THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

To the inhabitants of the Town of Langdon, County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Langdon on Tuesday, the thirteenth day of March, at twelve of the clock noon until six P.M. Regular business meeting will be held at seven P.M.

Article 1. To choose all necessary officers for the ensuing year.

Article 2. To see if the Town will appropriate and authorize Selectmen to use the income, estimated to be \$37,835.00 from:

a. Filing Fees and Permits	\$ 10.00

Article 3. To see if the Town will appropriate the sum of \$58,000.00 for the maintenance of highways and bridges. The State of New Hampshire to furnish approximately \$24,000.00 in state aid. The Town to raise the balance. (Approximately \$34,000.00)

- Article 4. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,000.00 for the Capital Reserve Fund previously established for the purchase of highway equipment.
- Article 5. To see if the Town will raise and appropriate the sum of \$2,221.00 for the Fall Mt. Branch of Home Health Care and Community Services. (Visiting Nurse)
- Article 6. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,800.00 for the Capital Expenses of the fire department.
- Article 7. To see if the Town will vote to appropriate the sum of \$5,000.00 for the conversion of the mini-pumper as a combination fire and emergency medical vehicle, using the money realized from the sale of excess fire equipment(tank from the C.D. Tanker, and present body on the mini-pumper). The Town to raise the balance.
- Article 8. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell the body from the mini-pumper, the tank from the C.D. Tanker, and any other equipment no longer needed on either vehicle.
- Article 9. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$1,500.00 for the replacement of the furnace in the fire station.
- Article 10. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum not to exceed \$4,255.00 for the purpose of repainting the Town Hall.
- Article 11. To see if the Town will vote to authorize withdrawal from the Revenue Sharing Fund established under the provisions of the State and Local Assistance Act of 1972, for use as set-offs against appropriations on the amounts indicated or take any other action hereon:

Article 14. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.

Article 15. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to sell property acquired by Tax Collector's Deed.

Article 16. To see if the Town of Langdon shall call upon the Governor and Executive Council, its State Representative and State Senator to promptly convene a Special Session of the Legislature for the sole purpose of preventing the imposition of huge cost increases in electric rates resulting from the Seabrook Nuclear Power Plant on the citizens, businesses, schools, and agencies in the Town of Langdon, and to direct the Selectmen to promptly notify our above elected officials of the Town's desire. ## REPORT OF THE FIRE CHIEF

The Langdon Fire Department responded to emergencies a total of 37 times in 1983, detailed as follows:

Truck Fires - 2	Medical Emergencies - 20
False Alarm - 1	(12 at FMRHS)
Structure Fires - 4	Down Wires - 1
Chimney Fires - 7	Partition Fires - 2

In 1983 many improvements were made both inside the department and on the station building itself. The interior has been insulated and more lights installed, making it less expensive to heat and better to maintain equipment in. The large underground tank in back of the station has been completely piped up and filled. We have drilled from it and found it works fine, making a large amount of water available year round. The men renewed the 1945 Jeep pumper this year also. This included welding, body work, lights, and a new coat of paint. If you've seen the Jeep since it's been done, I'm sure you'll agree the men did a fine job. Our thanks to Ray King for donating his shop and time towards the project.

We were able to buy 3 Scott Air Pacs at a good price and had another donated by Jim Dunne, which brings our total to 8. This is a number we can be proud of. Our thanks to Jim, who has helped us many times in the past, and I'm sure will continue to support and help Langdon better it's Fire and Rescue Department.

The men themselves have raised money this year with their rides and our Annual Mother's Day Pancake Breakfast. We also participated in the Langdon Church Fair which was bigger than ever this year. To date, the men in the Langdon Fire Department have donated \$1100.00 towards a radio and fittings for the new truck upon it's arrival.

The Rescue Squad has been very busy this year and I'm pleased to say we welcome 3 more members as EMT's to the Squad. These include 2 women who will be an asset to the service offered. Training was held at the station, plus many members attended courses all over the state and some out of state. This in addition to all the schooling required for a registered EMT is a great deal to give to the town and I'm sure we all are grateful for their donation. This service gets busier each passing year and requires more and more time.

The Department is at your call 24 hours a day, 7 days a week by calling 352-1100. If you have a fire, need rescue or medical help don't hesitate to call. I hope you all have stickers on your phone with that number plus your house number. If not please take time to contact myself or anyone in the Department. The time it may save when needed will be well worth it.

## REPORT OF THE FOREST FIRE WARDEN

I want to thank all of you for the diligence afforded the area of forest fires. We went without any fire this year. I hope we can maintain this record.

In an attempt to maintain our equipment, we purchased six hard hats and goggles. In 1984 I hope to add some more hand tools.

We in N.H. are fortunate that we have the least amount of area destroyed per fire - less than  $\frac{1}{2}$  acre each. Due to fiscal restraints the state wanted to cut back on forest fire detection - especially the fire towers. The two state delegates of the Cheshire County Forest Fire Wardens Association (Langdon is in this district), G. B. "Ben" Porter and myself, worked with the State Federation of Forest Fire Wardens Association and succeeded in obtaining additional state funding for forest fire detection. In 1984 there will be around 15 towers in use and especially important to us is the fact that the tower on Highland Hill will be in use after two years of being shut down.

There is excellent cooperation in the use of the written fire permit. Please continue - also please call me whenever you want to burn even though a written permit may not be necessary.

FALL MOUNTAIN BRANCH OF HOME HEALTH CARE & COMMUNITY SERVICES  
 Annual Report to the Town of Langdon for 1983  
 Request for Tax Appropriation Funds for 1984

On July 1, 1983, Fall Mountain Visiting Nurse Association became a participating agency with Home Health Care and Community Services (HHCCS), a combined home care and social service agency whose administration office is in Keene. HHCCS, serving 39 towns in Sullivan, Cheshire and Hillsborough Counties, demonstrates clearly that being bigger is more cost efficient and more effective in providing a broad range of services.

Fall Mountain Visiting Nurse Association continues to exist with its special separate identity, and with its Board of Directors still in place, overseeing home care management in Fall Mountain's five-town area. By its linkage to HHCCS, however, its administrative costs have been reduced by more than 55% (from over 40% to 17%). New Services are now available: Occupational Therapy, Speech Therapy and, in addition, a Care for the Terminally Ill Program that offers the full range of necessary services (including 24-hour on call services) for the terminally ill patient. The program makes it possible for a patient to remain at home to the end.

The staff providing direct services has remained unchanged, except for the addition of two new nurses. Kay Frazer, who was Director of Fall Mountain Visiting Nurse Association, now is HHCS' Director of Clinical Services. As Director of the agency's total clinical program, she continues to oversee activity in the Fall Mountain area.

Although costs increased in 1983, and are projected to increase in 1984, HHCCS requests no increase in tax appropriation. The amount remains \$2,221.00. This is a clear sign of new efficiency.

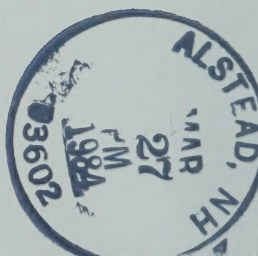


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
