Master of Fine Arts Thesis Exhibition

Representing the culmination of their two-year program as candidates for the Master of Fine Arts degree in painting from the Department of Art and Art History, UNH; Paddy Aidan, Tatiana Makarova, and Ron Prigat works will be on display in the Carter Gallery of the Museum of Art.

Paddy Aidan, Kalamazoo, Michigan, earned a Bachelor of Fine Arts degree from Western Michigan University in Painting and studied at the School of the Art Institute of Chicago and Oxbow School of Art before pursuing her Master of Fine Arts at the University of New Hampshire. Her graduate work builds on the tradition of the human figure and domestic interiors, embracing the balance between comfortable and uncomfortable. It explores the emotional potency of presence, absence, and isolation with figures, color, pattern and the use of space. Aidan works with the idea of creating an optical, emotional, and auditory impression of a space before the viewer may interpret the piece.

Tatiana Makarova, Moscow, Russia, studied painting as a teenager in Moscow, earning a Folk Russian Art degree with a focus in Russian Iconography. She earned a bachelor's and post-bachelor's degree concentrating in Graphic Arts at the Moscow State Straganov Academy, Russia, before coming to New Hampshire to pursue her Master of Fine Arts. Makarova's work is an attempt to piece together memories of previous experiences to recreate the concept of home. She works through utilizing luminosity and color to assemble experiences, noting that her graduate work is a representation of her journey of internal reflection.

Ron Prigat, Jerusalem, Israel, studied at the Jerusalem Studio School of Drawing and Painting followed by five summers painting the landscapes of the Italian countryside. His work stems from an admixture of observing life, the influence of painterly exemplars, and the goings on of his own mind. Prigat's painting is an act of self-substantiation and clarification, an attempt to be fully present in a moment, and receptive to the phenomenon of light. He states

"My paintings are poetry in the essence of an individual infused into my work." Following graduation, Prigat will be attending a summer residency at the Vermont Studio Center in Johnson, VT.
