

## TOWN WARRANT.

## STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE.

To the inhabitants of the Town of Washington qualified to vote in town affairs :

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said town on Tuesday, the 12th day of March next, at 10 o'clock in the forenoon to act upon the following subjects:

I. To choose all necessary Town Officers, Agents and Committees for the ensuing year.

2. To see what method the Town will adopt for the repairs and maintenance of highways for the ensuing year.

3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise for the repair of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.

4. To see what price the Town will vote to pay for labor on the highways for the ensuing year.

5. To see if the Town will vote to raise and set apart the amount required by the State for the building of permanent highways for the ensuing year.

6. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise to defray town charges for the ensuing year.

7. To see if the Town will vote to observe Old Home Day and make an appropriation therefor.

8. To see if the Town will vote to put one or more of the tombs at the old cemetery in shape for use and make an appropriation therefor.

9. To see what sum the Town will vote to raise for the observance of Memorial Day.

10. To see if the Town will vote to purchase snow rollers and make an appropriation therefor.

11. To elect a delegate to the Constitutional Convention to be holden at Concord on June 1912. 12. To see what vote the Town will take regarding the disposition of the Lovell House.

13. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## REPORT OF SCHOOL BOARD

At the close of the school year ending March 1st, 1912, we find the district in good financial standing.

Much has been done by way of repairs to improve and preserve the property of the district. The shed at the Center schoolhouse has received much needed repairs and has been connected with the main building by a covered passageway, which has proven of great convenience to the scholars. The interior of the schoolroom has been redecorated and curtained and minor improvements made. The East Washington schoolhouse has been newly shingled and the Wilcox division schoolhouse has received minor repairs.

Three terms each were held by the Center and East Washington schools and two by the Wilcox division school.

Scholars who came into the Farnsworth division after the beginning of the second term have received schooling at the Center school and transportation has been furnished throughout the remainder of the school year.

The following new text books have been introduced: Davidson's physiologies, "Human Body and Health," Elementary, Intermediate and Advanced. The works by Alvin Davidson present the subjects of anatomy, physiology and hygiene in such a clear, concise manner that new life has been given to what has been an uninteresting and a quite neglected study. Forman's "Essentials of Civil Government" and Smiley's "Handbook of American Literature" for the more advanced scholars.

We herewith append items of the different schools, together with the roll of perfect attendance in each.
