

There are at the present time in the library about 2,900 volumes. Eighty-six were added during the last year. Of these, thirty-six were purchased with money voted by the town; six were given by Misses Gause and Patten, and Mrs. Bramhall; and six by Mr. Amory Heald of Lynn; Rev. W. B. Hill gave ten volumes of the "World's History and its makers;" Dr. F. W. Jones presented the library with a copy of "The New Ipswich One Hundred and Fiftieth Anniversary 1900; Mr. A. C. Heald gave a set of Thoreau's Works and three by Bulfinch; Mr. Frank A. Colburn gave a bound volume of the Granite Monthly; Mrs. Katharine Miles, a granddaughter of the Rev. Noah Miles, has sent us another box full of complete sets of the most popular magazines of the day, and these form a very important addition to the miscellaneous reading of our library. We had twelve volumes of magazines bound last year, and hope to have the others as we get the necessary funds.

The library was well patronized during the year and 3,073 books were taken out. The library was probably never so well appreciated in town as it is to-day, and it is to be earnestly hoped that the town will be liberal in its support. The trustees would speak with pride of the interest and care always manifested by the librarian, Mrs. May Hayward, in her work.

No. 1. Spring term was taught by Mrs. Smith, a painstaking and thorough teacher, Fall and Winter terms by Miss Bryan, whose work was excellent, as is shown by the many requests that she be retained here in the future.
