#### Background



#### **Team structure**



# Designing and Implementing Protocols for Consistency of Care

#### **Protocols**

- 1. Prior to 2021: Pap smear and STI protocols
- 2021: Intimate Partner Violence, Sexual Assault, Wet mount microscopy, HPV vaccination, dysmenorrhea, abnormal uterine bleeding, prenatal medicine guide, and prenatal lab protocols

## Expanding Contraception Availability and Counseling

## PATH (Pregnancy Attitudes, Timing, and How Important is pregnancy prevention)

- Prior to contraception expansion at the clinic in 2021, available options consisted of one formulation of oral contraception pill (OCP) and external condoms.
- A partnership was established with PATH4YOU, a grant-funded statewide initiative to provide patient-centered pregnancy intention screening, alloptions contraceptive counseling, and same day provision at no cost to participants.
