# THE STATE OF NEW HAMPSHIRE TOWN WARRANT

To the Inhabitants of the Town of Washington in the County of Sullivan, in said State, qualified to vote in in Town Affairs:

You are hereby notified to meet at the Town Hall in said Washington on Tuesday, the tenth day of March, next at ten of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects.

- Art. 1. To elect a Town Clerk, Town Treasurer, one Selectman for three years, Road Agent, Tax Collector, Auditor, Fire Chief, Police Chief, one member of the Trust Fund Committee for three years, one member of the Planning Committee for five years, and other necessary town officers.
- Art. 2. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$570.10 and accept State Aid of \$3,800.68 for Town Road Aid in said Town.
- Art. 3. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the maintenance of highways and bridges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 4. To see if the Town will vote to install a street light at Bradford Road corner in East Washington and vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money for same.
- Art. 5 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Town Charges for the ensuing year.
- Art. 6. To see if the Town will authorize the Selectmen to borrow money in anticipation of taxes.
- Art. 7. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Shedd Free Library for the ensuing year.
- Art. 8. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the support of the Fire Department for the ensuing year.

- Art. 9. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for Fire Equipment, and authorize the Fire Department to sell the present truck if another one is obtained.
- Art. 10 To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate to pay on long term garage notes, \$1,000.00 of which is due Oct. 1, 1959.
- Art. 11 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$1,462.19 to pay Highway Equipment note due June 24, 1959.
- Art. 12 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$200.00 for Blister Rust recheck in 1959.
- Art. 13 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate the sum of \$56.00 for the support of the Dartmouth-Lake Sunapee Region for 1959.
- Art. 14. To see what sum of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for band concerts.
- Art. 15 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for Permanent Bridges.
- Art. 16 To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for Highway Equipment.
- Art. 17. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for tarring T. R. A. roads already completed, and vote to authorize the Selectmen to withdraw same whenever necessary.
- Art. 18. To see if the Town will vote to raise and appropriate a sum of money to be transferred to Capital Reserve for Fire Department equipment.
- Art. 19. To see if the Town will vote to authorize the Selectmen to accept from Vera M. Bartevian, a piece of new highway to replace the present highway past the Bartevian house, and at the time of acceptance discontinue the section of present highway replaced. The new highway to be built by the Bartevians on a

fifty foot right of way, with an eighteen foot gravel surface and two culverts where needed, and pass any other vote relating thereto.

- Art. 20. To see if the Town will vote to raise \$25.00 to be expended in cooperation with the New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission for the opening and maintaining of trails and old roads for forest fire protection. The New Hampshire Forestry and Recreation Commission to provide a matching sum not in excess of \$25.00 for this purpose.
- Art. 21. To see if the Town will vote to allow Washington Congregational Church and any organization within the Church to use the halls and the kitchen facilities for the purpose of raising funds for the support of the Church building and property without charging the regular fee.
- Art. 22. To see if the Town will vote to have the Town Hall bell rung for Church services or take any action relating thereto.
- Art. 23. To see if the Town will vote to discontinue, subject to gates and bars, the section of town road between the former Gilman Bailey Farm and the Blanchard Road.
- Art. 24. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.

## YOU CAN HELP PREVENT FOREST FIRES

Twenty-five percent of all forest fires in New Hampshire are caused from careless debris burning—brush, paper, leaves, etc. Most of them are started without the required permit from the local forest fire warden. The cost of extinquishing these fires annually runs into large sums of money.

According to law, responsible parties must pay the cost of putting them out. In addition, violators may be subject to court prosecution with fines runing as high as (\$200.00) two-hundred dollars.

In the interest of fire prevention why not eliminate burning at home? Use your town dump. It has been set up for your personal convenience. It provides a suitable place for the disposal of dangerous inflammable waste material and other useless items which accumulate around the home and local stores; brush, etc. cut on your property. Eliminate the hazard of burning yourself. It will be easier for you—personally and financially.

- If, however, you do burn on your premises:
- 1. Secure a permit from your local forest fire warden—the law requires it.

- Be sure to properly supervise your burning.
   Don't leave it.
  - 3. Make certain your fire is DEAD OUT before leaving it.

- 7. To choose Agents, Auditors, Committees in relation to any subject embraced in this warrant.
- 8. To see if the Washington Congregational Church, and any organization within the church, may use the upper school room and kitchen facilities for the purpose of raising funds for the church building and property, rent free.
- 9. To see what sums of money the district will raise and appropriate for the support of schools, for the salaries of school district officials and agents, and for the payment of statutory obligations of the district, and to authorize the application against said appropriation of such sums

This total of ten makes an excellent percentage of our graduates going on for further schooling.

As you well know, throughout the country there has been a movement toward consolidation which has closed hundreds of one-room schools. It is not any wonder that the citizens of Washington ask themselves, "Are we going to be pressured into closing our school and join the consolidation movement?"

I shall attempt here, to aleviate any fear which you may have on the subject. The answer is a most emphatic, "No"!

Neither the State Board of Education nor I, as their representative, have any desire to attempt to close any school which the citizentry wishes to remain open. In my report to you in 1956 I stated, "Washington should continue to operate its one-room school as long as there is a desire on the part of the citizenry to do so. It appears to me that the citizens of Washington take a considerable amount of justifiable pride in their school and as long as that continues there appears to be no reason for discontinuance." I feel as strongly about that statement today as I did when I originally wrote it.

I want to express my deep appreciation to Miss Margaret Hoyt for helping us the past two years with our music program.

It has been a real pleasure to work with the pupils, teachers, School Board and citizens of Washington. I truly appreciate the fine cooperation shown me.
