Coos County Delegation

On October 6, 1958, the Coos County Finance Committee held its third Quarterly Meeting at the County Farm, West Stewartstown, New Hampshire.

In the absence of Chairman Lyle Hersom, Vice-Chairman Hilda C. Brungot called the meeting to order at 11:00 a.m.

The clerk called the roll and the following members were present: Hilda Brungot, Guy Fortier, Rebecca Gagnon, Florence Gould, Harry Alls, Bert Stinson, Wilbur Potter. Also present were the three commissioners, Kenneth Harvey, John Cornelius, Norman S. Brungot.

Vice-Chairman Brungot read the report of expenditures for the Third Quarter. Harry Alls moved that the reading of the expenditures for Superior Court be dispensed with. This motion was seconded by Florence Gould, and carried.

Questions were asked by Harry Alls, Florence Gould, and Rebecca Gagnon in regard to certain expenditures of the County Farm, County Hospital and County Jail. Commissioners Harvey and Brungot explained that there would be credits coming in during the Fourth Quarter to balance the Budget.

Harry Alls moved that the expenditures of the Third Quarter be accepted as read. This motion was seconded by Rebecca Gagnon, and carried.

Commissioners Harvey, Brungot, and Cornelius suggested that the County Farm and County Hospital hold Open House, once a year, and invite the public to come to visit the Institution. Harry Alls moved that this committee go on record as being in favor of the suggestion and that future delegations be so informed.

Harry Alls moved that the meeting be adjourned. This motion was seconded by Bert Stinson and carried. The meeting adjourned at 12:10 p.m.

The third quarterly meeting of the County Delegation, Finance Committee was held at the County Farm, West Stewartstown on July 21, 1958 at 11:00 a.m.

The meeting was called to order by Lyle Hersom, Chairman of the Delegation. Guy Fortier called the roll and the following members were present: Lyle Hersom, Hilda C. Brungot, Guy J. Fortier, Harry Alls, Rebecca Gagnon, Wilbur Potter, Bert Stinson and Florence Gould. Commissioners Norman Brungot and John D. Cornelius were present at the meeting also.

Chairman Hersom read a communication from the Treasurer of Coos County, J. Arthur Sullivan, requesting authority to borrow \$100,000.00 in anticipation of taxes. Hilda Brungot moved that the County Treasurer be authorized to borrow said amount. This motion was seconded by Wilbur Potter. The roll was called and all being in favor of the motion, it was carried.

Hilda Brungot moved that the reading of that part of the Budget pertaining to the Superior Court be dispensed with. This motion was seconded by Rebecca Gagnon, and carried.

Questions were asked in regard to the appropriation for the Auditor. This item was explained by the Commissioners.

Harry Alls moved that the Budget for the 1st and 2nd Quarters be accepted as read. This motion was seconded by Bert Stinson, and carried.

The Commissioners stated that the railroad might discontinue serving this district and if this did happen, it would be cheaper to heat the farm and hospital with oil. Hilda Brungot moved that this matter be referred to the Commissioners for further investigation. Rebecca Gagnon seconded this motion and it was carried.

Wilbur Potter moved that the meeting adjourn. This was seconded by Bert Stinson, and carried.

The meeting adjourned at 11:50 p.m.

The meeting was called to order by Vice-Chairman Hilda Brungot, in the absence of Chairman Lyle Hersom.

The Vice-chairman reported that word had been received from Hersom saying that he would be absent on account of business.

The roll was called and the following members were present: Harry Alls, Hilda Brungot, Bert Stinson, Wilbur Potter, Guy Fortier, Rebecca Gagnon and Florence Gould. The three County Commissioners were also present.

A letter was read from County Agent, Gardner Smith, in regard to the financial report which the Delegation had requested from the Extension Service. Mr. Smith asked if they might also include a report on the work as well as the financial report.

Harry Alls made a motion that two pages in the County Report be allowed for these extension reports. Motion was seconded by Rebecca Gagnon, and the committee voted in favor of the motion.

Hilda Brungot brought up the subject of stair railings in public buildings.

The report of the expenditures for the first Quarter of 1958 were read by Vice-chairman Hilda Brungot.

Harry Alls moved that we pass over the items included in "Superior Court Expense." Seconded by Rebecca Gagnon and motion carried. Public welfare items were discussed.

