Deschenes; Chief of Police, Hubert F. O'Neil; Chief Engineer of the Fire Department, Perley H. Enos; Overseer of Poor, Hubert F. O'Neil; Water Commissioner for three years, Arthur S. Buss; Tax Collector, Hubert F. O'Neil; Trustee of Trust Funds for three years, John G. Townsend; Auditors, Robert Hamill, William T. Leighton and Editha D. Christian; Commissioner of Humiston Park for three years, Lawrence W. Brown.

Voted that the Selectmen be authorized to appoint the remaining officers.

Voted to elect two highway agents by the Australian ballot.

Voted that the polls be kept open till 6 p . m. and then closed.

Voted that the reports of the Town Officers be accepted as printed in the town reports.

Voted that the Selectmen be authorized to borrow in anticipation of taxes.

Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 2,800.00$ for State Aid Maintenance, upon condition that the State contribute an equal amount.

Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 2,400.00$ for Trunk Line Maintenance, upon condition that the State contribute an equal amount.

Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 2,734.50$ upon condition that the State contribute the sum of $\$ 1,367.00$ proceeds to be used for retiring bonds already issued for said construction.

Voted (Also under Art. 7) that the town construct a State Aid Road on North Street beginning at Main Street and extending as far as the former residence of Medrick Despres: and the Selectmen be authorized to issue not exceeding $\$ 3,000.00$ bonds payable in one year to pay for the same.

Voted that the town extend the State Aid Road, westerly on the "Turnpike" beginning where the work left off two years ago to the extent of $\$ 4,000.00$, that $\$ 2,500.00$ be raised and appropriated toward paying for the same and the Selectmen be authorized to borrow $\$ 1,500$ to pay for the same.

Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 800.00$ for the improvement of the Gilmore Pond road beginning at the stone bridge west of the residence of Emile Labrie and working in the direction of the Gray Line Garage until the money is expended. Work to be under the supervision of the Selectmen.

Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 200.00$ for the improvement of the highway leading westerly from Peterborough road at Pierce's Crossing.

Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 150.00$ to widen and repair the highway from the residence of Charles Jurva to the residence of Oren LeMay, under the direction of the Selectmen.

Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 300.00$ for the completion of the survey of East Jaffrey streets.

Voted that the town instruct the Selectmen to include in the plan of East Jaffrey streets, now being prepared, a system of numbering for all buildings and prospective buildings thereon.

Voted that, Whereas, the town of Jaffrey has by the gift of Mr. and Mrs. Julius E. Prescott, an admirable site for a Town Hall: and whereas due to the restrictions of the deed of gift and of State law the income of a town hall on this site will be limited to that derived from its use for public gatherings and entertainments and Whereas: the interests of the town may be best served by locating a motion picture theater in the Town Hall building, when built, the revenue thereof relieving the taxpayers of a considerable part of the burden of carrying charges: Therefore, be it

Resolved, That the town hereby instruct the Selectmen to limit the issuance of licenses for the exhibition of motion pictures to one license and one location until such time as the new Town Hall Building shall be erected, and then to one license in the Town Hall building; unless otherwise voted by the town: and be it further Resolved: That the Moderator appoint a Committee of three to make investigation as to plans for such a Town Hall, to report their recommendations to the town from time to time.

The Moderator appointed for said Committee, Merrill G. Symonds, George H. Duncan and Frank H. Baldwin.

Voted that the Selectmen be instructed to grade and beautify the old hotel site so that it can be used as a parking" place, raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 300.00$ to pay for the same.

Voted that the Selectmen be instructed to grant a permit for the dispensing of liquor for medicinal purposes.

Voted not to accept, in trust, the sum of $\$ 100.00$ for care of the Manser lot in the Conant Cemetery.

Voted that the town accept the sum of $\$ 100.00$ from Walter A. Lindsay to be kept in trust, and the town assume the care of the Lindsay lot in the old Baptist Cemetery.

Voted that the town continue the Committee on Historical research with authority to make such canvass as it deems wise for subscriptions to the history when published, and to secure estimates of the cost of publication for report to the next annual meeting: that the balance remaining from last year's appropriation be appropriated for the work of the committee: and that the sum of $\$ 2,000.00$ be raised and appropriated for the work for the ensuing year.

