Series Of Earthquakes Buries All Buildings; Leaves Campus In Primitive State, Gates; Educators Offer Solution For Catastrophe

In the greatest catastrophe since the San Francisco earthquake in 1906, the College of the Pacific was completely swallowed up last night by a series of shocks that reverberated throughout the United States. The final blast, coming at 7:53 a. m. this morning, as early students were coming to school, tore a wide crevice in Campus Avenue, into which a moment later toppled the Ad-

ministration Building, the last remaining building on the Pacific campus.

At 7:56 a.m. the earth gave another convulsion and the Ad. Building was completely covered with dirt and not a single edifice, tree or bush was left standing on what was the C. O. P. campus.

Stated Dr. Horatio Q. Fluffnagle. president of the American Union of Collegiate Institutions, when informed in New York of the disaster: "I am grieved beyond all description, but not particularly astounded. The College of the Pacific has been doomed for some time now. The Stockton Junior College finally reached the earthquake stage."

Shocking as this may seem, competent local observers agreed with Dr. Fluffnagle that the catastrophe was entirely man-made.

Early attempts to get statements from Principal Orton and the Stockton Board of Education were unsuccessful.





Jr. College Rent **Proposal Passed** C. O. P. Board Of Trustees Accepts Stockton School Board's New Plan

Dissolving the apparent crisis which had arisen in egard to the Stockton Junior College's rental of Colege of the Pacific facilities, the Board of Trustees of C. O. P. Tuesday morning officially accepted the counter proposal of the Stockton Board of Education, calling for a decrease of five dollars per

unit of the Junior College attend-JUDGE

> Based on a scale of \$65 for each out-of-town J. C. student and \$55 for each resident Stockton student in the Junior College at present, the Board of Education will pay Pacific approximately \$54,850 for the rental of the local buildings and equipment, for the year 1939-40. There are about 480 non-local, 430 local students in the J. C. this year. This figure represents a slash of \$5,000 in the amount requested of the Stockton Board by Dr. Tully C. Knoles, president of the College of the Pacific. Dr. Knoles' request was based on a \$65 per unit arrangement, as had been in force for the past two years.

In accepting the new "\$60 average" unit scale, the Pacific Board of Trustees also okayed the provision that \$3,000 of the rental money be spent for new construction and equipment, \$2,200 for new books for the library. **OPERATING LOSS** 

Next year's rental will be the largest yet paid by the J. C., which paid \$40,000 in 1937-38 and \$50,000 during the past year. However, in both of these years the College of

Stated Dr. Knoles: "Last year the College of the Pacific's expenditure on the facilities exceeded the rental figure by more than \$1,000. We are glad to make available our equipment to the Stockton Board of Education, but we cannot continue to do so at a continuous loss."
