\$2 Million SUB Expansion Started



'New' SUB Addition Front

Work on the \$2 million Student Union expansion project is in full swing. By the fall of 1963, a Student Union twice its present size will be available to students.

Actual construction was begun Sept. 30 as mechanical shovels started digging the basement for the new addition. Today, after less than a month, the foundation has been poured and work on the side forms started.

According to Gale Mix, ASUI general manager, all operations will be moved to the new wing when it is completed next fall. Then the present building will be completely renovated.

Included in the expansion program is a general doubling in size of present facilities, along with around a dozen new multi-purpose features added.

In the recreation area four new bowling alleys will be added with room for four more lanes. The extra space, at first, will be glassed in and used for a pool and billiard room. Adjacent to this room four table tennis tables will be set up.

A new arts and crafts area is designed to furnish a room for poster-making, working on crafts, printing, and duplicating.

The bookstore, originally scheduled to be moved to the basement, will stay in its present location. Construction moving the front of the bookstore flush with the SUB fish-bowl will eliminate its present over-crowded condition.

The cafeteria will also be expanded. A special family dining room, designed to permit eating with visiting parents, will be added. In addition, four rooms, similar to the present Pine room, will be incorporated into the building.

Space for student organizations and student government offices will be provided on the first floor in a long room which can be divided into areas of desired size. The Alumni offices will be separate.

Seven new meeting rooms are outlined in the remodeling plan for the present ballrooms. The entire area will be made into three multi-purpose rooms.

Ballroom space also will be increased, bringing the floor area to a size large enough to hold all campus dances, including the Junior-Senior prom.—
