### Vogue of Small Hats Assured



ALTHOUGH there is as much latitude in hats as in dresses for spring, the vogue of small hats for street wear is assured. But there is a very wide range of shapes in small hats, including round hats, toques and of-the-face or "pushed-back" brims. Vell, or suggestions of the veil in trimmings, are featured in the showings and, in toques, wreath effects hold a strong position. There is a very striking material used in these favored toques which has the appearance of a coarse hair net.

Satin crepe—that is, satin having a luster or polish instead of its usual sheen—is attractive for early spring and is best liked in black. Millinery "patent leather"—which is glossified cloth—comes very smart street hats and is shown in black and white and often in combination with velvet or other materials. Narrow, flat brims, silk or satin with chenille applied in rows, and hats of narrow ribbons are shown in every comprehensive display among the first hats for spring. In the group of these hats, shown above these good examples of these patterns in braid and ribbon appear.

Metallic cloths made into long plain folds answers the purpose of braid in the round hat at the left of the group and a soft rib might be suggested for it. The crown is of plain satin and the brim covered with folds laid irregularly about it, in lines that add to the becomingness of the shape. All kinds of tassels play their gayly ornamental role in millinery styles, and a tassel on this hat indicates its choice—it seems that nothing else would look quite as well.

In contrast with the casual, easy-going lines in which the braid is placed on the hat just described, there is the systematic arrangement of narrow, figured ribbon on the hat at the center. It is placed on the crown in four sections and in squares about the velvet-covered brim. A big chenille tassel looks at home on this rich turban. The last hat, of corded satin and chenille ornament on top, adds fifty per cent to its trim class by attaching a smart veil to have and to hold until the day of spring hats is past.

EXTRAVAGANCE CURTAILED Representative Simon D. Pess of Ohio, charged in the house of representatives before adjournment that lack of co-operation with congress by President Wilson was responsible for an orgy of extravagance indulged in by the executive departments.

Republicans took the lead, he stated, "not only in urging preparation, but in supplying the legislation necessary when we had entered the war. Knowing the inevitable tendency to war as the excuse for extravagance, Republicans at once attempted to create a committee on expenditures to guard against useless wastes. Instead of welcoming the co-operation of congress, which was Democratic in both branches, the President demanded the proposal killed and his wishes were respected. A second attempt by Republicans to create a committee on expenditures by the executive departments in the war department leave no further comment on the wisdom of the Republican proposal, but this array of facts must hold the administration responsible for the orgy of extravagance. No man who lives to the day will see or hear the last of the claims demanded from the government, permitted by the war department and other kindred responsible heads. This congress, alive to the real problem, saw at once the necessity of denying appropriations for unnecessary agency. It ordered the dismantling of the war machine.

Really is shown by the fact that while government employes in Washington before the war number 47,000, today, two years after the war, we still have over 100,000 on the payroll in Washington. Congress ordered in one bill a reduction of 40,000 to begin with July 1, by refusing to appropriate for them."

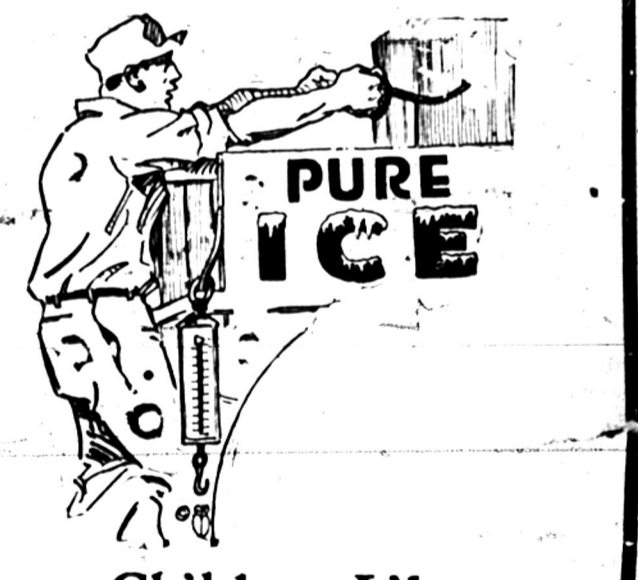

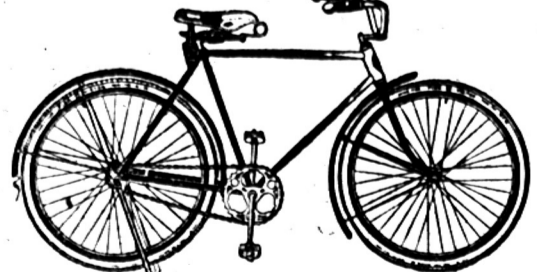

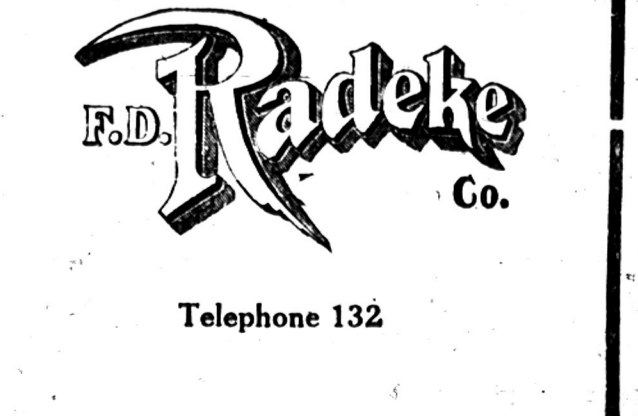
