harassment constitutes adequate cause for termination, then the matter will proceed directly to a hearing under either The University of Memphis policy for termination of tenure or TBR policy 5:02:03:00.

THE UNIVERSITY OF MEMPHIS' POSITION ON DRUG AND ALCOHOL USE BY STUDENTS

- A. In accordance with local, state and federal laws and with University Regulations promulgated in accordance with the Tennessee Board of Regents policy, students are prohibited from unlawfully processing, using, selling, manufacturing or distributing illicit drugs on University owned or controlled property. Also, students are prohibited from possessing, using, selling, manufacturing or distributing alcoholic beverages on University owned or controlled property.
 - At off-campus University sponsored (funded) events, students are prohibited from unlawfully possessing, using, selling, manufacturing or distributing illicit drugs. Alcohol shall not be abused by those of legal drinking age, nor used, possessed or distributed by those who have not attained drinking age.
 - Additionally, students are prohibited from being under the influence of illegal drugs or alcohol while on University owned or controlled property or while attending any University sponsored (funded) activity.
- B. Under the laws of the state of Tennessee, a person convicted of the unlawful possession, use, or distribution of an illicit drug or alcohol may face a fine ranging from fifty dollars (\$50) to \$500,000 and may face imprisonment ranging from thirty (30) days to sixty (60) years. Dependent on the offense and its classification, the fine and imprisonment may vary but will be within the limits noted. Descriptions of the offenses and sanctions listed are located in the Tennessee Code Annotated (T.C.A.) in section 39-17-401 through 427 and in sections 40-35-101 through 504.

Under the laws of the United States, a person convicted of the manufacture, distribution or possession of any controlled sub-stance may face a fine of up to \$100,000 and may face imprisonment of up to one (1) year for Schedule V drugs, and a fine of up to \$1,000,000 and life imprisonment for Schedule I drugs. Dependent on the offense

and its classification (according to the schedule of the drug), the sanction may vary but will be within the limits listed above. These sanctions are doubled when the offense involves either (i) distribution or possession at or near a school or college campus (emphasis supplied) or (ii) distribution to persons under 21 years of age. Additional sanctions include civil fines of up to \$1,000,000 for simple possession and loss of eligibility for federal benefits. Descriptions of offenses and sanctions are located in the United States Code (U.S.C.), title 21, sections 801 et seq.

C. The use of illicit drugs or alcohol may result in a variety of health problems. Excessive use of alcohol, for instance has been shown to result in damage to the heart and liver; impairment of brain activity, digestion and blood circulation; impairment of judgment, memory and motor skills; and ultimately may lead to death.

The use of illicit drugs has been shown to cause organic damage, impairment of physiological processes, and impairment to mental functioning. Risks of contracting hepatitis, AIDS and other infection increases when illicit drugs are injected. The use of illicit drugs may also lead to death.

D. The University of Memphis students have access to a wide variety of drug or alcohol related counseling/assistance programs, both on and off campus. On campus services, which are entirely free to students, include the Center for Student Development's Psychological Counseling Unit, the University's Health Center and the Department of Psychology's Counseling Services (Psychological Service Center). For more information on campus based services, contact the Center for Student Development at 678-2067.

 Off campus programs to assist the substance abuser range from groups dealing with addictive behaviors - such as Alcoholics Anonymous - to full service, in-patient programs operated by local hospitals or health-related concerns. These programs may be contracted either directly or through referral by The Center for Student Development; although, none are operated with the assistance of the University.

E. Violation of University Policy as stated in Section A above will result in disciplinary action being taken against the responsible student. A violation may result in a sanction ranging from a simple warning and referral for treatment to a full suspension or expulsion from the University and may also result in referral for prosecution by local, state or federal authorities. For a more detailed view of the disciplinary process, see the Student Handbook section on student discipline ("Code of Conduct") or contact the Office of Judicial Affairs at 678-2298.

CRIME AWARENESS & CAMPUS SECURITY ACT OF 1990

- The University of Memphis Procedure No. 2D:06:01A provides that all suspicious and/or criminal activity should be reported to the Department of Public Safety, which is open 24 hours a day. Reports of such activity may be made in person to a member of the Department of Public Safety at the office (155 Administration Building), to any Officer on campus patrol, by telephone (678-4357 or MSU-HELP), or from any campus emergency telephone located at various sites across campus and in the lobbies of most academic buildings.
- 2. The campus and facilities of The University of Memphis are restricted to students, faculty, staff, guests and invitees of the University, except when all or part of the campus, its buildings or facilities are open to the general public for a designated time and purpose. Individuals loitering on campus without a legitimate purpose as specified above are issued trespass warnings and directed to leave campus; failure to comply with the warning will result in arrest.
 - The main lobbies of residence halls are open from 7:00 a.m. to 12:00 midnight each day. After midnight, the residence hall lobbies are restricted to student residents and Residence Life staff. Visitation hours are established by a two-thirds majority of the residents of each individual hall at the beginning of each Fall semester. In any case, visitation hours may not exceed 12 hours (12:00 noon to 12:00 midnight) on weekdays and 14 hours (12:00 noon to 2:00am) on weekends. For more information concerning the residence hall visitation policy, consult the Residence Hall Application Reservation brochure available in the Office of Residence Life and Visitor Information Center.
- The Department of Public Safety employs 30 commissioned peace officers. University Police Officers attend a basic police academy and an <u>annual</u> in-service training program in conformance with the requirements of the Tennessee Peace Officers' Standards and

Training Commission. The University Police Officers' commission authorizes them to enforce state law on campus and on contiguous streets, and to investigate crime occurring on campus or against the University.

