January 2, 1956.

A meeting of the Finance Committee of the County Delegation was held January 2, 1956, with the following members being present: Hilda C. Brungot, Guy Fortier, Oliver A. Dussault, Harry Alls, Roy Ferguson, John D. Cornelius, Bert Stinson and Elmer Annis.

As Arthur Bouchard was absent, Guy Fortier acted as Clerk.

The meeting was called at 2:00 P. M. and the purpose was to approve temporary loan for \$150,000.00.

John D. Cornelius moved that the Commissioners be authorized to borrow \$150,000.00 in anticipation of taxes. This motion was seconded by Ferguson and carried.

There being no further business to come before the meeting, a motion was made by Oliver Dussault, seconded by Bert Stinson, and carried that the meeting adjourn.

Guy Fortier.

A meeting of the Finance Committee of Coos County Delegation was held in the Berlin Court House on Tuesday, January 31, 1956. The meeting was called to order at 2:00 P. M.

The following were present at the meeting: Elmer Annis, Harry Alls, John Cornelius, Bert Stinson, Oliver Dussault, Guy Fortier and Hilda Brungot. Arthur Bouchard and Roy Ferguson were absent.

On motion of John Cornelius, seconded by Bert Stinson, Guy Fortier was elected to serve as Clerk for this meeting.

Motion was made by Harry Alls that we accept the Budget pertaining to Court Expenses. This was seconded by John Cornelius, and carried.

A motion was made by Oliver Dussault that Care and Supply

of Court Houses be raised from \$10,000.00 to \$11,000.00. This was seconded by John Cornelius, and carried.

On Public Welfare, motion was made by Oliver Dussault to accept the Budget as proposed. This was seconded by Bert Stinson, and carried.

Motion was made by John Cornelius to accept appropriation of \$2,500.00 for New Pump for Well at the County Farm. This was seconded by Harry Alls, and carried.

A motion was made by Elmer Annis to increase the appropriation for County Reports to \$1,500.00. This was seconded by Harry Alls, and carried.

John Cornelius made a motion that we appropriate \$4,050.00 for Social Security. This was seconded by Harry Alls, and carried.

A motion was made by John Cornelius, seconded by Elmer Annis, to adjourn. This motion was carried, and the meeting adjourned at 4:30 P. M.

Guy Fortier, Clerk Pro-tem.

A Public Hearing on the Coos County Budget, held at Lancaster Court House, opened at 2:00 P. M., on February 17, 1956.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Hilda Brungot. Guy Fortier acted as Clerk in the absence of Arthur Bouchard.

Present at the meeting were Commissioners Leo Roy, Alton A. Potter and Bushrod H. Hicks.

The Budget was read by Chairman Brungot.

Robert C. Rich, Clerk of Court, spoke on the need of more fire-proof vault space at the Lancaster Court House. In the Clerk of Court's office about one year of filing space remains. Building additional vault space could be prolonged for some years by erecting a brick-partitioned dead storage space in the cellar of the court house for dead storage.

Register of Deeds. Additional book racks will be needed within three months. Could utilize dead storage space for supplies.

Register of Probate. More filing space will be required within five years. Could easily use dead storage space for supplies.

Floor covering is needed in three of the downstairs offices, the Clerk of Court's Office, Probate Office and Farm Bureau Office.

Office equipment for Clerk of Court's office only. Form filing cabinets for use of legal forms, typewriter for Deputy Clerk (replace present one), desk for Clerk.

Robert Rich also recommended an increase from \$8,000.00 to \$10,000.00 for Clerk of Court.

There were no further comments on the Budget.

The Budget will be presented for further consideration at the Annual Meeting of the County Delegation to be held at the County Farm, West Stewartstown, on March 6, 1956.

A motion to adjourn was made by Oliver Dussault of Berlin, and seconded by Harry Alls of Colebrook, and carried.

Meeting adjourned at 2:40 P. M.

The Annual Meeting of the Coos County Delegation was held at the Coos County Farm, West Stewartstown, March 6, 1956, at 10:40 A. M.

Chairman Brungot called the meeting to order and the following were present: Commissioners Roy, Potter and Hicks, Oliver Dussault, Guy Fortier, Edgar Roy, Arthur Russell, Frank Sheridan, Hilda Brungot, Marie Christiansen, Jennie Fontaine, Rebecca Gagnon, Oscar Rines, Harry Alls, Celia Hurlbert, Philip Ross, Wilbur Potter, Elmer Annis, William Bushey, Raymond Charbonneau, Claude Baker, William Emerson, Mark Rix, Victor Kidder and Florence Gould.