Voted that the town raise and appropriate the sum of $\$ 200.00$ to provide for a swimming instructor and life guard for Contoocook Lake during July and August, under the direction of the Jaffrey Parent-Teachers Association. Adjourned.

\section*{SURVEY OF STREETS}

\section*{Report No. 2}

Selectmen of Jaffrey, N. H.
Gentlemen:
Following is the report on the progress of the Survey of Streets to Jan. 31, 1930 :

The measurement of the ground plan of buildings on the following streets were completed: River, Main to Gray Line Garage, School, North School and North Main to Old Peterboro Road. These have been plotted on the plans on the scale of one inch equals 40 feet.

A topographical survey and plan was made for the committee on a New Town Hall.

Line and grade were given for sidewalks on North School and East Main Street.

Considerable time was spent examining road records and deeds to ascertain the original layout of the older streets. The chief trouble with the old layout records is the omission of ties at the beginning and end or at any angle points. These omissions increase the difficulty in re-establishing the old street lines. Thus far North School Street is the only one of the older village streets that can be laid out on the original lines, three of the four ties are still in existence and the present survey checked this layout of September 1874 with an error of about two feet.

\section*{REPORT OF HISTORY COMMITTEE}

Since our last report the work of the Jaffrey History Committee has gone steadily forward, and has so far progressed that it may be safely assumed that it will be brought to a conclusion within the present year.

In its genealogical section the record of more than 300 families covering 1,200 to 1,500 pages of typewritten manuscript, though still open to additions and amendment, is practically complete. From fifty to a hundred more family records, most of them brief, are in course of preparation.

The names so far included in this work are given in this report in the hope that the list may be carefully studied and omissions brought to the attention of Mr. Annett or Miss Lehtinen. The cooperation of the towns-people is greatly desired and parties interested are cordially invited to call at the selectmen's Room and examine the work completed and in progress in order that material facts may not be overlooked and omitted.

In many of our town histories the genealogical register is little more than a compilation of the Vital Statistics of the town, and this, while valuable, falls far short of meeting the requirements of future genealogists and students of New England history.

It will be readily granted that the record of an American family should begin with the immigrant ancestor and this in every case has been the aim in the compilation of our register of Jaffrey families. In this respect our work is as complete as that in any of the town histories that have come to our attention, with the possible exception of that of our small neighboring town of Sullivan, New Hampshire, with a population which never exceeded six hundred and is at present reduced to less than half that number. On this work Dr. J. L. Seward, a native of the town, as a labor of love, gave his spare time for more than thirty years and died leaving the work unfinished. It was his aim to include every family that ever lived in Sullivan, and as a result the index of the Sullivan History, as printed, contains more than twenty thousand names, a truly monumental work. This and a recent History of New Ipswich may be named as among a very few in which the work has been so exhaustively accomplished.

In a manufacturing town of the size of Jaffrey, with a constantly changing population, such a plan as that of the History of Sullivan, would be impracticable; but in our work an attempt has been made, based upon tax lists and an exhaustive search of the Registry of Deeds and of Probate of the County, to include all families which have owned homes in Jaffrey. To this number have been added some families not owners of real estate, who have been prominently identified with the business or community life of the town or by intermarriage with Jaffrey families were necessary to an adequate presentation of related family records.

As the result of a constant and growing interest in historical and genealogical research, Historical Societies have been organized in States, Counties and in nearly all our large cities and towns. Millions of dollars have been expended in buildings and vast collections of church, town, state and military records are now indexed and made available for genealogical research. By the use of such collections, few of which were in existence when the present history of Jaffrey was prepared fifty years ago, much valuable information has been obtained which has made it possible to carry the records of more than two thirds of our present Jaffrey families back to the arrival of the first American ancestor. The examination of these collections has involved much labor and considerable expense, but has added immeasurably to the results obtained. Whenever published genealogies could be found, abstracts covering the branch of the family represented in Jaffrey have been made, but in many instances the present record so far as known, is the only formal one to be found of many Jaffrey families.

