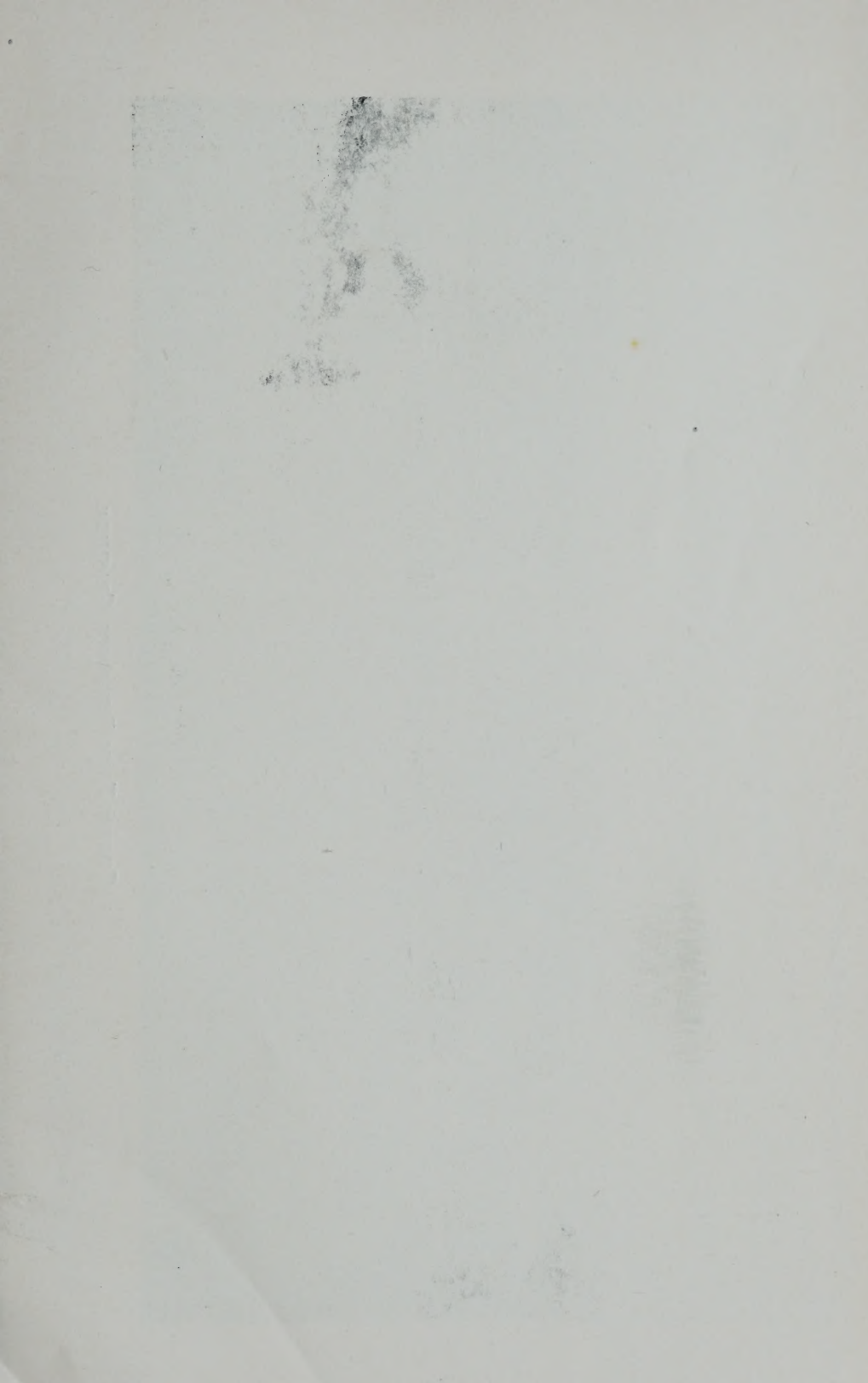

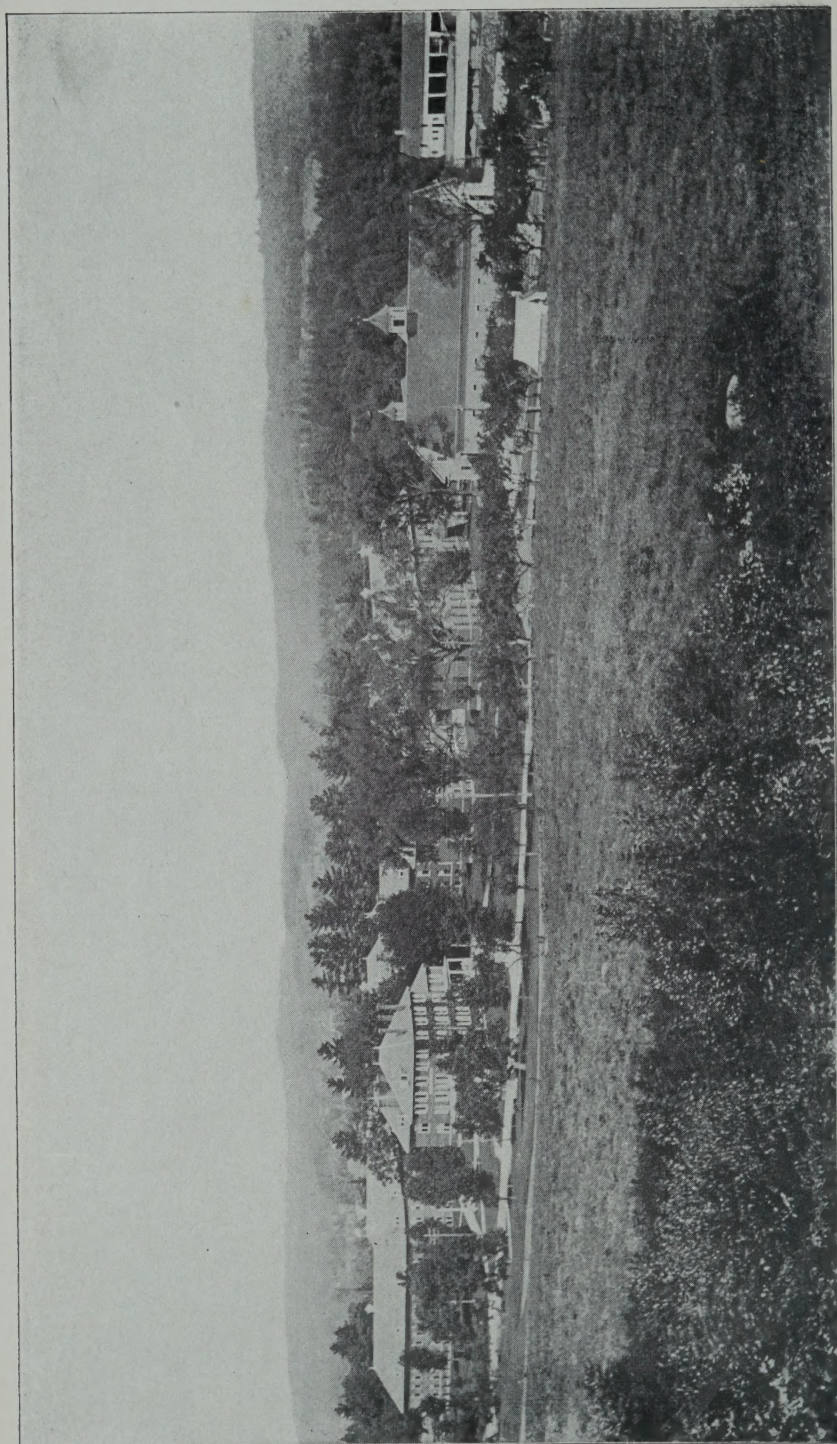

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## COMMISSIONER'S REPORT

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In accordance with the Public Statutes of the State of New Hampshire, we, the undersigned Commissioners of Hillsborough County submit our Annual Report for the year ending December 31, 1929.

Since taking charge of County affairs April 1, 1929, many needed improvements have been made.

The County Farm is under the supervision of Charles Connor, as Superintendent, and Mrs. Charles Connor as Matron. Their work has been performed in a highly efficient and able manner. Their economical handling of farm matters have aided in keeping operating costs down.

Romeo Gagnon was appointed Assistant Superintendent and he has been a very faithful official.

