REPORT OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS

To the Citizens of Cheshire County :

In accordance with the Public Statutes of the State of New Hampshire the county commissioners present herewith their annual report for the year ending December 31, 1940. Included are the reports of the County Treasurer, Auditors, Solicitor, Sheriff, Clerk of Court, Superintendent of County Farm, Master of the House of Correction and Physician to the County Farm. The fiscal year ended with a balance of \$36,031.31, and no outstanding notes or bonded indebtedness.

Direct relief has shown a saving over last year of approximately \$6,500. This is accounted for in part because more cases with large families have been cared for at the County Home and more of the employable cases have had employment. It is not probable, under present conditions, that the cost of direct relief can be further lowered to any great extent. The cost to the County of Old Age Assistance has increased during the year and will no doubt continue to increase each year. Board and care of children whose parents are either dead, or totally unable, or incompetent to care for them has run about the same. This is a form of relief which should be studied carefully as it seems money invested in the welfare of children being cared for in institutions or foster homes will pay dividends in self-supporting adults in later years.

Mr. and Mrs. B. F. Sherman who had served as superintendent and matron of the County Home for about eighteen years resigned in June to accept a very fine position as superintendent and matron at the New Hampshire Orphans' Home at Franklin, New Hampshire. Mr. and Mrs. Leo O. Vogel assumed charge of the County Home on June 25th, 1940. Mr. Vogel was

stricken seriously ill after serving about two weeks and Mrs. Vogel carried on in a very faithful manner until November 1st when Mr. and Mrs. J. A. Dunlap became superintendent and matron. Due to the several changes in administration and the fact that more and larger cases have been cared for at the Home and that some of these cases have required hospital care, x-rays and operations the cost of running the Home has exceeded the expenditures of the past several years. The farm buildings and equipment have been well maintained and the inmates and patients have received the usual fine care. We wish to express our appreciation for the faithful services rendered by Mr. and Mrs. Sherman, Mr. and Mrs. Vogel, Mr. and Mrs. Dunlap, Dr. Neil C. Stevens and to all the employees at the Home.

The County has been very fortunate in the expenditures of the Superior Court, Sheriff's department and the board and care of prisoners in the Keene Police Station and the Manchester Jail. It can not be expected that this good fortune will be lasting and the expenses will no doubt return to the average of the past few years.

The Cheshire County Bar Association has requested the county commissioners to have the ceiling of the courtroom covered with acoustic board and make other repairs to improve the conditions in the courtroom which are extremely bad for judge, council and jury when trying cases. The interior of the Court House is in a very bad state of repair. The lighting is decidedly out of date and the entire building needs redecorating and it is hoped that the necessary appropriation will be made so that the work may be done this year.

The farm at the County Home produced a very fine crop of beets, potatoes and other root crops but a great amount of these crops were lost due to lack of proper storage. A root cellar should be provided before another winter. The heating plant at the County Home is a very much patched up and built on system that is considered to be unsafe and a very expensive system to run. It is probable that with a new system a very substantial

saving can be made in the fuel bill. It is hoped that the above repairs to the Court House and the County Home may be made during the coming year.

The commissioners suggest that amounts be taken from the cash surplus of \$36,031.31 during the next two years so that the amount to be raised by taxation will be about the same for the years 1941 and 1942 as was raised during the years 1939 and 1940.

At this time we wish to take the opportunity to express our appreciation to the workers in our office for their assistance and interest in investigating the cases. We also wish to extend our thanks to the various overseers of the poor and selectmen throughout the County, other County and City officials, State Board of Public Welfare and to all citizens of Cheshire County for the cooperation and support which has been given us during the year 1940.

To the Honorable Board of Commissioners of Cheshire County :

The following is the report of the Cheshire County Farm for the year ending December 31, 1940 compiled to the best of our ability in view of the fact we were here only two months of the year.

We understand there has been a dryer installed in the laundry, and the outside of the cottage painted during the year. Since November 1st the Jail has been cleaned and painted throughout. The cottage kitchen has been freshened with new paint and also most of the employees living quarters have been painted.

The farm apparently furnished the Institution with the usual farm produce although the crops are reported short of other years due to a very dry season. Over 3,000 quarts of fruits and vegetables were canned for winter consumption.

To all groups who have furnished entertainment during the year we extend thanks in behalf of our people whose home this is and especially to Reverend Harold M. Frye and his group of young people for the impressive pageant given on Christmas Eve. Also to the various organizations sending candy and gifts.

We also thank the County Commissioners for their loyal support and cooperation as well as the employees who have worked so faithfully with us.

I herewith submit my Report as Sheriff of Cheshire County for the year ending December 31, 1940.

The total number of cases, where crime has been committed, in this County, has been somewhat less than that of the year 1939.

Less breaking and entering has been reported, which indicates some improvement in conditions; and in addition to that, we find quite a substantial reduction in the value of goods stolen. We have, however, had eight deaths to investigate, a few of which were motor-vehicle cases.

Permit me to again express my appreciation to the other local branches of Law-Enforcement, all of which have co-operated so satisfactorily, and assisted so capably to make possible this reduction in the number of Law Violations.
