The most recently published population figures, issued in 1920, give the Dominion of Canada a population of 8,835,102. The 1911 census gave that country a population of 7,200,642. This shows a 22% increase for the intervening nine year period. In 1871, Canada's population numbered only 2,097,251. That the increase in fifty years is almost 120%.

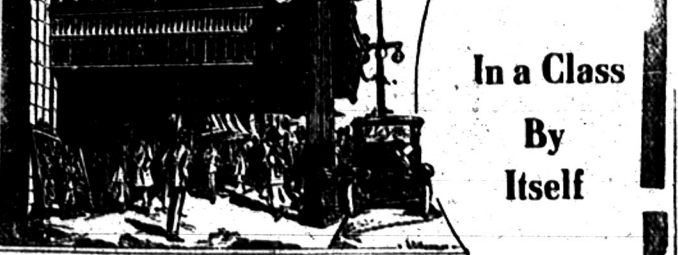