A new ambulance and truck purchased during the month of April has been a great assistance to the officials in their general routine work.

The County Hospital has progressed under Miss Addie Moore, Superintendent, and Mrs. Jessie R. Corey as Assistant. Damase Caron, M. D., Simeon Hebert, M. D., and Eddy B. Swett, headed a competent staff of physicians and surgeons, assisted by an able corps of nurses. This institution has been given a high rating by the American College of Doctors and Surgeons during the past year. 1053 patients have been taken care of during the fiscal year. 35,036 hospital days of care have been given these patients



according to hospital records. Of the 1053 cases accepted for treatment, 1033 were discharged. The average daily patients numbered 96. The cash receipts for the year show \$6,579.67, which is \$5,000 less than paid patients in 1928.

This is commendable showing considering that the Commissioners have made every effort to discourage accepting paid patients. The sum mentioned above with the amount appropriated will leave a surplus for the year.

Three electric refrigerators were installed, two in the hospital and one in the Nurses' Home. The nurses' dining room received some very much needed repairs.

We Commissioners are indeed proud of the showing of this institution.

Former Sheriff, John T. O'Dowd, as Jailer and Mrs. O'Dowd as Matron have given the same efficient management to our County Jail, which has been characteristic of them for the past ten years. They have always been faithful officials in the exercise of their duties.

New steel ceilings and walls were put in the Nashua Court House at a cost of \$1,800.00. This marks the twenty-seventh year of continued and faithful service of James W. Bills, custodian of the Nashua Court House. A new court room was remodeled and put in order at the Manchester Court House and owing to the large number of cases being tried in Superior court, this was a very praiseworthy improvement.

Owing to the industrial conditions in Manchester and Nashua causing much unemployment, a greater demand has been made for care and support of men and their families, who have found themselves unable to find work. In Manchester alone the record showed 1100 families received assistance. Is it any wonder that \$25,000 over the sum appropriated has been expended?

There has been an increase of more than one-half of the appropriation for soldiers' aid.

When our regime started in April of this year, we found

that the warerooms at the County Farm were very bare and many supplies were needed. It was necessary to spend \$5000 for coal, \$4000 for merchandise and supplies and our appropriation was \$5000 less than in 1928. We state these facts to show just how it was that appropriations were exceeded in some instances.

At this time we want to thank State Officials, Selectmen and Overseers of Poor and others who have co-operated with us in our endeavors in the important work in administering to those less fortunate than ourselves.

In closing we extend an invitation to all tax payers to visit our institutions at Grasmere so that they may see personally the fruits of our work in caring for the inmates in our charge.

