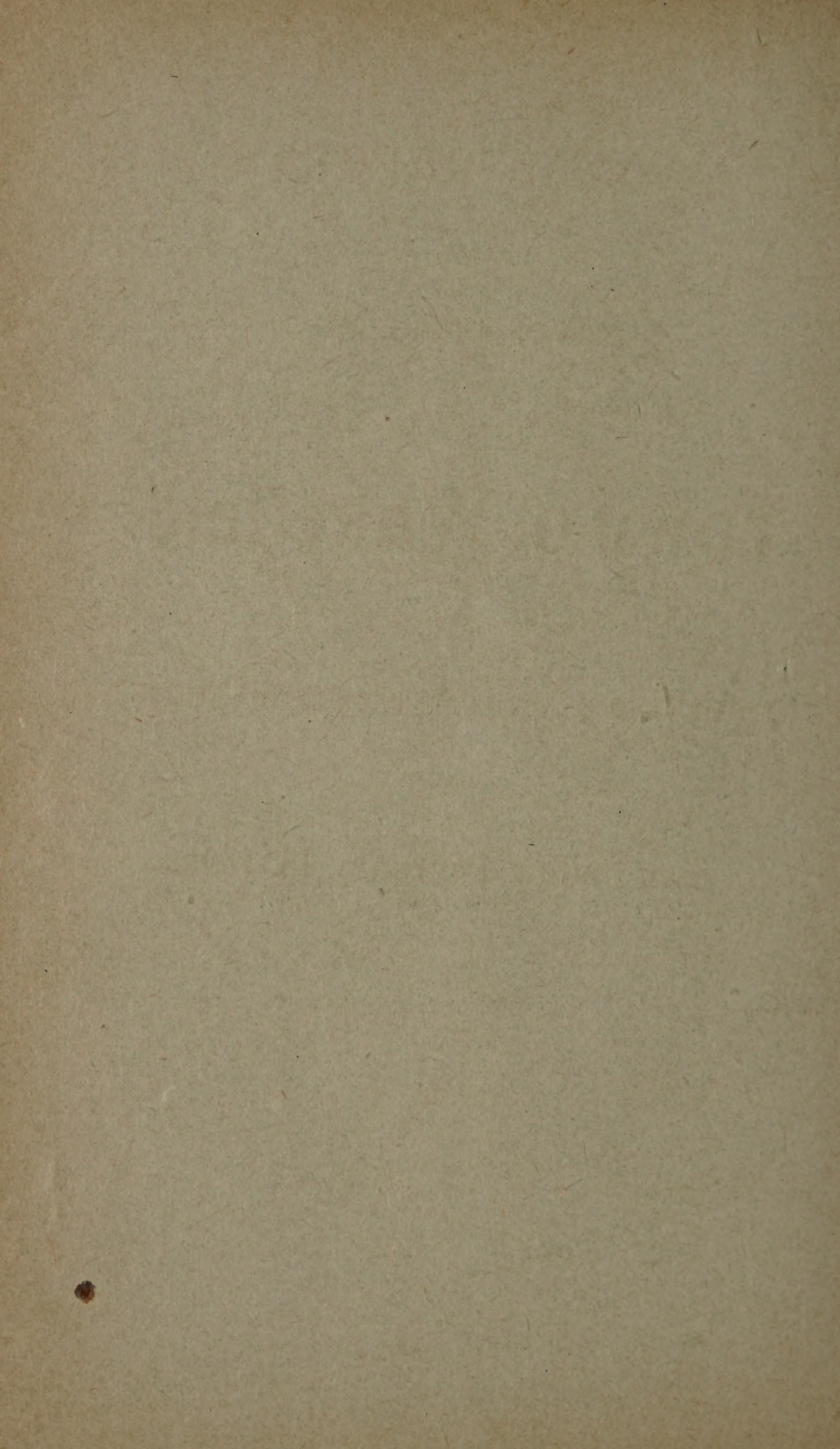

The above account by no means represents the cost of the building. As we reported at the special town meeting Sept. 27, Hon. John W. Sanborn, learning of the desire of a great many of our citizens that a brick building be erected, made an offer in writing to donate the land and build a basement story, which we estimated would cost two thousand dollars. The offer was accepted, and Mr. Sanborn immediately, under our supervision, put in a very substantial stone foundation and built the basement story at a cost of one thousand six hundred nineteen dollars and eighty-nine cents; the amount falling below the estimate, he very liberally contributed the balance, three hundred eighty dollars and eleven cents, which appears in our statement of receipts. Mr. Sanborn also gave the beautiful polished granite pillars which support the portico at the main entrance, and the complete set of scenery for the stage in the hall, the furnishings for dining hall and kitchen, chairs, knives, forks, plates, glassware and cooking utensils complete, and the large office table and chairs in selectmen's room, and an additional cash gift of \$192 58 which balances our expenditures as will be seen by reference to account above.

Hon. Frank Jones of Portsmouth very generously presented the elegant granite tablet which is conspicuous in its position in the westerly front, its inscription, "Town Hall, 1895," ever reminding us of the public character and date of erection of the building.

Mr. Simon Blake gave the large stone doorstep at the entrance, which for many years has been a familiar object to all who passed his premises at the Corner.

Mr. Charles A. Hackett made the symmetrical flag staff, from the top of which floats a beautiful flag, the gift of Mr. Daniel W. Sanborn of Boston, who takes great pleasure in visiting his native town, and never misses an opportunity to advance its welfare.

The sum paid for the clock, Howard's best, and the bell cast of best metal by Blake especially for us, was raised by subscription. The following is a list of our non-resident friends whose substantial aid was gratefully received: George W. Armstrong, \$50; Charles B. Gafney, \$50; Alonzo Kimball, Abbott L. Dow, D. W. Sanborn, William Kennett, \$25 each; John S. Nason, \$20; I. Smith Brewster, J. E. Kelley, O. P. Hobbs, A. T. Ramsdell, \$5 each; Friends, \$16.50. The balance was contributed by our citizens. We are indebted to many others who in various ways aided in the construction of this building.

As in all public matters where so many are interested, we found a wide difference in the opinions of our citizens as to the proper location and character of the building. After listening to all, and carefully and impartially considering the needs of the town for the present, and the future so far as we were able to judge, we decided to locate and build the building as it now is. We have performed the duty imposed upon us to the best of our ability, and we trust in a manner which meets the approval of all fair-minded citizens, and will be most conducive to the interests of our town.
