

# Report of Board of Education.

The measles were prevalent in the spring term, interfering with the attendance. By the order of the Board of Health, the schools were closed one week before the time set for the ending of the spring term.

The only change in teachers is at the West School, Mrs Mamie Hook deciding not to return, Miss Alice W. Adams taught the first term. Having an offer of a larger school, Miss Adams resigned, and Mr. Dalton completed the year. The year's work has been successful, the record of each class showing good advance.

George B. Eaton, Jr., was appointed truant officer and accomplished much to stimulate constant attendance among the reluctant. Seventy-five lists of absentees were sent him by the teachers. He found that the greater number were detained by illness, and a good number were detained by inclement weather and bad traveling. Those not having good reasons were notified to attend school, or were taken there by the officer.

The following article has been inserted in the school warrant: "To see if the district will vote to authorize the school board to unite with one or more town districts or special districts to form a supervisory district, for the purpose of employing a superintendent of the public schools therein, under the provisions of Chapter 77 of the Session Laws of New Hampshire, 1899." Towns uniting for this purpose under the prescribed conditions, will receive from the State

treasury one-half the salary paid to such superintendent.

Where such districts are formed, superintendents must be chosen from those who hold a state teachers' certificate, in accordance with the provisions of Chapter 77, laws of 1899. The town has received \$712 08, from the State of New Hampshire, to supplement the

efforts of the town to advance the educational standard."
