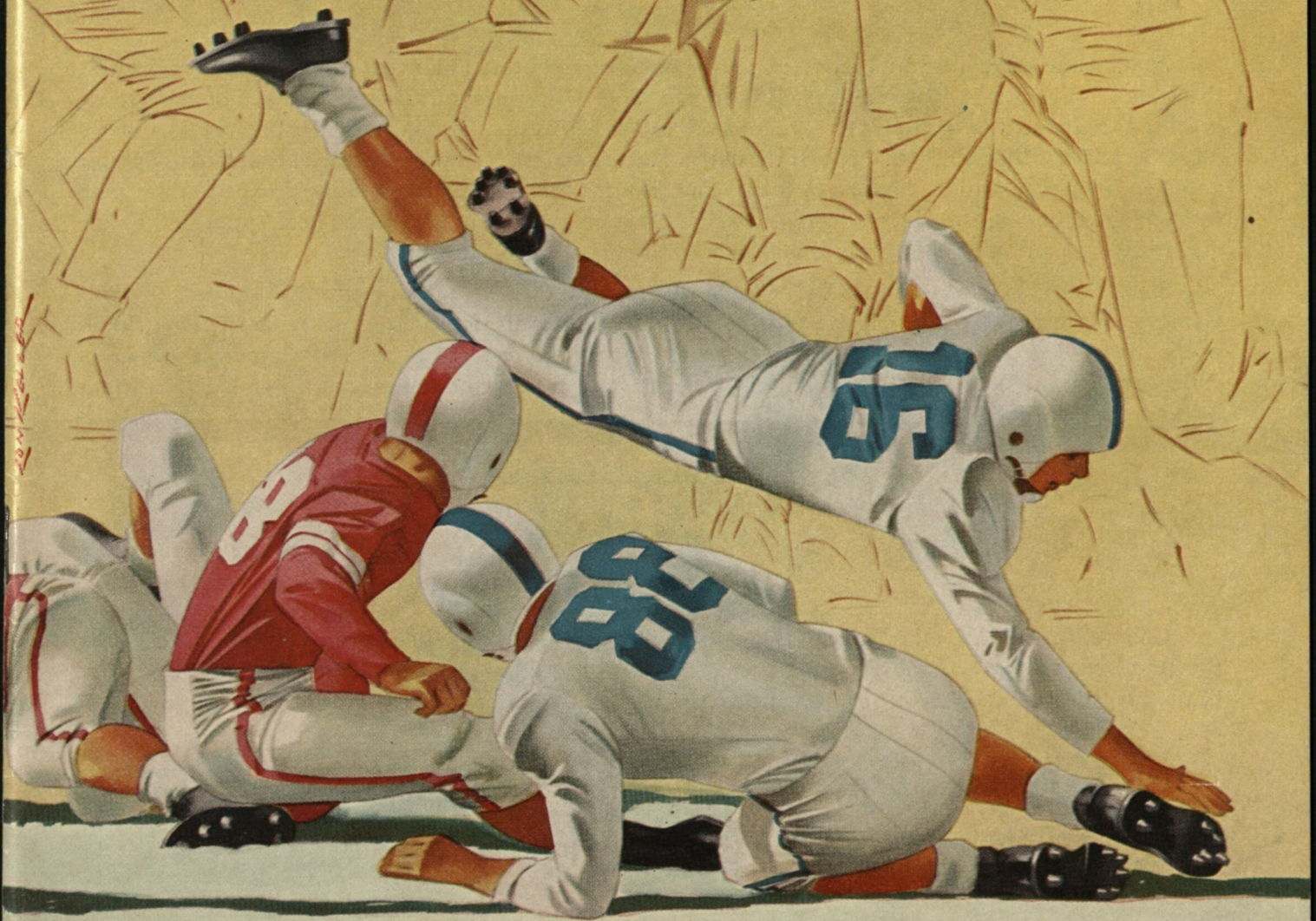

## OLD GRADS, TIGERS, AND MELBOURNE IN '56

Each autumn alumni make a pilgrimage back to the mecca of happy college days, to the old alma mater. For it is Homecoming time, and some of the beloved teachers are still there, and old classmates are back. There are reunions, rallies, luncheons and decorations at the fraternity house. And there's football.