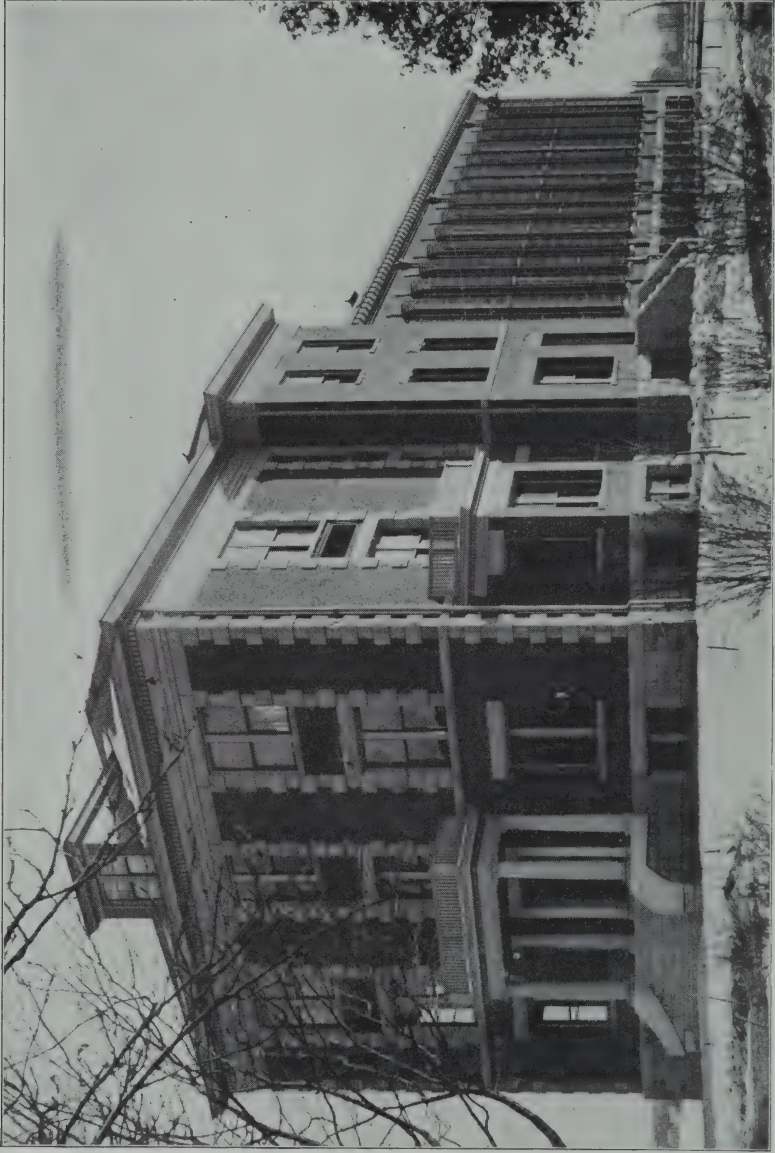

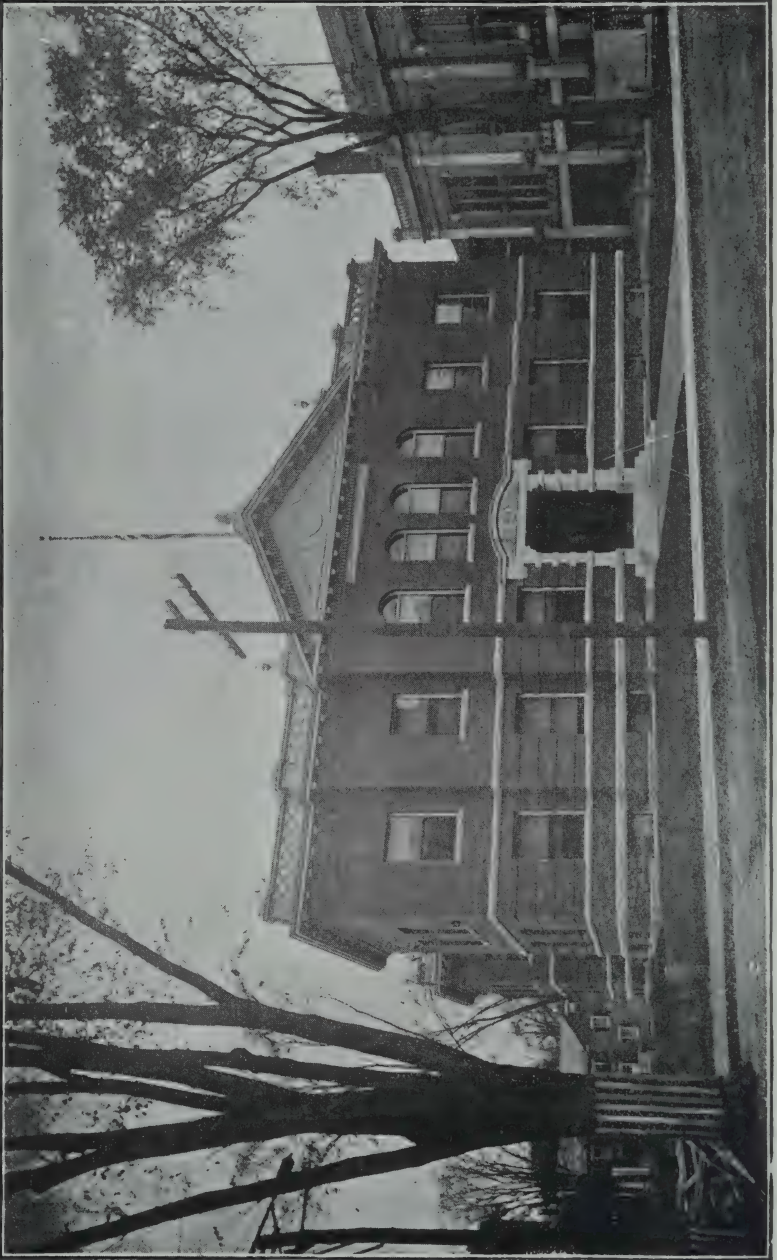

## SUPERINTENDENT'S REPORT

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*To the Honorable Board of Commissioners of the County of Hillsborough:*

GENTLEMEN:

In submitting my annual report for the year 1929, I am conscious of the fact that your board is already possessed of knowledge of the important happenings of the year at the farm, and that an enumeration of others might appear superfluous and uninteresting.

