Voted, that the Selectmen fill the remaining town offices by appointment.

Voted, to accept and adopt the Reports as printed.

Voted, to accept and adopt the report of Joel Poole, agent for the town in matter of the Parker legacies.

Voted, that the Selectmen's estimate of \$65, for Memorial Day be increased to \$75., and the estimate of \$150. for Library be increased to \$300., and that the amount called for in Selectmen's estimate be raised.

Voted, \$500. for Conant High School.

Voted, to appoint a Liquor Agent.

Voted, to accept the bequest of the late Elvira Spaulding, as set forth in the 15th section of her Will.

Voted, to accept the report of the Committee on Water Works.

Voted, to accept the Charter of the State Legislature of 1901, authorizing the Town to "construct and manage and own a System of Water Works."

Voted, a System of Water Works in accordance with the terms of said Charter.

Voted, to issue Bonds of the Town for a System of Water Works, not exceeding \$50.000., at a rate of interest not exceeding 3½ per cent.

Voted, to exempt from taxation all Water Bonds sold to citizens of Jaffrey on a 3 per cent basis.

Voted, to raise and pay into Treasury \$2500. in addition to the sum raised under Article 3, and that \$5000. or such part thereof as may be necessary to complete the System of Water Works, be paid to the Water Commissioners out of money in Treasury not otherwise appropriated, and the Selectmen are authorized to borrow money on the Notes of the Town to meet any deficiency thereby created.

Chose: Albert Annett, Joseph White, Edward A. Coburn, to serve the Town as Water Commissioners.

Voted, to pass over Article 10.

Voted, to pay firemen at Jaffrey Center from the time their Company was organized.

Voted, to repair Cemetery at west part of town, and appropriated \$100. for that purpose.

Voted, \$150., for sidewalk to Cheshire Mill.

Voted, \$150. out of Highway money, for widening highway near B. L. Robinson's cottage.

Listened to report of Committee chosen to examine into feasibility of lighting streets of East Jaffrey with acetyline gas. A resolution granting a Gas Light Company the right to lay pipes in highways, was lost.

Voted, to pass over Articles 17 and 18.

Voted, \$400. for land and building to house Snow Rollers and Road Machines.

Voted, to adjourn.

## THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Jaffrey in the County of Cheshire in said State, qualified to vote in Town Affairs:-

You are notified to meet at Town Hall in said Town on Tuesday, the tenth day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:—

- 6. To see if the town will vote to appoint a Liquor Agent, and to see what disposal the town will make of the goods now on hand, or act in any way relating thereto.
- 7. To see if the town will vote to maintain the Fire Company at the present number of men, or act in any way relating thereto.
- 8. To see if the town will instruct the Selectmen to borrow money, or act in any way relating thereto.
- 9. To see if the town will vote to appoint a Committee to appraise the real estate in town, or act in any way relating thereto.
- 10. To see if the town will vote to extend the six-inch water main from the end near the house of J. B. Shedd to Cheshire Mills, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by Joseph White and others, and raise and appropriate money for the same.
- II. To see if the town will vote to pay the Jaffrey Water Works a hydrant rental of \$25.00 per year for each hydrant on the town water system, or act in any way relating thereto.

- 12. To see if the town will vote to build a gravel or coal ash sidewalk from the corner near Godfrey Simoneau's to the Sawyer house on Dublin St. now occupied by Joseph Drinkwine, and raise and appropriate money for the same, or act in any way relating thereto.
- 13. To see if the town will raise and appropriate a sum of money for the purpose of repairing the sidewalks at Jaffrey Center, or act in any way relating thereto.
- 14. To see if the town will vote to raise and appropriate a a sum of money for the purpose of providing a public watering place to be located at Jaffrey Center, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by S. H. Austin and others.
- 15. To see if the town will vote to purchase a snow plow for sidewalks to be used at Jaffrey Center, raise and appropriate money for the same, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by Percy L. Cutter and others.
- 16. To see if the town will vote to extend the six-inch water main from the end near the house of Peter Depres to the house of E. O. Prescott, raise and appropriate money for the same, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by E. O. Prescott and others.
- 17. To see if the town will vote to repair the old highway leading south from the house of Will J. Mower to the highway east of Dana S. Jaquith's, raise and appropriate money for the same, or act in any way relating thereto.
- 18. To see if the town will vote to increase the salary of the Tax Collector, or act in any way relating thereto.
- 19. To see if the town will vote to exempt from taxation any and all improvements that C. L. Stratton shall make or cause to be made in his business for a term of ten years, or act in any way relating thereto, as petitioned for by Geo. H. Duncan and others.