After the game, there'll be open house, and the game should be wide open too. Colorado A and M meets, in this 1954 Homecoming game, College of the Pacific. And the teams from the little school in Stockton, Calif., are renowned for their wide open game. The Tigers of COP gained wide fame in the era of Eddie LeBaron, their great quarterback, who was a ball handling magician and a great passer. Their teams in years since that era have carried on the tradition—fast backs who go for the long gain, a barrage of forward passes, deceptive ball handling. This year's team is no exception. The Tigers and the Rams will show the Homecoming grads a highly entertaining brand of football.

Spicing the football action in pre-game and halftime activity—the presentation of the Homecoming Queen and attendants, and of the 1954 Honor Alumnus.

### OLYMPIC DAY

At halftime there'll be another activity. Members of Spurs and Lancers will pass containers through the stands bearing this inscription. "Give to the U. S. Olympic Fund Drive." This is because today has been designated "Olympic Day" at football games across the nation. And it is because \$1,100,000 must be raised within the next two years if the United States is to be represented at the next Olympic and Pan-American Games. Teams of many countries are state-controlled and their expenses are paid by their governments, but in our democracy the Olympic movement has always been supported by the generosity and pride of the sports-loving public.

The Pan-American Games will be held in Mexico City next year, with the Winter Olympic Games at Cortina D'Ampezzo, Italy, and the Olympic Games at Melbourne, Australia, in 1956. In all probability 90 percent of the United States teams that will go to these games will again be made up of college-trained athletes. Thus today's fund drive, to help see that no deserving athlete is left at home through lack of funds.

### NEXT WEEK

Colorado A and M takes to the road next week, playing Utah State at Logan, Utah. A week later the Rams return to Colorado Field to meet Montana University, Oct. 30. The following week, Nov. 6, they meet Utah University in a feature of the annual Letterman's Day.

JIM WILLIAMS

In eight years at Snow, Williams never had a losing season, and won 129 games while losing only 65. At Colorado A and M he faces a rebuilding job after the graduation of several key members of last year's team. But Aggie basketball fans look for Williams' excellent knowledge of basketball fundamentals, his teaching skill and his ability to work well with men, to help him to build more winners in the future at Colorado A and M.

**With Football Here, Basketball's Not Far Away**

A new basketball era opens at Colorado A and M this season. After guiding Colorado A and M to its first conference championship in history, Bill Strannigan, the ex-All American, accepted the challenge of boosting Iowa State College's basketball fortunes and resigned his hoop coaching job at Colorado Aggies.

Named to replace Strannigan was another vigorous young coach with the same likeable qualities that his predecessor possessed. The new Aggie hoop chieftain is Jim Williams, who came to Colorado A and M fresh from great success in the junior college coaching ranks in Utah.

Last year Williams led his unheralded team from little Snow College in Ephraim, Utah, to the finals of the national junior college tournament before losing in overtime in the championship game.

He was also the football coach, and will help with coaching and scouting in football at A and M.

## Colorado A and M Coaches

### ROBERT L. DAVIS

Head Coach and Athletic Director

An old timer as a head football coach now, in his eighth season at the Colorado A and M football helm, Bob Davis is only a sophomore, however, at his other big athletic job at the College. Davis took over as the chief athletic administrator July 1, 1953, upon the retirement of the late Harry Hughes. With a year's experience behind him in the job, Davis looks for this year to be a bit more relaxed for him, with his administrative duties taking less time from his football coaching.

The Ram mentor has a reputation for winning in his first seven years at Aggies, having compiled 43 victories against only 24 defeats and a pair of ties.

Davis is regarded as a brilliant teacher of the T offense, and he came by his backfield acumen rightfully, for he was a great quarterback for three years at the University of Utah under Ike Armstrong.

After graduation from college, the serious-minded strategist coached at South High School in Salt Lake City, was Utah state recreation director for two years, moved to Weber Junior College in Ogden, Utah, for a stint as head coach for five years. In senior college coaching, he was Armstrong's assistant at Utah for two years, and was at Denver University for one season as backfield coach before moving to Colorado A and M in the spring of 1947.

He wasted little time in making his mark as a head coach. In the 1948 season he was named Skyline "Coach of the Year" after compiling an 8-2 record and taking his team to the Raisin Bowl.

During the summer, Davis flees the worries of football coaching when he can find a few days, and hides out at his guest ranch in the Uintah Mountains of northeastern Utah, where he leads dudes through the primitive forest areas and fishing streams.

### MARK C. DUNCAN

Backfield Coach

Assistant coach Mark Duncan has been versatile, both as an athlete and as a coach. At Denver University, from where he was graduated in 1941, Duncan was a two-year all-conference guard, and lettered in basketball, too. At Colorado A and M, where he is now in his eighth year as a member of the coaching staff, he has been a football assistant, basketball assistant and head baseball coach, as well as chief scout in both football and basketball.

His coaching experience goes back several years prior to his coming to Aggies, however. After graduation from Denver, he was line coach at Colorado College, returned to Denver in 1942 as line coach, then became basketball coach in 1943. The same year, when only 24 years old, he became acting head

football coach, at the same time that he was physical training director for the Air Force at Denver University.

After two years in the army, he returned to his alma mater, then moved to Fort Collins. As a baseball coach he has the distinction of never having had one of his Aggie teams finish lower than second in eastern division play.

### DON "TUFFY" MULLISON

Line Coach

Don Mullison, in his third year on the Colorado A and M coaching staff, is an assistant to both football coach Bob Davis and wrestling coach Julius Wagner, and his athletic participation background fits him well for both jobs. In the late 1940's, "Tuffy" was an all-conference guard for Colorado A and M two years, and was a wrestler who brought regional and national honors to the College.

After graduation, he became a football assistant at Fort Collins High School and helped guide the Lambkins to two conference crowns and a state title. At the same time, he was coaching the wrestling team, which was undefeated in dual meet competition in three seasons.

Moving to Colorado A and M for the 1952 season, Mullison has ably directed Ram linemen since that time.

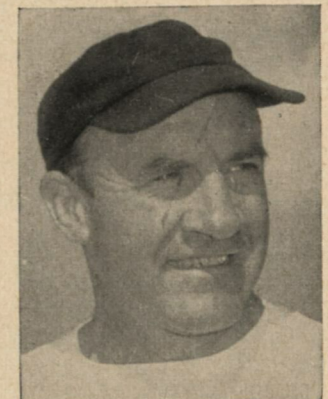
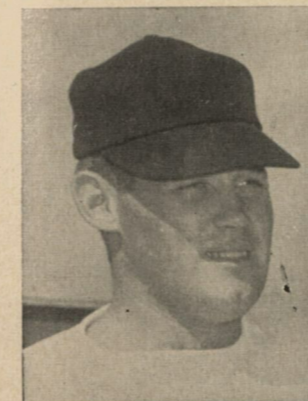
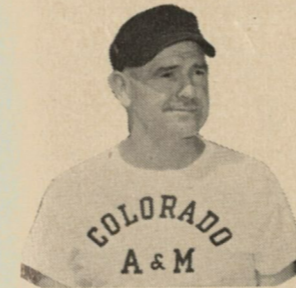
### JULIUS F. "HANS" WAGNER

Freshman Coach

Julius Wagner has a distinguished career in sports dating back some 30 years at Colorado A and M, first as an all-conference tackle, shot put record holder and wrestling champion during his days as a student, then as a coach with one of the most impressive records in the nation.

In addition to his duties as freshman football coach at Colorado A and M, Wagner is the wrestling coach. In 28 seasons of coaching, he has won 23 conference championships and tied for a 24th. As tutor of the weight men, he's contributed greatly to the College's proud track and field history. And he's helped develop many of the outstanding football players who have appeared on the gridirons of the mountain country for Colorado Aggies.

Wagner was assistant football coach to the late Harry Hughes for many years, and took over the coaching reins from Hughes during World War II years, beginning in 1943. He coached until Bob Davis became head mentor of the Rams in 1947.

## PENALTIES

### LOSS OF FIVE YARDS

1. Taking more than five times out during either half (except for replacement of injured player).
2. Illegal delay of game.
3. Failure to complete substitution before play starts.
4. Violation of kickoff formation.
5. Player out of bounds when scrimmage begins.
6. Putting ball in play before Referee signals "Ready-for-play".
7. Failure to maintain proper alignment of offensive team when ball is snapped. Also, backfield man illegally in motion.
8. Offside by either team or encroachment on neutral zone.
9. Attempt to draw opponents offside.
10. Crawling by runner.
11. Illegal forward pass (includes intentional grounding of forward pass). Also loss of down.
12. Taking more than two steps after Fair Catch is made.
13. Player on line receiving snap.
14. Any violation of the scrimmage formation.

### LOSS OF FIFTEEN YARDS

15. Team not ready to play at scheduled time.
16. Violation of rules during intermission.
17. Illegal return of suspended player.
18. Interference by member of offensive team with defensive player making pass interception. (Also loss of down.)
19. Interference with opportunity of player of receiving team to catch a kick.
20. Illegal use of hands or arms by offensive player.