A large portion of the daily life at the Hillsborough County Farm is necessarily routine, and much of the work of the year is represented in the up-keep of the largest institution of its kind in New Hampshire.

Each year finds the necessity of continuing the work of re-habilitation of farm property, some of it very old, and in need of constant supervision and frequent repair.

There are 15 different buildings at the County Farm, Grasmere, and most of them were erected in 1894. All require every year more or less attention from carpenters, painters, plumbers and electricians, and the aggregate cost of maintenance is generally larger than expected at the beginning of the fiscal year.

It is not improper to state that this administration was forced to carry on increasing burdens of farm and hospital under a reduction of \$5000 in its appropriation for the year 1929, from that of 1928.

Not once in the months of mid-summer, when the number of inmates of the farm is at a minimum, has the total population of the county farm been less than 400, while the past winter, and early spring, the persons cared for in all departments, including officers, attendants, hospital nurses and patients exceeded 650. This latter number is in excess of the inhabitants of many towns of New Hampshire.







NASHUA COURT HOUSE

At the last presidential election, 21 of the 29 towns of the county cast a smaller vote for president than were included among all of the people who were housed at the County Farm during the winter and spring months.

With no attempt to tabulate all of the outside work at the County Farm in 1929, your superintendent feels warranted in directing the attention of the commissioners and tax payers of the county, to a few of the substantial accomplishments, other than those compelled by the natural order of things, together with a few personal recommendations which he believes to be highly important for consideration in a year immediately preceding another session of the state legislature.

Discontinuance of the women's ward for patients afflicted with tuberculosis at the hospital, and their transfer to the sanatorium at Pembroke, together with several men, was the first definite step toward the abolishment of this undesirable annex to a general hospital. As soon as possible all tubercular cases at the county hospital will be removed elsewhere.

Hillsborough county is the only county of the state which has afforded care and treatment for the tubercular, and its management has long been convinced that the rapidly growing demands upon both the medical and surgical departments emphasizes the compulsion of abandoning further admissions of new patients, and the removal of those now in the men's ward, as quickly as provisions can be made for them, to a special sanatorium for consumptives.

Space much sought for in the present tubercular building will be available, when all patients have been taken away. There is an increasing application for additional private rooms at this popular institution.

Widening of the state highway 1200 feet opposite the county buildings is an improvement which merits reference. A new stone and cement wall has supplanted the old dilapidated wall on the north side of the highway, contributing an

appearance of tidiness about the premises, hitherto lacking. All work was performed by inmates of the farm.

Worn and slovenly motor vehicle equipment has been replaced by three pieces of new, a comfortable modern ambulance for the transportation of patients of the hospital; a commercial truck, and a driving car.

Much attention has been bestowed upon the water system, which had grown decadent, especially its pumps. By the installation of a 25-horse power, electrically-driven, centrifugal apparatus, the institution is now prepared to pump 280 gallons of pure spring water into the hill reservoir of 84,000 gallons capacity, in one minute, filling the reservoir to completion in four hours, instead of 14 hours as formerly.

Attention should be called to the remodeling and beautifying of the dining room for nurses, wherein it has become exceedingly inviting in appearance.

Three electric refrigerators have been added to the hospital, and give so much satisfaction that others will be brought to the farm in the near future.

Considerable labor has been done at the barns, new solid floors having been laid in both the cow barn and horse barn.

A severe drought last summer, which affected sections of the whole country, invaded the land of the County Farm, and caused an appreciable loss of farm products; however, two large silos were filled to capacity with ensilage corn, and there was harvested a super-abundance of several varieties of useful winter vegetables.