Students are encouraged to promptly report crime and suspicious activity through various crime awareness and prevention programming sponsored by the Department of Public Safety and the Division of Student Affairs, including New Student Orientation and Residence Life programming. Students are further encouraged to report criminal activity as outlined in various University publications, including the Student Handbook and the Campus Safety and Security brochure.

- The Department of Public Safety and the Division of Student Affairs sponsor on-going programming on crime prevention and safety awareness. Programming includes skits, videos, self-defense presentations and discussions presented to various student organizations and groups, resident students, and new students during orientation. This programming, as well as literature published by the University, encourages students to adopt safe behaviors and attempts to foster a sense of personal responsibility for safety among all members of the campus community.
- 5. The Memphis Police Department is notified of all felony crimes that occur on campus. Any sexual assault of a university student that is reported to the Department of Public Safety is also reported to the Memphis Police Department, whether the offense occurred on or off campus. The Tennessee Bureau of Investigation is also notified of any criminal activity deemed to be of special interest.
- 5. The sale, consumption or possession of alcohol or illegal drugs is prohibited on the campus of The University of Memphis and at any University sponsored student activity. Violators of this policy are subject to arrest and disciplinary action by the University. Further information regarding the University's policy on alcohol and drug use is contained in the Student Handbook in the sections entitled "The University of Memphis's Position on Drug and Alcohol Use", "Residence Life", and "The Code of Student Conduct" and in this schedule of classes.
- 7. No person, other than law enforcement officers when in the discharge of their official duties, may possess a weapon on premises owned, operated, managed, or under control of The University of Memphis. This exclusion includes individuals who have obtained permits to carry concealed weapons from the State of Tennessee or any other entity.

A log of all crimes reported to The University of Memphis Police during the previous day will be generated upon request. A database of all crimes and incidents reported to, or recorded by, The University of Memphis Police is maintained as a part of an automated records management system.

PARKING REGULATIONS

The U of M Parking Office is located at 3918 Central Avenue. Office hours are Monday - Thursday, 7:00am - 6:00pm, and Friday, 7:00am - 4:30pm. Please note: Hours may differ during U of M's student registration periods. Contact the Parking Office at 678-2212 for specific operating hours.

Campus Traffic and Parking Regulations are available in the Parking Office, 3918 Central Avenue, the Office of Judicial Affairs, University Center, and the Visitor's Information Center located at the corner of Patterson and Central.

Every vehicle parked on campus property must have a parking permit (hang-tag) properly displayed. Parking meters have been placed in parking lots around the University for the use of visitors. Parking permits

(hangtags) are permanent and are designed to hang from the inside rearview mirror post but may be transferred to a replacement vehicle when the registered vehicle is not available. A temporary parking permit (hangtag) must be purchased from the Parking Office when you forget to transfer the regular hangtag. Parking permit fees range from \$19 - \$200 based on the level of parking desired. If you lose your hangtag, a replacement fee of \$10.00 will be charged. A lost or stolen permit (hangtag) must be reported to the Parking Office. For additional information, telephone the Parking Office at 678-2212.

Parking lots are Priority (gate access), Reserved, General, Resident, or Visitor. All University owned streets are reserved for Resident or Visitor parking. A parking sign is erected at the entrance to each lot and University owned street indicating the use of that lot or street.

Priority (gate access) lots have a limited number of spaces. These spaces are sold for either day or evening use and a parking space is virtually guaranteed. Applications for gate access parking are available in the Parking Office or in the Fee Payment Center during registration. Resident students may charge resident parking fees on their university account during dorm check-in. Resident gated access costs \$21.00. Non-gated access costs \$14.00.

Vehicles must be parked within parking spaces delineated by white lines. Improperly parked vehicles may be towed at owner's expense. The issuance of a parking permit (hangtag) does not guarantee a parking space on University property. The inability to locate a legal parking space does not diminish the responsibility to park in accordance with University parking regulations.

Visitor parking is provided in spaces where parking meters are installed in various locations around campus or in the Parking Garage located at Deloach and Norriswood Streets. Visitor Parking Permits (hangtags) are available at the Parking Office or Visitor Information Center for a fee of \$1.00 per day. These permits allow parking at metered spaces without additional payment or in the General parking lots. The Visitor Information Center is located at Patterson Street and Central Avenue and the Parking Office is located at 3918 Central Avenue.

Garage parking is available Monday through Friday at Deloach and Norriswood streets. Garage parking is \$1.00 per hour or a daily rate of \$4.00. Parking permit (hangtag) holders may be provided a discount on the all-day rate. Evening access to the garage is provided to permit holders at a cost of \$40.00 per semester.

University Police officers, parking assistants, faculty members, or staff employees are not empowered to allow anyone to violate the traffic and parking regulations. Storing articles of value (including radar detectors) in parked automobiles is discouraged. However, if articles must be left in an automobile they should be placed out of sight and/or located in the trunk. The University of Memphis does not assume responsibility for loss of personal property.

Motorists may obtain assistance or information from any campus officer on patrol or by calling 678-4357 (MSU-HELP), or by using any emergency telephone located at various sites across campus and in the lobbies of most academic buildings.
