





Since the major drought of 2012, water resource availability has been a serious concern among environmentalists, farmers, science educators, and concerned citizens here in the Midwest and throughout the world.

Cameron Craig, a geographer in EIU's Department of Geology and Geography, likes to ask his classes a question at the start of the year that gets to the essence of the situation, "How will we all endure as water resources dwindle with a changing climate?" There are many that respond with puzzled expression and a belief that we have plenty of water. This concerns him as an educator, as there are many examples to the contrary: stories of people standing in line with a five-gallon bucket to get a day's water supply; satellite images of Russia's shrinking Aral Sea; news of the Colorado River no longer reaching the Gulf of California; and the reality of aquifers in the Southwest and Midwest drying up.