Visualizing the future, it appears evident to your superintendent that there are certain outstanding requirements of this growing institution which demand immediate consideration and that should not be allowed to pass unheeded by the Hillsborough County delegation at the next session of the legislature. Conspicuous among these, is the establishment of a storage reservoir for fire protection. There

is not now available sufficient water for fire needs, and will not be, until an open storage reservoir is constructed.

Danger of fire to life and property is the most serious menace an institution of this character is confronted with. There are many sick, old and infirm people constantly living at the farm, and in case of a bad fire, the loss of both life and property might become a fearful tragedy, with water lacking to extinguish it. The matter of a fire reservoir cannot be taken hold of too soon, or too earnestly.

Vitally necessary to meet the demands upon the County hospital is a new, modern operating room. In the opinion of those who have closely looked into the situation, a new operating room, with proper accessories may best be located on the top story of the building now occupied as sleeping quarters for the nurses, providing that a new nurses' home has been erected for them, apart from all other buildings. That the nurses should have a home of their own, separate from the administration building, has long been admitted.

Erection of a home for nurses will grant the hospital needed rooms for private patients, besides giving the reputable staff of physicians and surgeons such an operating room as their valuable services are entitled to.

It is hoped that the incoming state legislators will view these important propositions favorably, and assist in modernizing one of the finest hospitals in New Hampshire, by providing an appropriation for the improvements.

Of scarcely less importance, is a new sanitary, fireproof, modern cowbarn, in which may be safely quartered the farm's accredited herd of 70 Holstein cattle, which is the foundation of one of the finest milk supplies of the state.

A new, inexpensive piggery has long been a necessity at this farm. Raising pork successfully and economically, should be one of the farm's greatest assets, but under present bad and unwholesome arrangements the best results are impossible of attainment.

Not until a special place is provided for children where

they will not be exposed to the sights of prison walls, will the little ones of the farm, always a source of tender care, be given the surroundings of a home.

Large among the activities of the institution are those connected with the laundry, in daily operation, to handle the great amount of material constantly accumulating among the inmates of the farm, and the patients of the hospital.

That there is an emergency need of an addition to the laundry equipment, of a new mangle and steam press, is the judgment of the Superintendent, and that they should be provided for as soon as possible.

Acknowledgment of many kindnesses and courtesies received by the people of the institution are herewith given to various organizations, particularly to the Women's Christian Temperance Union, the 172nd Artillery band, the American Legion, Salvation Army, and the Wayside Army.

Our Chaplains, the Reverend Edmond M. Total of Villa Augustina and the Reverend Thomas C. Brewster, pastor of the Baptist Church, Grasmere, have conducted frequent religious services, and visited the patients.

I feel deeply indebted to the Board of Commissioners for their loyal co-operation and sound advice.

## REPORT OF COUNTY PHYSICIAN

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The admission of patients for the year 1929 in the Hillsborough County General Hospital has been greater in number than any previous year by almost 200. This increase is probably due to the fact that our institution has a larger capacity and is in position to receive a greater number.

According to the requirements of the American College of Surgeons, our institution has a staff which at the present time is composed of 55 physicians, covering all specialties in medicine and surgery. They have been chosen among the physicians of the County of Hillsborough in such a way that almost all cities and towns are represented and also all specialities in medicine and surgery are entirely covered.

We wish at this moment to express our sincere thanks to the members of our staff for their entire co-operation and their good work towards the hospital and the patients.

We are not only grateful to the members of the staff, but also to the matron and her assistants for the rating obtained by our institution, which the American College of Surgeons has classified (A) once more this year, and this gratification and honor came particularly at a moment where our hospital was the center of attention of every one in the state of New Hampshire.

Our gratitude must also be extended to the County Commissioners who have shown good disposition and good will towards improvements and recommendations of the representative of the American College of Surgeons.

Let us mention once more two of those recommendations which appear to us, not only necessary but urgent. We are recommended to have a librarian, a stenographic clerk to do clerical work and assume the responsibility of the records of the hospital.

The representative of the American College of Surgeons has also told us that a hospital of 100 beds should be provided with two operating rooms, one for aseptic cases and one for septic cases and plastic operations.

May we expect that these recommendations made by the highest authority in hospital welfare shall soon be realized for the benefit of the patients of the Hillsborough County General Hospital?