As Clerk Arthur Bouchard was absent, Rebecca Gagnon moved

that Guy Fortier act as Clerk. Jennie Fontaine seconded the motion which was carried.

The minutes of the previous meeting were read by Chairman Brungot.

The Proposed Budget for 1956 was read by Chairman Brungot.

Commissioner Roy stated that the County Treasurer notified him that the Budget item on interest for temporary loans would have to be increased from \$3,000.00 to \$4,500.00. Guy Fortier moved that this increase in Budget be made as requested. This was seconded by Oscar Rines, and carried.

George Martin spoke about the needs of the Coos County Extension Service.

Frank Sheridan spoke on the need of repairs to floors of the Lancaster Court House. Philip Ross also spoke on the same subject.

A communication from Clerk of Court Robert Rich was read, stating the need for more vault space in the Lancaster Court House.

A motion was made by Oliver Dussault to accept the Budget as read. A roll showed that all were in favor. This was seconded by William Emerson, and carried.

Rebecca Gagnon made a motion to adjourn. This was seconded by William Emerson, and carried.

The meeting adjourned at 11:40 A. M.

A meeting of the Coos County Finance Committee was held at the Coos County Farm at West Stewartstown on May 8, 1956.

The meeting was called to order by Chairman Hilda Brungot at 10:25 A. M. Those present at the meeting were Chairman Hilda Brungot, Bert Stinson, Oliver Dussault, Roy Ferguson, John Cornelius, Elmer Annis and Guy Fortier. Absent were Harry Alls and Arthur Bouchard.

Guy Fortier acted as Clerk.

A motion was made by Roy Ferguson and seconded by Harry Alls that the Commissioners be granted permission to borrow \$125,000.00 in anticipation of taxes. This motion was carried.

There being no further business to come up before the meeting, it was adjourned at 2:15 P. M.

Report of County Commissioners

To the Citizens of Coos County:

In compliance with the Laws of the State of New Hampshire, the Commissioners of Coos County present their annual report for the year ending December 31, 1956, together with the reports of the Treasurer, Clerk of Court, Sheriff, County Solicitor, Superintendent of the County Farm, Hospital, House of Correction, Jail, and Auditors.

The County ended the fiscal year of 1956 with a net Budget Surplus of \$25,001.42 and a Cash Surplus of \$24,998.03.

At the County Farm a new well was installed to improve the water supply at the Institution at a cost of \$1,625.00. All the buildings at the County Farm were painted.

The roof at the Berlin Court House was repaired and the Court Room was painted. A new furnace was also installed at a cost of \$2,930.00.

Under Support of Poor Off Farm, the increased expenditures were due mainly to the cost of Board and Care, Clothing and Medical Expenses.

The revenue from the County Farm and Hospital amounted to \$138,007.73.

To all employees of the County, officials of the Towns, and the City of Berlin, who have aided us in the administration of County Affairs, and to all individuals, clubs, and organizations who have so kindly contributed to the welfare and happiness of the inmates of our institutions, we are very grateful.

Superintendent's Report

To the Honorable Board of County Commissioners and the Tax-payers of Coos County:

1956 started out as a sad year for the Farm with the death of the popular Superintendent, Mr. Lee W. Whitcomb. Mrs. Whitcomb carried on bravely until April 15 when Mrs. Lurvey and I arrived.

We greatly appreciate the help and support of our fellow workers, the Commissioners, Mr. Roy, Mr. Hicks, Mr. Potter, and the people of the county in our new undertaking.

The outside of the buildings were given a fresh coat of paint last summer. The horse barn was remodeled into a cow stable. A new sterilizer and medicine cabinet were added to the Hospital and a new pick-up truck and weed sprayer to the farm equipment.

The Hospital admitted 1,004 patients with an average stay of 12 days. The average daily occupancy was 75%. There were 197 births, 255 operations, 681 out-patients, 1,019 laboratory tests, 456 X-rays, and 35 blood transfusions.

We wish to thank Mr. Morrissey and the Beecher Falls Mfg. Co. for their check to the Hospital at Christmas time, the Kidderville Social Workers for their baskets and the many other people who have sent gifts to the Hospital and inmates, and our Protestant Chaplain, Rev. Houseman, for services held here every other week, and our Catholic Chaplain, Father Gilbert, for the Masses held here.