In our Jaffrey record an attempt has been made to locate the place of residence of our early families, to show their neighborly relations and also the shift of population from the outlying districts, at one time evenly settled, to the villages. For this purpose abandoned highways have been traced and ancient sites located. It has been found that a large number of the early settlers of Jaffrey, coming from the same locality in Essex County, Massachusetts, where their families had been resident for a century, had so intermarried that it might almost be said that they were all related to each other. These interesting relationships which made of our early settlers a far more homogeneous population than that of recent years, have been to some extent traced and shown in our family records.

The changes in a country town are so gradual as to escape the notice of a busy people, but to one giving the matter a little thought it is apparent that we are now in a transition period in Jaffrey, such as may well be made the occasion of the balancing of our books, taking account of stock and opening new accounts in our history. Such a work, adequately done, demands more scholarship and more study than we are able to give to it, and such a subject might well engage the best thought and study of our most accomplished historians in the presentation of the rise, the vicissitudes, and often the fall of a New England town. In such conditions a new History of Jaffrey, however inadequate is timely.

The era of the old English, so far as Jaffrey is concerned, is near its end. Only the slightest thread connects our present population with that of the first century of our existence as a town. The indications are that the present generation, with a very few exceptions, will see the passing from our record of every family living in Jaffrey previous to the present century. A glance at the present vital statistics and school reports of Jaffrey reveals an extraordinary change in the racial character of our population; and the next history of Jaffrey will deal with names almost entirely alien to the traditions of the town. The new
elements in our population are taking leading places in our schools and inevitably the future of Jaffrey is in their hands. It has been the good fortune of Jaffrey to have its population renewed in this way, when so many towns by migrations and by the decay of early families have been reduced to scarcely more than a name. Under such changing conditions it has been regarded by your committee of special importance to secure while such information is available accurate records of our incoming families. To ignore this change would be to leave out of consideration perhaps the most vital element in our future history.

Here is a sociological study of great interest and importance, made more impressive by the fact that hardly half a dozen names of English origin on the rolls of our schools at the beginning of the present century now remain. A new era begins. Not a single New England town history has, to our knowledge, anything more than a fragmentary record of these new elements in its population that mean so much to their future. Often the authors of these histories, in their prefaces, have confessed their inability to make such a record, and it will be one of the outstanding merits of our new Jaffrey History, that such a record, as indicated by the list of names herewith has been successfuly made. For this we are indebted to Miss Alice Lehtinen, whose qualification for such a work could hardly be surpassed. A graduate of the University of Michigan, with a working knowledge of the four most essential modern languages she has brought to her work a special training and taste for historical research which has enabled her to render a service which is beyond price.

Among the features of special interest and value promised for our coming history is a chapter on the Topography and Geology of Jaffrey, with special reference to Monadnock, which will be contributed by Prof. Charles Palache, Professor of Mineralogy in Harvard University, a long-time summer resident of Jaffrey.

An interesting reminder of the old staging days in Jaffrey in the shape of the old tavern sign of Joseph Cutter which was hung to the breeze in Jaffrey Center in 1802, soon after the opening of the Third New Hampshire Turnpike through the township. has recently, after having been generally forgotten, come back to Jaffrey. This relic of the old times, still in a fine state of preservation, after many vicissitudes, comes to its old home from Riverside, California, where it has been treasured for many years by the descendants of Joseph Cutter, through the will of Mrs. Florence Overmeyer Cutter of that place.

The Committee on Jaffrey History recommends the appropriation of two thousand dollars for the completion of the work of preparation of its new town history the present year; and, if thought desirable, the appointment of a special committee to investigate the matter of publication or take such action relating thereto as may be decided by vote of the town.

\section*{REPORT OF TOWN HALL COMMITTEE}

Your Committee, appointed at the last annual meeting, have inspected several town halls in communities somewhat similar in size to Jaffrey. In coanection with the survey of the streets in East Jaffrey an accurate survey of the town hall lot has been made.

Messrs. Hendrick \& Hayward, architects, of Boston, who have had much experience in designing public buildings, have, without expense to the town, furnished plans and estimates of cost for a building which would be a great adornment to the town and furnish adequate accommodation for community activities. Plans and sketches are now on exhibition.

