

REPORT OF THE SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS

To the School Board and Citizens of Chatham:

This is my fourth annual report of the condition of the schools of Chatham, and I trust that you will all agree that the schools have improved during the four years. We now have 36 weeks of school each year. We have an adequate and carefully chosen supply of text books, also all of the scholars' supplies that are needed. We have well trained teachers who are working constantly to help their pupils, and improve the schools. The schools are graded and following the work prescribed by the State Program of Studies.

There were 40 pupils in all, 12 at North Chatham, 12 at the Center, and 16 at Green Hill. It is probable that the number of pupils at Green Hill will be considerably larger, and that the pupils from Conway will have to attend school in that town.

Some have thought that a school should be opened at the Eastman schoolhouse, but if that is done one of the other schools should be closed. There are but 24 pupils attending school at the Center and North Chatham, and to make three schools would reduce the schools to such small numbers that the pupils and teachers would lose interest. The town is now receiving \$1944.25 from the State. This generous sum is granted on the presumption that the money will be used wisely and economically, and this is the limit

that can be expected from the State. If another school is opened, it means that the town will have to bear the added expense. The State Commissioner does not approve of schools of less than 12 pupils, unless it is absolutely necessary. It now costs about \$80.00 per pupil to school him in Chatham, while it costs less than \$40.00 to run a school of 40 pupils, although the teachers are paid more than the teachers receive in Chatham.

The school Board has the authority to locate the schools. It is of personal interest to the superintendent where the schools are located, but I have tried to advise what I believe to be best.

Unless it is decided to open the Eastman school, the expense for repairs will be small for the next year. But some provision should be made every year.
