



TOWN WARRANT.

STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington, qualified to vote in town affairs.

You are hereby notified to meet at the town house in said town, on Tuesday, the 8th day of March, next, at 10 of the clock in the forenoon. to act upon the following subjects :

Article 1. To choose all necessary Town Officers. Agents and Committees for the ensuing year.

2. To see what method the town will adopt for the repairs and maintainance of highways for the ensuing year.

3. To see what price the town will vote to pay for labor on the highways the ensuing year.

4. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges the ensuing year.

5. see if the town will vote to raise and set apart the amount required by the State for the building of Permanent Highways for the ensuing year.

6. To see what sum of money the town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

7. To see if the town will vote to build a new highway on the west shore of Mellen Pond, and appropriate a sum of money sufficient to construct the same.

8. To see if the town will vote to instruct the Selectmen to sell and deed lots in the several cemeteries of the town, or pass any vote in region the ereto. 9. To see if the town will vote to raise twenty-five dollars for the benefit of Washington Cornet Band.

10. To see if the town will vote to grant Lovell Grange the free use of the Old Academy room, in connection with the band.

11. To see if the town will vote to raise one hundred dollars to paint the town house.

12. To see if the town will vote to do anything in regard to fire protection.

13. To see if the town will vote to build snow-scrapers of uniform size, to be used by the several road agents or surveyors.

14. To transact any other business legally coming before said meeting.

REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD.

During the past year schools have been maintained in town as follows: Spring, four terms, Fall, four terms and Winter, two terms. In the several schools six different teachers have been employed and sixty-two children have attended.

Only one school has been maintained in the east part of the town through the school year. Two each in the Farnsworth and Wilcox divisions.

We believe it a wise plan to unite fhe schools and secure good teachers, rather than maintain a school with a poor teacher, because it may be done at a less cost.