The building proposed would contain an auditorium seating 740 people; an assembly room seating 350 people, with all necessary ante-rooms and appurtenances. Quarters for the fire department, the police department with a court-room, the American Legion and public comfort stations are provided. The preliminary estimated cost of such a building is \(\$ 175,000\).

In view of the present financial situation of the town it cannot be recommended that immediate construction of such a building should be undertaken. Possibly the building proposed is too expensive for Jaffrey under any circumstances. Doubtless suggestions for the improvement of the arrangement will occur to many citizens.

Your committee would suggest that every citizen carefully examine the plans with a view to construction of some such building in the future, since, the longer the consideration the more satisfactory to the public the building will be when constructed. Possibly someone interested in Jaffrey may be moved to contribute a part or the whole of the expense of construction as a memorial, as the building lot itself, the Clay Library and the Durant Fund have been given.

Your committee wishes to express the appreciation of the community to Messrs. Hendrick \& Hayward for their courtesy in furnishing the plans and the estimate.

\section*{REPORT OF SUPERINTENDENT OF SCHOOLS}

To the School Board of Jaffrey:
I herewith submit to you my twelfth annual report, this being the twenty-first in the series under union supervision.

The enrollment for all schools for the school year 1928-29 was 523. For the first twelve weeks of the present school year the enrollment was 518 as compared with 503 for the same period last year.

The enrollment in the grades in the high school has shown a marked increase during the past five years, while the grades in the primary school have shown a corresponding decrease during this period.

The following table may be of interest in showing the figures noted.

During this period the senior high school has increased 25, the junior high and intermediate grades 41 , while the enrollment at the primary grades has decreased 44.

In 1925-26 the first four grades had 88 more pupils than grades five to eight, in 1926-27 they had 90 more; in 1927-28 49 more, in 1928-29 16 more, and at the present time only 3 more

This increase in the upper grades was most marked in grade seven at the opening of the school year wth sixty pupils enrolled in this grade.

To care for this increase grade seven was divided into two sections, and Miss Frost, who taught in grade five this year was transferred to the new section which was placed in the English room of the high school. As many new seats as the room would allow were placed in the senior high assembly room, but even then there were not enough desks in the high school.

The transfer of Miss Frost from the fifth grade to the seventh necessitated a new teacher in the fifth grade, and Miss Abbie Shea was transferred from her former room where she had charge of grades V-VII.

In order to care for the room left by Miss Shea it was decided to place Miss Mary A. Brown in charge of these grades and make her a full time teacher. She has continued her work as instructor of physical training, and during the periods that Miss Brown has her classes in physical training Miss Elizabeth Peckham has taught in grades V-VII. This arrangement was made possible by dropping the Domestic Science work in the upper grades, and in this way it was possible to care for the extra division in grade seven without the employment of a new teacher.

The only change in the teaching force was occasioned by the resignation of Miss Moulton in the high school, who accepted a position in Massachusetts. This position was filled by the election of Miss Margaret L. Cournoyer, a graduate of the University of New Hampshire, who had practice teaching in the Dover High School during her senior year in college.

The evening school enrollment for the present year has been about the same as last year. The classes are small but the attendance of those interested to continue their education has been very regular. We have this year, as we had last, a small class in beginner's English.

The playground activities were carried on as previously under the charge of the Parent Teacher Association. Last, summer the playground work was in charge of John Evans, a student of Keene Normal School. Mr. Pelletier, also of Keene Normal School, was swimming instructor.

The scholarship award of the Parent-Teacher Association for the Class of 1929 was made to Joseph F. Shields, who entered Boston College in September.

During the fall term a new fire escape was installed at the primary building. For a long time the old wooden fire escape had been unsatisfactory, and it seemed inadvisable to repair it again.

After considering several designs, a galvanized iron fire escape, entirely enclosed, was erected. The lower doors are provided with panic bolts, both sides of the stairs are equipped with iron pipe railings. We believe that the primary grade pupils are now provided with a safe and satisfactory fire escape.

A careful examination of the work of the high school and the elementary grades show very satisfactory results for the present year.

I wish to thank the school board, teachers, pupils, parents and all interested citizens who have loyally supported our schools during the past year.
