THE LION and THE TIGER

Tonight's game between the College of the Pacific Tiger and the Loyola Lion should prove to be allimportant to both teams. A win for Loyola over the highly rated Tigers from Stockton would get the Lions off on the right foot in the '49 season. The Tigers are out to get revenge for the 14-14 tie last season with this same Loyola team.

This game can be accurately called a play-off of that deadlock last year when the Lions and Tigers went sixty minutes to a draw at Stockton. For the most part the same teams will face each oher in this game as in the last. Each squad has had a year's added experience which should be of much help.

Loyola's new grid mentor, Jordan Olivar, will unveil the "T" with the Olivar Twist in tonight's game for the Los Angeles grid followers. The Olivar Twist that Coach Jordan Olivar has used with much success the past few seasons as mentor of the Villanova Wildcats is new in the "T." Olivar lines his halfbacks and fullbacks with a stance not unlike that of a track sprinter. The backs are also several feet closer to the quarterback than in the conventional "T." The object of this lineup is to spring the backs through the line a split-second sooner than in the conventional "T." Timing and ball handling, which is always a big problem in the "T," is even more important in the Olivar Twist.

Lawrence Siemerling, who is in his third season as Head Coach of the College of the Pacific Tigers, has had very much success at Pacific. Last year the Tigers played to a 35-35 tie with powerful Hardin-Simmons in the Raisin Bowl. During the regular season the Tigers' record was seven wins, one loss, and one tie. It is that tie that Siemerling's team hopes to settle in this game. Paced by the great Eddie LeBaron, Pacific's Little All-American for the past two seasons, the Tigers are strong favorites to win over Loyola. LeBaron is undoubtedly one of the smoothest quarterbacks in collegiate football today. Operating behind the big College of Pacific line, LeBaron is a threat every second he is on the playing field.

Holding down the important quarterback spot for the Lions is the promising Sophomore Don Klosterman, rated as one of the finest prospects at Del Rey in many years. How he will show against the experienced Eddie LeBaron remains to be seen. The responsibility of facing such a "T" wizard as Le-Baron in the varisty debut puts much pressure on Don, however, Del Rey sideliners sasy that Klosterman will give a good account of himself.

Big George Musacco should be an asset tonight. Musacco was the Lions' leading scorer in the '48 season as well as the team's leading ground gainer. With a year of varsity experience under his belt, George should be better than ever in the current campaign.

In the forward wall for the Lions, Guerin Alker and Aldo Dellosbel are expected to show well. The two Seniors have been outstanding for the last two years in the line. Alker is rated by the Loyola coaches as one of the best centers in the country.

The Pacific team is definitely favored to beat the Loyola eleven. Their squad is bigger and more exexperienced than Loyola and these factors tip the balance. It should be stated, however, that the Lions have shown great spirit in pre-season practices and are liable to upset the visitors from Stockton.



The Loyola starting lineup shows but two Seniors. There are six Juniors and three Sophomores starting the game for the Lions from Del Rey.


During the current Fall Term of the Evening Division, more than seventy courses of study are offered in the following departments:




