Bridgton outplayed the Frosh the first few minutes of play but many fumbles resulted, causing Bridgton to tighten up. The first touchdown came the first quarter by successive live plunges. The point was made by a rush through center.

The second quarter the Frosh came back with more fight and more recovering of Bridgton's fumbles. A safety was scored by Bridgton when a high pass from center went wild.