Harry Alls moved that the report of expenditures be accepted as read. Seconded by Wilbur Potter and voted unanimously in favor of.

All business before the meeting having been transacted, Bert Stinson moved to adjourn. Motion was seconded by Wilbur Potter and carried.

Meeting adjourned at 11:55 a.m.

The following members were present: Guy Fortier, Edgar Roy, Arthur Russell, Frank Sheridan, Hilda Brungot, Marie Christiansen, Jennie Fontaine, Rebecca Gagnon, Clarence Lacasse, all of Berlin; Harry Alls, Colebrook, Mark Rix, Dummer, George Graham and George Keough, Gorham, John Cornelius and Walter Sweet, Lancaster, Wilbur Potter, Milan, Walter Bushey and Lyle Hersom of Northumberland, Victor Kidder, Shelburne, Ray Placey, Stewartstown, Bert Stinson, Stratford, Florence Gould, Wentworth's Location, William Emerson, Dalton, and Jerry Emery, Stark.

The three County Commissioners were also present; also Robert Rich, Clerk of Court, George Martin, Gardner Smith, and Lawrence Philbrook of the Coos County Extension Service.

Robert Rich spoke about the Superior Court Budget and recommended changes should be made. His recommendations are as follows:

He was questioned by Florence Gould and Frank Sheridan.

Lawrence Philbrook, George Martin and Gardner Smith of the Coos County Extension Service explained that their budget was increased \$700.00 above last year's appropriation because of the higher cost of office expense and travel.

Chairman Hersom read the Proposed Budget for 1958.

George Keough questioned certain items of the Budget pertaining to equipment. Commissioner Harvey explained the reason for these items.

George Keough moved that the item pertaining to the Exercise Yard and extra guard for the prisoners be stricken from the Budget. This was seconded by Frank Sheridan. All present were in favor except Clarence Lacasse. The motion carried.

George Keough moved that the Chair dispense with reading other items of the Budget down to Public Welfare. Jerry Emery seconded this motion and it was carried.

Hilda Brungot moved that the Budget be accepted as read and that the County Commissioners be authorized to raise \$283,923.37 by direct taxation. The motion was seconded by Florence Gould and carried.

Hilda Brungot moved that the Chairman appoint some member of the Delegation to replace him when absent from the Extension Service Meetings. This motion was seconded by William Emerson, and carried.

Jerry Emery moved that the changes recommended by Robert Rich be referred to the County Commissioners for further investigation and report. This motion was seconded by Hilda Brungot, and carried.

William Emerson moved that the Extension Service submit a report of their activities to the County Commissioners and that the same be printed in future County Reports, that the Clerk be authorized to inform the Coos County Extension Service of this matter. This motion was seconded by Walter Swett and carried.

There being no further business, Harry Alls moved that the meeting be adjourned. This motion was seconded by William Emerson, and carried. The meeting adjourned at 2:00 p.m.

Report of County Commissioners

To the Citizens of Coos County:

In compliance with the Laws of the State of New Hampshire, the Commissioners of Coos County present their annual report for the year ending December 31, 1958 together with the reports of the Treasurer, Clerk of Court, Sheriff, County Solicitor, Superintendent of the County Farm, Hospital, House of Correction, Jail and Auditors.

The County ended the fiscal year 1958 with a net Budget Surplus of \$27,278.94 and a Cash Surplus of \$27,238.31.

A tractor, harvester and accessories were purchased at the County Farm at a cost of \$6,800.00. This purchase eliminated rental of equipment at a saving of over one thousand dollars a year and increased the efficiency of the Farm.

One of the porches was bricked in making a new sun room for the hospital, which will ease up crowding in other rooms. New beds were bought with the \$1,000.00 Special Equipment allowed in the Budget.

Numerous repairs were made at both Court Houses, as well as at the Farm.

The welfare load was heavily increased due to increased prices, curtailment of woods operations, strikes and general shortage of work in the territory.

The children's account was heavier also, as there are more children being turned over for County care each year.

To all employees of the County, officials of the Towns and the City of Berlin, who have aided us in the administration of County affairs, and to all individuals, clubs and organizations who have contributed to the welfare and happiness of the inmates at the County Farm and Hospital, we are very grateful.
