You are hereby notified to meet at the Town House in said Strafford on Tuesday, the 13th day of March next, at nine of the clock in the forenoon, to act upon the following subjects:

1. To choose all necessary Town officers for the year ensuing.
2. To raise such sums of money as may be necessary to defray town charges for the ensuing year, and make appropriation for the same.
3. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$6000 for highway and bridges.
4. To see if the Town will vote to accept State Aid on highway as per articles to be read at Town Meeting.
5. To see if the Town will raise the sum of \$400 for the control of White Pine Blister Rust.
6. To see what sum the Town will raise for Memorial Day.
7. To receive the report on cost and advisability of re-establishing the Range Lines and see what sum of money the Town will raise to carry into effect such action as may be taken.

8. To see if the Town will vote to make the following roads subject to gates and bars:

1. The so called Johnsonboro road.
2. The so called Mousam road.
3. The so called Pig Lane road.
4. Part of Whig Hill road from farm owned by Geo. P. Foss, to the Roberts' place.

9. To see if the Town will vote to buy a tractor and snow plow and appropriate money for the same.

10. To transact any other business that may legally come before said meeting.


