THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE

[L. s.] *To the inhabitants of the Town of Unity,
qualified to vote in town affairs:*

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House, in said town, on the second Tuesday of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose a Town Clerk for the ensuing year.
2. To choose three Selectmen and all other necessary town officers and agents for the ensuing year.
3. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for repairing highways, and to determine how it shall be expended.
4. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary for other necessary town charges.
5. To see if the town will vote to raise a sum sufficient to secure state aid for permanent highway improvements.
6. To see if the town will vote to build an iron bridge at Quaker City and raise and appropriate money therefor.
7. To hear and act upon the report of the Selectmen, Town Treasurer, Trustee of the Keyes fund, Road Agent and Auditor.
8. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

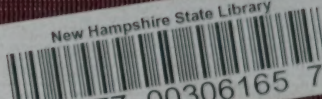
